OFFENSE POWERS TURNAROUND AS HALL LOCKS UP BIG EAST BERTH

With a doubleheader sweep of Georgetown last weekend, the Pirates clinched their second BIG EAST Championship berth in three seasons under head coach Paige Smith. Entering the tournament, SHU leads the league in HR, runs, RBIs and hits as stellar offensive production has helped lead The Hall to its highest overall (24) and BIG EAST (10) win totals since 2009. The team's 24 wins is nine more than the 2014 squad recorded; matching the second-largest improvement in program history. The last time Seton Hall won nine more games than the season before was in 2004, capturing the first of two consecutive BIG EAST titles along the way.

PIRATES LAND TRIO ON FIRST TEAM

Standout freshman infielder Alexis Walkden was unanimously selected Seton Hall's first-ever BIG EAST Rookie of the Year on Wednesday and was joined on the 12-member first team by teammates Danielle DeStaso and Yasmin Harrell. Walkden ranks 14th in the nation and second among freshmen with a program record 20 HR. DeStaso became just the fourth three-time All-BIG EAST honoree in program history after earning second team honors as a sophomore and taking home first team accolades last season. Harrell picked up all-conference honors for the first time in her career after ranking third in the league in hits and stolen bases. It was the first time three Pirates appeared on the first team in the 40-year history of the program.

SCOUTING DE PAUL

The Blue Demons received six-of-eight possible first place votes in the preseason coaches poll after capturing the conference title last season. DePaul is co-hosting the 2015 BIG EAST Championship and went 5-3 against conference foes at home, though none of those games came against tournament participants. Junior Morgan Maize was DPU's lone All-BIG EAST first team selection but battery-mates Mary Connolly and Sabrina Kuchta picked up second team nods. Seton Hall is now 3-20 against DePaul all-time including a 1-11 mark on the road. The two have only met once in BIG EAST Tournament play with DePaul winning, 1-0, in 2009.

WHO TO WATCH

SETON HALL: Nine of Alexis Walkden's 20 home runs came in conference play while 17 of her homers came in Seton Hall victories. The freshman hit .407 and slugged .630 against the 2015 tournament field. **Sara Haefeli** recorded team-highs of 3 HR, 7 RBIs, six runs scored and five extra-base hits in nine games against the tournament field; hitting .333 with a .741 slug %. **Yasmin Harrell** went 14-for-28 against DePaul, St. John's and Villanova, scoring five runs and swiping four bags in as many attempts. **Whitney Jones** went 3-for-8 over three games against the Blue Demons. **Casey Moses** sports a 2.42 ERA with a 1.10 WHIP in 17.1 innings and four appearances over the last 10 games.

DE PAUL: Mary Connolly limited The Hall to six runs in 12 innings across two victories earlier in the season. Dylan Christensen slugged three home runs in the three games; recording six of the team's 31 RBIs in the series. Six Blue Demons hit over .300 in the series including Maize who matched Christensen with a team-high five hits.

CAREER YEAR

Senior Sara Haefeli is enjoying the best of her four years at The Hall, belting a career-high 13 home runs after entering the season with 10 overall. Haefeli leads all BIG EAST OFs in HR, RBIs (39), doubles (12) and total bases (98) while hitting cleanup and playing center field.

FLAIR FOR THE DRAMATIC

Seton Hall came through in the clutch yet again with Whitney Jones delivering the game-winning single in the 11th inning of a 4-3 win over Georgetown. SHU recently recorded three walk off wins during its non-conference matchups with Drexel and Stony Brook. Walking off is something the Pirates have now done seven times this year, and as a result they are 11-6 in one-run games.

FIRST TO SCORE KEY FOR THE HALL

Getting off to a strong start has been key to Seton Hall seeing success on the field so far this season. The Pirates have scored 50 runs in the first inning, more than they did during all of last year, and they are 16-9 when scoring first in a game. The winning percentage is even great (14-4, .778) when the Pirates can bring a run home in the first inning, something they did in both wins over the Hoyas. Comparatively, the Pirates are just 8-18 when their opponent scores first.

NEW SINGLE-SEASON HR CHAMP

With a home run in every game at Butler, freshman Alexis Walkden set a new Seton Hall single-season home run record with 20 so far this season. Walkden, who ranks 14th in the nation in home runs, passed the old SHU mark of 18, set by the Pirates' all-time home run leader, Laura Taylor, during her freshman campaign back in 2002. Walkden already is tied for sixth all-time at Seton Hall in home runs, and will be chasing Taylor's career mark of 59.

MILESTONE AWARD

Walkden was unanimously chosen as BIG EAST Rookie of the Year and was one of two unanimous selections to the first team. She joins Taylor as the only Pirates ever to win a major BIG EAST individual award. Taylor was named BIG EAST Player of the Year

in 2005.

WINNING THE CLOSE "ONE" S

Culminating with its doubleheader sweep at Butler on April 26, Seton Hall played six-straight games that were decided by just one run, posting a 5-1 record in those contests. The Pirates have thrived in close games all season long, posting a 10-6 record in one-run games and a 14-10 mark in games decided by two or fewer runs.

PIRATE PAIR HONORED

Seton Hall saw senior Danielle DeStaso and freshman Alexis Walkden named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on April 27 after leading the Pirates to a series win at Butler. During the previous week, DeStaso hit a team-high .462 and slugged three home runs, also posting a 2-1 record on the mound. It was the first time this season the versatile SHU landed on the Honor Roll. Walkden hit .381 with a 1.048 slugging percentage, breaking the SHU single-season HR record in the process. She also drove in 11 runs, hitting the game-winning homer in two wins at Butler.

NEW LOOK AT SECOND

Head coach Paige Smith has a number of utility players on the roster that can switch between the infield and outfield and even play multiple positions around the diamond, which has provided her with several options, particularly in the middle infield. Sara

Foster spent a majority of the season at second, and has now moved over to short, which has given Noel Lent, Alyssa Prukop, Joelle Arrante, Sam DeMasi and Yasmin Harrell time at second. Harrell has started the last four games at second for SHU.

GOING THE EXTRA MILE FOR A WIN

Sophomore Lauren Fischer turned in an impressive performance to pick up an extra-inning win over Stony Brook on April 23. She started and threw the first six innings, before being relieved in the seventh. She re-entered the game and ended up throwing an SHU season-high 7.2 innings to grab her eighth win of the year, and Seton Hall's first extra-inning win of the season.

SINGLE SEASON HR RECORD TOPPLED

Blasting nine home runs in the series at Creighton on April 11-12, Seton Hall easily surpassed its all-time single-season HR mark, needing just 36 games this season to do so. The old standard of 40 homers in one year was set back in 2006, but this year's team has left the yard 59 times, which leads the BIG EAST and ranks 32nd in the country. Seton Hall has nine multi-homer performances this year, compared to just 13 in the history of the program heading into this season.

HARRELL SEES 10-GAME HITTING STREAK END

Yasmin Harrell had a season-high 10-game hitting streak come to an end against Rutgers on April 14. Her work as the Pirates' leadoff, particularly during conference play, has been outstanding. In 20 BIG EAST games she batted .407 with 11 runs scored and

eight stolen bases, with a .484 on-base percentage.

MOSES SAVES THE DAY

Senior Casey Moses has always thrived in a closer's role, and that was exactly what she did as SHU picked up a series sweep over Villanova on March 29-30. Twice, Moses came in to help the Pirates preserve a lead, picking up her first two saves of the season in the process.

WALKDEN BACK ON THE HONOR ROLL

Freshman slugger Alexis Walkden was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll for a second time on March 16, as the Pirates wrapped up action over Spring Break. In seven games that week, she hit a pair of home runs with three doubles to slug .720 with a .407 on-base percentage. Walkden recorded three multi-hit games and had at least one base hit in five games, highlighted by a 2-for-4 day with six RBI in a win over Quinnipiac.

IN DRAMATIC FASHION

Seton Hall made a habit of winning late, picking up three walkoff wins during its Spring Break trip to Clearwater.

- In a 7-6 win over Robert Morris, Danielle DeStaso picked up a game-winning RBI in the bottom of the seventh.
- Sara Haefeli homered twice and delivered the game-winning hit as The Hall erased a nine-run deficit in a 14-13 win over Western Michigan.
- In a 2-1 win over Florida A&M, sophomore Chelsea Caynon drove in DeStaso in the bottom of the seventh.

STRIKEOUT LEADER

Senior Danielle DeStaso fanned 11 against Florida A&M on March 15, the most for an SHU pitcher so far this year. DeStaso leads the Pirates with 129 strikeouts this season and ranks third all-time at The Hall with 478-career strikeouts.

DESTASO SIXTH IN WINS

With a win on the mound against Quinnipiac on March 13, Danielle DeStaso moved past Ashley Forsyth and into sole possession of sixth-place in program history with 32 wins. She is 38-51 all-time at Seton Hall, posting a career-best 14 victories in 2013.

HARRELL ON HONOR ROLL

Yasmin Harrell landed on the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on Feb. 16, after leading the Pirates offensively at the 25th Annual Campbell/Cartier Classic in San Diego. Harrell hit a team-best .375 with a base hit in four of the five games of the tournament and two multi-hit games. She also scored twice and had an RBI and a stolen base.

DESTASO IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Senior Danielle DeStaso has some of the most impressive offensive numbers in program history, and is poised to continue her ascent in the SHU record books. She currently ranks second in school history with 34 home runs and 121-career RBI. She is seventh all-time with 31 doubles.

STARTING STRONG

Seton Hall got off to a 5-0 start for the first time in 16 years, as the 1999 season was the last time The Hall won five-straight games to start the year. That season, the Pirates won their first seven games and finished the season with a 29-8 overall mark.

HAEFELI AND FISCHER LAND ON HONOR ROLL

Senior slugger Sara Haefeli and sophomore pitcher Lauren Fischer were both named to the first BIG EAST Softball Weekly Honor Roll of the season. Haefeli hit a.529 and slugged 1.529 while hitting five home runs and driving in 12. Fisher posted a 2-0 record on the mound, beating Texas Southern twice. She struck out eight and held opponents to a .167 average in 11 innings of work.

HAEFELI HOMERS RECORD THREE TIMES

Senior center fielder Sara Haefeli broke the Seton Hall sin-

gle-game home run record, sending three balls over the fence in a 17-6 win over North Texas on Feb. 7. The old record of two homers in the same game had been accomplished 14 times, including by Alexis Walkden in that same game, until Haefeli stood alone with three long balls in the same game. She also drove in six runs in the win.

NOW ENTERING THE TOP-10

With five home runs on opening weekend, senior Sara Haefeli moved into 10th-place in program history with 15 home runs in her career. She entered her senior season with 10 homers, and needed just five games to match half that total and enter the top-10. She currently has 13 homers this and is currently in fourth place all-time with 23 in her career.

PIRATES BREAK OFFENSIVE RECORDS

It's 17-6 win over North Texas on Feb. 7, Seton Hall made history, breaking the school record for home runs and runs scored. The 17 runs scored topped the old mark of 16, set three times, most recently against Saint Peter's in 2013. The home run mark was actually shattered, as The Hall blasted eight bombs in the win, moving well past the previous record of five, which came against St. John's in 2009.

Sophomore pitcher Lauren Fischer came on strong at the end of the 2014 season, posting a team-best 2.33 earned run average in conference play with a pair of wins. She needed just two starts to match that win total in 2015, as she beat Texas Southern twice at the North Texas Invitational on opening weekend. She struck out four batters in each game, and held foes to a .161 batting average.

GREAT START FOR DESTASO

Senior Danielle DeStaso is sure to go down as one of the best two-way players in program history and she started off her final season on a high note. At North Texas she recorded a hit in all five games, homered twice and drove in nine runs. She hit a team-best .636 and had an outstanding .706 on-base percentage.

PAIR OF ALL-BIG EAST PLAYERS RETURN

Seton Hall had three players earn All-BIG EAST accolades at the conclusion of the 2014 season and the Pirates' pair of First-Team honorees in **Jackie DiPietro** and **Danielle DeStaso**. DiPietro emerged as SHU's most consistent hitter, leading the Pirates with a .338 average while seeing an .080 boost from her freshman season. DeStaso, who was Second-Team All-BIG EAST in 2013, belted eight home runs with 29 RBI and a .579 slugging percentage.

GOTTA HAVE FAITH

Junior catcher Faith Laudano emerged as one of Seton Hall's more potent offensive threats once BIG EAST play got underway last season. Laudano was hitting just .167 prior to the first conference series, but went on to hit .306 in BIG EAST play which ranked third on the team. She started in 19-of-21 games and tallied 11 hits, two doubles, and a homer, to slug .444.

BIEMAN JOINS COACHING STAFF

Melissa Bieman has joined Paige Smith's coaching staff for the 2015 season. Bieman, who spent the last three seasons with Columbia, will work primarily with the Pirate pitchers. She is not familiar with BIG EAST softball, having graduated from Syracuse in 2001. A native of Ontario, Canada, Bieman tried out for the Canadian National Team in 2002 and 2003 and played professionally in New Zealand and Canada.

PIRATES ADD FOUR IN 2015

Seton Hall welcomes four freshman faces to the program for the 2015 season in pitcher/infielder **Alannah Basile (Levittown, N.Y.)**, infielder/outfielder **Sara Foster (Long Beach, Calif.)**, utility player **Alyssa Prukop (Coto de Caza, Calif.)**, and infielder **Alexis Walkden (Cibolo, Texas)**.

PIRATES PICKED SIXTH IN BIG EAST PRESEASON POLL

The Seton Hall University softball team received 20 points and was picked to finish sixth overall in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches Poll. The Pirates finished sixth last season with a 9-12 record against league foes. DePaul earned 48 points and six first-place votes to start the season as the preseason favorites to win the BIG EAST, while St. John's garnered a first-place vote to tally 42 points and come in second.

Paige Smith enters her third season as the head softball coach at Seton Hall University.

Smith made a profound impact on the program in her first year on the job as the Pirates qualified for the BIG EAST Tournament for the first time since 2009 and captured eight conference victories, the program's highest BIG EAST win total since 2010.

Additionally Seton Hall saw three student-athletes receive All-BIG EAST accolades, marking the first time since 2009 the Pirates landed any players on an All-Conference team and the most All-BIG EAST honorees for SHU since its historic 2005 campaign.

Take one look at the numbers and it is immediately apparent where Smith's influence sparked a tremendous turnaround. In just one year Seton Hall saw its team batting average jump by 61 points, its slugging percentage increase by 95 points and team stolen bases more than double, jumping from 30 in 2012 to 74 in 2013.

The Pirates also broke or tied five single-game school records, scoring 16 runs in a game twice, tallying 19 hits on two occasions and setting a new record for single-game margin of victory in a 16-0 win at Saint Peter's.

In year two under Smith, Seton Hall saw three more players capture All-Conference honors, including a pair of first-team members in Jackie DiPietro and Danielle DeStaso. Infielder Maria DeLuca was named Second-Team All-BIG EAST.

Prior to taking over at Seton Hall Smith spent five seasons at Division II Adelphi, compiling an overall record of 169-104-1 and leading the Panthers to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances.

Smith burst onto the scene at Adelphi in 2008, setting a program record for wins (Division II), racking up a 41-21 record and guiding the Panthers to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Throughout her tenure, she kept Adelphi a perennial contender in the competitive Northeast 10 Conference. In 2012, Adelphi posted a 35-20-1 record and reached the NCAA Regional Semifinals.

Under her tutelage, Smith coached 29 All-Conference, 11 All-Region, four CoSIDA Academic All-District honorees, and a Daktronics All-American in Samantha Johnston.

Prior to Adelphi, Smith spent the 2007 season as the first assistant coach with the St. John's University softball program where she worked primarily with middle infield and outfield instruction, hitting instruction and all areas of recruiting. Smith worked extensively with Loren Anguiano, who currently plays professional softball with the Philadelphia Force.

Smith's coaching career began in 2003 as an assistant at Louisburg College in North Carolina, where she helped the squad win a Region X Championship. She then moved on to her alma mater, North Idaho, in her hometown of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, where she aided to a NJCAA College World Series berth in 2006.

During her playing days, Smith started at North Idaho before moving up to Campbell University following her sophomore season. While at North Idaho, she earned NJCAA Academic All-America and National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-American Scholar Athlete honors in 2000 and 2001. At Campbell, she started 100 out of 112 games and was voted team captain in 2003. Smith received Presidential and Intercollegiate Scholar honors from 2001-2002 and made the A-Sun All-Academic Team in 2002 and 2003. She also earned the Coaches Award in 2003.

Smith graduated from Campbell University in 2003 with a bachelor's of science in physical education. She later earned her masters of science in adult education and organizational learning from the University of Idaho in 2005.
