RED STORM HEADS TO GEORGETOWN FOR BIG EAST SEMIFINALS

- Following a wire-to-wire victory over Creighton in the opening round of the BIG EAST Championship, the St. John's men's soccer team will head to the nation's capital for a semifinal tilt with Georgetown on Wednesday at 1 p.m.
- A win over the Hoyas on Wednesday would put the Red Storm one step closer toward a 10th BIG EAST title, a total that is unrivaled in the history of the league. Among current schools in the conference, no one program has more than four (Seton Hall) while Connecticut ranks second among all-time league members with seven. In 54 conference tournament games scattered over 26 separate appearances, the Red Storm owns a record of 35-14-5, good enough for an all-time winning percentage of .673 that leads all BIG EAST schools with at least four tournament berths.
- The Red Storm earned a spot in the conference semifinals thanks to a tremendous effort at home on Saturday night against Creighton. The Johnnies wasted no time getting on the board, scoring twice in the first 6:53 to take a commanding two-goal lead before winning the contest by a final score of 3-1. The offensive explosion at the start of the game marked the first time in 11 years that the Red Storm tallied a pair of goals that quickly, as Patrik Ensgstrom scored at the 2:38 and 5:30 marks in a 5-2 win over Georgetown in Washington, D.C., on Sept. 10, 2006.
- Sophomore Alistair Johnston, the team's leader with six goals on the year, paced the Red Storm with two tallies against Creighton for his second brace of the season. Classmate Matt Forster added a goal and an assist while senior Harry Cooksley, who was named the BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year just one day prior, became the first St. John's player since 2010 and just the 16th Johnny in program history to register three assists in a game. Cooksley's eight assists on the campaign place him in a tie for the most by a Johnny in single season since Matt Groenwald dished out nine in 2003, a season that saw the Red Storm make its third appearance in the College Cup and Groenwald earn a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-America Team.
- In addition to Cooksley becoming the fifth player in St. John's history and the first since 2011 to take home BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year honors, fellow senior David Enstrom became the ninth Johnny and the first since 2008 to be named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year. 2017 marks just the fourth time in program history that two members of the Red Storm have taken home major individual awards from the conference in the same season. In two of the previous three instances (1993, 2003 and 2008), St. John's went on to appear in the College Cup. On top of the honors from Cooksley and Enstrom, rookie forward Jack Shearer was unanimously selected to the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team after registering three goals in conference play.

SCOUTING GEORGETOWN

- Georgetown enters the conference semifinal following a week off from action, a benefit of clinching the no. 2 seed in the tournament with a win over Creighton on the final day of the regular season.
- A mainstay in the national polls this year with a record of 12-3-2, the Hoyas sport the nation's 13th best goals against average (0.63) and are tied with St. John's for the league's top shutout total with eight.
- Offensively, the Hoyas are led by rookie sensation Derek Dodson, who was named the BIG EAST Freshman of the Year after recording eight goals and two assists on the season.
- Second Team All-BIG EAST Selection J.T. Marcinkowski has played every minute between the pipes for Georgetown on the campaign, stopping 83 percent of opposing shots on target.

- St. John's and Georgetown will meet for the second time in two weeks when they square off on Wednesday, 11 days after the Johnnies picked up their signature win of the season over the Hoyas

on Oct. 28 in Queens. In that contest, Enstrom headed home the game-winner for the Red Storm in a 1-0 victory while Andrew Withers stopped both of the Hoyas' tries on target to pick up one of his eight shutouts on the year.

- Dating back to 1985, St. John's is 22-8-3 all-time against the Hoyas with a 4-2 mark in BIG EAST Tournament action.
- Since 2011, the last seven matches between St. John's and Georgetown have been decided by one goal with the last five featuring 1-0 final scores.

RED STORM EXCEL IN BIG EAST PLAY

- With a record of 5-2-2 in conference action, St. John's registered its best BIG EAST regular season since 2009.
- The Johnnies' five wins were the most in league action since the 2009 BIG EAST championship squad tallied six conference victories after an appearance in the 2008 College Cup.
- This year marks the Red Storm's first appearance in the BIG EAST Championship since 2012, despite the fact that the team still qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 2013, a year in which half of the conference qualified for the field of 48.

WITHERS RANKS AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

- Having allowed more than one goal in a game just twice this season, Andrew Withers ranks near the top of the national standings in a number of statistical categories.
- Through games played on Nov. 5, the Wellington, New Zealand, native's eight shutouts rank 13th in Division I, while his 0.64 GAA ranks 15th and his .844 save percentage is good enough for ninth.
- His eight shutouts are the most by a St. John's keeper since Rafael Diaz tallied nine clean sheets in 2013 and are tied for 10th on the school's single-season record list.

ST. JOHN'S AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

- Following the team's wins over RV/No. 19 Xavier on Sept. 23 and No. 10/7 Georgetown on Oct. 28, the Red Storm now boasts multiple wins over ranked opponents in the same season for the first time since 2013.
- Last year, the Red Storm topped No. 11/14 Butler, 2-1, at Belson Stadium on Oct. 15 two weeks to the day after earning a point with a 1-1 draw against No. 10/14 Creighton in Queens.

RICUPATI BATTLES INJURY, LOOKS TO BUILD ON HIGH-SCORING 2016

- Despite battling a nagging lower body injury for the entirety of the 2017 season so far, Filippo Ricupati has still established himself as one of the Red Storm's most prolific offensive talents.
- The junior from Milan has tallied four goals this year, including a brace in the Red Storm's victory over Villanova on Oct. 25.
- Of Ricupati team-best six goals in 2016, three were game winners.
- Four of Ricupati's six goals last season came in just two games, as he found the back of the net twice against Holy Cross and Saint Joseph's, making him the first St. John's player to record two multi-goal games in the same season since Andrei Gotsmanov tallied a pair of hat tricks for the Red Storm in 2004. Alistair Johnston joined him this season with braces against UCSB and Creighton.

SHEARER EXPLODES ONTO SCENE AS A FRESHMAN

- One of several promising players in a young and talented core for the Red Storm, freshman Jack Shearer enjoyed a string of breakout performances in BIG EAST play en route to unanimously earning a spot on the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team.
- The Aliquippa, Pa., native recorded his first collegiate goals on Sept. 23 against RV/No. 19 Xavier, becoming one of four players on the Red Storm this season to register a brace alongside

MEDIA POLICIES

All media requests for interviews with St. John's soccer players and coaches should be directed to the Athletic Communications office 24 hours in advance.

The best time for in-season interviews, either in person or on the phone, is prior to or following practice. Interviews conducted prior to or following practice should be held to a brief Q&A session. With advanced notice, interviews with players can be arranged for other hours.

Calling players at home or on mobile phones without permission from the St. John's Athletic Communications office will not be allowed. Residence halls, training rooms and weight rooms are off limits to the media.

The St. John's locker room is closed to the media following the game. The team is allowed the customary 10-minute cooling off period and time with the coaching staff to meet with the team after each game. The St. John's Athletic Communications staff will secure coach and student-athletes for postgame interviews that will be held on the field.

The only pregame interviews allowed on game days will be for St. John's radio, and local or national television productions. No game day interviews will be granted unless specifically requested for televised games.

Credential Requests

Credential requests must be made by sports editors or sports directors on official letterhead no later than five days prior to an event. They should be sent to the Athletic Communications Office, Room 157 Carnesecca Arena, St. John's University, 8000 Utopia Parkway, Queens, NY 11439. They also may be faxed to 718-969-8468 or emailed to stjcommunications@stjohns.edu.

Credentials are not transferable and are subject to immediate revocation if transferred to non-working members of a media outlet.

St. John's University and the NCAA prohibit the issuance of credentials to representatives of an organization that regularly publishes gambling information, such as "tout sheets" or "tip sheets."

Web sites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are allowed to post anonymous information or rumors are ineligible for credentials or access to media functions. If a news-gathering medium has an online site that sponsors these anonymous forums, they may continue to request credentials under their traditional medium, but will not be granted additional passes or access for online staff.

- The center forward tallied his third goal of the season on Oct. 21 against DePaul, a game-winner.

BIG EAST WELL REPRESENTED IN RPI

- The NCAA released its fifth RPI of the season on Monday and the BIG EAST saw many of its members ranked among the nation's best.
- St. John's is one of five BIG EAST teams in the top 65. Butler leads the league with a no. 15 ranking, followed by Georgetown (22) and Xavier (51). Creighton sits at 57 followed by St. John's (63), Providence (104) and Villanova (122).
- Marquette (141), Seton Hall (165), and DePaul (175) round out the league.

ST. JOHN'S SUFFERS LATE HEARTBREAK

- Both of the Red Storm's league losses this season came in devastating fashion.
- On Sept. 30 against then-No. 22/16 Butler in the 105th minute, the Bulldogs were awarded a penalty kick on which they converted and subsequently handed the Red Storm a 1-0 loss.
- On Oct. 14 at Belson Stadium, the Johnnies appeared to be heading toward a scoreless draw with Marquette, but the Golden Eagles found the back of the net with just 26 seconds remaining in double overtime to put the Red Storm on the wrong side of another 1-0 decision.
- The losses mark the first time since 2013 that the Johnnies have dropped two double OT games in the same season and only the second time the feat has occurred since 2001.
- Before trailing for 65:56 in their come-from-behind win over Villanova on Oct. 25, the Johnnies trailed for a total of just 15:26 in their first six conference contests (3-2-1).

COOKSLEY SHINES IN RETURN FROM INJURY

- A First Team All-BIG EAST selection in 2016 and one of only two players in the league to earn unanimous selection to the preseason all-conference team this summer, Harry Cooksley made his return to the pitch against Butler after missing nearly a month with a high-ankle sprain.
- After suffering the injury late in the second half of the Red Storm's scoreless draw against Hofstra, the London native missed the squad's next five games before registering 48 minutes against the Bulldogs.
- Six days later, the senior recorded his first career brace, finding the back of the net twice against Creighton.
- After three solid performances against Princeton, Marquette and DePaul, Cooksley assisted on both of Filippo Ricupati's goals against Villanova last Wednesday before adding another helper on David Enstrom's game-winner against Georgetown.
- In the BIG EAST Championship opener against Creighton, Cooksley became just the 16th player in program history to record at least three assists in a single game. The league leader in shots last season, Cooksley failed to take a shot for the first time in his St. John's career when logging more than 10 minutes, instead helping his team win in other ways.
- On the campaign, Cooksley has three goals and leads the team with eight assists.

EARLY AND OFTEN

- As is the case for most teams, a critical component of the Red Storm's success has been getting on the board first.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 season, the Johnnies are 63-4-3 when scoring before their opponent.

PLAYERS IN THE PROS

- Under Dave Masur, the St. John's men's soccer program has been a consistent provider of talented athletes to professional leagues all around the world.
- To date, 12 Red Storm alumni have suited up for Major League Soccer teams, with three of those players (Connor Lade- NY Red Bulls, Tim Parker- Vancouver Whitecaps, and Chris Wingert- Real Salt Lake) currently active in the league.

DR. MASUR DOES IT ALL

- In his 27th season on the sideline at St. John's, Dr. Dave Masur has proven to be one of the nation's most extraordinary leaders over the past quarter century.
- In 26 tries, Masur has been to 20 NCAA Tournaments, has won a league-record nine BIG EAST Championships and has also claimed six regular season conference titles.
- Among active Division I coaches, Masur's 401 career wins rank six, while his .681 winning percentage ranks 10th.
- In addition to his duties at the helm of the men's soccer program, Masur is also an associate athletic director at St. John's, serving as a key liaison between the department's coaches and administrators while overseeing a number of special projects within the department.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- A program widely known for its ability to attract talent from every corner of the globe, the Red Storm once again has a distinctly international feel in 2017.
- Of the Red Storm's 31 players on the roster, 17 were born outside the United States.
- The Johnnies largest contingents come from England and Italy, both of which produced three members of the Red Storm.
- Canada, Haiti, Iceland and Sweden can each claim two members of the squad, while Spain, Cyprus and New Zealand each sent one native son to Queens.
