**Quick Hits**

- ▶ Southeast Missouri opens its 2010 season at Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) and Mid-American Conference member Ball State Thursday. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m., CT, at Scheumann Stadium.
- ▶ Southeast looks to post its third-straight season-opening victory under head coach Tony Samuel. The Redhawks are 3-1 in such games with Samuel at the helm. Those wins came at Austin Peay (Sept. 2) in 2006, vs. Southwest Baptist (Aug. 28) in 2008 and vs. Quincy (Sept. 3) in 2009. Southeast is 8-11 all-time in season-opening games since moving to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA) level in 1991.
- ▶ The Redhawks meet Ball State for the first time Thursday. Southeast is 0-6 all-time against Mid-American Conference opponents. The Redhawks faced Eastern Michigan (2001, 2002), Ohio (2003), Bowling Green (2004), Central Michigan (2004) and Kent State (2005).
- ▶ Southeast was picked seventh in the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Poll. The Redhawks and Austin Peay tied for seventh with 38 points. Jacksonville State, which is again eligible for the conference title and NCAA postseason this year, is the preseason favorite after earning 11 of the possible 18 first-place votes. Last season, the Gamecocks were ineligible for the conference crown because of an NCAA postseason ban due to an APR penalty. Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Tennessee Tech, Tennessee State and UT Martin were also picked ahead of Southeast. Murray State rounded out the voting.
- ▶ Junior QB Matt Scheible and senior NT J.J. Sanchez were named to the 2010 Preseason All-Ohio Valley Conference Team. Scheible, one of four starting quarterbacks returning in the OVC this

season, completed 141-of-284 passes for 1,596 yards and 11 touchdowns during his first year as Southeast's starter in 2009. He also achieved the ninth-best single-season passing average in school history with 145.1 yards per game. Scheible was equally effective in the running game, where he gained 487 yards and scored four touchdowns on 129 carries. He ended the season ranked second on the team in rushing. Sanchez returns at nose tackle after registering 46 tackles in eight starts last season. He ranked fourth on the team in sacks (1.5) and fifth in tackles for loss (4.5).

- ▶ Junior QB Matt Scheible has gone three-straight games without throwing an interception. Scheible went each of the last three games of the 2009 season without a pick.
- ▶ Southeast returns seven starters on both sides of the ball in 2010. The Redhawks enter their season-opener with 87 players on the roster, including 21 seniors.
- ▶ The Redhawks look to snap a five-game losing streak on the road when they hook up with Ball State Thursday night. Southeast went 0-5 away from home last season. Meanwhile, Ball State finished with a record of 0-6 at home a year ago.
- ▶ Southeast finished its 2009 campaign ranked 16th in the nation and second in the Ohio Valley Conference in rushing with 183.6 yards per game. The Redhawks also allowed just 14 sacks on the year, second-fewest in the OVC.
- ▶ This year marks the fourth-straight where the Redhawks open their season on a Thursday. The only time Southeast didn't open a season on a Thursday under head coach Tony Samuel was 2006.

## 2010 REDHAWK FOOTBALL NOTES

- ▶ Senior WR Miles Edwards is tied for third in career receiving touchdowns at Southeast. Edwards led all Redhawk receivers with four TDs in 2009. He has caught 14 touchdowns in his career. Willie Ponder (2001-02) currently holds the record with 26 receiving touchdowns.
- ▶ Fifth-year senior running back Henry Harris returns as Southeast's feature back this season. Harris ran for 720 yards and seven touchdowns on 151 carries as the team's leading rusher last season. He also averaged 4.8 yards per carry.
- ▶ Only four running backs have rushed for 1,000 or more yards in a season in Southeast football history. Fifth-year senior tailback Henry Harris is primed to make a run at that mark in 2010. Harris' 720 yards in 2009 were the most in a season in seven years.
- ▶ A linebacker has led the Redhawk defense in tackles every year since 2006. Sophomore Blake Peiffer, seniors Justin Woodlief and Joshua Jackson, and junior Philip Klapproth return to lead the linebackers this season. Peiffer is expected to start at middle linebacker after finishing with 32 tackles and one fumble recovery in 10 games as a true freshman. Woodlief ranked fourth in the Ohio Valley Conference with 93 tackles en route to landing a spot on the league's All-Newcomer Team a year ago. Jackson ranked sixth on the team with 53 tackles in 11 games and two starts, while Klapproth tied for third on the team with 66 tackles last season.
- ▶ Southeast will have a new look on special teams after losing its top kicker and return man. All-American Doug Spada was the Redhawks starting kicker and punter the last three years. Freshman Joe Vucic will handle the punting duties, while sophomore Drew Geldbach will be the placekicker. Senior Henry Harris will likely be Southeast's top return man.
- ▶ The Redhawks opened their 2009 season with a modern day school record for points scored in a 72-3 victory over Quincy (Sept. 3). Southeast hopes to have a similar start in 2010. The Redhawks have scored 30 or more points in three of their last four season-openers.
- ▶ Southeast was involved in a lot of close games in 2009. Four of the Redhawks losses were by 10 or less points.

### ROAD WARRIORS

The Redhawks will play on the road in their first three games of the 2010 season. The last time Southeast opened a season with three-straight road games was in 2004.

### AGAINST FBS OPPONENTS

Southeast is 1-14 all-time versus NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) opponents. The Redhawks only win was at Middle Tennessee State (24-14) on Sept. 28, 2002. Here is a breakdown of Southeast's history against FBS foes:

### OVC VS. FBS TEAMS

Ohio Valley Conference teams have compiled a 17-130-1 record all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly I-A) teams. That is counting only games while the teams were members of the Conference (not before they joined or after they left). Eastern Illinois was the last OVC school to post a win over a FBS opponent when it beat Eastern Michigan (31-28) in 2004.

### ABOUT BALL STATE

Ball State, like Southeast, finished its 2009 campaign with two wins. The Cardinals went 2-10 overall and 2-6 in the Mid-American Conference a year ago. Ball State is under the direction of Stan Parrish, who is 59-52-3 overall. Parrish enters his second year as the head coach at Ball State. The Cardinals were picked to finish exactly where they ended in the MAC last season, fifth in the West Division. Ball State is led by fifth-year senior running back MiQuale Lewis. Lewis has rushed for 3,334 yards in his career and needs 669 yards to become the Cardinals all-time leading career rusher. Ball State has an experienced offensive line, which returns seven linemen who combined for 60 starts in 2009. Defensively, OLB Davyd Jones is back after leading the Cardinals with 100 tackles in 2009. Jones also ranked 11th in the MAC in tackles.

## 2010 REDHAWK FOOTBALL NOTES

### HAPPY ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 80th Anniversary of Houck Stadium which has served as the home of Redhawk Football since Oct. 3, 1930. The field and stadium were named in honor of Louis Houck, who served 39 years as a Regent for the University and President of the Board for all but three of those years.

### WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCES

Southeast Missouri head coach Tony Samuel will address the media during a press conference on Mondays during the season. All press conferences will be held at 12:30 p.m., CT, in the Knox Conference Room located inside of Houck Fieldhouse.

### WEEKLY INTERVIEWS

Southeast football student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews on Tuesdays and Wednesdays after practice. Practices generally run from 4-6 p.m. The team practices at Rosengarten Athletic Complex on Tuesdays and Houck Stadium on Wednesdays.

### REDHAWKS IN THE NFL

The Redhawks currently have three players active in the National Football League. G/C Eugene Amano is with the Tennessee Titans, G/C Dan Connolly is with the New England Patriots, and OLB/DE Edgar Jones is with the Baltimore Ravens.

### STRICTLY PROFESSIONAL

Several high-profile professional coaches have spent time at Southeast Missouri State as assistant coaches. Former Tampa Bay head coach and current Monday Night Football analyst Jon Gruden was the quarterbacks coach at Southeast in 1988. Philadelphia Eagles offensive coordinator (and former Detroit Lions head coach) Marty Mornhinweg was also an assistant at Southeast, taking over for Gruden as quarterbacks coach when he left following the 1988 season.

### 2010 NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2010 NCAA Division I Football Championship begins on Saturday, Nov. 27 and will continue with the second round of games on Saturday, Dec. 4. The quarterfinals will be held on Saturday, Dec. 11 and the semifinals will be held Friday-Saturday, Dec. 17-18. The Championship Game will be held at Pizza Hut Park in Frisco, Texas (with the Southland Conference serving as the host) for the first time in 2010. This year's Championship Game is set for Friday, Jan. 7.

Tony Samuel is in his fifth season as the head coach at Southeast Missouri State University.

Samuel, the ninth head coach in Southeast football history, was named to the position on Dec. 21, 2005.

In his first four years at Southeast, Samuel coached two First-Team All-Americans, five First-Team All-OVC selections and three OVC All-Newcomer picks.

Samuel also coached Edgar Jones, who is in his fourth year with the Baltimore Ravens. Jones is currently one of three former Southeast players in the National Football League.

Samuel has coached at the NCAA Division I level for 28 years, working 16 seasons as an assistant coach and 12 as a head coach.

He made stops at Western Michigan, Stanford, Nebraska, New Mexico State and Purdue before taking over at Southeast.

Samuel spent the bulk of his coaching career on the Great Plains of the Midwestern United States.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska, Samuel both played and coached football at his alma mater.

He coached the linebacker and rush end positions under legendary head coach Tom Osborne for 11 seasons (1986-96). Samuel mentored six First-Team All-Americans and 12 future NFL players. Nebraska won two National Championships (1994, 1995), captured seven Big Eight/Big 12 Conference titles and played in 11 bowl games over that span.

As a player, Samuel was a member of Osborne's first recruiting class at Nebraska. He was a two-year starter at defensive end and played in four bowl games, including the Sugar, Fiesta, Astro

Bluebonnet and Liberty Bowls. Samuel earned honorable mention All-Big Eight honors as a senior in 1977.

Samuel and six other members of his coaching staff have ties to the University of Nebraska.

Samuel went on to be the head coach at New Mexico State from 1997-2004, where he presently stands as the third-winningest coach in school history with 57 victories.

New Mexico State went 6-5 in 1999, recording its first winning season since 1992 and only its third in 32 years. In 2002, Samuel's Aggie squad posted a 7-5 mark which represented the most wins in a season since 1967.

His teams won the Rio Grande Championship twice, and he led the Aggies to an undefeated home record in 2002. Samuel was instrumental in leading the 2003 New Mexico State squad to a No. 13 ranking in graduation rates among all NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly I-A) programs (76 percent).

Samuel then spent one year as the defensive ends coach at Purdue University (2005) before accepting the head coaching job at Southeast.

While at Purdue, Samuel coached Rob Ninkovich, the team's Most Valuable Player and Second-Team All-Big Ten defensive end.

Samuel received his undergraduate degree in education from Nebraska in 1981. He was elected to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees in 2002.

Samuel is a native of Trinidad, West Indies, and moved to Jersey City, N.J. at the age of 10. He and his wife, Tamara, have five children, Travis, Serena, Phillip, Karisa and Terryn.
