The Bonnies look to re-group behind juniors Patrick Lottin, Wade Dunston and Ahmad Smith, their top three scorers. One sub-plot is the coaching matchup between Anthony Solomon and Jim Larranaga. Solomon is was an assistant under Larranaga at Bowling Green.

Last Game Recap

Monday at the Reilly Center, St. Bonaventure lost to Niagara, 111-75. The Bonnies led 33-31 late in the first half before the Purple Eagles closed the half with a 17-5 run to claim a 48-38 lead at intermission. Niagara, the 7th-highest scoring team in the nation, pulled away early in the second half. Patrick Lottin led the Bonnies with 13 points and freshman Michael Lee added 11. Ahmad Smith contributed eight points and a career high eight assists.

Scouting George Mason

Tonight's meeting with the Bonnies is George Mason's first game since Dec. 8 and just its second road game of the season. The Patriots' last game was a 70-65 home win over Iona. Veteran coach Jim Larranaga, who is in his seventh season at George Mason and 21st overall as a head coach, employs a defensive-oriented style. George Mason averages only 67 points per game but allows an average of just 65. The Patriots have losses to two ranked clubs, Maryland (78-54) and Michigan State (66-60). Jamar Butler leads GM at 16.9 points per game and averages 3.1 three-pointers per game. At 275 pounds, power forward Jai Lewis controls the paint. Five Patriot players, led by Lewis and Gabe Norwood, have double-figure totals in assists.

Former State College

Teammates To Square Off
Bonnies freshman **Willie Morse** and George Mason sophomore forward Gabe Norwood were high school teammates at State College (Pa.) High. The duo helped lead the Little Lions to the 2003 Pennsylvania AAAA state championship.

Solomon-Larranaga Ties

St. Bonaventure coach Anthony Solomon and George Mason coach Jim Larranaga are already well acquainted. Larranaga was an assistant coach at Virginia during Solomon's freshman, sophomore and junior seasons there. Then, in 1989, Larranaga hired Solomon as one of his assistant coaches while he was the head coach at Bowling Green. Solomon worked for Larranaga for three seasons at Bowling Green. This will be the second time and second year in a row they have gone head-to-head.

Members of our nation's armed forces will be honored during this Wednesday's game against George Mason at the Reilly Center. Jamestown Community College purchased 50 tickets and St. Bonaventure chipped in 25 more for a total of 75 free tickets for servicepeople and their families.

Lottin Makes Quick Return From Knee Surgery

Junior swingman **Patrick Lottin** underwent reconstructive surgery in April to repair a torn ACL in his right knee, so when he stepped on the floor a few minutes into the Marist game Nov. 23, it was a both a pleasant surprise and a much-needed boost to this team. One of the most improved players in the Atlantic 10 a year ago, the A-10 coaches recognized Lottin this fall with a spot on the preseason All-Conference third team. Lottin has demonstrated why, averaging team highs of 13.4 points and 6.9 rebounds. Lottin's five points at Arkansas-Little Rock was the first time he was held under 11 points this season and broke a streak of eight games (dating back to last season) he had scored in double figures. In 2003-04, Lottin finished second on the team in scoring (13.3 ppg), rebounding (4.5), assists (2.0) and three-point field goals (58). He scored in double figures 21 times. A fourth-year junior, he has two seasons of eligibility remaining.

Smith Logs Triple Duty

At 6-foot-5 and 195 pounds, junior guard **Ahmad Smith** is capable of playing multiple positions. He has done just that this year and his statistics bear that out. He leads the Bonnies in assists (33) and steals (11), is second on the team in rebounding (5.9) and third in scoring (9.1). The majority of Smith's playing time has been on the wing, though he has also handled the point as well. Dec. 20 against Niagara, Smith set a career high with eight assists. Dec. 4 at West Virginia, he recorded the first double-double of his career with 12 points and 11 rebounds.

Dunston's Immediate Impact

Junior guard **Wade Dunston**, a junior college transfer, has wasted little time in making a positive impression. He has led St. Bonaventure in scoring three times, has scored in double figures five times and is averaging 12.0 points per game. Dunston also leads the Bonnies in free throw shooting at 83 percent (39-47), a figure that ranks fourth best in the Atlantic 10. Playing his first game in a Bonaventure uniform at Iona, Dunston scored a game-high 22 points and grabbed four rebounds in 33 minutes coming off the bench. Dunston's other double-digit scoring outputs were 17 points against Marist, 10 at Canisius, 17 at Syracuse and 11 at Arkansas-Little Rock. The Washington, D.C., native was a highly-regarded player coming out of Bullis Prep High.

Gibbs Plays Big

Sophomore Brian Gibbs may be a power forward in a 6-4 body, but he refuses to let that deter him. At 225 pounds, the first-year player has the strength to play inside. Dec. 17 at Arkansas-Little Rock, Gibbs played what was easily the best game of his young career. He totaled a season high 14 points and five rebounds in just 19 minutes of action. Gibbs was 6-7 from the field, mainly taking shots close to the basket. What likely inspired Gibbs was playing in front of a group of friends and family. Gibbs is from Huntsville, Ala., and he attended Northwest Mississippi Community College last year. On the season, Gibbs is averaging 5.7 points and 3.4 rebounds over just 15 minutes per night.

Walk-On Makes Impact

Rarely do walk-on players make the kind of impact on teams that Greg Lewis had for St. Bonaventure last season. Lewis played in 21 games and scored 26 points.

This year, Lewis has played in all eight games. He has seen increased playing time the past three games, topped by a career-high 21 minutes against Niagara, as Coach Anthony Solomon has opted for a platoon of Lewis and freshman Isiah Carson at the point. Lewis hit the first three-pointer of his career in the loss to Arkansas-Little Rock.

Newcomers Playing Key Roles

The Bonnies' five new players – freshmen **Michael Lee**, **Isiah Carson** and **Willie Morse**, sophomore **Brian Gibbs** and junior **Wade Dunston** – are all seeing meaningful playing time. Dunston is the Bonnies' second-leading scorer. Lee is fourth on the team in scoring, has started three times and posted an impressive 16-point performance at Syracuse. Morse scored a combined 22 points over the last six games, including 10 against Cornell. Carson has started seven games at point guard.

Missing Marques Green

It would be hard for St. Bonaventure not to miss dynamic point guard **Marques Green**, who completed a superb career last year. The 5-foot-7 Green is St. Bonaventure's seventh all-time leading scorer with 1,734 points, and he holds school records for career assists, steals and three-pointers. He was a three-time All-Conference selection. Green is now playing professionally in France. A look at some of Green's honors and achievements in the 2003-04 season:

85th Season

This is the 85th season of St. Bonaventure basketball. The University's storied tradition in the sport includes an all-time record of 1,110 wins and 809 losses (.578), 57 winning seasons and 22 postseason berths.

Stevens, Pawlikowski Earn Walk-On Spots

A pair of guards, junior Craig Stevens and freshman Jason Pawlikowski, have earned roster spots as walk-ons. Stevens, who is in his second year on the team, played in the closing seconds of the Bonnies' Dec. 1 game at Syracuse, which is just a short distance from his hometown of Oneida, N.Y. Pawlikowski was an All-Western New York point guard last year at St. Mary's High School in suburban Buffalo.

Relph, Williams Wait In Wings

A pair of transfer student-athletes, 6-0 guard **Tyler Relph** and 6-10 forward **Paul Williams**, are practicing with the Bonnies this year and will be eligible at the start of the 2005-06 season. A sophomore, Relph will have three years of eligibility. Last season, he attended West Virginia, where he played in all 31 of the Mountaineers' games and averaged 5.0 points, 0.9 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 0.7 steals per game. A graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester, N.Y., Relph was named "Mr. Basketball" for the state of New York following his senior season of 2002-03, when McQuaid won the state championship. The *Rochester Democrat & Chronicle* twice named Relph its Greater Rochester Player of the Year. Williams played at Siena the past two seasons. As a sophomore, he averaged 2.6 points and 2.6 rebounds over 22 games. His freshman season, Williams averaged 3.2 points and 2.7 rebounds over 32 games and helped the Saints reach the second round of the NIT. Williams attended St. Patrick's High School in northern New Jersey, and his senior year, he was named "Best Big Man" in the state of New Jersey by the high school coaches association and was a first team All-State selection. Williams will have two seasons of eligibility at St. Bonaventure.

Mungar Among St. Bonaventure Hall of Fame Class of 2005

Former basketball standout **Barry Mungar '86** is one of three former student-athletes who will be inducted into the St. Bonaventure Athletics Hall of Fame on Jan. 8. Mungar, a 6-foot-8 forward, was known as a tenacious interior player. Mungar ranks among the top 20 players in school history in both scoring and rebounding. Owner of 1,361 points and 651 rebounds over his career, the 6-foot-8 native of Toronto, Canada, helped St. Bonaventure to 67 victories over his four seasons, including an NIT berth in 1983. Mungar was an honorable mention All-East selection in his sophomore season. As a senior in 1985-86, he made the First Team All-Atlantic 10 when he averaged 17.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Following his graduation, Mungar was selected by the Washington Bullets in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft. He later earned a spot on the 1988 Canadian Olympic Team. Today, Mungar is an officer in the Hamilton (Ont.) Wentworth Regional Police. Christine Agresta '87 (basketball) and Garvin Ferguson '90 (swimming) will join Mungar in the Class of 2005.

Birthday Boys
