TIPPING OFF

The Hawks hit the road for the final time this regular season as Saint Joseph's squares off against Xavier Friday evening at the Cintas Center with fourth place in the Atlantic 10 on the line. Both squads enter the game with identical 9-5 records in conference play, with the winner holding a one-game advantage heading into the final game of the season on Sunday.

SCOUTING THE MUSKETEERS

Winning six of its last seven, Xavier is peaking at the right time as they enter the final weekend of the regular season. Led by All-American candidate Tara Boothe, the Musketeers have posted an 18-7 overall record and can clinch fourth place and a bye in the A-10 Tournament with a weekend sweep of the Hawks and Dayton Flyers. A senior forward, Boothe leads the A-10 in scoring at 20.8 ppg, and leads Xavier in rebounding at 9.1 rpg. Likely joining Boothe starting lineup are guards Suntana Granderson (15.1 ppg), Michele Miller (10.1 ppg), Miranda Green (10.0 ppg) and forward Kristy Wallner (6.1 ppg). The group has started all 25 games this season for fourth-year head coach Kevin McGuff.

THE SERIES

The Hawks and Musketeers meet for only the 15th time when the two squads face-off Friday at the Cintas Center. Saint Joseph's, which holds a slight 8-6 edge in the all-time series, is 3-3 when playing in Cincinnati and only 1-2 at the Cintas Center. The Musketeers snapped a three-game losing skid to the Hawks last season as Tara Boothe paced Xavier to a 72-55 win at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse on January 21. Boothe led all scorers with 28 points, while **Whitney Ffrench** scored a then-career-high 17 for SJU.

LAST TIME OUT: SAINT JOSEPH'S DOWNS LA SALLE ON SENIOR DAY, 61-55

On a day the Saint Joseph's honored its senior class, it was junior guard **Whitney Ffrench** and sophomore guard **Timisha Gomez** who combined for 30 points to help lead the Hawks to a 61-55 victory over La Salle. With La Salle leading by one at the 12:42 mark of the second half, the Hawks took the lead for good on a 6-0 run over the next four minutes, taking a 43-38 edge. Trailing by eight with 2:24 to go, the Explorers scored five straight to cut it to a one-possession game, 51-48, with 1:44 remaining. After exchanging baskets, freshman guard **Jen Oyler** nailed a three-pointer with 58 seconds remaining to make it a 56-50 game. Saint Joseph's made five free throws over the final 58 seconds to hold on to the victory. Complete boxscore and recap available on page 29.

TRAINER'S ROOM

Freshman forward **Brittany Ford** will miss the entire 2005-06 season after suffering a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her left knee during practice. A three-time *Street & Smith's* All-America Honorable Mention, Ford will apply for a medical redshirt. The 6-foot-1 Ford averaged 14.4 ppg as a senior at Concord High School. Senior guard **Christine Roth**, and junior guard **Ayahna Cornish** are out the remainder of the season. Roth will miss the final games of the year with a left ankle injury, while Cornish is out after suffering a torn ACL at Massachusetts on February 5.

QUICK HITS

Junior guard **Timisha Gomez** is averaging 15.0 ppg last two contests for the Hawks...Freshman **Hillary Klimowicz** has five double-doubles this season, tying Saint Joseph's team total for the entire 2004-05 season.

SCHUTTE, MCBRYAN NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Saint Joseph's seniors **Faith Schutte** and **Maura McBryan** have been selected to the 2006 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District II Basketball Teams, officials from the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) announced February 9. A 6-foot-1 forward, Schutte earned First Team honors and is now eligible for Academic All-America distinctions, while McBryan, a 2005 member of the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District II Basketball Second Team, earns the honor for the second straight season. An English major with a 3.86 GPA, Schutte is averaging a career-best 8.8 ppg to go along with 4.6 rebounds. McBryan, a history major with a 3.86 GPA, earns her second straight distinction after averaging 4.3 points and 3.2 rebounds per game.

TURNING THE SHIP AROUND

Following a transition season in 2004-05, Saint Joseph's has returned to prominence in 2005-06 as the Hawks have made a 10-game improvement from the previous season, tying for the best turn around in the nation. The following is a look at the programs with the best turn arounds to date.

KLIMOWICZ EARNS SIXTH A-10 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

For the sixth time this season Saint Joseph's freshman **Hillary Klimowicz** has been recognized as Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week, this time sharing the honor with Sarah Williams of Richmond for the week of February 12-18. Over that period, Klimowicz helped the Hawks to a 1-1 record, while averaging 11.5 points, 8.0 rebounds per game. The 6-foot-2 center has previously earned the honor on November 20, December 4, December 11, December 25 and February 5. For the season, Klimowicz leads all newcomers in scoring, averaging 9.4 points per games and also leads Saint Joseph's in rebounding (7.6 per game) and blocks (54).

HOME SWEET HOME

After winning only two games at home all of 2004-05, the Hawks have reasserted their home-court advantage in 2005-06. Through its first eight games at Alumni Memorial Fieldhouse, Saint Joseph's has boasted a 11-2 record and outscored teams by 8.4 ppg.

HAWKS TOP ATLANTIC 10 ALL-TIME STANDINGS

Amongst the 14 current teams in the Atlantic 10, Saint Joseph's ranks first in all-time regular season standings. Entering their 23rd season in the A-10, the Hawks have compiled a 258-100 record for a .721 winning percentage. Only former A-10 member Rutgers (.848) and Penn State (.787) had higher winning percentages than SJU.

CHARITY CASE

Junior guard **Whitney Ffrench** has proven a prowess for getting to the free throw line and it has rubbed off on her teammates this year. In the 21 games this season in which Ffrench has played, Saint Joseph's is averaging 2.0 trips to the charity stripe a game and converting 14.4 of those. In the four contests Ffrench missed, the Hawks averaged 10.3 trips and 8.0 makes per game.

CLOSE CALLS

For the second time this month, Saint Joseph's had another close-call, this time versus Dayton, February 12. The Hawks, who led by as many as 15, got a game-winning free throw with 5.6 seconds left from junior **Whitney Ffrench** to down Dayton 66-65. Last time versus Temple, freshman **Hillary Klimowicz's** layup with 3.2 seconds left helped SJU past the #17/19 Owls, 65-64. On the year, the Hawks are 5-1 in overtime games and games decided by a possession. The following is a list of those games.

PULLING RANK

For the second time this season, the Hawks downed a nationally ranked team, the latest coming January 27 as Saint Joseph's downed #17/19 Temple 65-64. Earlier this season, the Hawks earned a 54-52 victory over #23/25 North Carolina State. The two wins over ranked opponents is the first for the Hawks since the 1999-2000 season and is the first time since 1991-92 they have done so in consecutive contests. All-time Saint Joseph's has posted a record to 29-101 against national ranked opponents, going 2-1 this season, with its lone loss at #22/23 Temple 59-53 on February 17.

BLOCK PARTY

Playing in only 25 games in the Crimson and Gray, freshman center **Hillary Klimowicz** has already established herself as one of the more prolific shot blockers in program history. The 6-foot-2 Scotch Plains, NJ native is currently second in Atlantic 10 in blocks per game at 2.18 and is averaging 2.21 in A-10 only contests. Her 54 this season is the second-best single-season mark in program history and has her tied for 10th all-time.

POLL POSITION

Six time this season, Saint Joseph's has received votes in the Associated Press Poll Top-25 Poll, most recently receiving four votes in the February 13 poll. The national recognition was the first time the Hawks have garnered votes in 2006, as SJU received votes five straight weeks (11/21, 11/28, 12/5, 12/12, 12/19) during its non-conference schedule. The Hawks also twice received votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll (12/12, 12/19). The last time the Hawks were ranked nationally was in March on 1990 as Saint Joseph's finished the season ranked 23rd in the USA Today Coaches Poll and 25th in the Associated Press Poll.

HEAD OF THE CLASS

Highly touted as one of the top recruiting classes in Saint Joseph's recent history, the 2005-06 freshmen class were expected to play a major role for the Hawks this season. However, many people might not have expected the impact the rookies have brought to Hawk Hill. Not only have the freshmen class of **Hillary Klimowicz, Jenna Loschiavo, Mary Kate McDade and Jen Oyler** led Saint Joseph's to a 17-8 overall record, they have also filled up the scorebook. Heading into Friday's game, the freshman have scored 483 of the team's 1,501 points for 32.1 percent of the Hawks' offense. The following is a breakdown class scoring:

GOMEZ GOING STRONG

After posting a solid start to the season, sophomore guard **Timisha Gomez** has turned it up for Atlantic 10 play. Averaging 5.7 points per game during the nonconference portion of the schedule, Gomez has excelled in A-10 play, ranking fourth on the squad at 7.5 ppg to raise her season average to 6.7ppg. Gomez has also seen an increase in assists during conference play as she has gone from 2.3 apg versus nonconference teams to 2.5 apg against A-10 teams.

FFREE THROWS FFALLING

Junior guard **Whitney Ffrench** has proven to be one of the top free throw shooters for the Hawks this season, converting 78.6 percent (88-of-112). Over 21 games, Ffrench has averaged 4.2 of her 7.0 points per game from the free throw line. Currently the third best free throw shooter in the Atlantic 10, Ffrench hit the game winning free throws with two seconds left in SJU's 54-52 win over #23/25 NC State and hit the game-winning free throw with 5.6 seconds left in the Hawks 66-65 win over Dayton.

SENSATIONAL SENIOR SEASON

Coming off a solid junior campaign that saw her set new season-highs in points and rebounds, senior **Faith Schutte** has kept up her continued improvement into this season. To date, the 6-foot-1 forward ranks is averaging a career-best 8.8 points per game, and ranks second in rebounds (4.8 rpg) and blocks (0.4 bpg) and fourth in assists (1.64 apg). Schutte, who averaged 13.5 points and 6.5 rebounds at the Wildcat Classic, was acknowledged for her exceptional play by earning a spot on the All-Tournament Team. She scored a career-best 19 points in a win over SLU on January 13.

WELL OYLED MACHINE

Freshman guard **Jen Oyler** has shown little trouble in adjusting to the collegiate game in her rookie season. Through the opening 25 games, the 6-foot-1 Oyler is tied for fifth on the Hawks in scoring (6.7points per game) and ranks seventh in minutes played (16.6 per game). A three-point specialist, Oyler currently leads Saint Joseph's with 46 three pointers made, tying for ninth in the A-10.

CAPTAINS ON THE DECK

On October 25, Saint Joseph's Head Coach **Cindy Griffin** announced that seniors **Maura McBryan** and **Faith Schutte** and junior **Ayahna Cornish** will serve as the team's captains for the 2005-06 season. The honor is the second for McBryan and first for Cornish and Schutte.

OYLER NAMED ATLANTIC 10 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Saint Joseph's freshman guard **Jen Oyler** has been named as Atlantic 10 Women's Basketball Rookie of the Week for the week of December 25-31. The 6-0 guard earned All-Tournament honors at the 15th Annual Hawk Classic after helping Saint Joseph's to the title game. Over two games, Oyler averaged 10.0 ppg and 3.5 rpg.

CORNISH NAMED WILDCAT CLASSIC MVP

Leading the Hawks to the 11th Annual Commerce Bank Wildcat Classic title, Saint Joseph's junior guard **Ayahna Cornish** was honored as MVP. Scoring 12 of her team-high 20 points in the second half, Cornish helped the Hawks outscore Kansas State 46-24 in the second stanza to earn the team title. Over the two-day tournament, Cornish averaged 17 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists.

BRING'EM ON BACK

After boasting one of only eight teams nationally in 2004-05 to boast a roster without one senior, the Hawks again find themselves in elite company in 2005-06. Saint Joseph's is one of only 25 teams in the nation to return all five starters this year as the Hawks return 10 of 12 letterwinners from last season.

OYLER AND KLIMOWICZ EARN HAWK CLASSIC HONORS

The freshmen duo of **Hillary Klimowicz** and **Jen Oyler** earned individual honors at the 15th annual Hawk Classic as both were named to the All-Tournament Team. A threat in the middle, Klimowicz averaged 9.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game, while the sharp-shooting Oyler added 10.0 ppg and 3.5 rpg.

BIG 5 RECOGNIZES CORNISH AS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Two days after leading Saint Joseph's women's basketball to the Commerce Bank Wildcat Classic title and MVP honors, Hawks' junior guard **Ayahna Cornish** was recognized as the Big 5 Player of the Week on December 5. Helping Saint Joseph's to a 3-0 record on the week, the Philadelphia native finished the week averaging 14.3 points, 4.67 assists and 4.3 rebounds. In Wednesday's win at Penn, the 5-foot-9 Cornish scored 13 points and added four assists.

HAWKS INK GILLESPIE TO NLI FOR 2006-07

Saint Joseph's announced 6-foot guard **Amy Gillespie** (Springfield, PA/Cardinal O'Hara) signed a National Letter of Intent on November 10, the first day of the NCAA early signing period. As a junior, Gillespie led Cardinal O'Hara High School to the Catholic League title last season, garnering All-Catholic League, All-Delaware County and All-Southeaster Pennsylvania honors in the process. A Street & Smith All-American Honorable Mention, she paced Cardinal O'Hara in scoring at 14.0 ppg.

THE HAWK MASCOT

The Saint Joseph's "Hawk" continues to flap its wings into its 51st season during the 2005-06 year. "Hawks" has served as the nickname for Saint Joseph's athletic teams since 1929. The idea for The Hawk, as mascot, was originated by Jim Brennan during the 1954-55 season. Brennan, an ex-marine and SJU cheerleader, at first wanted to secure an actual hawk, but later chose a costume. Brennan went on to don the costume as the student government raised 120 dollars to purchase it. He made his debut as the Hawk on January 4, 1956, a 69-56 win over La Salle at the Palestra. The Hawk, who was present at most women's basketball games, became a main-stay in 1989. Since then, eight SJU students have donned it. Selected as the nation's top mascot by *Sports Illustrated*, *Street & Smith Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine, the Hawk was named the nation's top mascot in *The Sporting News* January 2001 "Best of College Basketball" issue. **Kevin Hensler** currently dons the costume for every women's game.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Internet sites and agencies that will be considered for credentials include those of national cable networks or established publications. Internet sites representing local or regional media outlets will be provided credentials on a space-available basis. Websites that sponsor "message boards" or "chat rooms" where people are able to post anonymous information are ineligible for consideration of credentials.

Only accredited members of the media and accredited scouts will be issued credentials to cover Saint Joseph's basketball, and only those with passes will be permitted to sit in press seating. Members of the media are reminded that press row is a working area and cheering for either team will not be tolerated.

Saint Joseph's head coach Cindy Griffin will be available in the interview room following a post-game cooling off period. The Saint Joseph's lockerroom will be open to the media after the cooling off period.

Trailing early, Princeton fought back with a 9-2 run of its own, as the Tigers held Saint Joseph's to two Cornish free throws over the next 4:31.

Following a 30-second timeout to gather themselves, the Hawks opened up a 15-point lead, scoring 17 of the next 19 points to take a 26-11 lead on a pair of free throws from junior guard **Whitney Ffrench**.

Leading by 13 at the half, 30-17, Saint Joseph's quickly extended its lead to 18. Sophomore guard **Timisha Gomez** added a pair of free throws, while McBryan added a three pointer at 19:00, to take a 35-17.

Princeton cut the Hawks lead to eight, 42-34, on a pair of free throws by Becky Brown with 7:56 remaining, but Saint Joseph's responded as Cornish added back-to-back breakaway layups to push the Hawk lead back to double digits.

Both teams would exchange short runs over the final minutes, but the Hawks maintained a double figure lead throughout as it earned its third straight victory in season openers.

With the victory, the Hawks improve to 1-0 on the season, while the Tigers fall to 0-1. The win also extends Saint Joseph's winning streak to seven over Princeton as the Hawks move to 7-0 lifetime versus the Tigers.

For the first time since the 2001-02 season, the Saint Joseph's women's basketball team downed a nationally ranked opponent as two free throws in the final seconds by junior guard **Whitney Ffrench** lifted the Hawks past #23/25 North Carolina State 54-52.

Trailing by one, 52-51, with four seconds remaining, Saint Joseph's fouled North Carolina State's Khadijah Whittington, sending her to the foul line for a one-and-one.

With her team clinging to a one-point lead, Whittington missed the front end of the one-and-one as the ball hit the front of the rim and bounced to the left side. Ffrench gathered the loose ball and was fouled by Ashley Key as she drove up the court.

With only two seconds remaining, Ffrench knocked down the first of two free throws to tie the game at 52 apiece. Following a North Carolina State timeout, Ffrench calmly made the second free throw to give the Hawks a 53-52 lead.

On the ensuing inbounds, North Carolina State attempted a long-distance pass, but the ball bounced harmlessly out of bounds, giving Saint Joseph's control of the ball. Junior guard **Ayahna Cornish** was then fouled and made one of two free throws.

Leading by two, 54-52, with 1.3 seconds remaining, Ffrench intercepted the inbounds pass and dribbled out the clock for the victory.

In the first stanza, the Hawks quickly jumped out to a 4-0 lead, but saw it quickly erased as North Carolina State used a 10-4 run to take a 10-8 lead. Both teams battled closely over the remainder of the period as the Wolfpack's opened its biggest lead, 17-14, at 7:18.

Saint Joseph's headed into the lockerroom up one, 21-20, as the Hawks regained the lead with a pair of Ffrench free throws at 1:11.

The #23/25 ranked Wolfpack came out of halftime energized and quickly regained the lead. North Carolina State used a 17-7 run to open the second half.

Trailing by 11, 43-31, Saint Joseph's mounted its comeback. Using a 12-2 run, the Hawks came within two, 45-43 on a layup by senior forward **Faith Schutte** at 5:18.

Down one, 52-51, Saint Joseph's controlled the basketball with 17 seconds remaining. On the ensuing play Whittington stole the ball for the Wolfpack in the far right corner. With just over five seconds remaining, the Hawks fouled three times, forcing the one-and-one and setting up Ffrench's game-winning free throws.

With the victory, the Hawks improve to 2-0 on the season as it marks the first time Saint Joseph's has beaten North Carolina State as the Wolfpack had won the previous four meetings. The Hawks' victory also snapped an 11-game losing skid to nationally ranked opponents with their last victory coming November 18, 2001 at home versus Rutgers (64-58).
