Upcoming game: San Jose State at Fresno State,
Saturday, November 26, 2011,
Bulldog Stadium, Fresno, Calif, 5:00 p.m. (PST)

San Jose State record: 4-7, 2-4 WAC. The Spartans ended a three-game losing streak with a 27-24 victory over Navy on November 19.

Fresno State record: 4-7, 3-3 WAC. The Bulldogs won their first game in four tries with a 24-21 triumph at Hawai'i on November 19.

San Jose State head coach Mike MacIntyre: Finishing his second season as San Jose State University's head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 5-19. He is 0-1 as a head coach against Fresno State.

Fresno State head coach Pat Hill: Completing his 15th season at Fresno State. Has a major college coaching record of 112-78, all with the Bulldogs. He is 13-1 as a head coach against San Jose State.

San Jose State-Fresno State series: The Bulldogs lead the series, 39-33-3. Fresno State has won the last four games between these teams including a 33-18 decision in San Jose on October 23, 2010.

The Spartans last win in the series was a 24-14 triumph in Spartan Stadium on December 2, 2006.

San Jose State seeks its first win against Fresno State in Bulldog Stadium in 12 tries. In 1987, the Spartans stopped the Bulldogs, 20-16.

The 2011 meeting between these teams is the 18th time San Jose State concludes a regular season with Fresno State. The Spartans are 4-13 in these games. Three of the four victories (1949, 1990 and 2006) preceded a San Jose State bowl victory. The first was in 1929, less than one month after the Wall Street Crash that ignited the Great Depression.

Winning a finale: The last time San Jose State closed out a regular season with a victory was a 2007 triumph over Nevada in Spartan Stadium on November 24.

Finishing a season with a road win: The last time San Jose State concluded a season with a road win was in 1997 when the Spartans defeated UNLV, 55-48, in overtime. Since then, San Jose State are 0-4 in final regular season games away from San Jose including a 26-23 overtime loss at Idaho in 2010.

Exceeding 2009 & 2010 combined: With San Jose State's recent win over Navy, the Spartans picked up their fourth win of the season and exceeded its combined victory total of 2009 and 2010 of three. San Jose State won twice in 2009 and once in 2010.

Two non-conference FBS wins in 2011: For the first time in 2006 and only the fifth time in the last 25 seasons, San Jose State posted at least two non-conference victories over Football Bowl Subdivision schools. The Spartans topped Colorado State, 38-31, on October 1 and defeated Navy, 27-24, on November 19. In 2006, San Jose State beat Stanford and San Diego State. The Spartans also had two non-conference wins against FBS teams in 1987 and 1990 and three in 1992.

Fourth-Quarter Outcomes: With the 27-24 win over Navy, six of San Jose State's 11 games this season were decided by seven points or less on the scoreboard. The Spartans are 3-3 in these games.

Four of the six close calls went down to the final minute until there was a game-winning score. San Jose State won the first two of these at Colorado State and against Hawai'i, but lost the last two to Idaho and at Utah State.

Few penalties: San Jose State is among the national leaders in fewest penalties and fewest yards penalized per game. When the Spartans hosted Navy, each team was assessed two penalties - in line with their season averages.

Spartans Stay Among FBS Best: San Jose State leads the Western Athletic Conference and is tied for third nationally in turnovers gained with 30 after recovering one fumble in the Navy victory. The Spartans came up with a season-high six in the October 14 Hawai'i win. San Jose State is the national leader with 18 fumble recoveries and is tied for 27th with 12 interceptions.

Passing Game Still Moving: In San Jose State's last seven games, the Spartans are averaging 320.9 yards per game passing. Five times (Colorado State, Hawai'i, Louisiana Tech, Utah State and Navy), the Spartans passed for more than 300 yards.

400 Yard Total Offense Threshold: San Jose State's four wins are characterized by gaining at least 400 yards of total offense in each triumph. In the Spartans' victories, the team is averaging 462.5 yards a game.

Three Spartans With 50+ Receptions: For the second season in a row, three Spartans have 50 or more receptions in the same season. Wide receivers **Noel Grigsby** (81) and **Chandler Jones** (54) surpassed the 50-reception mark for the second consecutive season. Tight end **Ryan Otten** (50) is the first Spartan tight end in 15 years to catch at least 50 passes in a season.

San Jose State enters the week of November 26 as one of four Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools to have three players with 50 or more receptions. Western Michigan, Houston and Arizona are the others.

100-Yard Rushing Plateau: San Jose State's four wins are characterized by rushing for at least 100 yards in a win. San Jose State gained a season-high 230 yards against New Mexico State, 137 at Colorado State, 103 in the Hawai'i victory and 120 against Navy. In the three losses prior to playing Navy, the Spartans gained just 134 yards on 72 carries.

An All-Around First: After reviewing San Jose State game statistics for more than 50 years, running back **Brandon Rutley** is believed to be the first Spartan to rush for more than 100 yards and accumulate 100 or more receiving yards in the same game.

In the Navy win, Rutley gained 132 yards on 27 carries and scored two touchdowns and caught a single-game best 8 passes for 101 yards.

Among the top-100 FBS rushing leaders, Rutley is the fourth player this season demonstrating this unique level as an all-purpose back.

New team field goal record: The 2011 San Jose State team set a school record for most field goals in a season when **Jens Alvernik** made his first attempt for the team's 17th three-pointer of the season. The previous record was 16 set by the 1975 Spartans.

San Jose State heads into the Fresno State contest with 18 field goals for the season. Alvernik has a school-record tying 16 and **Harrison Waid**, last season's place-kicker, has two.

New Single-Game Field Goal Record: Senior **Jens Alvernik** set a San Jose State single-game record with four field goals made in the Utah State contest (11/12).

Alvernik was one of 12 Spartans to co-hold the previous single-game record of three when he booted three through the uprights at Brigham Young (10/8). Alvernik is 14-of-19 for the season and is two field goals shy of tying the San Jose State individual single-season record of 16 field goals by Lou Rodriguez in 1975.

Team Kick Scoring Record On The Line: Senior **Jens Alvernik** and sophomore **Harrison Waid** account for 81 of the Spartans' 267 points this season. Alvernik has 71 and Waid, 10. The most kick scoring points by a San Jose State was the 1986 Spartans that scored 86 points, all by Sergio Olivarez.

Unlisted numbers: **Jens Alvernik** heads into the Fresno State game with the most field goals, most field goals per game and the most kick scoring points by a Western Athletic Conference kicker this season. Since Alvernik has not yet played in the required 75 percent of the team's games in 2011, he does not appear in the WAC nor NCAA rankings.

Grigsby - Prolific Pass Catcher: On November 19, wide receiver **Noel Grigsby** became the third San Jose State player to catch 80 or more passes in a season. With 81 receptions, he is five away from establishing a new San Jose State single record. The current mark is 85 set by Kevin Jurovich in 2007.

In the Spartans' last six games through November 19, Grigsby has 53 receptions. He is one of six FBS players with 50 or more receptions in their last six games.

At Brigham Young (10/8), Grigsby became the first Spartan in three seasons to catch 10 or more passes in a game with his 11 receptions for 88 yards. He bettered that count in the Hawai'i win (10/14) with 12 receptions for a single-game season high 126 yards.

Grigsby is the 21st player in school history to catch at least 100 passes. He has 137 receptions in 24 games as a Spartan.

Chandler Jones Reaches 100 Career Receptions: Wide receiver **Chandler Jones** became the second Spartan this season and 22nd in school history to catch at least 100 passes when he caught his fourth pass in the Utah State game. Jones has 54 receptions in 2011 and is in 15th place on the school's career receiving list with 108.

Chandler Jones Named To Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll: For his three-touchdown contribution in the October 14 Hawai'i win, wide receiver **Chandler Jones** now was named to the Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll. The award recognizes the most versatile player in college football.

Travis Johnson Two-time Player of the Week: End **Travis Johnson** was named the WAC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance against Idaho (11/5). He is the first Spartan since Deonce Whitaker in 2000 to earn multiple Player of the Week nominations to receive WAC Player of the Week honors twice in the same season. Johnson also is the first player since Quinton Jones of Boise State in 2006 to earn WAC Football Player of the Week honors in two of the game's three facets (offense, defense and special teams).

School Record-Tying Effort Matches 2011 National Best: Defensive end **Travis Johnson** became the third San Jose State football to record four sacks in one game with his performance in the Idaho game. Johnson finished with 10 tackles, a fumble recovery and one of his sacks resulted in a safety for San Jose State. Johnson's four sacks moved him up to eighth nationally in quarterback sacks and also ties him with three others for most sacks in a game this season.

Spartans Pick Up & Score: In San Jose State's last two victories, the Spartans scored a touchdown on a fumble recovery return. **Duke Ihenacho** ran 20 yards with a fumble recovery in the Colorado State win (10/1).

Wide receiver **Chandler Jones** picked up a fumble on a kickoff return and ran 23 yards in the Hawai'i victory (10/14). Ihenacho's fumble recovery and run for a touchdown was the first by a Spartan since the 2004 season.

The Spartans nearly came up with a third touchdown via fumble recovery at Louisiana Tech when punter **Harrison Waid** picked up a loose ball and was tackled at the 2-yard line after a 20-yard run. One play later, tailback **Brandon Rutley** scored a San Jose State touchdown.

First Defensive PAT: San Jose State notched its first defensive PAT in school history when safety **Duke Ihenacho** returned a blocked PAT for two points in the Hawai'i victory on October 14. The play was named GEICO's Play of the Week from games ending the week of October 15. GEICO's Play of the Year will be announced November 25 in a nationally-televised program produced by Intersport for CBS TV.

Kickoff return for a TD: Freshman **Tyler Ervin** became the first San Jose State player since 2004 to return a kickoff for a touchdown with his 95-yard return in the Utah State game. Ervin now ranks second in the conference and 35th nationally in kickoff returns with a 24.9 average.

Season-High Five Sacks: San Jose State raised its season total of quarterback sacks to 12 with a 2011 best five in the Idaho game. End **Travis Johnson** accounted for four and end Mohamed Marah was credited with the fifth one.

Penalty-Free: For the first time since the 2007 Boise State game, San Jose State completed a game without a penalty.

First Rocky Mountain Win: San Jose State win at Colorado State was its first in the state of Colorado against a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent. Prior to the 2011 season, the Spartans had two losses at Colorado State and four at Colorado.

Gaining a Previously Elusive Road Victory: San Jose State's 38-31 triumph at Colorado State ended two long road losing streaks. The Spartans went winless in 16 consecutive road games since a November 1, 2008 victory at Idaho and were without a non-conference road triumph in 18 tries since a 2002 win at Illinois.

Recently vs. the Mountain West: Since 2006, the Spartans now have a 4-2 record against teams in the Mountain West Conference. San Jose State is 2-0 against San Diego State, 1-0 against Colorado State, has a 2006 New Mexico Bowl victory over New Mexico and is 0-2 against former Mountain West Conference member Utah.

Academic All-America nominees: Quarterback **Matt Faulkner** and linebacker **Vince Buhagiar** were nominated for the Capital One Academic All-America team as presented by CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). To be nominated, a one must have a minimum 3.30 cumulative grade-point average, be enrolled at the four-year institution a minimum of one academic year and be a significant player on a team. Faulkner is a senior majoring in business administration; Buhagiar, a sophomore majoring in psychology.

30-plus points: San Jose State's 34 and 38 points in the New Mexico State and Colorado State triumphs mark the first time since 2008 that the Spartans scored 30 or more points in back-to-back games.

High-scoring half: San Jose State's 24 points in the first half of the Colorado State win are the most first-half points by the Spartans since scoring 30 in a 51-17 win over New Mexico State in 2007.

Big plays in the New Mexico State win: For the first time since the 2008 Boise State game, San Jose State had two scoring plays of 60 or more yards in the New Mexico State victory. **Brandon Rutley** scored on a 66-yard run on the Spartans' first play of the game and tight end **Ryan Otten** scored on a 64-yard pass play.

In the 2008 Boise State game, linebacker Justin Cole scored on a 62-yard interception return and Rutley burst through the Boise State defense for a 60-yard touchdown run.

The last time San Jose State had two touchdowns produced by the offense of 60 or more yards in a game was in a 56-49 double-overtime loss to Boise State. The Spartans scored their first two touchdowns on a 69-yard Tyson Thompson run and a 79-yard pass from quarterback Adam Tafralis to wide receiver Rufus Skillern.

The 17th 200-Yard Rush: **Brandon Rutley's** career-best 33-carry, 209-yard, two touchdown performance in the New Mexico State win is the 17th time at San Jose State that a Spartan rushed for 200 or more yards in a game. Rutley is the tenth Spartan to post a 200-plus yard rushing game and the first since Tyson Thompson ran for 203 yards against Hawai'i in 2004. Rutley's 209 yards matches the tenth best San Jose State single-game total.

James Orth ties school record: Safety **James Orth** became the fourth player in school history to intercept at least one pass in four consecutive games. Others include current Jacksonville Jaguars defensive back Dwight Lowery (2006), Gerald Jones (2002) and Sherman Cocroft (1983), who had a five-year NFL career. Orth heads into the week tied for sixth nationally with four interceptions in seven games.

Punting record at Colorado State: Punter **Harrison Waid** set one San Jose State single-game record and tied a second in the Colorado State win. Waid averaged 58.6 yards per punt for five punts to eclipse a 15-year record of 56.8 yards per punt by Joe Furlow in the 1996 Air Force game. Waid matched Furlow's record of three punts of 60 or more yards in a game with kicks of 62, 63 and 72 yards.

A long, long drive based on time: San Jose State's first touchdown drive in the UCLA game covered 88 yards in 16 plays over a 7:53 time span.

The last time a Spartan team used more than 15 plays to score a touchdown was a 17-play, 78-yard drive in a 46-28 loss at Hawai'i on October 23, 2004.

The last time a San Jose State offense needed more than 7:00 to complete a touchdown drive was in the November 16, 2003 game at Tulsa when the Spartans zigzagged their way 83 yards on 17 plays in 7:13 in a 49-38 road victory.

Long drives based on yardage: The Louisiana Tech game marked the second time this season San Jose State had a touchdown 90 yards or longer. The Spartans concluded the game's scoring with a 99-yard, 11-play drive at Louisiana Tech.

Earlier in the season, San Jose State's only touchdown drive in the BYU game covered 96 yards on 12 plays.

Brothers: San Jose State has two sets of brothers on the 2011 team. Reserve right guard **Jacob Orth** is the older brother of **James Orth**. Back-up defensive end **David Tuitupou** is the older brother of Spartan tight end **Peter Tuitupou**.

30-Game Starters: Four Spartans are among 22 seniors who have 30 or more starts at San Jose State. Safety **Duke Ihenacho** (42), offensive guard **Fred Koloto** (31), line-backer **Tiuke Tuipulotu** (31) and cornerback **Peyton Thompson** (31) have 30 starting calls as a Spartan. Offensive tackle Andres Vargas can pick up his 30th start for the Spartans at Fresno State.
