**TIPPING OFF**

One losing streak will be snapped, while one will string on when Saint Joseph's hosts Rhode Island Sunday afternoon at 2 p.m. In the first of two games today that will match a Philadelphia team against a team from New England, the Hawks will try to extend the Rams skid to three games. Saint Joseph's, which has lost four straight contests, is 5-2 all-time when playing on Super Bowl Sunday. The Hawks' winning record might not boast well for the Eagles though, as the NFC has won only twice in those seven matchups.

**SCOUTING THE RAMS**

Rhode Island is coming off two heart-breaking losses, falling at home to Fordham (56-53) and at George Washington (64-61). Tied for third in the Atlantic 10 East, the Rams have had a week's rest to prepare for the Hawks. Offensively, Rhode Island is led by senior guard Peta Kneen's 15.1 points per game. Kneen, who is in the running A-10 Most Improved Player, has boosted her scoring 10.3 points per game from 4.8 ppg as a junior. Freshman guard Safi Mojidi and junior forward Tanya Rhodes are both averaging double figures in scoring, adding 12.8 and 12.6 points per game, respectively.

**THE SERIES**

The Hawks and Rams will meet for the first of two games this season come Sunday afternoon. Saint Joseph's, which holds a 40-5 series lead, is 18-3 all-time versus Rhode Island at home. However, the Rams won the previous meeting at Hawk Hill, a 61-51 decision on February 12 of last season.

**LAST MEETING: BRADY NETS 1,000TH AS HAWKS DOWN RHODE ISLAND, 68-58**

Senior Irina Krasnoshiok scored 23 points and classmate Erin Brady added 20, including the 1,000th of her career as Saint Joseph's held off host Rhode Island, 68-58, in Atlantic 10 Conference play. The Hawks opened up an 18-4 lead in the first four minutes and held on to for the victory despite a seven-minute scoring drought in the second half. Krasnoshiok and Brady combined to shoot 15-for-18 on the night as SJU improved to 17-9, 11-4 in the A-10.

**LAST TIME OUT: FORDHAM EXTENDS HAWKS LOSING STREAK TO FOUR**

The Rams handed Saint Joseph's its fourth straight loss, as Fordham downed the Hawks 47-43 Friday evening at Hawk Hill. Saint Joseph's fought back from an eight-point second-half deficit only to see their last-chance shot fall short. Fordham added two free throws with 4.7 seconds remaining to seal the game. Sophomore guard **Ayahna Cornish** posted a team-high 12 points in the loss (complete boxscore on page 24).

**TRAINER'S ROOM**

Junior guard **Kelly Springman** will miss another four weeks after fracturing a bone in her left wrist during a practice on January 19. Springman, Saint Joseph's leader in assists at 2.7 per game, missed the opening two games of the season after undergoing knee surgery to repair a torn meniscus.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE**

What a difference a year makes, literally for the Hawks. After struggling to put the ball in the hoop in 2004, Saint Joseph's has thrived in 2005. The Hawks, who averaged a mere 44.6 points per game over the first 12 games, have increased their output by 13 points per game to 57.6 ppg in 2005.

**NO SENIORITY**

The 2004-05 Hawks are one of seven teams nationally that boasts a lineup without a senior. Saint Joseph's, which consists of five juniors, four sophomores and three freshmen, is joined by Cal State Northridge, Canisius, Cornell, Dartmouth, Utah State and the University of Washington as teams without a senior.

**CONTROLLING THE ROCK**

Even though the Saint Joseph's backcourt had started only 17 games heading into the season, they have proven to control the ball quite well. The Hawks have improved from 16.3 turnovers per game last year to 14.7 this season. The change has helped Saint Joseph's to 23rd nationally in turnovers per game in the latest national rankings. The Hawks trail Big 5 rival Villanova (9.8 turnovers per game) for the national lead.

**CAREER YEARS**

With the loss of 80 percent of their offense to graduation last May, the returning Saint Joseph's players knew they would have to increase their scoring. Halfway through the 2004-05 season five of those six returning players have tied or set new career-highs in scoring. The following is a breakdown of those players.

**TRIFECTA**

After having their 72-consecutive game streak with a three pointer snapped by Villanova on December 11, the Hawks have started a new streak. Saint Joseph's, who went 0-9 versus the Wildcats, currently have a 10-game streak with a three pointer. Juniors **Maura McBryan**, **Christine Roth** and **Kelly Springman** give the Hawks several options from behind the arc and the trio has accounted for 79 of the Hawks 90 three pointers this season.

**A PLEASANT RETURN**

After sitting out the opening 10 games of the season with a broken bone in her right foot, sophomore guard **Ayahna Cornish** has brought a spark to the Hawks' offense. Cornish, who averaged 5.2 points per game as a freshman, is averaging a team-high 11.5 points per game. An explosive playmaker, Cornish scored a career-high 27 points in Saint Joseph's win at Duquesne. Cornish, who is averaging 11.9 points per game in Atlantic 10 contests, ranks 15th overall in conference-only scoring.

## GOMEZ TURNS IT UP IN ATLANTIC 10 PLAY

Expectations were high for freshman guard **Timisha Gomez**. A two-time *Street and Smith's* honorable mention All-American at Long Reach High School, Gomez was named to the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Rookie team. While having a solid start to the season, averaging 3.1 points and 3.2 rebounds per game, Gomez still had room for improvement. The 5-foot-8 guard has shown the A-10 what she has learned from the non-conference schedule. Gomez, who is averaging 4.8 ppg in conference-only games, has increased her scoring to 3.8 points per game. She has also become one of the Hawks best rebounders in A-10 play, grabbing 3.8 boards per game. She had a career-day at Massachusetts, scoring 14 points, while handing out five assists, recording two blocks and a steal to go with eight rebounds.

## PAVLOVSKAYA IS THE LIMIT

It has been a season of transition for sophomore **Zoya Pavlovskaya**. After seeing action in the Hawks' first three games of the season, the 6-foot-5 center was forced to sit out the next 12 contests with iron-deficiency anemia. Pavlovskaya made her return to the lineup January 13 versus Massachusetts. For the season, Pavlovskaya is averaging 1.4 points and 2.1 rebounds per game. The past five games she is averaging 3.0 points and 2.9 rebounds a game, including career highs in points (four) and rebounds (five) at Massachusetts on January 24.

## START IT UP

For Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin**, having only one returning starter from last year's squad was a challenge. Trying to find a combination of starters that click has been an even tougher task for the fourth-year Hawk coach. The following is a breakdown of Saint Joseph's starting rotations and the Hawks' record when they start.

## POLLOCK AMONG A-10 LEADERS

After redshirting the 2003-04 season, center **Erica Pollock** has given the Hawks a solid inside presence. On the season, Pollock has averaged 9.2 points per game, good for 28th overall in the Atlantic 10. Pollock has also proven to be a solid defender for Saint Joseph's, averaging 1.0 blocks per game (seventh in the A-10) and grabbing 5.7 rebounds per game for 20th in the A-10.

## SCHUTTE'S SCORING SURGE

The start of the Atlantic 10 schedule has been good for junior **Faith Schutte**. Prior to conference play, the 6-foot-1 forward was averaging 4.9 points per game. Over the first nine A-10 games, Schutte has averaged 8.1 ppg. She set a career-high in scoring, pouring in 12 points versus Dayton on January 9.

### SPRINGMAN DISHES IT OUT

After missing the opening two games following knee surgery to repair a torn meniscus junior guard **Kelly Springman** had made a welcomed return to the Saint Joseph's lineup. Springman, who averaged 1.43 assists per game as a sophomore, gave the Hawks a leader at the point. Over her first 16 games, Springman dished out a team-best 2.70 assists per game, including a a career-best six assists to go with nine points versus Drexel. Unfortunately for Springman and the Hawks, she will miss another four weeks after fracturing her left wrist.

### PASS THE WINDEX

Junior forward **Faith Schutte** is enjoying a break-out season for the Hawks on the boards. Through the first 21 games of the season, Schutte has grabbed 119 rebounds, 45 more than her total from the previous two seasons combined. The increase has also boosted Schutte's career average from 1.3 rebounds a game to 2.3 rpg.

### LONG RANGE ROTH

After losing two of the program's best three-point threats to graduation last year, Saint Joseph's deep threat seemed in-doubt heading into the 2004-05 season. Thankfully for the Hawks, junior **Christine Roth** has provided a spark from long range. Roth, a junior-college transfer from Genesee Community College, has drained 40 three-pointers on the season, good for sixth in the Atlantic 10. The 5-foot-10 guard is currently averaging 6.6 points and 1.6 rebounds off the bench for the Hawks.

### MORE OF MAURA

Dating back to last December, **Maura McBryan** has been a staple in the Hawks starting lineup. Beginning December 18, 2003 versus Virginia, McBryan has started 48 of the next 49 games, including all 21 this season. Versus Fordham last February 29, McBryan came off the bench as five seniors were honored with a start on senior day. Over the 49-game stretch, McBryan has averaged 5.4 points and 3.9 rebounds, increasing it to 7.5 points and 5.4 boards this season. She also posted two double-doubles this season against Mississippi State (10 pts./11 reb.) and Penn (12 pts./10 reb.).

### NEWLYWEDS

Wedding bells rang twice over summer for the Hawks as junior **Faith Gross** wed Christo Schutte, while assistant coach **Joe Logan** exchanged vows with his fiancé Susan.

### FFRENCH HITS SOPHOMORE STRIDE

With a new season came a new role for sophomore guard **Whitney Ffrench**. As a freshman, Ffrench saw action in nine games, averaging 1.8 points in 5.7 minutes. This season, Ffrench has proven to be a consistent contributor for the Hawks, averaging 6.4 points in 24.9 minutes per game. Ffrench has also shown a knack of getting to the foul line, ranking seventh in the Atlantic 10 in free-throw percentage at 75.0 percent (57-76).

### SCANLON PROVIDES SPARK OFF THE BENCH

After seeing limited action in her first two seasons, junior guard **Christen Scanlon** has been a solid contributor off the Hawk bench. A former Saint Joseph's rower, Scanlon has seen action in 11 games this season, averaging 0.8 points and 1.1 rebounds in 5.0 minutes per contest. Scanlon also has set career-bests in points (six at Ohio State), rebounds (four at Drexel) and minutes (14 at Drexel). Prior to this season, she had played only 12 minutes over nine games, scoring two points versus La Salle last year.

### HAWKS VERSUS THE POLLS

As usual, the Hawks once again put together a difficult non-conference slate for itself in the 2004-05 season. Despite going 2-10 in non-conference play, Saint Joseph's faced some of the toughest competition in the nation, including three top-25 teams. The Hawks, who have posted a 27-97 program record versus ranked opponents, went 0-3 this season with losses coming at #10/9 Ohio State (76-29) on November 14, at #14/16 Boston College (65-41) on December 22 and to #22/21 Kansas State (68-49) on December 30. Saint Joseph's earned its last victory over a ranked opponent on November 18, 2001 with a 64-58 win over #23 Rutgers.

### ATLANTIC 10 OPENERS

Saint Joseph's improved to 21-1 in Atlantic 10 openers with its 79-68 victory at Duquesne. George Washington handed the Hawks their lone loss in an A-10 opener, 80-77 on January 16, 1993 at Hawk Hill.

### CONTRACT EXTENDED

Saint Joseph's University Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** received a two-year contract extension in September. The agreement extends Griffin's term at the university through the 2008-09 season. Griffin has posted a 68-40 record in her four years on Hawk Hill.

### S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY:

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them-Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia-is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of S-A-I-N-T Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

## INSEPARABLE

As the season begins, juniors **Maura McBryan** and **Kelly Springman** will once again look down the bench and see each other. Both Springman and McBryan helped Archbishop Carroll to a 2000 Philadelphia Catholic League title. Springman, a 2001 graduate of Archbishop Carroll, began her Saint Joseph's career in the 2001-02 season, while McBryan, a 2002 Archbishop Carroll graduate, came to Hawk Hill for 2002-03.

## CAPTAIN ON THE DECK

Leadership will be a major key to victory for Saint Joseph's this year. Hawks' Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** selected junior forward **Maura McBryan** and junior guard **Kelly Springman** as captains to lead the young squad for the 2004-05 season.

## FOREIGN AFFAIR

The Hawks have been very effective at attracting talented international players to SJU. Presently, the Crimson and Gray have two foreign players - sophomores **Whitney Ffrench** (Nova Scotia, Canada) and **Zoya Pavlovskaya** (St. Petersburg, Russia) - on their 2004-05 roster. Overall, nine international players have worn the Crimson and Gray. The others are Alix Burns - England (1986-89), Megan Compain - New Zealand (1994-97), Jana Lichnerova - Slovakia (1997-00), Barbora Kuklova - Slovakia (1997-00), Susan Moran - Ireland (1999-02), Irina Krasnoshiok - Moldova (2001-04) and Amra Mehmedic - (2001-04).

## 300 AND COUNTING

With the season opening win on November 12 at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, the Hawks earned their 300th home win in program history. Saint Joseph's has gone 24 consecutive seasons since its last losing season at home (6-8 during the 1979-80).

## HAWKS PICKED SECOND IN A-10 EAST

The Saint Joseph's women's basketball team was picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 East by the Atlantic 10 coaches and media, conference officials at the A-10 basketball media day in early November. The Hawks, who return only one starter from last year's 22-11 team, were picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 East, behind 2004 A-10 Champions Temple. The Owls, who received all 30 first-place votes, were followed by the Hawks, Rhode Island in third, Massachusetts in fourth, Fordham in fifth and St. Bonaventure in sixth.

## HODGES APPOINTED HEAD COACH AT ARCADIA

Saint Joseph's Hall of Famer, Dale Hodges, was named head coach at Arcadia University this fall. Hodges, a 1990 graduate of Saint Joseph's, played professionally in Spain from 1999-04.

## COYLE OFFICIALLY TAKES REIGNS OF WNBA'S LIBERTY

Former Hawk assistant coach Pat Coyle was officially named head coach of the WNBA's New York Liberty. After being named interim head coach on July 3, Coyle helped the Liberty to a 13-10 record and a spot in the WNBA playoffs. Coyle spent three seasons (1989-90 through 1990-92) at Saint Joseph's and worked with current SJU head coach **Cindy Griffin** and assistant coach **Joe Logan** while the head coach at Loyola (1992-98).

## HEART OF A HAWK

In addition to athletics and academics, community service has long been one of the traditions of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball program. The "Heart of a Hawk" program is the team's way of "giving back" to the community. Each student athlete is required to complete a minimum of 10 hours of community service each semester.

## COSTELLO NAMED TO BIG 5 HALL OF FAME

A 1998 Saint Joseph's grad and standout on the hardwood, Maureen Costello was selected to the Big 5 Hall of Fame Class of 2004. A four-year letterwinner for the Hawks, Costello helped Saint Joseph's to two NCAA appearances and two City Series titles during her career. She currently ranks 10th in scoring (1,299 points), third in rebounding (952) and eighth in free-throws made (333). Costello, a 1998 Atlantic 10 First Team member and 1998 Big 5 MVP, is joined by 1969 La Salle graduate Roland "Fatty" Taylor. Induction ceremonies were held Dec. 3, at the Palestra.

## BIG 5 BRAGGING RIGHTS

While not a formal conference, the Big 5 is an agreement between five major Philadelphia area universities (La Salle, Pennsylvania, Saint Joseph's, Temple and Villanova) to play an annual round-robin series of games as part of their regular season schedule. The winner of the competition results in an annual "City Series" champion. Saint Joseph's success in the Big 5 over the last 20 years is astounding. SJU has won 14 Big 5 titles during that period, including 10 outright crowns. In addition to the titles, the Hawks are the all-time winningest team in Big 5 history, recording a 80-24 (.769) record in 27 years.

## SJU OLYMPIANS

Former Saint Joseph's University stand-out Megan Compain (Class of 1997) competed in the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens as a member of the New Zealand women's basketball team. Compain joined former Hawk rower and current U.S. men's National Rowing Team head coach Mike Teti (Class of 1978) and U. S. heavyweight boxing alternate Chazz Witherspoon (Class of 2004) in Greece.

## CRADLE OF COACHES

The Saint Joseph's University tradition of developing outstanding coaches has continued in recent years. ## THE HAWK MASCOT

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" has been flapping its wings for almost half a century, and now celebrates its golden anniversary with its 50th season of participation in 2004-05. "Hawks" has served as the nickname for Saint Joseph's athletic teams since 1929. The idea for The Hawk, as mascot, was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, eight SJU students have donned the costume. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *Sports Illustrated*, *Street & Smith Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine. Eastern Basketball tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot as well. In January 2001, *The Sporting News* named The Hawk as the Nation's Best Mascot in its "Best of College Basketball" issue. SJU junior **George Szczpanski** dons the costume for every Hawk women's game.
