TIPPING OFF

Saint Joseph's looks to break its longest losing streak, three games, since the 2000-01 since with a win Friday afternoon against Mississippi State in the opening round of the Dead River Classic. Friday's matchup will also mark the first meeting between the Hawks and Lady Bulldogs.

SCOUTING THE LADY BULLDOGS

Mississippi State is looking to bounce back after falling to No. 9/12 Baylor, 66-49 on Tuesday. The Lady Bulldogs, who received votes in the latest *Associated Press* Top-25 Poll, senior guard Tan White, are led by preseason Naismith Trophy candidate. White, who was named 2004 Southeastern Conference Player of the Year, picked up where from where she finished last year, averaging 25.0 points and 5.5 rebounds per game over the opening two contests. Classmate Tiana Burns is also off to a quick start, averaging 15.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game and posted a double-double versus Baylor. The backcourt duo of Tan and Burns have accounted for 57 percent (80 of 140 points) of Mississippi States scoring. Junior guard Doceide Warren (6.5 ppg), junior forward Mamie McKinney (3.0 ppg) and senior forward Rebecca Kates (2.5 ppg) will likely round out the starting five for the Lady Bulldogs.

THE SERIES

Friday's matchup will be the first time the Hawks and Lady Bulldogs have met. Saint Joseph's has a 3-12 program record against Southeastern Conference teams, with its last win coming against Alabama (74-69 OT) on December 29, 1997. Mississippi State has made only had three appearances against Atlantic 10 teams, posting a 1-2. The Lady Bulldogs lone victory over the A-10 came against Xavier (78-64) during the 2002-03 season.

LAST GAME: ILLINOIS USES 12-2 RUN TO DOWN HAWKS, 64-50

A 12-2 run halfway through the second half proved to be the difference as Illinois downed Saint Joseph's women's basketball team, 64-50, Tuesday at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. The Fighting Illini, clinging to a two point lead, 41-39, went on a 12-2 run, from 10:07 to 5:41, to take a commanding 55-41 lead that they wouldn't relinquish. Illinois' Jeré Issenmann drained two three pointers and Tiffanie Guthrie capped the run with a layup. Saint Joseph's would get no closer than 11 over the final five minutes, as the Fighting Illini made three of four free throws over the final 60 seconds. Redshirt freshman **Erica Pollock** led the Hawks with a career-best 16 points, while junior **Maura McBryan** posted a season-best 12 points.

TRAINER'S ROOM

Sophomore **Ayahna Cornish** will continue to sit out with a broken bone in her right foot. Cornish, who suffered the injury on November 6, is expected to miss another three-to-four weeks. Classmate **Whitney Ffrench** returned to the lineup Tuesday after sitting out Saturday's game with stiffness in her neck.

TIME IS ON HER SIDE

As the cliché goes, what a difference a year makes for sophomore guard **Whitney Ffrench**. As a freshman, Ffrench saw limited action, playing 51 minutes over nine games. This season, Ffrench has already eclipsed her playing time from the past year, earning 82 minutes of playing time in three games. Ffrench is averaging 27.3 minutes per game in 2004-05, a stark contrast from last season's 5.7 average.

POLLOCK RANKS AMONG A-10 LEADERS

After redshirting the 2003-04 season, forward/center **Erica Pollock** has given the Hawks a solid inside presence. Through the first four games of the season, Pollock has averaged 10.0 points per game, tying for 22nd overall in the Atlantic 10. Pollock has also proven to be a solid defender for Saint Joseph's, averaging nearly a block per game (0.75), ranking 14th. On Tuesday, Pollock scored a career-best 16 points on 4-of-8 shooting and 8-of-13 from the charity stripe.

SPRINGMAN RETURNS TO ROTATION

Saint Joseph's welcomed back junior guard **Kelly Springman** Saturday at Drexel. Springman was held out of for the opening two games after undergoing knee surgery to repair a torn meniscus. Versus Drexel, Springman poured in nine points and posted a career-best six assists. Tuesday, Springman made her first start of the season, scoring six points and grabbing four rebounds versus Illinois. For the season, she is averaging 7.5, 3.0 rebounds and a team-best 3.0 assists per game.

HAWKS PICKED SECOND IN A-10 EAST

The Saint Joseph's women's basketball team was picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 East by the Atlantic 10 coaches and media, conference officials at the A-10 basketball media day in early November. The Hawks, who return only one starter from last year's 22-11 team, were picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 East, behind 2004 A-10 Champions Temple. The Owls, who received all 30 first-place votes, were followed by the Hawks, Rhode Island in third, Massachusetts in fourth, Fordham in fifth and St. Bonaventure in sixth.

SCANLON OFF TO SOLID START

After seeing only limited action in her first two seasons, junior guard **Christen Scanlon** has been an intricate part of this season's Hawk squad. Through the first three games, Scanlon is averaging 2.7 points and 2.7 rebounds in 9.7 minutes per game. She also has set career-bests in points (six at Ohio State), rebounds (four at Drexel) and minutes (14 at Drexel). Prior to this season, Scanlon had played only 12 minutes over nine games, scoring two points versus La Salle last year.

MORE OF MAURA

Dating back to last December, **Maura McBryan** has been a staple in the Hawks starting lineup. Beginning December 18, 2003 versus Virginia, McBryan has started 31 of the next 32 games, including the first four this season. Versus Fordham last February 29, McBryan came off the bench as five seniors were honored with a start on senior day. Over 32-game stretch, McBryan has averaged 4.5 points and 3.0 rebounds and has increased her output to 7.0 points and 4.3 rebounds four games into the 2004-05 season.

300 AND COUNTING

With the season opening win on November 12 at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, the Hawks earned their 300th home win in program history. Saint Joseph's has gone 24 consecutive seasons since its last losing season at home (6-8 during the 1979-80).

TRIFECTA

No matter win or lose, Saint Joseph's has been consistent in for 66 straight games. Dating back to November 24, 2002 versus Virginia, the Hawks have converted at least one three-point basket in every contest to date. The last time Saint Joseph's failed to drain a trifecta was in a 59-44 loss to Villanova on November 22, 2002. The Hawks went 0-8 from behind the arc that day.

THANKSGIVING IN MAINE

For the second consecutive season, the Hawks are spending the Thanksgiving holiday on the road. Last year, Saint Joseph's was in Miami, Florida for the Herald Thanksgiving Classic, hosted by Florida International. This season, the Hawks are in Orono, Maine for the Dead River Classic. Saint Joseph's faces Mississippi State on Friday and either Loyola of Chicago or the University of Maine on Saturday.

FRIENDLY FACES

For the fourth consecutive game, Saint Joseph's saw a familiar face on the opposing bench Tuesday. Illinois Head Coach Theresa Grentz began her illustrious coaching career at Hawk Hill from 1974-76. Tuesday's game will be the second time the Saint Joseph's has faced a former mentor as the Hawks matched up against former Hawk head coach, and current Ohio State head coach, Jim Foster. Saint Joseph's also faced former player and current Drexel Assistant Coach Amy Mallon and former Penn and current Boston University Head Coach Kelly Greenberg.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

A new-look Hawks' squad took floor Friday, as Saint Joseph's returned only one starter, junior forward **Maura McBryan**, from last year's Postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament run. The 2004-05 team has a combination of five juniors, four sophomores, three freshmen and no seniors, a stark contrast from last year's team that featured six seniors.

GOMEZ EARNS PRESEASON ACCOLADES

SJU freshman guard **Timisha Gomez** was selected to the A-10's Preseason All-Rookie team, by the Atlantic 10 coaches and media, conference officials announced at the A-10 basketball media day in early November. Gomez, who averaged 16.6 points and 8.4 rebounds per game as a senior at Long Reach, joins Jocelyn Chandler of Duquesne, Brittny Picconi of Xavier, Lisa Steele of George Washington and Alisha Tatham of Massachusetts on the rookie squad.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Leadership will be a major key to victory for Saint Joseph's this year. Hawks' Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** selected junior forward **Maura McBryan** and junior guard **Kelly Springman** as captains to lead the young squad for the 2004-05 season.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY FIELD HOUSE

Saint Joseph's University's famed Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse celebrated its 55th anniversary on Thursday, November 11. The Field House, which is in its 32nd season as home to SJU women's basketball, was built as a memorial for Saint Joseph's alums and students who lost their lives protecting the United States during World War II.

LINING THINGS UP

Even though the 2004-05 Saint Joseph's squad returns only one starter, it boasts a good degree of depth at every position. Junior forward **Maura McBryan**, the team's lone returning starter, is joined in the front court by classmate **Faith Schutte**, and red-shirt freshman **Erica Pollock**. Junior **Kelly Springman** and sophomore **Ayahna Cornish** will bolster the back court with help from junior **Christen Scanlon** and sophomore **Whitney Ffrench**. Incoming junior **Christine Roth** and freshman **Timisha Gomez** will contribute right away for the Hawks at guard. Sophomore **Zoya Pavlovskaya** and freshman **Krista Hutchison** will challenge immediately for playing time at center.

SCORING OUTPUT

After losing 80 percent of their scoring output, the Hawks will look for several players to increase their output. Top returning scorer, sophomore **Ayahna Cornish**, averaged 5.2 points per game last year. The 2004-05 squad has totalled 616 career points, a stark contrast from last year's team that featured four 1,000-point scorers.

CONTRACT EXTENDED

Saint Joseph's University Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** received a two-year contract extension in September. The agreement extends Griffin's term at the university through the 2008-09 season. Griffin has posted a 66-31 record in her four years on Hawk Hill.

INSEPARABLE

As the season begins, juniors **Maura McBryan** and **Kelly Springman** will once again look down the bench and see each other. Both Springman and McBryan helped Archbishop Carroll to a 2000 Philadelphia Catholic League title. Springman, a 2001 graduate of Archbishop Carroll, began her Saint Joseph's career in the 2001-02 season, while McBryan, a 2002 Archbishop Carroll graduate, came to Hawk Hill for 2002-03.

FOREIGN AFFAIR

The Hawks have been very effective at attracting talented international players to SJU. Presently, the Crimson and Gray have two foreign players - sophomores **Whitney Ffrench** (Nova Scotia, Canada) and **Zoya Pavlovskaya** (St. Petersburg, Russia) - on their 2004-05 roster. Overall, nine international players have worn the Crimson and Gray. The others are Alix Burns - England (1986-89), Megan Compain - New Zealand (1994-97), Jana Lichnerova - Slovakia (1997-00), Barbora Kuklova - Slovakia (1997-00), Susan Moran - Ireland (1999-02), Irina Krasnoshiok - Moldova (2001-04) and Amra Mehmedic - (2001-04).

NEWLYWEDS

Wedding bells rang twice over summer for the Hawks as junior **Faith Gross** wed Christo Schutte, while assistant coach **Joe Logan** exchanged vows with his fiancé Susan.

STREET AND SMITH'S PICKS GOMEZ

Freshman guard **Timisha Gomez** begins her freshman season at Saint Joseph's after compiling an impressive resumé at Long Reach High School. The all-time leading scorer at Long Reach, Gomez was a two time *Street and Smith's* honorable mention All-American. As a senior Gomez averaged 16.0 points and 8.4 rebounds, earning All-County honors from the *Washington Post*, *Baltimore Sun* and *Columbia Flyer*.

THE MISSION OF FAITH

Hawk junior **Faith Schutte** spent her junior year and half of her senior year of high school with her family serving as a missionary near Pretoria, South Africa. Her father was co-pastor of a local church, where she helped to organize clothing drives and furniture donations and was an active member of youth organizations. When not attending to pastoral duties, Schutte's father also served as the basketball coach of her high school team in South Africa, Lyttelton Manor. She played point guard at the English-speaking school and averaged 23.0 ppg. In addition, she competed on an AAU-style club team, earning postseason MVP honors and helping the team to the league title.

MOVING ON UP

Former Hawk assistant coach Pat Coyle was named interim head coach of the WNBA's New York Liberty on July 6. Coyle spent three seasons (1989-90 through 1990-92) at Saint Joseph's and worked with current SJU head coach Cindy Griffin and assistant coach Joe Logan while the head coach at Loyola (1992-98).

KEEPING THE DREAM ALIVE

Saint Joseph 2004 graduates Erin Brady and Stephanie Graff both kept their dreams of playing professionally alive, as both agreed to play in Ireland this season. Brady agreed to terms with the Bausch and Lomb Wildcats of Waterford, Ireland, while Graff joined the University of Limerick / Auginish of Limerick, Ireland. Graff's UL / Auginish team is coming off two consecutive Irish Women's SuperLeague title, beating Brady's new team, Bausch and Lomb, in 2004.

HODGES APPOINTED HEAD COACH AT ARCADIA

Saint Joseph's Hall of Famer, Dale Hodges, was named head coach at Arcadia University this fall. Hodges, a 1990 graduate of Saint Joseph's, played professionally in Spain from 1999-04.

S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY:

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them-Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia-is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of S-A-I-N-T Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

SJU OLYMPIANS

Former Saint Joseph's University stand-out Megan Compain (Class of 1997) competed in the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens as a member of the New Zealand national women's basketball. Compain joined former Hawk rower and current U.S. men's National Rowing Team head coach Mike Teti (Class of 1978) and United States heavyweight boxing alternate Chazz Witherspoon (Class of 2004) in Greece.

COSTELLO NAMED TO BIG 5 HALL OF FAME

A 1998 Saint Joseph's grad and standout on the hardwood, Maureen Costello was selected to the Big 5 Hall of Fame Class of 2004. A four-year letterwinner for the Hawks, Costello helped Saint Joseph's to two NCAA appearances and two City Series titles during her career. She currently ranks 10th in scoring (1,299 points), third in rebounding (952) and eighth in free-throws made (333). Costello, a 1998 Atlantic 10 First Team member and 1998 Big 5 MVP, is joined by 1969 La Salle graduate Roland "Fatty" Taylor. Induction ceremonies will be held Dec. 3, at the Palestra.

BIG 5 BRAGGING RIGHTS

While not a formal conference, the Big 5 is an agreement between five major Philadelphia area universities (La Salle, Pennsylvania, Saint Joseph's, Temple and Villanova) to play an annual round-robin series of games as part of their regular season schedule. The winner of the competition results in an annual "City Series" champion. Saint Joseph's success in the Big Five over the last 20 years is astounding. SJU has won 14 Big Five titles during that period, including ten outright crowns. In addition to the titles, the Hawks are the all-time winningest team in Big Five history, recording a 80-22 (.784) record in 26 years of competition.

DOWN RIGHT OFFENSIVE

The 2003-04 Saint Joseph's team made history last year as it was only the eighth squad in NCAA history to feature a lineup with four 1,000-point scorers. Irina Krasnoshiok (1,241), Stephanie Graff (1,193) and Amra Mehmedic (1,034) all rank in the top-25 scorers in SJU history. Erin Brady, who transferred to Hawk Hill after her sophomore season at American, scored 707 of her 1,076 at SJU.

THE HAWK MASCOT

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" has been flapping its wings for almost half a century, and now celebrates its golden anniversary with its 50th season of participation in 2004-05. "Hawks" has served as the nickname for Saint Joseph's athletic teams since 1929. The idea for The Hawk, as mascot, was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, eight SJU students have donned the costume. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *Sports Illustrated*, *Street & Smith Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine. Eastern Basketball tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot as well. In January 2001, *The Sporting News* named The Hawk as the Nation's Best Mascot in its "Best of College Basketball" issue. SJU junior **George Szczpanski** dons the costume for every Hawk women's game.

THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES

The Hawks adieu to a sextet of seniors last May. Erin Brady, Stephanie Graff, Esther Hoffer, Irina Krasnoshiok, Amra Mehmedic and Elizabeth "Hootie" Mohan helped guide Saint Joseph's to its third consecutive Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance last spring.

TENACIOUS D

Last season, while the Hawks offense gained most of the attention, it was Saint Joseph's defense that keyed its run in the Postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament. While no single player garnered a defensive award, the Hawks finished 2003-04 26th in the nation in defense, holding opponents to 57.7 points per game. The Hawks held opponents to under 50-points seven times last season (Drexel, Lehigh, Massachusetts twice, Richmond, and Fordham twice). SJU has won 68 straight games when holding its opponent to under the half-century mark. The last loss was a 47-46 defeat to Duquesne on January 14, 1995.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK

The 2003-04 Hawks made it three consecutive seasons that Saint Joseph's earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. The Hawks made it to the quarterfinals in 2004, and the second round in 2002 and 2003. With the appearance in the Preseason WNIT, Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** will have assured her team of making a WNIT appearance in each of her first four seasons.

CRADLE OF COACHES

The Saint Joseph's University tradition of developing outstanding coaches has continued in recent years. Here is a list of SJU grads, who are presently in the head coaching ranks at the college level, Cindy (Anderson) Griffin '91 (Saint Joseph's), Muffet (O'Brien) McGraw '77 (Notre Dame) and Dale Hodges '90 (Arcadia). HODGES' NUMBER HANGS IN THE RAFTERS

Former Hawk star **Dale Hodges** (1988-90) became the first woman in SJU basketball history to have her jersey number retired during pregame ceremonies of Saint Joseph's game versus Air Force on Dec. 28, 1999. The most celebrated player in Hawk history, she wore #44 for the Crimson and Gray. A first team All-American as a senior, she holds 29 school records, including most rebounds (1,049) and for a career. She was a two-time Atlantic 10 and Big 5 Player of the Year. Her number hangs from the rafters at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. The #30 with the name Anderson has also been retired at Saint Joseph's. Often mistakenly referred to as head coach **Cindy Griffin's** (nee Anderson) number when she played at SJU, the number was actually retired by the Hawk men's team in honor of Cliff Anderson. Griffin wore #11 as a Hawk player.

HEART OF A HAWK

In addition to athletics and academics, community service has long been one of the traditions of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball program. The "Heart of a Hawk" program is the team's way of "giving back" to the community. Each student athlete is required to complete a minimum of ten hours of community service each semester.

Jim Havens, also one of the voices of Hawk baseball, enters his fifth season behind the basketball microphone. The program director at WCOJ radio in West Chester, PA, he has previously served as the radio voice for Neuman College.

Phil Denne, SJU's associate director of athletic communications, coordinates SJSN's day-to-day operations and serves as the liaison between the athletic department and various broadcast media outlets. Denne is also the executive producer of both the "Hawk Talk" television and radio shows.
