AUBURN TO PRESENT FIRST ROAD TEST OF SEASON FOR NO. 8 AGGIES

GAME PREVIEW

After completing a successful two-game homestand with the likes of Duke and Rice, the eighth-ranked Texas A&M women's basketball team (2-0) takes the show on the road with a Sunday, Nov. 22 matchup against defending Southeastern Conference champion Auburn (2-1) at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum in Auburn, Ala. The Aggies and Tigers will meet for only the second time in both program's history at 2 p.m. (CT). A&M will make its first-ever trip to the state of Alabama and first trip to SEC country since playing at Vanderbilt during the 1995-96 season. The Aggies have averaged 90.5 points per game in their last two outings including an 86-50 rout of Rice on Nov. 18. A&M will be matched in the defense department as Auburn has caused opponents to turn over the ball an average of 23.3 times over three games, while Aggie opponents have accrued 22.0 per game. Both schools lost talented senior classes to graduation a year ago including the Texas A&M trio of all-time leading scorer Takia Starks, Danielle Gant and La Toya Micheaux and the Auburn duo of DeWanna Bonner and Whitney Boddie.

TIGER BEAT

Auburn is off to a 2-1 start to the season with home victories over Troy (70-65) and Alabama A&M (83-56). Like A&M, the Tigers must play a tough non-conference slate to prepare them well for SEC competition in January. The Big 12 and SEC are arguably two of the strongest women's basketball leagues in the nation from top-to-bottom. Auburn's one loss of the season was a 66-52 road decision at 2009 NCAA Tournament participant Temple on Nov. 17 in Philadelphia. Junior guard and native Alabamian Alli Smalley, who is the lone non-senior starter on last year's SEC Championship winning team, is averaging a team-leading 21.3 points per contest. The Tigers will unveil their 2009 SEC Champions/NCAA Banner prior to Sunday's game.

SERIES NOTES

Texas A&M leads 1-0 in the all-time series with Auburn. Both teams last met two years ago in College Station with the Aggies defeating the Tigers, 62-60, on Dec. 15, 2007 at Reed Arena. It marked A&M's first home win over a non-conference top 25 ranked opponent since an 83-73 victory over No. 16 Duke on Nov. 17, 1995 at G. Rollie White Coliseum.

SERIES FLASHBACK

Takia Starks scored 17 points and Danielle Gant added 16 as No. 11 Texas A&M handed No. 14 Auburn its first loss of the season, 62-60, at Reed Arena. Auburn was one of nine unbeaten schools leading into the game. After trailing by as many as nine points in the second half, the Tigers pulled within a point with 3:17 remaining, 57-56, but A'Quonesia Franklin scored A&M's next five points on a three-pointer at the shot clock buzzer and two free throws to hold the Tigers at bay. Franklin ended the night with eight points. Earlier in the contest, Franklin dished out the 500th assist of her career and finished the game with a team-high five assists. Starks also hit a career milestone with the 1,000th point of her three-year A&M career at the 14:44 minute mark of the first half. She became the 19th women's basketball player in school history to reach 1,000 career points. A&M took an 11-point lead into halftime on the strength of a 20-4 run late in the first period. The run started after the Aggies fell behind by six points with 12:54 to go in the first half of play, 17-11. For the fifth-straight game, A&M shot better than 40 percent from the floor (41.7) and scored 34 of its total points in the paint including a seven-point and eight-rebound effort by Patrice Reado. Four Auburn players scored in double figures including a team-high 13 points and nine rebounds from Jordan Greenleaf.

BABY BARKLEY?

Texas A&M head coach has compared preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and former National JUCO Player of the Year Danielle Adams (Kansas City, Mo.) to former Auburn basketball and NBA star Charles Barkley. The "Round Mound of Rebound" was known for his tenaciousness on the boards and being a fan and media favorite. In only two games of her budding Aggie career, Adams has already dazzled fans on the court with her inside and outside game. She is currently averaging a team-leading 19.5 points per game and knocked down a trio of three-pointers from downtown. Adams has compiled a total of 39 points in 40 minutes of play combined (averaging nearly one point per minute) against then-No. 6 Duke on Nov. 15 in the team's season opener and Rice on Nov. 18.

PLAYING TEXAS A&M HOLD 'EM

Under Blair and associate head coach Vic Schaefer, known as the "Secretary of Defense," Texas A&M has taken pride in its signature in-your-face defense. Over the last three years, the Aggies have ranked among the top 25 teams in the country in scoring defense holding opponents to 55.4 points a game (24th) in 2008-09, 54.8 points (14th) in 2007-08 and 53.6 points (7th) in 2006-07. Last season, A&M also held opponents to just a 26.1 percent accuracy from behind the three-point arc which was fifth best in the nation.

FROM THE SIDELINES

- Texas A&M head coach Gary Blair is 7-6 all-time versus Auburn in his 25 years as a Division I head coach. He previously held SEC ties as the head coach at Arkansas from 1993-2003. Blair compiled a 198-120 record (.623) with the Lady Razorbacks who reached the NCAA Final Four in 1998 under his watch. Associate head coaches Vic Schaefer and Kelly Bond were also a part of Blair's coaching staff at Arkansas, while third-year assistant coach Johnnie Harris spent three seasons at Arkansas under former head coach Susie Gardner.

- The Aggies are 2-1 all-time against schools hailing from the Heart of Dixie including Alabama-Birmingham (1-0), Auburn (1-0) and South Alabama (0-1). A&M will look for only its second-ever road win at an SEC school with a 1-15 all-time mark. The Aggies' only SEC road victory is a 67-61 win at LSU on Dec. 29, 1993 in Baton Rouge, La.

- Sophomore Sydney Carter will have a mini family reunion this weekend as 10-15 members of her mother's side of the family will be in attendance at the Auburn game donning the Maroon and White. Her mother, Suzy Atchison, is originally from the Birmingham area and Carter, who just turned 19 years old on Wednesday, will meet them all for the very first time on Sunday.

AGGIES TO HIT THE GROUND RUNNING

Texas A&M annually plays one of the toughest schedules in the country packed with tough non-conference opponents and as a member of the No. 1-rated women's basketball conference in the nation in the Big 12. This season is no different as the Aggies will start off tough from the get-go with the likes of Duke, Auburn and California, all top 15 programs a year ago, in their first six games of the season. They will also face Arizona State in the Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic on Dec. 19 in a rematch of last year's NCAA Sweet 16 game in the Trenton Regional. Other notable early matchups include road tests at old Southwest Conference rival TCU on Dec. 12, Gonzaga on Dec. 20 and New Mexico on Dec. 30.

WHAT'S BACK

The Aggies are coming off a successful 27-8 NCAA Sweet 16 campaign in 2008-09. They are among a select number of schools to have received one of the top four seeds on Selection Monday and made back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances over the last two years. A&M returns 11 letterwinners including preseason All-Big 12 honorable mention selection Tanisha Smith and the sixth-rated recruiting class in the nation which includes preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year and National JUCO Player of the Year Danielle Adams.

AGGIES PICKED TO FINISH FOURTH

For the fourth consecutive year, the Texas A&M women's basketball team was picked to finish among the top five teams in the league in the preseason Big 12 Conference Coaches Poll. Coming off back-to-back NCAA Sweet 16 and Big 12 postseason championship game appearances, the Aggies were predicted to finish fourth and received one first-place vote with 87 points behind preseason favorite Baylor (109) and second-place vote-getters Kansas (106) and Texas (106). A&M was the preseason favorite to win the regular-season title in 2007-08 (Big 12 postseason champion and NCAA Elite Eight), picked second in 2006-07 (Big 12 regular-season co-champion) and fifth in 2008-09 (NCAA Sweet 16).

IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

A&M broke into The Associated Press Top 25 Poll with a No. 15 national ranking on Monday. It marked one of the biggest leaps by any Division I women's basketball program over the past decade in the AP Poll. The Aggies, who received votes in the preseason AP Poll released on Oct. 30, defeated then-No. 6 Duke, 95-77, in their season opener on Sunday at Reed Arena. Historically, Duke previously moved up 11 spots in January of 1998 and Rutgers had a two-week stretch when it went from No. 24 to No. 14 to No. 4 in recent years. A&M also climbed eight spots to No. 8 in the USA TODAY/ESPN Coaches Top 25 Poll on Tuesday. It marked the fourth consecutive season in which the Aggies have been ranked among the top 10 teams in the country. Last year, the Aggies were ranked a program-best No. 3 in both national polls, preceded by a No. 8 ranking in 2007-08 and a No. 10 ranking in 2006-07.

DEFENDERS OF THE HOME COURT

Texas A&M has protected its home court well over the last five seasons with the help of the 12th Man. In fact, the Aggies have compiled an unprecedented 59-5 (.922) overall success rate at Reed Arena including the second-fewest home losses in school history with a 13-1 mark in 2008-09 and a perfect 16-0 home stand in 2006-07. A&M has won its last eight consecutive contests in the venue dating back to a 73-60 win over Kansas on Jan. 31, 2009. The five tallies in the home loss column have only occurred during Big 12 Conference play against nationally-ranked league foes.

Three Aggies, including two of the team's top returning scorers, are Kansas City natives and look forward to returning to their hometown for the Phillips 66 Big 12 Women's Basketball Championship at Municipal Auditorium in March. Redshirt sophomore Tyra White, a McDonald's All-American out of Hickman Mills High School, was the preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year in 2008 and 2009. She is joined by Smith and Adams who are also KCMO products out of Lincoln Prep and Lee's Summit High School respectively. Last season, Smith was the team's third-leading scorer averaging 10.6 ppg and White the team's fifth-leading scorer with 5.2 ppg.

RICE RECAP

Texas A&M 86, Rice 50

- For the second-straight game, Texas A&M used the starting lineup of Sydney Colson, Tyra White, Tanisha Smith, Adaora Elonu and Damitria Buchanan (2-0).
- With the win, the Aggies extend their lead to 28-10 in the all-time series with Rice. A&M won by 36 points which was the largest margin of victory in the last five games in the series. Each game prior had been decided by 13 points or less. Coming into the game, the Aggies had lost three out of the last four contests between the two schools.
- A&M also extended its home-court win streak to eight-straight games at Reed Arena.
- Tanisha Smith and Danielle Adams turned in back-to-back games in double figures. Adams led the team in scoring for the second consecutive contest with 15 points. Smith turned in 14 points to mark her 10th consecutive game in double figures since scoring 18 points versus Oklahoma State in the team's regular-season home finale on March 5, 2009. She had an eight-game streak going prior to the Aggies' loss in the NCAA Sweet 16 a year ago.
- Junior reserve Maryann Baker (Dallas, Texas) tied career-bests in points (5), rebounds (3) and three-pointers made (1) and set a new personal best with three assists versus the Owls.
- A&M has dished out 20-or-more assists in back-to-back games against Rice (23) and No. 6 Duke (25).
- Sophomore Skylar Collins (Cedar Hill, Texas) recorded a career-high five points and freshman Kristi Bellock (St. Rose, La.) scored her first career bucket at the 9:41 minute mark of the second half and ended the night with six points. Freshmen Cierra Windham (Corona, Calif.) and Adrienne Pratcher (Memphis, Tenn.) also scored their first collegiate points with two apiece.

AGGIE NOTABLE QUOTABLES

"Both us were hit heavy with graduation losses. The road is not defined in the dictionary very well. It just says there is a little path going along. But, the road means so much more in the sporting world. How do you prepare for the road? You have to have confidence in your team, you have to have great preparation and you have to go in with a 'no fear' attitude. I think we will play well, because of the magnitude of the game. We play better against better competition. I think that's what you saw when we played against Duke on Sunday." – Texas A&M head coach Gary Blair on going on the road through SEC country at Auburn

"I'm excited to start traveling on the road. Auburn is a different team than when we played them two years ago. They lost a lot of veterans and have a lot of young players. They have a lot of athleticism and are tall in the post. They have two players, who are 6-foot-7 and 6-foot-8, coming off the bench. We have to really buckle down on defense and play our game. It's going to be a tough road test for us, since we played both of our first two games at home. Our game against Rice wasn't that great and we didn't do as well on defense like we did versus Duke. We just need to keep up our intensity, take care of the ball and pressure them the best that we can this weekend." – Senior Co-Captain Sydney Colson on this weekend's road trip to Auburn

"It's going to be a difficult game for us. We are both defensive-minded teams. They are very athletic and pretty big inside. We are going to have to match athleticism versus athleticism. The road is always difficult and this will show how we are going to respond on the road for the rest of the season. COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) - Danielle Adams scored 24 points in her Texas A&M debut as the Aggies stunned No. 6 Duke 95-77.

The Aggies (1-0) took the lead near the midway point of the first half and didn't trail again. Despite poor shooting, the Blue Devils (1-1) cut the lead to three points with about 14 minutes remaining, but the Aggies scored 10 straight points to make it 65-52 and Duke didn't threaten again.

Adams scored seven points in that span, including a nifty off-balance layup which she turned into a three-point play. Sydney Colson made a free throw to cap that run and then sprinted to the star at midcourt for an airborne chest bump with Tanisha Smith as a timeout was called.

Texas A&M got 19 points from Smith, 17 from Colson and Sydney Carter added 14. Damitria Buchanan had seven rebounds and tied an A&M record with seven blocks.

Jasmine Thomas had a career-high 26 points for the Blue Devils and Allison Vernerey scored 11.

The Aggies were up by 13 points when Duke finally got going and went on a 11-1 run to get within 55-52 on a jumper by Thomas with about 14 minutes left. But Adams and the Aggies thwarted the rally to cruise to the win.

Texas A&M was up by 15 points before scoring six straight points thanks to a missed layup and two turnovers by Duke to make it 82-61 with about 6 minutes remaining.

The Aggies led by 10 points at halftime and five quick points by Colson sandwiched around a layup by Duke's Joy Cheek stretched the lead to 50-37 early in the second half.

Duke cut the lead to four points before the Aggies went on another 8-0 run fueled by two 3-pointers by Carter to make it 31-19 with 5 1/2 minutes left in the first half.

The Blue Devils got within five a couple of minutes later but Texas A&M outscored them 10-5 to lead 45-35 at halftime.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - The eighth-ranked Texas A&M women's basketball team cruised past Rice, 86-50, in non-conference action held before a midweek crowd of 3,834 at Reed Arena.

The Aggies (2-0) got off to a slow start against the Owls (0-2) and could not gain more than a three-point lead in the first six minutes of the ballgame. However, A&M only trailed once as Tara Watts hit a three-pointer to give Rice an early 3-2 advantage at the 18:12 minute mark. A three-pointer by sophomore Sydney Carter (DeSoto, Texas) with 7:33 remaining in the first half pushed the lead out to 16 and the Aggies never looked back.

Thirteen of the team's 16 players on the roster contributed in the scoring column. Preseason All-Big 12 Conference honorable mention selection Tanisha Smith (Kansas City, Mo.) scored 12 of her 14 points in the first half as the Aggies shot 55.9 percent from the floor prior to taking a 47-22 halftime lead.

Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Danielle Adams (Kansas City, Mo.) led all scorers with 15 in just 18 minutes of play. She also brought down four rebounds and dished out four assists in only her second game as an Aggie. Carter ended the night with seven points and sophomore Adaora Elonu (Houston, Texas) added eight.

Much like the Duke game three days prior, the Aggie defense proved too much for the visiting squad as Rice committed 29 turnovers in which A&M converted into 31 of its points. Jessica Goswitz had 10 points for the Owls, who shot 36.4 percent from the floor (16-of-44) for the ballgame against one of the nation's top scoring defenses.
