Jim Christian was introduced to the Dallas/Fort Worth community on March 29th, 2008, as the 19th head men's basketball coach in TCU history. In front of representatives of the TCU athletics department, campus leaders, media members and lifelong Frog supporters, former TCU Athletics Director Dr. Danny Morrison described Christian as a "slam dunk" in finding the right person to lead the program.

The announcement of Christian as head men's basketball coach at TCU was made with praise not only around the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex, but around the nation as Mike Huguenin of Rivals.com stated that "Christian is the best hire of 2008 in college basketball." ESPN College Basketball Analyst Jay Bilas stated, "When you watch Christian's team play, you see just how good of a coach he really is. I have been surprised that someone hasn't plucked him out of Kent State sooner, but this was a tremendous hire by TCU and one that will pay dividends for them in the near future."

After one season at the helm, those who stood in the John S. Justin Athletic Complex that afternoon know that Christian was exactly the right person to change the direction of the Frogs' program. Christian promised change in attitude, change in intensity, and most importantly, change in the culture of the TCU men's basketball program. Those who watched the Purple and White during the 2008-09 campaign realized that Christian had, in fact, changed the Frogs.

In his first season as head coach, Christian guided the Frogs to a 14-17 overall record, and his 14 triumphs were the fourth-most wins by a first-year head coach in program history. Christian almost doubled the average amount of victories of 7.3 wins for a first-year Frogs' head coach in his inaugural campaign.

In addition, Christian became the third coach in program history to win his first game as head coach with the Frogs after TCU defeated Western Michigan by a 67-63 count at the ESPN Charleston Classic. Christian guided the Frogs to some big victories during the 2008-09 campaign, including home triumphs over Wichita State, UNLV, SMU, Colorado State and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. The victory over UNLV was the Frogs' first win over the Runnin' Rebels since the 1998-99 season - a span of eight games.

Opposing teams found out very quickly that the Frogs' hard-nosed defensive mentality would become their calling card during games as TCU finished the 2008-09 campaign ranked 83rd in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 64.1 points per game. During a three-game stretch, the Frogs held SMU, St. Gregory's (Okla.) and Colorado to 46 or fewer points, which marked the first time since the 1951-52 season that this feat had been achieved. The Frogs also held St. Gregory's and Colgate to 40 or fewer points in a game, allowing 38 and 37 points - respectively.

The Frogs proved that they could put together a string of victories during the season as TCU notched their first six-game winning streak since the 1998-99 campaign and also recorded nine consecutive victories at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum for the first time in over a decade.

It became very apparent to those who watched Christian wander the Frogs' bench that there was a new attitude surrounding the program. With three returning players to go along with seven newcomers, the Frog faithful became more and more excited about the faces that were leading the new-born program.

A big reason for the success of the Frogs last season and their future success came in senior Kevin Langford, who became one of Christian's prized and most memorable players despite only coaching him for one season. Langford, who earned second team All-Mountain West Conference accolades, began to lay the foundation for the Frogs' path to a championship with his leadership and influence on and off the court.

In addition, the TCU faithful became extremely energized with a pair of newcomers in Zvonko Buljan and Ronnie "Tuffy" Moss. Buljan, a 6-9 forward, was selected as the Mountain West Conference Newcomer of the Year to go along with honorable mention accolades while Moss, a 6-2 guard, became the first freshman since 2001-02 to score over 300 points in a season.

THE KENT STATE DAYS

Christian came to TCU after serving as the head men's basketball coach at Kent State for six seasons where he won at least 20 games in each campaign. During his tenure, Christian collected a record of 138-58 for the highest-winning percentage (.704) in Mid-American Conference history.

In his six seasons as head coach of the Golden Flashes, Christian climbed to second place on the all-time career victories list at Kent State with 138, which was only 10 wins shy of the 148 wins set by Jim McDonald. However, it took McDonald over a decade to record 148 victories where Christian was on-pace to break that mark early in his seventh season as head coach.

THE OCTAGON DAYS

Prior to joining the Kent State coaching staff, Christian spent two years with Octagon Sports Marketing and Management in McLean, Va., as a college basketball talent evaluator. During his time with Octagon Sports Marketing and Management, Christian worked with over 20 NBA standouts where he conducted individual workouts with talents, including current NBA players Brendan Haywood, Jaque Vaughn and Chris Mihm.

THE PITT DAYS

Christian spent three seasons at the University of Pittsburgh - a member of the Big East Conference - where he served as an assistant coach under his former high school coach Ralph Willard, who is currently an assistant coach under Rick Pitino at the University of Louisville. During his time, Christian aided the development of Vontee Cummings, who was a two-time All-Big East Conference award winner and former NBA talent for the Philadelphia 76ers and Golden State Warriors.

THE MIAMI (OHIO) DAYS

Christian served as an assistant coach under former Miami (Ohio) and current Arizona State head men's basketball coach Herb Sendek during the 1995-96 campaign. The coaching staff put together by Sendek that season served as an all-star cast almost a decade later with three current NCAA Division I head coaches coming from that program in Christian, Sean Miller (Arizona) and Charlie Coles (Miami, Ohio) In his single season, the RedHawks recorded a 21-8 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in conference action. The RedHawks earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament during the 1995-96 season.

THE WESTERN KENTUCKY DAYS

Christian notched a pair of stops in Bowling Green, Ky., as a member of the Western Kentucky men's basketball program. Christian got his first taste of collegiate coaching under Willard as a part-time assistant coach for two campaigns. In his first two seasons, Western Kentucky notched a 35-25 record, including a 21-11 overall record during the 1991-92 campaign.

THE ST. FRANCIS (PA.) DAYS

Christian's first full-time assistant coaching position came at St. Francis (Pa.) - a member of the Northeast Conference - under Tom McConnell. In his two seasons with the Red Flashes, he guided the development of two-time All-Northeast Conference performers Deon George and Jason Roberts.

THE PLAYING DAYS

A native of Bethpage, New York, Christian was an all-state guard at St. Dominic High School while playing under Willard. Following his prep career, Christian was recruited by current Louisville head men's basketball coach Rick Pitino at Boston University where he played two seasons before transferring to Rhode Island.

OFF THE COURT

Christian and his wife, Patty, were married in the summer of 2005, and have three children, MacKenzie (12), Zach (3) and the newest addition Jay, who was born on November 7, 2009.

TOO TUFF TO HANDLE

- TCU sophomore Ronnie "Tuffy" Moss originally signed with Kent State, but was granted his release and signed with the Frogs after Christian was announced as the new head men's basketball coach in the Spring of 2008.
- Moss posted a career-high 26 points on 9-of-17 shooting, including five three-pointers, to go along with six assists, five rebounds, two steals and one blocked shot in 32 minutes of action in TCU's 74-69 victory over Mid-America Christian. The TCU sophomore became the first player since Junior Blount in 2002 to post 25 or more points in the season opener.
- The TCU sophomore is averaging 16.2 points per game and has posted a double-digit scoring performance in 10 of 12 games this season. In addition, Moss has recorded four 20-plus scoring performances and ranks fourth in the Mountain West Conference and 189th in the country in scoring average (16.2 P-G).
- Moss is also ranked second in the country in assists per game (7.2 A-G) behind only Siena's Ronald Moore (8.0 A-G). The TCU sophomore is ranked first in the Mountain West Conference in assists per game (7.2 A-G) and has dished out at least five assists in all 12 games, including two double-digit assist performances (12 vs. Texas State | 11 vs. St. Gregory's).
- The Fort Worth standout posted his first career double-double in a triple overtime victory over Texas State after collecting 18 points and 12 assists. Moss became the first TCU player to post a double-double in points and assists since Corey Santee notched 20 points and 12 assists on Nov. 28, 2001 against Southwest Texas State (now known as Texas State).
- Moss reached a milestone in the Frogs' last outing on the road at Houston when he scored his 500th career point in only his 42nd career game. The 6-2 guard has established himself as one of the top players in the conference, ranking first in assists per game (7.2 A-G), second in minutes played (33.9 MP-G) and fourth in three-pointers (2.3 3FGM-G) and scoring average (16.2 P-G).

BULJAN RANKED AMONG LEAGUE'S BEST

- Senior Zvonko Buljan became the first player in program history to earn Preseason First Team All-Mountain West Conference accolades as voted on by the coaches and media. In addition, Buljan was selected as a Preseason First Team All-Mountain West Conference award winner by two publications in CBS Sportsline and Blue Ribbon Basketball Yearbook.
- The TCU forward has posted four double-doubles this season, including a 22-point and 16-rebound performance in the Frogs' season opener against Mid-America Christian. In the first game of the Preseason NIT, Buljan posted his second straight double-double with a 14-point and career-high 17-rebound effort against Cal State Northridge.
- Buljan is currently ranked 40th in the country and second in the Mountain West Conference in rebounds per game (9.3 R-G). In addition, the 6-9 forward is ranked first in the conference in defensive rebounds per game (6.8 R-G) and eighth in offensive rebounds per game (2.5 R-G). The TCU senior has recorded at least six rebounds in all 12 games this season.
- The TCU senior posted a scoring milestone in the second half of the Frogs' game against 23rd-ranked Texas Tech when he collected his 500th career point. In 43 career games with the Frogs, Buljan is averaging 13.1 points and 8.3 rebounds per game.
- Buljan has recorded 10 double-digit scoring performances this season, including three 20-plus scoring efforts. The TCU senior collected a career-high 29 points on 11-of-16 shooting, including four three-pointers, on the road at Wichita State. In back-to-back games, Buljan notched career-highs in scoring against Texas Tech (24 points) then Wichita State (29 points).
- Buljan became the first player in the Mountain West Conference this season to reach 100 rebounds on the season. The TCU forward is the only player in the conference to have at least 180 points and 100 rebounds on the season.

HAIL TO THE CHIEF

- Upon capturing the Northeastern Prep School Championship at Bridgton Academy, Ronnie Moss and Greg Hill took a tour of the White House in Washington, D.C. Even though President George W. Bush was unable to meet with the team during their visit, Moss and Hill were able to get their picture taken with an up-and-coming Senator from Illinois named Barack Obama.

CENTURY MILESTONE

- The Frogs scored 108 points in a triple overtime victory over Texas State on Nov. 24, 2009, which marked the first time that TCU has surpassed the 100-point milestone since Jan. 4, 2003. In that game, the Frogs scored 102 points against Centenary. In addition, this is also the first time that TCU has scored 108 points in a game since Jan. 5, 2002, against South Florida.

SCORING TOPS

- Currently, the Frogs are the only team in the Mountain West Conference to have three players ranked in the top-10 in scoring average in Moss (4th | 16.2 P-G), Buljan (6th | 15.3 P-G) and Ruzgas (6th | 15.3 P-G). The only other conference program to have more than one player ranked in the top-10 is New Mexico (Darington Hobson, 3rd | Roman Martinez, 5th).

FROGS INCREASE SCORING MARK

- This season, the Frogs are averaging 74.8 points per game, which ranks them fifth in the Mountain West Conference. The Frogs have tallied 70 or more points in eight of 12 games. Last season, TCU collected 70 or more points on seven occasions. The last time that TCU averaged over 74.0 points per game through the first 12 contests of the season came during the 2002-03 campaign when the Frogs averaged 81.2 points per game.

BEYOND THE ARC

- Edvinas Ruzgas was selected as the Mountain West Conference Player of the Week on Dec. 21 after scoring a career-high 32 points, including seven three-pointers, in a home victory over St. Gregory's. The TCU senior is averaging 15.3 points per game this season, including nine double-digit scoring performances and four 20-plus scoring efforts.
- The TCU senior is currently ranked second in the Mountain West Conference in field goal percentage (.560 | 65-of-116), third in three-pointers (2.6 3FGM-G), fourth in three-point field goal percentage (.437 | 31-of-71), fifth in minutes played per game (31.6 MP-G) and sixth in scoring average (15.3 P-G).
- In TCU's triple-overtime victory over Texas State, Ruzgas finished with 20 points on 8-of-10 shooting, including 4-of-5 from behind the three-point line, in addition to grabbing seven rebounds in a career-high 49 minutes of action. On the road at SMU, Ruzgas collected 20 points on 7-of-10 shooting to go along with a career-high seven rebounds in 33 minutes of action.
- Ruzgas has connected on 50.0 percent or higher of his total field goal attempts in eight of 12 games this season and currently ranks 21st in the country in three-point field goal percentage (.437 | 31-of-71) and 30th in field goal percentage (.560 | 65-of-116).
- Ruzgas connected on seven three-pointers against St. Gregory's, which is the fifth-highest total in TCU single-game history. In addition, his seven three-pointers were the second-most in the Mountain West Conference (behind New Mexico's Roman Martinez, who connected on eight treys against San Diego). The TCU senior has connected on at least one three-pointer in 10 or 12 games this season and tallied at least three three-pointers in five of 12 games.
- The TCU senior is coming up on a scoring milestone as Ruzgas only needs eight points to reach the 500-point milestone. During his TCU career, Ruzgas is averaging 11.4 points per game and has posted a double-digit scoring performance in 24 of 43 games.

TCU MILESTONE

- In the Frogs' 108-99 triple overtime victory over Texas State, Ronnie Moss and Kevin Butler became the first set of TCU teammates to post their first-ever double-double in the same game. A pair of sophomores, Moss finished with 18 points and 12 assists while Butler collected 13 points and 11 rebounds.

NEW TO THE TCU SCHEDULE

- The Frogs will square-off against three opponents that they have never faced before in Mid-America Christian (Nov. 13th), Cal State Northridge (Nov. 16th) and Northern Colorado (Dec. 30th).

HOME COURT SUCCESS

- The Frogs have notched 413 triumphs in the 49-year history of Daniel-Meyer Coliseum and have posted a winning percentage of .631 (413-242) on their home court. The Frogs played their 650th game at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum on Nov. 13th where TCU posted a 74-69 victory over Mid-America Christian University.
- Over the past 15 seasons, the Frogs have accumulated a 165-70 (.702) overall record at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum while posting at least 10 victories on their home court on 11 occasions.

AROUND THE NATION

- The Frogs have five scholarship players from the State of Texas, which is the lowest number of home state scholarship players since the 1998-99 season when TCU had two players from the State of Texas. Moss (Fort Worth) and Butler (Duncanville) are natives of the Metroplex while Lancon (Houston), Roberson (Houston) and Green (Missouri City) are all from the Houston area.

STRONG FAMILY TREE

- The Frogs have three players who have family ties to professional and collegiate backgrounds in Thorns, Green and Bavcevic.
- Thorns' father, Henry, was a standout on the football field for UNLV before playing professionally in the Canadian Football League.
- Thorns' cousin, C.J. Watson, played four seasons at the University of Tennessee where he graduated ranked second in program history in assists and steals. Currently, Watson is a member of the Golden State Warriors.
- Green's brother, Gerald Jr., went directly from high school to the NBA and was drafted by the Boston Celtics with the 18th overall selection in the 2005 NBA Draft. Currently, Green is playing professionally in Russia.
- Bavcevic's father, Niksa, is the head coach for TROGIR ZP, which is one of the best teams in Croatia's A-1 League.

HORNED FROG 500

- The Frogs have had two players reach their 500th career point in Zvonko Buljan (Dec. 8 vs. Texas Tech) and Ronnie Moss (Dec. 23 vs. Houston). In addition, Edvinas Ruzgas (492) and Keion Mitchem (443) are both within striking distance of 500.

NON-CONFERENCE; NO PROBLEM AT HOME

- Over the last four seasons, the Frogs have posted a 25-6 overall record (.806 winning percentage) against non-conference opponents at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. Below is a breakdown of the Frogs' non-conference home record over the last four seasons:

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- The Frogs have five international players on the roster this season in Zvonko Buljan (Croatia), Edvinas Ruzgas (Lithuania), Marin Bavcevic (Croatia), Cheick Kone (Africa) and Nikola Cerina (Serbia). This is the most international players that TCU has ever had on its roster at one time. In each of the last six seasons, the Frogs have had at least two international players on the roster.
- The Frogs are currently tied for third among all NCAA Division I programs in most international players on their roster with five. TCU is tied with Gonzaga, Hawai'i, Valparaiso, Stetson and St Mary's (Calif.) while New Mexico State and Northeastern both lead the country with six international players on their rosters.
- Buljan and Bavcevic are both from Split, Croatia, and were members of the same junior team their prep careers. Bavcevic's father, Niksa, is the head coach of TROGIR ZP basketball team in Croatia's A1 League.
- Cheick Kone is only the second player from the continent of Africa to join the TCU men's basketball team. The first player from Africa to play for the Frogs was Femi Ibikunle (2004-07), who was a native of Lagos, Nigeria.
- Even though the Frogs have five international players on the roster, four of them attended school in the United States before joining the TCU men's basketball team. Buljan went to junior college at Vincennes University in Indiana while Kone attended Howard College in Texas. Ruzgas went to high school in Virginia before playing junior college ball down the road from TCU in Weatherford. Bavcevic went to high school in North Carolina before attending TCU.
- The Frogs have the most international players on their roster among all Mountain West Conference programs. Wyoming has four international players followed by UNLV (2), Utah (2), BYU (2) while Colorado State and San Diego State each have one. In all, there are 17 international players in the Mountain West Conference.

I'VE SEEN YOU BEFORE

- The Frogs have two sets of teammates that have played together before joining the TCU men's basketball team. Ronnie Moss and Greg Hill both attended Bridgton Academy in Maine where they guided their prep school team to the Northeastern Prep School Championship during the 2006-07 campaign. Buljan and Bavcevic were both teammates during junior league in Croatia.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREE'S

- The Frogs have made at least one three-pointer in 353 consecutive games dating back to the 1997-98 campaign. The last time that TCU failed to connect on a three-point came against LIU-Brooklyn on November 22, 1997.
- The Frogs have connected on at least one three-pointer in 570 of their last 571 games. Prior to a failed connection against LIU-Brooklyn, TCU made at least one three-pointer in 217 consecutive games dating back to the 1989-90 season when the University of Texas held the Frogs without a three-pointer on February 11, 1990.

ON A TREY

- This season, the Frogs are ranked 22nd in the country in three-pointers per game (8.3 3FGM-G) and second in the Mountain West Conference. The Frogs are also ranked first in the Mountain West Conference in three-point field goal attempts per game, averaging 24.5 three-pointers per evening.
- The Frogs have attempted at least 30 three-pointers on three occasions this season (St. Gregory's | Mid-America Christian | Colgate). In addition, the Frogs have the highest single-game mark in the Mountain West Conference this season with 33 three-point field goal attempts against St. Gregory's. The Frogs have connected on at least seven three-pointers in 10 of 12 games.

SEE YOU IN THE 2010-11 SEASON

- The Frogs will have two new additions for the 2010-11 campaign in transfer Hank Thorns and freshman Amric Fields.
- Thorns will sit out the 2009-10 campaign due to NCAA Transfer Rules after coming to the Frogs' program from Virginia Tech. A two-year letterman for the Hokies, Thorns dished out a Virginia Tech freshman record 113 assists during the 2007-08 season, which was a mark previously held by Bimbo Coles. During his rookie season, the 5-9 point guard ranked sixth in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio and 10th in assists per game then guided the Hokies to an appearance in the semifinals of the 2009 NIT.
- A product of Putnam City West High School, Fields ranks as one of the best interior players in the State of Oklahoma after averaging 14.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 4.0 blocked shots per game during his junior campaign. The 6-9 center was selected as the Metro Atlantic Conference Defensive Player of the Year and secured all-conference accolades last season. The newly-inked TCU Frog also garnered All-District 8 recognition last season.

HE'S SEEN IT HALL

- TCU Director of Sports Medicine Chris Hall has spent 27 seasons on the bench for the Frogs, including 25 seasons as their full-time athletic trainer and two seasons as a student trainer. During his time, the Frogs have posted a 448-386 overall record.

EXTRA FRAMES

- The Frogs have posted an all-time record of 44-59 (.427) in overtime games and 33-27 (.550) in overtime games at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. TCU is a combined 4-0 in games that last past two overtimes in its history.

TALE OF TWO HALVES

- Since Jim Christian took over the reigns of the TCU men's basketball program, the Frogs have posted a 15-2 overall record when holding the lead heading into intermission. Last season, the Frogs were 10-1 when holding the halftime advantage, and currently TCU is 5-1 during the 2009-10 campaign when leading at halftime.

SIX SHOOTERS

- The Frogs will return six lettermen from a season, which ties for sixth in the Mountain West Conference. The Air Force Academy returns a conference-high 12 lettermen followed by Colorado State (10), BYU (9), San Diego State (7), Utah (7), TCU (6), New Mexico (6), UNLV (6) and Wyoming (5).

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Zvonko Buljan has recorded 13 double-doubles for his career, which is tops among all returning players in the Mountain West Conference. In addition, the TCU forward has collected seven double-doubles in Mountain West Conference action, which is one more than BYU's Jonathan Tavernari, who has recorded six during his conference career.
- The TCU forward has nearly missed a double-double in three other games by either a basket or rebound: SMU (14 points | 9 rebounds), Texas State (17 points | 9 rebounds) and Nebraska (8 points | 8 rebounds).

NEW FACES; NEW TEAM; SAME MAIN INGREDIENT

- A key ingredient that Christian looks for when building his roster is finding and signing players from winning high school and junior college programs. This past signing class was no exception for Christian as all six players were part of teams that recorded at least 19 victories a season ago. During the 2008-09 campaign, the six newcomers to the TCU men's basketball program helped their programs to a 140-53 combined record (.725 winning percentage).

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

- Keion Mitchem is the only four-year player on the Frogs' roster this season. A signee under former TCU head men's basketball coach Neil Dougherty, Mitchem has appeared in team-high 87 games, including a career-high 31 games last season. During his career, the TCU guard has started in 23 career games, including four games this season.
- Mitchem is set to graduate from TCU in May 2010 with a degree in communications. When the Rochester, N.Y., native walks across the stage to receive his diploma, he will become the first member of his family to graduate from college.
- The TCU senior needs 57 points to reach the 500-point milestone for his career. This season, Mitchem is averaging 4.1 points, 2.3 rebounds, 1.2 assists and 0.8 steals per game in 19.3 minutes per contest. Mitchem posted a season-high 12 points in the first round of the Preseason NIT against Cal State Northridge and nine points on the road at Nebraska.

IN THEIR LAST OUTING

- In their last outing, the Frogs dropped a 105-81 decision on the road at the University of Houston on Dec. 23. In that contest, the Cougars connected on 56.5 percent (39-of-69) of their field goal attempts compared to 46.8 percent (29-of-62) for the Frogs.
- The Cougars were led by the nation's leading scorer in Aubrey Coleman, who finished with 33 points (including 26 in the second half of action) while Kelvin Lewis chipped in with 25 points and Adam Brown added 21 points to pace Houston.
- Ronnie Moss led the Frogs with 23 points to go along with seven assists while Zvonko Buljan added 13 points and six rebounds. Edvinas Ruzgas collected 12 points in the game, and Greg Hill added 11 points for the Frogs.

THE GREEN MILE

- In his first season with the Frogs, Garlon Green has recorded four double-digit scoring performances, including a career-high 18 points in 29 minutes of action against Texas State. In the triple overtime victory over the Bobcats, Green connected on 10-of-14 attempts from the free throw line to go along with eight rebounds and one assist.
- The 6-7 freshman made his first collegiate start against SMU as part of the State Farm DFW Duel where he saw action in 14 minutes in a victory over the Mustangs. Green currently ranks first on the team in free throw percentage (.771), third in free throws made (27) and free throw attempts (35) and fifth in scoring average (6.1 P-G).
- Green posted his fourth double-digit scoring performance of the season with 10 points in a home victory over St. Gregory's. In addition, the TCU freshman notched 10 points, including 4-of-4 at the free throw line, to go along with four rebounds and one blocked shots against 23rd-ranked Texas Tech.
- The TCU freshman posted a career-high 10-of-14 from the free throw line against Texas State. His 14 free throw attempts are tied for second-most in a game among all players in the Mountain West Conference.

THE BUTLER DID IT!

- Kevin Butler is currently ranked first in the Mountain West Conference in offensive rebounds per game (3.5 R-G) and ninth in rebounds per game (5.8 R-G). The Duncanville, Texas, native is also ranked second on the team in rebounds per game and has recorded at least six rebounds on six occasions.
- The 6-4 forward recorded his first career double-double in a triple overtime victory over Texas State where Butler finished with a career-high 13 points and 11 rebounds. Butler also posted career-highs in that game in minutes played (42), field goals made (5), field goal attempts (9), rebounds (11) and points (13).
- Butler has recorded 70 total rebounds this season with 42 of them coming on the offensive glass. In addition, Butler has recorded 11 rebounds on two occasions (Mid-America Christian | Texas State) and collected nine rebounds in a home victory over St. Gregory's. The TCU sophomore has collected at least six points and six rebounds in five of 11 games this season.
- This season, Butler is averaging 25.6 minutes per game (up from 17.3 minutes a season ago) and ranks fourth on the team in court time. The 6-4 forward has seen action in at least 20 minutes in nine of 12 games this season and has posted at least 30 minutes on four occasions.

KING OF THE HILL

- Greg Hill scored a career-high 17 points, including four three-pointers and 5-of-6 shooting at the free throw line, in 31 minutes of action against Wichita State. The TCU junior has recorded four double-digit scoring performances this season after scoring 11 points against Nebraska (away), Texas State (home) and Houston (away).
- In his first season with the program, Hill is ranked fourth on the team in total points (79) and scoring average (6.6) and has posted at least five points in eight of 12 games. In addition, Hill is ranked fourth on the team in three-point field goals made (12) and three-point field goal attempts (47) and has connected on at least one three-pointer in eight of 12 games.
- Hill is averaging 20.9 minutes per game, which leads all TCU newcomers, and ranks fifth on the team this season. The Gary, Indiana, native has seen action in at least 20 minutes in eight of 12 games, including a career-high 31 minutes on two occasions.

HEY EVERYBODY, IT'S NIKO

- Freshman Nikola Cerina made his first collegiate start for the Frogs against SMU as part of the State Farm DFW Duel. The TCU newcomer has appeared in all 12 games where he is averaging 3.2 points, 3.0 rebounds and a team-high 0.7 blocked shots per game. The 6-9 freshman is averaging 15.3 minutes per game and has seen action in at least 15 minutes on six occasions.
- A native of Topola Oplenac, Serbia, Cerina is the first-ever international true freshman to play for the Frogs. Every international player that has appeared on the Frogs' roster has gone to either high school, prep school or junior college in the United States.
- Cerina posted a career-high 10 points to go along with four rebounds and three blocked shots against Louisiana Tech and added seven points and three rebounds in a victory over Colgate. The TCU newcomer posted a career-high nine rebounds to go along with eight points in a home victory over St. Gregory's.

NO THREE FOR YOU!

- Over the last six games, the Frogs have held opponents to 23.7 percent (24-of-101) shooting from behind the three-point line. During that stretch, the Frogs held Louisiana Tech (1-of-13), SMU (0-of-13), Texas Tech (3-of-10) and St. Gregory's (2-of-19) to less than 30 percent from behind the three-point arc. In all, TCU has held seven foes to less than 30 percent shooting from three.
- The Frogs are currently ranked 26th in the country in three-point field goal defense, allowing opponents to connect on 29.3 percent (66-of-225) of their field goal attempts. In addition, the Frogs are ranked first in the Mountain West Conference in that category and have held opponents to fewer than three three-pointers in six of 12 games this season.
- The Frogs held SMU to zero three-point field goals in their road victory on Dec. 2, which marked the first time in 492 games that TCU held an opponent to zero three-pointers. The last time came against Louisiana Tech on Jan. 3, 1994, when the Bulldogs finished the game 0-of-4 from behind the three-point line.

CALL TO DUTY

- This season, three walk-ons have seen action in their first-ever game donning the Purple and White in Marin Bavcevic, Tory Woods and Zach Huie. Bavcevic has appeared in two games while Woods and Huie made their collegiate debuts in a home victory over St. Gregory's. Woods scored his first career points against the Cavaliers.
