## BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP BOUND -

### RED STORM FACES SETON HALL IN FIRST ROUND ACTION

• With a win against Syracuse in the regular season finale on Oct. 21, the St. John's women's soccer team earned its 10th BIG EAST Championship berth. The Red Storm finished fifth in the American Division and is set to take on No. 4 Seton Hall in South Orange, N.J. for a first round match up on Owen T. Carroll Field on Thursday, Oct. 27. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

• St. John's enters Thursday's match 9-8-1 on the season and finished 5-6-0 in league action. Senior forward Jen Leaverton leads the Red Storm offense with 10 goals, six of them game-winners. Leaverton has 22 points on the season.

• The Red Storm is coming off a 2-0 victory over Syracuse on Friday, Oct. 21 in the 2011 regular season finale. Leaverton scored both goals in the contest, her second game this season with two goals. Coincidentally, Leaverton's other two-goal game this season came against Seton Hall on Oct. 2.

• St. John's and Seton Hall will play each other for the 17th time in history. Thursday's match up is only the second time the two cross-divisional rivals have faced one another in BIG EAST postseason action. The last time the two teams faced each other in the BIG EAST Championships was on Oct. 26, 2006. The Red Storm hosted the Pirates and won 2-0.

• The Red Storm traveled to Seton Hall earlier this season and defeated the Pirates 2-1 on Oct. 2.

• Seton Hall is 1-3-1 in its last five games and finished the season with a double-overtime 2-2 tie against Rutgers on Oct. 21. Since the Red Storm and Pirates last saw each other on Oct. 2, the only team Seton Hall has defeated was DePaul, 3-1 on Oct. 9. Similarly, before the 2-0 victory over Syracuse, St. John's last win was at Seton Hall.

• Red Storm fans will be able to watch Thursday's BIG EAST First Round match up on the Pirate Sports Network. Live Stats will also be available on ShuPirates.com one hour prior to the start of the game.

## Honoring Mrs. Maxine Belson

During the 2011 season, both the men's and women's soccer teams will be wearing black patches with "MB" sewn on in memory of Mrs. Maxine Belson, a generous benefactor and namesake of the St. John's soccer stadium and press box, who passed away in Fall 2010.

Named after both Maxine and her husband, Jerome Belson, a member of the University Board of Trustees and St. John's Law School graduate, the stadium was funded by a multi-million dollar gift from the Belsons and dedicated on Sept. 21, 2002.

### ST. JOHN'S IN THE BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Thursday's match against Seton Hall is St. John's 10th trip to the annual postseason tournament. The Red Storm made its first appearance in the BIG EAST Championships in 1994 and took the conference by storm, winning the tournament defeating Connecticut, 1-0 (Nov. 5) and Boston College, 1-0 (Nov. 6).
- St. John's did not appear in the BIG EAST Championships again until 2001, when the Red Storm lost at Notre Dame, 2-0 on Nov. 4.
- From 2001-2004 and from 2006-2009, the Red Storm received berths to the BIG EAST Championships. St. John's narrowly missed a tournament berth in 2005 and 2010.
- Overall, St. John's is 4-7-1 in BIG EAST Championship play. The Red Storm's wins in the postseason tournament are against UConn, Boston College, Seton Hall and Georgetown. St. John's only tie was against Rutgers in 2007. Rutgers advanced by penalty kicks.
- All of St. John's BIG EAST Championship appearances have been under head coach Ian Stone.

### SCOUTING THE PIRATES

- Seton Hall finished fourth in the National Division with a 4-6-0 BIG EAST record. The Pirates finished 8-7-2 overall. Seton Hall tied Rutgers, 2-2 in the regular-season finale on Oct. 21, finishing fourth in the division, while Rutgers finished fifth. 2011 is Seton Hall's first BIG EAST Championship berth since 2006, when St. John's defeated its New Jersey neighbor, 2-0.
- Taylor Wilson leads the Pirate offense with 14 points. However, Seton Hall's main goal scorer is Katlyn Ritter with six goals.
- Seton Hall splits time in goal between Jennifer Pettigrew and Elizabeth Bond. Pettigrew is 4-3-2 with a 1.38 goals against average and 42 saves. Bond is 4-3-1 in the net with a 1.56 GAA and 44 saves. Bond was between the pipes the last time St. John's and Seton Hall played each other. She had three saves in her 90 minutes in the net.

- Seton Hall lost five of its last seven games, with a win over DePaul on Oct. 9 and the Pirates' double-overtime tie against Rutgers on Oct. 21.
- The Pirates have played five overtime games in 2011. Seton Hall is 3-0-2 in overtime.

## PIRATES VS. RED STORM - THE SERIES

- Thursday's meeting is the 17th all-time between the Pirates and the Red Storm. St. John's holds a 11-4-1 series advantage over Seton Hall in a series dating back to Oct. 24, 1994. The Red Storm has won the last 10-consecutive meetings between the two regional rivals.
- The last time Seton Hall defeated St. John's was on Oct. 20, 2000 in a 1-0 decision at Belson Stadium.
- St. John's and Seton Hall last met on Oct. 2, 2011 at Owen T. Carroll Stadium, with St. John's defeating the Pirates 2-1 with a last minute goal by Jen Leaverton. The Red Storm got on the board first with a goal in the fifth minute by Leaverton, set up by Marron. The Pirates tied it up in the 46th minute, on a goal from Stephanie Soma, assisted by Wilson. Leaverton scored on an empty-netter in the 90th minute as the keeper tried to go up for the challenge. Leaverton's winning goal was assisted by Runa Stefansdottir.
- Stone is also 11-4-1 against the Pirates in his head coaching tenure. Seton Hall head coach Kazbek Tambi is 0-8 against the Red Storm.

## STORMTRACKER - LAST TIME OUT

- St. John's defeated Syracuse, 2-0, in front of a record-breaking crowd of 1,910 at Belson Stadium. With a mantra of "win and we're in" the Red Storm needed the victory to qualify for the 2011 BIG EAST Championships. Leaverton scored both goals in the victory, with assists by Runa Stefansdottir, Amy Marron and Michelle Murino. It was Murino's first-ever career assist.
- The Red Storm defense led by Murino, Michelle Iannacchino, Patrice Casimir and Sarah Ashmore held on to its seventh shut out of the season, the second for sophomore goalkeeper Lauren Ferris. Ferris finished the regular season with a 3-5-0 record.

## STAT OF THE WEEKEND

- 10: Leaverton has 10 goals on the season, which ties the team total of goals scored from 2010. For her career, the Mansfield, Mass., native has scored 17 goals.

## LEAVERTON LEADING THE WAY

- The Red Storm is 3-0 in 2011 when Leaverton scores within the first 10 minutes of action. Leaverton proved to be the tone-setter for the match again against Syracuse on Oct. 21, when she scored at 9:08 with her sixth game-winner of the season. Leaverton also scored fifth minute against Rutgers (Sept. 30) and the fifth minute against Seton Hall (Oct. 2) to help secure two other victories in 2011.
- St. John's is also 3-0 when Leaverton scores two goals in a game, which she did for the second time this season against Syracuse on Oct. 21. Leaverton also scored twice against the Pirates on Oct. 2, scoring both the first goal and the game-winner in the 90th minute. Leaverton also scored two goals against Seton Hall in 2009, helping St. John's to a 3-1 victory.
- For her efforts against Syracuse on Oct. 21, Leaverton was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll for the second time this season. The senior forward is sixth in the BIG EAST in goals (10) and goals per game (0.56), seventh in points (22) and points per game (1.22).

## SCORING FOR A CURE

- The Oct. 16 game vs. USF was St. John's featured Score For A Cure event. Since last April, the Red Storm has been raising funds for the local American Cancer Society and as of Oct. 4, St. John's has raised more than \$5,000 for the American Cancer Society for breast cancer research.
- St. John's seniors Megan Klement and Jen Leaverton spearheaded women's soccer's Score For A Cure campaign in the spring of 2011, kicking off the fund-raising plan at St. John's annual Relay For Life.
- All season long, the team has sold t-shirts, bracelets and shoelaces to Red Storm men's and women's soccer fans with all proceeds going to the local branch of the American Cancer Society. St. John's has also received donations from individuals and organizations for the women's soccer team's cause.
- The campaign was started in memory of Leaverton's mother Joan, who lost her battle with breast cancer on March 12, 2011.
- The Red Storm raised more than \$950 over the weekend of Oct. 14-16, and another \$340 during weekend of Oct. 21 for the American Cancer Society, through donations, merchandise sales and a silent auction, putting the current total at \$6,472.40.

**SOUTH ORANGE, N.J.** -- The St. John's women's soccer team won its second straight contest Sunday, using two goals by senior forward Jen Leaverton to beat Seton Hall, 2-0. With the game tied in the 90th minute, Leaverton notched her fifth game-winner of the season to give the Red Storm an undefeated weekend in New Jersey. In the first half, it was Leaverton providing the early spark for St. John's, getting a breakout pass from sophomore Amy Marron and sending a laser into the top right corner in the fifth minute for a 1-0 Red Storm lead. Shortly after the half, Seton Hall was able to tie it up on a goal in the 46th minute, but unable to take the lead because of 11 saves by STJ sophomore goalkeeper Lauren Ferris, a new career high. Ferris' strong play was key in stopping a Seton Hall attack that managed 19 shots and eight corner kicks on the day. With the victory, Ferris moved to 2-1-0 on the season. As the second half wound down, it looked as if the game would head to overtime, but once again, it was Leaverton corralling a pass from junior Runa Stefansdottir, and chipping it over a charging Seton Hall goalkeeper in the 90th minute to give the Red Storm the win.

The game-winner was scored in the 78th minute off a St. John's corner kick. St. John's goal was scored off a corner kick with just over ten minutes left in regulation. Rookie Morgan Ritter took the corner and crossed it toward the goal. With a scramble in front of the net as the rain picked up at Belson Stadium both Kerry Cummings and Jen Leaverton went up for the header. Both girls got a piece of the ball as it went toward the net. En route to back of the goal, the ball hit the cross bar and bounced just inside the goal line for the eventual game-winner.



## QUEENS OF THE REGION

- Not only is St. John's unbeaten against teams from New York, the Red Storm is also undefeated against New Jersey opponents at a combined record of 6-0-1.
- In non-conference action, the Red Storm defeated Albany, 2-0 (Sept. 2) and Columbia, 1-0 (Sept. 4) in the NYC Classic, and Yale on Sept. 11, 2-1 in a come-from-behind thriller. The Red Storm played cross-borough rival Fordham in the 2011 Belson Stadium-opener to a double-overtime scoreless tie on Aug. 26. In BIG EAST action, St. John's defeated both Seton Hall (Oct. 2) and Rutgers (Sept. 30) on the road, and Syracuse (Oct. 21), 2-1, to remain "Queens of the Region."
- Leaverton leads the offense against New York teams with 16 points, with seven goals and two assists. Classmate Anna Torregiano is second in points with four, after her game-winning penalty kick against Columbia, and two assists.

## WELCOME BACK!

- On Friday, Oct. 14 against then-No. 7/13 Marquette, St. John's honored alumna **Jen Contesini** (1993-1997) who is No. 2 in the program's all-time career assist records. Contesini is also No. 1 in the St. John's record books for assists in a season with 11 (1996) and is tied for the single game record for assists in a game when she had four against Fordham on Sept. 6, 1995. Contesini played from 1993-1997 and tallied 52 points on 14 goals and 24 assists. Contesini was also a part of head coach Ian Stone's inaugural season and his 1994 BIG EAST Championship team.

## FERRIS ON FIRE

- After St. John's 2-0 week in New Jersey, the St. John's weekly honors rolled in for St. John's as rookie Lauren Ferris earned her first conference honor as BIG EAST goalkeeper of the week (Oct. 3). Ferris had a career-best 11 saves vs. Seton Hall and 18 for the weekend. Ferris earned her first win of the season after making her first two starts of 2011 in Piscataway and South Orange.
- Jen Leaverton was also named to the Oct. 3 Weekly Honor Roll.

## RUSSELL NEARING TOP 3

- With 295 career saves, junior goalkeeper Kristin Russell is nearing another milestone in her net-minding career. She is six saves away from tying Sherry Reill (1993-1997) at the No. 3 spot with 301 saves. Russell already holds the career records in shutouts, wins and goals against average.
- However, against Georgetown on Sept. 25, Russell injured her foot, sidelining her for the rest of the regular season.

## IN OVERTIME

- St. John's is 1-1-1 in overtime this season, starting the 2011 home stand with a scoreless double overtime tie with Fordham (Aug. 26). The Red Storm defeated UConn, 1-0 in the extra period, but lost to Georgetown, 2-1 in its latest overtime match up (Sept. 25).

## BIRTHDAY BONUS

- Twice this season, when one of the Red Storm players celebrates their birthday on a game day, they play a part in the victory. On Sept. 18, senior **Kristin Russell** celebrated her 22nd birthday with her first-ever career assist, leading to the game-winner and breaking the all-time wins record. Against Columbia, on Sept. 4, senior **Anna Torregiano** marked her 22nd birthday with a game-winning penalty kick goal against the Lions. On Friday, Oct. 21, the Red Storm celebrated Michelle Iannacchino's birthday with a 2-0 victory over Syracuse to qualify for the BIG EAST Championships.

## OUT OF CONFERENCE SUMMARY

- St. John's finished non-conference play against Yale on Sunday, winning 2-1 in its first come-back win this season. The Red Storm finished non-conference competition at 4-2-1, with its only losses to then-No. 4/13 Virginia in Charlottesville, and its season-opener at William & Mary.
- Senior **Jen Leaverton** led the offense in non-conference play, with three goals and two assists for eight points. RS-Senior **Anna Torregiano** was second with four points off a goal and two assists.

## NOT IN OUR NET

- Russell tops the charts with 31 shutouts in her four-year career as the Red Storm's starting goalkeeper. She is 13 shutouts above St. John's No. 2 in shutouts, **Tina Fogg** and **Jamie Beran**.
- On Sept. 18, Russell also broke the career-win mark with 31 as she surpassed Fogg for all-time career wins with a 1-0 victory over Connecticut.

## CELEBRATING 25 YEARS OF WOMEN'S SOCCER

- The 2011 campaign is the 25th season of St. John's women's soccer as an NCAA Division I Varsity program. The first-ever game was played on Sept. 9, 1987 at Southampton. St. John's lost 7-2. The first-ever St. John's women's soccer victory was at Monmouth College, 5-1, on Sept. 20, 1987. St. John's marked its 200th program win with a 1-0 overtime victory vs. Connecticut on Sept. 18, 2011. St. John's has an all-time program record of 204-191-42.

- Head coach **Ian Stone** is the third-ever coach of the St. John's women's soccer program. He was preceded by **Matt Strong** (1987-1988) and **Ron Jabusch** (1989-1993).

- In 25 years of women's soccer, Stone has had the most accomplishments as he has led the team to a 1994 BIG EAST Championship title, a 2002 ECAC Championship, the first-ever NCAA Tournament berth in 2009, nine BIG EAST Championship appearances and four ECAC tournaments.

## STORMING THROUGH PRESEASON

- St. John's opened the season with two exhibition games, shutting out both local opponents as a warm up to the 2011 season. Four different players scored in the exhibition games. STJ opened the season against Long Island at home at Belson Stadium on Aug. 10. Sophomore **Sandra Osborn** scored the exhibition-winner in the second period. The Red Storm's and Blackbirds played three, 35-minute sessions in running time. It was Osborn's first goal, including last fall and the spring. At Stony Brook on Aug. 13, three different players scored in a 3-0 exhibition victory.

- Freshman **Deanna Murino**, senior **Anna Torregiano** and sophomore **Morgan Ritter** scored against the Seawolves. The Red Storm and Seawolves played three 30-minute periods in the scrimmage.

## ASHMORE'S REAL COLORADO RUNNERS UP AT USYS NATIONALS

- This summer, sophomore **Sarah Ashmore's** club team, the Real Colorado '91/'92's won the Region IV Championship (June 26-31) in Boise, Idaho; en route to finishing runners up at the U.S. Youth Soccer National Championships in Pheonix, Ariz., in late July. Real Colorado lost in overtime to Dallas' U-19 squad.
- During real Colorado's run through the Region IV Championships, Ashmore scored two goals and tallied two assists. For the Red Storm in 2010-11, Ashmore played in 17 of 18 contests, including eight starts.

## STONE ADDS NCAA TOURNEY EXPERIENCE TO SIDELINE STAFF

- With the hiring of long-time assistant Michele Canning as NYU's head coach, **Ian Stone** had spots to fill on his sideline. He chose to add youth and NCAA Tournament experience to his staff as he hired former St. John's student-athlete **Courtney Curby** as his assistant coach and Boston College alumna **Chelsea Regan** as his graduate assistant manager.
- Curby was a senior on of Stone's 2009 NCAA Tournament squad which received St. John's first-ever NCAA berth. She also helped St. John's to a program-first Top 25 ranking in the NSCAA Poll and its highest ranking in history in the Soccer America Poll at No. 11 (Oct. 5, 2009).
- Regan, a 2011 graduate of Boston College, was part of the Eagles' 2010 Women's Soccer College Cup, back-to-back NCAA Women's Soccer Elite Eight (2009-2010) and 2008 Sweet 16 squads.
- Both Curby and Regan played in the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

## STONE TO LEAD U-17 ODP REGION I YOUTH SOCCER SQUAD

- This past spring, head coach **Ian Stone** was selected as the head coach of the Youth Soccer Olympic Development Program (ODP) Region 1 (East) U-17 team. This is Stone's fifth year a member of the Region 1 senior staff, his first as head coach. He served as assistant coach from 2007-10, including helping assist the 2007, 2008 and 2009 ODP Interregional champions. He has been with the ODP program for 13 years as head coach of Eastern New York South.

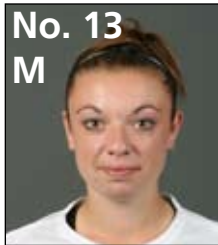

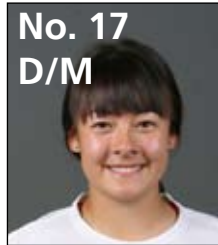
