At A Glance

St. Bonaventure will look to rebound from its first loss of the season as it welcomes Canisius to the Reilly Center. Today marks the 36th meeting between the two clubs despite playing each other just two times in the last five years. The Bonnies have won nine of the last 11 contests and both meetings under the tutelage of head coach Jim Crowley, including last year's 81-64 win at the St. Bona Shootout. The Golden Griffins own a 19-16 advantage in the all-time series.

Last Time Out: Kent St. hands Bonnies their first loss

Kent State handed St. Bonaventure its first loss of the season, 81-59, on Saturday afternoon at the Reilly Center. The loss ended the best start in the program's 34 year history and dropped the Bonnies to 5-1. The Golden Flashes looked right at home at the RC, connecting on 52 percent (27-52) of their shots from the field and 69 percent (11-16) from long range. **Stefanie Collins** led St. Bonaventure with 14 points, two assists and three steals. Junior forward **Audrey Latendresse** was the only other Bonnies player in double-figures, with 12 points.

Climbing the Charts

Senior guard **Stefanie Collins** continues her climb up the St. Bonaventure career scoring list. With her 14 points against Kent St., Collins became just the eighth player in school history to break the 1,200-point plateau. She now trails '03 graduate and current Bonnies assistant coach **Courtney Mattingly** by 43 points for seventh position.

Bombs Away

With plenty of deadly outside shooters, led by senior **Stefanie Collins**, St. Bonaventure has made the art of three-point shooting look easy. The brown and white currently lead the Atlantic 10 in both three-point percentage and long range field goals per game. The Bonnies .460 three-point percentage and 7.7 threes per game rank second and 10th nationally, respectively. One of the most prolific shooters in the country, Collins leads the nation in three-pointers per game (4.2) and is 12th in percentage (.521).

From Downtown

Senior **Stefanie Collins** continues to prove that she is one of the best shooters in the nation. She has knocked down 25 of her 48 (.521) shots from beyond the arc this season and leads the nation with 4.2 threes per contest. Collins drained 77 long range shots last season, 75 three-pointers as a sophomore and 63 in her freshman campaign. Her 25 three-pointers this season brings her career total to 240, which stands second in school history to Suzie Dailer's 294. Collins tied the school record for three-pointers in a game (8) twice last season.

Inside Out

Junior post player **Audrey Latendresse** has opposing defenses scratching their heads as she has shown there is more to her game than battling inside. Latendresse has developed a deadly shooting touch from the outside and has drained 22 of her last 38 shots (58 percent) from beyond the arc dating back to last season. On the season, Latendresse is 10-22 from three-point range.

Picking Up Where She Left Off

After averaging 8.6 points over the final 11 games of last season, sophomore **Priscilla Edwards** has picked up right where she left of last season. The Harlem, N.Y. native ranks second on the team with 10.7 points per game and averages 4.2 rebounds and a team-high 2.7 assists per game. Edwards has posted double-digit points in four games this season, including a career-high 15 against Cleveland St.

I.D., Please

Despite being the youngest two players on the Bonnies' roster, freshmen **Erica Schiefen** and **Katelyn Murray** have

shown they're ready to play big minutes. Through five games this season, the 18 year-old duo has combined to average 10.6 points and four rebounds per game. Against Niagara, Murray drained four threes en route to a season-high 12 points, while Schiefen tallied six points and four assists to spark the comeback win. Schiefen leads the team in field goal percentage (.520) and offensive rebounds (11).

Welcome Back

After missing the entire 2004-05 season with a shoulder injury, redshirt freshman **Ashley Edwards** is finally getting to showcase her abilities on the court. The Philadelphia, Pa. native turned in her best performance of the young season at St. Francis (Pa.), tallying 12 points, seven rebounds and three steals. So far this season, Edwards is averaging 6.2 points per game and 5.8 boards. Her 4.3 defensive rebounds per game rank 14th in the A-10.

Sensational Southpaws

Having two left-handers on the court at the same time is somewhat odd ... but three! The Bonnies lineup features three southpaws who all play over 20 minutes each game: **Stefanie Collins**, **Priscilla Edwards** and **Erica Schiefen**. The left-handed trio has combined to score 54 percent (33 points) of the team's points each game with Collins leading the way at 17.0 per contest.

DE-FENSE!

Despite being undersized, the Bonnies have used hustle and quickness on the defensive end to stymie their opponents offensive schemes. For the first time in 17 years (1987-88), St. Bonaventure held three straight opponents (Albany-49, St. Francis-45, Cleveland St.-49) to under 50 points. The Bonnies are limiting opponents to 56.7 points per game, a figure that ranks third in the A-10 and 43rd nationally. A key attribute to their success on the defensive end has been their ability to create turnovers. The brown and white defense has been able to force opponents into an average of 19.2 turnovers a game, while collecting 9.0 steals per contest.

Lights Out

After playing three games at the RC, one on the road and two at a neutral arena, St. Bonaventure has proven they can flat out shoot no matter what rim their aiming at. The Bonnies lead the conference in three-point percentage and long

range makes per contest with both ranking in the top 10 in the nation. The brown and white have also cashed in at the charity stripe. St. Bonaventure's 75 percent (73-97) mark from the free throw line ranks 32nd nationally and second in the A-10.

Early Season Hardware

For the second consecutive season, senior **Stefanie Collins** and junior **Audrey Latendresse** were named to the St. Bona Shootout All-Tournament team. Collins earned MVP honors after tallying 33 points in the two Bona wins, while Latendresse hit for 14 points on 3-5 shooting from long range against Cornell.

Bonnies Ink Three NLI's in Early Signing Period

Head coach Jim Crowley and the Bonnies inked three student-athletes to NLI's during the early signing period.

Andrea Doneth (East Lansing, Mich./Lansing Catholic), **Dana Mitchell** (Fairless, Pa./Pennsbury West) and **Julie Molloy** (Grove City, Pa./Grove City) will join the Bonnies beginning in the 2006-07 season.

A McDonald's All-American nominee, Doneth is currently averaging 18 points, seven rebounds and six assists per game thus far in her senior campaign. This season, she has guided Lansing Catholic to a 17-3 record and a spot in the Capital Area Athletic Conference playoffs. A two-time Associated Press Class B All-State first team selection, the 5-foot-11 Doneth has led the Cougars to a 64-10 record in her three seasons. As a junior, she averaged 14.6 points, 5.9 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game. Coached by her father Dan Doneth, she was named to the Lansing State Mid-Michigan Dream Team and Detroit Free Press Class B All-State team in both her junior and sophomore seasons.

The 6-foot-1 Mitchell averaged 20.8 points, 9.7 rebounds, 4.2 steals and three assists per game in her junior campaign at Pennsbury West. Under the tutelage of head coach Donna Nicholson, she helped guide the Falcons to 17-9 record last season, their best record since 2000. Her 20.8 points per game led the conference and earned her a spot on the Suburban League first team. A four-year starter, Mitchell has 1,011 career points and was the first player in school history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau as a junior.

A three-year starter at point guard for Grove City High School, Molloy averaged 14.2 points per game in her junior year. Coached by Roger Flynn, last season she led the Lady Eagles to a 15-9 record and a berth in the Mercer County Athletic Conference playoffs. As a junior she drained 47 three-pointers and dished out 80 assists en route to her second consecutive MCAC All-Conference first team selection. The 5-foot-9 guard was also named to the Butler County All-Star team and MVP of the Kiser Classic as a junior.

Bonnies claim St. Bona Shootout Title!

In a game it never trailed, St. Bonaventure posted a 59-49 win over Albany in the championship game of the second annual St. Bonaventure Shootout on Nov. 20 at First Arena in Elmira, N.Y. The Bonnies jumped out to a 31-22 lead at the half, holding Albany to 31 percent shooting. Three players reached double-digits on the afternoon. Senior **Stefanie Collins** led the way with 12 points, while freshman **Katelyn Murray** and redshirt freshman **Ashley Edwards** chipped in with 11 and 10 points, respectively.

Oh Canada

The Bonnies have three players from Canada on their roster: senior **Olecia Miller**, junior **Audrey Latendresse** and sophomore **Maripier Malo**. Only five in NCAA Division I women's basketball teams have more Canadian players.

Collins named to Preseason All-Conference first team

Senior **Stefanie Collins** was named to the Preseason Atlantic 10 All-Conference first team, in a voting done by the league coaches and media. Last season, Collins was named to the third team All-Conference after averaging 13.8 points and 3.0 rebounds per game. Collins led the A-10 in three-pointers made per game (2.8) and ranked 10th in steals (1.7).

Record Breaking Day

In their opening game at the St. Bona Shootout, a record breaking 1,820 fans turned out to see the Bonnies triumph over Cornell in the first round. It broke the previous attendance record of 1,741 set last season against Massachusetts.

Mattingly, Fleming join Bona staff

St. Bonaventure alums Courtney Mattingly '03 and Jesse Fleming '05 returned back to St. Bonaventure this summer to join the women's basketball coaching staff.

Mattingly was an assistant coach at Bowdoin (Maine) College last year. She helped Bowdoin to a 26-3 record, the New England Small College Athletic Conference championship and a berth in the NCAA Division III elite eight. Prior to joining the Bowdoin staff, Mattingly spent one year as a graduate assistant coach at Ithaca College. She helped the Bombers to an NCAA Div. III playoff berth, the Empire 8 Conference title and a 23-4 record. Mattingly will complete a master's degree in Exercise and Sport Science at Ithaca this summer.

As a player under Crowley, Mattingly was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference team as a junior in 2001-02 and

to the Academic All-Conference team both her junior and senior seasons. She ranks in the top 10 on St. Bonaventure's all-time list in points (seventh with 1,256), rebounds (seventh with 585) and assists (eighth with 300).

Fleming served as the Bonnies' coaching staff assistant for the past four seasons, adding the coaching staff with all aspects of the program's management.

Fleming was an assistant at Louisburg (North Carolina) College this past summer. During his time there, he was in charge of recruiting and on-floor coaching during preseason workouts. Last season, Fleming also served as an assistant coach at Olean High School. At Olean, he was in charge of film break down, opponent scouting and individual workouts with several players. He helped the Huskies to an 11-1 mark in CCIAC play and second-place finish in the sectional tournament.

In his five years at the helm, head coach Jim Crowley has installed a coaching style of hard work and determination that has raised the level of expectations for women's basketball at St. Bonaventure.

Crowley's ambition, drive and vision has allowed him to assembled competitive teams while carrying on the values established by his predecessor, Marti Whitmore.

Crowley's 2001-02 club won six more games than his first team did, going 13-15 overall and 7-9 in the competitive Atlantic 10 Conference. Three of his 13 wins came over NCAA bound teams. Crowley demonstrated his flexibility as a coach that season, adopting a defense-first philosophy after using a run-and-gun style his first season.

A rash of injuries, including a season-ending knee injury to 2001-02 Atlantic 10 Conference Rookie of the Year Stefanie Collins and a back injury that cut short the year for second-leading scorer Lyndsey Maurer, led to a disappointing 6-22 mark in 2002-03.

In 2003-04, the return of Collins helped the Bonnies improve by three wins overall and finish fourth in the Atlantic 10's East division. Crowley guided St. Bonaventure to an impressive 69-65 win over Marquette, who later advanced to the NCAA tournament.

Last season, Crowley and the Bonnies welcomed eight new faces to the roster. On Jan. 16, Crowley guided the new-look Bonnies to their first win in 10 years at Saint Joseph's Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. The brown and white finished last season with a 9-19 record.

This past off-season, Crowley guided the Western New York open division women's basketball team to a bronze medal at the Empire State Games. Sophomore Amanda Pierce joined Crowley on the Western New York team that returned just three

players from the previous year.

Renowned for his work ethic, Crowley's players follow their coach's example on and off the court.

Under Crowley's guidance, players like Courtney Mattingly and Collins made dramatic improvements and blossomed into All-Conference players. Mattingly was a second team All-Atlantic 10 choice as a junior and twice was named to the Atlantic 10's Academic All-Conference team. Collins has followed suit, being named to the All-Conference and All-Academic teams in each of the past two seasons.

The academic success of Crowley's teams is also noteworthy. Each of Crowley's teams have posted better than a 3.0 team grade point average, and he has had three players named to the Academic All-Conference team.

Crowley has now been a part of St. Bonaventure women's basketball since 1996. Prior to being named head coach in March of 2000, he served as an assistant coach for four seasons.
