**Stanford in Pac-10 Title Showdown***No. 1 Cardinal plays Oregon State for conference crown***Friday**

No. 13 Oregon State (15-1-1, 7-0) at No. 1 Stanford (16-0-2, 7-0), 8 p.m.

**Sunday**

Oregon (7-8-3, 3-3-1) at Stanford, 1 p.m.

**This Week**

The winner of Friday's 8 p.m. match at Laird Q. Cagan Stadium between Stanford and Oregon State wins at least a share of the Pac-10 title. For No. 1 Stanford (16-0-2, 7-0), it would be its second in a row and seventh overall. For No. 13 Oregon State (15-1-1, 7-0), it would be its first. The winner has a chance to capture the championship outright with a victory on Sunday on the final day of the regular season, with Stanford playing host to Oregon, and Oregon State traveling to Cal.

Friday's match will be televised live on Fox Soccer Channel, with Mark Rogondino calling the play-by-play and Kyndra de St. Aubin providing the color commentary.

**Tickets**

Tickets can be purchased in advance for both of Stanford's remaining two home regular-season matches -- against Oregon State on Friday at 8 p.m. and against Oregon on Sunday at 1 p.m. The latter match is Senior Day, honoring Stanford's four senior players.

Tickets are \$7 for adults and \$4 for youths, seniors, faculty and staff. Stanford students are free. To purchase tickets, call 1-800-STANFORD, or follow the ticket links on [gostanford.com](http://gostanford.com). Purchasing tickets ahead of time is always encouraged.

**NCAA Selection Show**

Pairings for the 64-team NCAA Tournament field will be announced live on the NCAA Selection Show, to be shown on ESPNU at 1:30 p.m. PT.

Stanford is expected to host the first and second rounds, on Nov. 12 and 14. In the current RPI, the formula used to help determine NCAA seeding, Stanford is No. 1 and Oregon State is No. 17.

## Friday's Opponent: Oregon State

This match, simply, is for the Pacific-10 Conference championship. Oregon State has taken the momentum from its surprising run into the third round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament and turned it into its greatest ever season. The Beavers, under third-year coach Linus Rhode, has led a team that went a combined 2-22-3 in the Pac-10 from 2006-08 into one that has set a school record for most victories and carries a 10-match winning streak. OSU's only loss was to current No. 11 UC Irvine, 1-0, and its draw came against San Diego State, 2-2. The Beavers, led in scoring by Chelsea Buckland (8 goals, 2 assists, 18 points), have outscored opponents, 32-7, including 9-1 in the first half. Oregon State has never finished higher than fifth, and that was during the first-year of Pac-10 play, with a seven-team conference, in 1993.

## The Stanford-Oregon State Series

Stanford leads the all-time series 16-1, with its only loss coming in 2003 in Corvallis, Ore., 1-0. Stanford is 7-0 against the Beavers at home, and has outscored them 15-1 in those matches. Oregon State hasn't scored a goal at Stanford since 1996. Stanford has won the past six matchups, including a 3-0 result in Corvallis last season in which the Cardinal got three second-half goals, including two in the final eight minutes.

## Sunday's opponent: Oregon

Oregon enters the weekend, which begins with a Friday match at Cal, is on season-best three-match winning streak, having outscored its opponents, 9-1 in those matches. The Ducks have improved from 1-8 in the Pac-10 last year to 3-3-1 this year, and are led by Jen Stoltenberg, who has 12 goals and 5 assists, for 29 points. Stoltenberg's 12 goals place her 20th in the nation in that category. Oregon is in the midst of its best season since going 6-1-2 in the conference in 2006.

## The Stanford-Oregon Series

Oregon has never beaten Stanford, during a 13-match series that began in 1997. The Cardinal has a 12-0-1 lead. The only blemish was a 0-0 draw in Eugene, Ore., in 2007. At Laird Q. Cagan Stadium, Stanford is 6-0 against the Ducks, and has yet to allow a goal, outscoring Oregon 17-0 in those matches.

## Head Coach Paul Ratcliffe

Two-time National Coach of the Year Paul Ratcliffe has built Stanford into one of the nation's elite and continues to draw the program closer to a national championship. In seven seasons, Ratcliffe has never failed to direct the Cardinal to the NCAA tournament. Now, the team



has pulled itself into the realm of perennial title contender.

After guiding Stanford to NCAA College Cup appearances the past two years, Ratcliffe has earned AVCA and Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors

after each season. The 2009 run was the best yet, with Stanford winning its first 25 matches and a No. 1 ranking, and reaching its first championship final. The Cardinal became the first school from the Bay Area and the Pac-10 to reach an NCAA final with a perfect record.

Stanford finished a best-ever 25-1 and scored a school record 80 goals.

Ratcliffe now is in his eighth season, which makes him the longest-tenured head coach in program history, and his 126-34-18 record makes him the winningest as well. Ratcliffe has never had a losing season at Stanford, or anywhere else since his first collegiate head-coaching season, at Saint Mary's in 1998.

His career record is 181-68-25 and his winning percentage of .706, ranks among the best all-time among coaches with at least 10 years of NCAA Division I coaching experience.

The talent he has helped develop is impressive. At Stanford, Ratcliffe has coached four first-team NSCAA All-Americans (10 in all), 23 all-conference players, 39 Pac-10 All-Academic selections and three Olympians.

## Pac-10 Leaders

Stanford leads the Pac-10 in every team and most individual offensive categories. As a team, Stanford leads in: shots (389), points (157), goals (54), goals per game (3.00), assists (49), and assists per game (2.72).

Stanford individuals leading the conference are Christen Press in shots (128), shots per game (7.11), points (49), points per game (2.72), goals (21), and game-winning goals (9). Teresa Noyola leads in assists (11) and assists per game (0.61), and true freshman goalkeeper Emily Oliver leads in goals-against average (0.32).

## Garciamendez Returns from World Cup Qualifying

Stanford sophomore central defender Alina Garciamendez started and played all 90 minutes in Mexico's 3-0 loss to Canada on Tuesday in the CONCACAF World Cup qualifying tournament in Cancun, Mexico. Garciamendez is scheduled to return to Stanford to play in both matches this weekend. She has started every match since she arrived at Stanford last year.

Mexico finished second in four-team Group B and plays the United States in the semifinals on Friday. Canada plays Costa Rica in the other semi. Only the finalists earn automatic berths in the 2011 World Cup in Germany. However, the winner of the third-place match plays off with Europe's fifth-place team for another berth.

## Oliver a Contender for Pac-10 Freshman of the Year

Stanford goalkeeper Emily Oliver is making a strong case for Pac-10 Freshman of the Year. Oliver leads the Pac-10 and is third in the nation in goals-against average (0.32). Oliver took over the starting position in Stanford's fifth match and has allowed only four goals in 14 matches. Her won-lost record is 14-0-0 and she has five shutouts, though that figure is deceiving because she was replaced late in four other shutouts. Oliver, a member of the U.S. Under-18 national-team pool, also is 11th in the nation in save percentage (.882).

## The Schedule

Stanford has played nine teams ranked at the time of their meeting, including defending national champion North Carolina on the road. Here is a list of opponents currently ranked in the NSCAA Top 25, with the dates and results of their matches:

2, Portland (Sept. 25; W, 2-1); 3, North Carolina (Aug. 27; T, 2-2); 13, Oregon State (Nov. 5); 14, Santa Clara (Oct. 3; W, 2-0); 23, USC (Oct. 8; W, 2-1); 19, Boston College (Aug. 20; T, 1-1).

In all, Stanford has six current Top 25 teams on its schedule, plus Arizona State (Oct. 22; W, 3-0), California (Oct. 30; W, 3-0), Duke (Aug. 29; W, 2-1); Georgetown (Sept. 19; W, 2-0), Georgia (Sept. 10; W, 2-1, OT); UCLA (Oct. 10; W, 2-0); and Washington State (Oct. 15; W, 5-0), which were previously ranked.

Of its 20 regular-season matches, Stanford plays 14 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament field. So far, Stanford is 3-0-2 against currently-ranked teams, with one more on its schedule: No. 13 Oregon State at home on Nov. 5.

## Scoring Streaks

Stanford forwards Christen Press and Lindsay Taylor both are involved in impressive scoring streaks. Press has scored or assisted in her past 17 matches. She also has scored goals in nine of her past 10 matches.

Taylor has a five-match scoring streak of her own, having scored in each match since Oct. 15 against Washington State. She had four goals in her first 13 matches, and five in five matches since. The scoring streak is the longest of Taylor's collegiate career.

## Assist Record

Christen Press needs one more assist to break the Stanford career mark of 40 held by Marcie Ward since 2004. Already this year, Press has broken Stanford all-time records for goals, points, shots, and is tied for the assists mark.

## From Behind

Stanford has trailed twice this season, falling behind Duke and Georgia by 1-0 scores. Stanford won both matches 2-1, scoring all of its goals in the second half, with three of the four scored by Christen Press. The senior forward has scored 10 of her national-leading 21 goals with Stanford behind or tied, and has nine game-winning goals.

## Senior Day

Stanford will honor its four seniors -- Kira Maker, Allison McCann, Christen Press, and Morgan Redman -- before Sunday's 1 p.m. match against Oregon, marking the final home regular-season match of their careers.

According to research by collegesoccer360.com, Stanford's senior class ranks third among all schools in victories. Over the past four years, Stanford has compiled a 78-6-8 record, trailing only North Carolina (83) and Notre Dame (81) in victories.

However, Stanford has suffered fewer losses in that span than any other team and its winning percentage of .891 is the second-best, trailing only Portland's .895.

## Home Success

Stanford enters the match with a 29-match home winning streak and a 33-match home unbeaten streak. The last non-victory at home came on Sept. 12, 2008, when the Cardinal tied North Carolina, 1-1. Stanford's last loss at home was in the third round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament when it lost to Connecticut, 2-0, on Nov. 23.

## Preseason All-Americans

Stanford placed more players on the *Soccer America* Preseason All-America team than any other school. Three Cardinal were among the 25 to make the list -- sophomore defenders Alina Garciamendez and Rachel Quon, and senior forward Christen Press. Garciamendez and Quon each started in the FIFA Under-20 World Cup in July, Garciamendez as a central defender for Mexico and Quon is an outside back for the U.S. Press has been active with the U.S. Under-23 national team.

## Three Cardinal on Hermann Trophy Watch List

Three Stanford players -- senior Christen Press and sophomores Mariah Nogueira and Rachel Quon -- have been named to the watch list for the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy, awarded each year to the top collegiate player in the country. They are among 47 women from 30 schools. One of those players will succeed Stanford's Kelley O'Hara, now with FC Gold Pride of Women's Professional Soccer, as the winner. Press was a semifinalist in 2009.
