TCU LOOKS TO KEEP WINNING STREAK ALIVE AT NEW MEXICO

TCU takes a two-game winning streak to the road this weekend when it faces New Mexico on Saturday at The Pit in Albuquerque, N.M. Tip-off for the contest, which will be televised live by The MountainWest Sports Network (The Mtn.), is scheduled for 4 p.m. MT.

The Horned Frogs, currently among a group of four teams tied for third place in the Mountain West standings at 2-2, will look to extend their winning streak to three games when they face the Lobos on their home court. A victory would give TCU its first three-game conference win streak since 2007-08.

New Mexico, 16-4 overall and receiving votes in the *USA Today* Coaches' Poll, is among the MW squads tied with TCU for third place at 2-2 following earlier league losses to UNLV and San Diego State. The Lobos snapped a two-game losing streak Wednesday with an 85-52 home victory over Colorado State and are 9-2 overall at The Pit this season.

TCU and UNM will be meeting for the 21st time in the all-time series. The Lobos own a 15-5 advantage and have won each of the past seven meetings.

Saturday's contest marks TCU's 12th televised game of the season and its eighth on the MountainWest Sports Network (The Mtn.). Rich Cellini (play-by-play) and Joe Cravens (analyst) will handle play-by-play duties for The Mtn.

Fans can also follow the TCU-Air Force contest on the radio throughout the Metroplex on 1460 AM KCLE and 88.7 FM KTCU with Brian Estridge (play-by-play) and John Denton (analyst) calling the action. Links to both the live radio Internet feed and live stats will be available via TCU's official athletics website, *GoFrogs.com*.

FROG QUICK NOTES

▶ Hank Thorns needs only four more assists for 500 in his career. Despite having played only 51 games as a Frog, Thorns is just 10 helpers shy of entering the program's career top-10 list (321).

▶ TCU has already surpassed last season's totals for overall victories (11) and conference wins (one).

▶ TCU held Boise State and Air Force to a total of three field goals in the final nine minutes of its last two games. The teams combined to shoot only 15.8% (3-of-19) with eight turnovers.

In subsequent references of the same presentation the team may be referred to by its nickname – Horned Frogs. A shorter version of the nickname, Frogs, is acceptable in later usage.

- ▶ TCU is 9-1 in games decided by six points or fewer. The squad was 2-5 in such contests last season.
- ▶ The Frogs have outscored opponents by only 26 points in the nine close wins compared to a margin of 120 points in their other three victories.
- ▶ The nine wins mark the most for TCU by six points or fewer in a single season since 1998-99 (10-5).
- ▶ TCU is forcing an average of 17.6 turnovers per game, 1.6 more than any other Mountain West team.
- ▶ TCU is No. 2 in the MW and No. 25 nationally in average turnover margin (+3.21). More than 25% of the Frogs' points this season have come off turnovers (356 of 1,371).
- ▶ Thorns is No. 4 in the MW in assists (4.53 apg); No. 5 in minutes (32.37 mpg); No. 6 in 3-pointers made (1.95 3pg) and assist/turnover ratio (1.54); No. 7 in scoring (13.4 ppg); and tied for No. 10 in steals (1.42 spg).
- ▶ In MW games only, Thorns is tied for No. 1 in 3-pointers (3.00 3pg) and No. 3 in scoring (16.5 ppg).
- ▶ Kyan Anderson is the only MW freshman among the league's top-20 scorers during league action (12.3 ppg; t-13th).
- ▶ J.R. Cadot is No. 3 in the MW in offensive rebounds (2.63 rpg); No. 5 in total rebounds (6.7 rpg); No. 6 in defensive rebounds (4.05 rpg); and No. 9 in steals (1.47 spg).
- ▶ Amric Fields is shooting a team-best 55.8% from the field over the last six games while averaging 12.5 ppg.
- ▶ Garlon Green is No. 18 in MW scoring average (10.7 ppg).
- ▶ Green's free-throw shooting rate of 85.7% is on pace to rank No. 8 in TCU single-season history.
- ▶ TCU is 7-0 when shooting 45.0% or better from the field, 7-0 when outrebounding the opposition, 10-1 when leading at halftime and 9-2 when scoring 70 points or more.

SCOUTING THE NEW MEXICO LOBOS

New Mexico, 16-4 overall this season and 2-2 in Mountain West play under fourth-year head coach Steve Alford, enters Saturday's game looking for its second straight home victory following Wednesday's 85-52 win over Colorado State. The Lobos are 9-2 overall at The Pit this season. The squad's two MW losses have come at home to San Diego State (75-70) and at UNLV (80-63).

UNM returned nine lettermen and four starters from last season's team that finished with a 22-13 overall record, placed fifth in the MW standings (8-8) and advanced to the second round of the NIT. This season, the Lobos rank among the nation's top-30 teams in several categories, including: assists (No. 13), field-goal percentage defense (No. 16), scoring margin (No. 17), 3-point field-goal percentage (No. 19), rebounding margin (No. 29) and scoring defense (No. 30). The squad tops the MW in assists, rebounding margin and 3-point percentage.

Senior forward Drew Gordon averages a double-double each time out with figures of 12.7 points and 10.7 rebounds per game. He ranks No. 1 in the MW in blocked shots (1.30 bpg), No. 2 in rebounding and No. 12 in scoring. Sophomore guard Tony Snell leads the team in scoring and is No. 9 in the league at 12.9 ppg, while sophomore guard Kendall Williams also averages double figures (11.8 ppg) and ranks No. 5 in the MW in assists (4.32 apg).

INSIDE THE SERIES

New Mexico holds a 15-5 edge in the all-time series that stretches back to 1964. The Lobos own a 10-3 advantage since the Frogs joined the MWC prior to the 2005-06 season and have won each of the last seven meetings. TCU took 3-of-4 games played during the 2006-07 and 2007-08 seasons. The Frogs are 0-9 against UNM in Albuquerque.

LAST TIME WE MET: UNM 80, TCU 70

TCU led by as many as five points midway through the second half, but a strong individual effort by guard Dairese Gary helped New Mexico pull away late during an 80-70 Lobo victory in the Frogs' 2010-11 home finale on Feb. 26, 2011.

Five Horned Frogs scored in double figures, including Nikola Cerina and Amric Fields, who shared the team lead with 17 points each. Cerina's effort marked a season high, as he went 7-for-11 from the field and added nine rebounds. Fields made 8-of-11 field-goal attempts.

Hank Thorns again topped double digits in assists, matching a career high with 12 helpers while chipping in 11 points. It marked his eighth double-digit assist effort of the season. Greg Hill, who was honored prior to his final home game alongside fellow senior Nikola Gacesa, totaled 10 points for the Frogs, while Garlon Green also added 10.

Gary, a first-team All-MWC selection, put together one of the top performances of his career to lead the Lobos. He scored a career-best 32 points, making 11-of-14 field-goal attempts while adding nine assists. Gary accounted for three of UNM's six 3-pointers and also went 7-for-8 at the charity stripe. A.J. Hardeman added a double-double for New Mexico featuring 14 points and 10 rebounds, while Phillip McDonald scored 12 points. Drew Gordon grabbed a game-high 11 boards.

THORNS LEADS TCU PAST AIR FORCE

Hank Thorns scored a career-high 22 points and TCU came up with big defensive stops late again Wednesday evening during a 59-56 victory over Air Force at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

Just like in Saturday's big comeback win over Boise State, TCU came up big on the defensive end of the court late in the game. The Frogs held the Falcons scoreless for the final four-plus minutes following a traditional 3-point play by Mike Fitzgerald at the 4:05 mark that cut TCU's lead to one point, 57-56. Thorns recorded a long jumper with 2:59 remaining to push his squad ahead by three points, and the Frogs were able to hold from there. Falcon guard Todd Fletcher missed a tying 3-point opportunity at the buzzer as TCU survived with yet another close victory.

Thorns experienced an outstanding evening the Frogs, connecting on 9-of-12 field-goal attempts, including 4-of-6 from beyond the arc. The output surpassed his previous high of 21 points that he had recorded on three different occasions. J.R. Cadot added his best offensive performance in well over a month, scoring 13 points and going a perfect 7-for-7 at the free-throw line. He also pulled down a team-high seven rebounds while collecting three assists, a career-best three blocked shots and a pair of steals.

- ▶ Guided Kent State to MAC regular-season and tournament championships and NCAA Tournament berths in both 2006 and 2008.
- ▶ Two-time MAC Coach of the Year (2006, 2008).
- ▶ The squad won four MAC East Division championships (2003, 2004, 2006, 2008) and finished no lower than second during his tenure.
- ▶ Took the Flashes to the NIT in each of his first three seasons (2003, 2004, 2005).
- ▶ Named National Rookie Coach of the Year in 2002-03 by *Basketball Times*.
- ▶ Prior to being named head coach, served one season as an assistant to former Kent State coach Stan Heath in 2001-02, helping the Flashes reach the Elite Eight round of the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Also previously served as an assistant at Pittsburgh (1996-99), Miami (Ohio) (1995-96), Western Kentucky (1994-95, 1990-92) and St. Francis (Pa.) (1992-94).
- ▶ In addition to coaching on the college level, spent two years at Octagon Sports Marketing and Management (1999-2001) as a college basketball talent evaluator.
- ▶ Is the only collegiate basketball coach in the country to have coached two NFL Pro Bowlers in San Diego Chargers tight end Antonio Gates (former Kent State forward) and Washington Redskins linebacker London Fletcher-Baker (former St. Francis forward).

TCU-AIR FORCE NOTES

- ▶ TCU matched a season low Wednesday by committing only nine turnovers, accomplished twice prior.
- ▶ TCU also set a season high with six blocked shots, which the squad previously recorded during the Dec. 31 home loss to Tulsa.
- ▶ Hank Thorns scored a career-high 22 points, topping his previous best of 21 points that he recorded on three different occasions.
- ▶ Thorns led TCU in scoring for the team-leading ninth time this season, while he scored 20 or more for the fourth time in his career.
- ▶ Thorns also matched a career-high with four 3-pointers on only five attempts. He previously hit four during the Dec. 31 home loss to Tulsa.

▶ J.R. Cadot scored 13 points, his highest offensive output in 10 games since totaling a season-high 18 during the Dec. 6 home win over Texas Tech.

LATE STOPS

TCU came up with strong defensive efforts late during back-to-back home wins over Boise State (Jan. 21) and Air Force (Jan. 25) that helped the squad dig out of an early 0-2 hole to its Mountain West season.

▶ TCU held the two teams to a combined three field goals in the final nine minutes of each of the last two games. The squads shot only 17.6% (3-of-17) with eight turnovers during the final stretch.

▶ The strong defensive play was a turnaround for the Frogs, who had allowed opponents to shoot 47.0% from the field overall, and 38.2% from beyond the arc, in the second half of games entering the Boise State contest.

▶ BSU shot only 1-of-11 from the field in the final 12:42, while Air Force was held to a 2-for-8 showing in the last nine minutes.

▶ TCU's final combined scoring margin over the last nine minutes for the two games was 25-9.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK

TCU has posted two comeback victories this season in which it trailed by 10 or more points at one point.

▶ TCU's Jan. 21 home win over Boise State saw the Frogs overcome a 15-point deficit with 10:24 remaining. The comeback marked the largest for the Frogs in victory in Jim Christian's four-year tenure.

▶ TCU erased a 10-point deficit earlier this season during its Jan. 4 home win against Rice.

▶ TCU now has four double-digit comebacks in Christian's stint as head coach: 12 points vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 6, 2008 and 11 points at SMU on Dec. 2, 2009.

CARDIAC KIDS

TCU has shown the ability to win close games this season, as nine of the team's 12 wins have come by six points or fewer.

▶ Overall, TCU is 9-1 in games decided by six points or fewer this season. The Frogs' fortunes appear to have changed from last season, when they went only 2-5 in such contests.

▶ The nine close wins already rank as the most by six points or fewer in an entire season for TCU since 1998-99, when the squad went 10-5 in such games.

▶ The nine victories have been by a combined 26 points. The squad's other three wins have been by a combined 120 points (vs. Austin College, vs. Grambling State and vs. UTPA).

▶ The most recent close victory saw TCU hold off Air Force by a 59-56 count at home Jan. 25 after trailing by two at the half.

▶ TCU erased a 15-point deficit Jan. 21 vs. Boise State before pulling out a 54-52 win. The Frogs held BSU without a field goal for an 11:31 stretch in the second half of the contest.

▶ TCU's lone close loss saw the squad erase an 11-point deficit in the final 2:38 of regulation during a Jan. 14 double-overtime loss at Colorado State.

▶ TCU battled back from a six-point deficit in the final five minutes of a Jan. 4 home victory over Rice. The Frogs held the Owls scoreless from the 5:06 mark until 37 seconds remaining.

▶ Hank Thorns delivered game-tying buckets in regulation (3-pointer; 0:20) and overtime (layup; 1:00) and the winning layup in overtime (1.4 seconds) during its Dec. 3 overtime win at Evansville.

▶ Thorns also helped hold off a late Florida Gulf Coast rally in the season opener, scoring on a scoop layup shot with only 11 seconds left to provide the winning points as the Eagles rallied late during a 73-72 TCU victory.

▶ TCU trailed with only 6.1 seconds remaining during its Nov. 26 road win at Houston before J.R. Cadot delivered the winning layup at the buzzer.

▶ Cadot also provided the winning points during TCU's Nov. 18 win over Virginia at the Paradise Jam, grabbing an offensive rebound off a missed free throw, laying the ball in and drawing the foul with under 20 seconds remaining. The Frogs held off the Cavaliers late for the 57-55 win.

THORNS NEARING ALL-TIME TCU LIST

Hank Thorns is climbing closer each game to placing his name on TCU's career assists list.

▶ Thorns has 311 assists as a Frog, leaving him only 10 helpers shy of former Frog Brent Atwater (321; 1992-93) for 10th place:

THORNS AMONG NATION'S TOP POINTS

A breakout 2010-11 season placed Hank Thorns into an elite group alongside the nation's top point guards entering his senior year. His performance so far this season has not disappointed.

- ▶ Since the Dec. 19 loss at USC, Thorns has dished out 40 assists against only 14 turnovers. Prior to that point, he had recorded 46 assists and 42 miscues on the season.
▶ Thorns is No. 4 in the MW in assists (4.53 apg); No. 5 in minutes (32.37 mpg); No. 6 in 3-pointers made (1.95 3pg) and assist/turnover ratio (1.54); No. 7 in scoring (13.4 ppg); and tied for No. 10 in steals (1.42 spg).
▶ Thorns has led TCU in scoring this season a team-high nine times and in assists all but three games.
▶ A Preseason All-Mountain West pick, Thorns is No. 3 among the nation's top returning assist men (7.0 apg) and No. 9 among the leaders in assist/turnover ratio (2.71). He led the MW in both categories and ranked No. 4 nationally in assists and No. 12 in assist/turnover ratio.
▶ Thorns was the only player last season to rank among the nation's top-12 players in both assists and assist/turnover ratio.
▶ Thorns does more than just dish the rock. He also led the team in steals (1.19 spg), was third in scoring average (10.5 ppg) and fifth in total rebounding (3.5 rpg).
▶ Thorns' 225 total assists ranked as the second-best single-season total in MW history and the most by a non-senior.
▶ Thorns dished out 10 or more assists nine times, seven more than any other MW player. He was third nationally in the category.

SECOND-HALF STANDOUT

Hank Thorns has been a second-half player this season for TCU, coming up big for the Frogs in crunch time.

- ▶ Thorns is averaging 8.5 ppg in the second half of games this season compared to 4.5 ppg prior to intermission. He has shot 46.9% from 3-point range in the second half after hitting at only a 31.1% clip prior to the half.
▶ Thorns has scored 10 points or more after the half eight times. The efforts were vital to TCU's wins vs. Virginia (Nov. 18), Houston (Nov. 26), Evansville (Dec. 3), Boise State (Jan. 21) and Air Force (Jan. 25).
▶ Thorns scored 10 of his 12 points in the second half to help lead TCU to a 54-52 win over Boise State. He totaled five points on a 3-pointer that gave TCU the lead with 2:37 remaining and the winning layup with 22 seconds left. He scored the final five points of TCU's 59-56 win over Air Force four days later.
▶ Thorns helped TCU overcome an 11-point deficit with only 2:38 to play in regulation during a double-overtime loss at CSU. He scored 16 of his 21 points after halftime overall, including seven of TCU's 11 points during its late comeback.
▶ Thorns delivered game-tying buckets in regulation (3-pointer; 0:20) and overtime (layup; 1:00) and the winning layup in overtime (1.4 seconds) during its win at Evansville.
▶ Thorns scored all 15 of his points after halftime during the win at Houston. Following a 0-for-3 start from the field, he hit all five of his second-half shots, including three straight 3-pointers.
▶ Thorns started his senior season on the right foot, providing the winning points during the season opener vs. Florida Gulf Coast on a layup with only 11 seconds left. He scored seven in the final 4:27 to help fuel TCU's Nov. 28 win over Virginia.

DYNAMIC FRESHMAN

Kyan Anderson provided the TCU program with a big lift last spring when he signed on to play with the Frogs out of North Crowley High School.

- ▶ Anderson has jumped out of the gate quickly in his career, ranking No. 2 on the team in assists (2.42 apg) and No. 5 in scoring (7.8 ppg). He has six double-figure scoring games.
▶ Anderson led TCU in points in back-to-back games against No. 14 UNLV (Jan. 18) and Boise State (Jan. 21). After setting career highs in both points (20) and boards (six) during the road loss at UNLV, he totaled 16 points during the Jan. 21 home win over BSU.
▶ Anderson is the only MW freshman among the league's top-20 scorers during league action (12.3 ppg; t-13th).
▶ Anderson is No. 3 among MW freshmen overall in scoring average and No. 2 in assists.
▶ Anderson is 7-of-17 on 3-pointers in conference play after entering the stretch only 5-of-24.
▶ Anderson has started each of the last eight games for TCU at the two-guard spot, averaging 9.9 ppg and 2.6 apg during starts.
▶ Anderson has totaled five or more assists four times, including a career-high seven in TCU's latest outing vs. UTPA.
▶ Anderson was one of the nation's top point guard prospects for 2011. The No. 18 player overall in the state of Texas according to Rivals.com and the No. 3 point guard, Anderson led all Class 5A players in assists as a senior and was No. 8 in scoring average.
▶ A first-team all-state pick as a junior, Anderson was named the area 2010 Player of the Year by both the Fort Worth Star-Telegram and Dallas Morning News.

FIELDS HITTING STRIDE

Sophomore Amric Fields appears to have made the next step as a young player in his second season on the court for the Frogs after playing all 33 games as a true freshman and finishing No. 2 among all MW freshman in scoring (6.8 ppg) in 2010-11.

- ▶ Fields played the best five-game stretch of his career from the Rice game ((Jan. 4) through the Boise State win (Jan. 21), scoring five more points (70) than in any previous run.
▶ Fields is shooting a team-best 55.8% from the field over the last six games while averaging 12.5 ppg.
▶ Fields ranks third on the team overall this season in scoring (10.0 ppg), and leads the squad in blocked shots (0.68 bpg) and field-goal percentage (53.5%).
▶ Fields twice forced extra periods of play during TCU's Jan. 14 double-overtime loss at Colorado State. He hit a pair of free throws with only 3.2 seconds remaining to send the game to extra time, then pushed it to double overtime on a running layup with only 0.3 ticks left in the first extra frame.
▶ Fields was named MW Player of the Week for the first time in his career Jan. 9 for his play against Rice. He became only the fifth Frog to earn the weekly honor and the first since Edvinas Ruzgas on Dec. 21, 2009. He totaled 18 points and his career best of six rebounds to lead a TCU comeback against the Owls.
▶ Fields scored double digits in points in five straight games from the Nov. 21 loss to Ole Miss until the Dec. 10 loss to Nebraska, a career-best streak. He has 11 such efforts overall this season.
▶ Fields has played in 52 straight games, the team's second-best active streak.

J.R. Cadot provided TCU with an aggressive edge around the basket from his guard position in his first season on campus last year. The Bahamas native finished last season on a roll and has picked right back up where he left off early this season.

▶ Cadot is No. 3 in the MW in offensive rebounds (2.63 rpg); No. 5 in total rebounds (6.7 rpg); No. 6 in defensive rebounds (4.05 rpg); and No. 9 in steals (1.47 spg).

▶ Cadot leads TCU in rebounding and is No. 4 in scoring (9.8 ppg) and No. 2 in field-goal percentage (49.2%).

▶ Cadot has scored in double figures nine times this season and 17 times in the last 28 games dating back to last February. He had only four such efforts in 25 career games prior to the current stretch.

▶ Cadot has a team-best three double-doubles this season and also leads the squad with six in his career. He has reached double figures in boards three games this season and seven in his career.

▶ Cadot pulled in a late offensive board and hit a free throw in the closing seconds of TCU's win over Virginia to seal the victory in the team's Paradise Jam opener.

▶ He added his fourth career double-double (18 points, 12 rebounds) vs. Ole Miss to earn a spot on the Paradise Jam's all-tournament team.

▶ Cadot's layup at the buzzer, off a putback from his own missed shot, made the Frogs an 81-80 winner at Houston on Nov. 26.

▶ Cadot is 88-of-140 from the field (62.9%) in his career playing at the DMC.

▶ Cadot led TCU last season in overall field-goal rate (65.9%) and rebounding (6.0 rpg). His field-goal rate ranked No. 2 in TCU single-season history for players with 150 attempts or more.

GREEN MEANS GO

Garlon Green is looking to continue his development following a breakthrough sophomore season in 2010-11. He is TCU's active career leader in games played (83) and points (705) as a Frog and has played in a team-best 64 consecutive games.

▶ Green is No. 1 among Frogs in free-throw percentage (85.2%), No. 2 in scoring (10.7 ppg) and No. 4 in rebounding (3.4 rpg).

▶ Garlon Green is No. 18 in MW scoring average (10.7 ppg).

▶ Green's free-throw percentage is on pace to rank No. 8 in TCU single-season history.

▶ Sixty-three of Green's 78 career 3-pointers have come in the last 42 contests. He has equaled his career high of three treys 10 times during the stretch.

▶ Green set his career scoring high during the Dec. 22 home win over Grambling State when he scored 24 points. It marked his second career 20-point performance.

▶ Green recorded both the second double-double of his career and a new personal best in rebounds with 14 points and 12 boards during the Jan. 14 double-overtime loss at Colorado State.

▶ Green led TCU last season in total points (369), 3-pointers (49) and 3-point percentage (47.6%). He was second in rebounding (4.6 rpg) and overall field-goal percentage (48.4%).

▶ The 3-point rate would have led the Mountain West, but he fell one made shot short of qualifying for the category.

▶ Green made major strides between his freshman and sophomore campaigns. He averaged 4.3 ppg and 2.4 rpg in 2009-10 and shot only 40.6%, including 18.9% beyond the arc.

TENACIOUS D

TCU has shown off its athleticism on the defensive end early on this season, using pressure defense to force an average of 17.6 turnovers per contest.

▶ TCU's average of forced turnovers leads all MW teams by 1.6 tpg. The team's defensive pressure has helped it rank No. 2 in the MW and No. 25 nationally in turnover margin (+3.21).

▶ More than 25% of the Frogs' points this season have come off turnovers (356 of 1,371).

▶ Six of TCU's opponents have turned the ball at least 20 times. The most the Frogs forced in any game a year ago was 19.

▶ TCU forced 29 turnovers in its season-opening win over Florida Gulf Coast, followed by 35 against Austin College. The figures mark the most in Jim Christian's tenure as head coach.

▶ The last time TCU had more than its 35 vs. Austin College was Dec. 30, 2000, when Arkansas-Pine Bluff had 41 against the Frogs.

▶ Despite the success in turnovers, TCU still has work to do on defense, as nine teams (FGCU, Ole Miss, Houston, Texas Tech, Nebraska, USC, Tulsa, Colorado State and UNLV) have shot 50% from the field or better against the Frogs.

MCKINNEY PROVIDING PAINT PRESENCE

Adrick McKinney, is in his first season after transferring from Angelina College, has helped give TCU a dimension it lacked last season as a physical inside presence.

▶ McKinney is No. 2 on the team in rebounding (4.4 rpg) and No. 7 in scoring (6.2 ppg). He has six double-figures scoring efforts and two games with 10 or more boards.

▶ McKinney is No. 8 in the Mountain West in offensive boards (1.83 rpg) and No. 16 in overall rebounds.

▶ McKinney set his career scoring high with 16 points on 7-of-12 shooting during the Jan. 18 road loss at No. 14 UNLV. He also dished out a career-best three assists.

▶ McKinney pulled in a career-high 14 rebounds during the Dec. 3 overtime win at Evansville, the most for a Frog since Zvonko Buljan totaled 17 against Cal State Northridge on Nov. 16, 2009.

▶ McKinney led TCU with a career-high 15 points during the squad's Nov. 20 setback to Norfolk State. He notched his first career double-double this season with 10 points and 10 boards Nov. 14 vs. Austin College.

▶ McKinney, who played prep ball at Fort Worth's Trimble Tech High School, was ranked as the nation's No. 45 junior college player by Jucojunction.com. He posted averages of 15.1 points and 8.4 boards for Angelina College in Lufkin, Texas.



HITTING THE OFFENSIVE GLASS

TCU has been effective at generating second opportunities by hitting the offensive boards this season.

- ▶ The squad totaled 11 or more offensive rebounds in seven straight contests dating from Nov. 20 through Dec. 10, the team's longest streak since a 10-game stretch in 2005-06.
▶ TCU has pulled down 10 or more offensive boards 14 times overall this season. The squad ranks No. 4 in the Mountain West rankings in offensive rebounding (11.47 orgp). The average is on pace to be the team's highest since 2007-08 (12.67 orgp).
▶ TCU has two of the MW's top-7 players in offensive boards in J.R. Cadot (No. 3) and Adrick McKinney (No. 8).

WILLIAMS STEPPING UP DOWN LOW

Craig Williams, who spent three years at Temple (2007-11) before transferring to TCU in the offseason, has been a major contributor for the Frogs in recent games, using his 6-8, 265-pound frame to give TCU a lift in the paint.

- ▶ Williams averaged a team-high totals of 13.4 ppg and 5.4 rpg from its Dec. 19 loss at USC through the Jan. 11 home win over UTPA. He scored in double figures in four of the five games.
▶ Williams reached double digits in points a career-best three straight games from the USC loss to the Tulsa loss (Dec. 31), including a career-high 25-point effort during the Dec. 22 home win over Grambling.
▶ Prior to the stretch, Williams had never reached hit double digits in back-to-back games.

▶ Williams also posted his first career double-double vs. Grambling, adding 10 rebounds.

▶ Williams owns TCU's top individual scoring and rebounding totals this season. In addition to his 25 points being the most by a Frog in 2011-12, he had 13 rebounds Dec. 6 vs. Lamar. He has led TCU twice in both scoring and rebounding.

▶ Williams is on pace to set career highs in points, rebounds, field-goal percentage and minutes played this season.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- ▶ TCU has connected on at least one 3-pointer in 424 consecutive games dating back to the 1997-98 campaign. The last time the Frogs failed to connect on a trey came against LIU-Brooklyn on November 22, 1997.
▶ TCU has connected on at least one 3-pointer in 640 of its last 641 games. Prior to a failed connection against LIU-Brooklyn, TCU made at least one trey in 217 consecutive games dating back to Feb. 11, 1990, when Texas held the Frogs without one.
▶ The Frogs have posted an all-time record of 45-61 (.425) in overtime games and 34-28 (.548) in overtime games at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. TCU is a combined 4-0 in games that last past two overtimes in its history. The Frogs are 1-1 when reaching overtime this season.
▶ Since Jim Christian took over the reigns of the program, TCU is 41-7 overall when holding the lead at halftime. The Frogs are 10-1 in 2011-12, with their only loss coming to Nebraska.

FROGS STRONG IN NON-CONFERENCE

TCU posted its most successful non-conference campaign in several years this season with a 10-5 record. The squad still has one more game to play, Feb. 8 at Metroplex rival SMU.

- ▶ TCU's 10 wins marked its most out of conference since the squad won 10 during 2004-05 season.
▶ A win Feb. 8 at SMU would give the Frogs 11 non-conference victories for the first time since 2000-01, when the squad went 11-3.
▶ Due to changes in Mountain West membership this season, TCU is playing 16 non-conference games instead of 14, which had been the usual total in recent seasons.

IN-STATE SUCCESS

TCU has seen success against its in-state foes since the arrival of head coach Jim Christian to campus.

- ▶ The Frogs are 17-3 against Texas teams in the Christian era, including 6-0 this season. TCU is 12-1 against teams from the Lone Star State in its last 13 opportunities.
▶ TCU will face seven Texas teams in all this season. A win Feb. 8 at SMU would give the squad an undefeated record against in-state foes for only the third time in program history and the first time since 1997-98 (9-0). TCU also posted an 18-0 mark in 1951-52 as a member of the Southwest Conference.
▶ Last year, TCU posted a 4-1 record with wins over Texas Tech, SMU, Houston and Prairie View A&M. The lone loss came at Rice.

HOME SWEET HOME AT THE DMC

TCU has notched 435 triumphs in the 49-year history of Daniel-Meyer Coliseum and has posted a winning percentage of .629 (435-257) on its home court.

Over the past 15 seasons, the Frogs have accumulated a 187-85 (.688) overall record at the DMC while posting at least 10 home victories on 11 occasions.

Among the Frogs who enjoy playing at home is J.R. Cadot, who owns a career field-goal shooting percentage of 62.9% (88-of-140) at the DMC. Garlon Green leads the Frogs this season in home scoring average (12.5 ppg) and free-throw percentage (87.9%).

PARADISE JAM RECAP

TCU made its first regular-season trip outside the contiguous U.S. Nov. 18-21, when it played in the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam on the island of St. Thomas. It was the first such appearance since former head coach Billy Tubbs' squad played in the 1999 Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska.

- ▶ TCU's last trip outside the U.S. came in Summer 2007, when former head coach Neil Dougherty's squad took a 10-day, five-day tour of Central America.
▶ The tournament served as a homecoming for U.S. Virgin Islands native Craig Williams, who hails from Christiansted on the island of St. Croix.
▶ TCU opened the tourney with a 57-55 win over Virginia, its first over an ACC opponent since a 71-70 victory over Florida State in the 2004 Corpus Christi Challenge (Nov. 28, 2004).
▶ TCU finished the tournament in fifth place. Following a semifinal-round loss to Norfolk State (66-53), the Frogs fell to Ole Miss (80-69) in the 3rd/5th-place game.
▶ J.R. Cadot was one of six players named to the all-tournament team after averaging 11.7 ppg and 8.0 rpg.

ONE BIG WIN

TCU's 103-45 home win over Austin College on Nov. 14 was one of its most lopsided decisions in several years.

▶ TCU broke the 100-point barrier for the first time since a triple-overtime win over Texas State on Nov. 24, 2009 (108-99).

▶ The game also marked TCU's first triple-digit regulation game since a 102-89 victory over Centenary on Jan. 4, 2003.

▶ The 58-point margin of victory marked TCU's largest in a game since a 130-71 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Dec. 30, 2000.

IN THE CLASSROOM

While one Horned Frog will be playing his final season as a graduate student (Craig Williams), four others are on track to earn their TCU degrees before the start of next season.

▶ Williams is playing this season with his degree in hand after earning a bachelor's in psychology from Temple in May 2011. He is currently working towards a master's in liberal arts at TCU.

▶ Junior Cheick Kone (communications) and senior Marin Bavecic (business) both earned their degrees in December. Bavecic, a walk-on from overseas, has since left the program to return to his home nation of Croatia.

▶ Seniors Hank Thorns (May) and J.R. Cadot (next summer) also are on track to earn communications degrees in the next calendar year.

FAMILY TIES

The Frogs have five players with family ties to professional and collegiate backgrounds in Hank Thorns, Garlon Green, Thomas Montigel, Connell Crossland and Nate Butler.

▶ Thorns' father, Henry, was a standout on the football field for UNLV before playing professionally in the Canadian Football League.

▶ Thorns' cousin, C.J. Watson, played four seasons at the University of Tennessee where he graduated ranked second in program history in assists and steals. Currently, Watson is a member of the Chicago Bulls.

▶ Green's brother, Gerald Jr., went directly from high school to the NBA and was drafted by the Boston Celtics with the 18th overall selection in the 2005 NBA Draft. Currently, Green is playing professionally in Russia.

▶ Montigel's father, Bill, is in his 23rd season as TCU's men's golf coach. Prior to his current role, he served eight seasons as an assistant basketball coach and top recruiter at TCU under legendary former head coach Jim Killingsworth.

▶ Several of Bill Montigel's recruits were key performers on the Frogs' back-to-back Southwest Conference championship teams in 1986 and 1987, including TCU Hall of Famer Jaime Dixon, who is now the head coach at Pitt.

▶ Crossland's cousin is 12-year NBA veteran Larry Hughes, who played college ball one year for St. Louis before being taken No. 8 overall by the Philadelphia 76ers in the 1998 NBA Draft. Hughes most recently played for the Charlotte Bobcats.

▶ Butler's father is Mario Butler, a basketball legend in Latin America who experienced a long career in the Baloncesto Superior Nacional, Puerto Rico's top professional league. Nate's brother, Mario Jr., also has played professionally in Puerto Rico.

▶ Butler's sister, Jessica, played college basketball for Canisius from 1998 through 2003.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

TCU opened the season with three international players on its roster, a figure that tied for the Mountain West lead with UNLV. The foreign states represented include Croatia (Marin Bavecic), the Bahamas (J.R. Cadot) and Mali (Cheick Kone). Bavecic, a walk-on player who was ruled out this season due to injury, has since left the program after receiving his degree in December.

TCU also has two players from U.S. territories on its roster in Nate Butler (Puerto Rico) and Craig Williams (U.S. Virgin Islands).

LOCAL PRODUCTS

Newcomers Kyan Anderson and Adrick McKinney join sophomore Thomas Montigel as Fort Worth natives playing for the Frogs. It marks the largest number of local products on TCU's roster since 2007-08, when Brent Hackett, Kevin Langford and Luke Tauscher all played with the Frogs. The last season TCU did not have a Fort Worth native on the roster was 2002-03.

NEW SEASON, NEW TEAM

Eight letterwinners and three starters who accounted for 95 of 155 starts from a season ago return for TCU in 2010-11.

Among the returnees is Hank Thorns, who earned All-Mountain West Third-Team honors as a junior after posting the third-best single-season assist total in program history (225). Thorns also averaged scoring in double figures with 10.7 ppg.

Garlon Green, who led last season's team in total points (369 points, 11.2 ppg), also is back, as is the team's top rebounder in J.R. Cadot (6.0 rpg).

Overall, TCU returned 56 percent of scoring, 55 percent of rebounding and 68 percent of assist totals from last year's team.

While some experience returns, TCU will count heavily on production from newcomers this season, as six of the 14 players on the roster are new to the program. The fresh faces include: senior Craig Williams; juniors Nate Butler, Connell Crossland and Adrick McKinney; sophomore Chris Zurcher; and freshman Kyan Anderson.

NEW FACES ON THE BENCH

Jim Christian added two new assistant coaches to his staff for 2011-12 in veterans Reggie Brown and Rob Evans.

Brown spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach at SMU and helped lead the Mustangs to the semifinals of the 2011 Collegiansider.com Tournament (CIT). Prior to his time at SMU, he served seven years as an assistant at UT Arlington, where he was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2008-09 season.

A graduate of UTA, Brown starred for the Mavericks from 1993-97, averaging 16.0 points, 3.0 assists and 2.3 rebounds per game during his career.

Evans is a former head coach with more than 40 years of experience overall at the Division I level. He was the head coach at Ole Miss from 1993 to 1998 and Arizona State from 1999 through 2006. He led Ole Miss to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances and ASU to three postseason tournament bids in his final five seasons.

Evans arrived at TCU from Arkansas, where he was an assistant on former Razorback head coach John Pelphrey's staff since 2007.

TCU MOVING TO BIG 12 IN 2012-13

On Oct. 10, 2011, TCU's Board of Trustees unanimously approved an invitation from the Big 12 to join the conference in all sports effective July 1, 2012. TCU will join Baylor, Iowa State, Kansas, Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Texas, Texas Tech and West Virginia.

The Big 12 sponsors all of the sports TCU currently fields in the Mountain West in addition to equestrian.

Fort Worth, Texas (Trimble Tech HS)

The No. 27 overall player in the state of Texas for the class of 2012 according to Rivals.com, Hill averaged 14.3 points and 2.8 steals per game as a junior in 2011 and recorded a team-high 18 dunks. He was named second-team all-area by the Fort Worth Star-Telegram and was a first-team all-district 4A-6 selection. Hill, who is coached at Trimble Tech by Wendell Ivory, plays AAU ball for the Texas Assault. Smith played his freshman year at Houston-area Cypress Creek High School. He also plays AAU ball for the New Heights club team in New York City in addition to his prep competition. TCU 73, FLORIDA GULF COAST 72 Fort Worth, Texas (Daniel-Meyer Coliseum) Nov. 11, 2011

FORT WORTH—TCU saw a 16-point second-half lead dwindle to only one point in the closing seconds of its season opener, but a big basket by Hank Thorns helped the Frogs pull out a 73-72 victory over Florida Gulf Coast.

TCU won its sixth consecutive season opener and its fifth in a row at home. The Frogs are a perfect 4-0 in openers in head coach Jim Christian's tenure.

Thorns turned in the play of the night to help secure the TCU victory. Leading by two points in the game's final seconds, Thorns scored on a scoop layup shot with only 11 seconds on the clock, beating both the shot clock and the Eagles' zone defense to put TCU up by four, 73-69. The bucket proved to be huge, as FGCU guard Sherwood Brown drilled a long 3-pointer just six seconds later to pull the Eagles within one point.

After Thorns was fouled on the in-bounds play with 4.1 seconds remaining and missed the front end of the one-and-one, a mad scramble for the ball resulted in the clock expiring, giving TCU the win.

Four Frogs scored in double figures Friday, including J.R. Cadot, who totaled a game-high 16 points. Cadot was a beast on the glass, pulling down seven rebounds. Two of his second-half boards resulted in putbacks, as he finished the contest 5-of-7 from the field for the game.

TCU 103, AUSTIN COLLEGE 45 Fort Worth, Texas (Daniel-Meyer Coliseum) Nov. 14, 2011

FORT WORTH—TCU posted its most lopsided victory in more than a decade Monday evening, handling Austin College by a count of 103-45 at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. Each of the 13 Horned Frogs who dressed scored at least two points.

The Frogs improved to 2-0 for the third straight season and the fifth time in the last six years.

The 58-point margin of victory marked TCU's largest in a game since a 130-71 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Dec. 30, 2000. The Frogs also forced 35 turnovers, the most by an opponent since that same contest against APBU, while they broke the 100-point barrier for the first time since a triple-overtime win over Texas State on Nov. 24, 2009 (108-99). It marked the first triple-digit regulation game for TCU since a 102-89 victory over Centenary on Jan. 4, 2003.

Four Frogs scored in double figures, including junior guard/forward Garlon Green, who totaled a game-high 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting. Green appeared to play most of the game above the rim, collecting four individual dunks on the night. As a team, TCU was credited with seven slams. Junior forward Adrick McKinney notched TCU's first double-double of the season with 10 points and 10 rebounds, while sophomore forward Amric Fields also reached double digits with 11.

ST. THOMAS, U.S.V.I.—TCU gained some early-season momentum and an impressive victory in the opening round of the 12th annual U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam, defeating Virginia, 57-55.

The victory moved TCU to 3-0 for the first time in head coach Jim Christian's tenure and the first time overall since the 2007-08 season. The Frogs also earned their first win over an ACC opponent since a 71-70 victory over Florida State on Nov. 28, 2004 in the Corpus Christi Classic. Virginia entered the tournament 2-0 and was voted to finish fourth in the ACC this season in the league's annual preseason poll.

Senior guard Hank Thorns led the Frogs with a game-high 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting and added four assists. Eleven of Thorns' scoring total came in the second half, including seven in the final 4:27. Also reaching double figures were senior guard J.R. Cadot, who had 12 points, and junior forward Garlon Green, who scored 10 despite sitting for much of the game in foul trouble. Cadot was a perfect 4-for-4 from the field in addition to hitting all four of his free throws.

Junior guard Nate Butler went scoreless but did pull down a team-high eight rebounds to lead the Frogs to a 30-28 advantage on the glass. Freshman guard Kyan Anderson produced six points, while senior forward Craig Williams scored four in his return to his home in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

ST. THOMAS, UVSI—TCU suffered its first loss of the season in the semifinal round of the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam to Norfolk State, 66-53.

TCU experienced its worst offensive night of the season against the Spartans, shooting only 25.4 percent for the game, including a 1-of-18 performance from 3-point range. Despite making only 7-of-31 field goals in the first half, the Frogs kept themselves in the game by relying on their strength to this point in the season—pressure defense. The squad forced 16 turnovers in the opening period, which it turned into 17 points. TCU also attacked the basket, which resulted in 12 free throws in 16 attempts in the half.

TCU trailed by only two points at intermission, 28-26, but its woes continued in the second half. A 10-0 Norfolk State run coinciding with a four-minute Frog scoring drought gave the Spartans a 14-point advantage, 46-32, with just over 10 minutes remaining. NSU would push the lead to 17 points just a minute later on a basket by guard Chris McEachin.

The Frogs were able to cut their deficit to only six points on a layup by Adrick McKinney with two minutes remaining, but McEachin responded with his fourth 3-pointer to essentially ice the game for the Spartans.

FORT WORTH—TCU dropped the third-place game of the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam to Ole Miss, 80-69. J.R. Cadot and Amric Fields led TCU with 18 points each.

In a game that featured 10 ties and 10 lead changes through the opening 30 minutes, Ole Miss pulled away from the Horned Frogs midway through the second half. The Rebels attacked the middle of TCU's defense, relying almost exclusively on layup attempts that resulted in either baskets or free throws. Ole Miss was 18-of-28 at the line for the game and 13-of-18 following intermission as the Frogs put the squad in the bonus early in the half. The Rebels also outscored TCU 44-30 in the paint for the game.

Nick Williams hit a big 3-pointer that pushed the Rebel lead to 11 points, 72-61, with 1:56 remaining and, despite TCU cutting the spread to six in the final minutes, Ole Miss made its free-throws late to ice the contest.

Cadot, who was named to the All-Tournament Team, posted his fourth career double-double, and only the second for the Frogs this season, after pulling down a game-high 12 rebounds to go with his 18 points. FORT WORTH—TCU ran out to a fast start and coasted to victory in the second half, running its winning streak to four games with a 75-69 victory over Texas Tech. The Horned Frogs hit a season-high 11 3-pointers in victory, including nine in the first half alone.

The win moved the squad's season record to 7-2 for the first time since the 2000-01 season, while TCU earned its first 4-0 home start since 2004-05.

J.R. Cadot again came up with the plays in crunch time to help TCU hold off a late, slow charge by Texas Tech. After trailing by as many as 16 points early in the first half, the Red Raiders shot a sizzling 61.9 percent from the field in the stanza to climb back into the contest.

After Tech was able to cut the advantage to only six points on a dunk by forward Jaron Nash with 3:07 remaining, Cadot answered with the first of his late plays. He pulled down an offensive rebound after missing a pair of free throws, then layed the ball in to give his squad a 70-62 edge with only 2:49 left.

Cadot calmly stepped to the line and sank both shots to put TCU up by four, 73-69, with only 13 seconds left. Hank Thorns added two more free throws in the final seconds to provide the game's final margin.

LOS ANGELES — TCU suffered its second straight setback, and its first this season in a true road contest, falling to USC, 83-59, at the Trojans' Galen Center.

The Frogs, trying to become the first TCU squad to win three consecutive road non-conference contests in since the 1942-43 season, ran into a tough matchup against a Trojan squad that played its best game of the season. USC shot 50.9 percent from the field and drilled 8-of-17 attempts from 3-point range, while its 83 points eclipsed the squad's previous season high set against Cal State Northridge (66) by 17 points.

While the Trojans' offensive effort was sharp, the squad also was opportunistic on the defensive end of the court, taking advantage of a sloppy TCU performance. FORT WORTH — Senior forward Craig Williams and junior guard/forward Garlon Green both chipped in career-high point totals Thursday to help TCU snap a two-game skid during an 85-53 Horned Frog victory over Grambling State at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

TCU ran out to 15-point lead at the half, then put its foot on the gas from there, outscoring the Tigers by 17 in the second half. FORT WORTH — TCU erased a six-point deficit in the game's final minutes with three late 3-pointers and some shut-down defense to down Rice, 78-74.

TCU, which led by five points at halftime, found itself trailing by six points with just over four-and-a-half minutes remaining before the Frogs came to life. Senior guard Hank Thorns hit a 3-pointer to cut the deficit in half before junior guard Nate Butler knotted the game up at 69-69 on another trey with 2:32 remaining. Sophomore forward Amric Fields followed by putting the Frogs up for good with a third straight 3-pointer at the 1:30 mark. Fields and Thorns then pushed the lead to seven points with only 41 seconds left by each adding 2-for-2 efforts at the line.

TCU 54, BOISE STATE 52 Fort Worth, Texas (Daniel-Meyer Coliseum) Jan. 21, 2012

FORT WORTH — TCU shook off a 15-point deficit with 10 minutes to play to complete its largest rally since 2008 over Boise State, 54-52. Kyan Anderson again led the Horned Frogs with a game-high 16 points, and TCU held the Broncos without a bucket for more than 1:10 during the comeback.

BSU, which led by as many as 15 points in the second half, grabbed a 14-point edge, 43-29, on a 3-pointer by Thomas Bropleh with 12:38 to play. The basket would prove to be the squad's last until the final minute of the contest, as the Frogs held the Broncos to only seven points at the free-throw line until a layup by guard Tre' Nichols with 56.9 seconds remaining.

Trailing by 15 with just over 10 minutes left, Anderson started the rally with a 3-pointer. Following a pair of Bronco free throws, TCU rattled off the next 18 points over a period of 7:36. Hank Thorns led the charge with seven points, including the final five that put TCU on top. He first gave the Frogs their first lead since early in the opening half, 52-50, on a 3-pointer from the left wing, then made it a four-point advantage on a layup at the 1:15 mark.

Nichols' layup inside the final minute ended the Bronco scoring drought while cutting the TCU lead to one possession, but the Frogs were able to withstand a last-second 3-point attempt from Nichols that glanced off the rim at the buzzer. The performance marked the largest deficit overcome by the Frogs in head coach Jim Christian's four-year TCU tenure.

FORT WORTH — Hank Thorns scored a career-high 22 points and TCU came up with big defensive stops late for the second straight game during a 59-56 home victory over Air Force.

Just like in Saturday's big comeback win over Boise State at the DMC, TCU came up big on the defensive end of the court late in the game. The Frogs held the Falcons scoreless for the final four-plus minutes following a traditional 3-point play by Mike Fitzgerald at the 4:05 mark that cut TCU's lead to one point, 57-56. Thorns recorded a long jumper with 2:59 remaining to push his squad ahead by three points, and the Frogs were able to hold from there. Falcon guard Todd Fletcher missed a tying 3-point opportunity at the buzzer as TCU survived with yet another close victory.

Thorns came up big again for the Frogs, who earned their ninth win in 10 games decided by six points or fewer. The returning All-MW performer connected on 9-of-12 field-goal attempts on the evening, including 4-of-6 from beyond the arc.

J.R. Cadot experienced his best offensive night in well over a month, scoring 13 points and going a perfect 7-for-7 at the free-throw line. He also pulled down a team-high seven rebounds while collecting three assists, a career-high three blocked shots and a pair of steals.

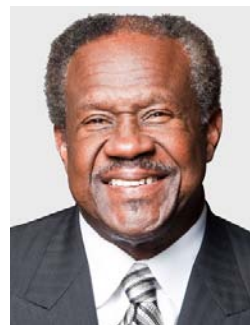
