### Storylines

South Carolina (34-19, 14-13 SEC) closes out the regular season schedule with a three-game SEC series vs. Georgia (35-17, 15-12 SEC) at Carolina Stadium beginning on Thursday night. Thursday and Friday's games are scheduled for 7 p.m. with first pitch on Saturday at 1 p.m. All three games will be televised live on SportSouth and can be heard on the Gamecock Radio Network and at GamecocksOnline.com.

**The Athletics Department will hold a special presentation and ceremony on Friday in the center field plaza at 6 p.m. located near the main entrance to Carolina Stadium. Fans are encouraged to attend the ceremony. The department will unveil a plaque honoring Sarge Frye and his contributions to Carolina Athletics. Carolina Baseball will also honor the senior class before Friday's game. Senior Day ceremonies will begin at 6:45 p.m. on the field.**

South Carolina and Georgia have both clinched spots in this year's SEC Tournament and will be vying for seeding this weekend. Carolina currently sits in third place in the Eastern Division and in the seventh seed position for the tournament. The Gamecocks are one game behind Georgia for second place in the Eastern Division and the fifth seed. Carolina is also just one-half game behind Arkansas for the sixth seed at this year's tourney.

**QUICK HITS**

**GAMECOCKS PICKED 4TH IN THE SEC EASTERN DIVISION**

South Carolina was selected to finish in fourth place in the Eastern Division in the 2009 SEC Pre-season Coaches' Poll that was released on Monday, Feb. 16. Carolina has finished in the upper half of the SEC Eastern Division 12 of 17 seasons since joining the league including nine of 12 years under head coach Ray Tanner.

LSU is the choice to win the 2009 SEC championship with 10 of 11 votes from the head coaches with Georgia selected to win the SEC East as well. In addition to picking a preseason champion, the head coaches voted a predicted order of finish in the SEC Eastern and Western Divisions. Points were compiled on a 6-5-4-3-2-1 basis for each division. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

### QUICK RECAP

Andrew Crisp tied his career-high with four RBI on a pair of doubles and starting pitcher Adam Westmoreland allowed just two runs in 5.1 innings of work as South Carolina defeated USC Upstate 9-2 in game two of a double-header to sweep the twin bill on Tuesday evening at Carolina Stadium. The Gamecocks also earned a 6-3 win earlier in the day over the Spartans. Both games were seven inning contests.

### SOME NUMBERS

On the year, Carolina is hitting .310 (572-for-1843) with 90 HR as well as 382 RBI. Carolina is also second overall in the SEC in slugging percentage (.529) second in hits (572), second in doubles (113) and fourth in home runs (90). The team's .310 average is fifth best in the SEC with its .302 average in conference games also fifth best in the league.

**A LOOK BACK AT TENNESSEE SERIES**

South Carolina had another solid series at the plate batting .328 (39-for-119) vs. the Volunteers with seven homers and 34 RBI as well as 35 runs scored. The Carolina offense has been on a tear with seven consecutive games with double-digit hits. The team is hitting .351 (94-for-268) in its last seven games with 73 runs scored. Carolina has won five of those last seven contests.

**MR. COOPER**

South Carolina junior right-hander Blake Cooper won his second straight start and improved to 7-4 on the year with victory in Sunday's series clinching win over Tennessee. It was arguably his top start of the year as he allowed just one run on five hits to pick up the victory. He has allowed just four earned runs in the last 16 conference innings he has pitched and improved his career win total to 19 at Carolina.

Cooper registered a complete game victory in 11-3 win over Vanderbilt to help Gamecocks sweep the Commodores. It was his second complete game victory of the season and third of his career. He limited Vanderbilt to three runs on 12 hits, did not walk a batter and struck out six in the win.

Cooper is 7-4 on the year with a 4.74 ERA in 68.1 innings pitched.

**MERRIFIELD KEEPS PRODUCING**

South Carolina sophomore Whit Merrifield has been on a tear at the plate as of late. He was a combined 7-for-11 (.636) in Carolina's two victories at Tennessee over the weekend. He tied a career-high for hits with a 5-for-6 day at the plate in the Gamecocks 15-12 comeback win over the Volunteers. His one-out RBI double in the ninth inning tied the game and helped propel Carolina to eventual win. He finished with four RBI in the game and came back on Sunday and helped Carolina clinch the series with 2-for-5 day at the plate. He homered for second consecutive day, an inside the park home run, the first of his career, also drove in three runs.

Merrifield is batting .341 (75-for-220) on the year with 11 HR, 44 RBI as well as 14 doubles and a team-high 62 runs scored. He is third in the SEC in runs scored and is fifth overall in hits. He is also hitting .328 in league games.

Merrifield hit his first career grand slam in the 14-6 win over USC Upstate and set a career-high with five RBI. Merrifield was key in the leadoff role the weekend at Ole Miss with a 5-for-6 day at the plate in the series opener, a 12-10 win over the Rebels. Merrifield's five hits were a season-high by a Gamecock player and the most since James Darnell tallied five on March, 18, 2008 at College of Charleston. He was just one shy of the cycle with three singles, a double and a triple.

**D-MACK DELIVERS**

Junior outfielder DeAngelo Mack owns a 14-game hitting streak and is batting .374 (79-for-211) on the year with 14 HR and 56 RBI. He is third overall in batting average. The Gamecock outfielder is also sixth in the SEC in on-base percentage (.468) and 10th in slugging percentage (.649). He finished 4-for-15 with three runs scored and five RBI at Tennessee in this weekend's games. Mack also leads the team with 25 multi-hit games and is second on the squad with 17 multi-RBI games.

Mack picked up the Tom Price Award as Most Valuable Player for Carolina in the four-game Carolina-Clemson series. He hit a two-run homer and also had a RBI single in the 10-4 win over the Auburn Tigers. Mack was 2-for-5 with a homer and four RBI in the 7-6 win vs. Clemson including a game-winning two-run single in the bottom of the ninth inning.

He tallied his first multi-homer game of his career in the Saturday win vs. Long Beach State. Mack also hit a game-winning solo homer in the 3-1 victory at Clemson on February 28. In addition, he hit a pair of three-run homers in the opening series vs. Duquesne.

Mack started the season in left field for the Gamecocks. He had a strong end to the 2008 season and made his way into the starting lineup late in the year. Mack blasted seven homers including a pair at the 2008 NCAA Raleigh Regional that put him also on the All-Tournament team. Mack joined Whit Merrifield on the Cape this summer with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox.

**BRADLEY, JR. MAKING A NAME FOR HIMSELF**

Freshman outfielder Jackie Bradley, Jr. is continuing his solid first season. Bradley was 3-for-3 in game one of a doubleheader vs. USC Upstate, a 6-3 win.

Bradley hit a key three-run homer in the first inning on Sunday that put the Gamecocks out in front in 15-6 win over Tennessee. He tied his career-high with three RBI in the win on Sunday and hit safely in all three games and extended his hitting streak to seven games. Bradley is at .338 (71-for-210) on the year with nine HR and 37 RBI. He is also second highest on the team in batting average in conference games with a .345 average (38-for-110) with six HR and 21 RBI.

Bradley earned SEC Co-Freshman of the Week honors following his performance in the Gamecocks' weekend sweep vs. Vanderbilt. Bradley, Jr. was stellar at the plate as he hit .643 (9-for-14) in the series with five runs scored, a homer and four RBI. He recorded three hits apiece in all three Carolina victories over the Commodores.

Bradley also is the 2008-09 South Carolina Male New Student-Athlete of the Year.

### BANGS BRINGS IT ON THE MOUND AND AT THE PLATE

Carolina has received a boost recently with the bat and arm of Parker Bangs. The Gamecock sophomore hurled 4.2 innings in the 6-3 win over USC Upstate and did not allow an earned run. He is 3-2 with a 5.40 ERA and 31 strikeouts in 28.1 innings pitched. Bangs also doubled in two runs in the 9-2 win over USC Upstate in the nightcap. He is now hitting .296 on the year with four HR and 32 RBI.

Saturday's 15-12 comeback win over Tennessee had several heroes including sophomore Parker Bangs. The Gamecock utility player hit a three-run homer in the seventh inning, came on in relief in the bottom half of that frame and hurled two perfect innings of relief and struck out all six batters he faced and got the Gamecocks started off on the right foot in the ninth inning of the comeback with a leadoff single.

### CRISP CLIMBS THE LADDER

Senior Andrew Crisp continues to climb the charts in several categories at Carolina. Crisp hit a three-run homer in game one vs. USC Upstate and was 2-for-4 with four RBI in the nightcap. Crisp now leads the SEC with 20 doubles on the year.

Crisp was 6-for-15 (.400) in last weekend's series at Tennessee. His six hits moved him up to sixth all-time at Carolina at 251, passing Mike Curry, Justin Smoak and Hank Small this weekend. Now at 254, Crisp is 11 hits shy of Derick Urquhart (265) and Landon Powell (265) for fourth on the all-time list. He also passed Jeff Parnell on the all-time games played list and is fourth at Carolina with 228 career games, eight shy of Mac White (236) for third place.

Crisp is hitting .338 (74-for-219) on the year with 10 HR and 47 RBI. He had a grand slam home run in the 15-6 win on Sunday.

### BROWN PICKS UP PRESIDENT'S AWARD

Jay Brown of the baseball team won the athletic department's most prestigious award on Tuesday night, The President's Award, which was presented to Brown by University of South Carolina President Dr. Harris Pastides. Brown has graduated with a bachelor's degree in political science and is currently pursuing a master's in public administration. He fought back from Tommy John surgery that caused him to miss the entire 2008 season, and also overcame a serious blood clot diagnosis last fall to contribute to the Gamecock baseball team this spring. Brown is a weekly tutor in the Midlands Reading Consortium at Watkins-Nance Elementary School, while he has also worked with the Harvest Hope Food Bank and volunteered at the Martin Luther King Jr. event in Columbia. He has been twice named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Brown is 3-0 on the year with a 3.58 ERA in 37.2 innings. He has struck out 28 and walked 18.

### DYSON CATCHING ATTENTION

South Carolina sophomore right-hander Sam Dyson is catching the attention of several college baseball media outlets. Dyson has been tabbed by Baseball America in their midseason draft update as the No. 36 best draft prospect in the nation. Dyson almost notched a complete game as he went 8.2 innings in the 8-5 win over Vanderbilt on Friday night. Dyson allowed five runs on nine hits and struck out seven to pick up the win.

He is now 7-4 on the year with a 5.70 ERA and has struck out 68 batters in a team-high 79 innings pitched. Opponents are hitting only .239 against him, that is eighth best in the SEC by a pitcher. His seven-win total ties him for fourth in the conference as well.

He pitched his first career complete game in a 8-3 win over Auburn that helped Carolina to series victory over the Tigers. He retired the last nine batters he faced from the seventh to the ninth inning with five retired by strikeout. He also tied a career-high and set a season-high with eight strikeouts in the win.

**BELCHER SHINES ON THE MOUND**

Freshman left-hander Nolan Belcher gave the Gamecocks a quality start with 7.1 innings of work in the 14-5 victory over Vanderbilt. Belcher allowed five runs on six hits in 7.1 innings.

He is 3-3 on the year with a 5.48 ERA.

Belcher hurled first career complete game in series-clinching victory over No. 14 Ole Miss. He limited the Rebels to just one run on nine hits in 8-1 win. Helped South Carolina to series victory, its first in Oxford since 1998, also the last time a road team has won the series between the Gamecocks and Rebels. He allowed just two runs in victories over nationally-ranked Arkansas and nationally-ranked Ole Miss.

**EBERT SHOWS STRENGTH**

Junior third baseman Nick Ebert is right up at the top in several categories on the SEC leader lists. Ebert is hitting .327 (56-for-171) with 18 HR and 60 RBI on the year including a .472 on-base percentage.

Ebert had a 6-for-11 (.545) weekend at the plate vs. Vanderbilt and homered in all three games. He reached base nine times with six hits and three walks. He tallied three multi-hit games vs. Vanderbilt with two hits apiece in each win. He also tallied three multi-RBI games with two RBI on Friday, four on Saturday and two on Sunday.

The University of South Carolina Athletics Department has established a Fire Relief Fund for two of its own who were affected by the recent fire at a Columbia apartment complex.

Ebert and Adam Nonnemacher, a full-time intern in the athletics marketing department, lost nearly all of their possessions in a fire at the Waterford Apartments off Broad River Road that occurred on February 23. The fire displaced 25 people and caused an estimated \$1 million in damage.

"This is a very difficult time for these two young men who are a part of the Gamecock Athletics Family," said Carolina Athletics Director Eric Hyman. "The Red Cross has assisted in the relief effort, but we wanted to fill in the gaps. We were looking for a way that we could help Nick and Adam recover some of their losses and do so within the framework of the NCAA rules. Former Gamecock pitcher Blake Taylor, a vice president at Southern First Bank, has worked with us to make this a reality."

Contributions are not tax deductible. If there are any proceeds remaining after Ebert and Nonnemacher's needs are met, that money would go to the Red Cross.

**DALLES GETS IT GOING**

Junior catcher Justin Dalles had a good weekend at Tennessee as he hit .500 (6-for-12) with a homer, four RBI and five runs scored. Dalles went back-to-back with Jackie Bradley, Jr. in the first inning of the 15-6 win over the Volunteers.

Dalles is hitting .304 on the year (45-for-148) with 10 HR and 31 RBI. He also has a .326 average with six HR and 18 RBI in SEC games.

**THE HOME RUN**

South Carolina has homered in 40 of 53 games this year with a total 90. The team hit 10 home runs in the weekend series with Vanderbilt and seven home runs at Tennessee. Carolina is 30-10 when hitting at least one home run in a game. Five Gamecocks have reached double digits in home runs; Nick Ebert (18), DeAngelo Mack (14), Whit Merrifield (11), Andrew Crisp (10), Justin Dalles (10).

**ROTH AN OPTION FROM THE LEFT**

Freshman left-hander Michael Roth was a highlight in the Sunday loss at Florida. Roth pitched four innings of scoreless relief and limited the Gators to just two hits.

Roth sports a 1-0 record with a 4.50 ERA on the year in 30 innings pitched. He has 27 strikeouts to just 12 walks and opponents are hitting just .257 against him.

**HANEY HAS GOOD WEEK**

Junior shortstop Bobby Haney has had a solid second half of the season and raised his season batting average to .270 with four HR and 25 RBI. He is hitting .304 (28-for-92) in SEC games as well.

**A LITTLE MORE**

The team is fielding an SEC-best .974 (1393 putouts, 525 assists, 52 errors) and did not commit an error the entire weekend at Tennessee. Carolina's pitching staff is allowing just a .263 average by opponents, that is the third lowest average in the SEC overall.

Carolina continues to be strong in the early innings, outscoring opponents 120-54 in the first two innings on the year. South Carolina is 32-4 in games when it out-hits the opponent. Carolina is also 30-10 when hitting at least one home run. The Gamecocks also have a record of 22-7 when scoring in the first inning.

Matthews finished 2-for-2 with two RBI in the victory, his first multi-hit game of the season.

Matthews is hitting .286 (14-for-49) in 31 games played and has made 11 starts as well. He has three stolen bases. Matthews hit his second home run in the 20-6 win over College of Charleston.

## CUJO

Senior right-hander Curtis Johnson has also been reliable out of the bullpen with opponents batting just .225 against him. He hurled 1.2 scoreless innings in the 14-5 win over Vanderbilt. South Carolina set a season-high with 20 runs scored. Previous high was 15 vs. Long Beach State (3/6/09) and at Furman (3/18/09). The most runs by the Gamecocks since Carolina scored 22 in a 22-5 win over East Carolina on Feb. 23, 2008. The most runs by South Carolina in an SEC game since a 20-3 victory at Mississippi State on March 23, 2007.

Now in his 13th year as head coach at the University of South Carolina, Ray Tanner continues to lead the Gamecock baseball program to unprecedented heights with his commitment to excellence. Over the last decade, Tanner has established one of the premier programs in all of college baseball with milestones and accomplishments piling up each season.

Atop the list are three consecutive trips to the College World Series from 2002-2004. Included in those journeys to Omaha was a national runner-up finish in 2002, a victory over SEC champion LSU in 2003 and three straight wins over perennial powers LSU, Miami (Fla.) and Cal State Fullerton in 2004.

Over the past nine years the Gamecocks own a 428-178 record, the fifth highest win total in Division I Baseball as well as an SEC-best 162-107 mark in conference match-ups. Since the 2000 season, Tanner's squads have reached the NCAA Regionals nine times, made seven NCAA Super Regionals, clinched four SEC Eastern Division titles, earned two SEC Championships and won the school's first SEC Tournament title. Tanner's last nine teams have also featured 19 All-America performers including 2008 consensus first-team All-America first baseman Justin Smoak and shortstop Reese Havens.

South Carolina recorded its ninth consecutive 40-plus win season in 2008 and earned a trip to the postseason and the NCAA Raleigh Regional, where the Gamecocks finished in second place. The 2008 squad featured Smoak and Havens, who along with All-America honors, were selected in the first round of the MLB Draft. Smoak was the 11th overall pick to the Texas Rangers with Havens drafted 22nd overall by the New York Mets. The Gamecocks finished with seven players drafted. Smoak and Havens also earned All-SEC accolades along with third baseman James Darnell and designated hitter Phil Disher. Smoak was a first-team choice with Darnell, Disher and Havens named to the second-team.

Since coming to South Carolina in 1997, Tanner has compiled a 540-243 record, winning over 69 percent of baseball games USC has played. The winning percentage is second highest all-time among SEC coaches behind legendary LSU coach Skip Bertman. Coach Tanner is in his 22nd season as head coach in collegiate baseball and owns an overall record of 935-416-3 with 17 appearances in the NCAA Tournament as a head coach at NC State and South Carolina.

The seven NCAA Super Regional appearances in the last nine years makes Carolina one of only five teams in the nation since 2000 to accomplish the feat. Under Tanner's leadership, the Gamecocks also own nine consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament, the longest current streak among the 12 SEC schools.

Tanner became the fourth fastest active coach to reach the 800-win plateau in the 2005 season. He has averaged over 44 wins a season and is currently the eighth winningest active coach in Division I college baseball by winning percentage.

Tanner has also gained valuable experience at an international level in his association with USA Baseball. He has served five stints with Red, White & Blue including his latest in 2003 as head coach for the USA National Baseball Team. At the helm of some of the top freshmen and sophomores in the country, Tanner's club finished with a 27-2 record, the best record for a U.S. National Team (.931 winning percentage) and won a silver medal at the 2003 Pan American Games. He was named the U.S. National

Coach of the Year for his work that season. Prior to his head coaching stint, Tanner served as an auxiliary coach for the 2000 Olympic Team under Tommy Lasorda that won a gold medal at the XXVII Olympiad in Sydney, Australia. He was also an assistant with the 1995-1996 USA teams under former LSU coach Skip Bertman that culminated in a bronze medal win at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga. Tanner also served alongside former Mississippi State coach Ron Polk on Bertman's staff. Tanner's first stint with USA Baseball came as an assistant coach to the national team in the summer of 1993.

Tanner was named the South Carolina head coach June 14, 1996 after nine successful seasons at North Carolina State.

The 1997 Gamecocks compiled a 33-24 record in Tanner's initial season and qualified for the Southeastern Conference post-season tournament. The 1997 team produced a first-team All-America player in designated hitter Ryan Bordenick. Bordenick and pitcher Brett Jodie were named to the All-SEC team and shortstop Adam Everett was chosen to play with the USA National Team. Bordenick and catcher Rob Streicher were named All-South.

The 1998 team was ranked among the top 20 in the nation, compiled a 44-18 record and earned a bid to the NCAA playoffs with Tanner earning SEC Coach of the Year. Pitcher Kip Bouknight, outfielder Mike Curry and shortstop Adam Everett were named first-team All-SEC. Bouknight, Everett, Curry and Bordenick picked up All-America recognition and pitcher Peter Bauer was named Freshman All-America.

The 1999 team won South Carolina's first Southeastern Conference Eastern Division championship and finished with a 35-23 record. It produced a first team All-SEC designated hitter Tim Angiolini with shortstop Brian Roberts making the second team. Roberts led the NCAA in stolen bases with a school record 67 and also earned All-America recognition. Four players from the 1999 squad signed professional contracts.



Tanner's 2000 South Carolina team won the Southeastern Conference championship, a regional championship, advanced to a super regional and finished with a 56-10 record. The 2000 team was ranked first in the final Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) compiled by the NCAA and among the top ten in the three national final polls. *Baseball America* ranked the Gamecocks fourth, *Baseball Weekly* eighth and *Collegiate Baseball* ninth. In addition, Tanner was named National Coach of the Year as well as SEC Coach of the Year for a second time. Pitcher Kip Bouknight, 2000 consensus All-America, won the Golden Spikes Award for the nation's top amateur baseball player and finished the year with a 17-1 record. Bouknight and pitcher Scott Barber were first team selections on the 2000 All-SEC squad and pitcher Peter Bauer, outfielder Nate Janowicz and shortstop Drew Meyer were on the All-SEC second-team.

His 2001 Gamecocks finished with a 49-20 record, won a regional and advanced to a super regional finishing in the top 15 in the national final polls. Carolina was 12th in the *Baseball America* poll, 13th in *Baseball Weekly* and 15th by *Collegiate Baseball*. The 2001 Gamecocks battled through the loser's bracket to win a second straight regional championship but lost a 3-2 heartbreaker to Stanford in the third and deciding super regional game at Palo Alto, Calif. Tanner's 2001 squad produced two All-America players in pitcher Lee Gronkiewicz, the nation's leader in saves, and catcher Tim Whittaker, who was also a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award. Outfielder Garris Gonce, Gronkiewicz and outfielder Marcus McBeth were All-SEC.

In 2002, Tanner and his Gamecocks made it to Omaha and stayed 12 days to finish as National Runner-up. It was the first trip for Tanner and culminated in a national championship showdown between South Carolina and Texas. The Gamecocks won their second SEC championship in three years and Tanner was named 2002 America Baseball Coaches Association South Region Coach of the Year and South Carolina was ranked as the number two team in the nation in all of the final polls. The final 2002 record was 57-18, topping the school record of 56 wins set two years earlier.

The 2002 team won four games in the SEC Tournament after winning the official conference title with a 21-8 record in conference games. The Gamecocks then defeated Virginia Commonwealth and North Carolina twice to advance to the super regional for the third year in a row. The Gamecocks won two of three from defending national champion Miami (Fla.) to advance to the College World Series in Omaha. It took a five run ninth inning rally to defeat the Hurricanes in the deciding game. After being shut out 11-0 by Georgia Tech to open the 2002 World Series, Tanner's team fought back. Carolina defeated home state favorite Nebraska 10-8, Georgia Tech, 9-5, and Palmetto State archrival Clemson twice, 12-5 and 10-2, before losing the title game to Texas 12-6. It was South Carolina's third second place finish in Omaha. The Gamecocks were also runners-up in 1975 under coach Bobby Richardson and in 1977 under coach June Raines.

Three of Tanner's players; first baseman Yaron Peters, pitcher Blake Taylor and shortstop Drew Meyer earned All-American honors. Peters was the SEC Player of the Year, and Taylor led the nation in saves with 21. Meyer was a first round pick, the 10th overall choice in 2002 and the third consecutive Gamecock shortstop to be drafted in the first round.

South Carolina returned to the College World Series in 2003 and notched one win, an 11-10 slugfest over fellow SEC member LSU wrapped around a pair of losses to CWS runner-up Stanford. The final record in 2003 was 45-22 and in the final national polls the Gamecocks were ranked 6th by *Collegiate Baseball*, seventh by *Baseball Weekly* and 10th by *Baseball America*.

To get to Omaha a second straight time South Carolina won its fourth SEC Eastern Division championship, a fourth consecutive NCAA regional championship and a second consecutive super regional.

The 2003 Gamecocks swept the Atlanta regional tournament hosted by Georgia Tech with a win over East Carolina and two over Stetson and then swept two super regional games against North Carolina at Sarge Frye Field. Two of Tanner's 2003

players, pitcher David Marchbanks and third baseman Brian Buscher, earned All-America recognition. Marchbanks was also SEC Pitcher of the Year and he, Buscher and Landon Powell were named All-SEC. Seven 2003 Gamecocks were drafted and three others signed as free agents.

South Carolina made its third straight trip to Omaha in 2004 when the Gamecocks finished with a 53-17 record and in the process set or tied 20 school records. Four of Tanner's players earned All-American honors in 2004, catcher Landon Powell and pitchers Chad Blackwell, Matt Campbell and Aaron Rawl. Powell and Blackwell also earned All-SEC honors along with Brendan Winn. Six Gamecocks were drafted and signed professional baseball contracts in the 2004 season including Powell and Campbell, who were selected in the first round of the MLB draft, the first time in history that two USC players were taken in the first round. Carolina finished the year ranked third in the country in all three national polls.

USC had another successful season in 2005 that saw the Gamecocks earn a spot in the NCAA Atlanta Regional. Carolina finished 41-23 and reached the final game of the NCAA Regional. Senior first baseman Steve Pearce earned All-American honors and was named NCBWA District IV Player of the Year. Junior shortstop Steven Tolleson joined Pearce on the All-SEC team. Pearce, Davy Gregg, Aaron Rawl and Zac McCamie all signed professional baseball contracts at the end of the season. The Gamecocks finished the season ranked 21st by *Sports Weekly* and 25th by *Baseball America*.

Carolina earned another trip to the postseason in 2006 and won the NCAA Charlottesville Regional before falling one win shy of a trip to Omaha and the College World Series by winning the first game of the NCAA Super Regional in Athens. Despite a young team, Tanner molded together a group that saw four players earn All-SEC honors including first team outfielder Michael Campbell and second team honorees Robbie Grinestaff (designated hitter), Reese Havens (shortstop) and Wynn Pelzer (relief pitcher). In addition to freshman Reese Havens earning All-SEC accolades, first baseman Justin Smoak, outfielder Andrew Crisp and starting pitcher Mike Cisco were named to the SEC All-Freshman team. The seven Gamecocks honored were the most players from an individual school to be recognized by the conference coaches in 2006. Smoak and Crisp also received national recognition with Freshman All-America honors. Carolina finished 2006 ranked 12th by *Collegiate Baseball* as well

as 13th by *Baseball America* and 15th in the *Sports Weekly/ABCA coaches'* poll.

South Carolina recorded its eight consecutive 40-plus win season in 2007 and achieved a ranking as high as No. 1 in the nation during the year. Carolina earned a trip to the postseason and won the NCAA Columbia (S.C.) Regional before falling one win shy of a trip to Omaha and the College World Series by winning one game in the NCAA Super Regional in Chapel Hill.

The 2007 team featured two All-America players in first baseman Justin Smoak and designated hitter Phil Disher. Disher would also earn first-team All-SEC honors along with second baseman Travis Jones. Smoak picked up a second-team All-SEC selection along with third baseman James Darnell. *Baseball America* and the *USA Today/ESPN coaches'* poll ranked South Carolina at No. 10 at the end of the season with the Gamecocks also coming in at No. 11 in *Collegiate Baseball's* final rankings.

Before arriving to Columbia as head coach of the Gamecocks, Tanner led his alma mater NC State to seven appearances in the NCAA postseason tournament and ranked second for most wins in school history. He was the 1990 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year and in 1993 was named Atlantic Region Coach of the Year when his team won 49 games.

While he was head coach a NC State for nine seasons, Tanner was affiliated with the Wolfpack baseball program for more than 20 years. He came to the Raleigh campus in the fall of 1976 as a player following an outstanding career at South Johnston High School in Four Oaks, N.C. A four-year starter at shortstop and third base, he earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors his senior season and still ranks among the Wolfpack's all-time leaders in several categories.

Following his playing career, Tanner served as an assistant for NC State coach Sam Esposito, overseeing recruiting efforts and coaching third base.

When Esposito retired, Tanner moved up at the age of 28, becoming one of the youngest head baseball coaches in the nation. During his tenure as an assistant, the Wolfpack reached the NCAA Tournament twice. He had additional duties as assistant to the athletics director and as assistant athletics director in charge of game operations.

Tanner has a bachelor of science degree in recreational administration (1980) and Master's of public affairs, public administration (1983) from NC State.

Born Donald Ray Tanner, Jr., March 25, 1958 in Smithfield, N.C., Tanner grew
