NINTH-SEEDED ST. JOHN'S HOSTS BROWN IN NCAA TOURNAMENT SECOND ROUND

- Playing as a national seed for the eighth time in 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, ninth-seeded St. John's (14-6-2), which earned an automatic bid after winning its conference-best ninth BIG EAST Tournament crown, comes off its First Round bye to open tournament play with a Second Round matchup against Brown (11-4-3).
- The No. 11/7 ranked Red Storm hosts the Bears at 5 p.m. on Nov. 20.
- St. John's, which won the 1996 NCAA National Championship and has been to four NCAA College Cups (2008, 2003, 2001 and 1996), is 25-16-1 (.607) all-time in NCAA Tournament play, including a 17-5-1 record (.761) at home.
- St. John's posted a 3-0-1 record against Ivy League teams this season, including a 2-0-1 record at home. The Red Storm defeated both Harvard (Sept. 9) and Yale (Sept. 11) by 2-0 margins, won 3-2 in double overtime at Princeton (Sept. 28) and played to a scoreless draw against Brown (Oct. 4).
- The Red Storm is 7-1-2 this season at Belson Stadium, outscoring its opponents 15-5 and posting just a 0.46 goals against average.
- St. John's is 7-0-0 this season when leading at the half and 13-1-0 when scoring first.

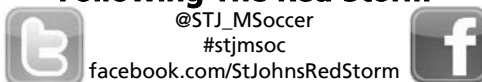

Named after both Maxine and her husband, Jerome Belson, a member of the University Board of Trustees and St. John's Law School graduate, the stadium was funded by a multi-million dollar gift from the Belsons and dedicated on Sept. 21, 2002.

INSIDE THE SERIES WITH BROWN

- This will be the 8th meeting in an all-time series that dates back to 1997.
- St. John's leads the series 4-1-2, including an 0-0-2 record at Belson Stadium.
- The Red Storm won the first four meetings in the series and was unbeaten (4-0-1) in the first five before a 1-0 Brown win on Oct. 5, 2010.
- The teams played to a 0-0 tie earlier this season on Oct. 4, 2011.
- St. John's is 2-0-0 against Brown in NCAA Tournament play, including wins in both 1997 and 1998.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

- Brown is 11-4-3 on the season after defeating No. 25 Fairfield, 3-2, in the NCAA Tournament First Round. The Bears are on a nine-game unbeaten streak (6-0-3) since a 2-1 loss to Columbia on Oct. 1.
- All-Ivy League honorable mention TJ Popolizio leads the offense with eight goals, including four game-winners, and three assists.
- Sean Rosa, a second team All-Ivy League honoree, has five goals and four assists, while Austin Mandel has three goals, including two game-winners, and one assist.
- Sam Kernan-Schloss is 8-2-3 in 13 starts this season and has eight shutouts, a 0.65 goals against average and an .827 save percentage.

BENNETT NABS BIG EAST TOURNAMENT MOST OUTSTANDING OFFENSIVE PLAYER HONORS

- Jack Bennett was named the BIG EAST Most Outstanding Offensive Player after leading St. John's to its ninth tournament crown.

LADE GARNERS BIG EAST TOURNAMENT MOST OUTSTANDING DEFENSIVE PLAYER HONORS

- Second team All-BIG EAST selection Connor Lade was named the BIG EAST Tournament Most Outstanding Defensive Player after anchoring the St. John's defense in a pair of shutout wins in the Semifinals and Finals.
- A two-time BIG EAST All-Tournament selection (2009, 2011), Lade and the defense allowed only four shots on goal against Villanova (Nov.11) before surrendering just one shot on goal against Connecticut (Nov. 13).
- Lade and the defense helped St. John's conclude its four-game tournament run with three-consecutive shutouts.

FIVE PLAYERS NAMED TO BIG EAST ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

- After capturing a conference-best ninth BIG EAST Tournament crown, St. John's had a total of five players named to the All-Tournament Team.
- Jack Bennett, Walter Hines, Connor Lade, Ido Ligety and Alex Naples all earned spots on the team after a pair of shutout wins against Villanova (Nov. 11) in the Semifinals and then-No. 3 Connecticut (Nov. 13) in the Finals.

- St. John's played Notre Dame to a scoreless draw in the 2009 Finals, but took the crown with a 5-3 PK shootout win.

BENNETT NETS GOLDEN GOAL IN FINALS WIN AGAINST UCONN FOR FIFTH GAME-WINNER

- Jack Bennett tallied his fifth game-winner of the season, the golden goal, in the 97th minute of a 1-0 win against then-No. 3 Connecticut (Nov. 13) in the BIG EAST Tournament Finals.
- The five game-winners are the most in a season since Nelson Becerra also tallied five in 2008.
- Bennett has now scored or assisted on a total of 10 game-winning goals this season (5g, 5a).

NAPLES RECORDS THIRD-STRAIGHT BIG EAST TOURNAMENT SHUTOUT

- Alex Naples posted his third-consecutive shutout in BIG EAST Tournament play, recording one save in a 1-0 overtime win against then-No. 3 Connecticut in the Finals (Nov. 13).
- The redshirt sophomore, who has won four-straight decisions, improved his record to 4-2-1 on the season.

HINES NETS WINNER FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT GAME IN SEMIFINAL WIN AGAINST VILLANOVA

- Walter Hines scored the game-winner for the second-straight game to lead St. John's to a 2-0 win against Villanova in the BIG EAST Tournament Semifinals (Nov. 11).
- Hines, who previously netted the winner in a 2-0 Quarterfinal win against then-No. 23 West Virginia, is the second player to score back-to-back game-winners this season.
- Jack Bennett was the first Red Storm player to accomplish the feat, notching the game-winners against both then-No. 8 William & Mary (Sept. 1) and Boston University (Sept. 3).

BENNETT REGISTERS GAME-WINNING ASSIST FOR THIRD-STRAIGHT GAME AS PART OF FIRST-CAREER MULTI ASSIST PERFORMANCE

- Jack Bennett tallied the assist on the game-winning goal for the third-consecutive game in a 2-0 BIG EAST Semifinal win against Villanova (Nov. 11).
- Bennett finished the game with two assists to also record his first-career multi-assist game.
- The midfielder has now scored or assisted on a total of nine game-winning goals this season (4g, 5a).

BATTUTO PUNYED EARNS BIG EAST CO-MIDFIELDER OF THE YEAR AWARD AS FOUR PLAYERS EARN ALL-CONFERENCE ACCOLADES

- Senior Pablo Battuto Punyed was named the BIG EAST Co-Midfielder of the Year and also took home first team All-BIG EAST honors to headline a total of four players that earned All-Conference accolades.
- Battuto Punyed became the fourth St. John's player to earn top midfielder honors since the award was first presented in 2000. The senior joins Nelson Becerra (2008), Matia Damiani (2003) and Jeff Matteo (2001) as the Red Storm's all-time selections.
- The midfielder, who has four goals and a career-high three assists this season, gives St. John's at least one first team honoree for the fourth-straight season.
- A third team selection in 2010, Connor Lade earned second team honors after anchoring a defensive unit that posted eight shutouts in the regular season.
- Walter Hines was named to the third team after finishing the regular season with career-highs in both goals (4) and points (9).
- Tim Parker, meanwhile, was named to the All-Rookie team after tallying one assist and helping the defense post eight shutouts in regular season action.

LIGETY EARNS COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT FIRST TEAM ACCOLADES

- Senior defender/midfielder Ido Ligety has earned Capital One Academic All-District first team honors as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).
- The accounting major with a 3.80 GPA made his Division I debut this season and has appeared in 18 games, including 13 starts.
- Ligety has also tallied two goals, including the game-winner for his first-career goal in a win against Yale (Sept. 9).

HINES BECOMES EIGHTH PLAYER TO NET WINNER WITH GOAL AGAINST WEST VIRGINIA

- Walter Hines became the eighth different player to tally a game-winning goal this season in a 2-0 win against then-No. 23 West Virginia (Nov. 6) in the BIG EAST Tournament Quarterfinals.
- The goal marked the fourth-career game-winner for the forward and first since Oct. 23, 2010 in a win against DePaul.

BENNETT ASSISTS ON GAME-WINNER FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT POSTSEASON GAME

- Jack Bennett assisted on the game-winning goal for the second-consecutive post-season game in a 2-0 win against then-No. 23 West Virginia (Nov. 6) in the BIG EAST Tournament Quarterfinals.
- Bennett also assisted on the game-winner in a 2-1 win against Georgetown (Nov. 3) in First Round action.
- The midfielder has now scored or assisted on a total of eight game-winning goals this season (4g, 4a).

PARKER NETS WINNER AGAINST HOYAS FOR FIRST-CAREER GOAL IN BIG EAST TOURNAMENT DEBUT

- Freshman Tim Parker scored his first-career goal, the game-winner, in his BIG EAST Tournament debut, a 2-1 win against Georgetown (Nov. 3) in First Round action.
- Parker, who assisted on the game-winner

against Yale (Sept. 11) for his first-career point, broke a 1-1 tie with the Hoyas in the 50th minute after an assist from Jack Bennett.

BENNETT ADDS THIRD GAME-WINNING ASSIST IN BIG EAST TOURNEY WIN AGAINST GEORGETOWN

- Jack Bennett set up the game-winning goal for the third time this season in a 2-1 win against Georgetown (Nov. 3) in the BIG EAST Tournament First Round.
- The midfielder, who assisted on the game-winners against Louisville (Oct. 15) and Syracuse (Oct. 12), has also racked up four game-winning goals this season.

NAPLES EARNS FIRST-CAREER WIN IN BIG EAST TOURNAMENT DEBUT

- Redshirt sophomore Alex Naples earned his first-career win in his BIG EAST Tournament debut, a 2-1 First Round win against Georgetown (Nov. 3).
- Naples, who was making his fourth-career start, made two saves to improve his record to 1-2-1.

MASUR COLLECTS 300TH VICTORY AT ST. JOHN'S

- Head coach Dr. Dave Masur reached his second coaching milestone this season, earning his 300th win at St. John's with a 4-2 triumph against DePaul (Oct. 22).
- Masur, who spent four seasons at the helm of Montclair State (1987-90), picked up the 350th win of his collegiate coaching career earlier this season with a 2-1 double overtime win against Notre Dame (Oct. 1).

STAGMILLER EARNS WIN OFF THE BENCH IN COLLEGIATE-DEBUT

- Freshman goalkeeper Jordan Stagmiller made his collegiate debut against DePaul (Oct. 22), replacing injured starter Rafael Diaz and playing the final 87:38 of a 4-2 win.
- Stagmiller made three saves in the contest, including two in the second half, to pick up his first-career win.

DE HOOP CONVERTS PK TO BECOME SIXTH PLAYER TO SCORE A GAME-WINNER

- Bjorn de Hoop converted a penalty kick in the 66th minute of a 4-2 win against DePaul (Oct. 22) to become the sixth different player to tally a game-winning goal this season.
- The goal marked the second-career game-winner for de Hoop, who also converted a penalty kick for the golden goal in a 1-0 double overtime win at Marquette on Sept. 21, 2008.

LADE EARNS SECOND BIG EAST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK NOD

- After anchoring a defensive unit that helped St. John's to a pair of conference wins, including a 1-0 win against then-No. 10/9 Louisville, Connor Lade has been named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week for the second time this season.
- The senior, who was one of just two players with a pair of Defensive Player of the Week honors in 2010, becomes the first player in the conference to earn the honor twice this season.
- Lade led a backline that surrendered just one goal and allowed a combined eight shots on goal in wins against the Orange (Oct. 12) and the Cardinals (Oct. 15).
- After limiting Syracuse to four shots on goal in a 2-1 win, Lade and the defense held a Louisville team that entered the night averaging 19.1 shots per game to just seven shots, four on net, in a 1-0 win.

BATTUTO PUNYED TALLIES FOURTH-CAREER GAME-WINNER IN WIN AGAINST NO. 9 LOUISVILLE

- Pablo Battuto Punyed tallied his second game-winner of the season, and the fourth of his career, in a 1-0 win against then-No. 9 Louisville (Oct. 15).
- The game-winner was the second in the past six games for Battuto Punyed, who also netted a golden goal in a 3-2 win at Princeton (Sept. 28).
- The two game-winning goals tie a season-high for the senior, who also tallied two winners as a junior in 2010.

L'ESPERANCE BECOMES FIFTH PLAYER TO TALLY A GAME-WINNER

- Adrian L'Esperance notched the game-winner in the 83rd minute of a 2-1 win at Syracuse (Oct. 12) to become the fifth different player to tally a winner this season.
- The winner marked the second-career game-winner for L'Esperance, who scored his first-ever winner in a 5-0 win against LIU on Sept. 19, 2010.
- L'Esperance joins Jack Bennett (4), Ido Ligety (1), Pablo Battuto Punyed (1) and Daniel Herrera (1) as the players with game-winners this season.

NAPLES POSTS SHUTOUT AGAINST BROWN IN FIRST-CAREER START

- Redshirt sophomore Alex Naples totaled four saves in a 0-0 draw against Brown (Oct. 4) to post a shutout in his first-career start.
- The start marked the fifth-career appearance for Naples, who played the final 10:45 earlier this season against Maryland (Aug. 26) and also saw action in three games in 2010 as a redshirt freshman.

HERRERA NAMED BIG EAST ROOKIE OF THE WEEK; BATTUTO PUNYED LISTED ON HONOR ROLL

- After a week that included a golden goal and an assist, Daniel Herrera was named

the BIG EAST Rookie of the Week. Pablo Battuto Punyed, who also had a golden goal and an assist, was selected to the honor roll.

- Herrera tallied his first-career goal, the golden goal, with 49 seconds remaining in a 2-1 double overtime win against then-No. 11 Notre Dame (Oct. 1). The midfielder also had an assist in a 3-2 double overtime win at Princeton (Sept. 28).
- Battuto Punyed, meanwhile, netted a golden goal with 4.2 seconds left in the 3-2 double overtime win against the Tigers and also registered an assist in the win against the Fighting Irish.

MASUR EARNS CAREER-WIN NO. 350 WITH VICTORY AGAINST NOTRE DAME

- With a 2-1 golden goal victory in double overtime against then-No. 11 Notre Dame (Oct. 1), head coach Dr. Dave Masur notched the 350th victory of his career.
- Masur, who needed just 534 games (350-113-71) to reach the milestone, has a 297-92-65 record at St. John's to go with a 53-21-6 mark at Montclair State.

ST. JOHN'S EARNS SECOND-STRAIGHT 2OT GOLDEN GOAL VICTORY

- A 2-1 golden goal victory against then-No. 11 Notre Dame (Oct. 1) gave St. John's its second-straight win in the closing minute of a double overtime contest.
- Daniel Herrera scored the golden goal against the Irish with 49 seconds remaining in the second extra session.
- The win against the Irish followed a 3-2 win against Princeton (Sept. 28) in which Pablo Battuto Punyed netted the golden goal with 4.2 seconds left in the second overtime.

FIRST-CAREER GOAL FOR HERRERA IS GOLDEN IN 2OT WIN AGAINST NO. 11 NOTRE DAME

- Redshirt freshman Daniel Herrera netted his first-career goal, the golden goal, in a 2-1 double overtime win against then-No. 11 Notre Dame (Oct. 1).
- The midfielder gave St. John's its second-straight double overtime golden goal victory, scoring with just 49 seconds left in the second extra session.

BATTUTO PUNYED NETS GOLDEN GOAL IN 2OT WIN AT PRINCETON

- Senior Pablo Battuto Punyed tallied his first goal of the season, the golden goal with 4.2 seconds remaining, in a 3-2 double overtime win at Princeton (Sept. 28).
- The tally marked the third-career game-winner for the senior, who netted a pair in 2010 to tie for the team lead.

SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED AT 647:04, THIRD-LONGEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- A goal allowed in the 74th minute against

then-No. 2 Connecticut (Sept. 24) marked the first goal allowed by St. John's in 647:04, the third-longest scoreless streak in school-history.

- The streak featured six-consecutive shutouts, one shy of tying a school-record, and included three against ranked teams.
- The school-record scoreless streak, set in 2006, stands at 673:33 and also includes a school-record seven-consecutive shutouts.

DIAZ GARNERS BIG EAST GOALKEEPER OF THE WEEK ACCOLADES

- After posting a pair of shutouts against then-No. 7 Indiana and then-No. 25 Iona to extend his run of clean sheets to six-straight, redshirt sophomore Rafael Diaz has been named the BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week.
- The six-straight shutouts tie a career-long stretch for Diaz, who first accomplished the feat in the final six games of the 2010 regular season.
- Diaz made three saves in a scoreless draw against the Hoosiers (Sept. 16), who entered the game averaging 2.8 goals per game before adding three more saves in a 2-0 win against the Gaels (Sept. 18).

BENNETT NETS FOURTH GAME-WINNER AS PART OF FIRST-CAREER MULTI-GOAL GAME

- Junior Jack Bennett netted a pair of goals, including his fourth game-winner of the season, to notch his first-career multi-goal game in a 2-0 win against Iona (Sept. 18).
- After tallying what proved to be the game-winner on an assist from Adrian L'Esperance in the 35th minute, Bennett added his second goal on an assist from Chris Lebo in the 82nd minute.
- The two-goal performance for Bennett marked the first multi-goal game for a St. John's player since John Tardy netted a pair in a 5-0 win against LIU on Sept. 19, 2010.

- Seniors Walter Hines and Connor Lade were each named to the BIG EAST weekly honor roll after helping St. John's to a pair of shutout wins.
- Hines scored a pair of goals, his first two of the season, to help pace the offense. After adding an insurance goal in the second half of a 2-0 win against Harvard (Sept. 9), the forward notched another second half goal in a 2-0 win against Yale (Sept. 11).
- Lade anchored a defense that allowed a total of just eight shots, two on goal, in two shutouts. The backline allowed three shots, zero on goal, against the Crimson and five shots, two on goal, against the Bulldogs.
