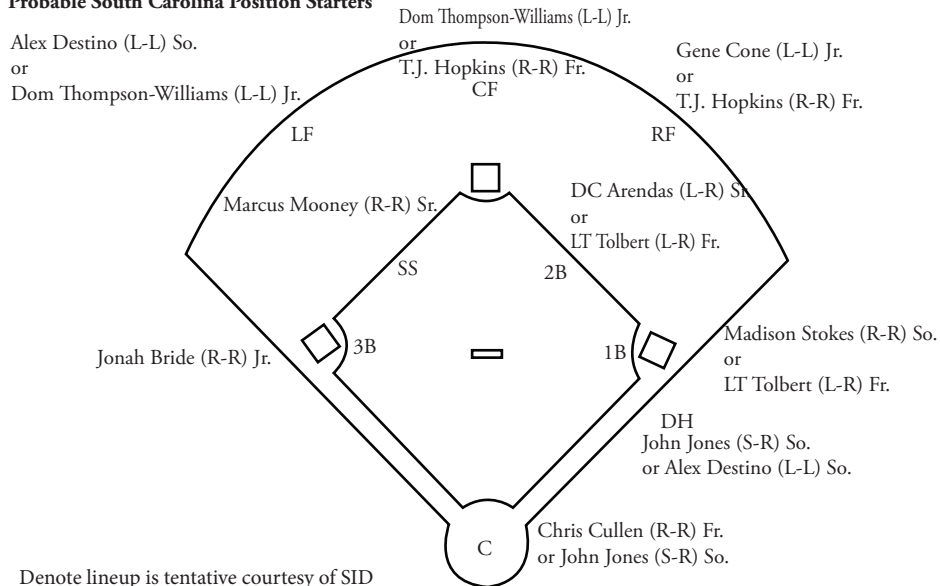

FOR STARTERS

South Carolina (46-16) will face Oklahoma State (39-20) in the NCAA Super Regional with the winner of the series advancing to Omaha and the College World Series. The Super Regional begins on Saturday at 3 p.m. on ESPN2. It continues on Sunday at 3 p.m. on ESPN2 or ESPNU. If necessary, a third game will be played on Monday at 1 or 4 or 7 p.m. on ESPN2 or ESPNU.

Every Columbia Regional can be heard on the Gamecock IMG Network including flagship station, 107.5 FM, "The Game."

HISTORY VS. OKLAHOMA STATE

This will be the fourth time that South Carolina and Oklahoma State meet in baseball with the previous three games in Omaha at the College World Series. Oklahoma State won all three games in 1981, 1982 and 1985.

REGIONAL RECAP

After falling 5-4 to Rhode Island in the regional opener, South Carolina won four consecutive games vs. Duke, Rhode Island and UNCW to win the 2016 Columbia Regional.

Sophomore catcher Hunter Taylor came up with the big hit in a 4-2 win over Duke in the first elimination contest as he knocked a double off the third base bag and down the left field line in the ninth inning to give the Gamecocks a lead they would not relinquish.

The Gamecocks followed that up with the best offensive performance of the season belting out 22 hits in a 23-2 victory over Rhode Island. Freshman right-hander Adam Hill pitched a career-high seven innings as well.

Having to win two games in one day, the Gamecocks came back for the nightcap and behind a complete game effort by sophomore right-hander Tyler Johnson and a x-hit attack, the Gamecocks defeated UNCW 10-1 to force one more game in the regional.

Rain postponed the regional final on Monday, but the Gamecocks were ready on Tuesday and put five runs on the scoreboard in the fourth inning and a pinch-hit two-run double by sophomore John Jones gave Carolina insurance in the ninth on the way to 10-5 win over UNCW to win the regional.

South Carolina became only the 20th school since the Regional-Super Regional format began in 1999 to claim the regional championship after losing its first game.

MORE REGIONAL FACTS & FIGURES

South Carolina's bats came alive in the regional as the team hit .346 (64-for-185) with 51 runs scored. The pitching staff was stellar as well with a 2.80 ERA in 45.0 innings pitched. Carolina allowed 15 runs, 14 earned, on 34 hits with 54 strikeouts to 15 walks. Opponents hit .206.

Junior outfielder Gene Cone and senior infielder DC Arendas were the team's leading hitters with both hitting .500 in five games. Cone was 10-for-20 with seven runs scored and eight RBI. Arendas went 7-for-14 with six runs scored, a double, a triple, two homers and five RBI.

Sophomore right-hander Tyler Johnson won Most Valuable Player for the Columbia Regional. He won two games and struck out 13 batters in 10.1 innings. Johnson earned the win vs. Duke with 1.1 scoreless innings of relief and then picked up the victory with a complete game and 11 strikeouts in the 10-1 win over UNCW.

Arendas, Cone and Johnson were joined by sophomore designated hitter Alex Destino and sophomore catcher Hunter Taylor on the All-Tournament Team for the regional. Destino homered twice and drove in seven runs while hitting .350 (7-for-20). Taylor hit .333 (4-for-12).

40/20 CLUB

For the 16th time in 17 years, South Carolina has won 40 or more games. South Carolina enters the weekend 42-15 for the season including a 20-9 record in the SEC. It marked the fifth time in school history that Carolina has reached 20 or more wins joining the 2000, 2002, 2010 and 2011 seasons.

In those 16 years that South Carolina has won 40 or more games, the Gamecocks have played for a regional title in every one of those seasons.

LOOKING BACK

South Carolina is the SEC Eastern Division champion with a 20-9 conference record. It is the seventh division title in school history. The Gamecocks also claimed the East in 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2011 and 2012. It is the first East title under head coach Chad Holbrook.

Under the direction of Coach Holbrook, the Gamecocks have earned a top four seed in three of four seasons at the SEC Tournament (2013, 2014, 2016). In that four-year span, the Gamecocks are one of only three teams to have accomplished the feat along with LSU (2013, 2014, 2015) and Florida (2014, 2015, 2016).

ALL-SEC

Junior outfielder Gene Cone earned first-team All-SEC honors, sophomore right-handed pitcher Clarke Schmidt earned second-team All-SEC accolades and catcher Chris Cullen, first baseman LT Tolbert and right-handed pitchers Adam Hill and Braden Webb were named to the SEC All-Freshman team, as the league announced its annual baseball honors on Monday May 23.

CONE LEADS IT OFF

Junior outfielder Gene Cone continues to lead the Gamecocks in hitting with a .370 average (77-for-208) with 30 RBI and 52 runs scored as well as a .479 on-base percentage and a .510 slugging mark. Cone ranks first in the SEC in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average. Cone and teammate Clarke Schmidt are semifinalists for the Gregg Olson Award, presented by Toolshed Sports and awarded to college baseball's breakout player of the year. Cone saved his best for league play as he has hit .391 (43-for-110) in 29 SEC games with 13 RBI and 30 runs scored. He led the conference with 27 walks to nine strikeouts and was second in the SEC with a .514 on-base percentage in SEC games. His 30 runs scored in league games were the most by a SEC player this season. He also ranked third in hitting and tied for sixth in hits.

Cone's school record hitting streak ended at 31 games in the 6-0 loss at Kentucky. Cone's hitting streak is the longest in Division I baseball this year with his 34-game streak of reaching base safely the longest mark in SEC play.

During the 31-game hitting streak, Cone hit .402 (49-for-122) with 18 RBI, 33 runs scored, 11 doubles, two triples and three homers. His on-base percentage during the streak was .497 with a .598 slugging mark.

Cone earned National Player of the Week honors by Collegiate Baseball as well as SEC Player of the Week accolades for his performance in the Missouri series.

Cone went 10-for-12 (.833) at the plate this weekend in a sweep of Missouri with six RBI and seven runs scored. Cone capped the weekend going 5-for-5, just a homer shy of the cycle and drove in three runs in the 9-2 victory over Missouri while setting a school record with a 27-game hitting streak, surpassing the previous mark of 26 set by Whit Merrifield in the 2009 and 2010 seasons. He was 3-for-4 with two runs scored with three RBI including a key two-out two-run double to give the Gamecocks the lead for good in Friday's 8-5 win over the Tigers. He was also 2-for-3 with two runs scored in the 5-1 win over Missouri.

Cone's 10 hits were the most in a weekend series by a Gamecock player since Christian Walker went 10-for-11 at Mississippi State April 22-24 and the most ever by a Gamecock player in Founders Park history (dating back to 2009).

SCHMIDT NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR DICK HOWSER TROPHY

South Carolina sophomore right-hander Clarke Schmidt has been named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy, presented by Easton Foundations and awarded by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. The award is given to the top player in collegiate baseball.

This is the 30th year of the Dick Howser Trophy, presented by Easton Foundations. The finalists will be announced on Thursday, June 9. The 2016 award will be presented at TD Ameritrade Stadium in downtown Omaha, the home of the College World Series for the sixth year. The winner will be unveiled on MLB Network on Friday, June 17 and then a press conference with the winner will be held on Saturday, June 18 at 10 a.m. (CDT), the opening day of the 2016 CWS.

The Dick Howser Trophy, given in memory of the former Florida State University All-America shortstop and major league player and manager, who died of brain cancer in 1987, is regarded by many as college baseball's most prestigious award. Criteria for consideration of the trophy include performance on the field, leadership, moral character and courage, qualities that were exemplified by Dick Howser's life. The winner's name is inscribed on the permanent trophy, a bronze bust of Howser displayed at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg - home of the Tampa Bay Rays. Both the winner and his school receive a special trophy to keep.

NCBWA membership includes writers, broadcasters and publicists. Designed to promote and publicize college baseball, it is the sport's only college media-related organization, founded in 1962.

SCHMIDT WITH SUCCESS

Sophomore right-hander Clarke Schmidt earned third-team All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball and is 9-4 with a 3.33 ERA. He has allowed 47 runs, 39 earned, on 101 hits in 105.1 innings pitched. He has 123 strikeouts to just 25 walks with opponents batting .248 against him.

He became the first Gamecock pitcher since Michael Roth in 2011 to reach the single-season 100-strikeout total. Schmidt is tied with teammate Braden Webb for the SEC-high with 123 strikeouts. He is also tied for third in innings pitched and fifth in wins.

Schmidt was strong in SEC games with a 5-2 record and a 3.72 ERA in the league. He had 76 strikeouts in 67.2 innings pitched in the league. His 76 league strikeouts were second-best among the league pitchers behind teammate Braden Webb, with his win-total tied for fifth-most and innings pitched ranked sixth in the conference.

Schmidt was named National Co-Pitcher of the Month for March by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA). Schmidt won four games last month and struck out 46 batters in 37.0 innings pitched with a 2.19 ERA. Founded in 1962, the NCBWA is dedicated to the advancement of college baseball. SCHMIDT & WEBB NAMED TO GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD WATCH LIST

South Carolina sophomore right-hander Clarke Schmidt and freshman right-hander Braden Webb were two of 60 players named to USA Baseball's 60-player midseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List as announced on Wednesday April 13.

Sponsored by Major League Baseball and presented in partnership with the Rod Dedeaux Foundation, the 39th Golden Spikes Award will be presented on June 30 in Los Angeles. ESPN will once again serve as the programming sponsor for the Golden Spikes Award.

On Wednesday, June 1, USA Baseball will announce the semifinalists for the 2016 Golden Spikes Award. The list of semifinalists will be sent to a voting body consisting of past USA Baseball National Team coaches and press officers, members of the media that follow amateur baseball closely, select professional baseball personnel, current USA Baseball staff and the 38 previous winners of the award, representing a group of more than 200 voters. Amateur baseball fans across the country will be able to vote for their favorite semifinalists at GoldenSpikesAward.com from June 1-8.

On Monday, June 13, USA Baseball will announce the finalists for the award, and fan voting will once again commence that same day. Fan voting for the finalists will end on Saturday, June 25.

WEBB WORKS HIS MAGIC

Freshman right-hander Braden Webb became the 31st pitcher in school history to reach 10 or more wins with a victory in the 4-2 win over Alabama on May 20. He allowed just one run on seven hits in six innings with two walks and nine strikeouts. He earned Freshman All-America honors alongside teammate Adam Hill from Collegiate Baseball. He was the first Gamecock to reach 10 wins since Michael Roth went 14-3 in the 2011 season.

Webb is 10-5 with a 3.24 ERA. He has allowed 41 runs, 34 earned, on 74 hits in 94.1 innings pitched. He also reached the single-season 100-strikeout total and has 117 strikeouts to 44 walks. Opponents are batting .215 against him.

Webb is tied for third in the SEC in wins and is tied with teammate Clarke Schmidt with his 123 strikeouts. He is sixth in opposing batting average and 10th in innings pitched.

In SEC games, Webb went 7-3 with a 3.82 ERA and has 88 strikeouts in 63.2 innings with opponents batting .232 against him in league play. Webb's seven wins tied him with Alex Faedo of Florida and Dakota Hudson of Mississippi State with the most victories in league play. His 88 strikeouts were also the most by a SEC pitcher in league contests.

Webb earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors for the third time after a win in a 2-1 victory over Florida. Webb allowed just one run on five hits with three walks and seven strikeouts in 7.1 innings.

His second Freshman of the Week honor came after he struck out 11 batters in eight scoreless innings and limited third ranked Vanderbilt to just two hits in a 4-0 win. Webb was masterful not allowing a hit until a two-out double in the sixth inning and just two in the contest. Webb's eight innings tied a season-high for innings pitched that he set at Ole Miss.

Webb was also National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball and SEC Freshman of the Week for a first time in his performance at Ole Miss. In the Ole Miss game, after allowing three consecutive base runners to reach with one out in the first inning, Webb retired 17 in a row and 23 of 25 at one stretch to help lead the Gamecocks to victory. Webb's 14 strikeouts were the most by a Gamecock since Billy Buckner struck out 16 on March 6, 2004 vs. Clemson and one short of the school's freshman record of 15 set by Brian Williams on May 29, 1988 vs. Georgia Tech.

MORE ON SCHMIDT & WEBB

Both Webb and Schmidt's SEC numbers are some of the best in school history. Webb's seven wins in league play are tied for third-highest in school history and are the most by a Gamecock pitcher since Blake Cooper went 7-1 in the 2010 season. Webb's 88 league strikeouts are the most-ever by a Carolina pitcher with Schmidt's 76 strikeouts in league play tied for second all-time as well.

Both pitchers are also currently on the College Baseball Hall of Fame National Pitcher of the Year Award Watch List.

DC DELIVERS

Senior infielder DC Arendas went 7-for-14 (.500) with six runs scored, a double, a triple, two homers and five RBI in the NCAA Regional. He was named to the All-Tournament Team. Prior to the postseason he hit his first career grand slam in the 16-4 win over The Citadel. Arendas owns a .337 on-base percentage. Arendas has been stellar defensively in 58 games with 40 starts as he is fielding .984 with just three errors (one at shortstop, one at second base, one at third base) in 189 chances with 74 putouts and 112 assists.

TAYLOR BEHIND THE PLATE

Sophomore catcher Hunter Taylor had just three starts entering the NCAA Regional, but made three starts behind the plate over the weekend and hit .333 (4-for-12) on his way to All-Tournament team honors. Taylor had a game-winning RBI double in the ninth inning of the 4-2 win over Duke. He also had two hits and a pair of RBI in the 10-1 win over UNCW.

STOKES SOARING

Sophomore infielder Madison Stokes had Carolina's best weekend in the Alabama series as he hit .778 (7-for-9) with three doubles, a pair of RBI and three runs scored. Stokes was 3-for-3 with two runs and a double in the 6-4 win over the Crimson Tide, followed that up going 2-for-4 in the 4-2 victory and closed out the series 2-for-2 with a run scored and two RBI in the 9-7 win.

Stokes has raised his season average to .329 (25-for-76) with eight RBI and 10 runs scored. Stokes has played in 24 games with 22 starts after missing the first half of the regular season with a Jones fracture in his foot.

DTW

Junior outfielder Dom Thompson-Williams is third on the team in hitting with a .323 average (75-for-232) with 17 doubles, three triples, seven homers, 40 RBI and 57 runs scored. He has a .423 on-base percentage and a .513 slugging mark. Thompson-Williams ranks tied for sixth in the SEC in runs scored, seventh in walks and tied for eighth in doubles. He leads Carolina with a team-high 23 multi-hit games and is third with 12 multi-RBI contests. He is the only Gamecock player to have started all 62 games this year. His 17 doubles are the most by a Gamecock since Christian Walker hit 21 in 2011 and his 57 runs scored are the most since Walker scored 64 in 2011.

He hit .545 (6-for-11) in the Alabama series with a home run, a double, a pair of RBI and five runs scored. All three games were multi-hit performances. He opened the series 2-for-4 with a double and a run scored in a 6-4, followed that up 2-for-4 with a homer in the 4-2 win and closed out the series 2-for-3 with three runs scored. Thompson-Williams had his first multi-homer game of his career in a 10-7 win over Texas A&M. Thompson-Williams tied a school record with three doubles and added a triple to go along with three RBI in a 14-4 win at Furman.

DYNAMIC DESTINO

Sophomore outfielder Alex Destino is among the top run producers in college baseball. He ranks second on the team in hitting with a .325 average (74-for-228). He has a team-high 10 homers, 59 RBI and leads the team with a .518 slugging percentage. Destino is tied for second in the SEC in RBI. It is the most RBI by a Gamecock since Christian Walker drove in 62 runs in 2011.

Destino's top games this year included going 5-for-5 with four RBI in an 8-1 win vs. Clemson and 3-for-6 with a double, two homers, two runs and a career-high seven RBI in a 16-5 win over Penn State.

JOHNSON BRINGS THE HEAT

Sophomore right-hander Tyler Johnson has been a key arm in this year's bullpen, but he came up with a huge start in his first start of the year in a 10-1 win over UNCW in the NCAA Regional. Johnson pitched his first career complete game and struck out 11 batters in the elimination game. That performance, along with 1.1 scoreless innings for the win vs. Duke in a 4-2 victory earned Johnson NCAA Regional MVP accolades.

For the season he is 3-2 with nine saves and a 2.52 ERA in 28 appearances. He has struck out 55 batters to eight walks and opponents are batting .183 against him.

Eight of his nine saves came in league play, that was the most by any reliever in the SEC this year. Johnson saved all three wins at Alabama last week. He pitched two scoreless innings in the 6-4 win, struck out the lone batter he faced in the 4-2 victory and closed out the series with 1.2 perfect innings in the 9-7 win over the Crimson Tide.

REAGAN FROM THE LEFT

Junior left-hander Josh Reagan won the regional final with 4.1 innings of work in the 10-5 win over UNCW. It tied for Reagan's longest stint of the season.

Reagan is 3-2 with 11 saves and a 2.08 ERA in a team-high 29 relief appearances. He has allowed 14 runs, 13 earned, on 34 hits in 56.1 innings with 50 strikeouts and 20 walks. He is tied for third in the SEC in saves. Reagan is on the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Midseason Watch List.

MOONEY IN THE MIDDLE

Senior infielder Marcus Mooney is fourth on the Gamecocks in hitting with a .310 average (61-for-197) with 29 RBI and 38 runs scored. Mooney owns a .413 on-base percentage. He has fielded .947 at shortstop with 87 putouts, 126 assists and just 12 errors.

MR. JONES

Sophomore catcher John Jones belted an important pinch-hit two-run two-out double in the top of the ninth inning of the 10-5 win over UNCW that gave the Gamecocks some insurance.

Jones is hitting .271 (56-for-208) with 36 runs scored, 11 doubles, seven homers and 49 RBI. He is at a .376 on-base percentage and a .425 slugging percentage. Jones has 15 multi-RBI games this year, second-highest on the team.

Jones was named SEC Player of the Week on March 21 after hitting .500 (7-for-14) in the Arkansas series with a pair of game-winning home runs as well as eight runs batted in. Jones opened the series going 3-for-5 with a pair of run scored and a RBI in the 10-6 win. He followed that up with a two-run homer to break a 2-2 tied in the 6-2 win over Arkansas on Saturday. Jones capped the weekend off going 3-for-5 with a double and a game-winning three-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning that lifted Carolina to an 8-6 victory vs. the Razorbacks. Jones' five RBIs in Sunday's contest was a career-high as well.

That was Jones' second conference award of the year as he was also Co-Player of the Week on February 29 after the Penn State series. Jones earned National Player of the Week honors from Collegiate Baseball and SEC Co-Player of the Week after putting together arguably one of the greatest weekends at the plate in school history in the Penn State series. Jones reached base in all 14 plate appearances vs. Penn State batting 1.000 (8-for-8) with six walks for an OBP of 1.000 as well. Jones went 4-for-4 with a homer and four RBI in a 7-1 series-opening win vs. the Nittany Lions. He followed that up with a grand slam and tying a single-game school record with four walks in Saturday's 16-5 victory vs. Penn State. In the series finale, Jones went 3-for-3 including a two-run single and a walk in the 4-2 win to sweep the series vs. Penn State. Jones' slugging percentage for the weekend was 1.750 also.

In records going back to 1997, Jones is the only Gamecock in school history to start three games in a series and put up a 1.000 OBP, besting the previous mark of .875 set by Christian Walker in 2011 at Mississippi State as well as Walker's .909 batting average (10-for-11). Jones' six walks tied for the most by a Gamecock in a series since Scott Wingo's six walks vs. Brown in 2010. Jones' 10 RBI are the most by a Gamecock in a series since LB Dantzler drove in 10 vs. Albany vs. 2013. Jones' 1.750 slugging percentage is the best in a series since Steven Neff's 2.000 slugging mark vs. Arkansas in 2011.

JONAH WITH A JOLT

Sophomore infielder Jonah Bride has been tremendous in 61 starts at third base with just three errors and a .974 fielding percentage. Bride is hitting .289 (63-for-218) with 32 RBI and 41 runs scored. He is second in the SEC with 19 hit by pitches on the year.

Bride is riding a season-high 11-game hitting streak heading into the NCAA Super Regional.

GREAT SCOTT

Junior right-hander Reed Scott has been a stopper of out of the bullpen this year. Scott is 4-1 with a 2.40 ERA in 28 appearances and a pair of saves. He has allowed 14 runs, 12 earned, on 40 hits in 45.0 innings. He has not allowed a run in 19 of 28 games and is tied for seventh in the SEC in appearances.

WIDENER

Junior right-hander Taylor Widener picked up a win at Alabama in the 9-7 victory as he allowed two runs on six hits with no walks and six strikeouts in 3.2 innings of work. Widener has been strong as of late as he struck out a career-high 12 batters in his longest stint at Carolina with just one run allowed in 7.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win over Presbyterian on May 10. Widener also earned a victory in his previous appearance, a 4-1 victory over USC Upstate with 3.2 scoreless innings of work. Widener retired 11 batters in a row before allowing a walk and struck out four batters. Widener won his first game of the season in a 4-2 win over Coastal Carolina on April 5 when he allowed two runs on two hits in five-plus innings with a walk and five strikeouts.

Widener is 4-2 with a 3.93 ERA in 16 appearances. He has 66 strikeouts in 55.0 innings with opponents batting .247 against him.

HILL ON THE MOUND

Freshman right-hander Adam Hill earned Freshman All-America honors alongside teammate Braden Webb from Collegiate Baseball. Hill is 7-0 with a 3.53 ERA. He has allowed 26 runs, all earned, on 49 hits in 66.1 innings. He has 72 strikeouts to 28 walks; opponents are batting .208 against him. That opposing batting average is fourth-best in the SEC. Hill worked a season-high seven innings to earn his seventh win in the 23-2 win over Rhode Island.

Hill was named SEC Freshman of the Week after winning a pair of games the week of March 7-13 to improve to 4-0 on the year. In a predetermined split on March 8, Hill went three innings and allowed one run on three hits with no walks and five strikeouts in a 7-1 win over Wofford. He followed that up with 5.1 scoreless innings in March 13th's 2-0 win over Charleston Southern. Hill allowed just four hits and one walk while striking out eight.

TJ

Freshman outfielder TJ Hopkins started all five NCAA Regional games and improved his batting average to .327 (37-for-113) with 25 runs scored and 26 RBI in 41 games played with 29 starts. Hopkins drove in a career-high five runs in the 23-2 win over Rhode Island.

Hopkins was 4-for-5 with two RBI and three runs scored as well as a double and two stolen bases in the 14-4 win over Furman. Hopkins' four hits were a season-high. He would also go 3-for-5 with two runs scored, two stolen bases and three RBI in the 9-2 victory over Missouri.

Hopkins' diving catch in right-center in the 10-6 loss at Vanderbilt was the No. 6 Play of the Day on ESPN's SportsCenter. Hopkins went 2-for-4 in a 4-0 win at Ole Miss and made eight putouts in the outfield, one short of single-game school record by an outfielder. He tied a single-game school record with two outfield assists on Opening Day. vs. Albany.

LT

Freshman infielder LT Tolbert hit .417 (5-for-12) in the NCAA Regional with two doubles, three RBI and six runs scored. Tolbert is now hitting .229 (44-for-192) in 55 games played with 50 starts. He has 27 RBI and 32 runs scored with 15 walks to 14 strikeouts. He is the second-toughest batter to strike out in the SEC with an average of 13.7 at bats per strikeout.

CULLEN CATCHING ON

Freshman catcher Chris Cullen is hitting .238 (35-for-147) with 18 runs scored and 22 RBI. Cullen has driven in 11 of his 22 runs with two outs. He also owns 11 doubles on the year.

Cullen went 2-for-3 with a RBI and two runs scored in the 6-4 win over Alabama. He tied a career-high in hits going 3-for-4 with a double in the 10-5 win over Kentucky. He was also 3-for-4 with his first career homer, two doubles, a run scored and two RBI in a 5-4 loss to Florida.

LEAGUE HONORS

A Gamecock has earned a weekly honor from the SEC eight times this year. Along with Webb's three Freshman of the Week honors, John Jones was SEC Co-Player of the Week on February 29 and SEC Player of the Week on March 21, Clarke Schmidt earned SEC Pitcher of the Week on March 7, Adam Hill was SEC Freshman of the Week on March 14 and Gene Cone was SEC Player of the Week on April 25.

SUPERLATIVES

South Carolina has outscored its opponents this year 400-234 including 91-41 in the first two innings of play. The Gamecocks are 34-5 on the year when scoring first and 21-4 when scoring in the first inning. South Carolina is 34-3 when out-hitting its opponent and 26-6 when hitting at least one home run. The Gamecocks are 41-1 when leading after the sixth inning. South Carolina is 20-10 in games decided by three runs or less. Carolina has reached double-digits in hits in 30 games this year with a 28-2 record with 10 hits or more.

TO ARMS

The Gamecocks own a team ERA of 3.28 on the year, fourth-best in the SEC with a .226 opponents batting average that is best in the SEC. South Carolina has allowed 234 runs, 203 earned, on 468 hits with 208 walks to 602 strikeouts in 557.0 innings pitched. Carolina is second in the nation with an average of 9.7 strikeouts per nine innings.

AT THE PLATE & ON THE FIELD

South Carolina is fifth in the SEC in hitting with a team average of .293 (623-for-2129) as well as a .384 on-base percentage and a .417 slugging percentage. The Gamecocks have hit 44 homers. Carolina is fielding .978 as a team with just 48 errors on the year, third-best in the conference.

MR. MURRAY

Sophomore right-hander Brandon Murray made his first career start and tied a season-high in innings pitched in the 4-1 win over USC Upstate. He has 20 relief appearances, fourth-highest on the team.

SCOLAMIERO

Sophomore Clark Scolamiero has been a key defensive replacement and pinch-runner in the late innings with 42 games played. Scolamiero has entered late to play center field with Dom Thompson-Williams moving from center to left when Alex Destino starts in left field.

Freshman Danny Blair has six starts and seen action in 22 games, mainly as a pinch runner. Blair had a career day going 3-for-5 with a double, a run scored and a RBI in a 16-5 win over Penn State. He was 2-for-5 with a RBI double at The Citadel. He is hitting .269 (7-for-26).

BOWERS BRINGS IT

Junior right-hander Colie Bowers is 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA in 13.1 innings with 15 strikeouts on the year. Opponents are batting .1093 against him. He has allowed just three runs on five hits for the season.

All six outs recorded by Bowers in a 7-1 win over Penn State were by strikeout. Bowers won his first career game with the Gamecocks after pitching 1.1 scoreless innings of relief with two strikeouts in the 8-1 win over Albany.

A START

In his first start of the season, sophomore infielder Matt Williams hit a solo home run in Sunday's 2-0 victory over Charleston Southern.

CAREER-HIGH FOR CROPPER

Sophomore right-hander Canaan Cropper made his second career start, pitched a career-high 3.2 innings and struck out a career-high eight batters in a 6-4 win over Winthrop.

FIRST CAREER WIN FOR HASWELL

Sophomore right-hander Tyler Haswell earned his first career win in a 16-5 win over Winthrop. He allowed one run, unearned, on two hits in three innings of relief.

RECRUITING CLASS RANKED NO. 2 IN THE NATION

South Carolina's newcomers have been ranked the No. 2 recruiting class in the country by Collegiate Baseball. This year's crop features seven players previously selected in the MLB Draft.

HONOR ROLL

The Gamecocks had 29 players in the fall semester with a GPA of 3.0 or better.

FOUNDERS PARK

Founders Federal Credit Union and the University of South Carolina announced in October 2015 a partnership awarding naming rights of the baseball facility to Founders Federal Credit Union changing the name from Carolina Stadium to Founders Park. The official dedication was April 23, 2016 before the South Carolina-Missouri contest.

The agreement, which continues through 2025, includes official naming rights and other partnership benefits for the South Carolina based credit union. The Founders Federal Credit Union brand is prominent throughout the baseball stadium complex including the outfield scoreboard and video board, interior signage, on-field signage, concourse and plaza signage. In addition, Founders Federal Credit Union receives advertising and promotional packages with the Gamecocks athletics program.

Unveiled in 2009, the \$35-plus million facility has a capacity of 8,242 fans and is the crown jewel among baseball stadiums across the nations. South Carolina has ranked among the top three in the nation in total attendance in five consecutive years, including a mark of 250,057 last season as well as a season-high 6,049 season tickets sold last year.

Head Coach Chad Holbrook

Chad Holbrook is in his fourth year as head coach of the South Carolina program and has spent over 20 seasons in college baseball including two national championship staffs with five national championship series appearances, six College World Series trips and 16 NCAA Regionals.

Holbrook was named head baseball coach for the University of South Carolina on July 16, 2012. He was promoted to the top spot by athletics director Ray Tanner after four seasons as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the Gamecocks. Holbrook came to South Carolina in July 2008 as associate head coach. Along with his recruiting coordinator duties, he served as hitting instructor, oversaw the Gamecock offense, including base running and the short game and was the third base coach. He also worked with the outfielders. Holbrook came to the Gamecock program after serving 15 seasons as a member of the University of North Carolina coaching staff. Holbrook was the 2011 ABCA/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year after the Gamecocks won a second consecutive national championship.

A tremendous evaluator of talent, Holbrook was named the No. 10 best recruiter in all of college sports by ESPNU & ESPN The Magazine in the publication's 2011 January edition. The list was put together in conjunction with three-dozen experts who were asked the question: Who are the top 20 recruiters in college sports? Holbrook was the only baseball coach on the list.

Holbrook's 2015 team was highlighted by first-team All-America first baseman Kyle Martin, who led the Gamecocks in all three Triple Crown categories with a .350 average, 14 homers and 56 RBI. Martin earned first-team All-SEC honors as well and was selected in the fourth round of the 2015 MLB Draft. Junior second baseman Max Schrock also received All-SEC honors and was an 11th round MLB Draft choice by the Washington Nationals. Junior left-handed pitcher Jack Wynkoop would be selected in the sixth round of the MLB Draft as well by the Colorado Rockies after going 8-5 with a 3.27 ERA in 104.1 innings. The 2015 Gamecocks set a school record as well with over 6,000 season tickets sold. Carolina would finish third in the nation in total attendance with 250,057 fans flocking to watch the Gamecocks play at home.

The 2014 team finished 44-18 and finished ranked as high as No. 22 by the USA Today coaches' poll. South Carolina went 18-12 in the SEC and was one of only two schools in the conference to finish among the top four teams in the league in both 2013 and 2014 and one of four schools in the SEC to win at least 40 games in both 2013 and 2014. South Carolina was also one of only nine schools in the nation to host a NCAA Regional in 2013 and 2014.

Among the highlights in 2014 included a series sweep of in-state rival Clemson. Holbrook's team would claim six SEC series including a pair of wins at eventual national champion Vanderbilt as well as a series victory vs. CWS participant Ole Miss. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fifth-straight year marking the Gamecocks as one of only two schools in the nation to claim that distinction. South Carolina set a total attendance record at 305,564 in 2014, the first time South Carolina eclipsed the 300,000-plus mark.

The 2014 Gamecocks led the SEC with a 2.43 earned run average that ranked ninth in the nation. The pitching staff was among the best in the country with 13 shutouts, fifth-highest in the nation, a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.03, sixth-best in the country and a 1.12 WHIP that was eighth overall. South Carolina hit .281 as a team with a .361 team on-base percentage and fielded .975 as well.

South Carolina would have seven players selected in the 2014 MLB Draft including five players in the first 11 rounds. Highlighting that group was junior catcher Grayson Greiner, who was a third round pick and the No. 99 overall selection by the Detroit Tigers. Greiner was a second-team All-America honoree by Baseball America and Perfect Game and was named the 2013-14 USC Co-Male Student-Athlete of the Year alongside Gamecock football/basketball standout Bruce Ellington. He would also be a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award for the top catcher in college baseball and a member of the SEC All-Defensive team. Greiner played in 60 games with 58 starts, hit .311 (66-for-212) with 39 runs scored, 50 RBI, 13 doubles and eight homers, also a .389 on-base percentage and a .486 slugging mark. Greiner hit a team-best .327 (37-for-113) in league games with four homers and 24 RBI vs. SEC teams. Junior left-handed pitcher Jordan Montgomery was a 4th round selection by the New York Yankees after leading the pitching staff with an 8-5 record and a 3.42 ERA in a team-high 100 innings with 95 strikeouts. Montgomery became the 22nd pitcher in school history to reach the 20-win total as well. Junior infielder Joey Pankake was a seventh round pick by the Tigers. He became the 26th player in school history to tally 200 or more hits with a double in the second inning of the Florida game at the SEC Tournament on May 22. He finished his career with 204 hits in the Garnet & Black. He started 58 games and hit .303 (67-for-221) with a team-high 52 runs scored. Junior outfielder Tanner English went in the 11th round to the Minnesota Twins after manning the center field position the entire year with 62 starts and being named to the SEC All-Defensive team. Joel Seddon also

was selected in the 11th round after earning second-team All-America honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association with 14 saves. He was a second-team All-SEC choice. Junior first baseman Kyle Martin was South Carolina's best hitter with a .336 average (82-for-244) and would be picked in the 20th round but chose to return to school for the 2015 season. Right-handed pitcher Evan Beal rounded out the group as a 21st round choice by the Royals. A Gamecock newcomer also found success as freshman right-handed pitcher Wil Crowe earned Freshman All-America honors as announced by Collegiate Baseball on Wednesday morning. In his first season, Crowe went 8-3 in 15 starts with a 2.75 ERA in 91.2 innings pitched. Crowe allowed just 32 runs, 28 earned, on 76 hits with 19 walks and 59 strikeouts. Crowe was strong in his last start with the Garnet and Black as he pitched four-hit complete game shutout in a 9-0 win vs. Campbell in the NCAA Regional that earned him All-Tournament Team honors. Crowe earned SEC Pitcher of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week also.

The Gamecocks also shined off the field as Greiner continued a streak of a Gamecock making the Capital One Academic All-America teams to four years, following LB Dantzler's Academic All-America Division I Baseball Player of the Year nod in 2013 and Michael Roth's two selections to the first team in 2011-12.

Holbrook's first season as head coach in 2013 saw the Gamecocks compile a 43-20 record and the school's 11th NCAA Super Regional appearance. Holbrook directed the 2013 squad to a final national ranking of No. 12 in the USA Today Baseball Coaches Poll along with No. 13 by Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game and No. 14 by Baseball America.

The 2013 highlights was a series victory against Clemson, four sweeps of SEC teams and six SEC series victories including a pair of wins at LSU, making the Gamecocks the only team to go into Baton Rouge in 2013 and claim a three-game set. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fourth straight year with the Gamecocks going undefeated in three games and continuing a run of 27 straight postseason wins at home including a 16-0 mark at Carolina Stadium. South Carolina ended the 2013 season with a total attendance of 260,605, third highest in the country.

The 2013 team raised its season batting average 19 batting points to .284 with a .375 on-base percentage and a .419 slugging clip. South Carolina led the SEC and ranked 18th in the nation with 52 homers. The 2013 pitching staff was among the best in the nation with a 3.02 earned run average to go along with a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.3 that ranked third best in the nation. South Carolina pitchers averaged 7.8 strikeouts per nine innings while walking just 2.36 batters per contest.

2013 featured third-team All-America designated hitter LB Dantzler. The senior ranked third in the SEC in homers (15) slugging percentage (.617) and walks (42) as well as fifth in total bases (132) sixth in on-base percentage (.444). Dantzler led Carolina in hitting with a .322 average (69-for-214) and was drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays. Senior left-hander Tyler Webb, earned third-team All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and second-team All-SEC honors after anchoring a bullpen with 17 saves. That mark is fifth highest in school history and ranked second in the league and seventh in the nation. Webb struck out 60 batters in 43.0 innings and pitched in 32 games on his way to setting a school record for career appearances with 110 on the mound with the Garnet & Black. Webb was selected in the 10th round by the New York Yankees. Greiner was tabbed second-team All-SEC at catcher as a sophomore and made USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team. He hit .298 (61-for-205) with 10 doubles and 38 RBI. Sophomore shortstop Joey Pankake continued his rise with a .311 average (69-for-214) with 11 homers and 42 RBI. Two Gamecock newcomers recruited by Holbrook garnered Freshman All-America honors. Max Schrock started 61 games at second base and hit .282 with six homers and 49 RBI with 36 walks to just 23 strikeouts and was second-team choice by Baseball America, the NCBWA and Perfect Game. Jack Wynkoop went 7-3 with a 3.09 ERA in 64.0 innings pitched on his way to recognition by Collegiate Baseball.

Holbrook's team succeeded off the field logging its highest cumulative GPA in school history with a 3.201 in the Fall 2012 semester. The Gamecocks maintained a high mark in the Spring of 2013 with a 3.050 GPA. The baseball team had 16 players named to the 2013 SEC Spring Academic Honor Roll. Among those were Dantzler, who was named 2013 CoSIDA Baseball Academic All-American of the Year. Dantzler was a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award. Senior right-hander Patrick Sullivan was South Carolina's male nominee for the 2012-13 Brad Davis SEC Community Service Scholarship.

Holbrook is the only head coach in South Carolina history to have led a team to the NCAA Regionals in his first two years as head coach. His overall winning percentage of .696 is the second-highest of any South Carolina coach in his first two seasons at the helm of the program.
