Game Reset: For the fourth time in five games this season, the Cardinal will face a team ranked in the nation's top-25 ... This time, however, Stanford will play the No. 1 team in the nation as the Cardinal (1-3, 0-3) travel to the Los Angeles Coliseum to face USC (4-0, 2-0) on Saturday, October 6 ... The Trojans are ranked No. 1 in the nation in this week's USA Today/Coaches Poll and No. 2 in the AP Poll ... The game, which will be televised live to a national audience on Versus, will be the Cardinal's first road game after opening the season with four games at Stanford Stadium ... The Trojans are coming off a 27-24 win at Washington while Stanford suffered a 41-3 defeat to Arizona State..... The Cardinal will play three of its next four and four of its next six games on the road.

Game Notes: USC comes into the game having won 35 consecutive home games and 24 straight Pac-10 home games, both Pac-10 records ... The Trojans last loss at home - overall and in conference games - was to the Cardinal, 21-16 on September 29, 2001 in Pete Carroll's first conference home game as the Trojan head coach ... The Trojans are Stanford's fourth nationally-ranked opponent in its first five games ... Previously, Stanford has played then No. 14 UCLA, then No. 13 Oregon and then No. 23 Arizona State ... USC is powered by quarterback

John David Booty and one of the nation's best rushing attacks ... USC averages over 237 yards on the ground and is ranked No. 10 in the country and No. 2 in the Pac-10 ... They are led by a running tandem of Stafon Johnson (94 rushing yards per game) and Chauncey Washington (78 yards per game) ... The Trojans are also among the national leaders in scoring offense (9th at 40 points per game), rushing defense (9th at 73 yards allowed per game) and total defense (1st in the Pac-10 and 15th nationally at 277 yards allowed per game).

The Ratings Game: Perhaps no team in the country has faced the array of nationally-ranked opponents as the Cardinal have thus far in 2007 ... On Saturday, Stanford will play its fifth game of the season, and fourth vs. a team rated in the top-25 ... Stanford has played UCLA, Oregon and Arizona State, all teams who were in the national ratings at the time of the game and are currently ranked in this week's national polls ... USA Today/Coaches Poll as Oregon at No. 13, ASU at No. 19 and UCLA at No. 25 ... USC, of course, is ranked No. 1 by USA Today and No. 2 by AP ... Stanford's five opponnets this season, including USC, are a combined 19-4 ... The Trojans are the third straight unbeaten team the Cardinal has played.

Improved Run Game: Stanford's run game has seen a marked improved over last year ... In fact, it's been the most effective rushing attack since 2001 when the Cardinal went 9-3 ... This year's ground game has increased its per game production by over 50 yards per game and its average per play is almost twice as productive as it was in 2006 ... The Cardinal is averaging 116.5 yards on the ground and 3.5 yards per carry this season, compared to 65.1 and 2.1 for the 2006 squad ... Stanford's 2007 ground game has already scored more rushing touchdowns in four games (four) than it did in all 12 games last year (three) ... The Cardinal did not have a running back gain over 100 yards in a game during the past two years ... So far, in just four games in '07, Stanford has had two backs (Anthony Kimble

and Toby Gerhart) rush for more than 100 yards in a game ... Gerhart gained 140 in game two vs. San Jose State; Kimble gained 119 in game three vs. Oregon ... The last time Stanford had back-to-back games with 100-yard rushers was the first two games of the 2003 season (J.R. Lemon / Kenneth Tolon) ... Stanford's 276 yards on the ground vs. San Jose State equaled the most by a Cardinal offense in six seasons (276 yards vs. Arizona in 2001) ... A year ago, Stanford had only two games in which it rushed for more than 100 yards, and its season high was 185 ... Gerhart became the first Cardinal running back to rush for over 100 yards in a game since J.R. Lemon in 2004 (162 yards vs. WSU)

Offensive Output: The Cardinal offense is averaging 385 yards and 22 points per game through the first four contests of 2007 ... A year ago, Stanford averaged 232 yards and 10.6 points per game ... Not since Stanford's 9-3 team of 2001 has the Cardinal had a greater offensive output ... In game two vs. San Jose State, the Cardinal offense accounted for 506 yards, the most on The Farm since the 2002 season (563 yards vs. SJS) ... Stanford also rushed for 276 yards against the Spartans, equaling the most for a Cardinal offense since the 2001 season ... In the season opener vs. UCLA, Stanford threw for 346 yards, the most since Nov. 26, 2005 when Stanford passed for 347 yards vs. Notre Dame in the final game of the "old" Stanford Stadium ... The Cardinal's 37 points scored vs. San Jose State in game two was the most by a Cardinal offense in the last 20 games - dating back to Oct. 22, 2005 (45 points vs. ASU) ... When the Cardinal scored 31 points the following week vs. Oregon, it marked the first time that Stanford had scored more than 30 points in back-to-back games since the first two games of the 2004 season.

All-Purpose Runner: After his 331-yard performance against No. 13 Oregon on Sept. 22, RB **Anthony Kimble** vaulted to the top of the conference and national leaders in all-purpose running ... This week, the junior from Baton Rouge ranks second in the Pac-10 and No. 16 in the NCAA averaging 180 all-purpose yards per game ... Against the Ducks, Kimble was just 48 yards shy of setting the Stanford record for most all-purpose yards in a game (school record is 379, Glyn Milburn, 1990) ... Kimble had 119 yards rushing, 170 yards on seven kickoff returns and 42 yards on six receptions ... He is currently the team leader in rushing with 288 yards (4.9 yards per carry average), fourth on the team with 10 receptions, and the team leader in kickoff returns (18 returns for 385 yards)

T.C.B: Quarterback **T.C. Ostrander** is averaging 266 passing yards per game, the highest for a Cardinal quarterback since **Todd Husak** in 1998 ... Ostrander, a fifth-year senior from Atherton, Calif., has thrown for 1,065 yards in four games ... He has also thrown for six touchdowns and just three interceptions in 1661 pass attempts ... if Ostrander can continue his pace, he will become only the fourth quarterback in school history to pass for over 3,000 yards in a season, joining **John Elway**,

Head Coach Jim Harbaugh



A 15-year NFL veteran and owner of an impressive 29-6 record at the University of San Diego, Jim Harbaugh was named Stanford's head coach shortly after the conclusion of

the 2006 season ... Harbaugh spent the last three seasons (2004-06) as the head coach at USD, leading the Toreros to Division I-AA Mid-Major national titles each of the past two campaigns ... His 29-6 (.829) at San Diego included 11-1 campaigns each of the past two years, a school record 18-game win streak and two Pioneer Football League championships ... Harbaugh starred at Palo Alto High School as one of the top prep quarterbacks in the nation, then enjoyed a storied collegiate career at the University of Michigan (1983-86), leading the Wolverines to three bowl games while being named Big Ten Player of the Year in his final season in 1986 ... As a professional, Harbaugh finished his career among the Top 50 all-time in several passing categories and was named AFC Offensive Player of the Year in 1995 ... He played for five teams over 15 seasons (1987-2001) as a quarterback in the National Football League after entering the NFL as a first round draft pick of the Chicago Bears in 1987 ... After seven seasons in Chicago (1987-93), Harbaugh played for the Indianapolis Colts for four years (1994-97) before playing one year with the Baltimore Ravens (1998), two seasons with the San Diego Chargers (1999-2000) and his final campaign with the Carolina Panthers (2001) ... In his brief coaching career, Harbaugh has been a part of one Super Bowl team (Oakland Raiders, 2002) and guided his USD teams to two national championships ... Harbaugh's dad, Jack, was Stanford's defensive coordinator in 1980 and '81.

Steve Stenstrom and Husak ... Ostrander is also averaging 41.5 pass attempts per game, putting him on school-record pace ... At his current rate, Ostrander would have 498 pass attempts ... The school record is 455 set by Stenstrom in 1993 ... Ostrander threw for more yards than any quarterback on The Farm since the 2001 season when he accounted for 346 passing yards in the season opener vs. UCLA ... Ostrander set career highs in yards, passes attempted (59), passes completed (27) ... The 59 passes tied Ostrander for the third highest in school history ... The school record is 68, set in a 1989 game vs. Notre Dame by **Steve Smith** ... The 346 passing yards was the most by a Stanford quarterback since **Chris Lewis** threw for 390 yards in the 2001 Big Game (Nov. 17) - a span of 60 games ... Ostrander has played in 26 games and started 11 in his Cardinal career, but 2007 marks his first as the team's No. 1 quarterback and full-time starter ... Ostrander played a backup role to Trent Edwards the past three seasons and received his playing time when Edwards was unable to play due to injury ... Now, it's Ostrander's turn to take the reigns ... He has thrown for 3,426 yards and 14 touchdowns in his career ... He started the final five games of the 2006 season and is one of the team's two captains in 2007.

Sack Time: Stanford has recorded 12 sacks in four games this season, only two shy of its total for the entire 2006 campaign ... The Cardinal had a season best six sacks against ASU ... Clinton Snyder leads the team and is fourth in the Pac-10 with 3.5 sacks ... Last year, Stanford had 14 sacks for (-111) yards ... In just four games in '07, the Cardinal has 12 sacks for (-90) yards.

Defense Records First Shutout in 11 Years: Stanford's 37-0 win over San Jose State was its first shutout since a 38-0 victory over Michigan State in the 1996 Sun Bowl ... The Cardinal defense not only pitched its first shutout in 11 years, but it accounted for seven tackles for loss, three quarterback sacks, one interception and seven pass break ups ... Stanford also limited the SJS to just 32 net yards rushing, 131 yards through the air and 163 yards in total offense ... The 32 rushing yards allowed was the fewest allowed by a Cardinal defense since 2003.

Belch Bytes: During his first three seasons, **Derek Belch** was a backup placekicker who did not see any game action ... In his fourth season, he attempted one field goal and was the team's kickoff specialist ... Now in his fifth season, Belch has not only won the No. 1 PK job, but, he has already made an impact in the Cardinal record book ... Belch has made six of nine field goal attempts in '07 and is third in the Pac-10 (1.50 fgg) ... He also leads the team in scoring with 28 points ... Belch hit one of two field goals in the season opener vs. UCLA, then made all three of his attempts vs. San Jose State, including two from 50 yards out ... Belch hit his first field goal from 52-yards, which tied for the 10th longest in school history ... When he made a 50-yard field goal later in the game, Belch became just the second kicker in school history to make two, 50-yard field goals in the same game ... The other was Rod Garcia, who made a school-record 59-yarder and a 52-yarder in a 1973 game vs. USC

The Last Meeting: November 4, 2006

USC 42, Stanford 0

Stanford, CA, Stanford Stadium

Unbeaten USC rolled over host Stanford, 42-0, in front of 49,371, the largest crowd in the new Stanford Stadium.

Stanford kept it close at least through the first quarter with just one of the six Trojan touchdowns of the day coming in the opening period on a 15-yard run by Chauncey Washington with 6:45 to go.

USC extended its lead to 21-0 quickly in the second quarter. John David Booty found Dwayne Jarrett for a 21-yard score with 13:31 remaining, and then after Stanford fumbled the ensuing kickoff to give the Trojans possession at the Cardinal seven-yard line, Booty needed just one play to get the ball back in the end zone on a seven-yard scoring strike to Steve Smith.

USC tacked on another touchdown just before halftime when Booty hit Fred Davis on a short two-yard pass to cap off a nine-play drive that covered 98 yards.

USC's offense would get just one more touchdown the rest of the way on a 4-yard run by Mark Sanchez near the end of the game with 5:33 to go after the Trojans also scored with 2:24 remaining in the third quarter when Terrell Thomas picked up a blocked field goal and rambled 71 yards for a touchdown.

Despite the 42-point defeat, the final statistics were not quite as lopsided as the final score as Stanford was able to muster 208 compared with a reasonable 355 for the Trojans. Stanford also dominated in possession time with an 11:44 advantage.

T.C. Ostrander had his best game of the season to date with 178 yards in the air on 16-of-30 passing while Richard Sherman had three catches for 58 yards.

2007 Stanford Football Game Recaps

Game 1 - UCLA 45, Stanford 17
September 1, Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- UCLA quarterback Ben Olson threw five touchdown passes and Kahlil Bell ran for a career-high 195 yards to lead the 14th-ranked Bruins to a 45-17 victory Saturday in Jim Harbaugh's first game as the Cardinal coach.

Coaching across the street from where he went to high school, Harbaugh's imprint on Stanford's offense was evident as the Cardinal moved the ball much better than they did in a 1-11 season a year ago.

After being outscored 165-33 in losing all five games at its remodeled stadium in 2006, Stanford was competitive for a little more than a half this game. The Cardinal trailed 14-7 at halftime and were within 21-10 late in the third quarter.

Senior T.C. Ostrander, beginning the season as the starter for the first time in his career, was 27-for-59 for 331 yards and two touchdowns, including a 70-yarder to Richard Sherman in the fourth quarter.

The Harbaugh era got off to an inauspicious start when Ostrander was stripped on a sack by a blitzing Trey Brown on the third play of the game, giving UCLA the ball at the Cardinal 12 after Bruce Davis' recovery.

Stanford's defense held the Bruins and Kai Forbath missed a 28-yard field goal to keep the game scoreless. But the Cardinal could not shut down the Bruins for long.

An 11-yard punt by Jay Ottovegio gave UCLA the ball on its own 40 midway through the first quarter. Four plays later, Breazell made a leaping 19-yard touchdown grab over Tim Sims to give UCLA the lead.

The Cardinal played with more enthusiasm than last year. Ostrander led the team on an 80-yard drive in the final minutes of the opening half. He went 4-for-6 for 45 yards on the drive, capping it with a 9-yard score to Jim Dray.

Game 2 - Stanford 37, SJSU 0
September 15, Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- Toby Gerhart ran for 140 yards and a touchdown Saturday night to lead Stanford to its first win in seven tries in its newly renovated stadium, 37-0 over San Jose State in the Cardinal's first shutout in more than a decade.

With a 52-yard field goal by Derek Belch on the opening drive, Stanford (1-1) was in front nearly the entire game and dominated San Jose State (0-3) with an overpowering running game.

The defense kept the Spartans off the scoreboard. It was Stanford's first shutout since a 38-0 victory over Michigan State in the 1996 Sun Bowl and first at home since a 24-0 win over Washington in 1972.

T.C. Ostrander threw a 46-yard touchdown pass to Richard Sherman and a 27-yarder to Austin Gunder in the fourth quarter as coach Jim Harbaugh's offense once again looked light years ahead of where it was a year ago.

Ostrander finished 18-for-28 for 220 yards. The Cardinal topped 500 yards for the first time in five years and scored four more points than they did in five home games combined last year.

The Cardinal led for all of 2:30 in their first six games in the new stadium before putting together a 13-play drive on their first possession to set up Belch's career-long field goal.

Belch added a 37-yarder midway through the second quarter and then Ostrander put together an efficient drive late in the half to set up a 50-yarder with 31 seconds left that gave Stanford a 9-0 lead at the break.

The Cardinal finally made it into the end zone to start the third quarter. Gerhart, who missed the opener with a hamstring injury, had 45 of Stanford's 66 yards on the drive. He capped it with a 13-yard run. Gerhart had the first 100-yard rushing game for a Stanford back since J.R. Lemon ran for 162 yards on Oct. 2, 2004, against Washington.

Game 3 - Oregon 55, Stanford 31
September 22, Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- Dennis Dixon threw a career-high four touchdowns and rushed for another score, and No. 13 Oregon scored 34 straight points and shut out Stanford in the second half of a 55-31 victory.

Jeremiah Johnson scored the go-ahead touchdown midway through the third quarter and Jonathan Stewart, who rushed for 160 yards on 19 carries, also scored as the Ducks (4-0, 1-0 Pac-10) .

Dixon, who was 27-for-36 for 367 yards, hit tight end Ed Dickson along the sideline for a 33-yard scoring toss early in the second half for a 31-31 tie. He also threw TD passes to Cameron Colvin, and two to Jaison Williams.

Oregon, the Pac-10 leader in scoring and total offense, was held to 48 yards during the second quarter, when they allowed 28 points to Stanford. The Ducks recovered nicely in the second half and finished with 589 yards. Anthony Kimble rushed for 115 of his career-high 119 yards in the first half for Stanford (1-2, 0-2). T.C. Ostrander threw for 262 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The Ducks, who entered the game third nationally in turnover margin, turned the ball over more in one quarter than their previous three games combined. Three Oregon turnovers -- all fumbles -- in the second quarter resulted in three Stanford touchdowns.

Dixon's back pitch was recovered by Pannel Egboh, which led to Kimble's 60-yard TD romp down the middle of the field. Stanford linebacker Clinton Snyder caused and recovered a fumble that led to Kimble's 3-yard run for a score. Chike Amajoyi recovered another fumble, and that led to Ostrander's 12-yard touchdown pass to Mark Bradford for the go-ahead score.

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- In a matter of seconds, Arizona State turned a close game into a blowout.

Rudy Carpenter threw a 62-yard touchdown pass to Rudy Burgess late in the second quarter and Omar Bolden returned an interception for a score on the next play from scrimmage to lead the 23rd-ranked Sun Devils to a 41-3 victory over Stanford.

Arizona State (5-0, 2-0 Pac-10) had been struggling offensively up until that point, giving up five sacks and being held to a pair of field goals by a Stanford team that had been unable to slow down its first two conference opponents.

Then on a third-and-8, Burgess took a pass from Carpenter and sped past the Cardinal defenders to the end zone for the first touchdown of the game with 2:31 left in the half. Keegan Herring ran in the 2-point conversion to make it 14-0.

After a touchback on the ensuing kick, T.C. Ostrander tried to connect with Richard Sherman for Stanford (1-3, 0-3). But Robert James knocked the ball away and into the hands of Bolden, who raced 29 yards for Arizona State's second touchdown in a span of 9 seconds.

Dimitri Nance added a 17-yard TD run and Herring scored on a 72-yard scamper in the fourth quarter as Arizona State won in its first road game of the season.

Arizona State got field goals from Thomas Weber on its first two possessions to take a 6-0 lead. The Sun Devils began their first drive at the 48 after a facemask penalty on the opening kick to set up Weber's 41-yard field goal.

Ostrander fumbled on a sack by Dexter Davis on Stanford's first drive. Dane Guthrie recovered at the 21 to set up Weber's 32-yard field goal that made it 6-0. Weber added two more field goals in the third quarter.
