

## GAMECOCK ALL-AMERICANS



**Andrew Adams** 2015 (S)

Adams shook off early injury that kept him out of the fall lineup to lead the Gamecocks to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006 and then kept that momentum in the NCAA Singles Championships. There he opened with a dominant win over the No. 3 player in the nation then topped an SEC rival for a spot in the round of 16.



**Stephane Simian** 1989 (S/D), 1990 (S)

The program's third multiple All-American selection, Simian ranked as high as No. 5 in the ITA Rankings during his career. He led the Gamecocks to the 1989 NCAA Semifinals and captured the Metro singles title at the No. 2 position as a junior and at No. 1 as a senior. As a senior, Simian reached the semifinals of the ITA All-America Championships and won 12 consecutive matches while posting 49 total singles victories.



**Tsvetan Mihov** 2013 (S)

Mihov became the first All-American under head coach Josh Goffi after the junior transfer reached the NCAA Singles Championship Round of 16, including a first-round win over the No. 2 player in the country. In his first season as a Gamecock, Mihov earned second-team All-SEC honors after recording a 6-4 conference record playing at the top of the lineup, making him just the fourth player in school history to record that many SEC wins from the No. 1 position.



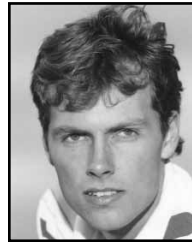
**Ken Diller** 1987 (S/D), 1989 (S)

Diller was a two-time All-American at South Carolina. He compiled a 32-16 singles record and a 26-12 mark in doubles during his junior season in 1987. As a senior, Diller led South Carolina to a win over No. 1 UCLA and a berth in the NCAA Semifinals. He also advanced to the NCAA singles semifinal and quarterfinal rounds during two seasons at UCLA.



**Seth Rose** 2003 (S)

Rose earned All-America honors as a senior. In his career, he participated in the NCAA Singles Championship twice, advancing to the Round of 16 in 2003 after defeating sixth-ranked Janne Holmia of Florida. He was selected the 2000 Region II Rookie of the Year, making him a finalist for National Freshman of the Year. Rose garnered All-SEC honors in 2002 and 2003. He was also a four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll recipient.



**Jan Sandberg** 1985 (S), 1987 (D)

Sandberg became the first Gamecock to earn All-America honors under head coach Kent DeMars. As a freshman in 1985, Sandberg reached the NCAA singles round of 32 and helped South Carolina to its first NCAA berth under DeMars. He was ranked as high as No. 3 in the ITA rankings during his three-year career and is 19th in school history with 72 career singles wins.



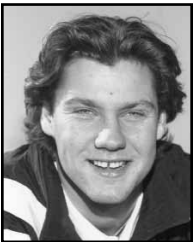
**Guillaume Legat** 2001 (S)

Legat capped his senior season with an ITA No. 4 final ranking, the highest in school history, and advanced to the NCAA Singles Championship semifinals. He capped his season with a 26-7 record that included 17 wins over ranked opponents. A four-time All-SEC selection (first team 1999 & 2001; second team 1998 & 2000), Legat collected 115 career victories. He was undefeated in nine SEC dual matches while playing in the No. 1 position to earn NCAA Region II Senior Player of the Year honors.



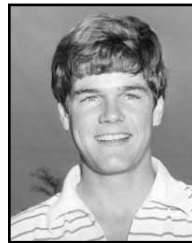
**Arthur Anastopoulo** 1978 (D)

Anastopoulo earned All-America honors after reaching the NCAA Doubles Championship quarterfinals. He also led South Carolina to its first NCAA team tournament appearance that season. He compiled a 76-37 singles mark, placing him 13th on the program's career singles list. In doubles, he posted a 63-29 career record, which ranks him 10th in school history.



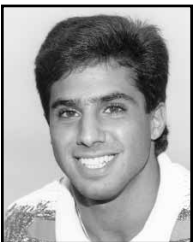
**Johan Sandberg** 1994 (S)

Sandberg became the first Gamecock to earn All-SEC honors and the program's eighth All-American. He was also the first Gamecock to defeat an opponent ranked No. 1 in the nation. Sandberg defeated 12 of the 20 ranked opponents he faced in 1993-94 and participated in the NCAA Singles Championship. He also achieved the highest doubles ranking in school history (No. 5, Fall 1993). Sandberg compiled a 52-47 career singles record and 53-38 career doubles mark.



**Chris Mayotte** 1977 (S/D), 1978 (S/D)

Mayotte was a two-time All-American in singles and doubles at South Carolina. Mayotte also received the 1979 Rafael Osuna Award, signifying outstanding sportsmanship, character, scholastic achievement and tennis playing accomplishments. He advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championships with teammate Arthur Anastopoulo in 1978 and also helped South Carolina make its first appearance in the NCAA team tournament.



**Louie Gloria** 1991 (S)

Gloria earned All-America honors behind a 27-7 singles mark, despite missing all but two dual matches of his senior year due to a stress fracture. He won the Milwaukee Classic, Rolex South Atlantic Regional and South Carolina Region II Fall Invitational during the season. Gloria posted a career record of 99-49, a mark that ranks him ninth on South Carolina's all-time singles victory list. He is also 15th on the career doubles victory list with a 62-24 record.



**Bobby Heald** 1968 (S)

Heald became the first Gamecock All-American after compiling a 26-1 singles record. Finishing his career with a 67-6 mark, he led the 1968 team to an ACC Championship and a 22-0 season record. During Heald's career, the Gamecocks compiled a 57-6 dual match record.

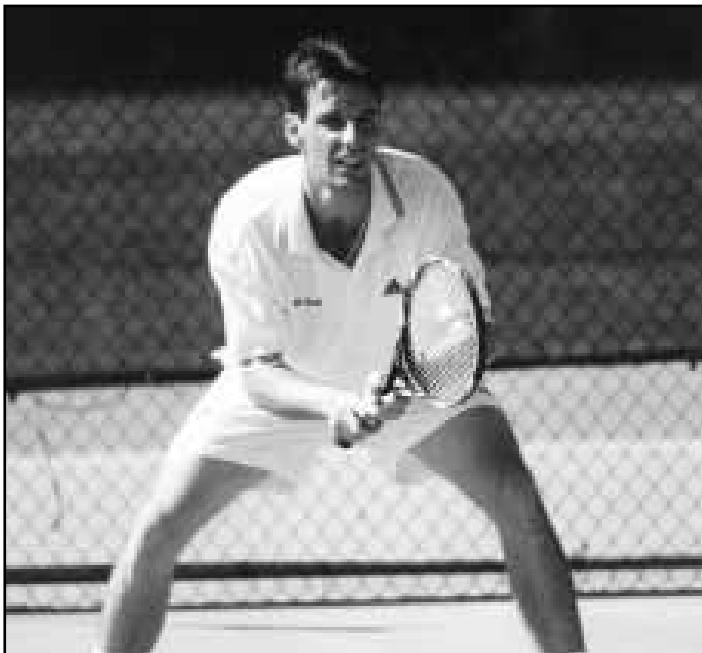
