### TIPPING OFF

Saint Joseph's caps the home portion of its regular season Thursday as the Hawks host St. Bonaventure at 7 p.m. at alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. Coming off a hard-fought 67-59 win over Charlotte on Sunday, SJU will try to improve to 7-4 in Atlantic 10 play and retain its hold on fifth place, while the Bonnies look to break a three-game losing streak and move out of a tie for 12th place. Prior to Thursday's game, the Hawks will honor their four seniors, **Ayahna Cornish**, **Whitney Ffrench**, **Zoya Pavlovskaya** and **Erica Pollock**, with a pregame ceremony.

### SCOUTING THE BONNIES

Having dropped three straight in Atlantic 10 play, St. Bonaventure will try to break its losing skid Thursday as they head to Hawk Hill tied for 12th in the A-10 at 3-7. Led by a three-post attack, the Bonnies will likely start senior Audrey Latendresse, sophomore Ashley Edwards and freshman Dana Mitchell in the front court. Leading SBU in scoring at 12.2 ppg, Latendresse is also the Bonnies top three-point threat with a team-high 39. One of the top rookies in the A-10, Mitchell enters the game second on SBU in both scoring (12.0 ppg) and rebounding (5.5 rpg). A native of Philadelphia, Ashley Edwards has started all 25 games this year for the Bonnies and is averaging 7.8 ppg. In the backcourt, junior Priscilla Edwards and sophomore Katelyn Murray will likely get the nod for head coach Jim Crowley. A speedy point guard, Priscilla Edwards ranks among the A-10 leaders in assists (3.9 apg) and is averaging 8.8 points to go with it. Another threat from behind the arc, Murray comes into the game averaging 7.1 ppg and has converted 38 three pointers. Off the bench, look for SBU forward Erica Schiefen (4.5 ppg) and guard M.P. Malo (2.2 ppg) to get the first calls. (Full preview on page 5)

### THE SERIES

Two former Atlantic 10 East foes square off Thursday when Saint Joseph's hosts St. Bonaventure. The Hawks head into the game with a 33-6 edge in the series and have won the previous two outings. All-time, Saint Joseph's has posted a 15-3 record against the Bonnies at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. (Year-by-year results on page 5)

### LAST TIME OUT: CORNISH LEADS HAWKS PAST CHARLOTTE, 67-59

Led by a game-high 23 points from senior guard **Ayahna Cornish**, Saint Joseph's topped Charlotte, 67-59, Sunday afternoon at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse. After trailing 3-0, the Hawks took the lead on an 8-0 run and never relinquished it. Despite seeing their lead cut to three in the second half, SJU held on for the 67-59 win. (Boxscore on page 27)

**GRAND FINALE**

Improving each season, senior guard **Ayahna Cornish** has proven to be a prolific scorer for the Hawks. Averaging a career-high 15.6 points per game this year, Cornish has climbed the Hawks' scoring charts. The Philadelphia native is currently 16th all-time in Hawk history in scoring with 1,071 points. **POLLOCK ETCHES NAME IN SJU RECORD BOOK**

Playing in her final season of the Crimson and Gray, senior forward **Erica Pollock** has climbed her way into the Saint Joseph's record books. The Bowie, MD native's 80 career blocks are tied for third all-time, while her nine rejections versus Richmond set a single game record. Pollock also will finish her Hawk career amongst the best rebounders in school history as she currently ranks 18th with 455 boards.

**SAINT JOSEPH'S CENTURION**

The sixth season at Saint Joseph's has been a historic one for Hawks' head coach **Cindy Griffin**. The SJU alum recently collected her 100th victory with the Hawks on a 71-60 victory over La Salle on January 12. Less than two weeks later, Griffin earned her 150th victory as a head coach as SJU topped Saint Louis 70-68 on January 21. A member of the Saint Joseph's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Griffin enters Thursday's contest 154-107 over nine seasons and 106-74 with the Hawks.

**TURNING UP THE AC**

Viewed as the Hawks' go-to player this season, senior guard **Ayahna Cornish** has proved just that. Arguably the team's top scoring threat, Cornish has excelled her senior season, leading the team in both scoring (15.9 ppg) and steals (1.75 spg), the Philadelphia native has proven why she was selected to the Preseason All-Conference Second Team. An A-10 All-Conference Second Team honoree last year, Cornish has steadily improved each season, and has also collected several individual honors along the way including the MVP of the 2005 Kansas State Wildcat Classic and All-Tournament honors at both the Courtyard Classic and Hawk Classic this season. **SJU AMONG LEAGUE LEADERS IN ATTENDANCE**

The Hawks have a long tradition of great fan support, and 2005-06 wasn't different. Last year, SJU finished second in the A-10 and 102nd nationally, in home attendance (1,376 fans per game). This year, the Hawks have averaged 1,083 fans at home and posted the ninth sellout in their history versus Villanova on January 3.

**WELL OYLED MACHINE**

Following a solid rookie season in which she earned Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team honors, guard **Jen Oyler** has excelled further as a sophomore. After pouring in 6.9 points per game and 55 three-pointers as a freshman, the 6-foot-1 Oyler has continued the momentum with 55 three pointers (first in the Atlantic 10) and is currently third on the team in scoring at 10.5 ppg. The Oregon City, OR native has also excelled on defense, ranking second the Hawks with 33 blocks (seventh in the A-10 and 9th all-time in SJU single-season history). Oyler also earned Hawk Classic All-Tournament Team honors after averaging 19.0 points and 9.0 boards per game.

**ON FFIRE**

After a breakout year last season as a junior, **Whitney Ffrench** has kept the momentum going into the 2006-07 campaign. The senior point-guard enters the game as the team leader in assists (2.9 apg) and third in scoring (10.5 ppg). Having a knack to getting to the foul line, Ffrench has scored 114 of her 244 points from the charity stripe this season and ranks ninth all-time in SJU history with 323 made free throws.

**TREY MAGNIFIQUE**

Excelling as a deadly team from behind the arc last season, Saint Joseph's has continued to bomb away with great success in the 2006-07 season. Entering Thursday's game, the Hawks ranks third in the Atlantic 10 in three-point proficiency at 35.0 percent, up from 31.7 percent a season ago. A large reason for the increase is the duo of **Jen Oyler** and **Jenna Loschiavo**. The duo currently are first and second in the A-10 averaging 2.29 and 2.25 three pointers per game, respectively. On the season, Oyler and Loschiavo have combined to go 109-of-270 from behind the arc, connecting at a 39.2 percent clip. And in just 54 games, Oyler has amassed 110 three pointers, good for 10th all-time in SJU history.

**HEAD OF THE CLASS**

Through 24 games, the senior class has proven to be the offensive leaders for the Hawks. Of the 1,566 team points scored by SJU, the seniors have accounted for 781 of those points or 49.9 percent. Saint Joseph's top scorer, senior **Ayahna Cornish**, has accounted for 24.4 percent (382 points) of the team's scoring. The following is a breakdown class scoring:

Priority is given to daily newspapers, radio/TV stations and other media who cover Saint Joseph's and its opponents on a regular basis. Internet sites and agencies that will be considered for credentials include those of national cable networks or established publications. Internet sites representing local or regional media outlets will be provided credentials on a space-available basis. Websites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are able to post anonymous information are ineligible for consideration of credentials.

**PRESS ROW**

Only accredited members of the media and accredited scouts will be issued credentials to cover Saint Joseph's basketball, and only those with passes will be permitted to sit in press seating. Members of the media are reminded that press row is a working area and cheering for either team will not be tolerated.

**POST-GAME**

Saint Joseph's head coach Cindy Griffin will be available in the interview room following a post-game cooling off period. The SJU locker room will be open to the media after the cooling off period.

**SUPER SOPHS**

Teammates before evening playing for Saint Joseph's, sophomores **Jenna Loschiavo** and **Mary Kate McDade** previously excelled for their AAU team, the Philadelphia Belles. Now Hawks, the duo has continued to shine, and especially bright this season. After averaging only 2.8 points per game as a rookie, Loschiavo has proven to be a consistent offensive threat for SJU this year. The Plymouth Meeting, PA native is currently second on the team in three pointers (54) and ranks fourth on the team in scoring at 8.0 ppg. While Loschiavo has been an offensive spark for the Hawks, McDade has continued to be a catalyst. After finishing her freshman season with 31 assists and a 1.9 assist-to-turnover ratio, McDade has continued her solid play with 52 assists already this season, to go with only 21 turnovers for a 2.48 average. The Philly native has also surpassed her total for scoring from last season with 41 points, com-

pared to 24 as a rookie.

### GOMEZ GOING STRONG

Last year, then-sophomore **Timisha Gomez** proved to be a go-to player for the Hawks down the stretch, averaging 7.7 points per game over the final 10 contests. Even with Cornish back this year, Gomez has kept up her strong play for Saint Joseph's. The junior, who started 10 games, is currently fifth on the team in scoring (6.9 ppg) and has posted four double-digit games for the Hawks this year (10 vs. Hartford, 15 at Illinois, 12 at Princeton, 14 vs. Xavier).

### HAWKS PICKED FOURTH IN ATLANTIC 10

Saint Joseph's was picked to finish fourth in the Atlantic 10 women's basketball race, according to a poll of the A-10's head coaches and media. The Hawks, coming off the nation's biggest turnaround (13 games) in 2005-06, return 10 letterwinners from last season's WNIT team. George Washington received 13 of 18 first-place votes cast by the panel of coaches and media. 2005-06 A-10 Tournament champions Temple (24-8/12-4) received two first-place votes and placed second in the preseason poll, while Xavier (21-9/11-5) received three first-place votes and placed third in the poll. Co-regular season championship Charlotte (21-9/13-3) was selected fifth in the poll and is followed by (Richmond (13-17/79), Dayton (17-12/8-8), Massachusetts (11-17/8-8), La Salle (11-17/7-9), Duquesne (13-17/6-10), Rhode Island (8-20/5-11), Saint Louis (7-20/4-12), St. Bonaventure (9-18/3-13), Fordham (10-18/5-11).

### HAWKS EARN TOP TURNAROUND IN THE NATION

Last season was a terrific year for the Saint Joseph's women's basketball program. Not only did the Hawks earn a postseason berth and win 20 games, SJU also posted the best turnaround in the nation. After winning just seven games in 2004-05, the Hawks posted a 20-11 season last year. The 13-game improvement was tops in Division I.

### S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them-Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia-is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of S-A-I-N-T Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other

public constituencies.

### HAWKS INK FOUR TO NLIS

Saint Joseph's announced that **Kallie Hovatter**, **Dominique Bryant**, **Laren Robinson** and **Sarah Acker** have signed National Letters of Intent on November 9. A three-year starter at Stonewall Jackson High School, Hovatter has averaged 20.6 points, 7.4 rebounds, 5.0 steals and 3.9 assists per game through her junior season. The 2005-06 Washington Catholic Athletic Conference's leading scorer, Bryant enters her senior season at St. John's College High School as a McDonald's All-American nominee. As a junior, the 6-foot forward earned First Team All-WCAC and Second Team All-Metropolitan Area honors after averaging 21.3 points and 9.0 rebounds per game. Ranked 64th by the Blue Star Index Top 100, Robinson is coming off a solid junior season in which she earned Third Team All-Patriot District and Patriot District All-Tournament Team honors. Averaging 15.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists per game, the 5-foot-9 guard also earned 2004-05 First Team All-Patriot District and Third Team All-Regional accolades. Twice named the Wyoming Valley Conference's MVP, the 6-foot-3 Acker helped Greater Nanticoke to a 29-1 record last season. A three-year starter at center, Acker has tallied over 1,250 points, 1,300 rebounds and 570 blocks for her career.

### THE HAWK MASCOT

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" has been flapping its wings for half a century and begins its 51st season during the 2005-06 season. "Hawks" has served as the nickname for Saint Joseph's athletic teams since 1929. The idea for The Hawk, as mascot, was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, eight SJU students have donned it. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *Sports Illustrated*, *Street & Smith Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine. Eastern Basketball tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot as well. In January 2001, *The Sporting News* named The Hawk the Nation's Best Mascot in its "Best of College Basketball" issue. Saint Joseph's sophomore Kevin Hensler dons the costume for every women's game.

### STREAKING UP AND DOWN THE HARDWOOD

The following is a look at Saint Joseph's current hot and cold streaks heading into today's game.

#### HOT

##### Jenna Loschiavo

The sophomore guard has averaged 13.0 points, including four three pointers, per game over the past two contests.

##### Timisha Gomez

Getting solid performances from seniors **Whitney Ffrench**, **Ayahna Cornish**, **Zoya Pavlovskaya** and "Mother Nature", Saint Joseph's earned a 63-56 victory over Bucknell in its season opener at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse.

Even though the three Hawk seniors accounted for 42 of the team's points, Saint Joseph's biggest contribution might have come from off the court. Bucknell would go on to outscore the Hawks 12-5 over the final six minutes of the half to take a 28-27 edge into the locker room.

Saint Joseph's senior guard **Ayahna Cornish** would make one of two free throws, giving URI a chance to tie.

Fortunately for the Hawks, their tough pressure forced a prayer attempt by Mojidi that fell well short of its mark.

The Rams started out hot, making four of their first five shots and taking a 13-2 edge on a Jessica Magely layup at the 16:38 mark.

Despite a slow beginning, in which they shot 0-of-4, the Hawks responded with 11-straight points over the next 4:37, tying the game at 13 on a pair of free throws by Cornish.

Saint Joseph's gained its first lead of the game with 4:56 remaining in the half as sophomore guard **Jen Oyler** put back a missed three pointer, putting her team up 23-21.

The teams exchanged baskets over the next three minutes, as the Hawks held a 27-26 edge with under a minute to play. In the final two SJU possessions, Cornish would go 1-of-2 from the foul line and add a layup off an inbound with 0.4 seconds remaining to put her team up 30-26 at the half.

After a back-and-forth opening 10 minutes of the first half, Saint Joseph's opened its biggest lead, 55-44, with 5:09 remaining.

Saint Joseph's kept its lead until the frantic final minutes, in which it held on for its second straight win.
