TIPPING OFF

History could be made at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse Friday evening as Saint Joseph's makes its first appearance in the Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament, hosting Boston University. With a victory, the Hawks will earn the program's 300th home win. Setting that milestone will not be an easy task for Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin's** squad, as it returns only one starter, junior **Maura McBryan**, from last year's squad that went 22-11 and advanced to the "Elite Eight" of the Postseason WNIT. Friday's game also marks the debut of Boston University's Head Coach Kelly Greenberg. Greenberg, a 1989 graduate of La Salle, coached led Penn to two NCAA appearances over the past five seasons prior to accepting the Terriers head job in July.

SCOUTING THE TERRIERS

Fresh off a 19-11 season, Boston University is hoping a better start will be the key to earning a postseason berth this year. The Terriers, who lost their opening three games last season, will look to new head coach, Kelly Greenberg, to guide the Boston University to its first NCAA appearance since 2003. The Terriers, who lost three starters from last season, return a solid one-two punch in senior forwards Adrienne Norris and Becky Bonner. Norris, who averaged 9.8 points and 7.2 rebounds per game last year, was named to the America East Preseason All-Conference Team, while Bonner is coming off a solid junior season in which she averaged 14.1 points and 4.4 rebounds per game.

THE SERIES

Saint Joseph's ride a three-game winning streak against Boston University into tonight's matchup with the Terriers. The Hawks hold a 3-1 series lead, earning a 58-45 in the last matchup, November 30, 2002 at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. Boston University's lone win came in the first ever matchup with the Hawks, a 79-68 decision January 30, 1981 in Boston.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

A new-look Hawks squad will take the floor Friday, as Saint Joseph's returns only one starter, junior forward **Maura McBryan**, from last year's Postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament run. The 2004-05 team has a combination of five juniors, four sophomores, three freshmen and no seniors, a stark contrast from last year's team that featured six seniors.

TRAINER'S ROOM

Junior **Kelly Springman** will miss the opening two-to-three weeks of the season after undergoing left knee surgery Monday to repair a torn meniscus. Springman has had previous knee surgery to repair a meniscus as a sophomore and torn anterior cruciate ligament in high school.

OPEN UP

Saint Joseph's opens its 32nd season boasting an impressive record in season and home openers. In season-opening games, the Hawks have posted a 22-9 record overall, winning six of their past eight openers. Even more impressive, Saint Joseph's has compiled a 28-3 mark in home openers. The last time the Hawks lost a season opening game was November 22, 2002, dropping a 59-44 decision to Big 5 rival Villanova. That loss also marked the last time Saint Joseph's lost a home opener as well.

LINING THINGS UP

Even though the 2004-05 Saint Joseph's squad returns only one starter, it boasts a good degree of depth at every position. Junior forward **Maura McBryan**, the team's lone returning starter, is joined in the front court by classmate **Faith Schutte**, and red-shirt freshman **Erica Pollock**. Junior **Kelly Springman** and sophomore **Ayahna Cornish** will bolster the back court with help from junior **Christen Scanlon** and sophomore **Whitney Ffrench**. Incoming junior **Christine Roth** and freshman **Timisha Gomez** will contribute right away for the Hawks at guard. Sophomore **Zoya Pavlovskaya** and freshman **Krista Hutchison** will challenge immediately for playing time at center.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK:

The 2003-04 Hawks made it three consecutive seasons that Saint Joseph's earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. The Hawks made it to the quarterfinals in 2004, and the second round in 2002 and 2003. With Friday's appearance in the Preseason WNIT, Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** will have assured her team of making a WNIT appearance in each of her first four seasons.

300 AND COUNTING:

With its next victory at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, the Hawks will earn their 300th home win in program history. Saint Joseph's has gone 24 consecutive seasons since its last losing season at home (6-8 during the 1979-80).

HAWKS PICKED SECOND IN A-10 EAST

The Saint Joseph's women's basketball team was picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 East by the Atlantic 10 coaches and media, conference officials at the A-10 basketball media day in early November. The Hawks, who return only one starter from last year's 22-11 team, were picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 East, behind 2004 A-10 Champions Temple. The Owls, who received all 30 first-place votes, were followed by the Hawks, Rhode Island in third, Massachusetts in fourth, Fordham in fifth and St. Bonaventure in sixth.

GOMEZ EARNS PRESEASON ACCOLADES

SJU freshman guard **Timisha Gomez** was selected to the A-10's Preseason All-Rookie team, by the Atlantic 10 coaches and media, conference officials announced at the A-10 basketball media day in early November. Gomez, who averaged 16.6 points and 8.4 rebounds per game as a senior at Long Reach, joins Jocelyn Chandler of Duquesne, Brittny Picconi of Xavier, Lisa Steele of George Washington and Alisha Tatham of Massachusetts on the rookie squad.

DOWN RIGHT OFFENSIVE

The 2003-04 Saint Joseph's women's basketball team made history last year as it was only the eighth squad in NCAA history to feature a lineup with four 1,000-point scorers. Irina Krasnoshiok (1,241), Stephanie Graff (1,193) and Amra Mehmedic (1,034) all rank among the top-25 scorers in program history. Erin Brady, who transferred to Hawk Hill after her sophomore season at American University, scored 707 of her 1,076 in a Saint Joseph's uniform.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

Last season, while the Hawks offense gained most of the attention, it was Saint Joseph's defense that keyed its run in the Postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament. While no single player garnered a defensive award, the Hawks finishing 2003-04 26th in the nation in defense, holding opponents to 57.7 points per game. The Hawks have held opponents to under 50-points seven times this season (Drexel, Lehigh, Massachusetts twice, Richmond, and Fordham twice). SJU has won 67 straight games when holding its opponent to under the half-century mark. The last loss was a 47-46 defeat to Duquesne on January 14, 1995.

PACK THE HOUSE

On January 29, 2004, a sell-out crowd of 3,200 fans packed Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse to watch Saint Joseph's take on the No. 5/No.6 ranked Penn State. The game marked the seventh sell-out in program history and first since the 2001-02 season. The Hawks also added two other top-10 marks last year as it hosted the 2004 Atlantic 10 Championship. A crowd of 2,822 saw Saint Joseph's down George Washington 70-57 on March 7 and 2,106 saw the Hawks down Duquesne 73-63 the previous day.

CAPTAINS

Leadership will be a major key to victory for Saint Joseph's this year. Hawks' Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** selected junior forward **Maura McBryan** and junior guard **Kelly Springman** as captains to lead the young squad for the 2004-05 season.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY FIELD HOUSE

Saint Joseph's University's famed Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse celebrated its 55th anniversary on Thursday. The Field House, which has been home to Hawks' women's basketball for 31 seasons, was built as a memorial for Saint Joseph's University alums and students who lost their lives protecting the United States during World War II.

SCORING OUTPUT

After losing 80 percent of their scoring output, the Hawks will look for several players to increase their output. Top returning scorer, sophomore **Ayahna Cornish**, averaged 5.2 points per game last year. The 2004-05 squad has totalled 616 career points, a stark contrast from last year's team that featured four 1,000-point scorers.

NEWLYWEDS

Wedding bells rang twice over summer for the Hawks as junior **Faith Gross** wed Christo Schutte, while assistant coach **Joe Logan** exchanged vows with his fiancé Susan.

STREET AND SMITH'S PICKS GOMEZ

Freshman guard **Timisha Gomez** begins her freshman season at Saint Joseph's after compiling an impressive resumé at Long Reach High School. The all-time leading scorer at Long Reach, Gomez was a two time *Street and Smith's* honorable mention All-American. As a senior Gomez averaged 16.0 points and 8.4 rebounds, earning All-County honors from the *Washington Post*, *Baltimore Sun* and *Columbia Flyer*.

FOREIGN AFFAIR

The Hawks have been very effective at attracting talented international players to SJU. Presently, the Crimson and Gray have two foreign players - sophomores **Whitney Ffrench** (Nova Scotia, Canada) and **Zoya Pavlovskaya** (St. Petersburg, Russia) - on their 2004-05 roster. Overall, nine international players have worn the Crimson and Gray. The others are Alix Burns - England (1986-89), Megan Compain - New Zealand (1994-97), Jana Lichnerova - Slovakia (1997-00), Barbora Kuklova - Slovakia (1997-00), Susan Moran - Ireland (1999-02), Irina Krasnoshiok - Moldova (2001-04) and Amra Mehmedic - (2001-04).

CONTRACT EXTENDED

Saint Joseph's University Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** received a two-year contract extension, school officials announced in September. The agreement extends Griffin's term at the university through the 2008-09 season. In her three seasons leading the Hawks, Griffin has led her squad to three consecutive appearances in Postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament.

INSEPARABLE

As the season begins, juniors **Maura McBryan** and **Kelly Springman** will once again look down the bench and see each other. Both Springman and McBryan helped Archbishop Carroll to a 2000 Philadelphia Catholic League title. Springman, a 2001 graduate of Archbishop Carroll, began her Saint Joseph's career in the 2001-02 season, while McBryan, a 2002 Archbishop Carroll graduate, came to Hawk Hill for 2002-03.

ROW YOUR BOAT ASHORE

SJU junior **Christen Scanlon** pulled double duty for the Hawks as a freshman. One of the Philadelphia region's top prep rowers, she also hit the water with SJU's women's rowing team. Scanlon helped the Hawks' highly successful freshman 8 win a gold medal at the ECAC Championship and a silver at the Dad Vail Regatta.

DOUBLE TAKE

Fans will once again be thrown for a loop when Saint Joseph's travels to Drexel this year. That is because Hawk junior **Christen Scanlon's** twin sister, Catherine, suits up for the Dragons. It is not a surprise that the sisters went their separate way in college, as they also attended different high schools growing up. Catherine played her high school ball at Cardinal O'Hara, while Christen was a teammate of former Hawk Stephanie Graff at Archbishop Prendergast.

THE MISSION OF FAITH

Hawk junior **Faith Schutte** spent her junior year and half of her senior year of high school with her family serving as a missionary near Pretoria, South Africa. Her father was co-pastor of a local church, where she helped to organize clothing drives and furniture donations and was an active member of youth organizations. When not attending to pastoral duties, Schutte's father also served as the basketball coach of her high school team in South Africa, Lyttelton Manor. She played point guard at the English-speaking school and averaged 23.0 ppg. In addition, she competed on an AAU-style club team, earning postseason MVP honors and helping the team to the league title.

THANKSGIVING IN MAINE

For the second consecutive season, the Hawks will be spending the Thanksgiving holiday on the road. Last year, Saint Joseph's was in Miami, Florida for the Herald Thanksgiving Classic, hosted by Florida International. This season, the Hawks will be Orono, Maine to participate in the Dead River Classic. Mississippi State, Loyola of Chicago and host University of Maine round out the tournament field.

KEEPING THE DREAM ALIVE

Saint Joseph 2004 graduates Erin Brady and Stephanie Graff both kept their dreams of playing professionally alive, as both agreed to play in Ireland this season. Brady agreed to terms with the Bausch and Lomb Wildcats of Waterford, Ireland, while Graff joined the University of Limerick/Augninish of Limerick, Ireland. Graff's UL/Augninish team is coming off two consecutive Irish Women's SuperLeague title, beating Brady's new team, Bausch and Lomb, in 2004.

MOVING ON UP

Former Hawk assistant coach Pat Coyle was named interim head coach of the WNBA's New York Liberty on July 6. Coyle spent three seasons (1989-90 through 1990-92) at Saint Joseph's and worked with current SJU head coach Cindy Griffin and assistant coach Joe Logan while the head coach at Loyola (1992-98).

SJU OLYMPIANS

Former Saint Joseph's University stand-out Megan Compain (Class of 1997) competed in the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens as a member of the New Zealand national women's basketball. Compain joined former Hawk rower and current U.S. men's National Rowing Team head coach Mike Teti (Class of 1978) and United States heavyweight boxing alternate Chazz Witherspoon (Class of 2004) in Greece.

S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY:

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them-Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia-is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of S-A-I-N-T Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

COSTELLO NAMED TO BIG 5 HALL OF FAME

A 1998 Saint Joseph's grad and standout on the hardwood, Maureen Costello was selected to the Big 5 Hall of Fame Class of 2004. A four-year letterwinner for the Hawks, Costello helped Saint Joseph's to two NCAA appearances and two City Series titles during her career. She currently ranks 10th in scoring (1,299 points), third in rebounding (952) and eighth in free-throws made (333). Costello, a 1998 Atlantic 10 First Team member and 1998 Big 5 MVP, is joined by 1969 La Salle graduate Roland "Fatty" Taylor. Induction ceremonies will be held Dec. 3, at the Palestra.

BIG 5 BRAGGING RIGHTS

While not a formal conference, the Big 5 is an agreement between five major Philadelphia area universities (La Salle, Pennsylvania, Saint Joseph's, Temple and Villanova) to play an annual round-robin series of games as part of their regular season schedule. The winner of the competition results in an annual "City Series" champion. Saint Joseph's success in the Big Five over the last 20 years is astounding. SJU has won 14 Big Five titles during that period, including ten outright crowns. In addition to the titles, the Hawks are the all-time winningest team in Big Five history, recording a 80-22 (.784) record in 26 years of competition.

CRADLE OF COACHES

The Saint Joseph's University tradition of developing outstanding coaches has continued in recent years. Here is a list of SJU grads, who are presently in the head coaching ranks at the college level, Cindy (Anderson) Griffin '91 (Saint Joseph's), Muffet (O'Brien) McGraw '77 (Notre Dame) and Dale Hodges (Arcadia). The others, all assistants or high school coaches, are: Barb Black (Mount St. Joseph's Academy), Robyne Bostick (Long Island), Kathy Costello (Nazareth Academy), Jen Greenwell (Long Island), Tracy Harmon (Archbishop Wood H.S.), Amy Mallon (Episcopal Academy), Alix (Burns) Mayock (Duquesne Academy), Mary (McGroerty) McDonald (Cardinal Dougherty), Kelley (Devine) Meury (Ohio State), Susan Moran (Saint Joseph's), Wendy (Brink) Jilson (Colonial Forge H.S.), Jeanine (Reynolds) Delaney (Clearview Regional), and Amra Mehmedic (Long Island).

The Hawks adieu to a sextet of seniors last May. Erin Brady, Stephanie Graff, Esther Hoffer, Irina Krasnoshiok, Amra Mehmedic and Elizabeth "Hootie" Mohan helped guide Saint Joseph's to its third consecutive Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance last spring.

HODGES' NUMBER HANGS IN THE RAFTERS

Former Hawk star **Dale Hodges** (1988-90) became the first woman in SJU basketball history to have her jersey number retired during pregame ceremonies of Saint Joseph's game versus Air Force on Dec. 28, 1999. The most celebrated player in Hawk history, she wore #44 for the Crimson and Gray. A first team All-American as a senior, she holds 29 school records, including most rebounds (1,049) and for a career. She was a two-time Atlantic 10 and Big 5 Player of the Year. Her number hangs from the rafters at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. The #30 with the name Anderson has also been retired at Saint Joseph's. Often mistakenly referred to as head coach **Cindy Griffin's** (nee Anderson) number when she played at SJU, the number was actually retired by the Hawk men's team in honor of Cliff Anderson. Griffin wore #11 as a Hawk player.

HEART OF A HAWK

In addition to athletics and academics, community service has long been one of the traditions of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball program. The "Heart of a Hawk" program is the team's way of "giving back" to the community. Each student athlete is required to complete a minimum of ten hours of community service each semester.

HODGES APPOINTED HEAD COACH AT ARCADIA

Saint Joseph's Hall of Famer, Dale Hodges, was named head coach at Arcadia University this fall. Hodges, a 1990 graduate of Saint Joseph's, played professionally in Spain from 1999-04.

THE HAWK MASCOT

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" has been flapping its wings for almost half a century, and now celebrates its golden anniversary with its 50th season of participation in 2004-05. "Hawks" has served as the nickname for Saint Joseph's athletic teams since 1929. The idea for The Hawk, as mascot, was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, eight SJU students have donned the costume. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *Sports Illustrated*, *Street & Smith Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine. Eastern Basketball tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot as well. In January 2001, *The Sporting News* named The Hawk as the Nation's Best Mascot in its "Best of College Basketball" issue. SJU junior George Szczpanski dons the costume for every Hawk women's game.

WELCOME ABOARD

Among the new faces travelling with the Hawks this season will be Assistant Director of Athletic Communications at Saint Joseph's University Jack Jumper. Jumper, who began in August, worked the past two years at his alma mater St. Bonaventure University. He replaces Kevin Bonner, who accepted a position at Temple University.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Credentials for media covering Saint Joseph's at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, or selected games at The Palestra, should be made at least 24 hours in advance by contacting Jack Jumper at (610) 660-3389, by fax at (610) 660-1724, or by email (jjumper@sju.edu).

Priority is given to daily newspapers, radio/TV stations and other media who cover Saint Joseph's and its opponents on a regular basis. Internet sites and agencies that will be considered for credentials include those of national cable networks or established publications. Internet sites representing local or regional media outlets will be provided credentials on a space-available basis. Websites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are able to post anonymous information are ineligible for consideration of credentials.

PRESS ROW

Only accredited members of the media and accredited scouts will be issued credentials to cover Saint Joseph's basketball, and only those with passes will be permitted to sit in press seating. Members of the media are reminded that press row is a working area and cheering for either team will not be tolerated.

POST-GAME

Saint Joseph's head coach Cindy Griffin will be available in the interview room following a post-game cooling off period. The Saint Joseph's lockerroom will be open to the media after the cooling off period.

Radio stations designated as the primary visiting outlet can have access to phone lines at a cost of \$100 per line per game. (\$200 for ISDN), unless a reciprocal agreement exists.
