**IT'S WORTH NOTING...**

• Stony Brook hosts Division II American International College in the 2010 home opener at LaValle Stadium on Saturday at 6 p.m. Fans can listen to the game live on WUSB 90.1, with Mike Solano (pbp), Curt Hylton (color) and Jeff Bernstein (sidelines) providing all the action. Live stats, live video and live video are available at GoSeawolves.org.

• Chuck Priore, only the second coach in school history, is in his fifth season as head coach. The Long Beach, New York native enters the season with a 22-23 record at Stony Brook and 61-32 overall. American International head coach Art Wilkins is 100-66 in 17 seasons with the Yellow Jackets.

• It is the 9th anniversary of September 11 as Stony Brook University will honor those who lost their lives with a moment of silence. The Seawolves also will honor former Hofstra football coach Joe Gardi, who passed away on June 13.

• It is also Long Island High School football night as the University will offer free admission to any program. In addition, a donation of \$2 from every ticket sold will go to the Sunrise Fund, benefiting the University Cancer Center. Stony Brook Athletics also is hosting Three Village Chamber of Commerce Night.

• Stony Brook is in the midst of play three schools from three different divisions to start the 2010 season (Florida - FBS, American International - Division II and Brown - FCS).

• Despite playing just three times in school history, Stony Brook and American International had a memorable first game in 1995 as the then Patriots rallied from a nine-point deficit to win, 23-22, on a field goal with one second left.

• Next week's game at Brown will be the Bears' season opener. Brown opened the 2009 season against Stony Brook, a 21-20 win by SBU.

**STORYLINES**

• Stony Brook is 3-0 in its last three home openers, defeating Georgetown, 35-28, Colgate, 42-26, and Brown, 21-20. Head coach Chuck Priore has lost just two home openers in his time as the head man at Trinity and Stony Brook combined (2001, 31-10 vs. Williams; 2006, 17-8 vs. Hofstra).

• This will be the fourth all-time meeting against American International, but the first since 1998. Stony Brook played as a non-scholarship Division III school in the previous three meetings.

• Stony Brook is in the midst of play three schools from three different divisions to start the 2010 season (Florida - FBS, American International - Division II and Brown - FCS).

• Stony Brook will begin its third season in the Big South Conference. For the first time in conference history, an automatic bid to the FCS playoffs is on the line.

• With the additions of Hofstra transfers Miguel Maysonet and Brock Jackolski and incoming freshman JeVahn Cruz and Gowins, the Seawolves have the last four "Hansen" winners, the award given to the top football player in Suffolk County on Long Island. Stony Brook's athletic department has created a marketing campaign spoofing on the 1979 movie Slap Shot and its "Hansen" Brothers, the white-taped black-rimmed glasses wearing hockey players.

• Stony Brook begins its 27th year of football. Stony Brook began Division I play in 1999, moved to scholarship football in 2006 and went to full 63-scholarship allotment in 2008.

• Saturday's game marked Stony Brook's first against an FBS opponent. Stony Brook has signed to play Buffalo in 2011, Army in 2012 and Boston College in 2013.

• American International, a Northeast-10 school located in Springfield, Massachusetts, lost to C.W. Post, 20-11, on Saturday in its season opener. Roosevelt native Mike Mayo led the Yellow Jackets with 14 rushes and 83 yards. Rob Parent threw a touchdown pass in the fourth quarter to Andre Samuels. Allen Bush blocked an extra point and Nathaniel Ricks returned it all the way for the two points. Ryan Brooks added a field goal early in the game. American International has 12 players from Long Island on its roster. The Yellow Jackets were picked to finish fourth in the NE-10 preseason poll.

## HOLTZ PRAISES PRIORE, SEAWOLVES

## GOWINS INCHES CLOSER TO RECORDS

Junior Eddie Gowins is the Big South's active leading rusher with 2,254 rushing yards. He is currently eighth in League history, is 90 yards away from seventh-place and is 1,380 yards away from the Big South career record of 3,633, which is held by former Liberty All-American and current Jacksonville Jaguar Rashad Jennings. Gowins, whose nine career 100-yard rushing games is tied for fifth-most in Big South history, has gained his 2,254 rushing yards in 22 career games for a career average of 102.45 rushing yards per game, second among all active FCS players. Gowins also is tied for seventh in Big South history with 21 career rushing touchdowns. All but six of his 21 career scores have gone for at least 20 yards, with a career long of 72. In his career, Gowins is averaging 32.1 yards per rushing touchdown (breakdown: 22 - 20 - 72 - 49 - 3 - 3 - 29 - 62 - 36 - 65 - 32 - 39 - 27 - 44 - 32 - 14 - 17 - 52 - 11 - 42 - 3).

## HOFSTRA TRANSFERS MAKE IMPACT

• All told, five players transferred to Stony Brook from Hofstra after the Pride cut their program. Sophomore Miguel Maysonet had 11 carries for 72 yards. Junior Brock Jackolski had seven carries for 23 yards, one catch for 23 yards and six kick returns for 111 yards, including a long of 28. Junior Andrew Nelson made one tackle and Armand Poole made the start at right guard. Redshirt freshman Reginald Francklin was hurt during Saturday's game and will miss the rest of the season.

## INJURY UPDATES

• Along with Francklin, senior Donald Porter, junior Al-Majid Hutchins and junior Michael Marino each were injured during Saturday's game. Porter also will miss the rest of the season while Hutchins will miss 3-4 weeks and Marino will miss the American International game.

## WHERE IS STONY BROOK?

• In a preview of the South Florida game in New York's Newsday, South Florida quarterback B.J. Daniels was asked if he knew where Stony Brook is. His answer, "Of course I do. My dad's from Buffalo." So where is Stony Brook? Located on the North Shore of Long Island, Stony Brook is just 60 miles east of New York City. Founded in 1957, Stony Brook is one of the State University of New York's four university centers (Buffalo, Binghamton and Albany). Stony Brook is one of just 63 members of the prestigious Association of American Universities.

• Some of Stony Brook's notable alumni include Richard Gelfond (CEO of IMAX), John Hennessey (President of Stanford University), Graham Spanier (President of Penn State) Tom Koehler (Major League Baseball's Florida Marlins - Double AA Jacksonville Suns) and Joe Nathan (MLB's Minnesota Twins).

## 2009 BIG SOUTH CO-CHAMPS

• In just their second year in the conference, Stony Brook won a share of the Big South with a dramatic 36-33 victory over Liberty. Liberty, ranked 16th at the time, was Stony Brook's first victory over a ranked opponent since joining Division I. 2010 marks the first season the Big South Conference will have an automatic berth to the FCS playoffs.

## 2009-10: A MEMORABLE ONE

• Stony Brook enjoyed its finest season in 2009-10 since joining the Division I ranks in 1999. The Seawolves won conference championships in football, men's soccer, women's cross country, men's basketball, men's lacrosse and baseball. The men's basketball team played host to Illinois on ESPN and the men's lacrosse team, in front of over 10,000 fans at LaValle Stadium, battled top-seeded Virginia before falling, 10-9.

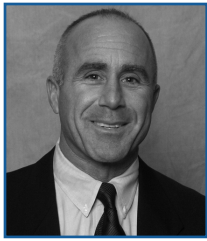

**CHUCK PRIORE 61-32 OVERALL**  
**ALBANY '82 22-23 AT SBU**  
**FIFTH SEASON**

The 2009 Big South Coach of the Year, Chuck Priore begins his fifth season at Stony Brook in 2010. After just a second season in the Big South, Priore guided the Seawolves to a share of the Big South Championship with a thrilling 36-33 victory over #16 Liberty. The Championship was the fifth in 10 seasons as a head coach. Seven different players earned All-Big South honors, including Tyler Santucci's selection as the Defensive Player of the Year.

Priore's third season at the Stony Brook helm was a historic one as the team played its first season as a member of the Big South Conference. He guided Stony Brook to a second-place finish in its first year in the league and saw his team garner four all-conference selections as well as the league's Rookie of the Year, Ed Gowins. The Seawolves broke a number of school rushing records, was the only FCS team with two backs gaining over 1,000 yards and finished ninth in the nation in rushing as a team.

In just his second season and against the toughest schedule Stony Brook has ever had, he led the team to a 6-5 record in 2007. In his first season at the helm of the Stony Brook football program, Priore guided the Seawolves to a 5-6 overall record, including a 5-2 mark in their final season in the Northeast Conference. Two of his athletes garnered all-NEC honors, one was Defensive Rookie of the Year, and one, quarterback Josh Dudash, was named the Stony Brook University Male Athlete of the Year. Under Priore's guidance, the Seawolves gained over 1,300 yards on the ground and nearly 2,500 yards in the air. In addition, the Seawolves led the conference in passing offense and red zone offense, putting points on the board in 24 out of 27 visits.

Priore was named the second head football coach in Stony Brook Football history on December 10, 2005. He came to Stony Brook after compiling an impressive 39-9 record in six seasons at Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut where he led the Bantams to four consecutive New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) titles and a 30-game winning streak, the longest active winning streak in the country at the time. The three-time NESCAC Coach of the Year, Priore guided Trinity to a No. 1 ranking in New England, four straight conference titles and three consecutive undefeated seasons, going 31-1 during that four-year stretch. For two straight years (2004-05) he was named the America Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division III Region I Coach of the Year.

During his six years at Trinity, he elevated the program to new heights, implementing a new, exciting, and prolific offensive system that produced some of the top performances in the region. The Bantams boasted five All-America selections on the offensive line in as many seasons and sent players to the AFCA Senior Aztec Bowl in Mexico against a Mexican All-Star team four times. In 2005, Trinity's defensive unit led the nation in total defense and boasted the NESCAC Defensive Player of the Year while three members of the team landed NESCAC All-Academic honors.

The Bantams' winning streak was the subject of a one-hour documentary, which was broadcast nationally on College Sports Television (CSTV). The program focused on the Trinity football game against Williams College, which the Bantams won, 34-6, to break the New England Division III win streak record of 23 victories.

Prior to Trinity, Priore served as the offensive line coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Pennsylvania from 1992 to 1999. During Priore's tenure at Penn, the Quakers compiled an impressive record of 52-27, including three Ivy League titles and a 24-game winning streak. In 1998, the Penn offense set a school record for points in a season with 297. Penn also produced two NFL players on the offensive side of the ball under Priore; wide receiver Miles Macik who played for the Detroit Lions, and tailback Jim Finn has seen action for the Indianapolis Colts, the Chicago Bears and the New York Giants.

Before arriving at Penn, Priore was the offensive coordinator and strength coach at Union College in Schenectady, N.Y. While at Union, the Dutchmen posted three undefeated seasons, three NCAA playoff appearances and a trip to the NCAA Division III Amos Alonzo Stagg Championship Bowl game in 1989.

Before joining Union's staff in 1987, Priore was the running backs and strength coach at the University at Albany, his alma mater, from 1983 to 1986. He also served as the head lacrosse coach at both Union and Albany.

In his playing days at Albany, Priore was the starting fullback for three seasons and the team captain as a senior. In 1982, Priore was presented the Spud Kruzan Award as Albany's Outstanding Athlete. Priore earned his undergraduate degree in 1982 and his master's in business education from Albany in 1985.

Priore is a native of Long Beach, N.Y. and graduated from Maria Regina High School.
