**TIPPING OFF**

Saint Joseph's will try for its third ever Atlantic 10 Championships when the Hawks begin play Friday at the 2005 Atlantic 10 Tournament. The Hawks will have a tough road to travel en route to their third title, as Saint Joseph's begins play as the fifth seed in the Atlantic 10 East, the lowest it has been seeded since the conference went to two divisions.

**THE ATLANTIC 10 TOURNAMENT**

The 2005 Atlantic 10 Tournament returns to Washington, DC for the first time since the 2003 season in which the George Washington Colonials downed Rhode Island for the A-10 title. This year's tournament marks the third time Saint Joseph's has competed for the conference crown in the nation's capital. In 1997, the Hawks won their first ever A-10 title in Washington, DC, downing the host Colonials 59-56 for the championship. Making its 23rd appearance in the tournament, Saint Joseph's is 27-20 in A-10 tournament games, and has made nine appearances in the title game.

**HAWKS IN 2004 ATLANTIC TOURNAMENT**

Saint Joseph's earned a bye in the 2004 Atlantic 10 Tournament's opening round and set a new A-10 record by hitting 32 of 44 from the free throw line in defeating Duquesne in the quarterfinals. In the semis, with the team's season hanging in the balance, it was fittingly the Hawk seniors rose to the occasion, netting 62 of the team's 70 points in an emotional victory over George Washington that gave Saint Joseph's its 20th win of the season and propelled the team into the A-10 title game for the second time in three years. In the final against Temple, the Hawks fell behind early and trailed by as many as 16 late in the second half before staging a furious comeback. Amra Mehmedic canned a key three late and after Stephanie Graff scored on consecutive possessions in the paint, SJU was within a pair with 32 seconds left. Alas, it was not to be as several Hawk attempts were off the mark in the waning seconds and the Owls iced the game with free throws late. Graff, who had a double-double in the final, and Irina Krasnoshiok each earned all-tournament honors for their efforts.

**TRAINER'S ROOM**

The Hawks will likely be without two of their three point threats for the Atlantic 10 Tournament. Junior guard **Kelly Springman** is questionable, following five weeks of rehab on a broken left wrist. One of two co-captains, Springman suffered the injury during practice on January 19. Junior guard **Christine Roth** is listed as doubtful after breaking a bone in her left foot at Fordham on February 13. The 5-foot-10 Roth ranked among the A-10 leaders in three-point shooting prior to the injury.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE**

What a difference a year makes, literally for the Hawks. After struggling to put the ball in the hoop in 2004, Saint Joseph's has thrived in 2005. The Hawks, who averaged a mere 44.6 points per game over the first 13 games, increased their output by 11.5 points per game to 56.1 ppg in 2005. For the entire season, the Hawks are posting 51.2 points per contest.

**NO SENIORITY**

The 2004-05 Hawks are one of eight teams nationally that boasts a lineup without a senior. Saint Joseph's, which consists of five juniors, four sophomores and three freshmen, is joined by Cal State Northridge, Canisius, Cornell, Dartmouth, Southern Miss, Utah State and Washington as teams without a senior.

**CONTROLLING THE ROCK**

Even though the Saint Joseph's backcourt had started only 17 games heading into the season, they have proven to control the ball quite well. The Hawks have improved from 16.3 turnovers per game last year to 15.7 this season. The change has helped Saint Joseph's to 48th nationally in turnovers per game in the latest national rankings. The Hawks trail Big 5 rival Villanova (9.6 turnovers per game) for the national lead.

**HAWKS VERSUS THE POLLS**

Five times this season, Saint Joseph's has faced a nationally ranked team. With its most recent game coming on February 27 versus then #16 Temple, the Hawks have posted a 27-99 program record versus ranked opponents. This season, SJU is 0-5 against top-25 teams with losses coming at #10/9 Ohio State (76-29) on November 14, at #14/16 Boston College (65-41) on December 22, to #22/21 Kansas State (68-49) on December 30 at #20/22 Temple (68-49) on February 10 and versus the #16 Owls (69-46). Saint Joseph's earned its last victory over a ranked opponent on November 18, 2001 with a 64-58 win over #23 Rutgers.

**CAREER YEARS**

With the loss of 80 percent of their offense to graduation last May, the returning Saint Joseph's players knew they would have to increase their scoring. This season five of those six returning players have tied or set new career-highs in scoring. The following is a breakdown of those players.

**TRIFECTA**

After having their 72-consecutive game streak with a three pointer snapped by Villanova on December 11, the Hawks have started a new streak. Saint Joseph's, who went 0-9 versus the Wildcats, currently have a 18-game streak with a three pointer.

**OH SO CLOSE**

Only 13 points. That was the difference between a 6-22 record and a 11-17 regular-season finish. Saint Joseph's, which played in 14 games decided by 10 points or less, lost by five points in five cases. The Hawks lost a one-point game at Massachusetts, by two points to Lehigh and St. Bonaventure, three points at Rhode Island and to George Washington by five.

### POLLOCK POSTS SOLID FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

After sitting out the 2003-04 season as a redshirt, center **Erica Pollock** has proven to be go-to player for the Hawks in her first collegiate season. The 6-foot-3 Pollock leads Saint Joseph's in rebounding (6.0 per game), blocks (1.1 per game) and is second on the squad in scoring, averaging 9.2 points per contest. Making 28 appearances with 22 starts, Pollock finished the regular season on a roll, averaging 14 points and 8.7 rebounds in the final three contests. She also earned Atlantic 10 Co-Rookie of the Week honors for the week of February 20-26. Pollock recorded her first career double-double at La Salle with 18 points and 10 rebounds. This comes off a 15 point, eight rebound game at Rhode Island on February 20.

### MCBRYAN LEADS THE WAY

Down the stretch, junior forward **Maura McBryan** has been in the zone offensively for Saint Joseph's. Averaging 7.6 points a game prior to January 30, McBryan was held scoreless for the first time this season at Richmond. Since then, the 6-foot swing player has averaged 12.5 points per game, and 13.3 over the final seven regular-season games. The scoring boost has increased her season average to career-best 9.0 points per game. In the Hawks game versus George Washington, McBryan scored a career-high 20 points on an 8-of-12 shooting evening. She followed that performance with her a 19-point, 11 rebound effort at Rhode Island on February 20.

### A PLEASANT RETURN

After sitting out the opening 10 games of the season with a broken bone in her right foot, sophomore guard **Ayahna Cornish** has brought a spark to the Hawks' offense. Cornish, who averaged 5.2 points per game as a freshman, is averaging a team-high 11.8 points per game. An explosive playmaker, Cornish scored a career-high 27 points in Saint Joseph's win at Duquesne. Cornish, who averaged 12.1 points per game in Atlantic 10 contests, finished 15th overall in conference-only scoring.

### SCHUTTE'S SCORING SURGE

The Atlantic 10 schedule was good to junior **Faith Schutte**. Prior to conference play, the 6-foot-1 forward was averaging 4.9 points per game. During A-10 games, Schutte averaged 6.3 points per game, including a career-best 12 points versus Dayton on January 9. A starter for all 16 conference contests, Schutte's performance in A-10 play has boosted her season scoring average to 5.7 points a game.

#### SCOUTING THE EXPLORERS

Big 5 rival and the fourth seed in the Atlantic 10 West, La Salle will face the Hawks for the second time in the span of a week. Last Friday, February 25, the Explorers downed Saint Joseph's 66-51 on senior day at Tome Gola Arena. The Explorers, who were without the use of sophomore Crista Ricketts, received a 23-point performance from senior guard Jill Marano. For the season, Marano finished second on La Salle in scoring, averaging 11.9 points per game. One of the top three-point shooters in the conference, Marano is shooting 46.6 percent from behind the arc. A 6-foot-1 post player, Ricketts has been sidelined the past two games with a sprained ankle. Probable for Friday's opening-round contest, Ricketts led the Explorers in scoring (15.4 ppg) and rebounds (6.1 per game). Junior guard Davineia Payne (11.3 ppg), senior guard Meghan Wilkinson (8.7 ppg) and senior forward Monica Garrido-Sanz (6.3 ppg) will likely round out the starting lineup for first-year head coach Tom Lochner.

#### SCOUTING THE OWLS

After posting only the fourth undefeated record in Atlantic 10 play, Temple has earned a bye into the quarterfinals of the A-10 Tournament. The first seed in the A-10 East and top seed overall, The Owls posted a 24-3 overall record en route to a top-20 national ranking. Earning #16 rank in both polls last week, Temple would face Saint Joseph's for the second time in seven days come Saturday. The Owls, who went 2-0 versus the Hawks this season, got a combined 28 points from seniors Ari Moore and Cynthia Jordan in their 69-46 win on February 27. Potential A-10 Coach of the Year, Dawn Staley has the Owls primed for their third title in five years. Defending A-10 Tournament champions, Temple is led by A-10 Player of the Year candidate Candice Dupree. Dupree, who leads the Owls in scoring (16.4 ppg) and rebounding (9.2 per game), was held to just 9.5 points in Temple's two games versus the Hawks. Jordan (12.9 ppg), sophomore forward Kamesha Hairston (12.7 ppg), Moore (8.5 ppg) and junior guard Jennifer Owens (4.7 ppg) will likely start for the Owls.

#### SCOUTING THE ENTIRE BRACKET

Should the Hawks advance to the semifinals of the Atlantic 10 Tournament, Saint Joseph's would face either Xavier (#2 seed in the A-10 West), Massachusetts (#3 seed in the A-10 East) or Duquesne (#6 seed in the A-10 West). The Hawks went a combined 1-3 versus the trio, with their lone victory coming at Duquesne, 79-68. On the other side of the bracket, Saint Joseph's posted a 3-6 record against possible opponents, including a 69-65 victory over Rhode Island (#2 seed in the A-10 East). The Hawks held their own against the opposing bracket, losing five of those six games by eight points or less. Richmond (#3 seed in the A-10 West) was the only team to beat Saint Joseph's by more, downing Saint Joseph's 66-41 on January 30.

#### GOMEZ TURNS IT UP IN ATLANTIC 10 PLAY

Expectations were high for freshman guard **Timisha Gomez**. A two-time *Street and Smith's* honorable mention All-American at Long Reach High School, Gomez was named to the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Rookie team. While having a solid start to the season, averaging 3.1 points and 3.2 rebounds per game, Gomez still had room for improvement. The 5-foot-8 guard showed the A-10 what she has learned from the non-conference schedule. Gomez, averaged 5.1 ppg in conference-only games, has increased her scoring to 4.3 points per game. She also became one of the better Hawk rebounders in A-10 play, grabbing 3.5 boards per game. She had a career-day at Massachusetts, scoring 14 points, while handing out five assists, recording two blocks and a steal to go with eight rebounds.

#### MCBRYAN NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Saint Joseph's junior **Maura McBryan** has been named to the 2005 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District 2 Teams Second Team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). McBryan, a history major with a 3.87 grade point average, is a five-time member of Saint Joseph's University Athletic Director's Honor Roll. She is the two-time recipient of the Chris DiJulia Award given to the most inspirational member of the SJU women's basketball team. She has also been named to the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll three times.

#### START IT UP

For Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin**, having only one returning starter from last year's squad was a challenge. Trying to find a combination of starters that click has been an even tougher task for the fourth-year Hawk coach. The following is a breakdown of starting rotations and SJU's record when they start.

#### S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY:

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them-Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia-is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of S-A-I-N-T Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

**POLLOCK AMONG A-10 LEADERS**

After redshirting the 2003-04 season, center **Erica Pollock** has given the Hawks a solid inside presence. On the season, Pollock has proven to be a solid player at both ends for SJU, ranking 27th in scoring (9.2 ppg) and averaging 1.11 blocks per game (sixth in the A-10). She is also grabbing 6.0 rebounds (Tied for 17th) and ranks 11th in the A-10 in offensive rebounds at 2.39 a game.

**FFRENCH HITS SOPHOMORE STRIDE**

With a new season came a new role for sophomore guard **Whitney Ffrench**. As a freshman, Ffrench saw action in nine games, averaging 1.8 points in 5.7 minutes. This season, Ffrench has proven to be a consistent contributor for the Hawks, averaging 6.1 points in 27.1 minutes per game. Ffrench has also shown a knack of getting to the foul line, ranking seventh in the Atlantic 10 in free-throw percentage at 73.5 percent (75-102).

**PASS THE WINDEX**

Junior forward **Faith Schutte** is enjoying a break-out season for the Hawks on the boards. This season, Schutte has grabbed 148 rebounds, 72 more than her total from the previous two seasons combined. The increase has also boosted Schutte's career average from 1.3 rebounds a game to 2.6 rpg.

**MORE OF MAURA**

Dating back to last December, **Maura McBryan** has been a staple in the Hawks starting lineup. Beginning December 18, 2003 versus Virginia, McBryan has started 55 of the next 56 games, including all 27 this season. Versus Fordham last February 29, McBryan came off the bench as five seniors were honored with a start on senior day. Over the 56-game stretch, McBryan has averaged 6.4 points and 4.1 rebounds, increasing it to 9.0 points and 5.5 boards this season. McBryan has posted three double-doubles this season against Mississippi State (10 pts./11 reb.), versus Penn (12 pts./10 reb.) and at Rhode Island (19 pts./11 reb). The 6-foot forward has also set a new career-high in scoring with 20 versus George Washington on February 17.

**SCANLON PROVIDES SPARK OFF THE BENCH**

After seeing limited action in her first two seasons, junior guard **Christen Scanlon** has been a solid contributor off the Hawk bench. A former Saint Joseph's rower, Scanlon has seen action in a career-best 13 games this season. She has averaged 0.8 points and 0.9 rebounds in 4.9 minutes per contest. Scanlon also has set career-bests in points (six at Ohio State), rebounds (four at Drexel) and minutes (14 at Drexel). Prior to this season, she had played only 12 minutes over nine games, scoring two points versus La Salle last year.

**CONTRACT EXTENDED**

Saint Joseph's University Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** received a two-year contract extension in September. The agreement extends Griffin's term at the university through the 2008-09 season. Griffin has posted a 68-40 record in her four years on Hawk Hill.

## LONG RANGE ROTH

After losing two of the program's best three-point threats to graduation last year, Saint Joseph's deep threat seemed in-doubt heading into the 2004-05 season. Thankfully for the Hawks, junior **Christine Roth** has provided a spark from long range. Roth, a junior-college transfer from Genesee Community College, has drained 49 three-pointers on the season, tying for third in the Atlantic 10. Unfortunately for Saint Joseph's, Roth and her 7.0 points a game will likely be out the remainder of the season with a broken left foot.

## FOREIGN AFFAIR

The Hawks have been very effective at attracting talented international players to SJU. Presently, the Crimson and Gray have two foreign players - sophomores **Whitney Ffrench** (Nova Scotia, Canada) and **Zoya Pavlovskaya** (St. Petersburg, Russia) - on their 2004-05 roster. Overall, nine international players have worn the Crimson and Gray. The others are Alix Burns - England (1986-89), Megan Compain - New Zealand (1994-97), Jana Lichnerova - Slovakia (1997-00), Barbora Kuklova - Slovakia (1997-00), Susan Moran - Ireland (1999-02), Irina Krasnoshiok - Moldova (2001-04) and Amra Mehmedic - (2001-04).

## INSEPARABLE

As the season begins, juniors **Maura McBryan** and **Kelly Springman** will once again look down the bench and see each other. Both Springman and McBryan helped Archbishop Carroll to a 2000 Philadelphia Catholic League title. Springman, a 2001 graduate of Archbishop Carroll, began her Saint Joseph's career in the 2001-02 season, while McBryan, a 2002 Archbishop Carroll graduate, came to Hawk Hill for 2002-03.

## CAPTAIN ON THE DECK

Leadership will be a major key to victory for Saint Joseph's this year. Hawks' Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** selected junior forward **Maura McBryan** and junior guard **Kelly Springman** as captains to lead the young squad for the 2004-05 season.

## COYLE OFFICIALLY TAKES REIGNS OF WNBA'S LIBERTY

Former Hawk assistant coach Pat Coyle was officially named head coach of the WNBA's New York Liberty. After being named interim head coach on July 3, Coyle helped the Liberty to a 13-10 record and a spot in the WNBA playoffs. Coyle spent three seasons (1989-90 through 1990-92) at Saint Joseph's and worked with current SJU head coach **Cindy Griffin** and assistant coach **Joe Logan** while the head coach at Loyola (1992-98).

## HEART OF A HAWK

In addition to athletics and academics, community service has long been one of the traditions of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball program. The "Heart of a Hawk" program is the team's way of "giving back" to the community. Each student athlete is required to complete a minimum of 10 hours of community service each semester.

## COSTELLO NAMED TO BIG 5 HALL OF FAME

A 1998 Saint Joseph's grad and standout on the hardwood, Maureen Costello was selected to the Big 5 Hall of Fame Class of 2004. A four-year letterwinner for the Hawks, Costello helped Saint Joseph's to two NCAA appearances and two City Series titles during her career. She currently ranks 10th in scoring (1,299 points), third in rebounding (952) and eighth in free-throws made (333). Costello, a 1998 Atlantic 10 First Team member and 1998 Big 5 MVP, is joined by 1969 La Salle graduate Roland "Fatty" Taylor. Induction ceremonies were held Dec. 3, at the Palestra.

## CRADLE OF COACHES

The Saint Joseph's University tradition of developing outstanding coaches has continued in recent years. ## THE HAWK MASCOT

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" has been flapping its wings for almost half a century, and now celebrates its golden anniversary with its 50th season of participation in 2004-05. "Hawks" has served as the nickname for Saint Joseph's athletic teams since 1929. The idea for The Hawk, as mascot, was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, eight SJU students have donned the costume. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *Sports Illustrated*, *Street & Smith Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine. Eastern Basketball tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot as well. In January 2001, *The Sporting News* named The Hawk as the Nation's Best Mascot in its "Best of College Basketball" issue. SJU junior **George Szczpanski** dons the costume for every Hawk women's game.

A two-time *Street & Smith's* Honorable Mention All-American, McDade has been a four-year starter for Nazareth Academy.
