Siena in the MAAC Tournament - Siena makes its 22nd appearance in the MAAC Tournament since joining the league at the start of the 1989-90 season. The Saints have posted an impressive 32-16 (.660) record, and won the conference tournament five times (1999, 2002, 2008, 2009 and 2010), including each of the last three years. The saint's 10-game MAAC Tournament win streak equals the longest in league history (LaSalle). Since the league expanded to its 10 current members (1997-98), the Saints have posted a 27-8 (.769) record in MAAC Tournament games, better than any other school. The Saints have advanced to the MAAC title game four straight years, a stretch that began with a Championship game loss to Niagara (83-79) in Bridgeport in 2007. Four of Siena's five MAAC Tournament Championships (2002, 2008, 2009 and 2010) came in Albany.

Of Note: Iona's win over Siena last month snapped a streak of five years and 19 days since Iona's second-most recent win over Siena, which came on Monday, January 24, 2006. Siena had won ten straight matchups with the Gaels prior to last month. However, Iona is a perfect 3-0 against Siena in MAAC Tournament, with their most recent win coming in the first round of the 2005 renewal.

Last Meeting - Mike Glover scored 22 points helping Iona snap a 10-game losing streak against the Saints with a 69-65 win in New Rochelle. Jonathan Breeden scored a game-high 24 points and grabbed four rebounds in a spot start at point guard for injured Rakeem Brookins. Iona led 62-50 with 3:01 to play, before Siena cut the lead to 65-62 with 30 seconds left, but the Saints could never get the ball in a one possession game down the stretch. Ryan Rossiter his first of two free throws with a chance to cut the lead to two with 6.7 seconds remaining, and Jermel Jenkins made 1-2 on the other end to seal the win.

Siena Versus the MAAC: Siena has been the dominant team in the MAAC for the past three seasons, and the most successful program since joining the conference in 1989-90. The Saints have won 53 of their last 66 games against MAAC schools and are the only team to have won both its regular-season and postseason conference championship each of the last three years. In so doing, Siena went 13-5, 16-2 and 17-1 in MAAC regular-season play and won the conference championship at Times Union Center each year. Siena's 222 MAAC wins since joining the conference (1989-90) and 160 wins since the league expanded to 10 teams (1997-98) rank as the most among league members. The real disparity has come in postseason play. Siena has made five NCAA Tournament (3-5) and four NIT (9-4) appearances since joining the league the year after its initial NCAA trip. The Saints have won 44 of their last 57 regular-season league games, 25 of their last 36 MAAC road games, and 33 of their last 37 games against MAAC foes at Times Union Center.

 Below are comments from the Manhattan Press Conference.

Opening Statement

Going into the game, I thought Manhattan was going to be a tough out. I really thought they were playing well, and our guys went in with a lot of respect from Manhattan. I thought they played terrific. Our guys hung in there, played great defense, particularly Clarence on Brutus in the second half. I thought we took his threes away, that was a big key to the game. Owen Wignot played great, and I thought our defensive intensity won the game. It's obviously a great win, and it's a league that I've been saying is even. The league's very even.

On Owen's Save to Jackson Late in Regulation

That was an unbelievable play. The tip and the three. If he doesn't make the three, we probably lose. I was glad to see him do that, because I've watched him play all year. He doesn't get a lot of credit because we've got Rossiter and Jackson, but he's a really solid player, and I was really happy for him.

On Big Game Experience Being a Factor

Jackson and Rossiter have been through a lot of big games, and they played big tonight. We've been in a lot of close games. I think the close games helped us tonight. We've been in a lot of them, and I think our guys are used to playing close games.

On Jackson

He made some unbelievable threes. He made three or four threes that were 23-footers. We were struggling, and he got us back in

the game. I've been saying all year that when he plays well, we're a different team. We're obviously a much better team.

On His Team's Key Turnovers

We were struggling with the 1-3-1. They were playing the 1-3-1, and it's not easy to play against. They do a good job with it, and they're athletic. They've got Beamon on top, he's tough, and we had a couple of ill-advised passes. But you're right, the kids did come back, Owen in particular.

On Iona

I haven't seen them recently, but people say they're playing as well as anyone in the league. We're going to have to play really well to win.

On if He's Concerned the Game Took a Lot Out of His Team

Yeah, I'm a little concerned, but Rossiter's used to playing 36 minutes. Jackson's a senior. I'm not that concerned. We'll have a game-plan put together tonight, and hopefully it works.

On the End of Regulation

That shot was a hell of a shot. Our guys played him well. They came into the timeout, and Rossiter, who's a great leader, the first thing he said was, "Let's go, we're going to win." When you've got a Rossiter, he's like another coach. He's in the huddle, he's great. To coach a Ryan Rossiter in my first year at Siena is an unbelievable thing. He's a great, great kid and a great player.

- ▶ Siena's senior class of Ryan Rossiter, Clarence Jackson and Steven Priestley is 10-0 in MAAC Tournament play
 - ✓ The Saints 10 straight MAAC Tournament wins equal a league record (LaSalle 1988-91)
 - ✓ The group is looking to become the first student-athletes to win the men's basketball MAAC Championship four times
 - ✓ Over the 10 games, Siena has held its opponents to just over 61 points in MAAC Tournament play
 - ✓ The senior class has 90 wins (90-43), marking the second most in Siena history. Last year's class finished with 97 wins.
- ▶ Siena has won the MAAC Championship five times (1999, 2002, 2008, 2009 and 2010)
 - ✓ The five MAAC Championships are the most for any league member since Siena joined the league in 1989-90
 - ✓ Iona leads all league members with seven MAAC titles
- ▶ Siena is the No. 7 seed in the MAAC Tournament
 - ✓ It's the lowest the Saints have been seeded since 2005 (No. 10)
 - ✓ Siena has been the No. 1 seed each of the last three years
 - ✓ Siena is the only team in MAAC history to win four games to capture the MAAC Championship, doing so as the No. 7 seed in 2002 in Albany
 - ✓ Since Siena's run in 2002, no team seeded 7-10 has reached the semifinals
 - ✓ Siena has won three straight MAAC Championships, advanced to the MAAC title game four consecutive years, and reached the semifinals 11 of the last 13 years, and 16 times in its 21 years as a league member
 - ✓ Siena has finished with a .500 or better league record 17 times in its 22 seasons as a league member, and in every year except two (2004-05 and this season) since the league expanded in 1997-98
 - ✓ Siena has finished fourth or better in 15 of its 22 seasons as a MAAC member
- ▶ Ryan Rossiter was named MAAC Player of the Year Thursday
 - ✓ Rossiter was selected MAAC co-Player of the Week Monday after his career-high 34-point performance on Senior Night.
 - ✓ It was the fifth time he has won or shared the award this season (11/15, 11/29, 12/20, 2/21 and 2/28), and seventh time in his career
 - ✓ Rossiter ranks second nationally in rebounding (13.4) and double-doubles (24)
 - ✓ Rossiter leads the MAAC in scoring (19.1). He could become the first player to lead the league in scoring and rebounding since Lionel Simmons since 1989-90
 - ✓ Rossiter's 402 rebounds and 25 double-doubles represent Siena single-season records. He is just nine rebounds shy of the MAAC single-season record.
 - ✓ Rossiter became Siena's all-time leading career rebounder against Loyola (2/7), and moved into third place on the MAAC's rebounding charts against Saint Peter's (2/16), passing Drew Henderson '93 from Fairfield. He is just 26 rebounds shy of Jason Thompson's second place MAAC total (1,171)
 - ✓ Rossiter has had two 20+ rebound performance this season (21 at Princeton 11/28 and 20 vs. Loyola 2/7). He became the first Siena player to have 20 rebounds in a game since Lee Matthews '93 (12/11/92)
 - ✓ Rossiter has scored 20 points or more 13 times this season, and grabbed 15 rebounds or more 13 times
 - ✓ Rossiter was named MAAC Preseason Player of the Year, an ESPN.com Player to Watch and to the Rivals.com Preseason All Mid-Major Team
 - ✓ Rossiter has played 35 minutes or more in all but four games this season
 - ✓ Rossiter is the only Siena player ranked in the top-30 in the MAAC in scoring (Jackson does not qualify)
- ▶ Clarence Jackson has scored 43 points the last two games
 - ✓ Jackson led the team in scoring against Marist (19) and Manhattan (24). The 24 points he scored yesterday were his most since dropping 24 against Northeastern (11/20).
 - ✓ Jackson averaged 16.9 ppg in the first nine games of the season before spraining his ankle for the first time
 - ✓ Since returning from injury (1/14 vs. Marist), Jackson has averaged just 12.4 ppg
 - ✓ Jackson has had some of his best performances on the biggest stages. As a sophomore he led the Saints with 12 points at #3 Pitt and scored 17 at #1 Kansas. As a junior, he led the Saints with 19 points at #19 Georgia Tech and had 24 at #13 Butler, and earlier this season, he scored a career-high 29 points at Minnesota.
 - ✓ Jackson has made 16-33 (48%) of his 3-pointers at the Arena at Harbor Yard over his career
 - ✓ Jackson leads the Saints with 54 3-pointers despite missing nine games
 - ✓ Jackson was a Preseason First Team All-MAAC selection
 - ✓ Siena is 7-0 when Clarence Jackson and Ryan Rossiter both score at least 15 points
- ▶ The Saints have defeated every team in the league except Fairfield and Saint Peter's
 - ✓ Siena has lost to every team in the MAAC except Marist
- ▶ Siena dressed its entire active roster for three of its final four games, and for yesterday's First Round win
 - ✓ The Saint Peter's game (2/16) marked the first time all 14 players dressed this season
 - ✓ Clarence Jackson missed nine games with two different ankle sprains
 - ✓ Rakeem Brookins sat out the road trip to Iona and Manhattan after injuring his rib in the first half of the Loyola loss (2/7).
 - ✓ He missed the Senior Night game against Marist with an injured wrist, but played 37 minutes yesterday.
 - ✓ Owen Wignot has injured his head, thumb and chest causing him to miss two games and limiting his effectiveness in several others. He missed the Manhattan game (2/13) with a severe stomach bug.
 - ✓ Kyle Griffin missed 14 straight games with an injured shoulder before returning to the rotation at Manhattan (2/13). He injured his knee in the first half of the Marist win Sunday and is questionable for the Tournament.



- ✓ Davis Martens has averaged fewer than five minutes and scored just seven points over the last 14 games (since 1/7 at Canisius) playing through an injured ankle at the start of the stretch
- ✓ Martens scored in all but one of the Saints' first 14 games and averaged 15 minutes per contest
- ✓ Kyle Downey missed the first six games of the season with knee and ankle injuries. He also played through an injured hip.
- ▶ 22 of Siena's 30 games, and 18 of the last 22, have been decided by 10 points or fewer
 - ✓ Siena is 9-13 in the 22 games decided by 10 or fewer
- ▶ The Saints have held their opponent to fewer than 70 points in 12 of their 13 wins
 - ✓ Siena is 1-10 when the opposition scores 70 points or more
 - ✓ The Saints have held 18 of their last 22 opponents to fewer than 70 points
 - ✓ Six of the first eight teams Siena played scored 70 or more points, including three 80+ point games
 - ✓ Siena averaged 74 points through its first seven games, but just 67.4 in the 22 games since
- ▶ Siena is the top rebounding team in the MAAC
 - ✓ Siena has out-rebounded its opponent in all 13 of its wins
 - ✓ The Saints have out-rebounded their opponent in 15 of their last 18 games
 - ✓ The Saints out-rebounded Loyola 42-22 (2/11) and Niagara 47-22 (1/30)
 - ✓ Siena leads the MAAC with 38.6 rebounds per game and a +3.5 rebounding margin
 - ✓ The Saints are also tops in the conference with 14.1 offensive boards per game
 - ✓ Siena has had 40 rebounds or more 13 times this season
- ▶ Jonathan Breeden and Trenity Burdine have seen a big bump in minutes at the end of the season
 - ✓ Breeden has averaged 9.3 ppg and 24.1 mpg over the last seven games
 - ✓ Breeden started three of those games for injured Rakeem Brookins
 - ✓ Burdine has averaged 14 mpg and 4.2 ppg over the last six games
 - ✓ Buonaguro indicated that Breeden and Burdine would each play big minutes in the MAAC Tournament. Burdine logged 10 minutes Friday night and Breeden played nine
 - ✓ Kyle Downey scored just two points and logged 23 total minutes over the last five games and did not see action in the first game of the Championships
 - ✓ Downey had played 20 minutes or more in 14 of the previous 17 games
- ▶ OD Anosike averaged 10.6 points and 9.0 rebounds over the final 17 games of the regular-season
 - ✓ Anosike had his fifth double-double in Siena's BracketBusters win over Maine (2/19), recording 10 points and 11 boards
 - ✓ Anosike has reached double figures in eight of the last 11 games and 12 of the last 17
 - ✓ Anosike scored a career-high 17 points against Manhattan (2/4)
 - ✓ Anosike had a career-high 16 rebounds in Siena's win over Niagara (1/30)
 - ✓ Anosike averaged just 6.9 points and 4.0 rebounds over the first 13 games
- ▶ Rakeem Brookins has reached double-figures in 11 of his last 17 games after doing so just three times in the first 10 games
 - ✓ Brookins started the season 7-30 from 3-point range and had just eight assists and 15 turnovers in his first three games
 - ✓ Brookins has made eight of his last 12 3-point tries (dating back to 2/11 vs. Loyola)
 - ✓ Siena's all-time assist leader Ronald Moore '10 averaged 7.4 ppg, 4.9 apg and 3.5 rpg as a freshman
- ▶ Siena is out-scoring its opposition 1,094-1,066 in the second half of games
 - ✓ Siena has been out-scored 973-922 in the first half this season
 - ✓ Siena is averaging six points more in the second half of games compared to the first half
- ▶ The Saints averaged 7,626 fans for their 15 home games this season
 - ✓ The Maine, Niagara, Manhattan and Vermont games had announced crowds over 8,000
 - ✓ The Butler game reached the set capacity of 8,444
 - ✓ The UAlbany game drew 10,753 fans
 - ✓ Last year, Siena averaged 7,853 fans per game - the 66th best total in the country and sixth highest among Mid-Majors
- ▶ Siena lost 49.5% of its scoring from last season
 - ✓ Ronald Moore, Edwin Ubiles and Alex Franklin combined for 4,763 career points, 1,975 career rebounds, 1,246 career assists and three MAAC Championships
 - ✓ The Class of 2010 combined for a school-record 97 career victories and two NCAA Tournament wins (vs. Vanderbilt in Tampa in 2008 and vs. Ohio State in Dayton in 2009)
 - ✓ Both Franklin and Moore are playing pro basketball overseas. Franklin currently plays in Spain for Sevindustria (CP) Tarragona, while Moore is suiting up for BK Casta SPU Nitra in Slovakia. Ubiles is finishing up his degree at Siena will working back from an injury. He hopes to join the NBA Developmental League or play overseas.
 - ✓ Siena was still chosen second in the 2010-2011 MAAC preseason poll behind Fairfield

Scouting Siena

Siena advances to the MAAC Quarterfinals following a thrilling 68-66 overtime triumph over Manhattan late Friday night. The victory was the Saints' 10th in a row in the MAAC Tournament, tying a league record held by LaSalle from 1988-91. Siena was paced by its senior leaders, Clarence Jackson and Ryan Rossiter. Jackson poured in five first half threes, finishing with a game-high 24 points while Rossiter posted his 25th double-double of the season with 17 points and 14 rebounds. He has now pulled down 402 rebounds this season, nine shy of the MAAC single-season record. Rossiter, who leads the league in both scoring (19.0) and rebounding (13.4), was named the MAAC Player of the Year on Thursday night. He becomes the third straight Saint to earn the prestigious award, following in the footsteps of Kenny Hasbrouck (2009) and Alex Franklin (2010). Rossiter, who last week broke Billy Harrell's '52 61-year old single-season rebounding record, is Siena's all-time leading rebounder and ranks second nationally in both rebounding and double-doubles this season. The Saints will now take on No. 2 seed Iona, looking to advance to the semifinal round for the 12th time in the past 14 years. Siena and Iona split the season series, with each team winning on its homecourt. The Saints and Gaels, which are the two teams with the most MAAC Championships with a combined 12, will meet for the sixth time in the MAAC Tournament. Siena, which is 4-7 against the No. 2 seed, has never defeated Iona in the MAAC Tournament, having lost all five meetings. The Gaels are the only team that the Saints have a losing record against in the MAAC Tournament. Siena, which is aiming to win an unprecedented fourth straight MAAC Championship, is the only team to win four games to capture the MAAC Title, doing so as the No. 7 seed in 2002. Since then, no team seeded lower than No. 6 has reached the Semifinal Round.

Scouting Iona

The Gaels enter the MAAC Tournament red-hot, having won seven in a row to close out the regular season. The winning streak directly followed a four-game losing streak for Iona. The Gaels have lost four straight MAAC Tournament games, including three in a row as the better seed. Nonetheless, they boast the second best winning percentage (.607) in MAAC Tournament history, trailing only Siena (.667). Iona is led by MAAC First Teamers Mike Glover and Scott Machado. Glover ranks second to Rossiter in the league in both scoring (17.9) and rebounding (10.2), while Machado ranks third in the nation, dishing out 7.4 assists per contest.

On His Back

Ryan Rossiter has enjoyed one of the great seasons in league history and as a result he was named the MAAC Player of the Year Thursday night. He becomes the third straight Saint to win the honor, joining Kenny Hasbrouck (2009) and Alex Franklin (2010). Rossiter leads the league in scoring (19.0 ppg) and rebounding (13.4 rpg), and could become the first player to do both since Lionel Simmons (1989-90) 21 years ago. Rossiter put an indelible stamp on the program's record book in the loss to Loyola (2/7), surpassing Lee Matthews' 93 long-standing career rebounding record. He enters tonight's matchup with 1,145 boards in his stellar career. Rossiter has also broken his own single-season school record with 25 double-double this season, and also topped Billy Harrell's 61-year old single-season rebounding benchmark. Rossiter's 57 career double-doubles are far and away the most in school history. He ranks second nationally with 13.4 rebounds per game and 25 double-doubles. In addition to being named Preseason Player of the Year, Rossiter was tabbed as an ESPN.com Player to Watch, and selected to the Rivals.com Preseason All Mid-Major Team. He and his classmates are looking to become the only men's basketball players in league history to celebrate a MAAC Championship four times. Rossiter's has had some monster performances this season. The senior had 28 points and 15 rebounds in the win at Northeastern, 26 points and 15 rebounds in the Butler loss, 18 points and 17 rebounds in the Rider win, 14 points and a career-high 21 rebounds in the Princeton loss, 28 points and 13 rebounds against UAlbany, 27 points and 13 rebounds in the Florida Atlantic win, 26 points and 15 boards against Iona, 19 points and 13 boards despite playing through illness and injury against Georgia Tech, 26 points and 15 rebounds in the Iona win, 28 points and 10 rebounds in the Canisius win, 21 points and 16 rebounds in the loss at Saint Peter's (1/21), 26 points and 15 rebounds in the loss to Rider (1/24), 23 points and 20 rebounds in the loss to Loyola and 21 points and 16 rebounds against Saint Peter's (2/16). Fittingly, he saved the best for last to close out the regular season, scoring a career-high 34 points and grabbing 11 rebounds in Siena's Senior Night win over Marist.

On the Rebound

The Saints have been the top rebounding team in the MAAC (38.6 rpg), and lead the conference with 14.2 offensive rebounds per game, and a +3.5 rebounding margin. In its win over Niagara (1/30), Siena controlled a 47-22 rebounding edge and an 18-0 advantage in second chance points. In the Loyola loss, Rossiter nearly out-rebounded the entire Loyola team, and Siena owned a 42-22 rebounding edge. The Saints have out-rebounded their opponent in all 12 victories this season.

On the Mend

Siena dressed all 14 players for the first time this season in its loss to Saint Peter's (2/16), and again against Maine and Fairfield. The Saints exhibited great balance in their win

over Maine (2/19), as five players scored in double figures for just the third time this season. Freshman forward Trinity Burdine's emergence performance may have been the most noteworthy. He scored 12 points and made 4-6 field goals and 2-4 3-pointers in 22 minutes against Maine and was rewarded with increased minutes down the stretch. In addition to Burdine, sophomore Jonathan Breeden has seen increased minutes. Breeden logged 15 minutes in the Fairfield loss, while usual reserve guard Kyle Downey did not play. He then started in place of injured Rakeem Brookins and played 36 minutes in the Marist win.

Overdosing on OD

OD Anosike has emerged as one of the top big men in the MAAC since the start of the calendar year. Anosike has averaged 10.6 ppg and 9.0 rpg over the last 17 games. Anosike is easily playing the best basketball of his career, showing great energy on both ends of the court. He scored 12 points and hauled in a career-high 11 rebounds in the loss at Canisius Jan. 7, and scored 15 points while grabbing 10 rebounds against Niagara. They were the first two double-doubles of Anosike's career, and ignited his hot streak. Anosike scored 12 points in the second half of the Loyola win (1/28) making all four of his field goals, and 4-5 free throws on his way to 16 points. He had 15 points and a career-best 16 rebounds in the Niagara win (1/30), and scored a career-high 17 points the win over Manhattan (2/4). Anosike had his fifth double-double of the season in the BracketBusters win over Maine (2/19).

Clarence is Critical

Clarence Jackson was sitting on 992 points for over a month. The senior swingman reached that total during the Saints' 72-69 victory over

Florida Atlantic, but missed the next six games with a sprained right ankle. When he returned, it didn't take him long to become the 37th player to reach the 1,000-point milestone. Jackson scored a game-high 19 points in his return to the rotation at Marist, including a key late 3-pointer after Marist closed to within a single point. But Jackson took a scary tumble in the second half of the Saints loss at Saint Peter's (1/21), and left with another ankle injury, this time spraining his right ankle. Jackson missed the next three games, but returned against Manhattan (2/4) to play 24 minutes off the bench and hit three key 3-pointers. He started the last six games of the regular-season, and seems to be rounding into form. Jackson scored a game-high 17 points and made 3-6 3-pointers in the Maine win and had 19 points in the Senior Night victory over Marist, before opening the MAA Tournament with a flourish last night, pouring in a game-high 24 points including six threes. His 184 career 3-pointers made are the 8th most in program history. In 21 games played this season, Jackson is shooting 38% from 3-point range (52-137) - the best percentage of his career. Against Minnesota, he scored a career-high 29 points, and at Northeastern, the shooting guard tallied 24.

Rahk Solid

Rakeem "Rahk" Brookins missed the Iona (2/11) and Manhattan (2/13) road games with an injured rib, and sat out the Senior Night game against Marist (2/27) with a wrist injury. The injuries couldn't have come at worse times as the freshman point guard was really hitting his stride. In the last 17 games he has played, Brookins has 78 assists and just 43 turnovers, and averaged 9.1 ppg. Brookins is following in the footsteps of Ronald Moore '10, who led the country in assists last season and ranks 23rd on the NCAA's all-time Division I charts. The Saints are more of an up-tempo team under Brookins' direction, which is the style of play that has helped them reach the NCAA Tournament each of the last three seasons. Brookins scored a career-high 18 points and added seven assists and no turnovers at St. Bonaventure. In the road Loyola win (1/28), Brookins had 11 points, six assists, four rebounds and three steals.

Breeden Gets His Chance, And Delivers

Sophomore Jonathan Breeden received the starting nod at Iona and Manhattan in place of Brookins, and against on Senior Night against Marist. In all three instances, Breeden couldn't have produced in a bigger way. He scored a career-high 24 points and made 10-14 shots against the Gaels, and had 20 points on 6-11 shooting (2-2 from 3-point range) against Manhattan. Against Marist he flawlessly executed Siena's offense, scoring 10 points with three assists and just one turnover in 36 minutes. He averaged 9.3 ppg and 24.1 mpg over the last seven games. Breeden's previous career high of

15 points came at St. Bonaventure (12/28), including seven in the final minute. Breeden gets the call in late game situations as well, and he drained two clutch free throws in the final minute to help ice the home win over Iona (1/3).

Close Encounters

22 of Siena's 30 games this season have been decided by 10 points or fewer, including 18 of the last 22. Siena is 9-13 in games decided by 10 points or fewer. Coach Buonaguro said prior to the season that "every game was going to be close this year, and late game situations would be critical."

Magic Number

Siena is 1-10 when the opposition scores 70 points or more, and 12 of the team's 13 wins have come when the opposition fails to reach 70. The lone exception was Siena's 81-73 Senior Night win over Marist. Siena had won 52 straight games when holding its opponent to fewer than 70 points until losing 58-48 at Saint Joseph's on New Year's Eve. The streak dated back 99 games to January 8, 2008 when Fairfield defeated the Saints 53-52 at Times Union Center.

Sending Out an SOS

Siena's non-conference schedule was one of the toughest in the country. Eight of Siena's 10 non-league opponents have RPI's above 200, with five schools (Butler, Florida Atlantic, Minnesota, Princeton and Vermont) holding spots in the top-100 RPI. Northeastern, Georgia Tech and Saint Joseph's are the only non-conference foes with losing records.

Catching Up with Downey

Junior Kyle Downey figured to be one of the major pieces to this year's team after serving as sixth man last year and starting the Saints' NCAA Tournament game against Purdue, and he has been. Downey was sidelined for the first six games with an injured ankle and knee, and was understandably not sharp in his return to the rotation against UAlbany. Since then, Downey has been a major factor, averaging 25 minutes per game and ranking fifth on the team with 6.5 ppg. He started at the 2 in place of Jackson against Georgia Tech and played a huge role in the win, scoring 12 points and grabbing six rebounds in 33 minutes. In 38 minutes against St. Bonaventure, Downey scored 21 points and made 9-18 field goals. He scored nine points against Iona in 37 minutes and did not commit a turnover, and had nine points and four rebounds and four assists in the victory at Marist. He was thrust into the starting lineup again versus Rider due to Jackson's most recent ankle injury, and he tallied nine points, six rebounds, two assists, a block, and a steal in 34 minutes of work. Downey played just 11 combined minutes in the last three games as Jonathan Breeden saw extended time.

Owen's Injury Riddled Season

Junior Owen Wignot has battled concussion-like symptoms, an injured thumb, a chest injury, and a violent stomach ailment this season, causing him to miss three games, and be less effective in several others. Still, Wignot has drained 32 3-pointers, and his 38.6% efficiency from distance ranks among the MAAC's leaders. Wignot has also emerged as one of the team's top defenders, playing the front of Siena's 1-2-2 trapping press. He had a career-high nine rebounds and five assists in the Iona win (1/3), and added four assists and two steals in the home loss to Rider (1/24) in addition to his 3-pointer barrage in the second half.

Foul Play

Siena led the nation with just 13.9 fouls per game last year. This year, the Saints have averaged 16.5 fouls through their first 30 games. Last year, Siena MADE 100 more free throws than its opponents ATTEMPTED. This year, Siena has attempted 57 more free throws than its opponents, and made 26 more. The Saints had a season-low 10 fouls in the Canisius loss (1/7), and tied its season high with 24 in the loss at Saint Peter's (1/21).

MAAC Daddies

Siena has been the dominant team in the MAAC for the past three seasons, and the most successful program since joining the conference in 1989-90. The Saints were the only team to win both their regular-season and postseason conference championship each of the last three years. In so doing, Siena went 13-5, 16-2 and 17-1 in MAAC regular-season play and won the conference championship at Times Union Center each year. Siena's 223 MAAC wins since joining the conference (1989-90) and 161 wins since the league expanded to 10 teams (1997-98) rank as the most among league members. The real disparity has come in postseason play. Siena has made five NCAA Tournament (3-5) and four NIT (9-4) appearances since joining the league the year after its initial NCAA trip. The

Welcome to the Show

Trenity Burdine got a major opportunity in the UAlbany game, and again against Niagara (1/9) and Manhattan (2/13), when Owen Wignot left with injuries, and he produced in all three games. Burdine scored 14 points in 32 minutes off the bench and made 4-6 field goals and all five of his free throws against the Great Danes. He had scored just three points all season entering the UAlbany game. Burdine was rewarded with the start against Fairfield, and did not commit a single turnover in 28 minutes. Burdine made 4-6 shots and scored nine points in the loss at Manhattan (2/13). He has seen increased minutes down the stretch, playing 22 minutes against Maine, 12 at Fairfield and 18 against Marist.

On the Run

In eight of its 13 wins, Siena used huge second-half runs to put each contest out of reach. At Northeastern, it was a 21-2 run that turned a slim 39-38 lead into a 60-40 advantage; at Rider, a 20-1 run turned a 47-44 deficit into a 64-48 lead. Against Florida Atlantic, an 18-6 run gave the Saints a commanding 15-point lead with 5:53 to play, and against Georgia Tech, it was a 13-2 run that turned a six-point deficit into a 49-44 lead with under 10 minutes to play. Versus Iona, Siena's 13-2 run gave them a 59-50 lead with 9:41 to go. Siena used a 13-2 run to erase a 10-point second-half deficit against Niagara (1/30), and started the second half on a 29-8 run in its 71-60 win over Maine. Siena started the second half against Marist on a 12-5 run to turn a four-point deficit into a quick lead.

Jekyll and Hyde

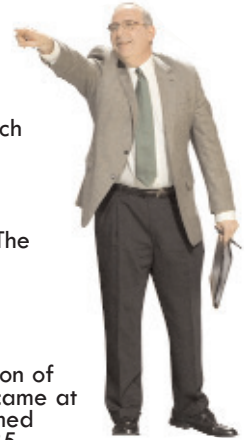
Siena entered the season with 38 straight wins on its home court - the second longest home win streak in the nation - but the Saints lost their first four home games this year. The Saints then rallied to win six of their next seven at the Times Union Center before dropping two of their last four. The Saints went unbeaten at home each of the last two years.

Three Magical Years

The Saints won 77 games (77-25) the last three seasons and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year. The program had made just three previous NCAA appearances in its previous 30 years of Division I competition.

Mitch is the Man

Mitch Buonaguro is one of the most respected basketball coaches in the country. Buonaguro is in his 35th season of Division I coaching, having spent the last 19 years as an assistant coach. His lone head coaching experience came at Fairfield from 1985-91 where he guided the Stags to two NCAA Tournaments (1986 and 1987) and was named National Rookie Coach of the Year in 1986. Buonaguro served as Rollie Massimino's top assistant for the 1985 Villanova team which won the National Championship. He played a key role in Siena's recent success, working alongside Fran McCaffery the last five seasons in Loudonville.



It's in the Genes

OD Anosike's sister Nicky is a member of the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx. Nicky Anosike was named 2008 NCAA Woman of the Year after leading Tennessee to back-to-back NCAA Championships.

Ryan Rossiter's brother Steve completed a strong career at Davidson last season, helping the Wildcats advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2007 and 2008. Rossiter's father Steve was the captain of the FDNY basketball team, and was featured on Sports Illustrated September 11th tribute issue in 2001.

Kyle Downey's brother Kevin was an All-MAAC selection at Canisius in 2004 and 2005. Kyle Griffin's mother Mimi played college basketball at Pitt and is a former ESPN women's college basketball analyst.

Clarence Jackson's father Clarence played a season at Pitt.

Owen Wignot's mother Terri played basketball at Lehigh under Muffet McGraw who coached former Siena coach Fran McCaffery's wife Margaret at Notre Dame.

Packing 'em In

Siena ranked 66th in attendance nationally last year, averaging over 7,800 fans per home game. This ranking tied a program high, and was sixth among Division I mid-major programs. The attendance for the season-opening loss to Vermont, which snapped Siena's 38-game home court win streak was 8,047 and 8,444 attended the Butler loss. A season-high 10,753 fans turned out for the annual Albany Cup battle between the Saints and Great Danes on December 4. Over 8,000 fans attended the Niagara, Manhattan and Maine games.

Where Are They Now?

Several recent Siena graduates have gone on to professional basketball careers. Tay "Firefly" Fisher '08 is in his second year traveling with the "World Famous" Harlem Globetrotters. The affable shooting guard ranks second on Siena's all-time 3-point charts. Siena's all-time assist king Ronald Moore '10 and reigning MAAC Player of the Year Alex Franklin '10 have taken their talents across the pond, along with 2008 grad Kenny Hasbrouck. Franklin currently plays in Spain for Sevindustria (CP) Tarragona, while Moore is suiting up for BK Casta SPU Nitra in Slovakia. Hasbrouck, who was the final cut of the Miami Heat this season, is also playing in Spain. His new team, Alicante, plays in the ACB, which is the top league in that country, and one of the top in all of Europe. "It's the best opportunity I had," Hasbrouck told the Times Union. "So it's a real good team in the same league as Ricky Rubio." Alicante is a port city located on the southeast coast of Spain, right on the Mediterranean. The team's season runs into May. After that, Hasbrouck said he'll continue pursuing his dream of being the first Siena graduate to get into an NBA regular-season game. Siena's third all-time leading scorer Edwin Ubiles is recovering from an injury that caused him to pull his name from the NBA D-League Draft.

Vermont 80, Siena 76

A valiant rally fell just short, and Siena men's basketball suffered its first home loss in 39 games at the Times Union Center, falling 80-76 to Vermont. The Catamounts led by as many as 15 in the later stages, but the Saints never quit, cutting the deficit to two before two late free throws from Vermont's Joey Accaoui iced it.

With 7:30 to go, the Saints (0-1) trailed 62-47. However, head coach Mitch Buonaguro, serving as the head coach of a Division I program for the first time since 1991, stuck to his guns, and trusted his leaders.

"I wanted to put guys on the floor who could help us win," Buonaguro said.

This involved putting freshman point guard Rakeem Brookins into a trial-by-fire situation. Brookins thrived under the pressure, helping Siena's offense get back on track with eight points, three assists, and three steals. The Saints also had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio, with ten and nine, respectively.

"I thought (Rakeem) played well," said Buonaguro. "He got the team going, and I think he was a real plus tonight."

Siena was paced by MAAC Preseason Player of the Year Ryan Rossiter. The senior put up 27 points, ten rebounds, two blocks, and two steals. Perhaps most notably, he went a perfect 11-for-11 from the charity stripe (as a team, the Saints shot 23-of-29 from the line, a 79.3% clip). Fellow senior Clarence Jackson tallied 14 points and five steals, and sophomore OD Anosike added 11 points and five rebounds.

Siena (0-2) had every opportunity to pull off a big upset at Big Ten foe Minnesota on national television, but ultimately the Saints gave that chance away. Siena played well in every area except one, committing 24 turnovers allowing Minnesota (2-0) to rally from an 11-point first half deficit, and a six-point second half deficit, to pull out a 76-69 win at Williams Arena.

Siena stormed past Rider 73-60 in the first Division I conference game of the 2010-11 season. Ryan Rossiter led the Saints' charge with 18 points and 17 rebounds, marking the third straight game he has had at least 16 points and 16 boards.

Davis' three came with 47 seconds left and cut Siena's six point lead in half. Buonaguro indicated that Siena failed to switch as instructed on defense, allowing the Tigers' top long range threat to shoot an uncontested shot.

Siena pushed the lead back to five with two Jackson free throws with 27 seconds to play, but Mavraides shook free and sank a long three with 10 seconds left to cut the Siena lead to 68-66.

Jackson was fouled on the ensuing Siena possession and missed the first free throw before sinking the second to put the Saints up three. Princeton called timeout with 5.4 seconds left after crossing midcourt, and set up the game's critical play.

Mavraides inbounded the ball to the top of the key and raced to get it back, he then took two dribbles to the right wing, elevated, double-pumped and connected over Owen Wignot to send the game to overtime.

The Tigers out-scored the Saints 17-8 in the extra session. They were led by Kareem Maddox who scored a career-high 30 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. Maddox did not start and came into the game averaging six points per game. He made 10-13 field goals and 10-12 free throws.

Rossiter finished with 14 points and a career-high 21 rebounds. It was the first time a Siena player grabbed 20 rebounds or more since Lee Matthews had 20 against Hartford on December 11, 1982. Rossiter also surpassed Matthews in career double-doubles with his school-record 37th.

Rossiter, Anosike and Martens fortified Siena's frontline which was instrumental in the Saints' +5 rebounding margin.

Sophomore guard Carl Jones scored 17 points to lead Saint Joseph's to a 58-48 victory over the Saints here at Hagan Arena in Philadelphia on Friday afternoon.

Saint Joseph's led 27-23 at halftime, but Siena took a 34-33 lead on Kyle Downey's layup with 14:37 to play. Langston Galloway scored on the Hawks next possession, igniting a 10-2 run, and Saint Joseph's led the rest of the way.

Siena had a chance to cut the lead to two, but Downey missed an open three with 2:52 to play, and the Saints trailing 50-45. The Hawks scored eight of the last 11 points to seal the victory.

Siena played without senior guard Clarence Jackson (ankle) and junior guard Kyle Griffin (shoulder).

Ryan Rossiter wasn't about to let this one slip away. Just 10 days after his last second jumper was swatted away as the buzzer sounded in Siena's 62-61 loss at Canisius, the senior rocked the Griffs for 28 points and 10 rebounds, including the go-ahead free throws with 59 seconds to play in Siena's 73-69 win in Albany.

Rossiter's monster effort offset a sensational performance by Canisius guard Gaby Belardo, who scored a game-high 29 points, and helped his team rally from a 15-point first half deficit to set up a scintillating finish.

Belardo's last basket of the night was a contested, rainbow three from the right wing that gave Canisius its only lead of the game, 69-68, with 1:20 to play.

Siena worked the ball to Rossiter on its next possession, and the senior drew contact inside, setting up the winning free throws. Belardo misfired on a go-ahead three on the Griffs next possession, and after a timeout, Rossiter freed Clarence Jackson with a home-run pass, and the senior's dunk put the Saints up three with 15 seconds to play. Up three, the Saints chose not to foul, and forced Belardo to take a wild, contested three with two seconds left. Jackson made one of two free throws with 0.7 on the clock to seal the win and account for the final margin.

Siena came out firing, grabbing a 27-12 lead less than 12-minutes into the game on Owen Wignot's layup. The Griffs cut that lead to 41-34 at the break, scoring nine of the last 11 points of the half.

Siena dominated the game inside, controlling a 38-31 edge on the glass. OD Anosike scored all 10 of his points in the first half to complement Rossiter's huge effort.

Freshman point guard Rakeem Brookins continues to develop. He ended with 10 points, six assists and a turnover. Jackson scored 15 points, despite missing 12 of the 17 shots he took, including eight of 10 3-pointers.

Anosike finished with seven points and 13 rebounds, helping the Saints out-rebound the Peacocks 48-47 despite being out-rebounded by 10 in the first half.

Saint Peter's scored 12 straight points, including seven from Bacon, to grab a 22-14 lead in the first half. Novar Gadson had 16 points and 10 rebounds for Rider which won for the eighth time in 10 games. Thompson had 14 points off the bench, and Mike Ringgold added 13 points in 29 minutes. Danny Stewart contributed four points, eight rebounds and a career-high five blocks.

Rakeem Brookins (10 points) was the only other Saint to finish in double figures, but juniors Kyle Downey and Owen Wignot each had nine. Siena made 12-14 free throws and 6-14 3-pointers, but converted just 15-57 shots from inside the arc.

All five starters reached double figures, and Ryan Rossiter became just the second player in school history to amass 1,000 rebounds in his career, as Siena throttled red-hot Loyola 76-59 in Baltimore.

The victory snapped a two-game MAAC losing streak for the Saints (8-12/5-5), and kept the team within striking distance of the top half of the conference.

Siena used a 15-2 run to turn a one-point deficit into a 29-17 lead at the 8:01 mark of the first half and led by double figures the rest of the way.

Loyola (10-10, 6-4) lost for the first time in five games, and just the second time this calendar year. The Greyhounds knocked off MAAC front runner Fairfield, 66-65, here on January 14.

Rossiter led all players with 18 points, and picked up his benchmark rebound just 19 seconds into the second half. He left the game momentarily in the second half after being hit in the groin, and returned with vengeance. He scored seven straight points after reentering at the 15:33 mark, pushing Siena's lead to 20, 52-32, with 13:50 to play.

The Greyhounds closed within 10, 65-55, on a 3-pointer from J'hared Hall with 6:26 to play, but Siena scored the next six points to put the game away.

OD Anosike scored a career-high 16 points and added eight rebounds for Siena. Owen Wignot had 14 points and seven boards, Kyle Downey finished with 13 and Rakeem Brookins had 11 points, six assists, four rebounds and three steals.

The difference in the game was Siena's shooting and its aggressive zone defense. The Saints shot 53% from the field after consecutive games of extremely poor shooting. Loyola shot just 33% and looked lost at times.

Justin Drummond came off the bench to lead the Greyhounds with 12 points. Three players added 10 apiece.

The Saints lost despite 23 points and 20 rebounds from Ryan Rossiter, who became the school's all-time leading rebounder 12 seconds into the second half.

Trailing 58-50 after a hook shot from Rossiter at the 12:12 mark, Loyola reeled off nine straight points to take the lead. Rossiter then scored seven of the game's next nine points to put the Saints up 65-61 with 5:16 to play, but Drummond hit consecutive 3-pointers, and Siena went scoreless for the next five minutes.

Drummond was one of five Greyhounds in double figures. Robert Olson and Erik Etherly tied for the team-high with 15 points, Shane Walker scored 13 and J'Hared Hall added 11.

Loyola shot 52% from the field, including 58% in the second half. The Greyhounds became just the third team to score 70 or more points against Siena in the last 15 games.

For Siena, it was a one man show, like it has been much of the season. Rossiter was dominant on his record setting night, and nearly did carry the Saints all the way on his back. The nation's second-leading rebounder entered the game 12 boards shy of Lee Matthews' school record, and he reached the mark by halftime.

Siena starting point guard Rakeem Brookins missed the entire second half with a rib injury sustained when he drew a charge late in the first half. Brookins had scored 11 points in the first half, made both his 3-pointers, and tallied three assists without a turnover, running the Siena offense flawlessly for 18 minutes. Jonathan Breeden replaced him in the second half, and had four quick assists to help Siena build its lead.

Feb. 27 - Times Union Center- Albany, N.Y.

Ryan Rossiter put an exclamation point on his stellar career, and his MAAC Player of the Year candidacy, treating the Siena faithful with a career-high 34-point effort in an 81-73 win over archrival Marist on Senior Night in Albany, his final game at Times Union Center.

In the process, Rossiter broke the school's 61-year old single-season rebounding record (Billy Harrell 49-50), and registered the 56th double-double of his sensational career.

Not to be out-done, classmate Clarence Jackson scored 14 of his 19 points in the second half, including a huge 3-pointer that broke open the game with 7:28 to play. It was Jackson's best performance since early in the year, an encouraging sign as the MAAC Tournament begins in earnest five days from now.

The crowd of 7,456 greeted Rossiter with a 3-minute standing ovation after his accomplishments were read in a pregame ceremony. They remained a factor throughout the night. Siena would not lose this game.

The Saints roared back from a 34-30 halftime deficit with 51 second half points, and the crowd hung on every play, willing Rossiter to another historic record. The senior from Staten Island continues to add to his Siena career rebounding record, and to his double-double benchmark. He now has his sets sight on the single-season MAAC record, and could finish as high as second on the league's all-time rebounding charts.

The one record he and his classmates want is still there for the taking. In the 30-year history of the league, no players have won four MAAC Championships. Rossiter, Jackson and Steven Priestley could become the first.

As good as Siena's inside-outside senior tandem was, there were other contributors. Jonathan Breeden started for injured Rakeem Brookins (wrist), and delivered a solid performance, posting 10 points, three rebounds and just one turnover, running the Siena offense with precision. His effort led to praise from Head Coach Mitch Buonaguro, who called the second half Siena's best of the season.

It couldn't have come at a better time.

Owen Wignot scored all five of Siena's points in overtime, including a make-or-break 3-pointer from the right corner with 1:28 to play as the Saints held off a very game Manhattan team 68-66 in the First Round of the MAAC Tournament.

George Beamon's 3-point try to win the game at the end of overtime rimmed out.

Siena stretched its MAAC Tournament win streak to 10 games, equalling a league record. The three-time defending champs will play No. 2 Iona at 7:30 Saturday night.

Manhattan's Michael Alvarado sent the game to overtime with a tough, fade-away 18-footer with five seconds left in regulation. Rakeem Brookins raced the length of the floor and got into the lane, but lost the ball as he tried to get off a runner at the buzzer.

Clarence Jackson led all players with 24 points for the Saints, including five first half threes. Ryan Rossiter had 17 points and 14 rebounds, but was held in check for most of the night by Manhattan's physical frontline. The MAAC Player of the Year now has 402 rebounds this season, nine shy of the conference single-season benchmark.

The game was back-and-forth throughout and the lead changed hands seven times in the final 10 minutes of regulation, and three times in overtime.

Siena took a 63-61 lead when Wignot dove out-of-bounds on the baseline and tipped the ball to a cutting Jackson with 35 seconds left. The Jaspers called timeout twice on the final possession of regulation before Alvarado sunk the equalizer.

All five starters reached double figures for Manhattan. Kidani Brutus led the Jaspers with 16 points, but he scored just two after intermission as Jackson locked him down on defense.
