Stanford Looks to Rebound Against USC Cardinal 13-2 in Last 15 Home Games

The Game

After playing two straight road games, Stanford Cardinal (4-1, 1-1 Pac-10) return home on Saturday to play host to the USC Trojans (4-1, 1-1 Pac-10) at Stanford Stadium/Foster Field (50,000). Kick off is set for 5:12 p.m. Both teams are coming off conference losses last weekend, with Stanford falling at Oregon, 52-31 and USC dropping a 32-31 decision at home to Washington. Stanford is ranked 16th in this week's AP poll and 18th in the USA Today Coaches poll, while USC is unranked.

Television Coverage

Saturday's game will be carried live on ABC, with **Mike Patrick** (play-by-play) and **Craig James** (analyst) calling the action. Saturday's game marks the fifth consecutive national telecasts involving Stanford.

Radio Plans

Saturday's Stanford-USC game will be carried live on **XTRA Sports 860 AM** with **David Flemming** (play-by-play), former Stanford quarterback **Todd Husak** (analysis) and **John Platz** (sidelines) handling the broadcast duties. All broadcasts begin one hour prior to kickoff with the Cardinal Tailgate Show and will conclude with the Cardinal Locker Room Report following the game. Stanford student station KZSU will also broadcast Saturday's game live.

Stanford-USC Series

In a series that dates back to 1905, Stanford trails the all-time series with USC, 26-58-3. Stanford has won two of the last three games played in the series, including a 55-21 upset of 11th-ranked USC last year at the Coliseum. The Cardinal also defeated No. 2 Troy in 2007, posting a 24-23 win in Los Angeles. The two teams last met at Stanford Stadium in 2008, with the Trojans prevailing, 45-23. Stanford has dropped four straight to USC at Stanford Stadium dating back to 2002. The Cardinal last defeated USC at home in 2000, 32-30. **Series Note:** Stanford does not count the 1918 contest won by the Trojans in its series scores, as it was played as part of an unofficial schedule.

Cardinal Clips

- Are 4-1 on the season after falling to Oregon, 52-31 last Saturday in Eugene...the 52 points were the most allowed by Stanford since the third game of the 2007 season, when the Cardinal dropped a 55-31 decision at home to Oregon...the 21-point loss was Stanford's largest margin of defeat since it suffered a 22 point loss to USC in 2008.
- Were also 4-1 after five games last season...a win on Saturday would give Stanford its first 5-1 start since the 2001 season.
- Are ranked 16th this week in the AP Top-25 poll and 18th in the USA Today Coaches poll...debuted in the rankings after a season-opening victory against Sacramento State, cresting at No. 9 in the AP poll following a week four victory at Notre Dame.
- Have been ranked for five straight weeks, marking Stanford's longest presence in the AP poll since the 2001 campaign, when in nine straight polls to close the season.
- Saturday's game marks just the fifth time Stanford has entered a game against USC ranked higher than the Trojans in the AP poll...other such matchups came in 1940, '41, '71 and '86.
- Defeated USC, 55-21 last season in Los Angeles...the last time Stanford defeated USC in back-to-back seasons was 1999-2001, when the Cardinal won three straight over the Trojans to match its longest winning streak in the series.
- Are 2-0 at home this season with wins over Sacramento State and Wake Forest...are 13-2 in the last 15 home games dating back to the final home contest of the 2007 season...USC (2008) and Cal (2009) account for Stanford's only two losses in the last 15 home games.
- Averaging 44.6 points a game to rank fourth in the nation in scoring offense...have scored 30 or more points 13 times in the last 18 games dating back to last season and have topped the 50-point mark four times during that stretch.
- Also rank in the top-30 nationally in total offense (469.60), rushing offense (214.0) and passing offense (255.60)...rank second nationally in third down conversions (57.81).
- Yielded 626 yards in total offense to Oregon, which was the eighth highest total ever by a Stanford opponent and the most since UCLA tallied 624 yards in 2007.
- Outscoring its first five opponents 139-47 in the first half...were a fast starting team last year, as well, outscoring opponents 267-156 in the first half.
- Sophomore running back **Stepfan Taylor** has rushed for over 100 yards in each of his last two games vs. Notre Dame (108) and Oregon (113).
- Lou Groza Award candidate **Nate Whitaker** is 9-for-9 in field goal tries this season and has made his last 14 attempts in a row dating back to last season.
- A total of 16 different Stanford players have scored TDs this season.

Stanford Returns Home Saturday to Face USC

The 16th-ranked Stanford Cardinal (4-1, 1-1 Pac-10) will look to rebound from its first loss of the season on Saturday when it plays host to the USC Trojans (4-1, 1-1 Pac-10) at Stanford Stadium. Kick-off is set for 5:00 p.m. and the game will be televised nationally on ABC. Both teams are coming off losses last week. Stanford dropped a 52-31 decision at Oregon while USC fell at home to Washington, 32-21. Stanford is unbeaten at home this season and is 13-2 in its last 15 home games.

Saturday's Storylines

- Stanford is 13-2 over its last 15 home games...one of the two losses came at the hands of USC in 2008 (45-23).
- Stanford is 2-1 against USC under head coach Jim Harbaugh...both of the wins have come at the Coliseum (2007 and '09).
- Have lost four straight at home to USC dating back to its last home win over the Trojans in 2000 (32-30).
- Saturday's game marks just the fifth time Stanford has faced USC when it has been ranked higher than the Trojans in the AP poll...other such match ups came in 1940, '41, '71 and '86.
- Looking for its first back-to-back wins over the Trojans since winning three in a row from 1999-2001.
- Defeated the Trojans, 55-21 last year in Los Angeles...the 55 points were the most-ever scored against USC and marked the Trojans worst home loss since a 51-0 defeat by Notre Dame in 1966.

Last Meeting: Stanford 55, USC 21; Nov. 14, 2009; Los Angeles, CA

- One week after defeating No. 7 Oregon, 51-42 at Stanford Stadium, the Cardinal upset No. 11 USC, 55-21 in Los Angeles.
- The 55 points were the most-ever allowed by a USC team and marked the Trojans worst home loss since a 51-0 defeat by Notre Dame in 1966.
- **Toby Gerhart** rushed for 178 yards and three touchdowns.
- **Andrew Luck** completed 12-of-22 passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another.
- Stanford led 21-7 at the half and 28-21 after three quarters before exploding for 27 points in the final period.
- With Stanford leading 35-21, **Richard Sherman** picked off a Matt Barkley pass and returned it 43 yards for a TD to give the Cardinal a 42-21 lead with 11:41 remaining...touchdown runs by Gerhart and **Tyler Gaffney** closed out the scoring.

The Start

Stanford is off to a 4-1 start for the second year in a row and a win on Saturday would give the Cardinal its first 5-1 start since the 2001 season. Stanford's 4-1 start ties for the third best, five game start in the post-World War II era. Only the 1951 (5-0) and 1995 (4-0-1) teams have posted better five game starts.

Stanford in the Polls

Following a 52-31 loss to Oregon, Stanford dropped from No. 9 to No. 16 in this week's Associated Press Top-25 poll. The Cardinal are ranked 18th in this week's USA Today Coaches poll after holding down the 13th spot last week.

Stanford has been ranked in the AP poll each of the last five weeks, marking the program's longest presence in the poll since the 2001 season, when the Cardinal was ranked for nine straight weeks to close the season.

Stanford, unranked in the preseason polls, made its debut in the AP poll at No. 25 on Sept. 25 following a season-opening victory over Sacramento State. The Cardinal ascended to as high as No. 9 following its 37-14 win at Notre Dame in week four, which marked the program's highest ranking since the end of the 1992 season (No. 9) and its first appearance in the top-10 since the 2001 season, when the Cardinal was ranked 10th in the AP poll following its 38-28 upset win over fourth-ranked UCLA.

Stanford as a Ranked Team

Stanford is 4-3 as a ranked team under **Jim Harbaugh**. Last season, the 25th-ranked Cardinal posted a 55-21 victory at USC only to fall the following week to Cal, 34-28, when it was ranked 14th. Stanford took an AP ranking of 19th into its Sun Bowl match up against Oklahoma, only to fall, 31-27. Stanford is 3-1 as a ranked team this season.

The Home Record

With wins over Sacramento State and Wake Forest this season, Stanford is now 13-2 in its last 15 home games dating back to the final home contest of the 2007 season. The Cardinal is averaging 38.6 points (541 total) over its last 14 home games, while allowing 22.7 (319). Stanford was just 3-16 on its home turf from 2005-07.

The Pac-10 Record

After posting a 10-31 record in Pac-10 Conference play from 2002-2006, Stanford is 14-15 against Pac-10 foes under head coach **Jim Harbaugh**. The Cardinal have posted victories over every Pac-10 team during Harbaugh's tenure as head coach.

Stanford's three-year conference breakdown includes .500 or better marks against Arizona (2-1), USC (2-1), Washington (2-1), Washington State (2-1) and UCLA (2-2) and sub-.500 marks against Arizona State (1-2), California (1-2), Oregon (1-3) and Oregon State (1-2).

Stanford tied for second in conference play last season with a 6-3 record. The six conference wins were the most since the 2001 squad finished 6-2.

High-Scoring Cardinal

Stanford is averaging 44.6 points a game after five contests to rank fourth in the nation in scoring offense.

Stanford has scored 35 or more points in 10 of its last 18 games dating back to last season and have topped the 50-point mark four times in its last 10 games. The Cardinal have scored no fewer than 24 points in its last 16 games dating back to the second game of last season vs. Wake Forest (17).

Stanford's 68 points scored this season against Wake Forest tied for the fourth-highest single-game scoring output in school history and marked the first time since 2002 the Cardinal had reached the 60-point mark in a game (63 vs. San Jose State).

Offensive Categories

Stanford ranks in the top-five in the Pac-10 Conference in six offensive categories, including scoring offense (44.6; 2nd), total offense (469.6; 3rd), rushing offense (214.0; 4th), passing offense (255.6; 3rd) and passing efficiency (154.7; 2nd).

Defensive Doings

Stanford gave up 626 yards of total offense to Oregon last Saturday, which was the eighth highest total in school history and the most yardage compiled by an opponent since UCLA tallied 624 yards in 2007. The Ducks also ran for 388 yards, which ties for the fifth highest rushing output by a Stanford opponent in school history.

However, Stanford still ranks in the top-four in the conference in three defensive categories, including total defense (3rd; 330.0), passing defense (3rd; 163.0) and scoring defense (4th; 21.4).

Moving the Chains

The Cardinal has 119 first downs in five games this season, which is the second highest total in the Pac-10. Stanford also ranks first in the Pac-10 in third down conversions at 57.8 (37-64).

By the Halves

Stanford is averaging 27.8 points (139 total) in the first half compared to 16.8 points (84 total) after intermission. Stanford did not score in the second half against Oregon, marking the first time the Cardinal had been blanked in a half since it was held off the scoreboard in the second half of last year's game at Wake Forest.

Stanford has outscored its first four opponents 139-47 in the first half, including a 76-20 mark in the first quarter. Stanford was a fast starting team last year, as well, outscoring the opposition 267-156 in the first half. The Cardinal has trailed in just two games this season (at Notre Dame; at Oregon).

Scoring Margins

Stanford has won four games of the season by an average of 34.23 points, with its closest call being a 23-point win over Notre Dame. Stanford's last 12 victories dating back to last season have come by a margin of 23.7 points (285 total), while its six losses have been by a margin of just 8.8 points (53 total). Stanford is 6-8 in 14 games decided by a touchdown or less under Jim Harbaugh.

Well Received

A total of 14 players have caught passes at the five game mark of the season, led by senior **Doug Baldwin**, who has 15 receptions for 255 yards and three touchdowns. Baldwin is one of six Stanford players to have at least 10 receptions on the year. The Cardinal's seventh leading receiver is **Coby Fleener** with nine catches for 148 yards and three touchdowns.

Spreading the Wealth

With **Griff Whalen** catching his first career touchdown pass on Saturday at Oregon, Stanford has 16 players account for its 28 touchdowns this season. Wide receiver **Doug Baldwin**, tight end **Coby Fleener** and running back **Tyler Gaffney** lead the team with three TDs, followed by wide receiver **Chris Owusu**, Andrew Luck, Owen Marecic and **Stepfan Taylor**, who have two each. Stanford has 13 rushing touchdowns and 13 passing touchdowns, to go along with an interception return and fumble recovery for TDs.

Turnovers

Stanford has forced 12 turnovers in five games this season (six interceptions; six fumbles), compared to last season at the five game mark, when the Cardinal had forced just six turnovers (three interceptions; three fumbles). Stanford has turned the ball over eight times, throwing four interceptions and losing four fumbles and rank third in the Pac-10 in turnover margin at +4.

In the Red Zone

Stanford converted on 2-of-4 of its trips into the red zone against Oregon and rank third in the Pac-10 and are tied for 12th nationally in red zone efficiency at 93.0 (28-for-30).

The Running Game

After five games, Stanford is averaging 214.0 yards a game in rushing average, which ranks fourth in the Pac-10 and 23rd nationally and is just four yards off the pace of last year's season average (218.2).

Stanford's top five rushers are averaging between 27.8 and 75.6 yards a game, including sophomore running back Stepfan Taylor, who leads the team in rushing at the five-game mark of the season with a 75.6 game average (378 net).

In the first season of the post-Toby Gerhart Era, five running backs -- Taylor (76-378), **Usua Amanam** (23-113), **Tyler Gaffney** (25-152), **Anthony Wilkerson** (19-68) and **Jeremy Stewart** (5-21) -- have combined to rush for 732 yards in five games, an average of 146.4 yards per contest. Last year, Gerhart averaged 143.9 rushing yards a game while Stanford as a team averaged 218.2 yards a game on the ground, which ranked second in the Pac-10 and 11th nationally.

Quarterbacks own Stanford's two longest runs of the season. **Alex Loukas** ran 48 yards for a touchdown in the season opener against Sacramento State while **Andrew Luck** ran for a 52 yard TD against Wake Forest.

Balance

Despite the loss of Doak Walker Award winner **Toby Gerhart**, Stanford remains primarily a run-orientated offense through the first five games of the season. Of Stanford's 354 offensive plays, 56.4 percent (200 total) have been rushing plays, while 43.6 percent (154) have been pass plays.

Controlling the Clock

Stanford has controlled the clock in four of its five games this season, with the exception of the Wake Forest game, when the Demon Deacons had the ball for 30:33. Stanford leads the Pac-10 in time of possession at 33:30 per game.

The Offensive Line

Stanford's offensive line -- consisting of center **Chase Beeler**, right guard **David DeCastro**, right tackle **Derek Hall**, left guard **Andrew Phillips** and left tackle **Jonathan Martin** -- has allowed just two sacks this season and has helped pave the way for a young Stanford rushing attack that is averaging 214.0 yards per game. Stanford currently ranks seventh nationally in sacks allowed per game at 0.40. The Cardinal allowed just seven sacks all of last season, which were the second fewest in the nation next to Boise State.

A Throwback

Senior **Owen Marecic** is perhaps the only player among FBS schools starting on both sides of the ball, topping the Cardinal depth chart at both fullback and inside linebacker.

For the season, Marecic has rushed 11 times for 26 yards and two touchdowns and currently ranks as Stanford's third leading tackler with 22 stops, including a career best 10 tackles at Oregon. He also has one tackle-for-loss, one sack, one interception return for a touchdown, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

Against Notre Dame, Marecic became the first player since 2006 to score a touchdown on both sides of the ball. At the 7:58 mark of the fourth quarter, Marecic capped an 11-play, 49-yard scoring drive with a one yard touchdown run to give Stanford a 27-6 lead. On Notre Dame's first play following the ensuing kickoff, Marecic intercepted a Dayne Crist pass and returned in 20 yards for a touchdown.

He finished the game with three yards on three carries, including a TD, and also was credited with four solo tackles, including a sack and an interception return for a TD.

Hot Foot

Lou Groza Award candidate **Nate Whitaker** made his only field goal attempt Saturday at Oregon, nailing a 46-yarder at the end of the first half. His is now 9-for-9 in field goal tries this season and has converted 15 straight field goals dating back to last season. He has also cashed in on 15 of his last 16 and 17 of his last 19 tries dating back to the Oregon game last season.

Against Notre Dame, Whitaker made all five of his field goal tries to tie a Stanford single game record (John Hopkins at California, 1990).

For his Stanford career, Whitaker has made 25-of-31 (.806) of his field goal tries and currently ranks first on Stanford's career list for field goal accuracy.

- Quarterback's **Andrew Luck's** father, Oliver, was a standout quarterback at West Virginia, where he now serves as athletics director.

Stanford Welcomes Five New Members to Its Coaching Staff

Stanford added five members to its full-time coaching staff in the offseason, including three new defensive coaches, a wide receivers coach and a special teams coordinator.

- **Vic Fangio** assumes the role of defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, after spending 24 years coaching in the NFL, including the last four seasons with the Baltimore Ravens.
- **Randy Hart**, a 40-year coaching veteran in the collegiate ranks, enters his first season as the defensive line coach after spending the 2009 season in the same capacity at Notre Dame.
- **Brian Polian** enters his first season as special teams coordinator after serving in the same role at Notre Dame for the previous five seasons.
- **Derek Mason** takes over as secondary coach after serving as assistant defensive backs coach with the Minnesota Vikings for the last three seasons.
- **Pep Hamilton** enters his first season on the Stanford staff as wide receivers coach after serving as the quarterbacks coach for the Chicago Bears for the past three seasons.
- **Greg Roman** was promoted to associate head coach and assistant coach of the offense. He will continue to work with the tight ends and offensive line.
- **David Shaw** now serves as running backs coach, in addition to his duties as offensive coordinator. **Ron Lynn**, who served as assistant head coach and co-defensive coordinator for the past two seasons, has assumed the role of director of player personnel.

Personnel on Stanford's coaching and support staff have a combined 122 years of NFL experience. Along with head coach **Jim Harbaugh**, who spent 15 years as a player in the NFL and two years as the quarterbacks coach of the Oakland Raiders, full-time assistants **Vic Fangio** (24), **Pep Hamilton** (7), **Derek Mason** (3), **Greg Roman** (13) and **David Shaw** (9) also have NFL coaching experience. Among the members of the support staff with NFL lineage are director of player development Ron Lynn, who spent 19 years as a defensive coordinator and secondary coach with six NFL teams; defensive assistant **Chester McGlockton**, a four-time Pro Bowler who played 12 seasons in the NFL; strength and conditioning intern **Steve Wisniewski**, a 13-year NFL veteran and eight-time Pro Bowler; and offensive assistant **Aaron Moorehead**, who spent five seasons with the Indianapolis Colts.

- Stanford's football program received an Academic Progress Rating (APR) of 976 last spring, which was the highest rating in the Pac-10 Conference and a figure that ranked eighth nationally among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) institutions.

48 • Owen Marecic, Inside Linebacker/Fullback, 6-1, 244, Sr.-Sr., Tigard, OR

- One of the team's tri-captains, along with Ryan Whalen and Sione Fua.
- Perhaps the only player among FBS schools to be listed atop the depth chart at two positions...holds down the starting duties at inside linebacker along his role at fullback.

- Had three tackles and one sack against Wake Forest.
- Had two total tackles and one pass breakup at UCLA...also carried three times for five yards, including a one yard TD run with 0:43 left in the third quarter.
- Rushed one time for six yards to go along with two assisted tackles, a pass breakup and a fumble recovery vs. Sacramento State.
- Three-time All-Pac-10 honorable mention selection at fullback...one of the best blocking fullbacks in the nation.
- Carried eight times last year for 21 yards and four TDs.
- Started on both sides of the ball in Stanford's win over No. 7 Oregon.

It Happened Against USC

1970

Before a crowd of 86,000 at Stanford Stadium, Stanford stuns fourth-ranked USC, 24-14, marking its first win over the Trojans since 1957. Jim Plunkett completed 19-of-31 passes for 275 yards and one TD and Stanford's defense turns back the Trojans twice on goal line stands.

1973

Rod Garcia sets a Stanford and Pac-10 record by booting a 59-yard field goal in the first quarter. However, Chris Limahelu's 34-yard field goal with 0:34 left lifts the eighth-ranked Trojans to a 27-26 victory at the Coliseum.

1975

Mike Langford kicks a 37-yard game-winning field goal as time expires, lifting Stanford to a 13-10 win over ninth-ranked USC at the Coliseum.

1979

After trailing at halftime 21-0, Stanford rallies to score 14 points in the fourth quarter to tie top-ranked USC, 21-21 at the Coliseum. It was the only blemish on USC's record, as the Trojans would finish the season ranked second in both wire service polls behind national champion Alabama.

1982

John Elway completes 27-of-41 passes for 239 yards for his 26th career 200-yard passing game, setting a new NCAA record, previously held by Jim Plunkett. Elway's record-setting performance was not enough, as USC came away with a 41-21 victory at Stanford Stadium.

1986

Before a national television audience and a crowd of 73,500 at Stanford Stadium, linebacker Dave Wyman records a school-record 27 tackles (5-22), however, USC shuts out the Cardinal, 10-0.

1990

Jason Palumbis completes 30-of-45 passes for 360 yards, including three TD passes, however, the Trojans force three Cardinal fumbles and limit Glyn Milburn to just nine yards on nine carries in a 37-22 victory at Stanford Stadium. Palumbis' passing yardage is the highest total ever recorded by a Stanford quarterback against USC.

1991

Stanford defeats USC, 24-21 at the Coliseum, marking the Cardinal's first victory over the Trojans since 1975.

1992

Steve Stenstrom completes 23-of-39 passes for 273 yards and Stanford's defense limits 11th-ranked USC to 59 rushing yards in a 23-9 victory at Stanford Stadium.

1996

Mike Mitchell runs for 147 yards on 22 carries to lead the Cardinal to a 24-20 come-from-behind victory over the Trojans at Stanford Stadium. The rushing yardage is the highest total by a Stanford back against USC.

1997

Troy Walters catches 11 passes for 209 yards and two TDs, however, Stanford drops a 45-21 decision at the Coliseum. Walters also returned a punt 66-yards for a TD in the first quarter.

2000

After coming off the bench to replace an injured Randy Fasani, Chris Lewis throws a 20-yard TD pass to Jamien McCullum as time expires to give Stanford a thrilling, 32-30 come-from-behind victory over USC. Kerry Carter ties a single-game record with four rushing TDs and DeRonnie Pitts catches 13 passes for 176 yards.

2007

Tavita Pritchard connects with Mark Bradford on a 10-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-and-goal play with 0:49 remaining to lift Stanford to a 24-23 victory over second-ranked (AP) USC at the Coliseum.

2010

Toby Gerhart rushed for 178 yards and three touchdowns to lead Stanford to a 55-21 victory over No. 11 USC at the Coliseum. The 55 point were the most ever scored against USC, as the Cardinal hand the Trojans their worst home loss since 1966.

- Recipient of the 2009 Jack Huston Award, given annually to a Stanford player for his unheralded efforts.
- Majoring in human biology.

98 • Matt Masifilo, Defensive End, 6-3, 280, Sr.-Jr., Ewa Beach, HI

- Has 12 total tackles on the year, including one sack and one forced fumble.
- Had a season high four tackles at Oregon.
- Coming off an injury-plagued season where he missed five games after suffering a knee injury in the second game of the season against Wake Forest.
- Finished the year with 18 tackles, including 11 solo efforts and one sack.
- Majoring in mechanical engineering.

81 • Chris Owusu, Wide Receiver, 6-2, 220, Jr.-Jr., Westlake Village, CA

- Has 11 catches for 140 yards and two touchdowns in his three games...missed the first two contests of the season with injury.
- Matched a career-high with six receptions for 52 yards at Oregon.
- Caught two passes for 23 yards at Notre Dame, including a 20-yard reception at the start of the third quarter.
- Made his season debut against Wake Forest...finished with three catches for 65 yards and two TDs...accounted for Stanford's first two TDs in a 68-24 victory over the Demon Deacons...caught an eight-yard pass from Luck that opened the scoring at the 9:12 mark on the first quarter and was also on the receiving end of a 35 yard pass from Luck at the 6:24 mark of the first period...marked his first multi-TD game of his career.
- Preseason first team All-America selection by both Sporting News and Playboy as a kickoff specialist...also included on the preseason watch list for the Walter Camp Foundation Player of the Year award.
- Led the team in touchdown receptions (5) and finished second in receptions (37) and receiving yardage (682).
- Dynamic kickoff return man earned first team All-Pac-10 honors and was selected as a second team Walter Camp All-American last year as a sophomore.
- Led the Pac-10 and ranked fifth nationally in kickoff return average (31.5)...totaled 1,167 yards in kickoff returns, smashing Ryan Wells' single-season school mark of 715 set in 2002.
- Returned eight kickoffs for 40 yards or more, including three for TDs in 2009.
- Returned three kickoffs for TDs against Washington State (85), San Jose State (94) and Washington (91) to set a Stanford single-season record...three kickoff returns for TDs also tied a Pac-10 single season record.
- His 94-yard return against San Jose State in 2009 was the 10th longest return in school history.
- Graduated from Oaks Christian School in Westlake Village where he was a high school teammate of former Notre Dame quarterback Jimmy Clausen.
- Majoring in human biology.

9 • Richard Sherman, Cornerback, 6-3, 192, 5th-Sr., Compton, CA

- Fifth-year senior has 15 total tackles, one interception and five pass breakups over the first five games of the season.
- Credited with three tackles in each of the last three games against Wake Forest, Notre Dame and Oregon.
- Finished with two tackles and recorded his third career interception at UCLA...picked off a Kevin Prince pass at the two-yard line in the second quarter.

Stanford's National Championships

NCAA championships are commonplace at Stanford University, as Cardinal teams have combined to win 99 NCAA team championships, including 60 men's championships and an NCAA-best 39 women's titles. Stanford teams have combined to capture a national-best 82 NCAA titles since 1980 and 59 since 1990. Stanford has won at least one NCAA championship for 34 consecutive years and has won four national titles in a single year nine times.

Nine different teams have won at least five national titles, including men's tennis (18), women's tennis (17), men's water polo (11), women's swimming and diving (9), men's swimming and diving (8), men's golf (8), women's volleyball (8), synchronized swimming (6) and women's cross country (5). A total of 19 Stanford teams have won at least one national championship after women's rowing captured its inaugural NCAA title 2009.

16 Straight Directors' Cups

Stanford has won 16 straight Directors' Cups, emblematic of the top intercollegiate program in the country. Last year, Stanford captured NCAA titles in the sports of women's tennis and men's volleyball.

Stanford boasted an impressive 17 top-10 finishes last season, with nine teams earning No. 1 rankings at some point during their seasons. In addition to winning national championships in three sports, six other Cardinal teams had runner-up national finishes.

Three Stanford student-athletes earned national player of the year recognition while three Stanford coaches earned national coach of the year recognition. Ten Stanford student-athletes won NCAA individual titles.

- His 16 field goals in 2009 ranked tied for third most in Stanford single-season history...became the first Stanford kicker with more than 40 attempts to convert all of his PAT tries.

Stanford 52, Sacramento State 17
September 4, 2010 | Stanford, CA | Stanford Stadium

PASADENA, Calif. – Sophomore quarterback Andrew Luck completed 17-of-23 passes for 316 yards and a career-best four touchdowns as Stanford routed visiting Sacramento State, 52-17 in the season opener before 30,626 at Stanford Stadium.

Stanford's point total was the third-highest in a season opener dating back to 1940 and marked the sixth time since the 2008 season the Cardinal had scored 40 or points in a game.

All four of Luck's touchdown passes came in the first half, as the Cardinal built a 38-7 lead at intermission. His first scoring strike came on an 81-yard bomb to senior wide out Doug Baldwin at the 6:18 mark of the first quarter which gave Stanford a 14-0 lead. The touchdown pass was the eighth longest in Stanford history. Baldwin finished the day with four receptions for a career high 111 yards. Luck's final passing total was the second-highest in his career, trailing only his 423-yard effort at Arizona in 2009. "We came out very strong," Luck said following the game. "There were some mistakes but that's to be expected in a season-opener."

In its first game of the post-Toby Gerhart Era, five Stanford running backs – Usua Amanam (50), Tyler Gaffney (33), Anthony Wilkerson (27), Jeremy Stewart (21) and Stepfan Taylor (16) -- combined for 147 yards on 31 carries, as Stanford finished the day with 213 yards on the ground.

Stanford's defense limited the Hornets to just 167 yards in total offense, the lowest output by an opponent since the Cardinal limited Washington to 161 yards in 2006. Inside linebacker Max Bergen, starting in place of the injured Shayne Skov, led the Cardinal with eight tackles. Sophomore outside linebacker Chase Thomas registered two sacks among his four total tackles.

The win was Stanford's third straight in a season opener, as the Cardinal improved to 12-2 in its last 14 home games at Stanford Stadium.

PASADENA, Calif. – Stanford snapped a six-game losing streak to UCLA in the Rose Bowl and shutout the Bruins for the first time since 1941 with its 35-0 victory in Pasadena.

The victory also marked Stanford's first road shutout since 1974, when the Cardinal defeated Oregon, 17-0 in Eugene.

Stanford's defense limited the Bruins to 233 yards in total offense as the Cardinal improved to 2-0 for the first time since the 2004 season.

Quarterback Andrew Luck connected completed 11-of-24 passes for 151 yards and two touchdowns. His 16-yard scoring strike to Ryan Whalen gave Stanford its first score at the 9:31 mark of the first quarter. Coby Fleener was on the receiving end of Luck's second touchdown pass, a three-yarder at the 8:38 mark of the fourth quarter.

Stanford also benefitted from a pair of Nate Whitaker field goals and a one-yard touchdown run by fullback Owen Marecic.

Safety Michael Thomas set the tone for Stanford's defense, forcing two fumbles and returning one 21-yards for a touchdown in the third quarter.

STANFORD, Calif. – Stanford's offense scored touchdowns on 10 of its 11 offensive possessions to rout Wake Forest, 68-24 at Stanford Stadium.

The point total tied for the third-highest in school history and marked the first time Stanford had reached the 60 point mark since the 2003 season in a 63-26 victory over San Jose State.

Stanford wore all-black uniforms for the first time in school history for the nationally televised game on ESPN 2, which kicked off at 8:25 p.m., marking the latest start time in Stanford history.

Stanford scored touchdowns on each of its first eight possessions behind quarterback Andrew Luck, who threw for 207 yards and four TD passes. His first two scoring strikes were to Chris Owusu, who was making his season debut after missing the first two games of the season with injury. Luck also ran 52-yards for Stanford's fifth touchdown of the game, helping the Cardinal build up a 41-10 lead at intermission.

Sophomore running back Tyler Gaffney finished the game with a career high 76 yards and two touchdowns on seven carries, as three Cardinal compiled 303 yards of rushing offense. Stanford finished the game with 535 yards in total offense, compared to the Demon Deacons 283 yard total.

The win also marked head coach Jim Harbaugh's 20th victory as Stanford's head coach in his 40th game on the sideline.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. – Nate Whitaker kicked five field goals to tie a Stanford single-game record as the 16th-ranked Cardinal defeated Notre Dame, 37-14 for its fourth consecutive victory to start the season.

The win was Stanford's first in South Bend since 1992 and gave the Cardinal its first 4-0 start since the 1986 season.

Stanford's defense limited the Irish to just 44 rushing yards and just one touchdown on the afternoon.

After the Irish took an early 3-0 lead on a David Ruffer field goal, quarterback Andrew Luck connected with Coby Fleener on a 16-yard pass play to culminate a 10-play, 79-yard scoring drive that gave the Cardinal a 7-3 lead.

Whitaker accounted for Stanford's next 12 points, converting field goals from 24, 41, 36 and 33 yards as the Cardinal built a 19-6 lead at the 10:44 mark of the third quarter.

A one yard run by Owen Marecic and a two-point conversion gave Stanford a 27-6 lead at the 7:58 mark of the final period.

Following the ensuing kickoff, Marecic intercepted a Dayne Crist pass and returned it 20 yards for a touchdown to give the Cardinal a 34-6 lead.

Notre Dame scored its only touchdown of the game at the 6:01 mark of the fourth quarter, but Whitaker nailed his fifth field goal with 1:47 left to close out the scoring.

Delano Howell had 12 tackles while linebacker Shayne Skov added eight stops, including two sacks and a fumble recovery, to lead an improving Cardinal defense.

EUGENE, Ore.-- EUGENE, Ore. -- In a battle of unbeaten and top-10 ranked teams, fourth-ranked Oregon scored 28 unanswered points in the second half to defeat ninth-ranked Stanford, 52-31 before a sellout crowd at Autzen Stadium.

The Ducks rolled up 626 yards in total offense, which was the eighth highest total ever allowed by Stanford. Of the 626 yards, 388 came on the ground, which marked the fifth highest rushing opponent total in school history.

Stanford took advantage of two Oregon turnovers in the first quarter to build a 21-3 lead. After Oregon took a 3-0 lead, the Cardinal marched 70 yards in 11 plays culminating in a 18 yard touchdown pass from Andrew Luck to Griff Whalen to take a 7-3 lead. The Ducks fumbled the ensuing kickoff and the Cardinal regained possession on the 12 yard line. Facing a third and eight play, Luck ran around left end for a touchdown to increase Stanford's lead to 14-3 at the 4:02 mark of the first quarter.

On Oregon's next possession, linebacker Chase Thomas intercepted a Darron Thomas pass at the Ducks 46 yard line. Stanford wasted no time in capitalizing, as Stepfan Taylor broke loose for a 44 yard touchdown run to give the Cardinal a 21-3 lead. After the Ducks closed the lead to 21-17, Luck connected with tight end Coby Fleener on a 36-yard touchdown at the 7:30 mark of the second quarter to give the Cardinal a 28-17 lead. A 46 yard field goal by Nate Whitaker as time expired in the first half gave Stanford a 31-24 lead at intermission.

The second half belonged to Oregon, as the Ducks compiled 481 of its 626 yards of total offense in the second half and scored 28 unanswered points to hand Stanford its first loss of the season. Oregon running back LaMichael James finished the game with 257 yards and three touchdowns while Thomas completed 20-of-29 passes for 238 yards and three touchdowns to lead the high-powered Duck offense. Thomas also rank for 117 yards on 15 carries.

Luck completed 29-of-46 passes for 341 yards and two touchdowns, but was also intercepted twice. Taylor finished the game with a career high 113 yards on 17 carries. Owen Marecic and Taylor Skaufel had a team-high 10 tackles for Stanford.
