**At A Glance**

St. Bonaventure looks for its first win of the season when it squares off against Cornell for the first time since 1990. The Bonnies come off a 91-67 loss to third-ranked Syracuse on Wednesday. There were many encouraging signs in that game that the Bonnies hope to carry over. Cornell dropped to 1-4 with a loss at Quinnipiac on Wednesday. This is the first home game that the St. Bonaventure students will be on campus.

**Last Game Recap**

St. Bonaventure fell to third-ranked Syracuse, 91-67, on Wednesday night at the Carrier Dome. The Orange led 33-24 with 4:01 left in the first half, scored the next 10 points and were ahead 46-26 at halftime. The Bonnies held their own in most categories, shooting 42 percent from the field. Junior **Wade Dunston** led St. Bonaventure with 17 points while freshman **Michael Lee** scored a season-high 16 and **Patrick Lottin** had 11. **Ahmad Smith** totaled eight points, eight rebounds, six assists and three steals.

**Doubleheader Saturday**

St. Bonaventure will host a rare doubleheader this Saturday, Dec. 4, at the Reilly Center. The Bona women will tip-off the action, taking on Navy at 4:30. A doubleheader ticket (\$14 all seats, reserved) is required for admittance to both games.

### Scouting Cornell

The Big Red come off an 83-76 loss at Quinnipiac on Wednesday. Sophomore forward Lenny Collins, who is Cornell's leading scorer at just over 20 points per game, scored 27 against Quinnipiac. The 6-6 Collins is 13-21 (62 percent) from three-point range this season. The Big Red are shooting 38 percent from long range as a team and limiting their opponents to 30 rebounds per game. Cornell's lone win came by a 69-67 score against Division III Ithaca; the Big Red have also lost to Marist (72-68), North-eastern (88-85) and Colgate (70-56). Shooting guard Cody Toppert averages 13.2 points per game while senior forward Eric Taylor is at 12.6 points and a team-high 8.8 rebounds per outing. Other starters are junior forward Ryan Rourke (8.2 ppg) and freshman point

guard Khaliq Gant (4.4 ppg).

### Lottin Makes Quick Return From Knee Surgery

Junior swingman **Patrick Lottin** underwent reconstructive surgery in April to repair a torn ACL in his right knee, so when he stepped on the floor a few minutes into the Marist game Nov. 23, it was a both a pleasant surprise and a much-needed boost to this team. His six months of rehabilitation were at least one month less than were originally forecast and a testament to Lottin's will. One of the most improved players in the Atlantic 10 a year ago, the A-10 coaches recognized Lottin this fall with a spot on the preseason All-Conference third team. Lottin has demonstrated why, averaging 14.7 points and 8.0 rebounds over his two games. At Syracuse Dec. 1, he scored 11 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Lottin scored a game-high 21 points on Nov. 27 against Canisius. In 2003-04, Lottin finished second on the team in scoring (13.3 ppg), rebounding (4.5), assists (2.0) and three-point field goals (58). He scored in double figures 21 times. A fourth-year junior, he has two seasons of eligibility remaining.

### Newcomers Playing Key Roles

The Bonnies' five new players – freshmen **Michael Lee, Isiah Carson** and **Willie Morse**, sophomore **Brian Gibbs** and junior **Wade Dunston** – are all seeing meaningful playing time. Dunston is the Bonnies' leading scorer at 16.5 points per game. Carson has started three games at point guard. Lee is fourth on the team in scoring at 8.3 ppg after a 16-point performance at Syracuse. Gibbs' combination of muscle and hustle earned him a start against Canisius, while Morse came off the bench to score eight points at Canisius.

### Dunston Makes Immediate Impact

Junior guard **Wade Dunston**, a junior college transfer, has wasted little time in making a positive impression. He has led St. Bonaventure in scoring three times and is averaging team-high 16.5 points per game. Playing his first game in a Bonaventure uniform at Iona, Dunston scored a game-high 22 points and grabbed four rebounds in 33 minutes coming off the bench. Dunston followed that with 17 points against Marist, 10 at Canisius and 17 at Syracuse. The Washington, D.C., native was a highly-regarded player coming out of Bullis Prep High.

## St. Bona vs. Ivy League

The green, orange and blue mascot will perform throughout the game as part of the NCAA's commitment to promote youth basketball participation and sportsmanship. J.J. Jumper has visited more than 275 NCAA institutions over the past four years, including St. Bonaventure last December.

## Returning & Lost

The Bonnies returned 50 percent of their scoring (954 of 1,904 points) and 71 percent of their rebounding from last season. The two main losses were guard Marques Green (19.4 ppg, 3.3 rpg) and forward Maurice Young (11.7 ppg, 4.2 rpg). St. Bonaventure returned two double-figure scorers in Patrick Lottin (13.3 ppg) and Ahmad Smith (10.3).

## Missing Marques Green

It would be hard for St. Bonaventure not to miss dynamic point guard **Marques Green**, who completed a superb career last year. The 5-foot-7 Green is St. Bonaventure's seventh all-time leading scorer with 1,734 points, and he holds

school records for career assists, steals and three-pointers. He was a three-time All-Conference selection. Green is now playing professionally in France. A look at some of Green's honors and achievements in the 2003-04 season:

- 2nd Team All-Conference.
- Atlantic 10 All-Defensive Team.
- Finalist for Cousy Award (top point guard).
- Led nation in steals (3.8 per game).

## 85th Season

This is the 85th season of St. Bonaventure basketball. The University's storied tradition in the sport includes an all-time record of 1,110 wins and 805 losses (.579), 57 winning seasons and 22 postseason berths.

## Walk-On Makes Impact

Rarely do walk-on players make the kind of impact on teams that Greg Lewis had for St. Bonaventure last season. Lewis played in 21 games and scored 26 points. Lewis is expected to see minutes again this season.

## Stevens, Pawlikowski Earn Walk-On Spots

A pair of guards, junior Craig Stevens and freshman Jason Pawlikowski, have earned roster spots as walk-ons. Stevens, who is in his second year on the team, played in the closing seconds of the Bonnies' Dec. 1 game at Syracuse, which is just a short distance from his hometown of Oneida, N.Y. Pawlikowski was an All-Western New York point guard last year at St. Mary's High School in suburban Buffalo.

## Bonnies Sign 6-10 Center in Early Period

Nov. 10, St. Bonaventure signed 6-10 forward **David Fox** to a National Letter of Intent. A native of Lakewood, Ohio, and a graduate of Lakewood High School, Fox is in his sophomore year at Mercyhurst North East Junior College in North East, Pa. Last year, Fox averaged eight points and 5.5 rebounds per game for a 23-6 team that finished 10th in the NJCAA Div. II poll.

## Relph, Williams Wait In Wings

A pair of transfer student-athletes, 6-0 guard **Tyler Relph** and 6-10 forward **Paul Williams**, are practicing with the Bonnies this year and will be eligible at the start of the 2005-06 season. A

sophomore, Relph will have three years of eligibility. Last season, he attended West Virginia, where he played in all 31 of the Mountaineers' games and averaged 5.0 points, 0.9 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 0.7 steals per game. A graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester, N.Y., Relph was named "Mr. Basketball" for the state of New York following his senior season of 2002-03, when McQuaid won the state championship. The *Rochester Democrat & Chronicle* twice named Relph its Greater Rochester Player of the Year. Williams played at Siena the past two seasons. As a sophomore, he averaged 2.6 points and 2.6 rebounds over 22 games. His freshman season, Williams averaged 3.2 points and 2.7 rebounds over 32 games and helped the Saints reach the second round of the NIT. Williams attended St. Patrick's High School in northern New Jersey, and his senior year, he was named "Best Big Man" in the state of New Jersey by the high school coaches association and was a first team All-State selection. Williams will have two seasons of eligibility at St. Bonaventure.

## Mungar Among St. Bonaventure Hall of Fame Class of 2005

Former basketball standout **Barry Mungar '86** is one of three former student-athletes who will be inducted into the St. Bonaventure Athletics Hall of Fame on Jan. 8. Mungar, a 6-foot-8 forward, was known as a tenacious interior player. Mungar ranks among the top 20 players in school history in both scoring and rebounding. Owner of 1,361 points and 651 rebounds over his career, the 6-foot-8 native of Toronto, Canada, helped St. Bonaventure to 67 victories over his four seasons, including an NIT berth in 1983. Mungar was an honorable mention All-East selection in his sophomore season. As a senior in 1985-86, he made the First Team All-Atlantic 10 when he averaged 17.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Following his graduation, Mungar was selected by the Washington Bullets in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft. He later earned a spot on the 1988 Canadian Olympic Team. Today, Mungar is an officer in the Hamilton (Ont.) Wentworth Regional Police. Christine Agresta '87 (basketball) and Garvin Ferguson '90 (swimming) will join Mungar in the Class of 2005.
