### Stony Brook Makes Third Trip To NCAA Tournament

The Stony Brook University baseball team will be making its third appearance in the NCAA Tournament since moving to the Division I level in 2000. The Seawolves will take on top-seed and host Coastal Carolina in their opening round game on Friday at 1 p.m. Joining SBU and Coastal in the Myrtle Beach Regional will be No. 2 College of Charleston and No. 3 North Carolina State. All Seawolves games will be broadcast locally on 90.1 WUSB as well as online at [goseawolves.org](http://goseawolves.org).

### Seawolves Path To The Tournament

Stony Brook went 26-25 during the 2010 regular season, winning seven of its final 10 games. The Seawolves went 15-9 during conference play to earn the No. 3 seed in last week's four-team, double-elimination America East Tournament. The 15 conference wins was the second most since the Seawolves joined the America East in 2002. SBU defeated No. 2 Maine, 10-1, on Wednesday in the tournament opener before defeating No. 4 Albany, 8-4, on Thursday to advance to the Championship game. The Seawolves then defeated Albany again on Friday, 4-2, to clinch the America East title and the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Sophomore outfielder **Pat Cantwell** (West Islip, N.Y.) was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after his two-run home run in the seventh inning of the title game broke a 1-1 tie.

### SBU Vs. 2010 Myrtle Beach Regional

The Seawolves are 0-2 all-time against Coastal, dropping a pair of games at Watson Stadium last season. SBU was swept in a three-game series against College of Charleston in 2007 in the only meeting between the programs. Stony Brook has never faced North Carolina State.

### NCAA Tournament History

This will be the Seawolves second appearance in the NCAA tournament in the last three seasons. At the 2008 Tempe Regional, the Seawolves fell to No. 1 Arizona State, 9-7, before being eliminated by second seeded Vanderbilt, 9-4. Stony Brook's other Division I NCAA Tournament appearance came in 2004 when it was sent to the Kinston Regional. The Seawolves fell, 8-2, to host East Carolina in the opener and were then eliminated by Tennessee, 1-0.

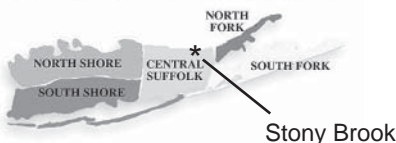

# NEWS & NOTES

## 11 Seawolves Named To All-Conference Teams

The Seawolves had a record 11 players named to the All-America East teams released last Wednesday. Sophomore **Nick Tropeano** was named Co-Pitcher of the Year; the first Stony Brook player since Gary Novakowski in 2007 to earn the honor. **William Carmona** was selected the Rookie of the Year; the first player since Jon Lewis was selected Rookie of the Year in 2002, the Seawolves first season in the America East. Tropeano and Carmona were joined on the first team by sophomore right-hander **Tyler Johnson** and junior **Stephen Marino**. SBU placed five players on the second team- seniors **Rob Dyer**, **Justin Echevarria** and **Michael Stephan**, junior **Chad Marshall** and sophomore **Pat Cantwell**. Freshmen **Tanner Nivins** and **Maxx Tissenbaum** joined Carmona on the All-Rookie squad.

## America East Tournament Recap

Stony Brook entered last week's four-team double-elimination tournament as the No. 3 seed. SBU defeated No. 2 Maine, 10-1, in the opener behind sophomore right-hander **Nick Tropeano**, who allowed one run on four hits in 8.0 innings. Stony Brook then advanced to take on No. 4 Albany in a winner bracket game, defeating the Great Danes, 8-4. Freshman William Carmona hit a grand slam in the ninth to give the Seawolves an 8-0 lead. Sophomore **Tyler Johnson** allowed three runs, two earned, in the 8.0+ innings. He allowed just one hit over the first 8.0 innings. The Seawolves then clinched the title with a 4-2 win over Albany on Friday. Freshman southpaw **Adam Brown** earned the win, giving up just two runs in 8.2 innings. Sophomore Pat Cantwell and junior Chad Marshall hit back-to-back home runs in the seventh inning to break a 1-1 tie. Cantwell hit .385 in the three games and was named the Most Outstanding Player.

## Tropeano, Johnson Anchor Starting Rotation

After terrific freshman campaigns, sophomores Nick Tropeano and Tyler Johnson did not suffer from the sophomore jinx. Instead, the duo became two of the top pitchers in the America East. Tropeano went 8-3 with a 2.36 ERA, striking out an America East best 101 batters in 91.2 innings. Tropeano had the best ERA in the conference during conference play (1.29) and also led the conference in strikeouts per game (10.2) and innings per start (6.2). Johnson went 6-1 with a 2.44 ERA during conference play and ranked second, behind Tropeano, in opponent batting average (.215). He went 9-3 overall, tying the programs single season record for wins in a season.

## Trio of Freshmen Shine for Seawolves

Seawolves head coach Matt Senk has had three first-year players step up and play leading roles on this year's squad. Designated hitter **William Carmona** led the conference in hitting (.398) and hit .455 during America East play. **Maxx Tissenbaum** made 48 starts at second base, hitting .341 with 10 doubles. **Tanner Nivins** helped to fill the void left by two-time all-conference selection Brian Witkowski '09 in centerfield. The Kitchener, Ontario native hit .283 with nine home runs and 45 RBI. Carmona and Tissenbaum were each named to the America East All-Tournament team. Tissenbaum hit .500 with five runs scored and a home run while Carmona hit .462 with two doubles and five RBI.

# MORE SBU NEWS & NOTES

## Leading the Way

Sophomore **Pat Cantwell** has had a fantastic season out of the leadoff spot for the Seawolves. Cantwell ranked fifth in the America East in batting average (.370) during the regular season which included a 23-game hitting streak that was snapped on the season's final weekend against Binghamton. A 2009 America East All-Rookie selection, he hit .402 in 32 games as the Seawolves leadoff hitter and had a conference-best 42 hits during America East play. He also made a seamless transition from catcher to the outfield. Cantwell started 31 games last season, 30 at catcher. With the return of starting catcher Justin Echevarria, Cantwell has made 23 starts in right field this season and made just one error.

## Senk Earns 500th Victory

Stony Brook head coach Matt Senk become the first coach in program history and the third in America East history to win 500 games in a season with the Seawolves 3-2 victory over Akron in this season's opener. In his 20th season at Stony Brook, Senk is 526-361. Senk has enjoyed 16 winning seasons with SBU and has won 30 or more games seven times. He has compiled a 326-254 record along with three America East tournament titles since the Seawolves move to Division I in 2000.

## Seawolves in the Pros

31 Stony Brook players have signed professional baseball contracts under Senk including 23 since the Seawolves made the move to Division I in 2000. Senk also has had seven players taken in the Major League baseball first-year player draft. Topping the list is Joe Nathan, a four-time American League All-Star with the Minnesota Twins.

A two-time Academic All-American at SBU, Nathan was also inducted into the Stony Brook Athletics Hall of Fame in December 2006, when he also became the first former Stony Brook student-athlete to have his jersey number retired. In August 2008, Nathan made a \$500,000 lead gift to the Stony Brook Department of Athletics in support of the construction of a new baseball field at Stony Brook University. Beginning in 2011 the field will be named Joe Nathan Field.

## Stony Brook Against Ranked Opponents

The Seawolves picked up their first ever win against a ranked opponent last season, winning at No. 11 Virginia, 6-2. Stony Brook was swept in a four-game series at No. 25 Alabama earlier this season, its only contest against a ranked opponent this season. Sophomore Nick Tropeano went 7.0 innings in his start against the Crimson Tide, a 5-0 Seawolves loss. The right-hander allowed four runs, did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

## Road Warriors

Stony Brook was no stranger to the road this season, playing 42 of its 54 games away from home including 25 of its first 26 contests. The Seawolves were 17-20 in away games and 3-2 in neutral site contests.

In his 20th season as the head baseball coach at Stony Brook University, Matt Senk has the Seawolves firmly entrenched as one of the top programs in not only the America East but also the Northeast Region.

Senk became the first coach in program history and the third in America East history to win 500 games in a season with the Seawolves 3-2 victory over Akron in this season's opener.

The all-time wins leader in Stony Brook baseball history, Senk has enjoyed 16 winning seasons with SBU and has won 30 or more games seven times. He has compiled a 326-254 record and two America East tournament titles since the Seawolves move to Division I in 2000.

Last season he guided the Seawolves to a 29-23 record, including a 6-2 victory over No. 11 Virginia on April 8, the program's first victory over a ranked opponent. In 2008, he guided Stony Brook to its second America East title in five years as the Seawolves recorded their most victories (34) since the 2001 season.

Senk has had 30 Seawolves players sign professional baseball contracts in his tenure and has also had seven players in the Major League baseball first-year player draft. Topping the list of Stony Brook alums is Joe Nathan, a four-time American League All-Star with the Minnesota Twins. .

A two-time Academic All-American at SBU, Nathan was also inducted into the Stony Brook Athletics Hall of Fame in December 2006, when he also became the first former Stony Brook student-athlete to have his jersey number retired. In August 2008, Nathan made a \$500,000 lead gift to the Stony Brook Department of Athletics in support of the construction of a new baseball field at Stony Brook University. Beginning in 2010 the field will be named Joe Nathan Field.

Individually, the Seawolves have been handsomely rewarded for their outstanding efforts under Senk's guidance. During his tenure at Stony Brook, he has had 84 players named all-conference, 34 players named all-region and two players named All-American.

Senk is a graduate of Cortland State where he earned his Bachelor's degree in psychology in 1980. While at Cortland, Senk was the Red Dragon's starting catcher for three seasons, a two-time All-SUNYAC selection and the team's Most Valuable Player as a senior. Senk later earned his master's degree in physical education from Adelphi University and is a member of the American Baseball Coaches Association.

# Stony Brook to name baseball field after Nathan

His No. 22, represented with a red replica on the rightfield wall at University Field is the only retired number in the history of [Stony Brook University](#) athletics. But that will not be [Joe Nathan's](#) legacy to his alma mater.

The Class of '97 graduate and [Minnesota Twins](#) All-Star closer was introduced to the crowd Saturday as a special guest for the final game on the field before it undergoes a major renovation. When it reopens next year, it will be called Joe Nathan Stadium.

"It means a lot to be here," said Nathan, who is sitting out the 2010 season because of [Tommy John](#) surgery. "This place was such a perfect fit for me. We kind of grew up together."

Nathan's agent, David Pepe, told Newsday that Nathan donated \$500,000 for the field but never asked to be recognized.

"That was my call," Stony Brook athletic director Jim Fiore said of naming the stadium after Nathan. "He represents everything we want our kids to become. He's generous. He gives back. He cares about the place. We didn't name the stadium for him because he's a pro player, but because he's a pro person."

Yesterday, Nathan basked in being the big man on campus he wasn't as a student-athlete.

"When I first got here, I really wasn't that good of a high school player," he said, "and this place allowed me to grow physically and mentally. Obviously, this program has grown with me."

When he and other baseball alumni were asked to take their old positions as part of the ceremony, Nathan jogged out to shortstop. That's where he played at Stony Brook, but soon after being drafted by the Giants, he was told they wanted to make him a pitcher.

"It definitely took some persuading. I still thought I could make it as a shortstop," Nathan said. "At the time they told me, I wasn't ready for that mentally. I came back here and finished up school. That time was really great for me. It allowed me to get my degree, clear my head and be ready to give this pitching thing a shot."

# Stony Brook confident for NCAA baseball tournament

The calendar has reached June and the banner athletic season continues at [Stony Brook University](#).

Quick, name a sport the Seawolves have not dominated. Success has come in cross-country, soccer, football, basketball and lacrosse. And now Stony Brook's America East champion baseball team has qualified for the NCAA Tournament. It seems as though the only highlight to elude Stony Brook in recent months was landing the 2014 [Super Bowl](#).

Stony Brook (29-25) will face Coastal Carolina (51-7) Friday in [Myrtle Beach](#), S.C. Stony Brook lost to Coastal by scores of 9-0 and 36-3 in the 2009 season.

"I think it's just like in any sport, you have to have a short memory," senior first baseman Rob Dyer said of those scores. "I think this year with our pitching, we have a shot against anybody."

The final week of the regular season certainly did not portend a championship finish. With a chance to host the conference tournament, Stony Brook was swept at home by Binghamton, which became the host and top seed as Stony Brook fell to third. Coach Matt Senk addressed the team and said, "Right now we're feeling terrible, but in a week's time, we could be doing cartwheels and back flips."

Pat Cantwell, a sophomore outfielder who played for West Islip High School, said the team got the message. "Losing was rough and it hurt, but I think it actually helped going into the tournament," he said. "It made us hungrier than ever."

The turning point occurred in the first game, a 10-1 victory over second-seeded [Maine](#). Nick Tropeano, Cantwell's teammate in high school, was the winning pitcher. "Coming out and making a statement against [Maine](#) set the tone," Cantwell said. "Putting up those runs, Nick had a great game."

Binghamton faltered and was eliminated before the two teams could meet. "That was the crazy part," Cantwell said. "We became more focused on ourselves instead of who we were playing."

The incentive of being in a winning environment around the university also helped, Tropeano said. "Our coach talked about how all the teams had come together. Even the

athletic director [Jim Fiore] got involved, talking about our championships. That pumped us up."

This will mark SBU baseball's third NCAA bid. College of Charleston and [North Carolina State](#) also are in the [Myrtle Beach](#) Regional. "It will not be a deer-in-headlights situation," Senk said. "We've made sure to play a tough non-conference schedule over the years to be prepared."

Stony Brook is 0-4 in NCAA Tournament games, but the players foresee a change in the double-elimination tournament. "We're definitely looking to do some damage," Tropeano said. "We're not looking to go two and out. I think we are capable of winning."

Big East champion St. John's (40-18) will meet [Mississippi](#) (38-22) in the Charlottesville Regional. [Virginia](#) and VCU also are in the regional.
