Pat Leahy Scholarship

The Pat Leahy Scholarship was established in 1992. Leahy is a native St. Louisan and former National Football League star who was a valued member of three Billiken NCAA national championship teams during his playing career from 1969-72.

The proceeds from Leahy's annual golf tournament benefit the men's and women's soccer programs at Saint Louis and the Pat Leahy Soccer Scholarship Endowment Fund. The funds are used primarily to cover fifth-year scholarships for Billiken soccer players.

Upon his retirement from pro football on July 6, 1992, Leahy left as the third-leading scorer on the NFL's all-time list with 1,470 points, trailing only Hall of Famers George Blanda and Jan Stenerud.

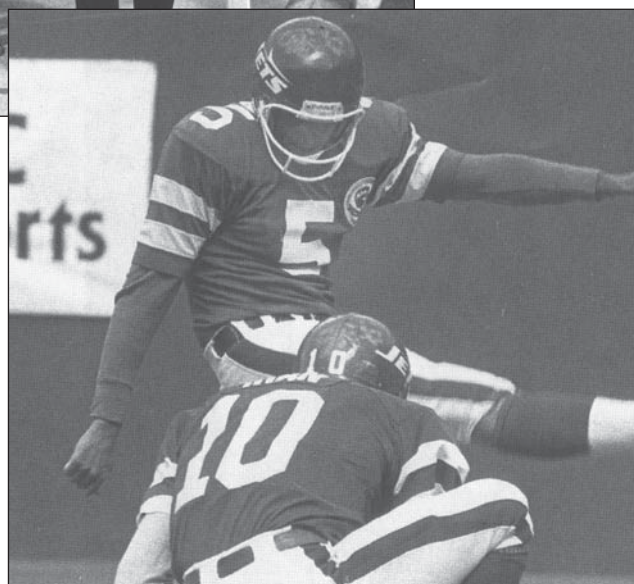
The highlight of Leahy's NFL career was when he was voted the Jets' MVP following the 1990 season. He scored 101 points that year and finished as the Jets' leading scorer for the 11th straight season.

A member of the Billiken Hall of Fame, Leahy was enshrined into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame in 2007.

A plaque is permanently displayed in the Soccer Office Suite at Chaifetz Arena acknowledging the award and its recipients.
