Noting the Golden Eagles

- Southern Miss starts a three-game road swing over the next four weeks that includes trips to Nebraska (9/7), Arkansas (9/14) and Boise State (9/28). Southern Miss also will have one of its two bye weeks during the season on Sept. 21.
- This stretch is the first time Southern Miss will play three-straight road games since 2009 when they played Kansas (9/26), UAB (10/1) and Louisville (10/10) in consecutive weeks that season.
- Six Golden Eagles made their first career starts, including wide receivers Tyre'oune Holmes and Rickey Bradley, Jr., quarterback Allan Bridgford, defensive lineman Jerry McCorvey, and offensive linemen Fredrick Moore and Rashod Hill.
- Southern Miss dropped its opener for the second consecutive year in a 22-15 loss to Texas State, falling to 63-33 in season openers.
- Southern Miss registered six turnovers against Texas State, marking the most since recording that many giveaways at Marshall on Sept. 10, 2011.
- Wide receiver Rickey Bradley, Jr., playing in his first game for the Golden Eagles, caught seven passes for 193 yards, marking the most receiving yards since DeAndre Brown caught 12 passes for 221 yards against Rice on Oct. 18, 2008. His total receiving yards for the contest are the fourth-most in a game in school history.
- Freshman receiver Tyre'oune Holmes had 12 catches for 96 yards in his first game. Holmes' reception total ties for second-best by a Golden Eagle in a contest and is the most by a Southern Miss player appearing in his first game.
- Freshman wide receiver James Cox caught his first pass in the contest, scoring on a six-yard strike from Bridgford.
- The Golden Eagle defense registered their most plays for loss (11) against Texas State since notching 13 at East Carolina on Nov. 5, 2011.

The Nebraska Series

- The meeting with Nebraska will be the fifth between the two schools in football and the Cornhuskers hold a 3-1 advantage in the series (Please see page 5 for a breakdown).
- The two teams met to open the season in 2012 and the Huskers registered a 49-20 decision in the contest. Tracy Lampley collected a 100-yard kickoff return midway through the first quarter and quarterback Chris Campbell hit Dominique Sullivan for a 24-yard touchdown pass with 13:09 left in the second quarter to tie the game at 14, before the Huskers scored 28 of the game's next 31 points to put the contest out of reach.
- Southern Miss took advantage of five Husker turnovers on Sept. 11, 2004, to capture its lone victory in the series, 21-17.
- This will be the fourth trip to Lincoln to face the Huskers and the school has posted a 1-2 mark. NU won the only meeting in Hattiesburg, 38-14, on Sept. 25, 2003, in a Thursday night contest.
- Nebraska opened its 2013 last week with a 37-34 home victory over Wyoming.

Against the Big Ten

- Southern Miss has posted a 2-4 overall record against schools that were members of the Big Ten when the two teams played, having posted a 2-0 record against Illinois, while dropping the only meeting with Indiana and Nebraska (last season), along with two meetings with Penn State.
- If you factor in the entire Nebraska series, the Golden Eagles are 3-6 all-time against current Big Ten opponents.

TV Notes

- The Southern Miss football team makes its first-ever appearance on the Big Ten Network this weekend.
- This will be the first of 10 television appearances for the Golden Eagles this season when they meet the Huskers.
- The Golden Eagles are 83-73 all-time when they play on television.

Todd Monken

Head Football Coach

First Season - 0-1 (.000)

Todd Monken was named the 20th head football coach at The University of Southern Mississippi on Dec. 12, 2012, and brings an impressive offensive pedigree to Hattiesburg.

Monken came to Southern Miss after serving the previous two seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Oklahoma State. It was his second stint at OSU, after serving as pass game coordinator and wide receivers coach there from 2002-04.

Under Monken last season, the Cowboys – which had a true freshman starting quarterback to start the season and a redshirt freshman as the primary back-up – finished ranked among the nation's top 10 nationally in scoring offense (3rd/45.7 ppg), total offense (4th/547.0 ypg) and passing offense (7th/331.7 ypg).

In the last two seasons under Monken, OSU scored more than 50 points 10 times, broke the 60-point mark in five contests, the 70-point mark twice and the 80-point plateau once in just two years with Monken calling the plays.

The Cowboys also during that span set single-season records for points scored, touchdowns scored, first downs, pass attempts, pass completions, passing yards, completion percentage, touchdown passes, yards per play and third-down conversions in 2011, in addition to posting six of the top seven single-game passing marks in school history.

In 2011, Monken served as Brandon Weeden's position coach, who set single-season school records for passes completed, passes attempted, passing yards, touchdown passes, completion percentage and total offense in 2011. Weeden, who now plays for the Cleveland Browns, also set single-game school records for passing yards and total offense under Monken's watch in 2011. On the national level, Weeden finished the 2011 season second in passing yards, third in total offense, fourth in touchdown passes and ninth in pass efficiency.

Monken's offense produced the 2011 Biletnikoff Award winner in Justin Blackmon in addition to a pair of All-Americans in Blackmon and offensive lineman Levy Adcock and the Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year, Grant Garner.

Prior to returning to OSU for his second time, Monken spent four years as wide receivers coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars of the National Football League. He had been promoted to the role of Jaguars' quarterback coach immediately before taking the offensive coordinator job at Oklahoma State. In his final year in Jacksonville, the Jaguar trio of Mike Thomas, Mercedes Lewis and Mike Sims-Walker combined to make 167 catches for 2,082 yards and 21 touchdowns with Lewis earning a spot in the Pro Bowl.

Monken also worked at LSU from 2005-06, where he developed several receivers including Skyler Green, Dwayne Bowe and Buster Davis. Bowe and Davis were selected in the first round of the 2007 NFL Draft. Bowe combined with Davis and Early Doucet to form one of the nation's premier receiving corps in 2006. The trio combined for 180 receptions, 2,598 yards and 24 TDs. Bowe finished his career with 154 catches for 2,403 yards, and his school-record 26 touchdowns ranked eighth in SEC history.

In his first stay at OSU, Monken spent three seasons (2002-04) as pass game coordinator/wide receivers coach. The Cowboys averaged more than 32 points per game during that time. In 2004, Monken tutored first-round pick Rashaun Woods, who was selected 31st overall by the San Francisco 49ers. Woods was a two-time All-America honoree and concluded his career with 293 receptions for 4,414 yards and 42 touchdowns.

He also helped engineer one of the nation's best passing attacks in his two seasons (2000-01) at Louisiana Tech – one year as the running backs coach and the other as wide receivers coach. In 2001, Louisiana Tech ranked eighth in the nation in passing, averaging 313 yards through the air per game. A year earlier, Tech ranked seventh in the nation averaging 313 yards passing per game.

In addition, Monken spent seven seasons at Eastern Michigan (1993-99) including the last two as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He also spent time at Grand Valley State (1989-90) and Notre Dame (1991-92).

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Monken was a three-year letterwinner at quarterback for Knox College. He earned a bachelor's degree in economics (1989) and followed with a master's degree in education leadership from Grand Valley State. He is a member of the Knox College Athletic Hall of Fame. Monken and his wife, Terri, have one son, Travis.

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) - Taylor Martinez threw for a career-high 354 yards and matched his high with five touchdown passes to lead No. 17 Nebraska to a 49-20 victory over Southern Miss.

Nebraska played the last three quarters without Rex Burkhead. The 1,300-yard rusher last season went out with a sprained ligament in his left knee after opening the scoring with a career-long 57-yard run.

The Golden Eagles scored their first touchdown on Tracy Lampley's 100-yard kickoff return. They tied it 14-14 on first-time starter Chris Campbell's 24-yard pass to Dominique Sullivan.

Nebraska's go-ahead TD came on Martinez's 9-yard pass to Jake Long.

The Huskers amassed 205 of their 632 total yards on their first three series with a 50-50 run-pass mix.

Quincy Enunwa turned one of his six receptions into a 27-yard catch-and-run before Martinez found Bell for a 26-yard pass that put Nebraska up 14-0.

Lampley caught the kickoff in the end zone, found a giant opening up the middle and easily outran kicker Brett Maher for the second kick return touchdown of his career.

The Eagles tied it on their next possession. Sullivan nearly went down after slipping through cornerback Andrew Green's grasp, regained his feet and went the final 10 yards to the end zone for his tying TD.

The Huskers went 59 yards in 11 plays to take the lead for good, with Martinez flipping an easy TD pass to Long after drawing in the defense on the play-action fake.

Season Winning Streak Mark Snapped

After compiling an 0-12 record in 2012, the Golden Eagles saw a streak of 18 winning seasons snapped. The streak, which lasted from 1994-2011, was the longest in school history. The streak was also the fourth longest current winning season streak in the FBS behind Florida State (36 seasons), along with Florida (25 seasons) and Virginia Tech (20 seasons), are the three schools that had collected longer current winning streaks heading into the 2013 season.

All-Time vs. Conference USA

Southern Miss holds an all-time mark of 83-42 in Conference USA contests, including a 43-19 mark at home, while compiling a 40-23 ledger on the road. The Golden Eagles finished under .500 in the league standings for the first time in 2012 in its history of the league which dates back to the inaugural season of 1996. The Golden Eagles had won at least five regular season conference games in each of the previous three seasons. The Golden Eagles open C-USA play Oct. 5, at home against new league member, FIU.

Five Time C-USA Champions

The Golden Eagles collected their first C-USA championship game and the school's fifth league title - more than any other school in the conference - when they defeated Houston 49-28 for the 2011 league crown on Dec. 3. It was the school's second C-USA East Division crown, as the other four league crowns came during the inaugural season of 1996 as well as 1997, 1999 and 2003 campaigns. The league divisional setup began during the 2005 campaign and also marked the first year for a league championship game of which the Golden Eagles have now appeared in 2006 and 2011.

New Look C-USA

Conference USA welcomes six new members to Conference USA for the 2013 football season, including Florida Atlantic, FIU, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, North Texas and UTSA. The 14-team alignment for the 2013 season will feature each team playing eight conference games, along with four non-league contests. Each school will play every team in its division once for six games, while playing two cross-over opponents from the opposite division. The 2013 schedule has 14 playing weeks, which provides for two open dates for each team. In 2014, the league welcomes Old Dominion and Western Kentucky to football to make a 13-team league and then will return to a 14-team football league in 2015 with the addition of Charlotte.

The Rock Welcomes Four New Teams

Southern Miss welcomes four teams for the first time to Carlisle-Faulkner Field at Roberts Stadium in 2013, including last week's opponent, Texas State. The Golden Eagles will also entertain FIU (Oct. 5), Florida Atlantic (Nov. 16) and Middle Tennessee (Nov. 23) in their their initial visit to Hattiesburg. North Texas also visits Hattiesburg this season as the Golden Eagles' homecoming opponent this season (Oct. 26).

Overtime Anyone?

Southern Miss has been involved in 10 overtime games since the rule went into effect prior to the 1996 season and the Golden Eagles are 4-6 overall, after losing a 38-31 double OT game at UCF in 2012. Nine of the 10 games that have taken OT to complete have been against C-USA opponents. Here is a look of all the overtime games Southern Miss has played in since the 1996 season:

Facility Upgrades at the Rock

Due to an EF-4 tornado that hit the Hattiesburg community and caused some campus destruction to buildings and landscape on Feb. 10, 2013, the resulting debris and water from the event necessitated some changes to the football facility, including a new playing surface and videoboard. The Robert "Ace" Cleveland press box, which did not suffer damage to the storm, enjoyed renovations as well over the summer that included upgrades to the area's air conditioning/heating system as well as to its roofing.

Eagle receiver back in terms of yards with 331. Ricky Lloyd has the most passing yards returning from last season with 277.

Looking for 2,000 Rushing Yards in a Career

Senior Kendrick Hardy needs 493 yards to register 2,000 rushing yards for his career. Should Hardy reach that plateau, he would become the 13th Golden Eagle to reach that

rushing number. Hardy had his best season as a freshman with 903 yards on the ground in 2010. Hardy missed the final nine games of the 2011 season with a shoulder injury. He leads the current Golden Eagles with the most career 100-yard rushing games with five, including his last one of 172 yards against Rice (10/1/11). His total 100-plus yard games tie for 13th most by a Golden Eagle rusher. Just above Hardy is Tony Smith, who had six from 1989-1991.

Richard Looks to Build on Solid Freshman Campaign

Sophomore Jalen Richard (Alexandria, La.) looks to continue a strong start to his Golden Eagle career, after tallying 426 yards as a true freshman. He notched his season-best 87 yards on 13 carries with two touchdowns at UCF (10/13/12). His rushing scores came from 15 and 14 yards, while also adding a long rush of 19 yards to finish the game at 6.7 yards per carry. He added two catches for 12 yards, including an 11-yard reception on 3rd-and-11 in the first overtime period which helped set up a touchdown. Richard, who started six times last season, was second on the team in rushing. Against UAB (11/3/12), Richard tallied 82 yards on the ground on nine carries with a rushing TD. He notched his longest rush of the year of 35 yards on his first carry and then added his longest scoring run of 29 yards in the second quarter against the Blazers.

Bracken Gets First Start of Year

Sophomore Tyre Bracken registered his first starting assignment of the year and second of his career in the season opener against Texas State. Bracken tallied 59 all-purpose yards with 22 yards on the ground on eight rushing attempts, along with four catches for 37 yards.

Senior Transfer Nabs QB Spot in Opener

Southern Miss redshirt senior Allan Bridgford got the nod at quarterback in the opener against Texas State. The Mission Viejo, Calif., native transferred to Southern Miss from Cal, after graduating over the summer. Bridgford enjoyed a stellar debut with a 28-for-53 performance with 377 yards and a touchdown. His passing yard total was the fifth-best for a game in school history, while his completion mark ranked tied for fifth on the school game charts and his attempt total holds the No. 2 spot. Bridgford beat out junior Cole Weeks and true freshman Nick Mullens for the starting job. Two other QBs, redshirt-sophomore Ricky Lloyd and true freshman Parker Adamson also were in the mix for the starting job during fall training camp. Redshirt freshman Kyle Slotter, who started camp at QB, asked to switch to receiver and is now working at that position.

The QB Rotation in 2012

The Golden Eagles started four different quarterbacks during the 2012 season and played five different signal callers during last season including reentrers Ricky Lloyd and Cole Weeks. Lloyd appeared in five games and made two starts last year, against Louisville and Boise State, before being lost for the season with a knee injury. Weeks saw action in relief in two games. Chris Campbell, who started in two games did not return this season due to injury, while the two other players that started at QB transferred. It is believed that that was the first time in school history that the Golden Eagles started at least four different QBs in a game during the year.

Receivers Looking to Get Going in 2013

The Golden Eagle receiving corps return four players that registered at least 10 catches last season including seniors Justin Sims and Francisco Llanos, who each tallied 20 receptions a season ago. Fellow senior Dominique Sullivan added 19 catches, while junior Chris Briggs added 11 catches. Sullivan is the only receiver back to register a 100-yard game a year ago, catching four passes for 101 yards against Rice (10/27/12).

WR Newcomers Make Great First Impression

Four first-year wide receivers caught passes in the season opener including rookies Rickey Bradley, Jr., a redshirt-senior, and Tyre'oune Holmes, a true freshman, who each earned his first starting assignment. The other two receivers, freshmen James Cox and Marquise Ricard, also made catches in the game. Bradley, Jr., caught seven passes for 193 yards, marking the most receiving yards since DeAndre Brown caught 12 passes for 221 yards against Rice on Oct. 18, 2008. His total receiving yards for the contest are the fourth-most in a game in school history. Holmes had 12 catches for 96 yards in his first game. Holmes' reception total ties for second-best by a Golden Eagle in a contest and is the most by a Southern Miss player appearing in his first game. Cox caught his first career pass in

the contest, scoring on a six-yard strike from Bridgford, while Ricard tallied two catches for 32 yards.

Swarming to the Football

The Golden Eagles posted 11 stops for minus yardage in their first game in 2013, marking the most since tallying 13 at East Carolina on Nov. 5, 2011. Eleven different players were credited with at least a half tackle for loss in the Texas State contest. Southern Miss limited the Bobcats to just 207 total yards in the contest, marking the fewest yards surrendered since Memphis gained 181 against USM on Nov. 26, 2011.

Howze Anchoring Defensive Unit

Senior Alan Howze returns as the anchor on defense at middle linebacker, starting in each of the last 13 games for the Golden Eagles. Howze is the returning leading tackler from 2012, making a total of 66 stops (31 solos) to go along with five tackles for loss (29 yards), and 2.5 sacks (22 yards). In addition, Howze tallied a team-best two fumble recoveries, added a forced fumble and blocked one kick. He paced Southern Miss in the season opener with nine tackles, to go along with a team-high 2.5 tackles for loss.

Reda Also Back at Linebacker

Fellow senior Dylan Reda returns at a linebacker spot, having tallied 55 stops (28 solos) with 2.5 tackles for loss (4 yards), two forced fumbles and an interception against Boise State (10/6) in 2012. Reda notched eight tackles in the season opener with a tackle for loss.

Closing the Gap Up Front

The duo of senior Khyri Thornton and junior Rakeem Nunez-Roches returns to clog the middle of the front line for the Golden Eagle defense. Nunez-Roches, a preseason All-Conference USA selection, and Thornton combined for 73 tackles last season, including 15.5 tackles for loss and two sacks between them. Thornton also registered his first interception of his career against Western Kentucky (9/22). The two combined for 21 of 24 potential starts on the defensive line last season. Starting the 2013 season, Thornton tallied six tackles (four solos) and Nunez-Roches added five tackles, including a half tackle for loss.

Forcing Turnovers on Defense

The Golden Eagles have forced turnovers in 56 of the last 66 games and had two or more in 40 contests. The team is 31-25 when they force at least one turnover and 27-13 when they collected multiple takeaways during that time. Last season, Southern Miss forced a total of 12 takeaways marking the lowest output in that category since registering just 16 during the 1998 campaign.

Place Kicking Duties Set to Go to Acosta

Redshirt junior Corey Acosta has appeared in 14 games in his career, taking over the full time kicking chores in the season opener last season versus Nebraska. He hit field goals of 45 and 37 yards to start that year on a positive note. He has connected on 15-of-22 kicks in his career, including a career-long 51-yarder against Marshall last season. He hit his second 50-plus yard field goal against Rice with a 50-yard make the following week. Acosta saw his first action as a redshirt freshman, subbing for Danny Hrapmann in the 2011 opener versus Louisiana Tech in his only appearance that year. Acosta converted both field goal tries, from 25 and 42 yards, when Hrapmann suffered some cramping in that home contest. Acosta's kicks kept the Golden Eagles in the game before Hrapmann came back to hit a 49-yarder with 2:32 left to play which proved to be the game-winner in a 19-17 triumph. Acosta started the 2013 season by converting two-of-three field goals, making kicks of 36 and 41 yards, while missing a 30 yarder.

New Punter in 2013

With the graduation of four-year punter Peter Boehme, the job transferred to sophomore Matthew Moseley. Moseley tallied six punts in his first game with a long of 54 yards and a 38.3 average. During Boehme's career, he registered a 40.1-yard punting average over his career that have included 40 career punts of 50 or more yards - his career long of 64 in 2012 at SMU - and 80 punts that have been placed inside the opponents 20 over his 213 career boots.

Texas State 22, Southern Miss 15 Aug. 31, 2013

HATTIESBURG, Miss. (AP) - Texas State's Tyler Arndt slipped through the Southern Miss defensive line, made a quick move and then ended up strolling into the end zone for the 17-yard, go-ahead touchdown.

It was the ending of a beautiful fourth-quarter drive that seemingly came out of nowhere as the Bobcats rallied to beat Southern Miss 22-15.

Arndt's optimism was hard to fathom considering how Texas State had let an early 14-3 lead slip away. Southern Miss took a 15-14 lead with 5:43 remaining on Corey Acosta's 36-yard field goal and Texas State had barely managed 100 yards of total offense at that point in the night.

But Arndt and the Bobcats were clutch when it mattered. The senior quarterback led a 75-yard drive - which included a long pass completion on fourth-and-19 - to lead the Bobcats to the win.

Texas State took advantage of six Southern Miss turnovers, including four lost fumbles.

Southern Miss lost in the debut of coach Todd Monken.

Allan Bridgford threw for 377 yards for the Golden Eagles.

Texas State didn't have a good night on offense - with only 215 total yards - but the Bobcats were opportunistic.

They took a 7-0 lead early in the first quarter when Craig Mager ripped the ball away from Tyre'oune Holmes after a short completion and ran untouched 44 yards for a touchdown.

Jordan Moore threw a 23-yard touchdown to Robert Lowe with 8:52 left in the second quarter to push Texas State ahead 14-0 with 8:52 remaining in the second quarter. It was Moore's only completion of the game.

The Bobcats led 14-3 at halftime despite only 100 total yards of offense.

The Golden Eagles pulled within 14-5 on a safety after Texas State lost a snap through the back of the end zone. Then Bridgford hit James Cox for a 6-yard touchdown to make it 14-12.

Bridgford completed 28-of-53 passes and threw one touchdown and two interceptions.
