- Playing in overtime for the first time this season, St. John's scored on an own goal just 52 seconds into extra time to notch a 2-1 golden goal victory on Sept. 28 at Yale.
- St. John's played in 10 overtime contests in 2009, posting a 1-0-9 record in those games and tying an NCAA record for ties in a season.

- Following a pair of shutout wins in a 2-0-0 week, two Red Storm players earned BIG EAST honors as Kyle Hoffer was named the Defensive Player of the Week and Rafael Diaz earned a spot on the honor roll.
- Hoffer anchored a defense that allowed just four shots on goal in two shutout wins and also recorded two assists. After tallying his first-career assist in the 83rd minute of a 3-0 win against Hartford, Hoffer added an assist in the 35th minute of a 5-0 triumph against LIU.

- Diaz, meanwhile, posted a shutout against Hartford and combined on the shutout of LIU. The keeper made two saves against Hartford and added two more stops in 77:32 of action against LIU before being lifted.

## First-Career Goal For Edwards Is A Game-Winner

- Sophomore forward Omar Edwards tallied his first-career goal in just the 2nd minute of a 3-0 win against Hartford on Sept. 17 and it proved to be the game-

winner.

- After passes from Sverre Wegge Gundhus and Pablo Battuto Punyed, Edwards found himself one-on-one with the keeper and slid a shot into the back of the net from six-yards out.

## Sarle Earns BIG EAST Rookie Of The Week; Terra Named To Honor Roll

- Following a perfect 2-0-0 week, a pair of Red Storm players earned BIG EAST accolades as Dom Sarle was named the Rookie of the Week and Tadeu Terra was selected to the weekly honor roll.
- Sarle had a goal in each of the two games. The forward tallied his first-career goal in a 5-0 win against FDU on Sept. 10 and added a goal in a 2-1 win against BU on Sept. 12.
- Terra, meanwhile, registered two goals and two assists. After notching one goal and two assists, including an assist of the game-winner, in the FDU win, the midfielder scored the game-winning goal in the win against BU.

## Nine Saves And An Assist For Diaz In Win Against BU

- Redshirt freshman Rafael Diaz posted a career-high nine saves, including seven in the second half, as St. John's defeated BU, 2-1, on Sept. 12.
- The goalkeeper also recorded his first-career assist after his deep punt set up a Dom Sarle goal that gave the Red Storm a 1-0 lead in the 34th minute.

- After giving St. John's a 4-0 lead in the 60th minute with a curling shot that deflected off a defender, the midfielder headed a loose ball in front of the net to put the Red Storm up 5-0 less than a minute later.

### **Sarle Breaks Into Points Column With First-Career Goal**

- Freshman Dom Sarle tallied his first-career points with a goal on Sept. 10 in a 5-0 win against FDU.
- Sarle, a 2009 NSCAA/adidas Youth All-American, took a pass from Tadeu Terra and blasted a shot into the top corner in the 44th minute to give the Red Storm a 3-0 lead at halftime.

- The 2009 Gatorade New York Boys Soccer Player of the Year, Bramall was also an ESPN RISE first team All-American and a NSCAA/adidas High School All-American as a senior. The midfielder was a two-time NSCAA/adidas All-Region choice, a two-time all-state selection and a two-time Section IX Times Herald Record Player of the Year. Bramall has played with the U-17, U-15 and U-14 National squads and is a four-time USYSA state champion.
- A 2009 NSCAA/adidas Youth All-American and a 2009 adidas ESP All-Star, Konowiecki also earned NSCAA/adidas Youth All-Region honors in 2008. A two-time adidas ESP participant, the midfielder spent two years in Germany playing for U-17 TSV 1860 Munich and has also trained internationally with Club Brugge and Ajax.
- Sarle, meanwhile, was named a 2010 Parade High School All-American and also earned NSCAA/adidas Youth All-America honors in 2009. The midfielder, who played club soccer for B.W. - The 15-member Red Storm recruiting class has been ranked No. 12 by College Soccer News.
- The class includes, which includes 11 freshmen and four transfers, bolsters a squad that returns 11 letter-winners and six starters.
- Among the freshmen are five decorated players from New York. Tyler Arnone was the Nassau County Player of the Year and a NSCAA/adidas High School All-Region selection as a senior. The 2009 Gatorade New York Player of the Year, Alex Bramall also earned NSCAA/adidas High School All-America honors. Dan Herrera earned NSCAA High School All-Region honors and was an all-state selection as a senior, while Joey Pinto earned conference player of the year accolades as a senior. An NSCAA/adidas Youth All-

American and a Parade All-American, Dom Sarle has played with both the U-17 and U-20 U.S. Men's National Team.

- A trio of freshmen hail from Maryland and played club soccer together. Playing for the Pachuca Internationals, Matt Harlow, Erik Opsahl and James Thomas won both the Maryland State Cup and Surf Cup in 2009.
- A native of Dillsburg, Pa., Danny DiPrima was the Mid-Penn Colonial Division Most Valuable Player a year ago. Kovi Konowiecki, a 2009 NSCAA/adidas Youth All-American from Long Beach, Calif., has also earned adidas ESP All-Star and NSCAA/adidas Youth All-Region honors. A two-time all-conference selection and a three-time USYS Region III Champion from Cary, N.C., Jordan Rouse rounds out the freshman class.
- A transfer from Nassau C.C., Bruce Ayala tallied 12 goals and 14 assists in two seasons with the Lions and earned first team NJCAA All-American honors as a freshman. Chris Lebo appeared in 30 games, tallied one goal and three assists, and reached the 2008 College Cup in two seasons with North Carolina. - The Red Storm garnered eight first place votes to earn 110 points and edge defending regular season champion Louisville, which earned five first place votes and 105 points.

### **Wegge Gundhus And Terra Earn Preseason BIG EAST Honors**

- Seniors Sverre Wegge Gundhus and Tadeu Terra were each named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team, as announced by the conference.
- A 2009 first team All-BIG EAST selection, Wegge Gundhus finished the season with a team-best 18 points. One of four Red Storm players to start all 21 games, the forward tallied five goals and added eight assists.
- Terra, meanwhile, is a two-time All-BIG EAST hon-

oree. The midfielder, who earned second team honors in 2009 and was an honorable mention in 2008, had five goals and two assists a year ago.

### **St. John's Alum Mallue Named Assistant Coach**

- Ben Mallue, a former men's soccer graduate assistant, player and student manager, has been hired as an assistant coach.
- Most recently serving as a graduate assistant (2010), Mallue has been involved with the Red Storm program for five seasons since first serving as a student manager in 2005.
- After serving as head student manager for two seasons (2006-07), Mallue earned a roster spot in 2008 and appeared in three games for a St. John's squad that went 19-3-3 and advanced to the College Cup.

## Head Coach Dr. Dave Masur

### 20th Season at St. John's Rutgers '84

Dr. Dave Masur enters the 2010 season having reached unprecedented success in collegiate soccer throughout his 19 years at the helm of the St. John's program. In his tenure, St. John's has won a national championship (1996), made four appearances in the NCAA College Cup (1996, 2001, 2003 and 2008) and reached 17 NCAA Tournaments, including 15-straight from 1992-2006. A testament to the program's consistent success, the Red Storm was the only program in the nation to reach 10 consecutive NCAA Tournament Rounds of 16 from 1996-2005. With Masur on the sidelines, the Red Storm has also won a conference-record eight BIG EAST Tournament titles, six BIG EAST regular season crowns and has qualified for 19-consecutive BIG EAST Tournaments.

Individual accomplishments are as varied for Masur as they are for the many highly decorated players he has coached. The Montclair, N.J., native has twice been named national coach of the year - by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) in 1996 and by Soccer America in 2001. He is also a two-time collegiate All-American, three-time BIG EAST Coach of the Year and a six-time Northeast Region Coach of the Year. Masur is also a member of the St. John's University, Rutgers University, Columbia High School, New Jersey Soccer and Columbia Soccer halls of fame.

Chris Wingert won the 2003 Hermann Trophy as the nation's top collegiate player to highlight an impressive list of individual student-athlete honors with Masur at the helm. Red Storm players have combined for 92 All-BIG EAST, 14 All-America and 34 Regional All-America nominations in the last 19 seasons, and 12 different players have earned selections in the Major League Soccer SuperDraft.

Masur holds a doctorate in education administration supervision from St. John's, an M.A. in physical education from Montclair State and a B.S. in sports management from Rutgers.

A stellar run of success immediately followed Masur's arrival in 1991, as the Red Storm won a then-program record 12 games in his first season. In 1992, St. John's won its first ever BIG EAST Tournament championship and made its first ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Red Storm followed that up with BIG EAST Tournament titles in 1993, 1994 and 1995 as part of a run of four straight tournament crowns.

The next season, the 1996 team set new single-season records for wins (22), goals (80), assists (88) and points (248) on its way to the first national championship in St. John's university history. The Red Storm won the BIG EAST regular season title, but fell in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Tournament and earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. St. John's ran through the tournament field with five-straight wins and handled Florida International, 4-1, in the championship game to cap a 22-2-2 season with a national title.

In 2002, the opening of Belson Stadium marked a season in which the Red Storm also earned the first No. 1 national ranking in school history. St. John's played Wake Forest to a 1-1 tie in front of a sellout crowd of 2,266 in the first game at Belson and went on to earn the No. 1 national ranking.

Prior to his remarkable success at St. John's, Masur began his career as a head coach at Montclair State in 1987. As a rookie coach, Masur nearly doubled the Redhawks win total from the season before, finishing with a 7-5-2 overall mark. Montclair State went 17-4-3 and won the ECAC New York-New Jersey Regional Championship in 1988 and followed that up with a 13-8-1 record, a New Jersey Athletic Conference championship and an NCAA Tournament berth in 1989. In his final season at Montclair State in 1990, Masur led the Redhawks to a 16-4-0 overall record and its second berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Masur began his coaching career at his alma mater, Rutgers University, in 1984. He was an assistant to his former coach, Bob Reaso, for two seasons, before taking the job at Montclair State in 1987.

As a player at Rutgers, Masur was a two-time All-American and just the third soccer player in school history to be inducted into the Rutgers Olympic Sports Hall of Fame. The only Scarlet Knight player to be named an All-American in back-to-back seasons, Masur earned national distinction in 1983 and 1984, as well as all-region honors from 1982-84.

Following his graduation from Rutgers, Masur was drafted by the New York Cosmos and went on to play professionally with the Chicago Sting, Toledo Pride, New Jersey Eagles, Penn Jersey Spirit and New Jersey Imperials.

Masur's most recent Hall of Fame induction came at Columbia High School, where he was a Parade All-American and New Jersey State Player of the Year, in May 2006. Prior to that, Masur was inducted into the St. John's Athletics Hall of Fame in May 2004 and saw his jersey retired by Rutgers University in 1989.

Masur, and his wife, Shannon, have three daughters, Samantha, Jessica and Sidney, and a son, Christopher David. They reside in Montclair, N.J.
