San José State record: 1-2, 0-0 Mountain West. The Spartans lost at Texas, 56-0, on September 9.

Utah record: 2-0, 0-0 Pacific 12 Conference. The Utes topped BYU, 19-13, on September 9. Utah has three consecutive wins dating back to the 26-24 win over Indiana in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: In his first season as a major college head coach. Has a major college head coaching record of 1-2, all at San José State. Brennan returns to San José State after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. He is 0-0 as a head coach against Utah.

While an assistant at Oregon State, the Beavers were 2-4 against the Utes winning 21-7 in 2012 and 51-48 in overtime in 2013.

Utah head coach Kyle Whittingham: In his 13th season as the head coach of the Utes. Has a major college coaching record of 106-50, all at Utah. He is 3-0 as a head coach against San José State.

Series history: Utah leads the series, 7-1. The teams are completing their second home-and-home series in eight years. The Utes have wins in the last four meetings including a 34-17 decision in San Jose a year ago. The Spartans' only victory in the series was a 24-6 triumph in Salt Lake City in 1974 when Darryl Rogers was San Jose State's head coach.

Recent San José State history vs. the Pac-12 Conference: San José State seeks its first win against a current Pac-12 member school since a 35-34 win over Stanford on September 9, 2006.

Since then, the Spartans have 12 losses - Stanford (6), Utah (3), Arizona State (1), Oregon State (1), USC (1) to Pac-12 football schools.

Another opportunity vs. a nationally-ranked opponent: Utah is the second San Jose State football opponent this season with a top-24 national ranking. The Utes enter the week's action ranked 24th in the USA Today/Amway coaches poll.

San Jose State's last win over a nationally-ranked team was a 62-52 decision over #16/#16-Fresno State on November 29, 2013. Since then, the Spartans are 0-3 vs. a nationally-ranked opponent.

The last Spartan road victory against a nationally-ranked opponent was on November 1, 1980 when San Jose State upended #10/#11-Baylor, 30-22, in Waco.

A chance for a non-conference road win: San José State's last non-conference regular-season road victory was a 12-0 win at Navy on September 29, 2012. Since then, the Spartans are 0-8 in non-conference road contests.

Television: ESPN2 will provide play-by-play coverage of the San Jose State-Utah game. The telecast begins at 8:00 p.m. (MT)/7:00 p.m. (PT).

The telecast also will be available on WatchESPN.

The Utah Spartans & perhaps the Beehive Boot: San José State's game at Utah is the first of three Spartan opponents this year from the state of Utah. San Jose State hosts Utah State on September 23 in the Mountain West opener for both teams. On October 28, the Spartans take on BYU.

San Jose State is the only team to face all three Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) from Utah this season. In a previous era, BYU, Utah and Utah State would have a round-robin series and the team with the best record in those three games would house the Beehive Boot until the next season. Presently, Utah is in possession of the Beehive Boot.

Homecoming: San José State defensive coordinator **Derrick Odum** was a defensive back on the 1989 through 1992 Utah football teams and centerfielder for the 1992 and 1993 Ute baseball teams. He would begin his coaching career in 1996 as a Utah football graduate assistant and return as the safeties coach for the 2005 through 2007 seasons.

They were at Utah and they were at San Jose State or vice versa: The ties between these schools include several well-known and interesting football personalities.

Running back **Bob Ladouceur** transferred from Utah to San Jose State in 1974. He did not play in San Jose State's win over Utah due to the NCAA's transfer rule for Division I football players. Switched to a defensive back role, he didn't play much for the Spartans. After graduating, he became best known as the high school football coach with the best winning percentage in the country (.934) after compiling a record of 399-25-3 from 1979 through 2012 at De La Salle High in Concord, Calif. Ladouceur received an honorary doctorate from San Jose State at the University's 2015 commencement.

Offensive lineman **Ron McBride** lettered at San Jose State in the 1960, 1961 and 1962 seasons. He never wore the same number in any of his three varsity seasons. McBride would become Utah's head coach for 13 seasons (1990 through 2002). He ranks third on the school's career list for coaching victories with his 88-63 win-loss record.

Like Ladouceur, all-purpose player **Mervyn Fernandez** transferred to San Jose State. Fernandez played the 1981 season catching 35 passes for 697 yards and seven touchdowns, rushing once for a 35-yard touchdown in a 28-6 win at Stanford and played enough as a safety to intercept two passes. As a professional, he played for the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League (1982-86, 1994) and six seasons for the Los Angeles Raiders (1987-92).

Fernandez was part of the explosive 1981 San Jose State offense with Jack Elway as the head coach and former University of Utah assistant coach **Dennis Erickson** as the team's offensive coordinator. The Spartans won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship, finished with a 9-3 win-loss record after beating Stanford and California in the same season for the first time in school history, but lost to Toledo, 27-25, in the California Bowl despite three second-half touchdown receptions by Fernandez.

A 13-game regular-season schedule: For the first time since the 2010 season and fifth time in school history, San José State has a 13-game regular-season schedule. The Spartans also played 13 regular season games in 2002, 1939 and 1937.

Busiest defense in FBS football: Three games has a lot do with it, but San José State's defense has faced more snaps to date than any other Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team in games played through September 3. Three Spartan opponents have combined for 259 snaps. Oregon State is next closest at 230.

Despite the number of plays for the San José State defense, the Spartans are credited with forcing 23 punts and recovering three fumbles in their first three games.

First to 40: Linebacker **Frank Ginda** is the first Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player this season to be credited with at least 40 tackles. Ginda has 42 tackles in three games after a game-high 12 at Texas on September 9 and heads into the Utah game ranked second nationally in total tackles per game at 14.0.

Takeaways matter: The San José State defense recovered three fumbles and turned them into 14 points in the 34-13 win over Cal Poly.

In San Jose State's two losses, five turnovers turned into 28 points, 14 each for USF and Texas.

Pass defense holding up: San Jose State opponents completed just 50.8 percent of its pass attempts against the Spartans through three games. Among Mountain West schools, only Wyoming at a 45.5 percent completion rate had a lower opponent completion percentage figure.

Three games, three quarterbacks: In San José State's first three games, three quarterbacks were used. Sophomore **Josh Love** started the first two games. Redshirt freshman **Montel Aaron** started at Texas. Sophomore **Sam Allen** played in the fourth quarters of the Cal Poly and Texas games.

Based on available records dating back to the 1970's, Allen is the first known San José State player to play as a special teams defender and at quarterback in the same game. Allen is a member of the Spartans' punt coverage unit.

Aaron remains among top FBS freshmen quarterbacks in passing efficiency:

Despite a rough game at Texas in which he completed 12-of-23 pass attempts with an interception for 103 yards and no touchdowns in his first major college start, **Montel Aaron** enters the Utah game as the fourth highest-rated Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) freshman quarterback for passing efficiency. His four touchdown passes are the most thrown by a freshman quarterback in games played through September 9.

Freshman QB starters at San José State: Montel Aaron became the sixth San Jose State freshman of any kind to start a game at quarterback since freshman eligibility was reinstated in 1972 when he started the September 9 Texas game.

Other Spartan freshmen to start at quarterback since 1972 include current sophomore **Josh Love** in 2016 at Iowa State and **Adam Tafralis**.

Aaron's start was the 13th time a San José State freshman started a game at quarterback since 1972. **Doug Allen** (1984, one); **Greg Centilli** (1988, two), **Marcus Arroyo** (1998, five), Tafralis (2004, three) and Love (2016, one) were the other occasions a freshman started at quarterback for the Spartans.

Opponent punt returns still negligible: San José State's **Michael Carrizosa** has 24 punts this season. The 2015 Ray Guy Award finalist is averaging 44.0 yards per punt with a long of 68 yards. Only four of his 24 punts this season were returned for a net of minus-1 yard. San José State enters the Utah game ranked 22nd nationally with a 43.2 net punting average.

Paso Robles pair leads Spartan pass catchers: Wide receiver **Bailey Gaither** and tight end **Josh Oliver**, teammates since their Paso Robles (Calif.) High School days, are the team's top two receivers.

Oliver had seven career receptions in his first two seasons and after catching three passes at Texas is the team leader with 12.

Gaither came into the season with four career receptions as a redshirt freshman. He has 10 catches and leads the team with three touchdown receptions.

Young Spartans: The current San José State football roster consists of 48 freshmen. In the last eight seasons, the 2017 squad is the third one to begin a season with at least 40 freshmen. The 2012 (41) and 2013 (45) teams had more than 40 freshmen on the opening-game roster.

The fewest freshmen on a San José State opening-game roster since 2010 was 35 in 2013 and 2014.

First time starters: Linebacker **Jamal Scott**, nose tackle **Sailosi Latu** and wide receiver **Thai Cottrell** made their first major college starts in the USF game. Wide receiver **JaQuan Blackwell** made his first San José State start in the Cal Poly win. Offensive lineman **Jackson Snyder** started for the first time at the major college level at Texas.

It was hot: The game time temperature for the September 2 San José State-Cal Poly game at CFECU Stadium in San José was recorded as 108 degrees. Previously, the last time San José State played in a game with 100-plus degree weather was on September 1, 2007 in a 45-3 loss at Arizona State. The evening temperature was 101 degrees at kickoff.

Four hours, three minutes of football: For the first time since defeating #16-ranked Fresno State, 62-52, on November 29, 2013, San José State played a football game that lasted at least four hours in its season-opener against USF. The game had 189 plays, 39 possessions, 23 punting situations, 18 assessed penalties, and four replay reviews leading to a 4-hour, 3-minute contest length. The 2013 San José State-Fresno State game lasted 4-hours and 9-minutes.

Plenty of chances to score: The 39 possessions in the San José State-USF game are the most in a San José State football game since the Spartans' 2016 home opener against Portland State. The Spartans and Vikings combined for 37 possessions, 19 by Portland State and 18 by San José State in a 66-35 Spartan win.

900 Club: In a game with 64 combined points scored, there were more punting yards than total offense in the San José State-USF game. San José State, with its 387 yards, and USF, with its 548 yards of total offense, combined for 935 yards of total offense. The two teams punted for 941 yards - 489 on 11 punts by the Spartans and 452 on 12 punts by the Bulls.

Lots of pass plays: San José State's 50 pass plays against #19-USF are the most attempts by the Spartans in a game since 51 passes in a 38-31 loss to Colorado State on November 1, 2014. USF tied a San José State opponent record becoming the third school to run 101 plays against the Spartans in a game.

Lots of punts: The San José State-USF game included 23 punts, 11 by San José State's **Michael Carrizosa** and 12 by USF. The last time the Spartans punted 10 times in a game was in a 48-0 loss to Boise State on October 16, 2010.

USF became the first San José State opponent to punt at least 10 times in a game since Utah State punted 10 times in a 30-7 Spartan victory on October 11, 2008.

The San José State-USF contest marked the first time since a 21-0 home loss to Louisiana Tech on November 8, 2008 that there were at least 20 punts in a Spartan game. That day, there were 11 by San José State and nine by Louisiana Tech.

New coordinators: Offensive coordinator **Andrew Sowder** and defensive coordinator **Derrick Odum** are in coordinator roles for the first time in their respective coaching careers. Sowder is in his ninth season of college coaching; Odum, his 22nd.

Two generations of Bernardis: First-year offensive line **Joe Bernardi** is a second-generation San José State offensive line coach. His dad, **Gary Bernardi**, now at the University of Colorado was the Spartans' offensive line coach during the 2010 through 2012 seasons.

The Bernardis are the second multi-generational football family to serve as San José State assistant coaches. **Tom Quinn**, current New York Giants special teams coordinator, had the same role with the Spartans during the 1999 through 2001 seasons. His dad, **Mike Quinn**, was San José State's special teams coordinator from 1976 through 1978.

Youth movement in the coaching box: Offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** (30), offensive coordinator **Andrew Sowder** (29), linebackers coach **Bojay Filimoeatu** (27) and wide receivers coach **Kevin Cummings** (26) begin the season aged 30 and under. Filimoeatu and Cummings will be a year older in December.

Experienced offensive line: San José State's projected starting offensive line of tackles **Troy Kowalski** and **Nate Velichko**, guards **Jeremiah Kolone** and **Chris Gonzalez**, and center **Keoni Taylor** have 137 combined starts after three games of the 2017 season. That number is tops among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools.

Families that stay together: The 2017 San José State team has two sets of brothers and one second-generation Spartan. Cornerback **Jermaine Kelly** is the older brother of wide receiver **Jeremy Kelly**.

Linebacker **William Ossai**, a senior, is the older brother of freshman **Isaiah Ossai**. Isaiah is the third Ossai in the family to join the San José State football program. Their older brother, **Onyeka Ossai**, was a linebacker during the 2001 through 2003 seasons.

Defensive lineman **Nico Aimonetti** is the son of former San José State team captain and 1986 honorable mention All-America offensive lineman **John Aimonetti**.

New CEFCU Stadium playing surface: In 2017, San José State replaced its FieldTurf playing surface with its second artificial playing surface, AstroTurf, since CEFCU Stadium opened in 1933. For the first time, the Spartans' home field has a two-toned look with light and dark greens alternating every five yards from goal line to goal line.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year two of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

New uniforms: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas.
