At A Glance

St. Bonaventure hosts Central Arkansas in its home opener. The Bonnies already have two games under their belts, going 1-1 in the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic last week in Austin, Texas. The Bonnies feature a mix of returning players and newcomers with front line veterans Michael Lee and Paul Williams leading the way. Central Arkansas is in its first year in NCAA Division I, but has been a successful program under fourth year head coach Rand Chappell.

2K Sports Classic Recap

Last week in Austin, Texas, the Bonnies went 1-1 in the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic. St. Bonaventure opened with a loss to Chicago State but defeated Alcorn State in the consolation game, 68-59. Paul Williams and Michael Lee led the way, but several other players enjoyed strong showings as well. Williams recorded back-to-back double-doubles with a career high 25 points and 13 rebounds against Chicago State and 10 points, 10 rebounds against Alcorn State. Lee averaged 18.5 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.0 blocked shots over the two games. A.J. Hawkins started his sophomore season well with 14 points in the opener and 11 points and eight rebounds against Alcorn State. Zarryon Fereti led the Bonnies with 21 points in the win over Alcorn.

Scouting Central Arkansas

The Bears opened the season with a 71-53 home win over Central Methodist on Saturday. Five Central Arkansas players scored in double figures led by reserve forward Mitch Rueter, who had 15 points. Forward Durrell Nevels blocked six shots and scored 12 points. This is the Bears' first season in NCAA Division I and also as a member of the Southland Conference. Head coach Rand Chappell, who is 62-28 in his fifth season at Central Arkansas, led the Bears to an 18-10 record last season. Three starters from that team led by LaMar Phillips, who averaged 12.6 points per game.

Home Openers

At the Reilly Center, St. Bonaventure is 36-1 all-time in its first home game of a season. The lone loss came in 1994 to Canisius.

Offense Off The Bench

Junior guard Zarryon Fereti and sophomore forward Tyler Benson are giving St. Bonaventure a spark off the bench, particularly on the offensive end. Fereti scored 21 points against Alcorn State and eight against Chicago State, while Benson scored nine and three points, respectively. Benson has made four of his seven shots from three-point range.

Returning/Lost

St. Bonaventure returned four starters and a total of eight letterwinners from last season's club which finished 8-19. The returning starters are senior center Paul Williams (10.1 ppg, 7.1 rpg), junior forward Michael Lee (12.7 ppg, 6.5 rpg), senior point guard Terron Diggs (2.2 ppg, 2.8 apg) and junior guard Tyler Relph (6.9 ppg). Also back are sophomore guard A.J. Hawkins (6.3 ppg), sophomore swingman Tyler Benson (0.9), senior forward Ivan Kovacevic (0.2) and senior center David Fox (0.8). The Bonnies lost three seniors from last year's team: All-Conference swingman Ahmad Smith, swingman Patrick Lottin and guard Wade Dunston. Smith was the Bonnies' leading scorer at 15.9 points per game. Lottin averaged 7.5 points and Dunston 4.3.

Five New Faces Add To Depth

There is no question that St. Bonaventure's depth is improved this year; that is thanks to the improvement of returning players as well as the team's five new players. Four of those newcomers are juniors who have junior college backgrounds: guards Zarryon Fereti and Jermaine Calvin, who were teammates last year at Southern Idaho J.C.; guard James Williams and forward Lounceny Kaba. The team's only scholarship freshman is power forward Jourdan Morris.

Bounce-Back For Health

Three Bonnies players are hoping for health after injury-interrupted seasons last year:

- Junior guard **Tyler Relph** missed the first nine games of 2005-06 due to a stress fracture in his left foot but came back to help the Bonnies in the second half of the year. Relph started the last eight games of the season and averaged 7.6 points per game in A-10 play. He posted three double-figure scoring efforts (13 vs. George Washington, 12 vs. Duquesne, 13 at Xavier) on the season and gave St. Bonaventure a three-point threat, shooting 30 percent from long range for the season.
- Senior center **Ivan Kovacevic** missed all but six games last season due to a knee injury, which he sustained in a game at Marist Dec. 21. Kovacevic opens this season as the backup to Paul Williams.
- Sophomore forward **Tyler Benson** missed 10 games last year due to a mid-season ankle injury. He averaged only 0.9 points in 13 games, but opened this season with 13 points in the exhibition win over Gannon.

Fab Frontcourt

It has been since the days of Caswell Cyrus and Peter Van Paassen back in 1999-2000 that St. Bonaventure featured a frontcourt worth bragging about. The Bonnies have something to talk about this season with junior forward Michael Lee and senior center Paul Williams. Last year, that duo combined to average

22.8 points, 13.6 rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game. Lee finished among the top 20 players in the A-10 in scoring (12.7), rebounding (6.5) and blocked shots (1.1). Williams finished 7th in the A-10 in rebounding (7.1) and averaged 10.1 points per game. In the Atlantic 10 Conference, only UMass' Rashaun Freeman and Stephane Lasme boast better numbers among the returning frontcourt tandems (24 points/16 rebounds on average).

New Faces On The Bench

Head coach Anthony Solomon welcomes two new assistant coaches, Andy Johnston and Dino Presley. Both joined the staff last spring. Johnston spent the past four seasons at LIU-Brooklyn, while Presley worked at Maryland-Baltimore County last season and East Carolina for two years before that. Overall, Johnston has 18 years of experience in coaching while Presley has 13. In addition, Jake Luhn is in his first season as an assistant after working the last three years as Director of Basketball Operations.

Closing The Gap

It is certainly true that the Bonnies were a more competitive team in 2005-06 than the previous season. Ten out of the Bonnies' 19 losses were by 11 points or less including a 1-point decision at Richmond, a 2-point loss at Saint Louis, a 5-point loss to West Virginia (ranked among the Top 25 for most of the year) and an 11-point decision to the Atlantic 10 champions, George Washington.

2005-06 Non-Conference Success

St. Bonaventure completed its non-conference schedule 6-5, tripling its win total from all of last season. The Bonnies went 5-0 at Reilly Center, their best home start in four years, and snapped a 30-game road losing streak with an overtime win at Florida International.

Chicago State 98, St. Bonaventure 95

David Holston scored 43 points to lead Chicago State to a hard-fought win in the opening round of the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic. The game remained close throughout the second half. Each time St. Bonaventure seemed ready to run away, Holston kept the Cougars close. The Bonnies' largest lead was five points at 78-73 with 6:36 left following a dunk by Paul Williams. Chicago State fought back and eventually tied the game at 88-88 with 2:51 left, then took the lead for good on a dunk by Cam-Ron Clay with 2:06 to play. Clay then made it 92-89 with 1:22 left. The Cougars went up 94-89 with 26 seconds remaining on a free throw by Aaron Williams, and the closest St. Bonaventure came after that was two points. Zarryon Fereti made a three-pointer with 17 seconds left to cut the Bonnies' deficit to 94-92, but Holston was fouled and made two free throws to put Chicago State back ahead by four. Williams led the Bonnies with a career high 25 points and 13 rebounds. Michael Lee also finished with a double-double, 20 points and 10 rebounds. A.J. Hawkins scored 14 points while Tyler Relph tied his career high with 13 points.
