The Game At A Glance

St. Bonaventure returns to Rochester to face the darlings of last year's NCAA Tournament, the West Virginia Mountaineers.

This is the 16th time that St. Bonaventure will play in Rochester and the fourth time in the last six seasons (see more on p. 3).

Led by seniors Ahmad Smith and Patrick Lottin and a revamped supporting cast, the Bonnies bring a new energy and a dramatically improved team from last season. A convincing win over Canisius on Saturday gave St. Bonaventure a 2-1 record. One player that fans will have to wait to see is Rochester native Tyler Relph. The Bonnies' guard, who led McQuaid High School to a state title in 2003 and played at (ironically) West Virginia before transferring to St. Bonaventure, is out indefinitely due to a stress fracture in his left foot.

While West Virginia has lost three straight after a 2-0 start to fall out of the national rankings, the Mountaineers feature experience and one of the nation's most respected coaches in John Beilein. They also feature senior forward Mike Gansey, who played for St. Bonaventure for two seasons (2001-03) before transferring. The sharpshooting Mountaineers average over 10 three-pointers per game.

A slow start cost St. Bonaventure a legitimate chance at its first win. The unbeaten Mountaineers jumped out to a 33-16 lead by halftime. The Bonnies clawed back with a stronger second half performance but still could not come any closer than 11 points. Ahmad Smith posted the first double-double of his career with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Rebounding was a bright spot; St. Bona enjoyed a 41-32 edge.

Scouting West Virginia

The Mountaineers have lost three games in a row although all three were to well-respected opponents - #2 Texas, #10 Kentucky and LSU. The latter came on Saturday at home and in overtime by a 71-68 score. West Virginia was ranked 13th in both of the national polls but fell out of the Top 25 following those losses. Former Bonnie Mike Gansey, now a senior, leads West Virginia in scoring at 18.8 points per game followed by senior forward Kevin Pittsnogle at 16.2. The Mountaineers rely on their zone defense, a staple of Coach John Beilein's system, to create turnovers. Guards Joe Herber (8.8 ppg) and Frank Young (8.6 ppg) are also veteran leaders for the Mountaineers.

Last Game Recap

Saturday at the Reilly Center, St. Bonaventure used solid defense and a combined 52 points from Ahmad Smith and Patrick Lottin to post a 77-55 win over Canisius. A 10-2 run to open the second half gave the Bonnies a 50-35 lead and they were in control from there. St. Bonaventure limited Canisius to 37 percent shooting for the game including 28 percent in the second half. Smith set a career high with his 30 points and recorded his second double-double of the year, while Lottin added 22 points.

St. Bonaventure Basketball in Rochester

This is the 16th time that St. Bonaventure will play in Rochester and the fourth time in the last six seasons. The Bonnies have a record of 8-7 in Rochester. They have lost their last two games at Blue Cross Arena including an 87-78 setback to defending national champion Syracuse on Dec. 3, 2003. Former Roommates Smith, Gansey Set The Standard

St. Bonaventure guard **Ahmad Smith** and West Virginia forward **Mike Gansey** are both off to fantastic starts to their senior seasons. Both lead their teams in scoring and in rebounding. Both are about 6-foot-5. What's more, they used to be roommates. When Gansey was a sophomore and Smith was a freshman at St. Bonaventure, they roomed together while on team road trips. While Gansey left St. Bonaventure after the 2002-03 season, he and Smith remain friends and talk often.

Smith Off To Super Start

Senior guard Ahmad Smith has picked up where he left off last season - and then some. Through three games, Smith is averaging team highs of 21.3 points and 8.7 rebounds per game. He already has two double-doubles (30/10 vs. Canisius and 11/10 vs. Robert Morris). Smith was named to the Atlantic 10's preseason All-Conference Second Team in voting of the A-10 coaches and media. Last year, Smith was a third team All-Atlantic 10 selection when he was the only A-10 player who ranked in the top 10 in the conference in 2004-05 in the three major statistical categories: scoring (8th), rebounding (10th) and assists (9th). At a strong 6-foot-5 and 210 pounds and with the skill of a point guard, Smith is capable of playing just about any position on the floor. Hawkins Named A-10 Rookie of the Week, Starts Career Well

Freshman guard **A.J. Hawkins** was named the Atlantic 10 Conference men's basketball Rookie of the Week for the period ending Nov. 19. The 6-foot-5 Hawkins has enjoyed a solid start to his college career. In the Bonnies' season-opening, 80-61 win over Robert Morris last Friday. He totaled 12 points, four rebounds and two assists in 33 minutes of action. Hawkins followed that with two more solid efforts and is averaging 10.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.0 steals.

Help Wanted: Rebounding

One unspoken goal for this team is surely to have a player other than **Ahmad Smith** lead the club in rebounding. The 6-5 Smith has been the Bonnies'

top rebounder each of the past two seasons at 5.9 and 6.2 rpg, respectively. Coach Anthony Solomon has preached that the Bonnies' -4.6 rebound margin from last season must swing the other way. The Bonnies added three 6-foot-10 players this season in juniors **Paul Williams, David Fox** and **Ivan Kovacevic**. Sophomore **Michael Lee** is also expected to increase his season average of 3.2 rpg from last year. Senior **Patrick Lottin** (4.3 rpg last season) is also a very capable rebounder.

Lottin From Long Range

Senior forward **Patrick Lottin** shot 35 percent from three-point range last season to rank 10th in the Atlantic 10 in that category, but no one could have predicted the kind of shooting he would display to start this season. Through three games, Lottin is 13-21 (.619) from three-point range. He made seven three-pointers in the season-opener and followed that with three more in each of the past two games.

Lottin has 140 three-point field goals in his career, good for sixth place on St. Bonaventure's career three-pointers list: St. Bona Career Three-Point Field Goals

Lottin In His Fifth Season

Senior forward **Patrick Lottin** is in his fifth season at St. Bonaventure. The "veteran" of the roster in terms of both experience and age, Lottin is 24 years old. His career has been marked by two major injuries that cost him most of one season and limited his effectiveness in others. Lottin received a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA for the 2001-02 season after he suffered a ruptured Achilles tendon in a game at Alabama. Lottin suffered a second major injury in April 2004, when he tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee. He underwent reconstructive surgery, returning in time for last season but playing at less than 100 percent.

"I am anxious to play a season at full strength," Lottin said. "I'm confident that we are headed in the right direction here and that I can help us keep building."

"Patrick has been productive the past two seasons even though he has endured two major injuries that forced him to spend two entire summers doing nothing but rehabilitation," Bonnies coach Anthony Solomon said. "I am optimistic that he can play at an even higher level after a full off-season of preparation."

Expectations, Strength On The Increase For Lee

Last season as a freshman, Michael Lee finished fourth on the team in scoring at 6.6 points per game, but the last three games of the year were a glimpse of why expectations for the lanky forward are so high. Lee averaged 16.6 points and 5.0 rebounds over the final three games, leading the Bonnies in scoring twice during that stretch. While many people have voiced concerns about his strength and weight, Lee has worked diligently to gain the strength needed to compete in the Atlantic 10. Bonnies strength and conditioning coach Darryn Fiske said that Lee now is able to bench press 250 lbs. as compared to only 130 lbs. when Lee first arrived on campus. Lee also has improved his leg press maximum over 400 lbs. to 865 lbs., and his vertical leap is 38-1/2 inches, an increase of over four inches since the start of his freshman year.

Transfers Ready To Go - Almost

Two of the new players St. Bonaventure welcomed this season are center Paul Williams and guard Tyler Relph, who sat out the 2004-05 season as transfer student-athletes. Relph will have to wait a bit longer to make his debut, as he is sidelined indefinitely due to a stress fracture in his left foot. The former New York State Player of the Year played at West Virginia in 2003-04 before transferring closer to his home city of Rochester. Williams debuted as the Bonnies' starting center. He played two seasons as a reserve at Siena College.

Diggs Making Strong Debut At The Point

Junior Terron Diggs, who is a newcomer to St. Bonaventure, has made quite an impression to open the year as the Bonnies' starting point guard. Through the first three games, Diggs has 17 assists and just two turnovers, both of which came in the Canisius game. Diggs signed with St. Bonaventure last spring out of Tallahassee (Fla.) Community College, where he played for two seasons. A native of Fairfax, Va., Diggs was familiar with St. Bonaventure through current Bonnies Ahmad Smith and Wade Dunston, who he knew of from their high school and summer league days. Smith and Diggs went head-to-head in high school when each played for Washington Catholic Athletic Conference teams, Smith for Bishop O'Connell and Diggs at St. Paul VI.

Smith, Lottin Move Toward 1,000 Points

Seniors Ahmad Smith and Patrick Lottin are well within reach of 1,000 career points - Smith needs 105 points and Lottin needs 181. There are 35 men in school history who have achieved that feat, most recently Marques Green in 2004.

Number Changes

Due to a delay in production of new Nike uniforms, St. Bonaventure will wear its old adidas uniforms for the first several games this season. Due to that, two players will be wearing different uniform numbers than they will the remainder of the season: A.J. Hawkins (25) is wearing 20 while Jeff Foote (40) is wearing 35.

Plenty of Offense Back

Although only five players returned from last season's roster, they were five of the team's top six scorers last season, accounting for 77 percent (1,325 out of 1,718 points) of the Bonnies' offense. Three double-figure scorers are back: Ahmad Smith (14.2), Wade Dunston (11.6) and Patrick Lottin (10.8).

St. Bonaventure has seven new scholarship players on its roster: forwards Paul Williams, David Fox and Ivan Kovacevic, swingmen A.J. Hawkins and Tyler Benson and guards Tyler Relph and Terron Diggs. Five players returned from last season: guards Ahmad Smith, Wade Dunston and Isiah Carson and forwards Patrick Lottin and Michael Lee. Freshmen Jeff Foote and Perry King made the team as walk-ons.

Bonnies Ink Two in Fall Signing Period

Nov. 9, St. Bonaventure announced that forward **Jourdan Morris** and guard **James Williams** both signed National Letters of Intent on the first day of the NCAA early signing period.

"We are ecstatic to have both Jourdan and James join us," Solomon said. "One goal this year was to have several commitments in the fall before the season began and that has been accomplished. That is growth for us as a program."

The 6-foot-6, 215-lb. Morris, who is from Bowie, Md., is in his senior season at Eleanor Roosevelt High School. Last season, he played at Montrose Christian High School and averaged 12 points and six rebounds per game. Over the summer, Morris transferred back to Roosevelt High, where he played his freshman and sophomore seasons. Recently, he was named Most Valuable Player of the Riverdale Baptist Fall League. Morris was recently listed as one of the top 24 senior prospects in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area by the *Washington Post*.

"Jourdan comes from a rich high school tradition at Eleanor Roosevelt," Bonnies coach Anthony Solomon said. "We value versatility at the forward positions and Jourdan certainly fits that criteria. His size, strength and skills will be an asset for us when Patrick Lottin departs our team."

Williams is a sophomore at Cloud County Community College in Kansas where he plays for head coach Kevin Muff. A 6-foot-5, 200-lb. guard, he averaged 9.0 points, 3.8 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.1 steals per game last season. A native of Topeka, Kan., Williams attended Highland Park High School and led that school to a state championship as a senior.

"James is a much-needed signee for us since we will lose Ahmad Smith and Wade Dunston next season," Solomon said. "James' versatile and heady play attracted us to him. Leading his high school team to a state championship as the lone senior that season says as much about James the person as it does James the basketball player. His winning qualities as a player and as a person will be a welcome addition."

St. Bonaventure will lose three seniors to graduation next spring – Smith, Lottin and Dunston.
