- Senior **Amy Wold** scored 17 points and was named MVP of the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic, while freshman **Sarah Acker** added 16 and earned All-Tournament Team honors in helping SJU to the tournament title.

LAST TIME OUT

Saint Joseph's senior guard **Amy Wold** scored 17 points, freshman center **Sarah Acker** had 16 and Saint Joseph's upset No. 15 Auburn 71-69 in the championship game of the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic. Down 71-69, the Tigers stayed alive when Saint Joseph's twice missed the front end of a 1-and-1 free throw opportunity. Alli Smalley had a chance to tie the game, but bounced the ball off her foot and out of bounds with 2 seconds left. When Wold couldn't inbound the ball, she was whistled for a five-second violation, giving the Tigers one final chance, but Sherell Hobbs misfired on a 3-pointer at the buzzer. SAINT JOSEPH'S VERSUS THE POLLS

Topping No. 15 Auburn in the title game of the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic, Saint Joseph's improved to 31-104 all-time versus ranked opponents and 1-2 on the season. The Hawks previously lost to No. 5/6 Rutgers, 56-50, November 28 and to No. 21/22 Wyoming, 66-64, on December 8. The Hawk last win over a ranked team prior to Saturday came on March 4, 2007 as SJU topped No. 8/9 George Washington, 57-55. 2007-08 Atlantic 10 Predictions

The Saint Joseph's women's basketball team was picked to finish sixth in the Atlantic 10 race, according to a poll of the Atlantic 10's head coaches and media released today by conference officials. The Hawks, who advanced to the A-10 Championships game and earned a WNIT berth last year, return eight letterwinners from a squad that finished 19-14 a season ago. George Washington (28-4), the 2006-07 regular season A-10 champs, was selected as the clear-cut favorite to win the Atlantic 10, receiving all 17 first-place votes. The Colonials, who return four starters, including three Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference members, finished last year ranked No. 11 in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll. The following is the predicted finish for all 14 members of the Atlantic 10.

CAPTAINS ON THE DECK

Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** announced that seniors **Timisha Gomez**, **Krista Hutchison** and junior **Mary Kate McDade** will serve as the team's captains for the 2007-08 season. All three Hawks are first-time captains as they replace '07 graduates Ayahna Cornish and Whitney Ffrench.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Hawks added several five faces for the 2007-08 season with the addition of freshmen **Sarah Acker**, **Dominique Bryant**, **Kallie Hovatter**, **Alexis Johnson** and **Laren Robinson**. As a group, these rookies averaged 91 points and 52.5 rebounds per game as seniors in high school. Just five games into their collegiate careers, these newcomers have made major impacts on Hawk Hill as the group has averaged 17.1 points, 12.3 rebounds and 1.8 steals per game. MVP, MVP

Having already earned MVP honors at the Brown Basketball Classic after leading SJU to the title, senior guard **Amy Wold** again earned some hardware, earning the same accolade at the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic. The Cedar Rapids, Iowa native scored a team-high 17 points and had five assists and six rebounds in SJU's title-game win over No. 15 Auburn. Wold averaged 12.5 points, 6.0, assists and 5.0 rebounds per game in helping the Hawks to their second in-season title of the year. Over the four-game span, the senior averaged 14 points and 5.25 assists per game.

SJU CLAIMS HILTON PHILADELPHIA HAWK CLASSIC TITLE

The Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic championship trophy returned to Saint Joseph's as the Hawks topped NO. 15 Auburn, 71-69, in the title game (recap on page 18). The Hawks earned the title, the sixth in 17 years, backed by MVP **Amy Wold** and All-Tournament Team member **Sarah Acker's** 17 and 16 points, respectively. Saint Joseph's previously won the Hawk Classic in 1993, 1997, 1999, 2000 and 2001. The Hawks topped NJIT, 68-59, in the opening round as senior guard **Timisha Gomez** paced SJU with 16 points.

ACK ATTACK

Having played in just 13 collegiate games, Saint Joseph's freshman **Sarah Acker** has already made an impact for the Hawks. Saint Joseph's leader in scoring (11.5 ppg), the Nanticoke, Pa., native currently ranks sixth in the Atlantic 10 in rebounding (8.1 rpg) and is tied for fifth in blocks (18). Her team-leading 56.5 field goal percentage ranks second in the A-10 and had her enter the winter break ranked 26th nationally. Acker has also earned individual accolades, being selected Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week (December 2-9) and earning Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic All-Tournament Team honors.

MINGING IT HAPPEN

Serving as backup point guard her first two seasons on Hawk Hill, junior **Mary Kate McDade** has thrived this year as a starter. Currently fourth in the Atlantic 10, and first on SJU, the Philadelphia native has dished out 58 assists over the first 13 games, well above her career average (1.67 apg). Also, McDade has become a bigger scoring threat this season, averaging 4.1 points per game after entering the year at 1.3 ppg. She enters Thursday's game fourth in the Atlantic 10 and 66th nationally in assists.

GO-TO GOMEZ

It has been a solid start to the season for senior guard **Timisha Gomez**, averaging a career-high in scoring (11.1 ppg) and rebounding (4.2 rpg). The Elkridge, Md., native has led the Hawks in scoring a team-high four times and scored in double figures seven times. Gomez, who has played in 106 of a potential 107 career games, earned Brown Basketball Classic All-Tournament Team honors after helping SJU to the title.



FORD TOUGH

After missing the 2005-06 season with a torn ACL, forward **Brittany Ford** was a bright spot for the Hawks' bench last year. Averaging 4.3 points in just 12.5 minutes a game during the regular season, Ford came on strong over the final five games of the season, averaging 12.6 points per contest. Ford also proved to be a solid defender for Saint Joseph's, ranking second on the team at 0.96 rejections per game. At the Atlantic 10 Championship, Ford's offensive ability blossomed. Averaging 13 points and 6.8 rebounds per game, the Wilmington, DE native earned All-Tournament Team honors after helping lead the Hawks to the A-10 title game. In the championship game, Ford scored a team and career-high 20 points off the bench in front of a national television audience. She followed that up with 11 points and a career-high three blocks in SJU's WNIT matchup with Coppin State. Ford, who missed the first 10 games of the season with a minor knee injury, has had a solid start to the 2007-08 season, averaging 9.0 points and 3.3 rebounds per game over her first three contests.

GILLESPIE GOING STRONG

It has been a breakout season for sophomore guard **Amy Gillespie**. Ranking fourth in scoring (8.3 ppg), second in three pointers (18) and earning Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament Team honors, the the Springfield, Pa., native has thrived in a larger role this season. Gillespie, who averaged 21 points per game at the Hawkeye Challenge, more than doubled her entire scoring (44) and rebounding (21) totals from last season, as she enters Thursday's game with 100 points and 44 rebounds.

WOLD AND GOMEZ LEADS SJU TO BROWN CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP

The Hawks captured their 14th in-season title in program history as SJU topped Manhattan (65-58) and Brown (65-54) to claim the Brown Basketball Classic title. Saint Joseph's senior **Amy Wold** earned MVP honors after posting a career-high 20 points and seven assists in the title game. Classmate **Timisha Gomez** was named to the All-Tournament Team as she led SJU with a game-high 17 points in the opener versus the Jaspers.

POST MANEUVERS

With several Hawks having a larger role this season compared to last, there is no arguing the transformation of SJU's sophomore forward **Ashley Logue**. Playing limited time in just seven games a year ago, Logue has excelled this year, playing in all 13 games, including eight starts. Scoring only two points and adding six rebounds as a rookie, Logue eclipsed nearly all her career-highs in the opener at Lehigh, scoring 16 points and adding six rebounds. Over the first 13 games, Logue has poured in 66 points (5.1 ppg) and grabbed 47 rebounds (3.6 rpg).

ON THE AIR



For over 17 years, the Saint Joseph's Sports Network (SJSN) has produced and broadcast Hawk athletics to the Philadelphia region and beyond. Begun as an outgrowth of a four-game package of Saint Joseph's women's basketball broadcasts during the 1989-90 season, SJSN was founded in the fall of 1990. Since that time, SJSN's coverage of Hawk athletics has grown and currently includes live coverage of all Hawk men's and women's basketball games, Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" radio program, the nationally-renowned "HawkTalk" television show and "Courtside", the Saint Joseph's women's basketball show.

All of SJU's women's games can also be heard via audio streaming on the internet at the Hawks' official athletics site, www.sjuhawks.com. Video streaming of selected games will also be available on www.sjuhawks.com as part of the Hawks All-Access package.

Saint Joseph's pioneered commercial radio of women's college basketball in the area with a NCAA tournament game in March 1989 and followed that up with a package of regular season games ever since. The Cindy Griffin pregame show kicks-off game broadcasts.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The Hawks will be using a young lineup during the 2007-08 season as 8 of Saint Joseph's 13 players are freshmen and sophomores. With Saint Joseph's loss of 65.2 percent of its scoring (1,413 of 2,166 points) this past off-season, the Hawks will look for all four classes contribute evenly in 07-08. The following is a comparison of each class' points and percentage of the team's scoring based.

LIGHTS, CAMERAS, HAWKS

Former SJU standouts Jane Meade '02, Elizabeth Mohan '04, Ayahna Cornish '07 and current SJU assistant coach **Susan Moran** '02, will appear in the upcoming film "Our Lady of Victory", centered around the 1972 national-championship squad from Immaculata. The movie, starring Ellen Burstyn (Requiem For A Dream), Carla Gugino (HBO's Entourage) and David Boreanaz (Fox's Bones), focuses on the Mighty Macs of Immaculata and their new coach Cathy Rush (played by Gugino). Realizing her dream as a coach, Rush leads Immaculata from a team with no gym to the first national title in women's basketball. The movie is due out in March.

HEART OF A HAWK

In addition to athletics and academics, community service has long been one of the traditions of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball program. The "Heart of a Hawk" program is the team's way of "giving back" to the community. Each student athlete is required to complete a minimum of 10 hours of community service each semester.



NEW FACES ON HAWK HILL

Saint Joseph's Head Coach Cindy Griffin announced this summer that Stephanie McCaffrey was promoted to assistant coach, while Saint Joseph's Hall of Famer Ellen Fitzpatrick returned to Hawk Hill as director of women's basketball operations.

HAWKS INK THREE FOR 2008-09

Saint Joseph's women's basketball announced that Michelle Baker (Wilmington, DE/Brandywine), Kelly Cavallo (Westhampton Beach, NY/Westhampton Beach) and Katie Kuester (Chestnut Hill, PA/Academy of Notre Dame) have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Saint Joseph's University in the fall of 2008-09.

"We have a very solid class coming to Hawk Hill next season," said Saint Joseph's head coach Cindy Griffin. "I think these three young women fit the need that we will have with the departure of this year's senior class."

A 5-foot-9 guard, Baker enters her senior season at Brandywine with 1,438 career points and just 121 points shy of Delaware's top-10 all-time scorers' list.

A three-time All-New York State selection, Cavallo will bring a scorer's touch from the post position. Standing 6-foot-1, the Westhampton Beach, NY, native has averaged double figures in scoring her entire high school career.

Kuester joins Baker on the Preseason Honorable Mention All-America Team by Sporting News. As a junior, the 5-foot-10 guard averaged 10.3 points, 3.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists per game as she led Academy of Notre Dame to a 17-9 overall record.

S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations.

FIELDHOUSE EXPANSION PROJECT

A major expansion of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse and a dedicated center for men's and women's basketball highlight a comprehensive plan for enhancing varsity and recreational athletics at Saint Joseph's. Construction on the project began in the fall of 2007.

As the home of the Hawks, the Fieldhouse is the well-loved shrine and the very heart of Saint Joseph's athletics. The expansion and renovation is an integral part of *With Faith and Strength to Dare: The Campaign for Saint Joseph's University*, and will preserve the storied facility while bringing the athletic complex to a level befitting such a venerable tradition. The Fieldhouse, home to Saint Joseph's University basketball since 1949, will be named for Michael J. Hagan '85 at the conclusion of the multi-year project set to begin this fall.

Because of the Maguire Campus (former Episcopal Academy) acquisition, the vast needs of the University's intramural program and several varsity sports will finally be addressed, creating an opportunity to dramatically improve the infrastructure for men's and women's basketball.

The three-phased project will begin with the construction of a two-story, 20,000-square-foot new wing adjacent to the existing Fieldhouse. It will add locker rooms, offices, and study rooms for men's and women's basketball, and a new Athletic Hall of Fame room.

Phase II will upgrade and renovate the current sports complex by adding a dedicated practice facility with permanent wood flooring as well as locker rooms and offices for soccer, lacrosse, track, and cross country. Phase III will include a complete overhaul of the interior of the fieldhouse, followed by the construction of an upper-level concourse, expanded seating (a minimum of 1,000 seats will be added), and more. Home court advantage will be secured, and the Saint Joseph's athletic tradition will live on for years to come.

Events in the new facility could begin as early as 2010.



THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" has been flapping its wings for over half a century, celebrating its golden anniversary in 2004-05.

The Hawk is one of the most famous mascots in college sports best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its "wings" from tip-off to the final buzzer of every game, as well as for "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant flapping, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on a national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.



The most decorated mascot in the country, the Hawk has garnered numerous accolades in its 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine. *Eastern Basketball* tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot, while The Hawk won a "Best of Philly" award in 2003-04.

Saint Joseph's University athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor, Charlie Dunn, initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed to two, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" (World War I soldiers who specialized in tossing grenades) by a slim margin in the final vote. The winning suggestion was submitted by John Gallagher, Class of '31, who was a catcher on the Saint Joseph's baseball team. He won a sweater with a special Saint Joseph's monogram for selecting the winning name.

According to the student annual, the name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at Saint Joseph's following the 1939 season.

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, nine SJU students have donned the costume. Saint Joseph's junior Kevin Hensler is in his third season as the Hawk.

Internet sites representing local or regional media outlets will be provided credentials on a space-available basis. Websites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are able to post anonymous information are ineligible for consideration of credentials.

POST-GAME

Saint Joseph's Head Coach Cindy Griffin will be available in the interview room following a post-game cooling off period, along with select players. The Saint Joseph's lockerroom will not be open to the media after the cooling off period.

PRESS ROW

Only accredited members of the media and accredited scouts will be issued credentials to cover Saint Joseph's basketball, and only those with passes will be permitted to sit in press seating. Members of the media are reminded that press row is a working area and cheering for either team will not be tolerated.

RADIO POLICY

Radio stations designated as the primary visiting outlet can have access to phone lines at a cost of \$100 per line per game. (\$200 for ISDN), unless a reciprocal agreement exists. Visiting radio stations wishing to broadcast the game should contact Jack Jumper at (610) 660-3389 to arrange phone lines.



HEAD COACH CINDY GRIFFIN



Five postseason berths in her first six seasons at the helm of Saint Joseph's is one of the numerous accomplishments for the Hawks' Head Coach Cindy Griffin. Guiding Saint Joseph's to its first win over a Top 10 team and an appearance in the Atlantic 10 title game last year, the former Hawk standout enters her seventh season as head coach of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball team. A 1991 graduate of SJU, Griffin (nee Anderson) was named the seventh head coach in the program's history on April 25, 2001. Griffin has compiled an overall record of 166-117 in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Griffin helped to reinvigorate the SJU program in her first season, leading the squad to a 24-8 record and the second round of the WNIT. She capitalized on the team's tradition of scrappy play and rugged defense, while releasing the reins and allowing the team to play a more up-tempo style on the offensive end of the floor. The Hawks finished the year among the national leaders in nine different categories and paced the nation in free throw percentage for the second straight year.

Following a memorable first year at the helm of her alma mater, Griffin upped the ante in her second season by capturing 2003 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Hawks to a 19-11 record. The team sprinted to the conference's Eastern Division title and earned a berth in the WNIT for the second straight season, despite the departure of SJU's all-time leading scorer and a non-conference schedule that rated fourth nationally.

Led by six seniors, the 2004 team went 22-11 and advanced to the WNIT Elite Eight. Saint Joseph's finished second in the A-10 East and dropped a heartbreaker in the Atlantic 10 Championship to Temple. Four Hawk seniors reached the 1,000-point plateau, marking just the eighth time in NCAA history that a quartet of players had reached the milestone in the same season. Erin Brady, Irina Krasnoshiok, Stephanie (Graff) McCaffrey and Amra Mehmedic went on to sign professional contracts.

With the loss of four 1,000-point scorers, the 2004-05 Hawks showed their true colors down the stretch, earning a hard-fought victory over La Salle in the opening round of the Atlantic 10 Championship and coming within 10 points of 16th-ranked, and eventual A-10 Champion, Temple.

Fueled by a collection of newcomers and a developed core of upperclassmen, Griffin led the Hawks back to national prominence in 2005-06. The Crimson and Gray engineered the nation's best turnaround of 13 games, made an appearance in the national polls for the first time since 2003-04, advanced to the semi-finals of the A-10 Championship and earned a berth in the WNIT.

Despite losing a good deal of experienced players prior to the 2006-07 season, Griffin had her team peaking at the right time. Playing Griffin's style of hard-nosed defense and persistent offense, the Hawks advanced to the Atlantic 10 Championship, including the program's first win over a Top 10 opponent (#8/9 George Washington) along the way. Saint Joseph's capped the season with its fifth WNIT appearance in six years and tied the SJU record for games played in a season with 33.

Following her playing career, Griffin spent the 1992-93 season as a graduate assistant at her alma mater. She then accepted an assistant's spot at Vanderbilt University from 1993-95 under former Saint Joseph's head coach Jim Foster. Foster recruited Griffin to SJU and coached her during her playing career on Hawk Hill.

In her two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt, the Commodores finished 53-15 overall, won the 1995 SEC championship and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 both seasons. In addition to coaching responsibilities, she was the co-director of the Vanderbilt Basketball Camp and the director of the Black & Gold Club.

Griffin left Vanderbilt after the 1995 season to return to the East Coast as an assistant coach at Loyola College (MD). She spent three seasons as an assistant under Patty Coyle at Loyola before being elevated to the role of associate head coach in 1998. Griffin was promoted to the position of head women's basketball coach at Loyola midway through the 1998-99 season. She was the seventh-youngest head coach in Division I at the time. Griffin - who was named head coach five games into season as Coyle left for an assistant coach position with the WNBA's New York Liberty - kept the Greyhounds' momentum going as Loyola won a team-record 21 games that year. Overall she compiled a record of 48-33 during her tenure at the Baltimore school, guiding the squad to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference semi-finals all three seasons.

One of the top playmakers in Saint Joseph's history, Griffin starred for the Hawks from 1987-88 through 1991-92 (missing the 1988-89 season due to injury). A three-year team captain, Griffin finished her career with 662 points, 278 rebounds, 510 assists and 197 steals. She ranks fourth on SJU's all-time assist list.

As a junior in 1990-91, she played in 1,178 out of a possible 1,200 minutes to set the school record for minutes played in a single season. The Hawks made three NCAA Tournament appearances and posted three straight 20-win seasons during her playing career. A two-time Second Team All-Big 5 choice, as well as a Third Team All-Atlantic 10 pick as a senior, she was inducted into the Saint Joseph's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998.

A native of Maple Glen, Pa., Griffin played her high school basketball for Bishop McDevitt, winning two Philadelphia Catholic League titles. A 1987 graduate of McDevitt, she was inducted into its Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997, and in 2002, received the Philadelphia Catholic League's alumni achievement award. She earned a bachelor's degree in accounting from Saint Joseph's in 1991 and completed work on a M.B.A. degree from SJU in 1993. She resides in Conshohocken, Pa., with her husband Curtis and daughters, Kaylie (4) and Hannah (2).
