PIRATES AIM TO KEEP POSTSEASON HOPES ALIVE IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE AT ST. JOHN'S

For the Seton Hall University men's soccer team the goal for Thursday night's regular season finale at St. John's is simple, with a win the Pirates will keep their hopes alive for securing the sixth and final berth in the BIG EAST Championship. Even with the win the Pirates would still need help from two other matches, but The Hall must pick up three points on Thursday night to keep their hopes alive. St. John's is one of two teams that has been eliminated from postseason contention heading into the final match of the regular season, but the Red Storm picked up a 5-0 win over Seton Hall last year in South Orange.

QUICK HITS

- With only one regular season match to play the BIG EAST playoff picture remains slightly muddled. The top five seeds have already been claimed and three squads remain alive for the sixth and final spot, including Seton Hall.
- The Pirates must win at St. John's on Monday to leap past Marquette and Butler. The Golden Eagles and Bulldogs both wrap up their seasons a day later. Seton Hall would need a Butler loss at Xavier and for Marquette to either lose or tie in its home contest with DePaul.
- Seton Hall is coming off an exciting 3-3 tie against No. 24 Marquette last Saturday night. The Pirates twice held a lead over the Golden Eagles, including a 2-1 margin at the half, but it took a **Mateusz Brela** score in the 74th minute to tie the match.
- Senior **Bolu Akinyode** registered three points in the first half against Marquette, assisting a goal in the second minute and scoring his career-best third goal of the season in the 25th minute. He was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll for the first time in his career.
- The Pirates found offense against the Golden Eagles despite being shutout in back-to-back games leading up to the match. Seton Hall was the first team this season to score three goals on Marquette.
- St. John's is 1-6-1 in the BIG EAST with its conference win coming at home against Butler in double overtime, 3-2.
- The Red Storm are 0-5-1 since that win, scoring three goals over that span.
- All four of St. John's wins have come at home, where it sports a winning overall record of 4-3-2.

SCOUTING THE COMPETITION

SERIES HISTORY VS. ST. JOHN'S

St. John's leads the all-time series with Seton Hall 21-11-3 and the Red Storm picked up a 5-0 win over The Hall in last year's season finale in South Orange. St. John's is 3-0-2 against the Pirates over the last five meetings, with Seton Hall's last victory in the series coming back in 2006. Despite regional proximity, the two programs failed to meet for three-straight seasons from 2010-12 before last year's matchup.

GERSON ECHEVERRY

HEAD COACH • 3RD SEASON • SETON HALL '94

Gerson Echeverry begins his third season as the head men's soccer coach at Seton Hall University.

Echeverry was a standout former student-athlete at Seton Hall from 1990-93 and assistant coach for five seasons under longtime Pirate head coach Manfred Schellscheidt (2002-06).

In just his first season as head coach at Seton Hall, Echeverry led the Pirates to a berth in the BIG EAST Tournament for the first time since 2007, and during the regular season the Hall picked up an upset victory over No. 19 Monmouth.

Echeverry returned to Seton Hall after spending three years as an assistant coach for the United States Soccer Federation Under-17 men's national team and residency program in Bradenton, Fla. His credentials include success as a coach and player at collegiate, professional and international levels.

With the U.S. Under-17 national team, Echeverry planned and implemented training sessions for midfielders and forwards, evaluated future prospects for the residency team and U-17 men's national team, and served as the head coach for the U-16 men's national team in the Mondial Minimes International Tournament in Montague, France.

For five years, Echeverry served as the top assistant coach for the Seton Hall men's soccer program posting an overall record of 47-38-12 during his tenure. Seton Hall advanced to the BIG EAST Championship game in 2004 and earned three-straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2003-05.

As a player Echeverry stands as one of the finest to ever wear a Seton Hall uniform. He ranks fourth in school history with 114 points, third with 32 assists and sixth with 41 goals.

Echeverry's 1991 campaign still ranks as one of the best single-season performances in program history. That year, he finished the season third in the nation with 52 points while leading the Pirates to the BIG EAST Championship. For his efforts, Echeverry was named the Most Outstanding Player of the BIG EAST Championship, BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year and a Third-Team All-American.

Following his collegiate career, Echeverry played professionally in Colombia as well as with the NY/NJ Metro Stars and D.C. United of Major League Soccer. He holds a professional U.S. Soccer Federation "A" license.

LAST TIME WE MET...

St. John's led 1-0 at the half in last year's season finale but scored four second half goals to earn a 5-0 win. The Pirates ended that game playing two men down after having a pair of defenders sent off after receiving red cards. Three of St. John's scores came after the two red cards were issued, which came just 1:08 apart in the second period. Five different players scored for St. John's while **Samuel Geiler** had three shot attempts, two on goal for The Hall.

PLAYOFF PICTURE

Three teams are still alive for the sixth and final BIG EAST Conference playoff berth including Seton Hall, Marquette and Butler. Butler currently sits in sixth with eight points, followed by Marquette (7) and then Seton Hall (6). Seton Hall must win in order to have a chance at finishing sixth. From there the Pirates need Butler to lose at Xavier and for Marquette to either lose or tie in its finale against DePaul.

AKINYODE NAMED TO HONOR ROLL

Senior midfielder **Bolu Akinyode** landed on the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll for the first time in his career after recording three first-half points in the tie with No. 24 Marquette on Nov. 1. Akinyode had the assist on **Victor Manosalvas'** goal in the second minute, then gave the Pirates a lead for a second time when he scored in the 25th minute. Akinyode has scored a career-best three goals to go along with two assists for eight points this season, which ranks third on the team.

MANOSALVAS TAKES OVER TEAM SCORING LEAD

With his goal in the second minute against No. 24 Marquette on Nov. 1, redshirt senior midfielder **Victor Manosalvas** regained the lead in goals scored and total points for the Pirates. He has netted a career-best six goals this season, which along with two assists give him 14 points for the year. Manosalvas had just one goal and seven assists for nine points prior to this season.

BRELA CONTINUES CAREER YEAR

Senior defender **Mateusz Brela** scored in the 74th minute against No. 24 Marquette on Nov. 1, netting his career-best third goal of the season. Brela ranks fourth on the team in scoring with three goals and an assist for seven points. He had just two points in his career prior to this season, scoring at Monmouth last year. For his career he has played in 68 matches making 57 starts, and has served as a team captain for three-straight years.

BLANKING THE COMPETITION

After earning a 0-0 draw at Butler on Oct. 29, Seton Hall has now posted a pair of shutouts during BIG EAST play, also beating Georgetown University, 1-0, on Oct. 18. It is the first time since the 2009 season the Pirates have blanked more than one conference foe; the year they tied No. 15 St. John's and Marquette, both 0-0.

LONG TIME COMING

With its 1-1 draw at Villanova on Oct. 15, Seton Hall earned its first BIG EAST road point since a 1-1 draw at Providence on Oct. 17, 2009. The Pirates' last BIG EAST road victory came during that same season in the conference opener at Syracuse.

PIRATE PAIR HONORED

For the first time this season, Seton Hall saw a pair of student-athletes earn BIG EAST individual recognition as **Julian Spindler** was named the conference Goalkeeper of the Week and **Shawn Morrison** the Defender of the Week, it was announced Oct. 20. Spindler is the Goalkeeper of the Week for the first time in his career, and received the honor after tying his career-high with eight saves in a 1-0 shutout over No. 3 Georgetown. Morrison assisted on the game-winner in that victory and also helped anchor the SHU defense at outside back. He is the first SHU student-athlete to be named Defender of the Week since Christos Zisimatos on Oct. 23, 2005.

TOPPLING A RANKED FOE

With its win over No. 3 Georgetown on Oct. 18, Seton Hall picked up a win over a ranked opponent for a fourth-straight season. It was also the first time The Hall took down a top-five team since the beginning of that streak, a 1-0 win over No. 3 Connecticut on Oct. 30, 2011. The Pirates are 1-3-2 against teams ranked in the NSCAA Top-25 poll this season.

LOMANTO'S GAME WINNER

Senior forward **Andrew LoManto** came up with the game-winner, a 15-yard shot far post in the 69th minute, in a 1-0 win over No. 3 Georgetown on Oct. 18. It was the first goal of the season for LoManto and the third of his career. LoManto came up with the difference making score for the second time in his career and the first since 2012, when he factored in a 2-1 overtime victory against Rider.

TRY, TRY, TRY AGAIN

In a statistical oddity, the Seton Hall men's soccer team was awarded three penalty kicks in the same game at Villanova on Oct. 15, with all three calls coming on hand balls in the box in the second half. The Pirates trailed at the time of all three whistles, and missed the first two attempts before senior **Kai Greene** stepped up to convert and tie the match in the 88th minute.

UNBEATEN IN OT

During the **Gerson Echeverry** era, Seton Hall has boasted an impressive record during overtime contests. In fact, the Pirates have not lost in overtime during Echeverry's three seasons as head coach. SHU has played 10 matches that reached extra time over the past two-plus seasons, posting a 4-0-6 record in those contests. Seton Hall's last overtime loss came against Marquette, 3-2, back on Oct. 20, 2010.

ON THE BOARD

Freshman midfielder **Patrick Burd** netted the first goal of his career in the Pirates' 3-2 loss at No. 11 Creighton on Oct. 4, one-timing a deflection from the 18-yard line into the upper 90. Burd has made a significant impact during his first season at Seton Hall, appearing in 13 matches with 12 starts.

EARLY DEFICITS

Falling behind early in matches has plagued Seton Hall so far this season, as the Pirates are 0-7-2 when allowing their opponents to score first in 2014. Seton Hall is 0-6-1 when trailing at the half.

SETUP MAN

Sophomore **Samuel Geiler** led Seton Hall in scoring with eight goals last season, but so far this year the dynamic midfielder has taken on a different role for the Pirates, getting his teammates in on the action. Geiler currently leads the team with four assists, dishing out two against Princeton on Sept. 15, which tied a career-high.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

After landing on the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll for the second time this season, sophomore goalkeeper **Julian Spindler** received some national recognition for his strong play as he landed on the TopDrawerSoccer National Team of the Week. Spindler made seven saves, including a critical stop in double overtime to help the Pirates post a 0-0 shutout against No. 18 George Mason on Sept. 19.

KEEPING THEM SCORELESS

Seton Hall gave up a season-high five goals to Princeton on Sept. 14, but bounced back to post shutouts in its next two matches, blanking No. 18 George Mason in a 0-0 draw and defeating Monmouth, 1-0. It is the first time the Pirates held consecutive opponents without a goal since beating Saint Peter's and Pittsburgh, 1-0 and 4-0 respectively, during the 2010 season.

SPINDLER BACK ON THE HONOR ROLL

Sophomore goalkeeper **Julian Spindler** was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll for the second time this season after making a career-high seven saves in a 0-0 shutout against No. 18 George Mason on Sept. 19. Spindler's key moment of the game came in the second overtime, when he made an acrobatic save on a Timi Mulgrew header in the 102nd minute to preserve the scoreless draw. It was the first shutout against a ranked foe for Spindler in six attempts.

STRAIGHT ZEROS

Seton Hall played No. 18 George Mason to a scoreless draw on Friday, Sept. 19, marking the first time this season the Pirates failed to score at least one goal. It was Seton Hall's first match where neither team scored since The Hall tied then No. 1 Maryland, 0-0, on Sept. 20, 2011.

MANOSALVAS NAMED BIG EAST OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After scoring three total goals against Delaware and Princeton, redshirt senior **Victor Manosalvas** was named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 15, for the first time in his career. Manosalvas is the first Pirate to earn the award since George Velazquez did so on Oct. 21, 2013, and it is the first time he has received any conference weekly accolade. His two goals against Princeton on Sept. 14, were a career-best, and came just over eight minutes apart in the second half.

BRELA RECORDS POINTS IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

Senior **Mateusz Brela** recorded points in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. He registered his first-career assist on a second half goal at Delaware on Sept. 10, and headed in a game-tying score in the first half against Princeton on Sept. 14, the second goal of his career. Brela now has a career-high seven points.

EXTENDED SUMMER VACATION

Seton Hall's two leading scorers **Victor Manosalvas** and **Kai Greene** both entered the season with a lot of momentum coming off of successful work in the summer, which has definitely carried over to The Hall's benefit. Manosalvas, who leads SHU with 14 points on six goals and two assists, led the Red Bulls U-23 team to a league title before being named the top player of the league. Greene shined during the exhibition season, thriving after being moved to striker when he scored five goals in two matches; his five goals this season are the best single-season output of his career.

JULIAN SPINDLER LANDS ON WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

Sophomore goalkeeper **Julian Spindler** was named to the BIG EAST Men's Soccer Weekly Honor Roll on Sept. 1, for the second time in his career. Spindler allowed just one goal in a 1-0-1 opening week for The Hall, boasting a .900 save percentage and 0.45 goals against average. He stopped five shots, just one shy of his career-high, in a 2-0 shutout victory over UMass Lowell on Aug. 31, posting his first shutout of the season and the third of his career.

MANOSALVAS ENDS GOAL DROUGHT

Redshirt senior midfielder **Victor Manosalvas** converted a penalty kick against UMass Lowell on Aug. 31, ending a scoreless drought that dated back to his freshman season in 2010. Looking to take on a greater role in the Pirates' offensive production this season, Manosalvas ranks first for The Hall with 14 points, six goals and two assists, through 16 matches. He has seven goals and nine assists in 58-career games.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG EAST

Coming off a stellar rookie campaign that earned him a spot on the BIG EAST All-Rookie team, sophomore midfielder **Samuel Geiler** was selected as one of 15 members of the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team when the conference preseason awards were announced on Aug. 19. Geiler started all 18 games in the midfield for the Pirates last season, leading the team in goals (8) and points (20) while also racking up four assists. During BIG EAST play, he was second on the team in scoring with two goals and two assists. He was named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week after scoring three times over the first week of his collegiate career and netted a pair of game-winners on the season.

HALL PICKED NINTH IN PRESEASON COACHES POLL

Seton Hall was picked to finish ninth in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Pirates were 7-9-2 overall last season and 3-6 in conference play, finishing in a tie for eighth place in the league. Seton Hall returns nine starters and 20 letterwinners from last year's team. Georgetown and Marquette both received 75 points in the preseason poll, with the Hoyas gaining an edge with five first-place votes. The Creighton Blue Jays picked up the final first-place tally.

HALL TIME GREAT

Seton Hall head men's soccer coach **Gerson Echeverry** was one of the most dominant offensive players to ever wear a Seton Hall uniform and his name will forever be listed amongst the greatest student-athletes in school history as he was inducted into the Seton Hall University Athletic Hall of Fame on June 10, 2013. Echeverry was the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year in 1990 and led Seton Hall to the BIG EAST Championship in 1991, a season in which he finished third in the nation in scoring with 52 points. He still ranks sixth in program history in goals scored (41) and third in assists (32).

SUMMER SUCCESS

Redshirt senior midfielder **Victor Manosalvas** enjoyed a stellar summer season playing with the New York Red Bull U23 team in the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL). Manosalvas led the Red Bulls in scoring with 12 goals and seven assists, helping guide his squad to the NPSL title with a 3-1 win over Chattanooga FC. For his spectacular play, he earned the 2014 Mitre Golden Ball as the league's top player and was also a recipient of the Puma Golden Boot Award, recognizing the league's top goal scorer.

IMPRESSIVE RETURNS

In returning nine starters from last season the Pirates also welcome back five of their top seven scorers from last season. In addition to welcoming back sophomore midfielder **Samuel Geiler**, who led the squad in goals (8) and points (20) in 2013, Seton Hall also returns senior forward **Kai Greene** redshirt sophomore forward **Danny Bartok** and senior midfielder **Konrad Plewa**, all three of whom finished with a pair of goals last year. Redshirt senior midfielder **Victor Manosalvas** finished with five assists as the leading setup man for The Hall.

PIRATES NAME PAIR OF CAPTAINS

Seton Hall head coach **Gerson Echeverry** has named a pair of captains for the 2014 season, senior midfielder **Bolu Akinyode** and senior defender **Mateusz Brela**. Brela is serving as a team captain for a third-straight season while Akinyode has been selected as a team captain for the first time in his career.

MEET THE NEW PIRATES

Seton Hall has added six new faces to the program for the 2014 season, with an emphasis on adding depth in the midfield and along the backline. Head coach **Gerson Echeverry** inked five freshman in the offseason including midfielder **Patrick Burd (Hillsborough, N.J.)**, midfielder **Jakub Golabek (Elmwood Park, N.J.)**, defender **Nick Najera (Laguna Hills, Calif.)**, defender **Lukas Pangonis (Kaunas, Lithuania)** and defender **John Philbin (Emmaus, Pa.)** and midfielder **Mario Prata (Dracut, Mass.)**.

FACING THE BEST

Once again head coach **Gerson Echeverry** has put together a challenging non-conference schedule for the Pirates, which when combined with their BIG EAST foes, features eight teams that competed in the NCAA Tournament last season. On the non-conference slate, Delaware, George Mason and Drexel all saw postseason action in 2013, while The Hall also faces perennial regional powers Monmouth and Princeton.

POWER CONFERENCE

The BIG EAST Conference has long been considered one of the strongest soccer leagues in the nation and last season was no exception, with the new iteration of the league resulting in five of the 10 squads competing for a national title in the NCAA Tournament. Providence, Marquette, Georgetown, St. John's and Creighton all qualified for the NCAA Championship, with the Red Storm earning an at-large berth without qualifying for the BIG EAST Tournament. Defending BIG EAST Champion Marquette, and Georgetown, who was the national runner-up in 2012, both advanced to the Sweet 16.

NEWARK, DEL. - The Seton Hall University men's soccer team saw its upset bid at No. 21 Delaware fall short as the Blue Hens struck twice in a span of just 38 seconds to come back to beat the Pirates, 3-2, on Wednesday night.

Seton Hall held a 2-1 lead with fewer than 20 minutes to play when Delaware strung together a pair of scores in quick succession to seize control of the contest. Thibault Philippe provided the game-tying strike, sending a free quick from 25-yards out into traffic in front of the SHU net, with the deflection rolling past sophomore keeper Julian Spindler (Weiersbach, Germany).

Spindler made several spectacular saves throughout the match, including two key stops early in the second half that helped the Pirates maintain a tie before eventually taking a lead, but there was nothing he could do to stop the eventual game winner.

Shortly after action resumed, Joe Dipre controlled the ball 30-yards out from the Pirate net on the left side and directed a perfectly placed shot past Spindler and into the upper 90. Seton Hall pressed over the final 18 minutes of action but was unable to generate any strong attempts on frame, as the Blue Hens hung on for the win.

After falling behind 1-0 in the 18th minute on Wednesday night, red-shirt senior Victor Manosalvas (Clifton, N.J.) scored his second goal of the year to tie the contest before the half. In the 34th minute, sophomore Samuel Geiler (Offenburg, Germany) played a corner on the right side near the net, only to see keeper Borja Barbero deflect the pass out of harm's way.

Barbero failed to clear the zone, as SHU senior defender Mateusz Brela (Kielce, Poland) chased down the loose ball. He sent a beautiful cross back into the area, where Manosalvas received it at the far post, heading in the score.

Delaware started strong in the second period, controlling play for the first 15 minutes and registering the first three shots attempts of the half, only to see Spindler keep its offense at bay, making a save on a point blank shot off the foot of Guillermo Delgado in the 54th minute.

Finally in the 62nd minute Seton Hall broke the tie with its second goal of the night coming off a set piece. A foul call 30-yards out from the Blue Hen net gave the Pirates a free kick. Geiler initiated the play, sending a pass in to senior forward Kai Greene (South Orange, N.J.), which he headed past Barbero to give The Hall its first lead of the night.

Spindler continued to make acrobatic plays in net, diving to his right to make a tremendous save on a Dipre line shot off a free kick in the 67th minute. For the night he was credited with three saves, but he made several additional plays to keep the Pirates in the game against one of the most potent offensive teams in the country; Delaware entered the night averaging 3.5 goals per game, the fifth-best mark in the nation.

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J. - The Seton Hall University men's soccer team lost a high-scoring back-and-forth affair against the Princeton University Tigers, 5-4, on Sunday afternoon, with Princeton's Julian Griggs netting the game-winner with just 28 seconds remaining in regulation.

The Pirates trailed 2-1 at the half before using back-to-back goals from redshirt senior Victor Manosalvas (Clifton, N.J.) to take their first lead of the game in the 55th minute.

Manosalvas' first score of the day came off a penalty kick. The sequence leading to a foul in the box began with Manosalvas playing a ball to senior Mateusz Brela (Kielce, Poland) on the left side, who quickly directed a pass to a streaking Kai Greene (South Orange, N.J.) in the middle of the field. Greene split a pair of defenders and would have had a free path to the net if not for a foul call, two steps into the area.

On the ensuing penalty kick Manosalvas drove a shot past a diving Ben Hummel toward the left post for his third goal of the year and a second off a penalty kick.

Just over eight minutes later Manosalvas struck again, this time in the run of play. Sophomore Samuel Geiler (Offenburg, Germany) started the play, leading Greene down the left side toward the end line. Greene's speed proved to be too much for his defender, chasing down the through ball, which he settled and passed to Manosalvas at the far post for an easy finish.

The Tigers would bounce back to tied things up in the 67th minute as Myles McGinley found Griggs for a header from 10-yards out, but the game would not stay tied for long.

Seton Hall re-assumed control of the contest as Greene beat Hummel with a sliding shot off an Eric Lagg (Lafayette, N.J.) cross at the near post. Defender Julian Kennedy (Nindorf, Germany) played the ball out to Lagg on the far side of the field, and he drilled a pass to Greene to help the Pirates take a 4-3 lead.

It was the first-career assist for Kennedy, and Lagg's first assist of the season and second of his career. Greene now has a career-best three goals this season, and is second on the team in scoring with seven points.

Princeton drew even by converting on a penalty kick of its own in the 78th minute. Kennedy was whistled for a foul on the far side of the box on a physical play where he tried to take his man off the ball. Cameron Porter scored on the PK to tie the game for a fourth time, and the Tigers would secure the win in the final 30 seconds of action.

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J. - Coming off a disappointing loss to Princeton last weekend, the Seton Hall University men's soccer team bounced back to play the No. 18 George Mason Patriots to a scoreless draw on Friday afternoon at Owen T. Carroll Field.

The Pirates' (1-2-2) defensive effort was highlighted by a career-day in goal by sophomore Julian Spindler (Weiersbach, Germany), who turned away a personal-best seven shots while picking up his second shutout of the season and the fourth of his career.

Of Spindler's seven stops, none were bigger than the acrobatic save he made on a Timi Mulgrew header in the 102nd minute. The dangerous Henning Dirks set up what nearly proved to be the game-winning scoring chance on the left wing, delivering a precision cross to Mulgrew on the far side. His header was on frame, but Spindler went air born and blocked the attempt with his outstretched leg, allowing senior Bolu Akinyode (Lagos, Nigeria) the opportunity to swoop in for the clear.

Seton Hall was facing its second top-25 team in as many weeks, dropping a 3-2 result at No. 21 Delaware last Wednesday night. It was the first tie against a ranked team for The Hall since matching No. 1 Maryland, 0-0, at home on Sept. 20, 2011.

George Mason (5-0-1) failed to pick up a victory for the first time this season, and the Patriots have relinquished just one goal in six matches. Seton Hall's defensive front rebounded from allowing five goals to Princeton last weekend, as the Patriots entered the match as one of the most potent offenses in the nation, averaging 2.6 goals per game.

The Pirates controlled the first half of play on Friday afternoon, nearly scoring on a handful of occasions in the opening period. In the 10th minute, George Mason failed to clear its defensive zone following a pair of Seton Hall corner kicks in short order, eventually committing a foul 20-yards out from net on the right side. Sophomore Samuel Geiler (Offenburg, Germany) bent a shot toward the near post on the set piece, but it was cleared away by Steffen Kraus in net.

In the 26th minute Seton Hall recorded two dangerous chances as Geiler had a shot saved by Kraus, only the rebound found junior Eric Lagg (Lafayette, N.J.) on the left side, where his subsequent shot attempt sailed over the cross bar.

Seton Hall's best chances in the second half came early on, with the Pirates recording four shot attempts over a span of 1:16 starting in the 54th minute. Senior Kai Greene (South Orange, N.J.) had the best looks, with a header off a Geiler cross blocked in the area, before gathering the rebound to shoot a laser off the near post seconds later.

Late in regulation, senior Andrew LoManto (Massapequa, N.Y.) had a couple of chances to win the game, but the Mason defense stood strong.

Off a Jason Wellington (West Palm Beach, Fla.) cross in the 87th minute, LoManto saw a header on net cleared away by Kraus, leading to a corner kick. Geiler sent a pass in off the corner, finding LoManto once again, and this time his header missed left.

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J. - The Seton Hall University men's soccer team will be riding a bit of momentum into the start of BIG EAST play as the Pirates closed out a three-match home stand with a 1-0 victory over Monmouth University on Tuesday night.

Redshirt senior Victor Manosalvas (Clifton, N.J.) continued his capital senior campaign, netting the game-winner in the 33rd minute, his team-leading fifth goal of the season and the first game-winner of his career. Manosalvas, who had scored one goal through his first three seasons at Seton Hall, currently ranks in the top-30 nationally in total goals and points per game.

On Manosalvas' game-winner on Tuesday night, senior midfielder Bolu Akinyode (Lagos, Nigeria) initiated the scoring play, dribbling through the Monmouth defense in the middle of the field.

As he entered the area, Akinyode dumped a pass to senior forward Kai Greene (South Orange, N.J.), who flanked him on the left side, and a moment later, Greene played up to Manosalvas, who was wide open 10-yards out from net, and he converted the easy finish to the far post.

Akinyode recorded his first assist of the season on the play while Greene picked up his second; Greene is second for The Hall in scoring with three goals and a pair of assists for eight points.

Five minutes after giving SHU the lead Manosalvas nearly found the back of the net a second time. Freshman John Philbin (Emmaus, Pa.) played a pass into Manosalvas at the 18-yard line and he bent a screamer toward the far post, missing by little more than a foot.

Late in the second half he recorded his second shot on goal, narrowly missing an opportunity to pad the Pirates' lead once again. Monmouth kept Seton Hall pinned in its own zone for a majority of the second period, but after finally clearing a goal nearly materialized off a counter on the other end.

Freshman Patrick Burd (Hillsborough, N.J.) crossed from the right side to Manosalvas at the near post, and he swiftly placed a header on frame, but Eric Klenofsky had the answer, knocking the shot out of play.

The Hawks had their best look at tying the game with just over 11 minutes remaining, but Julian Spindler (Weiersbach, Germany) came up with the biggest of his four saves on the night to snuff out the attack.

Monmouth's leading scorer Dom Sarle came out of the midfield, and played a pass to Dan Pizzimenti behind the Pirate defense. Spindler made an aggressive play out to the ball, meeting Pizzimenti as he attempted the shot, and sophomore back Shawn Morrison (York, Pa.) was there to clear the ball out of play.

Spindler, who was named to the TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Week after making seven saves against George Mason last Friday, now has a career-high three shutouts, and has posted consecutive clean sheets for the first time in his career. He made four saves against Monmouth and lowered his GAA to 1.40.

Eight minutes later, sophomore Samuel Geiler (Offenberg, Germany) came close to knotting the score.

VILLANOVA, PA. - The Seton Hall University men's soccer team probably came back to tie Villanova, 1-1, on a Kai Greene (South Orange, N.J.) penalty kick in the 88th minute on Wednesday afternoon at the Villanova Soccer Complex.

The hard fought road result came after the Pirates were forced to play the final 7:08 of regulation and both overtime periods down a man, and Greene's PK conversion was actually the third attempt of the day for the Pirates, who had the first two cleared away by Will Steiner earlier in the half.

Seton Hall is now 0-3-1 in BIG EAST play, and earned its first BIG EAST road point in nearly five years; since a 1-1 tie at Providence on Oct. 17, 2009. It was also the first tie in 31 all-time meetings between The Hall and Villanova (6-5-2, 1-2-1), a series SHU now leads 19-11-1.

The Pirates (3-6-3, 0-3-1) were trailing, 1-0, when the first PK opportunity came at 70:54; and all three were a result of a handball in the area. After several failed attempts to make a clear errant pass hit a defender's arm, leading to the whistle. Redshirt senior Victor Manosalvas (Clifton, N.J.) took the shot for The Hall, aiming low and to his right, but Steiner made a diving stop resulting in the first missed PK of the year for SHU.

It seemed as if hope for a comeback was dashed 12 minutes later when freshman Lukas Pangonis (Kaunas, Lithuania) was ejected after receiving his second yellow card of the game, forcing the Pirates to attempt to tie the game with only 10 position players.

However, fewer than four minutes later the Wildcats were once again called for a handball, giving the Pirates another chance, only again failed to capitalize. Sophomore Samuel Geiler (Offenberg, Germany) attempted a shot to nearly the same spot as Manosalvas, and Steiner made nearly the save.

This time the deflection rolled out of the backline, leading to a Seton Hall corner. After Geiler passed it into the zone, Providence made a quick attempt to clear, but amazingly the Wildcats were penalized for a handball for a third time, the latest coming mere moments after the second.

Greene was the next man up to take his shot at tying the game, and this time his conversion was true, stutter stepping towards the net before firing hard and low, straight to the middle of the net, his fifth goal of the season.

To earn a point would still be an uphill climb, down a man heading to extra time, but Seton Hall actually nearly won the game thanks to Geiler's left foot. After beating a defender up the middle of the field four minutes into the first OT, Geiler broke it outside to his left and then ripped a surprising shot far post from 25-yards out. Steiner was caught off guard and dove to his left, missing the ball, which hit the post and bounced out of play.

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J. - Behind senior Andrew LoManto's (Massapequa, N.Y.) score in the 69th minute, the Seton Hall University men's soccer team picked up its most impressive win of the season, blanking the third-ranked Georgetown University Hoyas, 1-0, on Saturday afternoon at Owen T. Carroll Field.

On a play that began in the midfield, redshirt senior Victor Manosalvas (Clifton, N.J.) sent sophomore Shawn Morrison (York, Pa.) on a long run toward the end line down the right side.

The speedy Pirate defender chased down the pass and controlled only a yard or two from the end line, sending a centering pass with his left foot back to the middle of the field.

LoManto, who was wide open coming in 15-yards out from net, received the pass and fired a low shot toward the far post and past a diving Tomas Gomez for the score. It was LoManto's first goal of the season, third of his career, and the second time he netted a game-winner for The Hall.

Seton Hall's (4-6-3, 1-3-1) impressive win was the first over a top-five team since the Pirates defeated No. 3 Connecticut at Owen T. Carroll Field back on Oct. 30, 2011, but it is the highest ranked foe to fall to SHU since head coach Gerson Echeverry took over prior to the 2012 season.

The Pirates had lost six-straight to Georgetown (7-3-4, 2-2-1) and seven of the last eight, picking up their first win over the Hoyas since back in 2006, and the first home victory in the series since 2005. SHU has now defeated at least one ranked opponent for the fourth-straight season.

With the win, Seton Hall strengthened its position in the race to qualify for the BIG EAST tournament, a distinction reserved for the top-six teams in the conference. With four conference matches remaining, the Pirates currently have four points and sit in a tie for fifth place with Marquette, Villanova, DePaul and Butler.

The win would not have been possible without a stellar defensive effort and solid play in goal against one of the most potent offensive threats in the nation. Georgetown forward Brandon Allen entered the game ranked fifth in the country with nine goals, but was largely held in check after the first 20 minutes of action, and was limited to just one shot attempt.

Sophomore Julian Spindler (Weiersbach, Germany) tied his career high with eight saves on the day, picking up his fifth shutout of the season and his first clean sheet against a BIG EAST opponent in his career.

In the 54th minute, Spindler made one of his biggest saves, as he was there to make a stop on a close-range header from Jon Azzinnari, who was attempting to finish a cross near post directly in front of the net.

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J. - The high-scoring Providence College Friars picked up a 3-0 victory over the Seton Hall University men's soccer team on Saturday afternoon at Owen T. Carroll Field.

Providence, the 23rd-ranked team in the country, entered the contest averaging just over two goals per match, the 13th-best mark in the nation, and an early strike in the fourth minute set the tone for the day.

On what proved to be the eventual game winner, an offensive opportunity that was not nearly as dangerous as several that SHU keeper Julian Spindler (Weiersbach, Germany) turned away later in the day, Phil Towler sent a through ball from midfield to Fabio Machado on the left side.

As Machado approached the 18 he unleashed a low shot near post, and Spindler was unable to dive in front to make the save.

As the first half drew on, Seton Hall outshot the Friars 7-4, but many of those attempts were from long range. The best look at a first-half score came from sophomore midfielder Samuel Geiler (Offenberg, Germany), who rifled a shot from 20-yards out in the 19th minute, only to see Keasel Broome leap to his left to make the save.

For the Pirates, Spindler finished the match by tying his career-high with eight saves, the third time this year he has hit that mark, and a majority of those plays were not of the routine variety.

Early in the second period, Towler chipped a shot on frame from 20-yards out, forcing Spindler to leap in the air and punch the attempt straight up in the air, allowing a defender to swoop in and make the clear. Even on his second goal allowed, the sequence started with an outstanding stop.

Dominik Machado fired from inside the area to Spindler's right, and he was there for a stop, only the rebound remained in play for Mac Steeves to clean up for this team-leading eighth strike of the season.

Providence's third goal was the direct result of an SHU giveaway, leaving Spindler with little chance to make a stop. Dominik Machado was credited with an assist, finding Julian Gressel down the left for a break on net, and he scored near side with a shot that was mere inches inside the post.

INDIANAPOLIS, IND. - The Seton Hall University men's soccer team managed to keep pace in the BIG EAST postseason race by earning a 0-0 draw at Butler on Wednesday night.

At 1-4-2 in the BIG EAST, the Pirates now sit in a three-way tie for seventh-place in the conference standings with Butler and DePaul with two matches remaining in the regular season. The top six teams in the 10-team league earn the right to compete for the conference title, with that sixth and final playoff spot currently occupied by No. 24 Marquette, who lost 2-0 at Creighton on Wednesday to fall to 1-3-3 in league play with six points.

Seton Hall is now faced with a tremendous opportunity this Saturday night, when it welcomes the Golden Eagles to Owen T. Carroll Field for its home finale and senior night.

Butler peppered Seton Hall with 18 shot attempts over 110 minutes, but only three of those shots were on target, with sophomore Julian Spindler (Weiersbach, Germany) there to make every stop and pick up his sixth shutout of the season.

Sophomore midfielder Samuel Geiler (Offenberg, Germany) created the most offensive chances of the night for the Hall. Coming off the bench for the first time this season, Geiler finished with a team-high five attempts, two of which came on net, and a bulk of those opportunities came during overtime.

Geiler opened the first overtime session with two shots over the first four minutes, the first of which was saved by Eric Dick, who finished the night with six saves. In the 97th minute Geiler fired again, missing wide of the frame, which was the last shot attempt of the period for either team.

Neither team was on target during the second overtime, where the Pirates' final shot of the game came in the form of Danny Bartok (Union, N.J.) firing over the cross bar in the 107th minute.

Two of Spindler's three saves came during the first half, the second of which followed a Charlie Constantino attempt in the 43rd minute. Earlier in the period, Dick saved a Victor Manosalvas (Clifton, N.J.) shot out of play, leading to the second corner of the game for The Hall, but there was not a second shot attempt during the sequence.

In the 54th minute, Dick stopped Geiler then fewer than two minutes later kept Kai Greene (South Orange, N.J.) from scoring with a save off a header, the final shot on goal in regulation for SHU.

SOUTH ORANGE, N.J. - Senior Mateusz Brela (Kielce, Poland) scored the equalizer in the 74th minute as the Seton Hall men's soccer team played No. 24 Marquette to a 3-3 draw on Saturday night at Owen T. Carroll Field.

With the tie, the Pirates stay a point back of the sixth-place Golden Eagles and are still in contention for the final spot in the BIG EAST Tournament with one match to play.

Sophomore Samuel Geiler (Offenberg, Germany) started the play on Brela's score with a free kick from just past midfield on Marquette's end. After a scramble at the top of the box, the ball fell at Brela's feet. The senior fired with his left foot, with a shot that slid past a diving Charlie Lyon, who watched the ball hit off the right post and roll into the back of the net for Brela's third goal of the season.

The match lived up to its billing from the first touch. Fewer than two minutes into the action, the Pirates capitalized on their first opportunity when senior Bolu Akinyode (Lagos, Nigeria) found a cutting Victor Manosalvas (Clifton, N.J.) along the left side. The senior dashed past a defender and moved into the left side of the box, before putting on a shot that went past a diving Lyon and off the far post for his team-leading sixth goal of the season.

Less than two minutes later, the Golden Eagles cashed in on their first opportunity when David Selvaggi crossed in a free kick from the right side toward the far post. C. Nortey, who delivered the game-winner in Marquette's 2-1 victory over The Hall last season, left right off from where he started with a header just inside of the near post to tie the game at one apiece just 3:42 into the match.

In the 22nd minute, Marquette found another strong chance, with a corner from Selvaggi that landed under 10 yards away from the net. With Spindler at the goal line, Akinyode stepped in front of Marquette's John Pothast and Nortey and booted the ball up into the air before it was cleared away to keep the Golden Eagles off the board.

Seconds later, the Pirates turned the tables when midfielder Sam Geiler (Offenberg, Germany) forced a throw-in from 30 yards out. Manosalvas threw the ball in and Akinyode took it from there following a scramble. Running toward the right edge of the box, Akinyode struck a shot that went far post and past a sprawling Lyon.

In the second stanza, the Golden Eagles put together two quick responses. Louis Bennett II and Luis Trude combined on a set piece as a free kick was sent into the box from the right side toward the far post. Pothast came up from the top of the box and headed in his first score of the season.

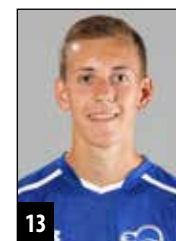

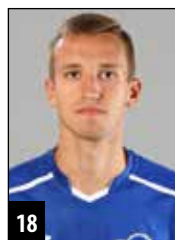

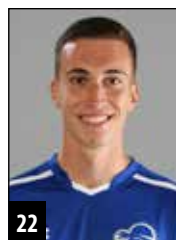
