



## MEN'S BASKETBALL: Titans Try to Rebound in San Diego

**IN A NUTSHELL:** After a disappointing road trip to Nacogdoches, Texas, that saw them lose twice, the Titans are back on the road for a Wednesday night game at San Diego State. It will be a homecoming of sorts for Fullerton forward Jer'Vaughn Johnson, who played two seasons for the Aztecs before transferring to Fullerton before last season.

**SERIES HISTORY:** The Titans trail the all-time series against their former Pacific Coast Athletic Association rivals, 20-10, despite winning four of the last five meetings. The Aztecs snapped a 4-game losing streak to Fullerton with a 63-60 win in San Diego in their last meeting on Dec. 21, 2004. Bob Burton is 0-1 vs. the Aztecs.

**ABOUT THE AZTECS:** San Diego State (6-2) has won three in a row including an overtime win at San Diego and an 8-point win Saturday at UC Santa Barbara. The losses came at Saint Mary's and at Pacific. Four players average in double figures led by Billy White at 13.3 and Tyrone Shelley at 12.7. Freshman Kawhi Leonard averages 8 rebounds and 7.9 points. SDSU is shooting only .296 from the 3-point line but .574 from inside the arc. Opponents are shooting only .374 from the floor.

**THE COACH:** Bob Burton is in his seventh year at Cal State Fullerton with a campus and career record of 110-79. Two losses in Texas dropped his winning percentage to .5820, a tick below Bobby Dye's .583 (109-78) school record from the 1970s. Alex Omalev, who passed away last November at the age of 88, has the most total victories (139-176) followed by George McQuarn (122-117) and then Burton.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** Under Bob Burton, the Titans have made dramatic strides as a road team. In the past five seasons plus three games this year, they are 51-44 (.537) away from Titan Gym (includes 11-11 on neutral floors). For the previous 10 seasons (1994-95 thru 2003-04), the combined road record was 30-115 (.207). With a 3-11 mark in his first season (2003-04), Burton's total CSF road record is 54-55 (.495).

**JOHNSON VS. THE AZTECS:** Jer'Vaughn Johnson is the 34th person to play for the Titans after transferring directly from another Div. I school. He is only the seventh that will face his ex-school and the first to do so in 22 years. Tom Morgan played and won against Boise State in 1977-78 after playing his freshman year (1975-76) with the Broncos. David Wear had games of 26 and 4 points in a pair of losses to Fresno State in 1980-81. Leon Wood led the Titans to a 67-66 win at Arizona on Dec. 1, 1983. Ozell Jones scored 10 points in a loss at Wichita State on Dec. 7, 1982. Gary Moeller averaged 1.5 points and 3.8 rebounds in four wins in four tries vs. UCSB in 1983-85. And Bobby Adair had 8 points and 4 rebounds as Fullerton beat his former Utah team on Dec. 9, 1987, in Titan Gym. Totals: CSF is 7-3 in reunion games.

**NOT THIS TIME:** Not since a trip to Utah State and Idaho on Jan. 20 & 22, 2005, had the Titans failed to fly home with at least one victory from a multi-game road trip -- a span of 16 road trips. They had two 2-0 trips, one 2-1 trip and 13 1-1 adventures between the 0-2s.

**NO DOUBLE FIGURES:** When Bryce Webster and Devon Peltier led the Titans with only 8 points vs. Central Arkansas on Friday, it was the lowest point total for a Titan scoring leader in the program's 36-year Div. I history. In only three other games did no Titan score in double figures -- 9 by Pape Sow vs. USF, Nov. 19, 2005; 9 by Babacar Camara at Valparaiso on Dec. 22, 2000; and 9 by both Ike Harmon and Chris Dade at Utah State n Feb. 7, 1998.

**ANOTHER LOW:** Fullerton's 49 points vs. Central Arkansas were its lowest output since a 77-44 loss at UC Santa Barbara on Jan. 31, 2004. The only other sub-50-point game in the Bob Burton Era was a 57-49 loss at Utah State on Jan. 22, 2004.

**FAST START:** Fullerton was 3-0 out of the gate for the fourth time in the Burton Era. But only in 2006-07 have the Titans made it to 4-0.

**OVERTIME SUCCESS:** Fullerton has won five of its last six overtime games, which covers this season and the previous three.

**STOPPING THE TREY:** In recent years, Fullerton has not had a good 3-point field goal percentage defense -- .367 last year (next to last in the Big West) and .375 the year before. But this season Titan opponents are shooting a frigid .248 (26 of 105) while the Titans are shooting .360 led by Aaron Thompson's 9-for-14 (.643) effort, which is among the nation's leaders.

**HOME BODIES:** Cal State Fullerton has only five games on its 2009-10 schedule outside the state of California --two tourney games in Nacogdoches, Texas, and three in Logan, Utah. Last season the Titans traveled far and wide -- to Honolulu, Portland, Baton Rouge, Las Cruces and Bozeman after a Labor Day exhibition tour to Vancouver, BC.

**SHORT-TERM EXPERIENCE:** Despite five returning lettermen, the Titans have no players remaining on the roster who suited up during the 2007-08 Big West Conference championship and NCAA Tournament season. Jacques Streeter (32), Gerard Anderson (29), Papa Guisse (21), Aaron Thompson (16) and Ray Miller (12) did combine for 110 starts last season.

**DIV. I TRANSFERS:** The Titans have two new Div. I transfers eligible this season in Orane Chin (South Florida) and Jer'Vaughn Johnson (San Diego State) plus two players who began at 4-year schools but came to Fullerton via the community college route (Bryce Webster from Minnesota via Irvine Valley and Eric Williams from Metro State in Colorado via Orange Coast). The Titans have two more Div. I transfers redshirting in Sean Williams from Syracuse and Andre Hardy from Oral Roberts. They bring the total of Div. I transfers to CSF to 13 in the Bob Burton Era and 36 in the program's now 35-year Div. I history.

**SHELTON TO REDSHIRT:** D. J. Shelton, the only freshman in CSF's program, will redshirt this season. The 6-9 forward is a product of East Bakersfield High School. His cousin, Tim Shelton, is on the San Diego State team but nursing a knee injury.

**FALL SIGNEES:** Cal State Fullerton received two national letters of intent in the November signing period:

- De'Andre Haskins is attending Citrus College in Azusa after playing his freshman year at Valparaiso University in Indiana. The 6-foot-4 wing player out of Long Beach Jordan HS averaged 6.2 points and 2.6 rebounds for the Crusaders and, as a lefthander, will draw comparisons to recent Titan Frank Robinson.

- Isiah Umipig is a senior at Federal Way High School and lives in Seattle, Washington. The 6-1 point guard led his team to the Class 4A state championship in 2008-09 and was his team's leading scorer in the championship game win over Garfield, 62-54, in the Tacoma Dome with 19 points on 5-of-9 shooting. He played only 13 games his junior season due to an ankle injury. The title was the first in school history.

The Titans opened the regular season hosting adjacent Hope International and they came away with their fifth win in five tries over the Royals. The 36-point margin of victory was just under the 38.8 point average for the 5-game series.

Fullerton led wire-to-wire. A 9-0 run over less than three minutes turned a 9-8 edge into an 18-8 advantage and the Titans gradually pulled away. The lead was 20 points before the half was out, 30 points midway through the second half and later 40 points as the Titans shot the ball and protected the ball much better than in an exhibition victory five nights earlier over Cal State L.A.

Orane Chin came off the bench firing, hitting 7-of-8 shots on his way to a 16-point first half. Jer'Vaughn Johnson, Bryce Webster and Aaron Thompson each added 8 points before intermission as the Titans built a 53-29 advantage.

All 13 Titans played and all 13 scored.

The win in a home opener was the sixth in a row for Coach Bob Burton, the fourth over Hope International.

Timing is everything it has been said for a long, long time.

The Titans picked a judicious time to first play and then beat UCLA for the first time in 10 tries. They caught the 11-time national champs in a reloading mode after the loss of four starters from a 26-win team. They caught the reorganizing Bruins early in the schedule and disrupted by pre-season injuries. And they caught them on a miserable shooting opening night.

But as time passes, all that will remain vivid is the scoreboard. And a national TV audience got to see all of it as part of a 24-hour marathon of college basketball on ESPN. The midnight start in the East might have discouraged some live viewers, but the constant rehash of the marathon as it progressed including comments from the announcers at the 11 subsequent games gave Titan basketball far more exposure than even an NCAA Tournament contest.

The game was typical for November with poor shooting and lots of turnovers. The Titans went mostly with a zone defense after the first half and dared the Bruins to shoot over it. UCLA didn't hit a trey for 32 minutes and finished 5 for 29. UCLA missed four one-and-ones and game-winning shots in regulation and the first overtime as well as a tying try at the final buzzer. The loss was its first at home to an unranked non-conference foe in 5 years or 37 games.

Fullerton led most of the way and by as many as 10 in the second half. Jacques Streeter scored 7 of his points in the final 10:09. Bryce Webster played the final 16 minutes with four fouls but still managed 14 rebounds.

Basketball is a game of streaks but New Mexico State and Cal State Fullerton took the notion to extremes.

In the backhalf of last year's BracketBuster Game in Las Cruces, the Aggies jumped out to a 25-3 lead 10 minutes into the game. The Titans, perhaps suffering a "UCLA Hangover," made only 1 of their first 15 shots before Bryce Webster scored with 9:15 to play in the half. That basket was followed by three more consecutive Fullerton scores and suddenly the temporary scoreboards (the main one was inoperative) showed 25-11 and the Titans maintained the momentum. They finished the half with a 22-12 run. They scored the first 12 points of the second half to take the lead for good and when the score read 60-42 with 13:13 to play, the Titans had completed a remarkable 57-17 run in 16 minutes.

But the Aggies didn't fold their tents. Utilizing an effective full-court press, NMSU got within four points at 74-70 at 2:02, the end of a 26-12 burst of its own. Jer'Vaughn Johnson converted a 3-point play at 1:46; Jacques Streeter made one of two free throws at 1:08 and Gerard Anderson threw down a dunk at 0:56 to make it 80-70 and the Titans' third victory of the year was secured.

The win snapped a 5-game Aggies' winning streak over the Titans and reduced the former Big West Conference member's all-time edge over Fullerton to 24-8.

The Titans' first overnight trip of the season took them to a rare destination – Texas. Previous Cal State Fullerton teams had played only 12 games in the Lone Star State, winning only three. And, due to a number of problems, that victory total remained unchanged after two games at the Etech Lumberjack Classic at Stephen F. Austin University.

In a predetermined bracket, the Titans opened against a 1-5 Central Arkansas team. Fullerton had not played in 10 days and the rust showed. But more devastating was the condition of Jacques Streeter (flu) and Gerard Anderson (hand injury). Neither scored in limited action and the Bears concentrated their defensive focus on Aaron Thompson, who came into the game second in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage at .667.

The lack of firepower produced the second lowest scoring game in the Bob Burton Era, besting only the 44-point effort In a loss at UC Santa Barbara on Jan. 31, 2004. The Bears finished the first half on a 20-4 run over the final 8 minutes to build a 38-23 lead that was never seriously threatened in the second half as the Titans finished with a 32 percent field goal percentage including only 3 treys in 18 tries.

The combination of poor play and ill health caused Coach Burton to send his starters to the locker room with five minutes remaining as the bench finished out the game.

The second day of the tourney found the Titans playing the host Lumberjacks, who came in with a 4-2 record after an easy win over Southern on opening night. The Titans played much better although Streeter and Anderson were still not up to par. And, despite falling behind early by as many as 11 points, it appeared the Titans had pulled out a gutty road victory.

After losing a 5-point lead midway through the second half, the Titans found themselves down by 4 points with a minute to go. Orane Chin hit a 3-pointer with 52 seconds left to make it a 1-point game. The Titans got a stop and possession for the apparent last shot. Streeter drove to the basket, was knocked to the floor by Eric Bell and got up to sink a pair of free throws with 4 seconds left.

After a timeout, Stephen F. Austin inbounded the ball to 5-foot-7 guard Denzel Barnes. He quickly drove down the floor, into the lane and crashed into 6-foot-7 Jer'Vaughn Johnson. The referee called Johnson for a blocking foul and Barnes sank the tying and winning free throws with half a second showing on the clock.

Coach Burton called the foul the most incredible call he has seen in 40 years of coaching.

So the Titans headed home 3-2 after suffering their first winless multi-game overnight trip in almost five years (losses at Utah State and Idaho in January of 2005).
