## Stanford and Arizona Meet in Key Pac-10 Matchup Cardinal Off to Best Start Since 1970

### The Game

The 10th-ranked Stanford Cardinal (7-1, 4-1 Pac-10), off to its best start since 1970, will face the 13th-ranked Arizona Wildcats (7-1, 4-1 Pac-10) Saturday at Stanford Stadium/Foster Field (50,000). The game will be televised by ABC and will kick off at 5:12 p.m. Stanford and Arizona are tied for second place in the Pac-10 Conference race and are meeting as ranked teams for the first time in the history of the the series. Both teams are coming off road wins last Saturday. Stanford shut out Washington, 41-0 while Arizona downed UCLA, 29-21 at the Rose Bowl.

### Television Coverage

Saturday's game will be carried live on ABC, with **Brent Musburger** (play-by-play), **Kirk Herbstreit** (analyst), and **Erin Andrews** (sidelines) calling the action.

### Radio Plans

Saturday's Stanford-Arizona game will be carried live on **XTRA Sports 860 AM** with **Dave Fleming** (play-by-play), former Stanford quarterback **Todd Husak** (analysis) and **John Platz** (sidelines) handling the broadcast duties. All broadcasts begin one hour prior to kickoff with the Cardinal Tailgate Show and will conclude with the Cardinal Locker Room Report following the game. Stanford student station KZSU will also broadcast Saturday's game live.

### Stanford-Arizona Series

In a series that dates back to 1979, Stanford trails the all-time series with Arizona, 11-14-0. Stanford has won two of the last three games in the series and are 6-3 against the 'Cats dating back to a 50-22 victory in 1999, which snapped Arizona's six-game winning streak in head-to-head meetings. Arizona won last year's game in Tucson, 43-38, as the two teams combined for 1,137 yards in total offense, including 849 in the air. Stanford is just 4-7 in 11 home games against Arizona, including a victory in the 'Cats last visit to the Bay Area in 2008, 24-23. The teams also played one neutral site game in 1986, with Stanford claiming a 29-24 victory in Tokyo, Japan.

### Cardinal Clips

- Are 7-1 on the season after shutting out Washington last Saturday, 41-0...are off to its best start since 1970, when Stanford began the season with an 8-1 record on its way to the Pacific-8 Conference and a Rose Bowl victory over Ohio State.
- Are ranked 10th this week in the AP Top-25 poll and 12th in the USA Today Coaches poll...have been ranked for nine straight weeks, marking Stanford's longest presence in the AP poll since the 2001 campaign, when it was also ranked in nine straight polls to close the season...check in at No. 13 in this week's Bowl Championship Series (BCS) standings.
- Coming off one of the most dominating defensive performances in school history in its 41-0 shutout victory at Washington...allowed the second fewest total yards (107) in school history and gave up just seven first downs...allowed the Huskies past midfield just once.
- Are 4-0 at home this season and are 15-2 in its last 17 home games dating back to the final home contest of the 2007 season.
- Averaging 42.38 points a game to rank second in the Pac-10 Conference and fifth in the nation in scoring offense...have scored 30 or more points in eight straight games, which is a school record...are on pace to break the school's single-season point total of 461 set last season.
- Also rank in the top-30 nationally in total offense (16th; 466.8), rushing offense (12th; 223.7), passing efficiency (10th; 163.5), first downs (11th; 24.50), third down efficiency (2nd; 57.69) and red zone efficiency (t-8th; 92.0).
- Outscoring its first eight opponents 205-68 in the first half, including 107-27 in the first quarter...were a fast starting team last year, as well, outscoring opponents 267-156 in the first half...have not trailed at halftime this year.
- Stanford has punted just 16 times this season, the fewest attempts in the nation along with Nevada among FBS teams...Boise State has punted 17 times.
- Davey O'Brien Award candidate **Andrew Luck** ranks first in the the Pac-10 and 10th nationally in passing efficiency at 162.51...he also ranks first in the conference and 19th nationally in total offense (283.12) and 34th nationally in total passing yards (1,920)...Stanford is 15-5 over the last two seasons with Luck as its starting quarterback.
- Sophomore running back **Stepfan Taylor** has rushed for over 100 yards in each of his last five games, which is the second longest streak of its kind in school history...he is averaging 114.2 yards a game in his last five contests.
- A total of 16 different Stanford players have scored TDs this season, which is tops in the nation, along with Central Florida.

### Stanford and Arizona Meet in Key Pac-10 Matchup

The Stanford Cardinal (7-1, 4-1 Pac-10) return home to face the Arizona Wildcats (7-1, 4-1 Pac-10) Saturday at Stanford Stadium/Foster Field (50,000). Kickoff is set for 5:12 p.m. and the game will be televised by ABC. Stanford, off to its best start since 1970, is coming off a 41-0 victory at Washington last Saturday, while Arizona defeated UCLA, 29-21 at the Rose Bowl. Stanford is ranked 10th in this week's AP poll and 12th in the USA Today Coaches poll, while Arizona is ranked 13th in both polls.

### Saturday's Storylines

- Saturday's game marks the first meeting between Stanford and Arizona when both teams have been ranked...Stanford has faced the 'Cats twice previously as a ranked team and is 1-1 in those contests.
- Both Stanford and Arizona got off to 4-0 starts before dropping its fifth game of the season...both teams enter Saturday's contest riding three game winning streaks.
- Stanford's lone loss of the season came to Oregon (52-31) while Arizona's lone setback was to Oregon State (29-27).
- Stanford and Arizona combined for 1,137 yards in total offense in last year's game in Tucson, including 849 in the air.
- Stanford is ranked second in the Pac-10 and 12th nationally in rushing offense (223.7) while Arizona is ranked first in the conference and sixth nationally in rushing defense (88.38).
- The Cardinal enter the game having scored 30 or more points in a school-record eight straight games and are averaging 42.38 points per game, which ranks second in the Pac-10 and fifth nationally...the 'Cats rank first in the Pac-10 and seventh nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 14.38 points a game, and have not allowed more than 29 points all season.
- Arizona is averaging 3.38 sacks per game, tops in the Pac-10 and fifth nationally...Stanford has allowed just 0.38 sacks per game (7 total), the lowest average in the Pac-10 and tied for second nationally.
- Arizona leads the Pac-10 and ranks 12th nationally in passing offense (300.63) while Stanford ranks third in the conference and 41st nationally in pass defense (198.88).
- Stanford quarterback **Andrew Luck** enters the game having completed 59-of-78 (.756) of his passes for 667 yards and seven touchdowns in his last three games...Arizona ranks second in the conference behind California in pass defense, allowing 198.5 yards per game.
- Stanford running back **Stepfan Taylor** enters the game having rushed for 100 yards in each of his last five games and is averaging 114.2 yards a game during that stretch...Arizona has allowed just one running back (Cal's Shane Vereen; 102) to rush for 100 yards this season.

### Last Meeting: Arizona 43, Stanford 38; Oct. 17, 2009; Tucson, AZ

- Nate Grigsby's 57 yard touchdown run with 2:57 left in the game lifted Arizona to a 43-38 come-from-behind win over Stanford in an offensive shootout at Arizona Stadium.
- Stanford had leads of 21-13, 28-13, 31-23 and 38-29 before the Wildcats rallied for two fourth quarter touchdowns to hand the Cardinal its second straight defeat.
- With Stanford holding a 38-29 lead, Greg Nwoko broke loose for a 43 yard touchdown run at the 10:06 mark of the fourth quarter to bring the Wildcats to within two points at 38-36. Later in the period, the Cardinal managed to drive down to the Wildcat's eight-yard line with a five and a half minutes remaining in the game, only to be turned away when Chris Owusu dropped a pass from Andrew Luck on a fourth and two play.
- On the 'Cat's next possession, Grigsby broke loose for 57 yards and the go-ahead touchdown on a third and 17 play from Arizona's own 43 yard line.
- With time winding down, Luck guided the Cardinal down to the Arizona 12-yard line, connecting with Owusu and Doug Baldwin on pass plays of 15 and 36 yards, respectively. Following a delay of game penalty that pushed the ball back to the 17, Stanford failed to reach the end zone after three straight incompletions and the Cardinal saw its record fall to 4-3 on the season and 3-2 in the Pac-10 Conference.
- The two teams combined for 1,137 yards in total offense, including 849 through the air.
- Luck completed 21-of-35 passes for 423 yards and three touchdowns and accounted for 443 yards in total offense. The passing yardage was the third highest single game total in Stanford history while the total offense yardage ranked second. The redshirt freshman connected with Jim Dray, Ryan Whalen and Chris Owusu on touchdown passes while running back Toby Gerhart rushed for two others as Stanford eclipsed the 30-point mark for the fourth time in seven games.
- Gerhart finished with 123 yards on 28 carries to move into fourth place on Stanford's all-time career rushing list.
- Arizona quarterback Nick Foles completed 40-of-51 passes for 415 yards and three touchdowns.

**The Start**

At 7-1, Stanford is off to its best start since 1970, when quarterback Jim Plunkett led Stanford to an 8-1 start on its way to the Pacific-8 Conference title and a trip to the Rose Bowl.

**Stanford in the Polls**

Stanford is ranked 10th in this week's AP Top 25 poll and 12th in the USA Today Coaches poll. The Cardinal is also ranked 13th in the BCS Standings.

It marks Stanford's highest ranking in the poll since it was ranked No. 9 on Sept. 26 following its 37-14 win at Notre Dame and the program's fourth top-10 ranking since the end of the 1992 season.

Stanford has been ranked in the AP poll each of the last nine weeks, marking the program's longest presence in the poll since the 2001 season, when the Cardinal was ranked for nine straight weeks to close the season.

Stanford, unranked in the preseason polls, made its debut in the AP poll at No. 25 on Sept. 25 following a season-opening victory over Sacramento State. The Cardinal ascended to as high as No. 9 following its 37-14 win at Notre Dame in week four, which marked the program's highest ranking since the end of the 1992 season (No. 9) and its first appearance in the top-10 since the 2001 season, when the Cardinal was ranked 10th in the AP poll following its 38-28 upset win over fourth-ranked UCLA.

**Stanford Against Ranked Teams**

Stanford has faced just one ranked team this season, losing to No. 4 Oregon, 52-31 on Oct. 2 in Eugene. However, the Cardinal is 3-1 in its last four games against ranked opponents. Stanford is 7-3 as a ranked team under **Jim Harbaugh**, including a 5-1 mark as a ranked team this season.

**Home and Road**

Stanford is 4-0 at home this season and is now 15-2 in its last 17 home games dating back to the final home contest of the 2007 season. The Cardinal is averaging 38.5 points (616 total) over its last 16 home games, while allowing 23.8 (382). Stanford was just 3-16 on its home turf from 2005-07.

The Cardinal is 3-1 in three road games this year, posting wins at UCLA (35-0), Notre Dame (37-14) and Washington (41-0) while falling at Oregon (52-31). Stanford is 8-12 in 20 road games under **Jim Harbaugh**.

**Stanford a Winner Under Harbaugh**

With its 41-0 victory at Washington last Saturday, Stanford improved to 24-21 (.533) under head coach **Jim Harbaugh**, including a 15-6 record in its last 21 contests. Stanford had posted a 16-40 record in five seasons (2002-06) before Harbaugh took over the program beginning with the 2007 season.

Stanford is also 17-15 against Pac-10 foes under head coach **Harbaugh**, including a 10-4 mark in its last 14 conference clashes. The Cardinal have posted victories over every Pac-10 team during Harbaugh's tenure as head coach.

Stanford's three-year conference breakdown includes .500 or better marks against Arizona (2-1), USC (3-1), Washington (3-1), Washington State (3-1) and UCLA (2-2) and sub-.500 marks against Arizona State (1-2), California (1-2), Oregon (1-3) and Oregon State (1-2).

The Cardinal was 10-31 in conference play from 2002-06.

**High-Scoring Cardinal**

Stanford is averaging 42.38 points a game through eight contests to rank second in the Pac-10 and fifth nationally in scoring offense. Only Oregon (54.88), Boise State (47.41), Oklahoma State (45.25) and Utah (45.25) are averaging more points per game than the Cardinal at this point in the season.

Stanford has scored 30 or more points in eight straight games this season, which is a school record. The Cardinal has scored 30 or more points in 13 of its last 21 games dating back to last season and have topped the 50-point mark four times during that span. The Cardinal have scored no fewer than 24 points in its last 19 games dating back to the second game of last season vs. Wake Forest (17).

Stanford's 339 total points to date already rank sixth on the school's all-time single-season list.

Stanford's 68 points scored earlier this season against Wake Forest tied for the fourth-highest single-game scoring output in school history and marked the first time since 2002 the Cardinal had reached the 60-point mark in a game (63 vs. San Jose State).

## Shutouts

Stanford registered its second shutout of the season last Saturday in a 41-0 victory at Washington. The last time Stanford had two shutouts in the same season was 1972, when the Cardinal blanked San Jose State (44-0) and Washington (24-0). It also marked the first time since 1968 Stanford has registered two road shutouts in the same season and the first time since 1969 it has blanked two or more conference opponents in the same season.

## Defensive Doings

Stanford allowed just 107 yards (19 rush; 88 pass) in total offense against Washington, which was the second lowest output by a Cardinal opponent in school history, trailing only the 80 yards it allowed against San Jose State in 1971. Stanford also allowed just seven first downs in the game as Washington crossed the 50 yard line just once in its 11 offensive possessions. In six of the 11 possessions, the Huskies failed to cross its own 30 yard line.

Stanford has allowed just one offensive touchdown in three of its four road games, discounting the Oregon game.

Under first-year defensive coordinator **Vic Fangio**, Stanford ranks third in the Pac-10 and 30th nationally in total defense, allowing 330.3 yards per game. The Cardinal also rank third in the conference in scoring defense, yielding just 21.25 points a game. Last year, Stanford finished ninth in the conference in total defense (402.7) and eighth in scoring defense (26.5).

## Moving the Chains

The Cardinal has 196 first downs in eight games this season, which is the second highest total in the Pac-10 behind Oregon (219). Stanford also ranks first in the Pac-10 and second nationally in third down conversions at 57.69 (50-87). Only Nevada (59.41) is converting third down tries at a higher rate than Stanford.

## By the Halves

Stanford is averaging 25.6 points (205 total) in the first half compared to 16.7 points (134 total) after intermission.

Stanford has outscored its first six opponents 205-68 in the first half, including a 107-27 mark in the first quarter. Stanford was a fast starting team last year, as well, outscoring the opposition 267-156 in the first half.

## Scoring Margins

Stanford has won seven games this season by an average of 27.1 points (190 total). Stanford's last 15 victories dating back to last season have come by a margin of 22.5 points (338 total), while its six losses have been by a margin of just 8.8 points (53 total). Stanford is 7-8 in 15 games decided by a touchdown or less under **Jim Harbaugh**.

## Well Received

A total of 15 players have caught passes at the eight-game mark of the season, led by senior **Doug Baldwin**, who has 33 receptions for 458 yards and six touchdowns. Baldwin is one of seven Stanford players to have at least 10 receptions on the year. A total of nine different players have caught touchdown passes this season.

## Spreading the Wealth

With **Griff Whalen** catching his first career touchdown pass at Oregon, Stanford has 16 players account for its 43 touchdowns this season. Stanford has 21 passing touchdowns and 20 rushing TDs to go along with an interception return and fumble recovery for scores.

## Turnovers

Stanford has forced 18 turnovers in eight games this season (10 interceptions; eight fumbles), compared to last season at the eight game mark, when the Cardinal had forced just eight turnovers (three interceptions; five fumble recoveries). Stanford has turned the ball over 13 times (seven fumbles lost; six interceptions), and rank fourth in the Pac-10 in turnover margin at +4.

## In the Red Zone

Stanford converted on all six of its trips into the red zone against Washington and rank second in the Pac-10 and are tied for eighth nationally in red zone efficiency at 92.0 (46-for-50). Stanford has come away with 34 touchdowns and 12 field goals in 50 trips to the red zone this season.

## The Running Game

After seven games, Stanford is averaging 223.7 yards a game in rushing average, which ranks second in the Pac-10 and 12th nationally and is 18.1 yards per game ahead of last year's pace at the same point of the season (205.6).

Stanford's top five rushers are averaging between 19.8 and 91.0 yards a game, including sophomore running back Stepfan Taylor, who leads the team in rushing at the eight-game mark of the season with a 91.0 game average (728 net).

In the first season of the post-Toby Gerhart Era, five running backs -- Taylor (146-728), **Usua Amanam** (27-126), **Tyler Gaffney** (38-202), **Anthony Wilkerson** (36-167) and **Jeremy Stewart**

(8-24) -- have combined to rush for 1247 yards in eight games, an average of 155.9 yards per contest. Last year, Gerhart averaged 143.9 rushing yards a game while Stanford as a team averaged 218.2 yards a game on the ground, which ranked second in the Pac-10 and 11th nationally.

Quarterbacks own Stanford's three longest runs of the season. **Alex Loukas** ran 48 yards for a touchdown in the season opener against Sacramento State while **Andrew Luck** has TD runs of 52 (Wake Forest) and 51 (Washington) yards.

### Taylor Five Straight Over a 100

Sophomore running back **Stepfan Taylor** has rushed for 100 yards in each of his last five games against Notre Dame (108), Oregon (113), USC (104), Washington State (142) and Washington (104) and is averaging 114.2 yards a game (571 total) in those five contests.

Taylor is just the second Stanford back in school history to rush for 100 yards or more in five straight games, joining **Toby Gerhart**, who closed out his collegiate career with seven straight 100-yard rushing games.

Taylor ranks fifth in the Pac-10 and 31st nationally in rushing average at 91.0.

### Balance

Despite the loss of Doak Walker Award winner **Toby Gerhart**, Stanford remains primarily a run-oriented offense through the first seven games of the season. Of Stanford's 562 offensive plays, 58.7 percent (330 total) have been rushing plays, while 41.2 percent (232) have been pass plays.

### Controlling the Clock

Stanford has controlled the clock in seven of its eight games this season, with the exception of the Wake Forest game, when the Demon Deacons had the ball for 30:33. Stanford leads the nation in time of possession at 34:24 per game.

### Punting

Stanford has punted just 16 times in eight games this season which are the fewest attempts in the nation along with Nevada. Boise State has punted just 17 times.

### The Offensive Line

Stanford's offensive line -- consisting of center **Chase Beeler**, right guard **David DeCastro**, right tackle **Derek Hall**, left guard **Andrew Phillips** and left tackle **Jonathan Martin** -- has allowed just three sacks this season and has helped pave the way for a young Stanford rushing attack that is averaging 223.7 yards per game. Stanford currently ranks first in the Pac-10 and tied for second nationally in sacks allowed per game at 0.38. The Cardinal allowed just seven sacks all of last season, which were the second fewest in the nation next to Boise State.

### Luck Moving Up on Stanford's Career Charts

Quarterback **Andrew Luck** has throw 20 touchdown passes this season, which tie **Jim Plunkett** (1969) and **John Elway** (1981) for fifth on Stanford's all-time single-season list. He needs two more TD passes to tie Steve Dils (1978) for fourth on the list. Elway (1990) and **Steve Stenstrom** (1993) share the school's single-season record with 27 touchdown passes.

Luck's 33 career TD passes currently rank tied for eighth on Stanford's single-season charts with **Chris Lewis** (2000-03). He needs three more to tie **Trent Edwards** (36; 2003-06) for seventh.

His 4,941 career yards in total offense currently ranks eighth on Stanford's all-time top-10 list, 687 yards behind **Trent Edwards** (7th; 5,628).

### Dual Threat

Quarterback **Andrew Luck** has rushed for 345 yards on 40 carries (8.6) in eight games this season (43.1) to rank as Stanford's second leading rusher behind Stepfan Taylor (728). He ran for 92 yards against Washington, including a 51 yard touchdown run in the first quarter, his second run more than 50 yards this season (52 TD vs. Wake Forest).

Luck's 345 rushing yards are the third highest single season total by a Stanford quarterback, trailing **Gene Washington**, who ran for 362 yards in 1966, and his own total of 354 yards compiled during his freshman season.

For his career, Luck has rushed for 699 yards and five touchdowns on 101 carries (6.9 average).

### Stanford's Every Down Man

Senior **Owen Marecic** is perhaps the only player among FBS schools starting on both sides of the ball, topping the Cardinal depth chart at both fullback and inside linebacker.

For the season, Marecic has rushed 13 times for 31 yards and two touchdowns and currently ranks as Stanford's fifth leading tackler with 31 stops, including a career best 10 tackles at Oregon. He also has 3.5 tackles-for-loss, one sack, two interceptions (one for TD), four pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

### Bloodlines

Several Stanford coaches and players have interesting athletic family pedigrees, starting with head coach Jim Harbaugh, whose father Jack coached for 41 years, including 14 as the head coach at Western Kentucky, while his brother John is serves as the head coach of the Baltimore Ravens. ## It Happened Against Arizona

### 1979

In the first-ever meeting between the two schools, Stanford defeats Arizona, 30-10 in Tucson...Turk Schoenert completes 17-of-20 passes for 194 yards while sophomore linebacker Dave Morze finishes with 15 tackles and an interception in his first career start.

### 1982

Stanford squanders a 27-13 lead with 12:46 remaining as the Wildcats score 28 points in a span of 9:49 to defeat the Cardinal, 41-27 at Stanford Stadium...John Elway completes 22-of-33 passes for 359 yards to set a NCAA completion record (720), breaking the old mark held by Mark Herrmann of Purdue.

### 1983

Freshman quarterback John Paye completes 22-of-28 passes for 280 yards and three touchdowns as Stanford upsets Arizona, 31-22 at Stanford Stadium. The Cardinal brought an 0-6 record into the game against a 5-1-1 Wildcat team that had been ranked as high as third in the polls during the season. Emile Harry catches 10 passes for 179 yards, which marked the third highest receiving yardage total in school history.

### 1984

Linebacker Tom Briehl returns and interception 53 yards for a touchdown in a 28-14 setback in Tucson. Junior linebacker Dave Wyman is lost for the season after dislocating his right knee and suffers damage to both cruciate ligaments.

### 1985

Stanford rallies from a 17-7 halftime deficit and scores 21 unanswered points, including 14 in the fourth quarter, to upset 19th-ranked Arizona, 28-17. John Paye, who suffered a separated shoulder the week before against USC, comes off the bench to lead the Cardinal on three second half scoring drives.

### 1986

Stanford defeats Arizona, 29-24 in front of 55,000 fans at Memorial Stadium in Tokyo, Japan. The two teams combine for seven fumbles, five interceptions and amass 142 yards in penalties.

### 1992

Stanford is held to -33 rushing yards in a 21-6 loss at Stanford Stadium

### 1999

Todd Husak completes 21-of-35 passes for 364 yards and one touchdown as the Cardinal defeat the Wildcats, 50-22 in Tucson, snapping Arizona's six-game winning streak in the series; Tim Smith picks off three passes.

### 2001

Brian Allen rushes for 143 yards on 23 carries in Stanford's 51-37 victory in Tucson. The rushing total was the highest ever recorded by a Stanford back against Arizona.

### 2006

Arizona holds Stanford to just 52 yards in total offense, its lowest output in school history, as the Cardinal drop a 20-7 decision at Stanford Stadium...Stanford's lone touchdown comes on a 72-yard interception return by Wopamo Osaisai.

### 2008

Toby Gerhart's one-yard TD run with 0:25 left caps an 11-play, 60-yard drive as Stanford defeats Arizona, 24-23 on Homecoming...backup quarterback Alex Loukas engineers the game-winning drive and completes a 21-yard pass to Ryan Whalen and picks up 32 yards rushing on the final drive.

**Stanford's National Championships**

NCAA championships are commonplace at Stanford University, as Cardinal teams have combined to win 99 NCAA team championships, including 60 men's championships and an NCAA-best 39 women's titles. Stanford teams have combined to capture a national-best 82 NCAA titles since 1980 and 59 since 1990. Stanford has won at least one NCAA championship for 34 consecutive years and has won four national titles in a single year nine times.

Nine different teams have won at least five national titles, including men's tennis (18), women's tennis (17), men's water polo (11), women's swimming and diving (9), men's swimming and diving (8), men's golf (8), women's volleyball (8), synchronized swimming (6) and women's cross country (5). **16 Straight Directors' Cups**

Stanford has won 16 straight Directors' Cups, emblematic of the top intercollegiate program in the country. Last year, Stanford captured NCAA titles in the sports of women's tennis and men's volleyball.

Stanford boasted an impressive 17 top-10 finishes last season, with nine teams earning No. 1 rankings at some point during their seasons. In addition to winning national championships in three sports, six other Cardinal teams had runner-up national finishes.

Three Stanford student-athletes earned national player of the year recognition while three Stanford coaches earned national coach of the year recognition. Ten Stanford student-athletes won NCAA individual titles.

- Finished with four tackles at Oregon and recorded his first career interception when he picked off a Darron Thomas pass in the first quarter.
- Finished with five tackles at UCLA...recovered a Randall Carroll fumble at the UCLA 46 in the second quarter.
- Named a second team freshman All-American by CollegeFootballNews.com and also earned ESPN.com and Sporting News Pac-10 all-freshman honors.
- Appeared in 13 games and made eight starts at defensive end...took over a starting role at Oregon State after Erik Lorig was sidelined with a season-ending injury.
- Finished his first campaign with 36 total tackles, including seven for loss.
- Majoring in communications.

**3 • Michael Thomas, Safety, 5-11, 182, Jr.-Jr., Houston, TX**

- Has 28 total tackles, including 20 solo efforts...also has 4.5 tackles-for-loss, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery for a TD.
- Credited with a season-high seven solo stops against Wake Forest.
- Turned in an outstanding performance at UCLA with five total tackles, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery for a TD...forced a Randall Carroll fumble at the 8:45 mark of the second quarter...also stripped Kevin Prince of the ball and returned the fumble 21 yards for a TD with 0:34 left in the third quarter...first Stanford player to return a fumble for a TD since Michael Craven vs. UC Davis in 2005...was named the Pac-10's Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.
- Had a season-high five tackles in the Sun Bowl against Oklahoma.
- Majoring in sociology.

**9 • Ryan Whalen, Wide Receiver, 6-2, 205, Sr.-Sr., Alamo, CA**

- One of team's tri-captains, along with Sione Fua and Owen Marecic.
- Ranks as the team's second leading receiver with 22 catches for 261 yards and two TDs in his six games...missed the Notre Dame and Oregon games with injury.
- Has 121 career receptions for 1,706 yards and seven TDs in 43 career games.
- Caught five passes for 59 yards at Washington, including a long of 24...has 11 receptions for 130 yards in last two games.
- Caught a season-high six passes for 71 yards and one TD against Washington State...was on the receiving end of a seven yard TD pass from Luck at the 4:33 mark of the first quarter.
- Returned to action against USC after missing the Notre Dame and Oregon games with an injury suffered against Wake Forest...caught one pass for 18 yards against the Trojans.
- Finished with four receptions for 40 yards and one TD at UCLA...caught his first TD pass of the season at the 9:31 mark of the first quarter on a 16-yard pass from Luck.
- Debuted with four receptions for 64 yards in the season-opener against Sacramento State...was on the receiving end of a 30-yard pass play from Luck in the second quarter...first reception of the game was his 100th of his career.
- Stanford's leading receiver each of the last two seasons...caught 57 passes for 926 yards and four touchdowns last season after a sophomore campaign that netted 41 receptions for 508 yards.

**39 • Nate Whitaker, Kicker, 5-9, 185, 5th-Sr., San Diego, CA**

- Lou Groza Award semifinalist is 13-for-14 in field goal attempts this season.
- Saw his streak of 16 straight field goals come to an end when he misfired on his first attempt from 40 yards at Washington...came back to nail tries of 22 and 39 yards.
- For his career, has made 29-of-36 (.805) field goal tries to rank first on Stanford's career list for FG accuracy...is 13-13 between 20-29 yards, 8-9 from 30-39, 7-12 from 40-49 and 1-2 from 50+...booted a career long 54-yarder last season at Wake Forest, which tied for the fifth longest in school history and set a BT&T Stadium record.
- Ranks fourth in the Pac-10 and 16th nationally in points per game (9.62).
- Kicked a game-winning, 30-yard field goal as time expired to defeat USC, 37-35.
- Was 5-for-5 in field goal tries at Notre Dame...the five field goals tied a Stanford single-game record (John Hopkins vs. California, 1990)...accounted for 17 of Stanford's 37 points...named Pac-10's Special Teams Player of the week for his efforts.
- Is 33-for-36 in PATs this season and is now 86-of-89 in PAT tries in his career...made 66 consecutive PATs before misfiring against Wake Forest following Stanford's fourth TD of the game in the second quarter...also missed another PAT in the fourth quarter.
- Earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors last season after converting 16-of-22 FG tries and all 53 of his PATs.
- His 16 field goals in 2009 ranked tied for third most in Stanford single-season history...became the first Stanford kicker with more than 40 attempts to convert all of his PAT tries.
- Began his college career at Notre Dame where he made the team as a walk-on in 2006...saw time with the Irish in 2006 and '07 before transferring to Stanford...officially joined the team on Sept. 22, 2008.
- Joined on the team by younger brother, Eric.
- Majoring in product design.

**36 • Daniel Zychlinski, Punter, 6-3, 207, Jr.-So., Tampa, FL**

- Averaging 44.8 yards (717 total) in 16 punts this season.
- Has averaged 41.5 yards (831 total) in 20 career punts...career long is 64.
- Saw action in two games last season to earn his first varsity letter...punted four times for 153 yards (38.2) with a long of 46.
- Majoring in psychology.

**Stanford 52, Sacramento State 17**  
**September 4, 2010 | Stanford, CA | Stanford Stadium**

PASADENA, Calif. – Sophomore quarterback Andrew Luck completed 17-of-23 passes for 316 yards and a career-best four touchdowns as Stanford routed visiting Sacramento State, 52-17 in the season opener before 30,626 at Stanford Stadium.

Stanford's point total was the third-highest in a season opener dating back to 1940 and marked the sixth time since the 2008 season the Cardinal had scored 40 or points in a game.

All four of Luck's touchdown passes came in the first half, as the Cardinal built a 38-7 lead at intermission. His first scoring strike came on an 81-yard bomb to senior wide out Doug Baldwin at the 6:18 mark of the first quarter which gave Stanford a 14-0 lead. The touchdown pass was the eighth longest in Stanford history. Baldwin finished the day with four receptions for a career high 111 yards. Luck's final passing total was the second-highest in his career, trailing only his 423-yard effort at Arizona in 2009. "We came out very strong," Luck said following the game. "There were some mistakes but that's to be expected in a season-opener."

In its first game of the post-Toby Gerhart Era, five Stanford running backs – Usua Amanam (50), Tyler Gaffney (33), Anthony Wilkerson (27), Jeremy Stewart (21) and Stepfan Taylor (16) -- combined for 147 yards on 31 carries, as Stanford finished the day with 213 yards on the ground.

Stanford's defense limited the Hornets to just 167 yards in total offense, the lowest output by an opponent since the Cardinal limited Washington to 161 yards in 2006. Inside linebacker Max Bergen, starting in place of the injured Shayne Skov, led the Cardinal with eight tackles. Sophomore outside linebacker Chase Thomas registered two sacks among his four total tackles.

The win was Stanford's third straight in a season opener, as the Cardinal improved to 12-2 in its last 14 home games at Stanford Stadium.

PASADENA, Calif. – Stanford snapped a six-game losing streak to UCLA in the Rose Bowl and shutout the Bruins for the first time since 1941 with its 35-0 victory in Pasadena.

The victory also marked Stanford's first road shutout since 1974, when the Cardinal defeated Oregon, 17-0 in Eugene.

Stanford's defense limited the Bruins to 233 yards in total offense as the Cardinal improved to 2-0 for the first time since the 2004 season.

Quarterback Andrew Luck connected completed 11-of-24 passes for 151 yards and two touchdowns. His 16-yard scoring strike to Ryan Whalen gave Stanford its first score at the 9:31 mark of the first quarter. Coby Fleener was on the receiving end of Luck's second touchdown pass, a three-yarder at the 8:38 mark of the fourth quarter.

Stanford also benefitted from a pair of Nate Whitaker field goals and a one-yard touchdown run by fullback Owen Marecic.

Safety Michael Thomas set the tone for Stanford's defense, forcing two fumbles and returning one 21-yards for a touchdown in the third quarter.

STANFORD, Calif. – Stanford's offense scored touchdowns on 10 of its 11 offensive possessions to rout Wake Forest, 68-24 at Stanford Stadium.

The point total tied for the third-highest in school history and marked the first time Stanford had reached the 60 point mark since the 2003 season in a 63-26 victory over San Jose State.

Stanford wore all-black uniforms for the first time in school history for the nationally televised game on ESPN 2, which kicked off at 8:25 p.m., marking the latest start time in Stanford history.

Stanford scored touchdowns on each of its first eight possessions behind quarterback Andrew Luck, who threw for 207 yards and four TD passes. His first two scoring strikes were to Chris Owusu, who was making his season debut after missing the first two games of the season with injury. Luck also ran 52-yards for Stanford's fifth touchdown of the game, helping the Cardinal build up a 41-10 lead at intermission.

Sophomore running back Tyler Gaffney finished the game with a career high 76 yards and two touchdowns on seven carries, as three Cardinal compiled 303 yards of rushing offense. Stanford finished the game with 535 yards in total offense, compared to the Demon Deacons 283 yard total.

The win also marked head coach Jim Harbaugh's 20th victory as Stanford's head coach in his 40th game on the sideline.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. – Nate Whitaker kicked five field goals to tie a Stanford single-game record as the 16th-ranked Cardinal defeated Notre Dame, 37-14 for its fourth consecutive victory to start the season.

The win was Stanford's first in South Bend since 1992 and gave the Cardinal its first 4-0 start since the 1986 season.

Stanford's defense limited the Irish to just 44 rushing yards and just one touchdown on the afternoon.

After the Irish took an early 3-0 lead on a David Ruffer field goal, quarterback Andrew Luck connected with Coby Fleener on a 16-yard pass play to culminate a 10-play, 79-yard scoring drive that gave the Cardinal a 7-3 lead.

Whitaker accounted for Stanford's next 12 points, converting field goals from 24, 41, 36 and 33 yards as the Cardinal built a 19-6 lead at the 10:44 mark of the third quarter.

A one yard run by Owen Marecic and a two-point conversion gave Stanford a 27-6 lead at the 7:58 mark of the final period.

Following the ensuing kickoff, Marecic intercepted a Dayne Crist pass and returned it 20 yards for a touchdown to give the Cardinal a 34-6 lead.

Notre Dame scored its only touchdown of the game at the 6:01 mark of the fourth quarter, but Whitaker nailed his fifth field goal with 1:47 left to close out the scoring.

Delano Howell had 12 tackles while linebacker Shayne Skov added eight stops, including two sacks and a fumble recovery, to lead an improving Cardinal defense.

## #4 Oregon 52, #9/13 Stanford 31 October 2, 2010 | Eugene, OR | Autzen Stadium

EUGENE, Ore. – In a battle of unbeaten and top-10 ranked teams, fourth-ranked Oregon scored 28 unanswered points in the second half to defeat ninth-ranked Stanford, 52-31 before a sellout crowd at Autzen Stadium.

The Ducks rolled up 626 yards in total offense, which was the eighth highest total ever allowed by Stanford. Of the 626 yards, 388 came on the ground, which marked the fifth highest rushing opponent total in school history.

Stanford took advantage of two Oregon turnovers in the first quarter to build a 21-3 lead. After Oregon took a 3-0 lead, the Cardinal marched 70 yards in 11 plays culminating in a 18 yard touchdown pass from Andrew Luck to Griff Whalen to take a 7-3 lead. The Ducks fumbled the ensuing kickoff and the Cardinal regained possession on the 12 yard line. Facing a third and eight play, Luck ran around left end for a touchdown to increase Stanford's lead to 14-3 at the 4:02 mark of the first quarter.

On Oregon's next possession, linebacker Chase Thomas intercepted a Darron Thomas pass at the Ducks 46 yard line. Stanford wasted no time in capitalizing, as Stepan Taylor broke loose for a 44 yard touchdown run to give the Cardinal a 21-3 lead. After the Ducks closed the lead to 21-17, Luck connected with tight end Coby Fleener on a 36-yard touchdown at the 7:30 mark of the second quarter to give the Cardinal a 28-17 lead. A 46 yard field goal by Nate Whitaker as time expired in the first half gave Stanford a 31-24 lead at intermission.

The second half belonged to Oregon, as the Ducks compiled 481 of its 626 yards of total offense in the second half and scored 28 unanswered points to hand Stanford its first loss of the season. Oregon running back LaMichael James finished the game with 257 yards and three touchdowns while Thomas completed 20-of-29 passes for 238 yards and three touchdowns to lead the high-powered Duck offense. Thomas also rank for 117 yards on 15 carries.

Luck completed 29-of-46 passes for 341 yards and two touchdowns, but was also intercepted twice. Taylor finished the game with a career high 113 yards on 17 carries. Owen Marecic and Taylor Skaufel had a team-high 10 tackles for Stanford.

## #16/18 Stanford 37, USC 35 October 9, 2010 | Stanford, CA | Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif. – Nate Whitaker kicked a 30-yard field goal as time expired to lift 16th-ranked Stanford to a 37-35 victory over USC before a crowd of 51,607 at Stanford Stadium.

Whitaker's game-winning field goal culminated a seven play, 62-yard scoring drive in 1:02 seconds and lifted the Cardinal to its fifth victory against just one defeat on the season.

The two teams were never separated by more than seven points during the game and combined 976 yards in total offense.

After USC tied the game at 28-28 at the 11:11 mark of the fourth quarter on a Matt Barkley six-yard pass to Robert Woods, Stanford's Chris Owusu returned the ensuing kickoff 88 yards down to the Trojans 12 yard line. Three plays later, Andrew Luck connected with Doug Baldwin on a seven-yard, go-ahead touchdown pass. However, Whitaker misfired on the point after attempt, leaving the door open for the Trojans.

Stanford regained possession with 6:54 remaining after Barkley threw four straight incomplete passes from the Cardinal 32 yard line.

However, a fumble by Stepan Taylor on a first and 10 play from midfield turned the ball back over to the Trojans with 4:14 remaining.

The Trojans then marched 51 yards on 10 plays, culminating in Allen Bradford's game-tying touchdown with 1:02 left. Joe Houston's PAT gave the Trojans a 35-34 lead. Stanford quarterback Andrew Luck completed three passes for 28 yards while Taylor rushed twice for 21 yards on Stanford's seven-play, 62 scoring drive that resulted in Whitaker's heroics as time expired.

Luck completed 20-of-24 passes for 285 yards and three touchdowns while Taylor finished with 104 yards on 23 carries, marking his third straight, 100-yard game. Baldwin caught a career high eight passes for 98 yards and two touchdowns.

## #12/14 Stanford 38, Washington State 28 October 23, 2010 | Stanford, CA | Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif.-- Sophomore running back Stepfan Taylor rushed for a career-high 143 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries while Andrew Luck threw for 190 yards and three touchdowns to lead Stanford to a 38-28 victory over the visiting Washington State Cougars before a soggy Reunion Homecoming crowd of 36,679 at Stanford Stadium.

Stanford built a 24-7 lead at halftime and led 31-7 after three quarters and withstood three late Cougar touchdowns to earn its sixth victory of the season. At 6-1, the Cardinal secured its best start to a season since 1970.

Taylor became just the fourth Stanford back in school history to rush for over 100 yards in four straight games, along with Darrin Nelson, Tommy Vardell and Toby Gerhart. Both of his touchdown runs came in the second quarter, the first at the 5:23 mark on a six yard effort. He also carried over from one yard out with :47 remaining to cap a six play, 80-yard scoring drive.

Luck connected with Ryan Whalen, Doug Baldwin and Coby Fleener on touchdown passes of seven, 17 and four yards, running his season total to 19 scoring strikes.

Owen Marecic recorded his second interception of the season, picking off a Jeff Tuel pass on the game's third play from scrimmage to set up a Nate Whitaker field goal at the 12:41 mark.

## #13/14 Stanford 41, Washington O October 30, 2010 | Seattle, WA | Husky Stadium

SEATTLE, Wash. -- Stanford turned in one of the most dominating defensive performances in school history in shutting out Washington, 41-0 before a rain-soaked crowd of 69,020 at Husky Stadium.

Stanford limited Washington to just 107 yards in total offense, which was the second lowest output by an opponent in school history. The Huskies recorded just seven first downs and managed to drive the ball past the 50 yard line on just one occasion.

Coupled with its 35-0 win at UCLA earlier in the season, the shutout marked just the first time since 1972 Stanford had shutout two opponents in the same season.

The Cardinal scored touchdowns in each of its first four possessions to build a 28-0 lead at halftime. Quarterback Andrew Luck opened the scoring with a 51-yard touchdown run at the 8:37 mark of the first quarter. Luck finished the game with a career high 92 rushing yards on just five carries. He also completed 19-of-26 passes for 192 yards and one touchdown, his 20th of the season, which tied him with Jim Plunkett (1969) and John Elway (1981) for fifth place on Stanford's single-season list.

Stepfan Taylor became just the second back in school history to rush for 100 yards in five straight games, as he finished with 104 yards on 20 carries, including touchdown runs of two and three yards.

Ryan Whalen and Doug Baldwin had five receptions each.

Sophomore linebacker Chase Thomas had a team-high nine tackles, including one sack, while Shayne Skov finished with eight tackles. Matt Masifilo had two sacks while Delano Howell and Johnson Bademosi each had interceptions.
