At A Glance

St. Bonaventure ends its nine-day hiatus with a trip to Little Rock, Ark., to face a veteran Trojan club. The Bonnies' last action before semester exams was Dec. 7 at West Virginia. Arkansas-Little Rock, which counts three ranked opponents among its four losses, features seven seniors and an up-tempo style. This game is St. Bonaventure's first visit to the state of Arkansas and completes a home-and-home series between the schools. It also is the first in busy pre-Christmas period which has the Bonnies playing three games in six days.

Last Game Recap

Dec. 7 at the Charleston (W.Va.) Civic Center, a slow start cost St. Bonaventure a legitimate chance at its first win as West Virginia prevailed 70-55. The unbeaten Mountaineers jumped out to an early lead and were ahead 33-16 at halftime. The Bonnies clawed back with a much stronger second half performance but still could not come any closer than 11 points. **Patrick Lottin** led the Bonnies with 14 points. **Ahmad Smith** posted the first double-double of his career with 12 points and a career-high 11 rebounds, and **Wade Dunston** chipped in eight points and seven rebounds. Rebounding was a bright spot as St. Bonaventure enjoyed a 41-32 edge.

Scouting Little Rock

The Trojans fell to 4-4 with an 83-53 loss at #22-ranked Mississippi State on Saturday. Three of Arkansas-Little Rock's losses have come to ranked teams - ALR also lost at Georgia Tech (79-54) and at Oklahoma State (90-65). Arkansas-Little Rock second year coach Steve Shields has the benefit of seven seniors on his roster. Senior guard Brandon Freeman is the team's top scorer at 14.6 points per game; he is shooting 41 percent (18-44) from three-point range. Forward Darius Eason and reserve guard Zack Weight both average 10.4 points per game. Forward Richard Hardman is the Trojans' top rebounder at 6.3 per outing and also averages 7.4 points. Reserve forward Columbus Willis is at 8.6 points per game.

Lottin Makes Quick Return From Knee Surgery

Junior swingman **Patrick Lottin** underwent reconstructive surgery in April to repair a torn ACL in his right knee, so when he stepped on the floor a few minutes into the Marist game Nov. 23, it was a both a pleasant surprise and a much-needed boost to this team. One of the most improved players in the Atlantic 10 a year ago, the A-10 coaches recognized Lottin this fall with a spot on the preseason All-Conference third team. Lottin has demonstrated why, averaging team highs of 15.2 points and 7.0 rebounds over his five games. Lottin has scored at least 11 points in every game so far. In 2003-04, Lottin finished second on the team in scoring (13.3 ppg), rebounding (4.5), assists (2.0) and three-point field goals (58). He scored in double figures 21 times. A fourth-year junior, he has two seasons of eligibility remaining.

Smith Logs Triple Duty

At 6-foot-5 and 195 pounds, junior guard **Ahmad Smith** is capable of playing multiple positions. He has done just that this year and his statistics bear that out. He leads the Bonnies in assists (22) and steals (11), is second on the team in rebounding (6.7) and third in scoring (8.8). The majority of Smith's playing time has been on the wing, though he has also handled the point as well.

Dunston's Immediate Impact

Junior guard **Wade Dunston**, a junior college transfer, has wasted little time in making a positive impression. He has led St. Bonaventure in scoring three times and is averaging 13.0 points per game. Playing his first game in a Bonaventure uniform at Iona, Dunston scored a game-high 22 points and grabbed four rebounds in 33 minutes coming off the bench. Dunston followed that with 17 points against Marist, 10 at Canisius and 17 at Syracuse. The Washington, D.C., native was a highly-regarded player coming out of Bullis Prep High.

Newcomers Playing Key Roles

The Bonnies' five new players – freshmen **Michael Lee**, **Isiah Carson** and **Willie Morse**, sophomore **Brian Gibbs** and junior **Wade Dunston** – are all seeing meaningful playing time. Dunston is the Bonnies' second-leading scorer at 13.0 points per game. Lee is fourth on the team in scoring at 6.2 ppg and posted an impressive 16-point performance at Syracuse. Morse scored a combined 20 points over the last four games, including 10 against Cornell. Carson has started five games at point guard.

No Exhibitions

The Bonnies were not allowed to play any exhibition games, a penalty imposed upon the program by the NCAA last spring.

Morse Code

His shooting and saavy have earned freshman guard **Willie Morse** greater playing time. Dec. 4 against Cornell, Morse saw a season-high 32 minutes of action and he responded with season highs of 10 points and four assists. For the season, Morse is averaging 3.3 points and is 4-12 from three-point range.

Returning & Lost

The Bonnies returned 50 percent of their scoring (954 of 1,904 points) and 71 percent of their rebounding from last season. The two main losses were guard Marques Green (19.4 ppg, 3.3 rpg) and forward Maurice Young (11.7 ppg, 4.2 rpg). St. Bonaventure returned two double-figure scorers in Patrick Lottin (13.3 ppg) and Ahmad Smith (10.3).

Missing Marques Green

It would be hard for St. Bonaventure not to miss dynamic point guard **Marques Green**, who completed a superb career last year. The 5-foot-7 Green is St.

Bonaventure's seventh all-time leading scorer with 1,734 points, and he holds school records for career assists, steals and three-pointers. He was a three-time All-Conference selection. Green is now playing professionally in France.

85th Season

This is the 85th season of St. Bonaventure basketball. The University's storied tradition in the sport includes an all-time record of 1,110 wins and 807 losses (.578), 57 winning seasons and 22 postseason berths.

Walk-On Makes Impact

Rarely do walk-on players make the kind of impact on teams that Greg Lewis had for St. Bonaventure last season. Lewis played in 21 games and scored 26 points. This year, Lewis has played in all six games with a season high 12 minutes against West Virginia.

Stevens, Pawlikowski Earn

Walk-On Spots

A pair of guards, junior Craig Stevens and freshman Jason Pawlikowski, have earned roster spots as walk-ons. Stevens, who is in his second year on the team, played in the closing seconds of the Bonnies' Dec. 1 game at Syracuse, which is just a short distance from his hometown of Oneida, N.Y. Pawlikowski was an All-Western New York point guard last year at St. Mary's High School in suburban Buffalo.

Bonnies Sign 6-10 Center in Early Period

Nov. 10, St. Bonaventure signed 6-10 forward **David Fox** to a National Letter of Intent. A native of Lakewood, Ohio, and a graduate of Lakewood High School, Fox is in his sophomore year at Mercyhurst North East Junior College in North East, Pa. Last year, Fox averaged eight points and 5.5 rebounds per game for a 23-6 team that finished 10th in the NJCAA Div. II poll.

Relph, Williams Wait In Wings

A pair of transfer student-athletes, 6-0 guard **Tyler Relph** and 6-10 forward Paul

Williams, are practicing with the Bonnies this year and will be eligible at the start of the 2005-06 season. A sophomore, Relph will have three years of eligibility. Last season, he attended West Virginia, where he played in all 31 of the Mountaineers' games and averaged 5.0 points, 0.9 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 0.7 steals per game. A graduate of McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester, N.Y., Relph was named "Mr. Basketball" for the state of New York following his senior season of 2002-03, when McQuaid won the state championship. The *Rochester Democrat & Chronicle* twice named Relph its Greater Rochester Player of the Year. Williams played at Siena the past two seasons. As a sophomore, he averaged 2.6 points and 2.6 rebounds over 22 games. His freshman season, Williams averaged 3.2 points and 2.7 rebounds over 32 games and helped the Saints reach the second round of the NIT. Williams attended St. Patrick's High School in northern New Jersey, and his senior year, he was named "Best Big Man" in the state of New Jersey by the high school coaches association and was a first team All-State selection. Williams will have two seasons of eligibility at St. Bonaventure.

Mungar Among St. Bonaventure Hall of Fame Class of 2005

Former basketball standout **Barry Mungar '86** is one of three former student-athletes who will be inducted into the St. Bonaventure Athletics Hall of Fame on Jan. 8. Mungar, a 6-foot-8 forward, was known as a tenacious interior player. Mungar ranks among the top 20 players in school history in both scoring and rebounding. Owner of 1,361 points and 651 rebounds over his career, the 6-foot-8 native of Toronto, Canada, helped St. Bonaventure to 67 victories over his four seasons, including an NIT berth in 1983. Mungar was an honorable mention All-East selection in his sophomore season. As a senior in 1985-86, he made the First Team All-Atlantic 10 when he averaged 17.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Following his graduation, Mungar was selected by the Washington Bullets in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft. He later earned a spot on the 1988 Canadian Olympic Team. Today, Mungar is an officer in the Hamilton (Ont.) Wentworth Regional Police. Christine Agresta '87 (basketball) and Garvin Ferguson '90 (swimming) will join Mungar in the Class of 2005.
