GAME STORIES . . .

- Saint Joseph's snapped a two-game losing skid on Wednesday with a 57-53 victory at La Salle. The Hawks held La Salle to just 27.3 percent shooting and 6.3 percent from three-point range.
- The win moved the Hawks into a tie for sixth place with the Explorers and gave SJU any tie-breakers should the two teams have the same A-10 record at the end of the year.
- Wednesday's victory also assured Saint Joseph's a winning season. It is the 36th time in 39 years of Division I competition that SJU has posted a winning season.
- Saint Joseph's heads into Sunday's game with Saint Louis holding a 6-1 edge in the all-time series. The Hawks have won the last two meetings and are 4-0 at home against the Billikens
- Sunday's game is a Jesuit Basketball Spotlight contest. The Hawks are 3-0 against fellow Jesuit schools this year having downed Boston College, 74-57 (Dec. 29), Fordham, 57-46 (Jan. 18) and Xavier, 70-67 (Jan. 21).
- Sunday's promotion is "Breast Cancer Awareness Day With The Hawks." Saint Joseph's will be wearing pink apparel, including a special pink shooting shirt.
- Proceeds from Sunday's game will go to Assistance in Healthcare. Assistance in Healthcare provides service for patients treated by the Cancer Treatment Centers of America.
- Several dozen former Hawks are expected to attend Sunday's game as Saint Joseph's is holding its annual "Alumni Day."

Shooting 50 percent from the field (24-of-48) and getting a combined 32 points from Katie Kuester and Michelle Baker, Saint Joseph's topped Saint Louis, 66-54, in the Hawks' Atlantic 10 opener. Leading by as many as 15, Saint Joseph's saw its advantage cut to seven, midway through the second half. The Hawks answered with a 6-1 run s, going up 49-37 with 8:21 remaining and never allowed Saint Louis to come closer than seven points from there.

INJURY REPORT

Freshman forward Mariah Lesure is doubtful for Sunday's game against Saint Louis. Lesure injured her right ankle Wednesday at La Salle. Sunday will mark the first time in 17 games SJU will likely be without its full bench.

BAKER BECOMES 21ST HAWK TO REACH 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Senior guard **Michelle Baker** became the 21st SJU player to reach 1,000 career points this past Saturday at Richmond. Baker reached the career milestone on a jumpshot with 11:06 left in the second half. She currently has 1,011 points and ranks 19th all-time in scoring entering Sunday.

BALANCED OFFENSIVE ATTACK

With six players averaging more than seven points per game, Saint Joseph's has put the emphasis on sharing the ball at the offensive end. The Hawks are the only team in the A-10 without a player ranked in the top-20 scoring. Additionally, **Katie Kuester's** 20 points against Duquesne made SJU the final Atlantic 10 squad to have a player score 20 points in a game this year.

DEFENSE THE DIFFERENCE

A staple for the Hawks over the years has been their tenacious defense. This season it has continued as Saint Joseph's has held opponents to 305-for-886 from the floor (34.4 percent) in its 15 wins. Additionally, the Hawks held Lehigh, Drexel, Saint Francis (Pa.), Quinnipiac, Penn and La Salle to under 30 percent shooting, and had their top-two defensive performances of the year recently, limiting Penn and Fordham to 34 and 46 points, respectively.

HAWKS EXCEL AGAIN IN NONCONFERENCE PLAY

For the second-straight year Saint Joseph's has posted 10 wins during the nonconference portion of the schedule. The Hawks, who went 10-4 in the nonconference the past two seasons, won 17 non-conference games in 1984-85 to set the all-time record. SJU had won 14 nonconference games the previous year, 1983-84.

KUESTER SJU'S ALL-TIME LEADER IN FT PERCENTAGE

Senior **Katie Kuester** is currently SJU's all-time leader in free throw percentage. Knocking down 129 of 151 shots for 85.4 percent, she has hit 34-of-41 from the foul line (82.9 percent) this year.

THE HAWKS' IRONWOMAN

Senior guard **Michelle Baker** has been the Hawks' Ironwoman since 2008-09. Beginning as a freshman, Baker has appeared in all 117 games for SJU, while making 65 starts. She is currently averaging 8.6 points and 3.2 rebounds per game for her career.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

A mainstay with any **Cindy Griffin** squad, this year's Hawks are proving to be one of the best teams in the nation in handling the basketball. Saint Joseph's currently ranks 12th in the nation in turnovers per game (13.5), and have posted nine games of 11 turnovers or fewer, including a season-low four turnovers at #8 Maryland. Additionally, the Hawks are 18th overall in assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.01.

CAVALLO RANKS AMONG SJU'S ALL-TIME LEADERS

Even with more than eight games to go, senior forward **Kelly Cavallo** has already made a big impact on the Saint Joseph's record book. A stellar defender, Cavallo has recorded 112 career blocked shots, good for second in program history, while her 541 career rebounds ranks 14th all-time. Additionally, the Hampton Bays, N.Y. native is only the second Hawk ever to amass 100+ blocks and 500 rebounds, joining current assistant coach **Stephanie McCaffrey '04** (nee Graff) who finished with 175 blocks and 788 rebounds.

PRIM HITS HER PRIME

Junior **Ashley Prim** has become a focal point for the Hawks' offense this season. Relied upon for her passing ability, the SJU point guard has proven to be a key scorer for the Hawks this year. Matching her career-high with 18 points at La Salle on Wednesday, Prim has averaged a career-best 9.6 points per game this year and leads the Hawks in assists (75), steals (31) and free throws (70) while averaging just 23.6 minutes per game.

PARKER MAKES MOST OF HER MINUTES

After playing just 38 minutes over 11 games as a rookie, sophomore guard **Kasie Parker** has made a strong presence off the bench for the Hawks this year. Averaging 10.7 minutes per game through 23 contests, Parker has given SJU a boost off the bench, adding 3.8 points and 1.2 rebounds per game so far this year. She has scored in double figures three times this year after not scoring a point as a rookie last season.

KUESTER SEVENTH ALL-TIME IN THREE POINTERS

Senior **Katie Kuester** enters Sunday's game seventh all-time in program history for three point field goals. The four-year letterwinner has hit 148 field goals and trails Angela Zampella (184) for sixth.

SHIELDS AND PRIM POST FORMIDABLE DUO

Having the option of junior **Ashley Prim** or sophomore **Erin Shields** run the point is a welcomed opportunity for the Hawks. Combining for 197 of the team's 475 assists last year, the duo were terrific with the ball in 2010-11 posting a 1.7 assist-to-turnover ratio. This season, the pair have accounted for 131 of SJU's 314 assists and are averaging 17.3 points per game together.



WORTH THE WAIT

Having missed the previous two seasons due to injury, redshirt sophomore Ashley Robinson has shown to be a steady force in the paint for SJU. Posting an 18-point, 10 rebound performance in the season opener at Princeton, she ranks third among SJU post players in scoring (5.7 ppg), third overall in blocked shots (14) and third overall in rebounding (3.7 rpg).

VAN GRINSVEN REACHS 1,000 POINT MARK FOR CAREER

Senior Samira van Grinsven surpassed the 1,000-point mark for her career with a second-half basket at Lafayette. The two-year starter has tallied 417 points over 55 games (7.6 ppg) in Crimson and Gray after scoring 723 points her first two collegiate seasons at Casper College, good for 1,144 total points.

KUESTER AND BAKER SERVING AS CAPTAINS IN 2011-12

Seniors Michelle Baker and Katie Kuester are serving as captains for the Hawks during the 2011-12 season. Kuester was a captain a season ago, while Baker is in her first year of captaincy.

EFFICIENT CAVALLO

Senior Kelly Cavallo posted one of the most efficient seasons in program history in 2010-11. Hitting 116 of 189 shots, Cavallo posted SJU's second-best single-season field goal percentage at .614. For her career, she is shooting .573 from the floor (231-of-403), while she has hit on 56.3 percent of her shots this year (71-of-126).

SCHOLARLY SMITH

A standout on the court and the classroom, junior Shelby Smith is one of just two Hawks in program history to earn Philadelphia Big 5 All-Academic Team. The finance major is also a member of both the A-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll and SJU Athletic Director's Honor Roll. On the court this season, Smith has worked at becoming more of a scorer and has tallied 29 points so far this season, surpassing her total of 23 from 2010-11.

VILA HELPS SPAIN WIN U-20 EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP

Junior Mireia Vila capped a stellar summer in style, helping her Spanish squad to the 2011 FIBA U20 European Championships. Appearing in seven games, and averaging 19.1 minutes per contests, Vila helped Spain to a 62-53 victory over Russia in the championship game.

SJU INKS FOUR TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT

Saint Joseph's women's basketball announced that Ciara Andrews (Glenside, Pa./Cheltenham), Sarah Fairbanks (Elizabethtown, Pa./Elizabethtown Area), Casey Smith (Danbury, Conn./Danbury), and Jordan Strode (Harrisburg, N.C./Hickory Ridge) have signed National Letters of Intent during the early signing period to attend Saint Joseph's University next year.

Leading Cheltenham High School to the PIAA Class 4A title last season, Andrews proved to be one of the top players in Pennsylvania in 2010-11. Averaging 19.7 points per game, the 5-foot-9 guard garnered First Team All-State honors as a junior and was named the Suburban One Conference Player of the Year. A three-year letterwinner, Andrews, nicknamed CC, has helped the Panthers to three-straight Suburban One title and tallied 573 career points.

A standout forward at Elizabethtown High School, Fairbanks has led her team in scoring and rebounding the past three seasons. As a junior, the 6-foot-2 post player averaged 15 points per game as the Bears posted a 14-9 mark. A Sporting News Honorable Mention All-American, Fairbanks has tallied 904 career points and is on pace to become just the sixth player at Elizabethtown Area to reach 1,000 career points.

Guiding Danbury to a 16-7 record in 2010-11, Smith led the Lady Hatters with 19 points, 9.6 rebounds and 2.6 rebounds per game. A two-time All-State and All-Fairfield County Interscholastic Athletic Conference selection, the 6-foot-2 forward enters her senior season having score 1,047 career points.

A three-time All-District selection at Hickory Ridge, Strode garnered All-Conference and team MVP honors after averaging 16 points per game as a junior. Having earned four varsity letters prior to 2011-12, the 5-foot-8 guard will become the second player in team history to reach 1,000 career points later this season.



BAKER NAMED TO ATLANTIC 10 PRESEASON TEAMS

Senior guard **Michelle Baker** was selected to both the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Second Team and All-Defensive Team. Leading the Hawks in scoring (12.2 ppg) and tallying the most points by a Hawk since 2006-07, she anchored Saint Joseph's defense, and earned A-10 All-Defensive Team honors last year after helping the Hawks limit opponents to just 58.6 ppg.

CAVALLO AND PRIM NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Senior **Kelly Cavallo** and junior **Ashley Prim** were named to the TD Bank Classic All-Tournament Team. Averaging a double-double over two games, Cavallo tallied 24 points and 23 rebounds against Dartmouth and Vermont, including a season-high 14 boards against the Catamounts. Prim averaged 13.5 points and 3.5 assists per contest versus the Big Green and host Vermont.

ROBINSON NAMED A-10 CO-ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Averaging a double-double in her first two collegiate games, red-shirt sophomore **Ashley Robinson** was named Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Week, for the week of Nov. 11-13. Robinson, who missed the previous two seasons due to leg injuries, averaged 12 points and 10 rebounds per game, including an 18-point, 10-rebound double-double in her debut at Princeton.

FOREIGN-BORN HAWKS

Senior forward **Chatilla van Grinsven** is the 14th foreign-born student-athlete to play for Saint Joseph's. Chatilla joins her sister, **Samira**, junior **Mireia Vila** and sophomore **Ilze Gotfrida** mark for most foreign-born Hawks on a team, surpassing the 2001-02, 2003-04 and 2010-11 squads. WHY S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them-Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia-is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of S-A-I-N-T Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

THE FAST BREAK

- SJU's **Cindy Griffin** and Xavier's Amy Waugh are the only two head coaches in the Atlantic 10 to coach at their alma mater.
- The Hawks turned the ball over just four times at Maryland, marking the team's fewest since SJU had three against La Salle (1/12/07).
- With wins over UCLA and Boston College in successive games, the Hawks posted back-to-back victories over BCS opponents for the first time since the start of the 2001-02 season when they topped USC and Rutgers.
- Sophomore **Ilze Gotfrida** (Latvia) and **Chatilla van Grinsven** (Netherlands) also competed for the national team at this past summer's U-20 FIBA European Championships.
- **Chatilla van Grinsven**, **Samira van Grinsven** and **Mireia Vila** are three of just four players to play for SJU with a "V" last name.
- **John McCray**, a 2011 graduate of Ohio State, is in his first year as graduate assistant at Saint Joseph's.
- Saint Joseph's had four players score in double figures against Temple, marking the ninth time it has happened this year.

LOOKING AHEAD

Saint Joseph's hosts Rhode Island this Wednesday as the Hawks cap a two-game home swing. Game time is set for 7 p.m.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for more than a half a century.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, The Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die."

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More

than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The idea for The Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the \$120 needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as The Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at The Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a mainstay in 1989. Since then, 10 SJU students have donned the costume, with senior **Nick Martino** serving as the Hawk for the second straight year this season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 56-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine and was a nominee for the 2008 Mascot Hall of Fame.



Cindy Griffin - Head Coach

Saint Joseph's '91, MBA '93 - 11th Season

Guiding the Hawks to seven postseason appearances and six in-season tournament crowns, **Cindy Griffin** enters her 11th season as Saint Joseph's head coach in 2011-12. A 1991 and 1993 graduate of SJU, Griffin (nee Anderson) has compiled an overall record of 241-177 in 14 seasons as a head coach and is 193-144 in 11 seasons on Hawk Hill. Her Saint Joseph's squads have posted four 20-win seasons, including four victories over ranked opponents, while her players have been honored as Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers 10 times.

Returning just one starter for the 2010-11 season, the Hawks quickly jelled under Griffin's guidance as they went on to win 20 games, earned the program's 700th victory and advanced to the second round of the WNIT. Backed by All-Big 5 honorees Michelle Baker and Katie Kuester, Saint Joseph's had its most efficient offensive showing since 2002-03, as the Hawks finished 60th in the nation in field goal percentage (42.1), while holding opponents to just 37.2 percent (59th nationally).

Additionally, several Hawks were honored for outstanding seasons last year, headlined by sophomore Ashley Prim becoming the first SJU player to be named Atlantic 10 Sixth Player of the Year. Baker became just the second Hawk to be named to the A-10 All-Defensive Team, while freshman Erin Shields became the sixth player Griffin has coached to A-10 All-Rookie Team honors.

Earning a postseason berth for the first time in two years, the Hawks surpassed predictions in 2009-10 as they finished tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10 after being picked to finish ninth. After opening the season with a 3-7 mark, Griffin saw her team begin to click at the end of the non-conference schedule as SJU claimed the 19th Annual Hawk Classic title and worked its way to .500 by the second week of the Atlantic 10 slate.

Posting a 9-5 mark against conference opponents, Griffin hit two milestones during A-10 play, earning her 150th win at Saint Joseph's in a victory against Dayton and earning her 200th coaching win against George Washington. The Hawks would go on to earn the program's seventh WNIT bid, and play the first postseason game at Hagan Arena.

Griffin helped to reinvigorate the SJU program in her first season, leading the squad to a 24-8 record and the second round of the WNIT. She capitalized on the team's tradition of scrappy play and rugged defense, while releasing the reins and allowing the team to play a more up-tempo style on the offensive end of the floor. The Hawks finished the year among the national leaders in nine different categories and paced the nation in free throw percentage for the second straight year.

Following a memorable first year at the helm of her alma mater, Griffin upped the ante in her second season by capturing 2003 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Hawks to a 19-11 record. The team sprinted to the conference's Eastern Division title and earned a berth in the WNIT for the second straight season, despite the departure of SJU's all-time leading scorer and a non-conference schedule that rated fourth nationally.

Led by six seniors, the 2004 team went 22-11 and advanced to the WNIT Elite Eight. Saint Joseph's finished second in the A-10 East and dropped a heartbreaker in the Atlantic 10 Championship to Temple. Four Hawk seniors reached the 1,000-point plateau, marking just the eighth time in NCAA history that a quartet of players had reached the milestone in the same season. Erin Brady, Irina Krasnoshiok, Stephanie (Graff) McCaffrey and Amra Mehmedic went on to sign professional contracts.

With the loss of four 1,000-point scorers, the 2004-05 Hawks showed their true colors down the stretch, earning a hard-fought victory over La Salle in the opening round of the Atlantic 10 Championship and coming within 10 points of 16th-ranked, and eventual A-10 Champion, Temple.

Fueled by a collection of newcomers and a developed core of upperclassmen, Griffin led the Hawks back to national prominence in 2005-06. The Crimson and Gray engineered the nation's best turnaround (13 games) and received votes in the national polls for the first time since 2003-04. The Hawks advanced to the semifinals of the A-10 Championship and earned a berth in the WNIT.

Despite losing several experienced players prior to the 2006-07 season, Griffin had her team peaking at the right time. Playing Griffin's style of hard-nosed defense and persistent offense, the Hawks advanced to the Atlantic 10 Championship game, including the program's first win over a top-10 opponent (#8 George Washington) since 1992 along the way. Saint Joseph's capped the season with its fifth WNIT appearance in six years and tied the SJU record for games played in a season with 33.

Relying heavily on underclassmen in 2007-08, Griffin guided her Hawks to another winning season, including crowns at the Brown Basketball Classic and the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic. Among the wins, Saint Joseph's posted its biggest win over a non-conference ranked opponent since the 1984-85, topping #15 Auburn for the Hawk Classic title.

In 2008-09, Griffin undertook arguably her toughest season to date as Saint Joseph's played every contest away from Hawk Hill for the first time in program history. And in typical SJU fashion, Griffin got her team to respond as Saint Joseph's went on to post an 8-5 record at home venues and earn its first Big 5 title since 2000-01. Individually five Hawks posted career-bests in scoring, with juniors Brittany Ford and Mariame Djouara both earning All-Big 5 Second Team honors.

Following her playing career, Griffin spent the 1992-93 season as a graduate assistant at her alma mater. She then accepted an assistant's spot at Vanderbilt University from 1993-95 under former Saint Joseph's head coach Jim Foster. Foster recruited Griffin to SJU and coached her during her playing career on Hawk Hill.

In her two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt, the Commodores finished 53-15 overall, won the 1995 SEC championship and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 both seasons. In addition to coaching responsibilities, she was the co-director of the Vanderbilt Basketball Camp and the director of the Black & Gold Club.

Griffin left Vanderbilt after the 1995 season to become an assistant coach at Loyola College (Md.). She spent three seasons as an assistant under Patty Coyle before being promoted to associate head coach in 1998. Griffin was promoted to the position of head women's basketball coach at Loyola midway through the 1998-99 season. She was the seventh-youngest head coach in Division I at the time. Griffin – who was named head coach five games into the season as Coyle left for an assistant coach position with the WNBA's New York Liberty – kept the Greyhounds' momentum going as Loyola won a team-record 21 games that year. Overall she compiled a record of 48-33 during her tenure at the Baltimore school, guiding the squad to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference semifinals all three seasons.

One of the top playmakers in Saint Joseph's history, Griffin starred for the Hawks from 1987-88 through 1991-92 (missing the 1988-89 season due to injury). A three-time team captain, Griffin finished her career with 662 points, 278 rebounds, 510 assists and 197 steals. She currently ranks fourth on SJU's all-time assist list.

As a junior in 1990-91, she played in 1,178 out of a possible 1,200 minutes to set the school record for minutes played in a single season. The Hawks made three NCAA Tournament appearances and posted three straight 20-win seasons during her playing career. A two-time Second Team All-Big 5 choice, as well as a Third Team All-Atlantic 10 pick as a senior, she was inducted into the Saint Joseph's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998.

A native of Maple Glen, Pa., Griffin played her high school basketball for Bishop McDevitt, winning two Philadelphia Catholic League titles. A 1987 graduate of McDevitt, she was inducted into its Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997, and in 2002, received the Philadelphia Catholic League's alumni achievement award. She earned a bachelor's degree in accounting from Saint Joseph's in 1991 and completed work on an M.B.A. from SJU in 1993. She resides in Conshohocken, Pa., with her husband Curtis and children, Kaylie (8), Hannah (6) and Curtis Jr. (3).

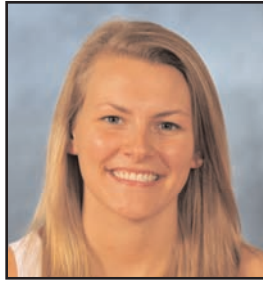
