SEASON PREVIEW

Having graduated arguably one of the best classes in program history, Saint Joseph's seventh-year head coach Jess Reynolds has confidence in her team to accomplish the same goal: compete for an Atlantic 10 Championship.

"This season is going to be a challenge for us as we graduated six starters that changed our program, but our expectations still remain high," Reynolds said. "A majority of our returning players have had A-10 Tournament experience and our incoming freshmen should make an immediate impact."

Coming off a record-setting 33 goals last year, Reynolds will press her Hawks to top that as Saint Joseph's will play a more aggressive style on offense this season.

"Our plan is to attack defenses and play a really high pressure style of play," said Reynolds. "We worked hard in the preseason to be mentally and physically tough and it should prove decisive on the field."

Leading the Hawks' offense this season will be senior co-captain **Shannon Osborn**. Coming off a productive junior year, Osborn is Saint Joseph's returning leader in goals (three) and points (six). Likely to start alongside Osborn at forward are juniors **Laura Adams** and **Amanda Morrell** and sophomore **Danielle DeBernardo**.

Playing in 15 games last season, including eight starts, Adams saw time at both forward and in the midfield, recording one goal. Saint Joseph's returning leader in assists (two), Morrell made the most of her first season with the Hawks. Seeing action in 11 games, Morrell earned six starts as a rookie. One of only four Hawks to play in all 18 games, DeBernardo had an impact as a freshman, tallying a goal and an assist as she split time between midfield and attack.

Challenging for time at forward this year will be senior **Kristie-Anne Hoban**, junior **Lauren Stevis** and freshmen **Raeann Groves**, **Brooke Price** and **Lauren Sawyer**. Last year, Hoban recorded a career-best three shots, while Stevis made steady improvement after suffering a season-ending injury as a freshman. Sawyer capped her high school career as the all-time leader in goals, assists and points at Smithtown East, while Groves finished as the third all-time leader in scoring at Old Lyme. Price, a two time All-New Jersey honoree, helped the Mount Laurel Strikers to two state titles.

With last May's graduation of Kimmy Leigh, the program's top playmaker in recent years, the focus will now be on junior **Ashley Bugnar** and sophomores **Lauren Sutcliffe** and DeBernardo.

After playing in all 20 games as a rookie, Bugnar posted a career-best three points over 17 games as a sophomore. The Newtown, PA, native added a goal and assist, earning six starts along the way for Saint Joseph's.

Appearing in 17 games last season as a freshman, Sutcliffe will likely improve upon her 11 starts. Tallying a goal and an assist in her first year at Saint Joseph's, Sutcliffe's playmaking ability should fill the gap left by last year's class.



Sophomore co-captain Sarah O'Malley is one of two returning Hawks to have started all 18 games last season.

Adding depth to the Hawks midfield this season are junior **Allie Dowling**, sophomore **Amy Balaguer** and freshmen **Meagan Cronin**, **Amanda Irons** and **Carly Salter**.

The only two Saint Joseph's players to start all 18 games a year ago, senior **Kelly Galen** and sophomore **Sarah O'Malley** will serve as the Hawks' backbone on defense.

A two-year starter after transferring from Lafayette, Galen has given SJU poise and balance at defense and was named co-captain for her leadership.

Adding a strong shot and playmaking ability, O'Malley made an instant impact for the Hawks, scoring a goal and tallying three shots from the defensive position.

Earning playing time in eight games, including three starts, sophomore **Taylor Carr** and freshman **Kaitlyn Grimes** will challenge for the third starting spot.

Between the pipes, senior **Jen Kuhn** and sophomore **Megan Bastianelli** will battle for the starting spot. Starting 14 games as a junior, Kuhn posted a team-high five wins and a 1.73 goals-against average. As a freshman, having started four games, Bastianelli went 2-3, while making 22 saves.

Having again slated one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the region, Reynolds believes playing a strong schedule will help her team come conference play.

"We have one of our most challenging non-conference schedules to date this year," said Reynolds. "We start out versus two tough teams in Drexel and Delaware that should tell us where we are at."

Saint Joseph's hopes that its tough scheduling will pay off in Atlantic 10 competition as the Hawks look to return to the A-10 Tournament, coming up short a season ago.

"The A-10 is going to be tough again this season," said Reynolds. "Last year's winner Saint Louis is going to be strong, as will the rest of the conference. We believe our strong play at the end of the season and hard work in the offseason should help us return to the postseason and compete for the Atlantic 10 title."

Jess Reynolds, the only coach in program history to lead the Hawks to the Atlantic 10 Tournament, returns for her seventh season at the helm of the women's soccer program. In just six years, Reynolds has turned around a team that posted a single A-10 win in the season before she arrived to one of the up-and-coming programs in the conference.

Bringing in several highly-touted recruits and transfers, Reynolds led the Hawks to their first winning season in four years in 2003. Saint Joseph's went 9-8-1 overall and set a program record for Atlantic 10 wins with a 7-4-0 record and qualified for its first A-10 Tournament. Saint Joseph's also set team records for assists and points.

The seven-game improvement from 2002 to 2003 ranked among the best in the nation. Reynolds also guided three players to All-Conference or All-Rookie recognition, including 2003 A-10 Rookie of the Year Megan Schutt.

In 2004, Reynolds guided the Hawks to new heights as Saint Joseph's earned the program's first post-season victory. Highlighted by a 1-0 win over La Salle in the A-10 Championship, the Hawks posted a 9-11-1 overall record and finished 6-4-1 in conference play.

Having graduated the Hawks' top scorer and goalkeeper, Reynolds' coaching ability shined in 2006 as Saint Joseph's fought into the final weekend for a playoff spot. Despite falling shy of the program's fourth-straight postseason appearance, Reynolds coached the Hawks to a single-season best 33 goals, while helping senior Ali Wean to the first ever A-10 Offensive Player of the Year in SJU history. Wean, who scored a single-season record 14 goals last year, also became the second Hawk under Reynolds' guidance to earn A-10 First Team All-Conference accolades, along with the first SJU player to be named to *SoccerBuzz.com* Mid-Atlantic Third Team.

The seventh-year mentor has annually compiled one of the toughest schedules in the region and 2007 is no different as Saint Joseph's takes on Delaware, Georgetown and Princeton on the road to prepare for the Atlantic 10 slate.

Reynolds has been instrumental in the team's preseason trips to Norway, California and Colorado the past two seasons and has directed off-season camps to help raise money for the program.

Prior to coming to Saint Joseph's in August of 2001, she spent one year as head coach at West Chester University, where the Golden Rams compiled a record of 10-9-1. In addition to her responsibilities of handling the soccer team, Reynolds also coordinated all aspects of West Chester's extensive summer camp program.

A four-year starter at Delaware, Reynolds earned her undergraduate degree in education in 1997 and is currently enrolled in Saint Joseph's master's in educational leadership program. Reynolds returned to her alma mater as an assistant coach in April of 1999 and also served as an assistant women's soccer coach at Temple for one season. She presently serves as head coach of FC Delco Storm U-17 and assists with the FC Delco U-12 squad.

A native of Swarthmore, PA, Reynolds played her high school soccer at Strath Haven. She currently resides in Philadelphia.

Joining the Hawks in May 2006 as assistant coach, Lee Mitchell begins his second season at Saint Joseph's. Mitchell came to Hawk Hill after spending seven seasons at the Mount Laurel United Soccer Club. For the past five years, Mitchell worked as director of the Mount Laurel

United Soccer Club, serving as head coach, managing club finances and staffing as well as teaching coaches.

A 1994 graduate of North Lincolnshire College in England, Mitchell spent four years coaching at Myerscough College from 1996 to 2000. A three-year member of the North Lincolnshire soccer team, Mitchell also played four seasons professionally for Lincoln United FC and Southport FC.



Kaiti McCaffery

Saint Joseph's '07 - First Year

A four-year starter for Saint Joseph's, Kaiti McCaffery returns to Hawk Hill this season as an assistant coach. Helping her squad to three-straight Atlantic 10 Tournament appearances, McCaffery etched her name in the Saint Joseph's record books along the way. The 2007 graduate

finished her career second all-time in assists (13), ninth all-time in shots (64) and tied for 10th all-time in points (23). Posting the second-best single-season performance in assists (five) in 2003, McCaffery set a single-game record that same year with three assists in a win over Drexel.

A native of Langhorne, PA, McCaffery was a four-time All-Catholic League standout at Conwell-Egan High School. She graduated in May 2007 from Saint Joseph's with a degree in elementary and special education.

The Hawk Will Never Die!

FINNESEY FIELD



Laid out in a natural bowl in the center of Saint Joseph's campus, Finnesey Field has been the home of Hawk women's soccer since its inception in 1996.

Originally constructed for football and opened in 1929 with plans for an eventual 70,000-seat stadium, the field has undergone numerous changes over the years.

In 1960, both the original grandstand and hillside seating were eliminated for the construction of Villiger (now Post) Hall/Bluett Theater. That construction necessitated raising the field's level some five feet above its earlier location. In 1990 the facility's usage was greatly expanded with the installation of artificial turf. That expansion continued in 1994 when lights were added. During the summer of 2001, the field received a facelift when new turf was installed. Bleachers were built into the hill closest to Barbelin Hall during the summer of 2003.

In addition to the women's soccer team, Finnesey Field is currently the home of SJU track and field, field hockey, men's soccer and both men's and women's lacrosse. Previously, it played host to the football, baseball and softball teams.

Saint Joseph's women's soccer team has compiled a record of 42-45-5 on the field since 1996.

Legend has it that a 1777 Revolutionary War skirmish took place on the site. Several war-era relics, in fact, were discovered during landscaping work in 1939.

From the North: NJ Turnpike to Exit 6 (PA Turnpike connector). Follow PA Turnpike to exit 20 (Rt. 476). Follow 476 South to Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia. Follow Rt. 76 East to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the East: From the Ben Franklin Bridge (via Rt. 676) or the Walt Whitman Bridge: Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make left on 54th Street and then right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the South: Rte. 95 North to 476 North. Follow 476 North to exit 5 (Rt. 1). Follow Rt. 1 North to SJU, approximately 10 miles. Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the West: PA Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Follow Rt. 76 East, toward Philadelphia, to Exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

From the Airport: I-95 North to Rt. 76 West. Follow Rt. 76 West to exit 339 (Rt. 1 South, City Avenue). Make right on 54th Street and right into parking lot. Field is straight ahead.

THE HAWK



The Saint Joseph's Hawk mascot has been flapping its wings for more than a half a century.

One of the most famous mascots in college sports, the Hawk is best known for staying in constant motion by flapping its wings throughout every basketball game and representing the Saint Joseph's motto, "The Hawk Will Never Die".

Saint Joseph's athletic teams have been recognized with the nickname "Hawks" since 1929. At that time, the school's yearbook editor initiated a contest among the student body for a symbol. More than 100 submissions were narrowed, with "Hawks" winning out over "Grenadiers" by a slim margin. The name was appropriate because it typified "the fighting spirit of our crimson and gray athletes and it is suggestive of the aerial attack which has made our football team famous." Football, ironically, was discontinued at SJU following the 1939 season.

The Hawk mascot has garnered numerous accolades in its 50-year history. It has been selected as the nation's top mascot by *The Sporting News*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, *Street & Smith's Basketball Yearbook* and *ESPN College Basketball* magazine.

The Hawk Will Never Die!

2006 YEAR IN REVIEW



It was a season of highs and lows for Saint Joseph's in 2006. Looking for their fourth-straight postseason berth, the Hawks fell just short, but several Hawk players set record marks on the way.

After a hard-fought 1-0 loss at Delaware to start the year, Saint Joseph's bounced back with a season-high five goals en route to a 5-0 win over Wagner. Senior Ali Wean tallied the first of her record-setting 14 goals of the season in the win, while classmates Nancy Cook and Megan Schutt each tallied a goal as they climbed the Hawk scoring charts.

Following a 1-0 loss at St. John's, the Hawks responded with a 4-3 overtime win at Lehigh, in which Wean tallied a pair of goals, while Cook tied the game late. Schutt carded the winning score as the Hawks moved to 2-2 on the season.

A tough three-game road skid, coupled with a 2-0 loss at home to Rider had Saint Joseph's standing at 2-4 overall heading into its final non-conference game. In the last warmup before conference play it was Wean once again who led the way. Tallying a pair of goals, including the game winner with 11 seconds left, Wean upped her total to five for the year as she helped Saint Joseph's to a 2-1 win over Marist.

The momentum from the win carried over into the following week in Atlantic 10 play as the Hawks topped Richmond 1-0 in overtime on a Cook goal.

Unfortunately for the Hawks, the offense slowed in the next five games, as Saint Joseph's went 1-4 in A-10 play, with tough losses to Charlotte, Massachusetts and Rhode Island, with a victory over city-rival Temple in between.

Needing to get back to its winning ways, Wean turned it on for the Hawks. The senior tallied five goals in the next two games as the Hawks posted 4-2 and 4-1 wins over Duquesne and St. Bonaventure, respectively. Wean was recognized for her efforts as the senior was named A-10 Player of the Week for October 23.

With a 4-4 record in conference play, Saint Joseph's headed into its season finale versus Fordham needing a win and some help elsewhere in the league to secure a playoff spot. Despite taking an early 1-0 lead on a Wean goal, it wasn't meant to be for the Hawks as the Rams fought back for a 2-1 win to end the season.

While the team fell short of its goal in 2006, it was a historic season individually for Saint Joseph's. Setting a single-season record in goals (14) and points (33), Wean became the first Hawk to earn A-10 Offensive Player of the Year accolades. The forward, who

was also named to the A-10 All-Conference First Team, and *SoccerBuzz.com* All-Mid-Atlantic Third Team, finished her three-year SJU career second all-time in program history with 57 points and 23 goals.

Setting a career-high with eight points, senior midfielder Kimmy Leigh earned her second straight A-10 All-Conference Second Team honor. Leigh, only the second SJU player to be twice be selected to an A-10 All-Conference Team, finished her Hawk career fifth in assists with 12.

Cook, who finished second on the team in scoring with six goals and two assists for 14 points, capped her career fourth all-time in goals (17) and ninth in points (36). A standout since her freshman year in which she earned A-10 Rookie of the Year honors, Schutt finished her Crimson and Gray career third all-time in goals (20), tied for second in assists (14) and third in points (54). Senior Kaiti McCaffery also etched her name among the SJU all-time leaders as the defender finished her career fourth all-time in assists with 13.

Graduating one of the best classes in SJU history will be tough to replace, but with a young and talented group of returnees, the Hawks will again have their sights set high in 2007.

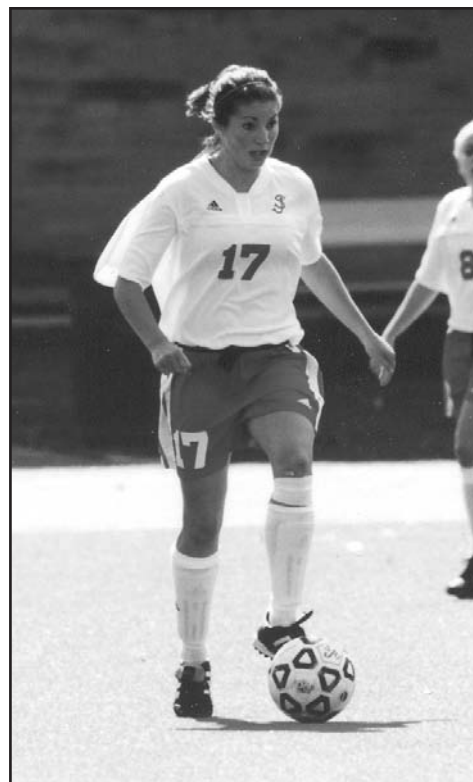

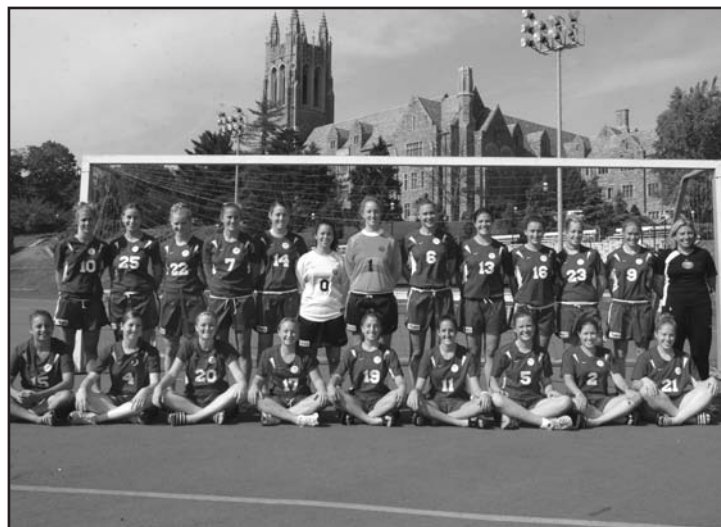

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 - the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, and Xavier University.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation work. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its student-athletes. In doing so, the Atlantic 10, under the leadership of commissioner Linda Bruno, instituted the Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better. 1,170 student-athletes were named to the Fall 2006 Honor Roll and 1,119 were named to the Spring 2007 Honor Roll.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors one student-athlete per sport as the A-10 Student-Athlete of the Year. In 2006-

07, over 170 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition. Also, the Atlantic 10 provides postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes.

Five A-10 schools were among the 51 cited for having five or more athletics programs recognized by the NCAA for their latest Academic Progress Rate scores. Fordham led the Atlantic 10 in the number of high-performing squads with nine teams receiving awards. Only the Ivy League (eight) and Patriot League (six) had more than the A-10's five, which was matched by the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Charlotte cross country and track & field standout Jane Daniels was chosen as a 2006-07 NCAA Div. I Coca-Cola Community All-American. The national honor includes a \$5,000 donation in her name to the charity of her choice. Daniels chose to split her donation among Girls on the Run International, the Charlotte University City YMCA and the Oostburg (Wis.) Community Education Foundation.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of nearly 73 million people within its geographic footprint of eight states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.



Ali Wean became the first Hawk to earn Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Year honors, as All-Conference First Team member led the A-10 in goals (14) and points (33).



Rebecca Cunfer, the 2004 Atlantic 10 Field Hockey Rookie of the Year, was named Student-Athlete of the Year in 2006.

Timothy R. Lannon, S. J.
University President

Timothy R. Lannon, S.J., is beginning his fifth year as president of Saint Joseph's University.

Fr. Lannon began his term as Saint Joseph's 26th president in July 2003. Since then he has led many significant University initiatives, most notably the agreement to purchase the 38-acre campus of the neighboring Episcopal Academy. Saint Joseph's anticipates taking possession of the property in 2008; the acquisition -- to be known as the Maguire Campus -- will provide unparalleled flexibility to enhance academic programs and facilities.

Under Fr. Lannon's stewardship, the University vastly upgraded student housing and parking options with the opening of the City Avenue Residence Halls in August 2004. Phase II of that initiative is currently underway and will result in additional parking and retail development along 54th Street.

Fr. Lannon has also played a major role in boosting Saint Joseph's academic profile, an effort which includes recently endowed faculty chairs and student scholarships as well as the opening of the Pedro Arrupe Center for Business Ethics. A major curricular-review initiative and the hiring of more than 50 new full-time faculty over a five-year period will serve to further strengthen the University's academic position. SJU attained its best-ever U.S. News ranking (t-8th, Northeast) in the 2008 "America's Best Colleges" edition.

Fr. Lannon has worked tirelessly to re-engage the University in its mission and to foster expanded outreach efforts to alumni, governmental leaders, and other external constituencies. In the latter role, he serves as chair of the City Avenue Special Services District (CASSD). As a central tenet of his leadership, Fr. Lannon's has articulated a vision for Saint Joseph's to be recognized as the preeminent Catholic comprehensive university in the Northeast.

He previously was vice president for university advancement and associate executive vice president at Marquette University, and served presidential internships at the College of the Holy Cross and Boston College while completing a doctorate and teaching fellowship in the Graduate School of Education at Harvard University. Fr. Lannon serves on the boards of Marquette University, St. Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, and the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Pennsylvania.

Fr. Lannon has studied and written on Catholic identity at Jesuit universities. A native of Mason City, Iowa, he attended Creighton University as an undergraduate and was later president of Creighton Preparatory School. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1977 and was ordained in 1986.



Cary Anderson
Vice President of Student Life

Cary Anderson, Ed.D., is the newest member of the Saint Joseph's University administration, assuming the post of vice president of student life on June 1, 2007. He brings a wealth of experience in higher education and student affairs to Saint Joseph's, along with a great familiarity with Jesuit institutions.

As vice president of student life, Dr. Anderson oversees many areas, including athletics and recreation, along with residence life, career development and counseling services.

Dr. Anderson came to SJU from Canisius College, where he served as the associate vice president and dean of students for eight years. Prior to that, he spent over nine years at the College of the Holy Cross, working first as complex director, then advancing to assistant dean of students and then to associate dean of students.

"The Jesuit philosophy on education resonates with my own personal educational philosophy," explained Dr. Anderson on his commitment to working with Jesuit institutions. "A lot of universities talk about educating their students with a concern for the common good, but Jesuit colleges and universities really act on this."

Dr. Anderson holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Iowa and a master's degree from Loyola University of Chicago. He earned his doctorate in education from the University of Massachusetts while working at Holy Cross.

He is a contributing columnist with several student affairs publications, and was recently elected editor of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA) Journal.



Don DiJulia
Associate Vice President
Athletic Director

One of the most active and involved leaders in collegiate athletics, Don DiJulia is in his fifth decade of affiliation with Saint Joseph's University. DiJulia is in his second stint as the University's top athletic administrator after returning to Hawk Hill as an Assistant Vice President/Athletic Director on June 8, 1988.

Over the past 17 years, DiJulia has overseen tremendous growth in the University's athletics programs. During his tenure, five varsity programs have been added, a new weight training facility built, athletic facilities upgraded and athletic fund drives initiated. In addition, the importance of the student-athlete has been recognized with the institution of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll as well as the senior scholar-athlete awards. DiJulia also spearheaded SJU's hosting of various conference and national tournaments, including the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four.

A 1968 graduate, DiJulia has worn many hats in college athletics during his more than 30 years of professional experience. His career first started in coaching, where he served as an assistant basketball coach at Fairfield, George Washington and American.

During his first stint as Director of Athletics at SJU from 1976-1981, DiJulia was instrumental in the planning and construction of the \$5 million athletic and recreation complex. He also oversaw the growth of women's athletics as softball and cross country were added as varsity sports. DiJulia left SJU in 1981 to become Commissioner of the East Coast Conference, a position he held for two years until leaving to become the Commissioner of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (1984 through 1988).

A two-sport athlete as an undergraduate at SJU, DiJulia was a member of the 1964-65 Hawk basketball team which compiled a 26-1 regular season record and a top 10 national ranking under head coach Dr. Jack Ramsay. He and his wife, Pat, are the parents of seven children and reside in Havertown, PA.



THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1851, Saint Joseph's is an independent, Catholic, Jesuit university teaching disciplined reasoning, effective communication and a love of learning. From Willings Alley in Old City Philadelphia to Stiles Street in North Philadelphia to its current location on City Avenue, Saint Joseph's has continued to grow and change with the times. The University combines the Jesuit tradition of academic excellence, a history of service and an ideal campus location to produce successful students who seek to make a good world even better.

Full-time, undergraduate day enrollment is approximately 4,150. Graduate, evening and executive programs push total enrollment to more than 7,400.

Saint Joseph's nationally recognized academic reputation is confirmed by ongoing acknowledgment in Barron's, U.S. News & World Report and Peterson's. The Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry and personal concern manifests itself in small, challenging classes taught by a caring faculty. Graduate assistants do not teach, so undergraduates can be sure they are receiving the very best educational experience. One-on-one interaction between students and faculty is a reality at Saint Joseph's.

A solid liberal arts curriculum provides across-the-board learning for every student. Supporting that curriculum are comprehensive academic majors and learning facilities. The result is a broad education which prepares students not only for employment and graduate school, but for life itself.

In the fall of 1998, SJU opened the \$25 million Owen A. Mandeville Hall, which houses the Erivan K. Haub School of Business, the Center for Food Marketing and the region's first "Teletorium" and "Moot Boardrooms." An 87,000-square-foot international academic center featuring state-of-the-art distance learning technology, it is located near the corner of 54th Street and City Avenue.

A HISTORY OF SERVICE

The students of Saint Joseph's University are dedicated to making today's world even better. A natural spirit of volunteerism has enabled the University's community service programs to become the most popular extracurricular activities on campus. In addition, a Service Learning program allows students to receive academic credit for their work outside the classroom.

SJU offers local, national and international opportunities for student service. From North



Philadelphia to Camden, N.J.; from Tijuana, Mexico, to the Appalachian Mountains, Saint Joseph's students embrace the Jesuit mission of serving those in need. The Thanksgiving Dinner Dance for area senior citizens and the Hand-in-Hand Festival for the handicapped are two annual student-run events which draw thousands of special visitors to campus for fun and friendship.

IDEAL CAMPUS LOCATION

SJU's City Avenue location combines the best of dynamic Philadelphia with the suburban, residential setting of the elegant Main Line. Saint Joseph's 65 acres span two counties, allowing students literally to enjoy the best of both worlds. The city of Philadelphia, with its tremendous wealth of historical, cultural, social and athletic attractions, is easily accessible, while the safety, serenity and greenery of a suburban campus are right at hand.

The friendly atmosphere and close-knit campus ensure that students don't get lost in either the literal or the figurative sense at Saint Joseph's. Expanded library, computer and athletic facilities add a big-time "feel" to this growing university.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

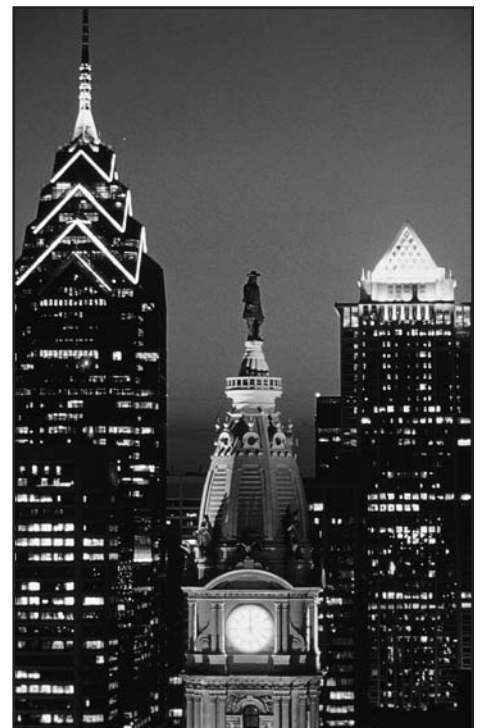
