- Saint Joseph's will try to snap its three-game losing skid as the Hawks travel to Massachusetts for a Sunday matchup.
- Despite holding a 40-8 edge in the all-time series, Saint Joseph's hasn't topped Massachusetts at the Mullins Center since the 2003-04 season.
- After starting out 2-0 in the Atlantic 10, the Hawks have dropped three straight, with two games coming down to the final possession (Dayton, Temple).
- Coming off a career-high 21 point at Temple, SJU senior guard **Amy Wold** has been stellar in A-10 play for the Hawks, averaging 8.6 points and ranking first in assists (24) and steals (nine) and second in rebounding (5.6 rpg).
- Sophomore forward **Brittany Ford** is coming off a season-high 19 points for the Hawks at Temple on Wednesday.
- Saint Joseph's is 7-3 all-time on Super Bowl Sunday, going 6-2 in years the AFC wins and 1-1 when the NFC is victorious.

OF NOTE

Freshman center Sarah Acker's 58.9 field goal percentage currently ranks third all-time among SJU's single-season leaders and she enters Sunday's game one block shy of 10th place in single-season rankings.

CAPTAINS ON THE DECK

Saint Joseph's Head Coach Cindy Griffin named seniors Timisha Gomez, Krista Hutchison and junior Mary Kate McDade as the team's captains for the 2007-08 season. All three Hawks are first-time captains.

LOSCHIAVO ENTERS HAWKS' RECORD BOOK

Arguably Saint Joseph's most consistent three-point threat the past three seasons, junior guard Jenna Loschiavo has continued to etch her name in the Hawk's record book this year. Already fifth in SJU history in three-point percentage (.375), Loschiavo has climbed the ladder for both three pointers made and attempted. The Plymouth Meeting, PA, native enters Saturday's game ninth all-time in both makes (130) and attempts (347).

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Hawks added several five faces for the 2007-08 season with the addition of freshmen Sarah Acker, Dominique Bryant, Kallie Hovatter, Alexis Johnson and Laren Robinson. As a group, these rookies averaged 91 points and 52.5 rebounds per game as seniors in high school. Sixteen games into their collegiate careers, these newcomers have made major impacts on Hawk Hill as the group has averaged 16.6 points, 11.5 rebounds and 1.9 steals per game. ACK ATTACK

Having played in just 20 collegiate games, Saint Joseph's freshman Sarah Acker has already made an impact for the Hawks. Saint Joseph's leader in scoring (11.9 ppg), the Nanticoke, Pa., native currently is eighth in the Atlantic 10 in rebounding (7.6 rpg) and is fifth in blocks (29), with her team-leading 58.9 field goal percentage ranks second in the A-10. Acker has also earned individual accolades, being selected Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week twice (Dec. 2-9, Jan. 7-13) and earning Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic All-Tournament Team honors.

MCING IT HAPPEN

Serving as backup point guard her first two seasons on Hawk Hill, junior Mary Kate McDade has thrived this year as a starter. Currently sixth in the Atlantic 10, and first on SJU, the Philadelphia native has dished out 80 assists over the first 20 games (4.00), well above her career average (1.67 apg). Also, McDade has become a bigger scoring threat this season, averaging 3.2 points per game after entering the year at 1.3 ppg.

GO-TO GOMEZ

It has been a solid start to the season for senior guard Timisha Gomez, averaging a career-high in scoring (11.2 ppg) and rebounding (3.8 rpg). The Elkridge, Md., native has led the Hawks in scoring a team-high five times and scored in double figures 12 times. Gomez, who has played in 113 of a potential 114 career games, earned Brown Basketball Classic All-Tournament Team honors after helping SJU to the title.

GILLESPIE GOING STRONG

It has been a breakout season for sophomore guard Amy Gillespie. Ranking fourth in scoring (7.5 ppg), second in three pointers (29) and earning Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament Team honors, the the Springfield, Pa., native has thrived in a larger role this season. Gillespie, who averaged 21 points per game at the Hawkeye Challenge, more than doubled her entire scoring (44) and rebounding (21) totals from last season, as she enters Sunday's game with 143 points and 57 rebounds. She is also one of only two Hawks to register 20-point games twice this season.



SO NICE THEY NAMED HER IT TWICE

Having already earned MVP honors at the Brown Basketball Classic after leading SJU to the title, senior guard **Amy Wold** again earned some hardware, earning MVP accolades at the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic. The Cedar Rapids, Iowa native scored a team-high 17 points and had five assists and six rebounds in SJU's title-game win over No. 15 Auburn. Wold averaged 12.5 points, 6.0, assists and 5.0 rebounds per game in helping the Hawks to their second in-season title of the year. Over the four-game span, the senior averaged 14 points and 5.25 assists per game.

FORD TOUGH

Averaging 13 points and 6.8 rebounds per game en route to Atlantic 10 All-Tournament honors last March, forward **Brittany Ford** was expecting a stellar start to the 2007-08 season. That didn't occur as planned as the Wilmington, DE native missed the opening 10 games with a minor knee injury. Returning to the lineup at Seton Hall, Ford is still shaking off the rust, but has still posted solid numbers for SJU, averaging 8.6 points, 3.0 rebounds per game and six blocks. At Temple, Ford posted a season-high with 19 points and added five rebounds.

BALANCED OFFENSE

With Saint Joseph's loss of 65.2 percent of its scoring (1,413 of 2,166 points) this past off-season, the Hawks have relied on all four classes to contribute in 07-08. The Hawks - who are using a younger lineup with 8 of 13 players being freshmen and sophomores - have received a very balanced attack so far this season, with a member of each class ranking among the Hawks' top four scorers. The following is a comparison of each class' points and percentage of the team's scoring based.

POST MANEUVERS

With several Hawks having a larger role this season compared to last, there is no arguing the transformation of SJU's sophomore forward **Ashley Logue**. Playing limited time in just seven games a year ago, Logue has excelled this year, playing in all 20 games, including 12 starts. Scoring only two points and adding six rebounds as a rookie, Logue eclipsed nearly all her career-highs in the opener at Lehigh (16 points and six rebounds). To date, Logue has scored 102 points (5.1 ppg) and added 71 boards (3.6rpg).

ON THE AIR



For over 17 years, the Saint Joseph's Sports Network (SJSN) has produced and broadcast Hawk athletics to the Philadelphia region and beyond. Begun as an outgrowth of a four-game package of Saint Joseph's women's basketball broadcasts during the 1989-90 season, SJSN was founded in the fall of 1990. Since that time, SJSN's coverage of Hawk athletics has grown and currently includes live coverage of all Hawk men's and women's basketball games, Phil Martelli's "HawkTalk" radio program, the nationally-renowned "HawkTalk" television show and "Courtside", the Saint Joseph's women's basketball show.

All of SJU's women's games can also be heard via audio streaming on the internet at the Hawks' official athletics site, www.sjuhawks.com. Video streaming of selected games will also be available on www.sjuhawks.com as part of the Hawks All-Access package.

Saint Joseph's pioneered commercial radio of women's college basketball in the area with a NCAA tournament game in March 1989 and followed that up with a package of regular season games ever since. The Cindy Griffin pregame show kicks-off game broadcasts.

GOMEZ AND ACKER EARN WEEKLY HONORS

Combining for 39 points in Saint Joseph's 68-61 win at St. Bonaventure, the Hawks' senior guard **Timisha Gomez** and freshman center **Sarah Acker** were honored for their individual performances with Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Week and Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week accolades, respectively. Earning the first Big 5 honor of her career, Gomez tallied a career-best 21 points to go along with five rebounds, three assists, a block and a steal in the Hawks' win, while Acker was a perfect 7-of-7, scoring 18 points and adding nine boards and four blocks. Acker had previously earned A-10 weekly honors for the week of December 2-9.

WOLD NAMED BIG 5 CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Coming off MVP honors at for the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic, Saint Joseph's senior guard **Amy Wold** was honored for her stellar play at the tournament with Big 5 Co-Player of the Week honors. The Cedar Rapids, Iowa, native earned the first SJU City Series weekly honor after helping the Hawks to the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic title. In the championship game versus No. 15 Auburn, Wold tallied a team-high 17 points and five assists, and finished the two-game tournament with a 12.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists per contest.

SJU CLAIMS HILTON PHILADELPHIA HAWK CLASSIC TITLE

The Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic championship trophy returned to Saint Joseph's as the Hawks topped NO. 15 Auburn, 71-69, in the title game (recap on page 18). The Hawks earned the title, the sixth in 17 years, backed by MVP **Amy Wold** and All-Tournament Team member **Sarah Acker's** 17 and 16 points, respectively. Saint Joseph's previously won the Hawk Classic in 1993, 1997, 1999, 2000 and 2001. The Hawks topped NJIT, 68-59, in the opening round as senior guard **Timisha Gomez** paced SJU with 16 points.

HEART OF A HAWK

In addition to athletics and academics, community service has long been one of the traditions of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball program. The "Heart of a Hawk" program is the team's way of "giving back" to the community. Each student athlete is required to complete a minimum of 10 hours of community service each semester.



SAINT JOSEPH'S VERSUS THE POLLS

Topping No. 15 Auburn in the title game of the Hilton Philadelphia Hawk Classic, Saint Joseph's improved to 31-104 all-time versus ranked opponents and 1-2 on the season. The Hawks previously lost to No. 5/6 Rutgers, 56-50, November 28 and to No. 21/22 Wyoming, 66-64, on December 8. The Hawk last win over a ranked team prior to Saturday came on March 4, 2007 as SJU topped No. 8/9 George Washington, 57-55. LIGHTS, CAMERAS, HAWKS

Former SJU standouts Jane Meade '02, Elizabeth Mohan '04, Ayahna Cornish '07 and current SJU assistant coach **Susan Moran** '02, will appear in the upcoming film "Our Lady of Victory", centered around the 1972 national-championship squad from Immaculata. The movie, starring Ellen Burstyn (Requiem For A Dream), Carla Gugino (HBO's Entourage) and David Boreanaz (Fox's Bones), focuses on the Mighty Macs of Immaculata and their new coach Cathy Rush (played by Gugino). Realizing her dream as a coach, Rush leads Immaculata from a team with no gym to the first national title in women's basketball. The movie is due out in March.

NEW FACES ON HAWK HILL

Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** announced this summer that **Stephanie McCaffrey** was promoted to assistant coach, while Saint Joseph's Hall of Famer **Ellen Fitzpatrick** returned to Hawk Hill as director of women's basketball operations. After spending the previous two seasons as the director of basketball operations, McCaffrey (nee Graff) was promoted to assistant coach, replacing the departed Lynn Milligan, who left in April to accept the head-coaching job at Rider. Fitzpatrick, who brings over 15 years of basketball experience to Griffin's staff, is in charge of opponent film exchange, and assisting in team travel plans. She also assists with the Hawk Hill Roundball Club, SJU's basketball booster organization, as well as the Ball-Handling Kids Club and team promotions.

CRADLE OF COACHES

The Saint Joseph's coaching connection is an impressive one. A total of 16 Saint Joseph's graduates are currently in the coaching ranks, with another six head coaches who have ties to Hawk Hill. Current SJU Head Coach Cindy Griffin and Notre Dame Head Coach Muffet (O'Brien) McGraw both earned Saint Joseph's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame honors after terrific playing careers at Hawk Hill. This past summer, Saint Joseph's added another to the coaching ranks as Lynn Milligan resigned to become head coach at her alma mater, Rider. Milligan joins current Loyola (MD) Head Coach Joe Logan as member's of Griffin's staff who have become head coaches at the Division I level. The Hawks captured their 14th in-season title in program history as SJU topped Manhattan (65-58) and Brown (65-54) to claim the Brown Basketball Classic title. Saint Joseph's senior **Amy Wold** earned MVP honors after posting a career-high 20 points and seven assists in the title game. Classmate **Timisha Gomez** was named to the All-Tournament Team as she led SJU with a game-high 17 points in the opener versus the Jaspers.

S-A-I-N-T JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY

The corporate title of "Saint" Joseph's University, which has been in place since Saint Joseph's was granted university status by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1979, is now the "public" title of the institution for all aspects of its operations. Previously, the abbreviation of "St." Joseph's University was permitted in a number of alumni and athletic contexts. According to the most recent edition of the Higher Education Directory, there are at least nine recognized "St. Joseph's" among the nation's colleges and universities. Only one of them-Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia-is a university-level, Master's I, NCAA Division I institution. A complete spelling of S-A-I-N-T Joseph's University in all contexts will help eliminate any confusion among higher education and other public constituencies.

HAWKS INK THREE FOR 2008-09

Saint Joseph's women's basketball announced that **Michelle Baker** (Wilmington, DE/Brandywine), **Kelly Cavallo** (Westhampton Beach, NY/Westhampton Beach) and **Katie Kuester** (Chestnut Hill, PA/Academy of Notre Dame) have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Saint Joseph's University in the fall of 2008-09.

"We have a very solid class coming to Hawk Hill next season," said Saint Joseph's head coach Cindy Griffin. "I think these three young women fit the need that we will have with the departure of this year's senior class."

A 5-foot-9 guard, Baker enters her senior season at Brandywine with 1,438 career points and just 121 points shy of Delaware's top-10 all-time scorers' list. A Preseason Honorable Mention All-American by Sporting News, she was named team captain and MVP the past three years. As a junior, Baker earned First Team All-Conference honors, averaging 24 points, 10 rebounds and three assists per game.

A three-time All-New York State selection, Cavallo will bring a scorer's touch from the post position. Standing 6-foot-1, the Westhampton Beach, NY, native has averaged double figures in scoring her entire high school career, including 23 points, 14 rebounds and six rebounds per game as a junior. Selected three times to both the All-League and All-Suffolk County teams, Cavallo has also shown to be a proven winner, leading her squad to both Suffolk Count Class A and Long Island Class A titles and the New York State Final Four as a freshman.

Kuester joins Baker on the Preseason Honorable Mention All-America Team by Sporting News. As a junior, the 5-foot-10 guard averaged 10.3 points, 3.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists per game as she led Academy of Notre Dame to a 17-9 overall record, earning First Team All-Maine Line, Second Team All-Delco and Second Team All-Inter-AC accolades along the way. Possessing a keen shooting touch, Kuester finished the 2006-07 season with 60 three pointers.



FIELDHOUSE EXPANSION PROJECT

A major expansion of Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse and a dedicated center for men's and women's basketball highlight a comprehensive plan for enhancing varsity and recreational athletics at Saint Joseph's. Construction on the project began in the fall of 2007.

As the home of the Hawks, the Fieldhouse is the well-loved shrine and the very heart of Saint Joseph's athletics. The expansion and renovation is an integral part of *With Faith and Strength to Dare: The Campaign for Saint Joseph's University*, and will preserve the storied facility while bringing the athletic complex to a level befitting such a venerable tradition. The Fieldhouse, home to Saint Joseph's University basketball since 1949, will be named for Michael J. Hagan '85 at the conclusion of the multi-year project set to begin this fall.

Because of the Maguire Campus (former Episcopal Academy) acquisition, the vast needs of the University's intramural program and several varsity sports will finally be addressed, creating an opportunity to dramatically improve the infrastructure for men's and women's basketball.

The three-phased project will begin with the construction of a two-story, 20,000-square-foot new wing adjacent to the existing Fieldhouse. It will add locker rooms, offices, and study rooms for men's and women's basketball, and a new Athletic Hall of Fame room.

Phase II will upgrade and renovate the current sports complex by adding a dedicated practice facility with permanent wood flooring as well as locker rooms and offices for soccer, lacrosse, track, and cross country. Phase III will include a complete overhaul of the interior of the fieldhouse, followed by the construction of an upper-level concourse, expanded seating (a minimum of 1,000 seats will be added), and more. Home court advantage will be secured, and the Saint Joseph's athletic tradition will live on for years to come.

Events in the new facility could begin as early as 2010.



THE HAWK

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" has been flapping its wings for over half a century, celebrating its golden anniversary in 2004-05.

The Hawk is one of the most famous mascots in college sports best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its "wings" from tip-off to the final buzzer of every game, as well as for "flying" in figure eights around the court during timeouts. The constant flapping, coupled with the scrappy play of the University's athletic teams, helped to spawn the school's familiar slogan "The Hawk Will Never Die!" ESPN used a "flap-o-meter" on a national telecast of a Saint Joseph's game to estimate that the Hawk flaps its wings 3,500 times during a regulation game.



The most decorated mascot in the country, the Hawk has garnered numerous accolades in its 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine. *Eastern Basketball* tabbed The Hawk as the Atlantic 10 Conference's best mascot, while The Hawk won a "Best of Philly" award in 2003-04.

Saint Joseph's University athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor, Charlie Dunn, initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed to two, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" (World War I soldiers who specialized in tossing grenades) by a slim margin in the final vote. The winning suggestion was submitted by John Gallagher, Class of '31, who was a catcher on the Saint Joseph's baseball team. He won a sweater with a special Saint Joseph's monogram for selecting the winning name.

According to the student annual, the name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at Saint Joseph's following the 1939 season.

The idea for the Hawk as a mascot was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-Marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later switched to the costume idea. The student government raised the 120 dollars needed to buy the initial costume, which Brennan donned for three years. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, nine SJU students have donned the costume. Saint Joseph's junior Kevin Hensler is in his third season as the Hawk.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Internet sites and agencies that will be considered for credentials include those of national cable networks or established publications. Internet sites representing local or regional media outlets will be provided credentials on a space-available basis. Websites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are able to post anonymous information are ineligible for consideration of credentials.

POST-GAME

Saint Joseph's Head Coach Cindy Griffin will be available in the interview room following a post-game cooling off period, along with select players. The Saint Joseph's lockerroom will not be open to the media after the cooling off period.

PRESS ROW

Only accredited members of the media and accredited scouts will be issued credentials to cover Saint Joseph's basketball, and only those with passes will be permitted to sit in press seating. Members of the media are reminded that press row is a working area and cheering for either team will not be tolerated.

RADIO POLICY

Radio stations designated as the primary visiting outlet can have access to phone lines at a cost of \$100 per line per game. (\$200 for ISDN), unless a reciprocal agreement exists. Visiting radio stations wishing to broadcast the game should contact Jack Jumper at (610) 660-3389 to arrange phone lines.



HEAD COACH CINDY GRIFFIN



Five postseason berths in her first six seasons at the helm of Saint Joseph's is one of the numerous accomplishments for the Hawks' Head Coach Cindy Griffin. Guiding Saint Joseph's to its first win over a Top 10 team and an appearance in the Atlantic 10 title game last year, the former Hawk standout enters her seventh season as head coach of the Saint Joseph's University women's basketball team. A 1991 graduate of SJU, Griffin (nee Anderson) was named the seventh head coach in the program's history on April 25, 2001. Griffin has compiled an overall record of 169-121 in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Griffin helped to reinvigorate the SJU program in her first season, leading the squad to a 24-8 record and the second round of the WNIT. She capitalized on the team's tradition of scrappy play and rugged defense, while releasing the reins and allowing the team to play a more up-tempo style on the offensive end of the floor. The Hawks finished the year among the national leaders in nine different categories and paced the nation in free throw percentage for the second straight year.

Following a memorable first year at the helm of her alma mater, Griffin upped the ante in her second season by capturing 2003 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Hawks to a 19-11 record. The team sprinted to the conference's Eastern Division title and earned a berth in the WNIT for the second straight season, despite the departure of SJU's all-time leading scorer and a non-conference schedule that rated fourth nationally.

Led by six seniors, the 2004 team went 22-11 and advanced to the WNIT Elite Eight. Saint Joseph's finished second in the A-10 East and dropped a heartbreaker in the Atlantic 10 Championship to Temple. Four Hawk seniors reached the 1,000-point plateau, marking just the eighth time in NCAA history that a quartet of players had reached the milestone in the same season. Erin Brady, Irina Krasnoshiok, Stephanie (Graff) McCaffrey and Amra Mehmedic went on to sign professional contracts.

With the loss of four 1,000-point scorers, the 2004-05 Hawks showed their true colors down the stretch, earning a hard-fought victory over La Salle in the opening round of the Atlantic 10 Championship and coming within 10 points of 16th-ranked, and eventual A-10 Champion, Temple.

Fueled by a collection of newcomers and a developed core of upperclassmen, Griffin led the Hawks back to national prominence in 2005-06. The Crimson and Gray engineered the nation's best turnaround of 13 games, made an appearance in the national polls for the first time since 2003-04, advanced to the semi-finals of the A-10 Championship and earned a berth in the WNIT.

Despite losing a good deal of experienced players prior to the 2006-07 season, Griffin had her team peaking at the right time. Playing Griffin's style of hard-nosed defense and persistent offense, the Hawks advanced to the Atlantic 10 Championship, including the program's first win over a Top 10 opponent (#8/9 George Washington) along the way. Saint Joseph's capped the season with its fifth WNIT appearance in six years and tied the SJU record for games played in a season with 33.

Following her playing career, Griffin spent the 1992-93 season as a graduate assistant at her alma mater. She then accepted an assistant's spot at Vanderbilt University from 1993-95 under former Saint Joseph's head coach Jim Foster. Foster recruited Griffin to SJU and coached her during her playing career on Hawk Hill.

In her two years as an assistant at Vanderbilt, the Commodores finished 53-15 overall, won the 1995 SEC championship and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 both seasons. In addition to coaching responsibilities, she was the co-director of the Vanderbilt Basketball Camp and the director of the Black & Gold Club.

Griffin left Vanderbilt after the 1995 season to return to the East Coast as an assistant coach at Loyola College (MD). She spent three seasons as an assistant under Patty Coyle at Loyola before being elevated to the role of associate head coach in 1998. Griffin was promoted to the position of head women's basketball coach at Loyola midway through the 1998-99 season. She was the seventh-youngest head coach in Division I at the time. Griffin - who was named head coach five games into season as Coyle left for an assistant coach position with the WNBA's New York Liberty - kept the Greyhounds' momentum going as Loyola won a team-record 21 games that year. Overall she compiled a record of 48-33 during her tenure at the Baltimore school, guiding the squad to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference semi-finals all three seasons.

One of the top playmakers in Saint Joseph's history, Griffin starred for the Hawks from 1987-88 through 1991-92 (missing the 1988-89 season due to injury). A three-year team captain, Griffin finished her career with 662 points, 278 rebounds, 510 assists and 197 steals. She ranks fourth on SJU's all-time assist list.

As a junior in 1990-91, she played in 1,178 out of a possible 1,200 minutes to set the school record for minutes played in a single season. The Hawks made three NCAA Tournament appearances and posted three straight 20-win seasons during her playing career. A two-time Second Team All-Big 5 choice, as well as a Third Team All-Atlantic 10 pick as a senior, she was inducted into the Saint Joseph's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 1998.

A native of Maple Glen, Pa., Griffin played her high school basketball for Bishop McDevitt, winning two Philadelphia Catholic League titles. A 1987 graduate of McDevitt, she was inducted into its Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997, and in 2002, received the Philadelphia Catholic League's alumni achievement award. She earned a bachelor's degree in accounting from Saint Joseph's in 1991 and completed work on a M.B.A. degree from SJU in 1993. She resides in Conshohocken, Pa., with her husband Curtis and daughters, Kaylie (4) and Hannah (2).
