The Bonnies welcome Boston University on the 40th anniversary of the opening of the Reilly Center. Coming off a loss to Niagara, St. Bonaventure looks to rebound in the second contest of a four-game homestand.

**40 Years of the Reilly Center**

Dec. 2 is the 40th anniversary of the first game played in the Reilly Center. On Dec. 2, 1966, St. Bonaventure defeated Quincy College 100-64 in what was then known as the University Center. In 1974, the building was dedicated to the memory of former St. Bonaventure coach and administrator Mike Reilly. The Bonnies are 365-151 all-time in the RC.

**Last Time Out:  
Bonnies Fall To Niagara**

Wednesday in the Reilly Center, Niagara posted a 74-63 win over the Bonnies. The visitors used a 22-2 run over the closing minutes of the first half and the beginning of the second half to seize control. The Bonnies trimmed their deficit to 49-46 with 10:49 to play but could not come any closer than that. Niagara made 16 of 25 shots in the second half including 3-4 from three-point range. Michael Lee and Paul Williams led the Bonnies with 14 points apiece.

## Scouting BU

The Terriers have lost three of their last four games, most recently a 55-39 decision at Saint Joseph's on Monday. Freshman guard Corey Lowe, who scored 28 points in a win over Manhattan, leads BU at 13.8 points per game. Sophomore guard Tyler Morris is next at 13.3. Senior Omari Peterkin is BU's top post player, averaging 9.0 points and 5.7 rebounds as the team's sixth man. Eight players average better than 20 minutes per game for the Terriers. BU is a guard-oriented, good shooting team, coming in at nearly 40 percent from three-point range. Boston University had a string of four straight postseason appearances (2002-05) under head coach Dennis Wolf, who spent three seasons as an assistant coach at St. Bonaventure, 1982-85.

## Double Your Pleasure

Bonnies' senior center Paul Williams already has four double-doubles this season, the most by an Atlantic 10 Conference player. Williams' 10.5 rebounds per game ranks second in the Atlantic 10. Williams game-by-game:

## Fab Frontcourt

It has been since the days of Caswell Cyrus and Peter Van Paassen back in 1999-2000 that St. Bonaventure featured a frontcourt worth bragging about. The Bonnies have something to talk about with junior forward **Michael Lee** and senior center **Paul Williams**. The Bonnies' top two scorers – Williams at 14.7 points per game and Lee at 13.8 – are combining to average 28.5 points, 17.7 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game. Williams stands second A-10 in rebounding and ranks 17th in scoring; Lee stands 12th in the conference in rebounding. Last year, the duo combined for 22.8 points, 13.6 rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game. Lee finished among the top 20 players in the A-10 in scoring (12.7), rebounding (6.5) and blocked shots (1.1). Williams finished seventh in the A-10 in rebounding (7.1) and averaged 10.1 points per game. In the Atlantic 10 Conference, only UMass' Rashaun Freeman and Stephane Lasme boast better numbers among the returning frontcourt tandems (24 points/16 rebounds on average).

## Aussie Is Instant Offense

Junior guard **Zarryon Fereti** is giving St. Bonaventure a spark off the bench, particularly on the offensive end. The Australian is the Bonnies' third-leading scorer at 11.7 points per game. Fereti has already shown a flair for the dramatic, too. Last Saturday night in a win at Central Connecticut, he made two free throws with 13 seconds left to give the Bonnies back a one-point lead. Nov. 14, his off-balance three-pointer with two seconds left forced overtime and propelled the Bonnies to a win over Central Arkansas.

## Sophomore Improvements ... Not Slumps

Sophomores **A.J. Hawkins** and **Tyler Benson** have already shown that they are vastly improved from their freshman seasons. Hawkins and Benson are in their second year as roommates on campus and also play the same position, small forward. Both also share a passion for practicing, so their improvements are no accident. The duo are often found in the Reilly Center after practices and during the day working on shooting drills. Hawkins, who enjoyed a solid freshman season at 6.3 points and 2.5 rebounds per game, is averaging 9.0 points and 4.7 rebounds in this young season. He also leads the Bonnies with eight steals. Last year, Benson missed 10 games year due to a mid-season ankle injury and averaged 0.9 points in 13 games. This year, Benson is 8-21 (.381) from three-point range and is averaging 4.7 points per game. He played a career high 19 minutes against Saint Francis.

## J. Williams Debuts

Junior guard **James Williams** made his Bonnies debut in Wednesday's game against Niagara. The Topeka, Kansas, native had been sidelined since early November by a strained Achilles. He played five minutes against Niagara and made his only shot, a three-pointer.

## Five New Faces Add To Depth

There is no question that St. Bonaventure's depth is improved this year; that is thanks to the improvement of returning players as well as the team's five new players. Four of those newcomers are juniors who have junior college backgrounds: guards Zarryon Fereti and Jermaine Calvin, who were teammates last year at Southern Idaho J.C.; guard James Williams and forward Lounceny Kaba. The team's only scholarship freshman is power forward Jourdan Morris.

## 2K Sports Classic Recap

Nov. 9-10 in Austin, Texas, the Bonnies went 1-1 in the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic. St. Bonaventure opened with a loss to Chicago State but defeated Alcorn State in the consolation game, 68-59. Paul Williams and Michael Lee led the way, but several other players enjoyed strong showings as well. Williams recorded back-to-back double-doubles with a career high 25 points and 13 rebounds against Chicago State and 10 points, 10 rebounds against Alcorn State. Lee averaged 18.5 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.0 blocked shots over the two games. A.J. Hawkins started his sophomore season well with 14 points in the opener and 11 points and eight rebounds against Alcorn State. Zarryon Fereti led the Bonnies with 21 points in the win over Alcorn.

## Bounce-Back For Health

Three Bonnies players are hoping for health after injury-interrupted seasons last year:

- Junior guard **Tyler Relph** missed the first nine games of 2005-06 due to a stress fracture in his left foot but came back to help the Bonnies in the second half of the year. Relph started the last eight games of the season and averaged 7.6 points per game in A-10 play. He posted three double-figure scoring efforts (13 vs. George Washington, 12 vs. Duquesne, 13 at Xavier). This year, Relph is averaging 8.5 points per game and is 8-18 (.444) from long range.
- Senior center **Ivan Kovacevic** missed all but six games last season due to a knee injury, which he sustained in a game at Marist Dec. 21. Kovacevic is now the backup to Paul Williams.
- Sophomore forward **Tyler Benson** missed 10 games last year due to a mid-season ankle injury. He averaged only 0.9 points in 13 games. This year, he is one of the Bonnies' top substitutes and three-point threats.

## New Faces On The Bench

Head coach Anthony Solomon welcomes two new assistant coaches, Andy Johnston and Dino Presley. Both joined the staff last spring. Johnston spent the past four seasons at LIU-Brooklyn, while Presley worked at Maryland-Baltimore County last season and East Carolina for two years before that. Overall, Johnston has 18 years of experience in coaching while Presley has 13. In addition, Jake Luhn is in his first season as an assistant after working the last three years as Director of Basketball Operations.

### Returning/Lost

St. Bonaventure returned four starters and a total of eight letterwinners from last season's club which finished 8-19. The returning starters are senior center Paul Williams (10.1 ppg, 7.1 rpg), junior forward Michael Lee (12.7 ppg, 6.5 rpg), senior point guard Terron Diggs (2.2 ppg, 2.8 apg) and junior guard Tyler Relph (6.9 ppg). Also back are sophomore guard A.J. Hawkins (6.3 ppg), sophomore swingman Tyler Benson (0.9), senior forward Ivan Kovacevic (0.2) and senior center David Fox (0.8).

The Bonnies lost three seniors from last year's team: All-Conference swingman Ahmad Smith, swingman Patrick Lottin and guard Wade Dunston. Smith was the Bonnies' leading scorer at 15.9 points per game. Lottin averaged 7.5 points and Dunston 4.3.

## 40 Years of the Reilly Center

Dec. 2 will mark the 40th anniversary of the first game in the Reilly Center. The Bonnies will host Boston University on that date and a number of commemorative activities are being planned. In addition, fans can submit their top Reilly Center memories on-line through GoBonnies.com.

A look at some Reilly Center facts and figures:

- The first men's basketball game played in the Reilly Center was on Dec. 2, 1966. St. Bonaventure defeated Quincy College, 100-64, before a crowd of 4,276. Jeff Hazard led the way for the Bonnies with 29 points.

- All-time, St. Bonaventure has won 71 percent of its games in the RC with a mark of 365-150.

- In 2001, the Reilly Center was named one of the top five "Hostile Homes" in college basketball by ESPN's Jay Bilas.

- St. Bonaventure played its first-ever home postseason game during the 1995 NIT when they hosted Southern Mississippi in round one. Tickets to the game sold out in a mere four hours. More than 6,000 fans watched as the Bonnies prevailed 75-70.

- Originally named the University Center, the building was dedicated to the memory of Carroll "Mike" Reilly '25 on June 1, 1974. Reilly was a Bona student-athlete, faculty member, football-basketball coach and athletic director. He is also a member of the St. Bonaventure Athletic Hall of Fame.

## Two More Games Added to CSTV Schedule

Two more Bonnies games have been added to CSTV's regional schedule: Jan. 10 against Richmond and Feb. 10 vs. Dayton. Both games are at the Reilly Center. **Please note that the Dayton game will now start at noon as opposed to the previously announced 7:00 tip time.** CSTV, which is the new television partner of the Atlantic 10 Conference, will also air the Bonnies' Feb. 3 home game with Duquesne.

## Bonnies Sign Guard and Two Forwards in Early Period

The St. Bonaventure men's basketball program announced that three student-athletes have signed National Letters of Intent to attend St. Bonaventure beginning next year: forwards **Da'Quan Cook** and **Matt Morgan** and guard **Malcolm Eleby**.

The 6-foot-8 Cook is in his senior season at The Miller School in Charlottesville, Va. Last season, Cook was a first team All-State selection in the Virginia Association of Independent Schools. Cook helped the Devils to a 20-5 record and a second place finish in the state tournament. He averaged 11 points, 5.8 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.5 steals per game. Cook is a native of Elizabeth, N.J., who began his high school career at St. Patrick's, which is the school current Bonnies senior Paul Williams attended.

"Da'Quan has a bright future ahead of him in the college game," Bonnies coach Anthony Solomon said. "His versatility is a plus. His time at The Miller School will assist his transition to college in all aspects."

Morgan, who also stands 6-foot-8, is playing at St. Thomas More, a prep

school in Connecticut. A native of Landover, Md., Morgan played at Millersburg Military Academy in Kentucky last year. There, he averaged 13.4 points, 3.8 rebounds over 30 games. His top single game was 35 points and 12 rebounds against traditional power Oak Hill Academy.

"To have Matt join our University and basketball program is exciting," Solomon said. "His time at St. Thomas More will benefit his transition and will lead to a successful college experience. He is just touching the surface of his potential and we look forward to a great four years with him."

Eleby is in his senior year at Franklin Learning Center in Philadelphia. The 6-foot-3 Eleby can play either guard position. Last season as a junior, Eleby averaged 22.2 points per game. He was named second team All-State by the Associated Press and second team All-City by the *Philadelphia Daily News*.

"Malcolm is an excellent signing for us," Solomon said. "He is a driven young man who will cherish the opportunity to compete for St. Bonaventure in the Atlantic 10. His size, competitive drive and winning ways are admirable and will be welcome in our program."

St. Bonaventure will lose four seniors to graduation next spring - Williams, center David Fox, center Ivan Kovacevic and point guard Terron Diggs.

"First, this class says a lot about a job well done by our coaching staff. Having these three young men join us in the fall is another step in the progression of our program," said Solomon.

"Da'Quan Cook, Matt Morgan and Malcolm Eleby are all key components to our future. Each of them has strengths we value that will be assets and help us reach higher heights."
