HEAD COACH PHIL MARTELLI



Now in his 13th year at Saint Joseph's, **Phil Martelli** has built a program that is consistently one of the top in the conference, a perennial post-season participant and a key player on the national scene, while earning his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history.

Martelli reached a significant milestone in 2006-07, when he surpassed Hall of Famer Jack Ramsay for second place on the school's all-time list for wins. His 12-year career mark now stands at 246-143, while he ranks fourth in career winning percentage (.632) among SJU coaches. Setting the school record for wins in a season (30) in 2004, Martelli has guided SJU to 20 or more victories five times in 12 seasons. More impressively, his teams have gone 159-68 in the past seven seasons, an average of 23 wins per year. He is 123-69 in Atlantic 10 play, which is the most conference wins for any active coach in the A-10. Martelli has also been at his best when it counts the most as his 17 postseason wins (6 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in school history, ahead of Ramsay's 12. Martelli ranks first among Hawk coaches with a .680 postseason winning percentage (17-8) and has taken SJU to the postseason in six of the last seven years, and eight times in his 12 seasons.

Guiding a young squad in 2006-07, the Hawks went 18-14, marking the eighth time that he has led them to 18 or more wins. Martelli turned in a top-notch coaching performance in 2005-06, as the Hawks went from a 10-12 record in February to win the final five games of the regular season, and three straight in the conference tournament, to reach the Atlantic 10 championship for the second year in a row, falling just one point short of the title. That effort was similar to 2004-05 where he turned in perhaps a more remarkable coaching job than in 2003-04, when he was the consensus National Coach of the Year. Faced with the loss of two NBA first-round draft picks from the '03-04 squad that went 30-2, the 2004-05 Hawks struggled early on, but Martelli reworked the team's style of play to guide SJU to 21 wins in the calendar year of 2005 to finish 24-12. Saint Joseph's posted the conference's best record (14-2) and won its fifth straight regular-season title to tie the league record. The Hawks garnered the top seed in the conference tournament for the second year in a row and reached the championship game. He was named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year for the second straight season and the fourth time in his career. The Hawks made an exciting six-game run in the NIT, falling on a last-second shot in the championship game. It marked the second time in his career that he guided SJU to the NIT title game.

Martelli's efforts and the success of the SJU program have been recognized on a consistent basis. In fact, he has earned a Coach of the Year award, whether it be a city, conference or regional honor, in six of his 12 seasons.

In the summer of 2005, Martelli served as the head coach of the USA Men's U21 World Championship Team, which competed at the FIBA U21 World Championship in Argentina, and earned a fifth-place finish.

In 2003-04, Martelli guided a focused and unselfish squad that became the most compelling story in college basketball with its undefeated regular season, a number-one national ranking and number-one seed in the NCAA Tournament. Led by consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson, the Hawks advanced to the Elite Eight, falling two points shy of the Final Four.

After 10 years as an assistant at SJU, Martelli was named the school's 14th head coach in 1995 and is just the third non-alumnus to hold the position. Martelli burst onto the scene in his first season (1995-96) and took the squad to the NIT championship game.

Prior to his arrival at SJU, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School. At Kenrick, he led his team to six straight Catholic League playoff appearances, a school record, and still owns the school's all-time mark for wins with 108. Martelli began his career as the junior varsity coach at Cardinal O'Hara High in Springfield, Pa., in 1976-77. He moved on the following year to become an assistant at his alma mater, and helped guide Widener to the NCAA Division III Final Four. After that season, he accepted the head job at Kenrick.

As a player, he was part of Widener's NCAA Tournament teams in both 1974-75 and 1975-76, serving as team co-captain as a senior.

Martelli has added a new title to his resumé, that of "author." The coach has co-written a book, "Don't Call Me Coach: A Lesson Plan for Life" with Harold Gullan, Ph.D, which was published in the fall of 2007.

Martelli and his wife Judy, a former basketball player with the legendary Immaculata College teams, have three children. Phil, Jr., a 2003 SJU graduate, is an assistant basketball coach at Niagara University, Jimmy is an assistant coach at Robert Morris University, and Elizabeth is a junior attending Saint Joseph's.

LAST TIME OUT: Ahmad Nivins had 20 points and seven rebounds, Pat Calathes grabbed 16 rebounds and Saint Joseph's sank 10 3-pointers to beat Siena, 74-68 in Albany. Trailing 68-66 with 1:33 to go, the Hawks scored the final nine points of the game to beat the Saints. Rob Ferguson's open 3-pointer gave the Hawks the lead for good with 1:24 left. It was Ferguson's fourth 3-pointer in four attempts on the game, as he finished with 14 points. Calathes had 14 points to go along with his career-high 16 rebounds, and added three steals. The biggest steal came with :13 to play and Siena trailing by three. Calathes stepped in front of a pass and took it the length of the court for a dunk to give the Hawks the 73-68 lead with :12 remaining. Tasheed Carr, who had nine assists, provided the final margin with a free throw with three seconds to go.

THE BIG THREE: SJU got the game it's been looking for at Siena from the the three upperclassmen in the frontcourt - Pat Calathes, Rob Ferguson and Ahmad Nivins. Calathes grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds and had a key steal and dunk with :13 to play and the Hawks clinging to a 3-point lead. Ferguson was a perfect 4-for-4 from 3-point range and his three with 1:24 remaining gave SJU the lead for good. Nivins scored 20 points for the first time since Dec. 1 and made two key free throws with :26 to give the Hawks a two-point cushion.

BROTHERS IN ARMS: Pat Calathes and his younger brother, Nick, share the distinction of being the only brothers in basketball to be their teams' leading scorers. Pat is averaging a team-high 17.1 points for the Hawks, while Nick, a freshman at Florida, is scoring 14.8 per game.

RINGING IN THE NEW YEAR: The Hawks and New Year's Eve have become a recent tradition. This will be Saint Joseph's fifth game on New Year's Eve in the last seven years. In the program's history, the Hawks are 2-4 on the final day of the year. Here's the rundown:

LENGTHY BREAKS: Having played Siena last Friday, this will be a quick turnaround for the Hawks, compared to the rest of the month. For example, Saint Joseph's had a week break in between the Fairfield and Siena games. After closing out 2007 tonight, SJU will have some more time before opening the conference season on January 9 at UMass. SJU had a long hiatus earlier this year because of the Preseason NIT. After defeating Boston University on Nov. 17, the Hawks played their next game on Nov. 27 and defeated Ball State. They also had an 11-day hiatus between the Dec. 9 game at Creighton and the Dec. 21 game at Fairfield.

BOUNCING BACK: Ahmad Nivins bounced back from a 2-point performance at Creighton (Dec. 9) with 15 points in the win at Fairfield. Nivins made 7-of-8 shots from the field - a marked difference from the Creighton game in which he didn't have a field goal attempt. He followed that with a team-high 20 points at Siena, going 7-for-12 from the field and 6-for-10 from the foul line.

TAKING OVER: Tasheed Carr did what leaders do as he scored 10 key points in the final seven minutes at Fairfield. The Hawks lost their 17-point lead and saw Fairfield close to within seven points. Carr took over, hitting three field goal attempts and 3-of-5 free throws in that stretch. The junior, who joined the Hawks this year after transferring from Iowa State, was elected co-captain by his teammates before even playing in a game for SJU. Carr has always felt certain of his role, as he has the words "born leader" tattooed on his wrists.

BREAKING OUT: Idris Hilliard had a career-best game in the win at Siena. The freshman sparked the Hawks with a personal-best eight points, helping SJU maintain the lead in the first half. He also grabbed three rebounds.

UNSUNG HERO: Garrett Williamson wasn't the high scorer in the Fairfield win, but he was the difference maker according to Phil Martelli. "Garrett was the player of the game for us. He made every one of those small plays - like a steal or offensive rebound - that you need to win a game like this." Williamson had seven points, two rebounds and three steals in 20 minutes of action. One of the key plays came with 1:36 to play and the Hawks holding a seven-point lead. Williamson made a diving backcourt steal and set up a 3-pointer by Rob Ferguson that gave the Hawks a 10-point lead.

OVERTIME BLUES: Two of the Hawks' four losses this year have come in overtime (Gonzaga, Creighton). SJU has now dropped seven consecutive overtime contests. Their last OT win came on Dec. 31, 2002 when Jameer Nelson hit a last-second shot to defeat Gonzaga.

SJU AND THE THREE: Saint Joseph's has definitely used the 3-pointer to its advantage this year, as it ranks second in the A-10 in 3-point field goals made per game (8.5). But on the flip side, the Hawks have allowed their opponents to excel from behind the arc as they rank last in the conference in 3-point field goal defense (41.4%).

GET HIM THE BALL: Ahmad Nivins is averaging just 6.9 shots per game and was without a shot against Creighton, scoring just two points from the foul line. It was his lowest point total since he had three at Syracuse earlier this year. Previously the A-10's leader in field goal percentage, Nivins does not appear in the league's stats because he has not met the minimum of five field goals made per game, although he's shooting 65.2 percent. Nivins has played the most minutes of any Hawk (360), but has taken the fewest shots (69) among the starters.

THE OUTSIDERS: The Hawks have still been relying on their perimeter game despite having one of the A-10's top inside players in Ahmad Nivins. Nivins has taken fewer field goal attempts (69) than Darrin Govens has taken from 3-point range (70).

PRAISING THE HAWKS: In early December, SI.com remarked that the Hawks "have to be the best 4-4 team in the America". The Hawks' four losses are by a combined total of 19 points. That includes a last-second loss at Syracuse, an overtime loss to #19 Gonzaga, a five-point loss to Holy Cross and another overtime loss at Creighton.

ON THE LINE: Pat Calathes converted a career-best 13-of-13 free throws against Gonzaga and saw his streak end at 24 consecutive when he missed one against Penn State. Last season, Calathes set the school record with 38 consecutive free throws made. His percentage has dipped some this year and he's currently shooting 76.9 percent from the line.

GOING ON THE ROAD: The Hawks are in the midst of a stretch of five consecutive games played away from Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. After tonight's game, SJU closes out 2007 at its "home away from home", The Palestra, against Drexel on New Year's Eve. Saint Joseph's opens conference play at Massachusetts on Jan. 9 and then returns to Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse on Jan. 12 against Richmond.

FINDING FERG: Rob Ferguson broke out of his early-season slump and has now scored double figures in five of the last six games, averaging 12.1 points. The senior had 10 points and nine rebounds against Gonzaga, and then hit for a season-high 15 points against Penn State. He scored 14 points at Creighton, hitting 5-of-7 from the field, and made all four of his 3-point attempts at Siena, scoring 14 points.



SHUTTING THEM DOWN: Garrett Williamson came off the bench to provide a stellar defensive effort against Gonzaga. The sophomore was instrumental in getting the Hawks back from a 17-point deficit. He helped force Gonzaga into a seven-minute field goal drought and seven turnovers as the Hawks took their first lead of the game at the 14:50 mark of the second half. Williamson spelled **Tasheed Carr** at point guard and had only one turnover in 23 minutes of action.

PALESTRA PLAY: With the formation of the Philadelphia Big 5 in 1955, SJU began utilizing The Palestra as a home venue. Since that year, the Hawks have played at least one home game in the historic arena every season. SJU has compiled a 318-149 record (.681) at The Palestra, with more wins than the program's victory total at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse (314). This is not the Hawks' "home" game, but they will play four more in the building this year.

FOR STARTERS: The Hawks are getting good production from their starters, with all five averaging double figures and averaging 30 minutes or more. On the flip side, SJU has not gotten much offense from its bench with the Hawk reserves combining to score just 81 points.

PAT'S POINTS: Pat Calathes started off the year with two 20-plus point efforts and now has three on the year after hitting a season-high 24 points against Gonzaga. He's now scored 20 or more points in nine career games.

LEAGUE LEADER: In the league stats, **Tasheed Carr** tops the Atlantic 10 in assists with 7.0 per game and is second in assist-to-turnover ratio.

LONG-RANGE THREAT: Darrin Govens has hit a team-high 27 3-pointers for the Hawks. He went 5-for-10 effort in the win over Ball State and made six three's against Syracuse en route to a career-high 22 points. **Phil Martelli** sees Govens as more of shooter than a point guard, saying "Darrin can really, really stroke the ball and he reminds me of Terrell Myers, and that's the highest compliment I can pay a shooter at Saint Joseph's. He has a fearlessness for shooting the ball. He is a shooter - he's not a point guard."

MR. VERSATILITY: Pat Calathes put together solid all-around numbers last season and ranked among the Atlantic 10's leaders in seven different categories- scoring, rebounding, assists, blocks, defensive rebounds, assist/turnover ratio, and free throw percentage. Calathes ranked second on the Hawks with career-best averages of 13.9 points and 7.1 rebounds, but led the squad in assists, with 3.6 per game. He's putting up the same type of numbers this year, leading the team in scoring, ranking second in rebounding and assists. Calathes also tops the Hawks in blocked shots, and had a career-best day in that category with five against Gonzaga.

TEAM EFFORT: The Hawks have done a good job of distributing the ball with a balanced scoring effort (five starters averaging double figures) while averaging 15 assists per game.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Tasheed Carr is making an impact in his first season with the Hawks after sitting out 2006-07 upon his transfer from Iowa State. In his debut against FDU, he had 11 points and 12 assists, just two shy of the SJU record. He followed that up with another solid performance against Syracuse with 13 points, nine assists and six rebounds. He currently leads the Atlantic 10 with 7.0 assists per game and ranks ninth in the nation. The 6-4 guard averaged 5.8 points and 2.2 rebounds as Iowa State's sixth man in 2005-06, and was named to the Big 12 All-Bench Team. Carr attended University City H.S. in Philadelphia, but then graduated from Mt. Zion Academy in North Carolina. Carr has two years of eligibility at SJU.

FRONT AND CENTER: Saint Joseph's has one of the top frontcourts in the Atlantic 10, comprised of **Pat Calathes**, **Rob Ferguson** and **Ahmad Nivins**, the team's top three scorers from last season. All three averaged double

figures last season with Nivins scoring 16.6 points per game, Calathes averaging 13.9 and Ferguson scoring 11.3 points. Nivins and Calathes, who each received 2007 All-Conference honors, are also among the league's top 20 returning scorers. Last season, the trio accounted for 61 percent of the Hawks' scoring.

ON TARGET: Ahmad Nivins set the school record for field goal percentage last season, converting an impressive 63.1 percent (176-279). That number also ranked as the top in the Atlantic 10. For his career, he is shooting



62.9 percent (289-459) from the field, while hitting 65.2 percent this season.

FACE THE NATION: Tasheed Carr ranks ninth in assists (6.9) in the NCAA statistics for games thru Dec. 17. Darrin Govens is 39th in 3-point field goals made (3.1), while the Hawks are 29th in blocked shots (5.5) and 39th in 3-pointers made (8.6).

SITTING IT OUT: Sophomore D.J. Rivera will not participate in competition this semester in order to concentrate on academics. Rivera has practiced with the Hawks on a schedule determined by Coach Martelli and the academic tutors. Rivera was the Hawks' "sixth man" last season, leading the team in steals (41) and averaging 5.9 points. His status for the rest of the season will be determined by the start of the next semester.

DEPTH CHARGES: The Hawks have a smaller squad than usual this year, with only 12 players for as long as D.J. Rivera sits out. There are 11 scholarship players, with C.J. Brown being the lone walk-on.

IMPROVED NUMBERS: With the focus of the offense resting on their shoulders last season, Ahmad Nivins, Pat Calathes and Rob Ferguson upped their numbers, with Nivins and Calathes experiencing the more drastic change in statistics. Here's the comparison of seasons:

TO THE POINT: Phil Martelli prefers not to label his players as point guards or two-guard and says that they "are just guards." The Hawks have showed a few backcourt combinations with either Tasheed Carr, Garrett Williamson or Darrin Govens at the point. Pat Calathes is also capable of running the offense and gives SJU a unique look with his height.

NEW FACES: Charoy Bentley and Idris Hilliard comprise the Hawks' freshman class. Bentley, a 5-11 guard from Harding High School in Connecticut, played there under his father, Charles. An All-State selection, he averaged 25 points per game his senior season and scored over 1,600 points in his career. Hilliard, a 6-7 forward, earned All-State honors three times while at The Hun School in New Jersey. He averaged 15.0 points and 6.2 rebounds as a senior and helped his team to the Prep A state title.

CAPTAINS OF THE SHIP: Rob Ferguson and Tasheed Carr were named co-captains as voted by their teammates. In 2006-07, the Hawks did not elect captains and designated them only on a game-by-game basis.

SENIOR MOMENT: Against FDU, Arvydas Lidzius showed a shooting touch that's been mainly seen only in practices. The fifth-year senior came off the bench to make all four shots and record a career-high 11 points in the win over FDU, in 12 minutes of action.

DEAN OF COACHES: Phil Martelli has the most Atlantic 10 wins among active coaches with 123 and owns the longest tenure at one school (12 years) of any of the league's coaches. Only Jim Baron of Rhode Island has been in the A-10 longer (15 years), but it's been at two schools, St. Bonaventure and Rhode Island.

PRESEASON PICKS: The Hawks were picked to finish third in the Atlantic 10 in the preseason voting of media and coaches. Ahmad Nivins was chosen to the 2007-08 A-10 Preseason All-Conference First Team, with Pat Calathes earning a spot on the third team. Nivins was also one of 33 players named to the Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch List.

LONE HOLDOVERS: Rob Ferguson and Arvydas Lidzius are each in their fifth year with the program and are the final players remaining from SJU's 2003-04 Elite Eight Team. Both were freshmen that season while Ferguson redshirted the year. Lidzius was a reserve on that team but sat out the 2005-06 season.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE: This year the Hawks are facing seven teams which reached the NCAA Tournament last season, as well as three which appeared in the NIT. In the non-conference slate they are meeting three teams, Boston University (Nov. 17), Holy Cross (Dec. 4) and Siena (Dec. 28), which are picked to win their leagues in 2007-08.

THREE FOR ALL: SJU owns a streak of 446 straight games with at least one 3-pointer made, a string which began at the start of the 1993-94 season. The last game in which a Hawks' team did not hit a "three" was at Southwest Missouri State on Mar. 18, 1993.

HALLMARK OF SUCCESS: Entering this season, SJU had compiled 159-68 record (70.0 winning percentage) in the past seven seasons, with post-season berths in six of them.

WALKING ON: Sophomore C.J. Brown is another new face on the team as he earned a spot on the squad this year as the Hawks' only walk-on. Brown was an All-State Third Team selection at Caravel Academy in Delaware and was a part of two state championship teams there. A biology major, Brown played for the Hawks' junior varsity team last year.

ALL IN THE FAMILY: Coaching certainly runs in the Martelli blood as the head coach's two sons are currently working the sidelines. Oldest son Phil, Jr., a 2003 SJU graduate, is an assistant coach at Niagara University. Jimmy, a 2005 graduate of Dickinson College, is in his first year as an assistant at Robert Morris University.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Ahmad Nivins was one of the 30 players selected to participate in the USA Basketball Pan Am Games Trials this past summer.

HAWKS IN THE PROS: Saint Joseph's is currently represented in the NBA by 2004 first-round picks Jameer Nelson (Orlando Magic) and Delonte West (Seattle Superonics), as well as 2005 A-10 Defensive Player of the Year Dwayne Jones (Cleveland Cavaliers).

CRADLE OF COACHES: The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of seven Saint Joseph's graduates have gone on to become head coaches in the NBA, and SJU is now tied with Illinois for second on the list of universities with alums that have served as NBA head coaches. Indiana tops the list with 11 graduates that have coached in the league. Jim O'Brien is the only current NBA head coach, now in his first season with the Indiana Pacers. CHAMPION FOR A CAUSE: Phil Martelli's passion extends to his work in the community and his efforts with Coaches vs. Cancer are tireless. Martelli and the five other Division I coaches in the city (Drexel, La Salle, Penn, Temple, Villanova) comprise the Philadelphia Coaches vs. Cancer group, which has become one of the most successful group in the nation. The six coaches raised



over \$800,000 last year to fight the disease, while setting a goal of \$1 million for this year. The group was honored with the Coaches vs. Cancer Champion Award by the NABC at the 2004 NCAA Final Four. Martelli and his wife, Judy, were honored in early November 2007 for their work and presented with the Inspiration Award from the American Cancer Society.

SPELL IT OUT: The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the public title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. The University should be referred to as "Saint Joseph's". The abbreviations "SJU" or "St. Joe's" are acceptable in headlines or certain informal references.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Hawks get another break and start the conference season on Jan. 9 at UMass. SJU makes its return home on Jan. 12 against Richmond.

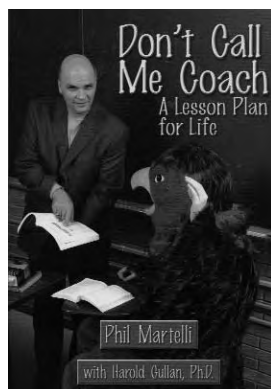

In 2007, Phil Martelli added a new title to his resumé - that of "author". Martelli came out with his first book in September, entitled "Don't Call Me Coach: A Lesson Plan for Life." The book is co-written by the Hawks' coach and Harold Gullan, Ph.D.

In the book, Martelli passes on what he has learned from his own rich experience, which includes over 30 years of coaching at the high school and college levels. One of America's most colorful, outspoken, and successful coaches, Martelli compresses his three decades of experience into a 10-point "lesson plan for life" that will benefit anyone, no matter what the challenges may be.

He speaks equally to teachers, parents, educators, and business executives — in short, to anyone who plays the role of coach in daily life.

Gullan, a noted historian and sports fan, is also the author of "The Upset That Wasn't", "Faith of Our Mothers", "First Fathers", and "Jumping Through Hoops".

The book, which includes a forward from Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell, was published by Camino Books of Philadelphia (www.camino-books.com).

FIELDHOUSE EXPANSION PROJECT

A major expansion of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse and a dedicated center for men's and women's basketball highlight a comprehensive plan for enhancing varsity and recreational athletics at Saint Joseph's. Construction on the project began in the fall of 2007.

As the home of the Hawks, the Fieldhouse is the well-loved shrine and the very heart of Saint Joseph's athletics. The expansion and renovation is an integral part of *With Faith and Strength to Dare: The Campaign for Saint Joseph's University*, and will preserve the storied facility while bringing the athletic complex to a level befitting such a venerable tradition. The Fieldhouse, home to Saint Joseph's University basketball since 1949, will be named for Michael J. Hagan '85 at the conclusion of the multi-year project set to begin this fall.

Because of the Maguire Campus (former Episcopal Academy) acquisition, the vast needs of the University's intramural program and several varsity sports will finally be addressed, creating an opportunity to dramatically improve the infrastructure for men's and women's basketball.

The three-phased project will begin with the construction of a two-story, 20,000-square-foot new wing adjacent to the existing Fieldhouse. It will add locker rooms, offices, and study rooms for men's and women's basketball, and a new Athletic Hall of Fame room.

Phase II will upgrade and renovate the current sports complex by adding a dedicated practice facility with permanent wood flooring as well as locker rooms and offices for soccer, lacrosse, track, and cross country. Phase III will include a complete overhaul of the interior of the fieldhouse, followed by the construction of an upper-level concourse, expanded seating (a minimum of 1,000 seats will be added), and more. Home court advantage will be secured, and the Saint Joseph's athletic tradition will live on for years to come.

Events in the new facility could begin as early as 2010.



THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for more than a half a century, and celebrated its golden anniversary in 2005-06.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk has not missed a men's basketball game since that first season.

In addition to the constant flapping, the Hawk is also recognized by its "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant motion, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" A few years ago, ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on the national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.

The Hawk is unique because it is one of the few mascots in the nation that travels to every game, and the student who holds the position gains a full scholarship. The student, who is selected through an interview process during the previous spring semester, also serves as a team manager for the men's basketball team and travels with the squad.

Jim Miller is the Hawk mascot for the second straight year, and the 30th student to wear the wings. He is a senior public administration major from Broomall, PA.



ON THE AIR

TV: Five of Saint Joseph's regular-season games will be seen nationally this season, beginning with the continuation of the rivalry with Gonzaga on November 29 on ESPNU from the Fieldhouse. ESPNU will also show the Hawks' game at local rival Temple (Jan. 26) while conference matchups with Saint Louis and Xavier will be seen on either ESPN or ESPN2. The annual rivalry with Villanova will be televised nationally by CSTV on February 4. Saint Joseph's will have a minimum of six conference games produced and broadcast regionally by CSTV, with the outlets to be announced. The complete broadcast schedule is on page 2.

RADIO: All Hawk games will be broadcast this year on WNTP 990 AM and can be heard via audio streaming on www.sjuhawks.com. The Saint Joseph's Sports Network team of **Tom McCarthy** and **Joe Lunardi** will provide the play-by-play and color commentary, respectively, for the fifth consecutive year. McCarthy, who spent two years as the play-by-play announcer for the New York Mets radio broadcasts, was recently named the television play-by-play announcer for the Philadelphia Phillies. He's making a return to the Philadelphia Phillies, as he worked their radio broadcasts for three years prior to the Mets job. He also announces numerous college basketball games for CSTV. Lunardi, in his 18th year on the Hawks' radio broadcasts, is the assistant vice president for Marketing at Saint Joseph's, and is a college basketball analyst for ESPN.com with his popular "Bracketology" column.

"HAWKTALK": Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" will return for its 12th season in 2007-08. The most unique coach's television show in college basketball, it was named the "Best Coach's Show in the Nation" by *The Sporting News*. Martelli's show combines a "Tonight Show" format with unique guests and just a few basketball highlights. The show will air locally on Comcast SportsNet beginning in January.

GAME RECAPS

SJU 86- Fairleigh Dickinson 66: Saint Joseph's used its size to dominate the smaller Fairleigh Dickinson team and win its season opener, 86-66. **Pat Calathes** had 20 points and **Ahmad Nivins** had 19 points and nine rebounds as the Hawks shot a sizzling 62.3 percent from the field. Senior **Arvydas Lidzius** helped break open the game early as he hit a career-high 11 points on 4-for-4 shooting in a 12-3 run. SJU led by as many as 18 points in the second half before FDU went on an 11-2 run to close to within 64-57. But the Hawks scored nine straight points, with five from Calathes, to build the lead back to double digits. In his first game as a Hawk, **Tasheed Carr** had 11 points and 12 assists.

Syracuse 72 - SJU 69: The Hawks fell, 72-69, at Syracuse in a back-and-forth contest in the 2007 NIT Season Tip-Off. **Pat Calathes'** 3-point play tied it at 24.5 seconds, but Syracuse's Jonny Flynn hit a game-winning 3-pointer with 5.3 seconds to go. The Hawks got off to a flying start, running up a 12-0 lead before Syracuse scored its first basket six minutes into the game. Syracuse came back and held a 33-30 lead at halftime, but started the second half with a 12-3 run. The Orange opened a 45-33 lead but SJU went on a 10-point run to cut the deficit to 45-43 with 15:18 left. A putback by **Rob Ferguson** gave the Hawks a 50-48 lead but Syracuse answered with eight straight points. Trailing by 63-56 with 4:50, the Hawks fought back and tied it at 68-68 at :25 on Calathes' follow and free throw. That set the stage for Flynn's gamewinner. **Tasheed Carr** was fouled at :02 and after making the first free throw, intentionally missed the second but SJU couldn't grab the rebound. Calathes finished with 22, **Darrin Govens** had a career-high 22 points and Carr scored 13 points, while **Ahmad Nivins** was limited to three points on four shots.

SJU 57- Boston University 48: **Ahmad Nivins** scored 18 points and matched his career high with 13 rebounds to lead SJU to a 57-48 victory over Boston University, the Hawks' third win over the Terriers in less than a year. Saint Joseph's won despite not scoring a field goal over the final 9:03 and shooting 3-for-20 from 3-point range. The Hawks, who trailed by as many as seven in the first half, took a 49-33 lead with 9:03 left and scored just eight free throws the rest of the way, but BU could get no closer than seven points. **Darrin Govens** scored 19 points for the Hawks, while **Tasheed Carr** added nine points, five assists and six of his team's 12 steals.

SJU 74- Ball State 63: **Pat Calathes** scored 19 points and **Darrin Govens** had 15, including four 3-pointers in the second half, as Saint Joseph's defeated Ball State, 74-63, in the home opener at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. Ahmad Nivins had 15 points for the Hawks, which were playing their first game since Nov. 17. The Hawks jumped out to a quick 13-2 lead but Ball State eventually took the lead, 23-22, late in the first half. SJU closed out the half with a 9-2 run to own a 36-29 edge at intermission. The Hawks led 46-33 six minutes into the second half, but Ball State used a 10-2 run to pull within 48-45. Long-range shooting by Govens sparked the Hawks to a 61-49 advantage, but the Cardinals rallied once again, cutting the lead to 64-57 at the 5:03 mark. But **Rob Ferguson** made a layup and Govens hit another three to end the threat. **Tasheed Carr** finished with 13 points and five assists.

#19 Gonzaga 70- SJU 65: SJU fell short in its upset bid of #19 Gonzaga, 70-65, in an overtime thriller before a raucous standing-room only crowd at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. Gonzaga came out strong and led by as many as 17 points in the first half, but the Hawks clamped down, holding the Zags without a field goal for seven minutes and to trim the lead to 35-30 at halftime. SJU would take its first lead on a 3-pointer by **Rob Ferguson** at 14:50 and then went up 55-49 on a Ferguson jumper. With Gonzaga holding a 59-57 lead, **Tasheed Carr** drove the lane and was fouled, and converted two free throws with 10.3 seconds left to tie the game. GU had two attempts at the gamewinner but they failed. In the extra period, the Hawks went cold and **Ahmad Nivins** missed a pair of free throws at 1:32 remaining that would've given SJU the lead. Gonzaga would go on to make 7-of-8 free throws and Carr missed the potential tying 3-pointer with one second to play. **Pat Calathes** went 13-for-13 from the foul line and had a game-high 24 points and career-high five blocks. Nivins scored 14 points while Ferguson had 10.

SJU 79- Penn State 67: **Ahmad Nivins** had 25 points and 10 rebounds to lead Saint Joseph's to a 79-67 win over Penn State at the Palestra. The win ended a nine-game losing streak for SJU against the Nittany Lions, which was the longest streak against a team on this year's schedule. The Hawks came out flat, possibly showing the side effects of their third game in five days and a tough overtime loss to #19 Gonzaga in the previous game. Despite holding a lead for much of the first half, Penn State outscored the Hawks, 7-2, in the final minutes of the half to force a 28-28 tie at intermission. SJU went on an 18-6 run to open the second half, taking a 45-36 lead at 14:45. The Hawks would shoot 51.5 percent in the second half and led by as many

as 24 points. Penn State closed the gap in the final two minutes against the Hawk reserves. Nivins shot 8-for-12 from the field and 9-for-12 from the foul line, while blocking three shots. **Rob Ferguson** and **Darrin Govens** each added 15 points while **Pat Calathes** scored 14.

Holy Cross 71- SJU 66: Saint Joseph's dug itself a huge hole in the first half and despite a furious rally in the second half, fell to Holy Cross, 71-66, at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. Holy Cross jumped out to an 18-2 lead in the first nine minutes as the Hawks missed their first 11 shots and turned the ball over six times in their first eight possessions. **Tasheed Carr** hit SJU's first shot of the game, a 3-pointer, with 5:01 left in the half, while the team fell behind 34-21 at halftime. Led by **Pat Calathes**, who scored all 19 of his points in the second half before fouling out, SJU closed to within 66-61 with 2:03 to play. But the Hawks missed five straight shots while Holy Cross hit four free throws to put the game away with a 70-61 lead. Carr finished with 17 points and six rebounds, while **Darrin Govens** had 12 points.

Creighton 90- SJU 84: Creighton overcame a four-point deficit in the final minute of regulation to force overtime and defeat Saint Joseph's, 90-84, despite a career-high 23 points from the Hawks' **Tasheed Carr**. After Creighton tied it, 70-70, at :14, **Pat Calathes** had a chance to win it at the buzzer for Saint Joseph's, but his 3-point shot bounced off the rim. Creighton scored nine of the first 11 points in the extra period. The Hawks twice closed to within four, but Creighton went 17-of-20 from the foul line in the extra period to hold on. In regulation, the game went back-and-forth, with Saint Joseph's coming back from an eight-point deficit and making a 15-5 run to take a 35-34 lead at halftime. **Darrin Govens** had 14 points in the first half, making 3-of-6 from three-point range. The Hawks held the lead for part of the second half, but then Creighton came back and went up 61-58 with 4:53 to play. SJU used free throws from **Rob Ferguson** and **Ahmad Nivins** and a basket by Calathes to tie the game at 62-62 with 2:21 to play. Saint Joseph's led by 67-63 with 1:09 left after two free throws from **Garrett Williamson**, but the Bluejays scored seven in a row. Calathes, Ferguson and Govens finished with 14 points each.

SJU 78- Fairfield 70: Saint Joseph's bounced back from a 10-point first half deficit and held onto the lead to defeat Fairfield, 78-70, to end a two-game losing streak. **Tasheed Carr** had 18 points, with 10 in a key stretch of the game, while **Pat Calathes** also added 18. The Stags built a quick 10-point lead at 18-8 with 12:44 remaining in the opening half. Saint Joseph's scored the next eight points over two-plus minutes of action to make the score 18-16. Fairfield remained in the lead until **Garrett Williamson** made one of two free throws to break a 22-22 tie and push SJU in front by a point with 6:20 left. Fairfield took the lead for the last time, 25-22, but Calathes answered with a 3-pointer which started a 13-0 run over the next four minutes, giving SJU a 38-25 advantage with 1:15 remaining in the half. SJU led by as many as 17 in the second half, but the Stags used the 3-pointer to get back into the game, and cut the deficit to 69-64 with over two minutes to play. The Hawks answered with a jumper by Carr and a 3-pointer by **Rob Ferguson** to cancel Fairfield's threat. **Ahmad Nivins** added 15 points on 7-for-8 shooting while the Hawks converted 52.7% from the field.

SJU 74- Siena 68: **Ahmad Nivins** had 20 points and seven rebounds, **Pat Calathes** grabbed 16 rebounds and Saint Joseph's sank 10 3-pointers to beat Siena 74-68 in Albany. Trailing 68-66 with 1:33 to go, the Hawks scored the final nine points of the game to beat the Saints. **Rob Ferguson's** open 3-pointer gave the Hawks the lead for good with 1:24 left. It was Ferguson's fourth 3-pointer in four attempts on the game, as he finished with 14 points. Calathes had 14 points to go along with his career-high 16 rebounds, and added three steals. The biggest steal came with :26 to play and Siena trailing by three. Calathes stepped in front of a pass and took it the length of the court for a dunk to give the Hawks the 73-68 lead with :12 remaining. **Tasheed Carr**, who had nine assists, provided the final margin with a free throw with three seconds to go.

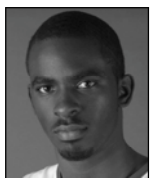

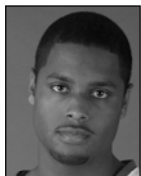
