- No live reports of any type from practice.
- Still photographers must give 24-hour advance notice.
- No reports permitted on injuries, protective gear, who is playing where or schemes unless initiated by Coach Whittingham.
- Interviews are typically conducted after practice on Mondays (players*) and Tuesdays (players, Coach Whittingham, two assistant coaches).
- *Players at the Monday press conference will not be available after practice that day.
- Media may observe the final 20 minutes of practice on Tuesdays.
- For weeks with Thursday games, the only media access is the Monday press conference. There are no assistant coach interviews the weeks of Thursday games and byes.
- 10-minute limit on player interviews beginning when they come off the field.

Quick Hits

- > Utah is in the coaches poll for the third-straight week, dropping one position to No. 24 after its 19-13 win at BYU last Saturday. The Utes are first of the others receiving votes in the AP poll for the second week in a row.
- > Utah is 23-1 in non-conference games since joining the Pac-12 in 2011, including a 17-0 non-conference record in the last four years.
- > The Utes have sold out 45 straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener, including 42 standing room-only crowds.
- > Utah also played San Jose State in game three of the 2016 season (winning 34-17 in San Jose).
- > Utah leads the series with San Jose State 7-1 and its only loss came in the 1974 Homecoming game in old Rice Stadium. The Utes lead 2-1 in Salt Lake City. See page 2 for the complete series history.

Conference Call

Utah and San Jose State share a conference history. Both schools competed in the Western Athletic Conference from 1996-98—Utah's final two years of a WAC affiliation that began in 1962. Both teams have also competed in the Mountain West, although their conference paths did not cross. The Utes departed for the Pac-12 after the 2010 season and the Spartans joined the Mountain West in 2013.

Six true freshmen have played: **Chayden Johnston; Tyquez Hampton, Jaylon Johnson, Javelin Guidry, Ali'I Niumatalolo and Orlando Umama** ... Utah's roster contains 32 players of Polynesian descent.

After trailing early in the second quarter, Utah scored 28 unanswered points and beat San Jose State 34-17. Utah's 10 sacks (tied for the second most in school history) included two apiece by Hunter Dimick and Filipo Mokofisi. Tim Patrick had a career-high 121 receiving yards, while Zach Moss and Armand Shyne rushed for 95 and 92 yards, respectively. Troy Williams completed 20-of-26 passes (71%) for 257 yards and a touchdown (1 INT). Andy Phillips made both of his field goal attempts and broke the school record for PATs in a career with the first of his four extra point kicks. Sunia Tauteoli had a team-high eight tackles, including a sack and 1.5 TFL.

Two-Minute Drill

Utah is 17-6 all time in games televised on ESPN2, including last week's 19-13 win over BYU ... First-year kicker **Matt Gay** is tied for the national lead in field goals (7), field goals made per game (3.50) and field goal percentage (1.000). Gay, in his first season as a college kicker, is 7-of-7 in field goals and 5-of-5 in PATs ... Running back **Zack Moss**' first career start came last year at San Jose, when he led Utah in rushing with 95 yards and a touchdown.

Game Day Activities

Saturday's theme is **Ute Proud** and Utah Athletics will honor the Ute Indian Tribe at the game. Members of the tribe in attendance will be recognized on the field in the fourth-annual Ute Proud game. Half-time will feature a cultural demonstration by the Ute Indian Tribe's Pow Wow committee. The Utah ROTC's Ute Thunder cannon will blast the pre-game **Cannon Call** to notify fans outside the stadium that kickoff is 30 minutes away ... In honor of the **Extra Yard for Teachers**, Utah Athletics, in partnership with the Pac-12 Conference and College Football Playoff Foundation, will present a \$10,000 check to Wallace Stegner Academy, which serves the Glendale and Rose Park neighborhoods ... The **Ute Walk** begins at 5:30 p.m. on the corner of Guardsman Way and 500 South. The first 125 fans at the Ute Walk to text UtahFB to 53535 will receive a Utah Utes' pint glass.

Game Honorees

The Utah soccer team will be introduced on the field in honor of its first ever NCAA Sweet 16 appearance last season ... Former Ute and NBA basketball players Andre Miller and Michael Doleac, who led the 1998 Utes into the NCAA Championship game, will be recognized as the winningest Runnin' Ute basketball players in school history. Last Game

A punishing defense and a career night by first-year starters **Tyler Huntley** and **Matt Gay** propelled the Utes to a 19-13 win over BYU in Provo—Utah’s seventh victory in a row over its rival to the south. Huntley passed for 300 yards (129 to **Darren Carrington**) while completing 27-of-36 attempts. Huntley also rushed for a career-high 89 yards and a touchdown. Gay accounted for the remainder of Utah’s scoring, making all four field goal attempts and his only PAT. Gay’s 38-yard field goal in the third quarter gave the Utes a 19-6 lead, but BYU closed the gap to six points (19-13) with 2:38 remaining. The Cougars got the ball back at 1:34 on the clock, but turned it over on downs. **Boobie Hobbs**, **Jaylon Johnson** and defensive tackle **Filipo Mokofisi** made their first career interceptions in the game and Mokofisi had one of Utah’s three sacks. **Chase Hansen’s** eight tackles led a Ute defense that held BYU to 233 yards of total offense (63 rushing).

Utah’s All-Time Record

Utah’s all-time football record is 663-453-31. The Utes are 401-188-16 at home (83-31 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 240-248-12 in road games and 22-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah vs. the Mountain West

Utah is 298-154-11 against current Mountain West teams: Air Force (13-14), Boise State (2-5), Colorado State (56-22-2), Fresno State (7-4), Hawai’i (15-12), Nevada (4-5-1), New Mexico (33-17-2), San Diego State (17-12-1), San Jose State (7-1), UNLV (14-2), Utah State (79-29-4), Wyoming (51-31-1).

Utah vs. the Pac-12

Utah is 25-29 against Pac-12 teams as a conference member and 101-149-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. The series breakdown follows: Arizona (2-4/21-19-2), Arizona State (2-4/8-20), California (2-2/5-6), Colorado (4-2/28-32-3), Oregon (1-3/9-21), Oregon State (4-2/9-11-1), Stanford (2-0/4-3), UCLA (3-3/4-11), USC (2-4/5-10), Washington (1-3/1-9), Washington State (2-2/7-7).

Whittingham File

In his 13th season as Utah’s head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** owns a 106-50 overall record. His bowl win percentage of 91-percent (10-1) is the best in NCAA history and his 10 bowl wins is tied for second among active coaches (one behind Alabama’s Nick Saban). The 2008 National Coach of the Year, Whittingham’s postseason success includes a 2-0 mark in BCS bowl games (2005 Fiesta Bowl vs. Pittsburgh, 2009 Sugar Bowl vs. Alabama). His teams have finished in the AP top 25 five times, including the last three seasons. He came to Utah in 1994 as the defensive line coach. In his 23 seasons as an assistant and head coach, he has participated in more wins (191) than any football coach in school history. See the sidebar on page 2 for more on Whittingham.

Quarterback Notebook

- > Sophomore quarterback **Tyler Huntley** is 2-0 as the starter. He has appeared at quarterback in six games in his career, including four games in relief as a true freshman in 2016.
- > **Huntley** has 527 passing yards (263.5 ypg) with one touchdown and one interception in the first two games.
- > **Huntley** is also Utah's leading rusher, averaging 79.5 yards per game with 37 carries for 159 yards (4.3 average) and a team-high three touchdowns.
- > **Huntley's** 73.5% completion percentage (50-of-68) ranks fifth in the Pac-12 and 15th nationally.
- > **Huntley** ranks third in the Pac-12 and No. 14 nationally in total offense per game (343.0).
- > **Huntley** leads the Pac-12 quarterbacks and is No. 8 nationally among QBs in rushing yards per game (79.5).
- > **Huntley** has three rushing touchdowns through the first two games—the most by a Pac-12 quarterback and tied for third among quarterbacks nationally.
- > **Huntley** has two 200-yard passing games and one 300-yard passing game this season and in his career.
- > **Huntley** had career highs in passing (300 yards), rushing (89 yards, 1 TD) and total offense (389 yards) at BYU.
- > **Huntley** was involved in 90-percent of Utah's total offensive yards (389-of-430), including 77-percent of its net rushing yards (89-of-116), against BYU.
- > Utah has three quarterbacks with NCAA FBS experience: **Huntley**, senior **Troy Williams** and senior **Cooper Bateman**.
- > **Williams**, Utah's starter last season and now No. 2 on the depth chart, posted a 9-4 record his junior season, passing for 2,757 yards and 15 touchdowns (8 INT) and running for 235 yards and five scores.
- > **Bateman** joined the Utes as a walk-on in the spring after lettering three seasons at Alabama.
- > **Bateman** completed 49-of-66 (74%) passes for 410 yards and two touchdowns in his career at Alabama.

Running Back Notebook

- > Sophomore **Zack Moss** is second on the team in net rushing yards (149), rushing yards per game (74.5) and rushing touchdowns (1).
- > **Moss** is averaging a team-best 4.5 yards per rush.
- > **Moss** had his first career 100-yard game against North Dakota (128 yards).
- > **Troy McCormick, Jr.**, who got his first career start last week at BYU, is third on the team with six carries for 66 yards (11.0 yards per rush).
- > **McCormick** also has seven receptions for 32 yards—most of the running backs.
- > Sophomore **Devonta'e Henry-Cole** saw his first action of the season against BYU, but did not have any stats.

> **Carrington's** 8.5 receptions per game ranks third in the Pac-12 and 12th in the nation.

> Sophomore **Siaosi Wilson** is Utah's second-leading receiver with seven catches for 119 yards and a team-best 17.0 yards per catch average.

> **Wilson** recorded a career-high 89 yards on five catches against BYU, including a career-long 48-yard catch.

> Freshman **Samson Nacua** is tied for second in receptions (7) and third in receiving yards (71) and yards per catch (10.1).

> **Nacua** had season and career highs against BYU with five receptions for 52 yards.

> Sophomore **Demari Simpkins** has started both games and has three catches for eight yards.

> **Simpkins** completed a 14-yard pass to Nacua against BYU, his second career passing attempt and his first completion. He also attempted a pass as a true freshman in 2016.
