Mayor **Michael Nutter** and comedian **Bill Cosby** (Temple '61) will participate in the coin toss. Nutter will present the Mayor's Cup trophy to the winning team following the contest.

The Owls' radio broadcast will air on WHAT 1340 AM with **Harry Donahue** calling the play-by-play and Steve Joachim providing color analysis. All-MACcess will carry live video streaming of the game. Live gametracker stats and video streaming will be available on the Temple Athletics website at [www.OwlsSports.com](http://www.OwlsSports.com).

Under the direction of fourth-year head coach **Al Golden**, Temple football continues to grow and prosper. The 2009 squad, featuring Golden's first recruiting class as seniors, returns 21 starters to 17 positions. The Owls utilize an East Coast offense and 4-3 defense.

Recording the program's most wins in 18 years last fall, Golden guided the Owls to five wins and a second-place finish in the Mid-American Conference East Division in 2008.

Villanova, a member of the Football Championship Subdivision Colonial Athletic Association, is under the tutelage of 30th-year coach **Andy Talley**. Ranked as high as No. 5 nationally in preseason FCS polls, the Wildcats return 15 starters to its multiple spread offense and 4-2-5 defense.

**TEMPLE-VILLANOVA CONNECTIONS**

Head coach **Andy Talley** has been involved with the National Bone Marrow Donor Drive since 1992. In 2008, he enlisted 26 collegiate football teams to join the cause. **Al Golden** and the Temple Owls helped in the effort, shattering the national record by a collegiate team with 630 potential donors. Like the Wildcats, the Owls continue a bone marrow donor drive each spring.

**TEMPLE-VILLANOVA— THE SERIES**

Thursday's game marks the 30th meeting between the Owls and the Wildcats since 1908, renewing a 101-year old cross-town rivalry after a six-year hiatus. The game is the first in a series of four Mayor's Cup games. The teams are also slated to play again in 2010, 2011, and 2012. The Wildcats hold a 15-12-2 series advantage.

After the teams' first meeting in 1908 (a 12-0 Villanova win at an unknown site), the teams did not meet again until 1928. TU and VU played 16 consecutive seasons from 1928 to 1943. After a 27-year hiatus, the schools met again in 1970 and proceeded to play every season thereafter until 1980. The Wildcats have won the last two meetings, while the Owls won seven of the prior eight meetings from 1972-79.

During the teams' last outing— Temple's first-ever home game at Lincoln Financial Field on Sept. 6, 2003— Villanova claimed a wild 23-20 double overtime win. Trailing 7-0 at halftime, the Wildcats converted two field goals in the final four minutes of regulation to force overtime before 30,090 fans. Both squads made touchdowns in their first overtime drives. Temple missed a 47-yard field goal attempt. VU then won on a 37-yard field goal.

#### WATCH OUT FOR NEBLETT

Temple senior NT **Andre Neblett** (Rahway, N.J.) has been named to the Football Writers Association of America's watch lists for the 2009 Bronko Nagurski Trophy, presented annually to the nation's best defensive player, and the 2009 Outland Trophy, presented annually to the nation's best interior lineman.

A preseason first-team All-MAC pick by *Phil Steele's College Football and Athlon*, Neblett is a three-year starter at nose tackle for the Owls. A two-time All-Mid-American Conference honoree, he started all 36 games of his career. Last fall, Neblett finished the season with 36 tackles, 7.5 for a loss, two forced fumbles, a recovery, and a sack. He is also a candidate for the Rotary Lombardi Award.

#### PRESEASON HONORS

#### FIRST CLASS

In celebration of the ascension of Al Golden's first recruiting class to senior status, the Temple Owls have utilized the theme of "First Class" this season in all of their promotional materials. During Golden's first two seasons (2006, 2007), Temple fielded the youngest team in the nation.

#### USA TODAY COACHES' POLL

Beginning this season, Temple head coach **Al Golden** is a voting member on the weekly the *USA Today* Coaches' Poll. He is one of 59 Division I-A coaches on the panel representing the American Football Coaches Association.

#### NEW ADDITIONS

Strolling the sidelines this fall are two new coaches. Taking over the defensive line is **Randy Melvin** (Eastern Illinois '82). He rejoined the collegiate coaching ranks after four years with the Cleveland Browns.

**Bill Griggs** (Virginia '84) is in his first season as the graduate assistant coach for the offense. A 1984 draft pick by the New York Jets, he played tight end professionally from 1984 to 1990.

#### COUNTDOWN TO 400TH WIN

Temple enters the 2009 season, its 111th season of football, with 398 wins (overall record is 398-539-52). The Owls need just two victories to record the 400th win in school history.

#### 1000 GAMES

Temple's final home game with Kent State on Nov. 21 will be the 1000th football game in school history. The Owls began football in 1894 with a 15-6 win over Philadelphia Dental College.

#### INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Four Temple Owls are members of a unique class— American football players who were born in foreign lands. Junior DT **Grigory Frenk** (Brooklyn, N.Y.) was born in the Ukraine, while freshman DB **Mina Gould** (Kailua, Hawai'i) was born in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Junior LB **Amara Kamara** (Newark, N.J.) was born in Liberia, and senior LB **James Namude** (Potomac, Md.) was born in Kampala, Uganda. Utah State has the nation's most internationally born football players with six.

### NAME GAME

Several Owls share the same last name. Four players' sir name is **Brown**— freshman DT **Levi** (Bethlehem, Pa.), junior OL **Marcus** (Upper Marlboro, Md.), freshman WR **Matt** (Baltimore, Md.), and sophomore DE **Morkeith** (Harrisburg, Pa.). The Browns are not related.

TE **Richard Fricke** and WR **James Nixon** each have five siblings. Five Owls have four siblings— **Matt Brown, Justin Gildea, Simon Ogunleye, Deonte Parker, and Matt Paul.**

### UP NEXT

Temple enjoys a 16-day break before traveling to nationally ranked Penn State on Sept. 19. Kickoff is set for Noon at Beaver Stadium on the Big Ten Network. The Owls return home to Lincoln Financial Field on Sept. 26 to host Buffalo in the Mid-American Conference opener. Kickoff is Noon on ESPN Plus.

### CHARLTON TO START AT QUARTERBACK

After sitting out last season, redshirt junior **Vaughn Charlton** (Landenberg, Pa.) has been named the Owls' starting quarterback for the opener with Villanova.

In his last action in 2007, the 6-4, 235-lb. signal caller played in seven games with four starts. He finished the season 78-of-137 for 808 yards and three touchdowns.

Charlton will be backed up by redshirt sophomores **Chester Stewart** (Hanover, Md.) and **Mike Gerardi** (Parsippany, N.J.). Stewart played in 11 games with three starts under center last fall. He went 53-of-106 for 524 yards and four touchdowns. Gerardi enrolled at TU in January 2008 and joined the team as a walk-on that spring. He redshirted last fall.

### SOLID AS A ROCK

Temple's offensive line is solid as a rock, returning five starters with experience—senior LT **Devin Tyler**, sophomore LG **Wayne Tribue**, sophomore C **Sean Boyle**, sophomore RG **Steve Caputo**, and redshirt junior RT **Darius Morris**. Tribue and Caputo started in 2008 as true freshmen.

Adding depth will be **Pat Boyle**, **John Palumbo**, **Jeremy Schonbrunner**, **Colin Madison**, and **Darryl Pringle**, as well as freshmen **Cody Bohler**, **Simon Oguniye**, **Matt Paul**, **Sean Pearson**, **Evan Regas**, **Scott Roorda**, **Ryan Skotnicki**, and **Jeff Whittingham**.

### IN THE AIR TONIGHT

Senior **Jason Harper** (Budd Lake, N.J.) leads a plethora of wide receivers. He finished the 2008 campaign with 33 receptions for 571 yards and three touchdowns. Joining Harper are junior **Michael Campbell** (Edison, N.J.), junior **Delano Green**, and sophomore **James Nixon** (New Haven, Conn.). Freshmen **Matt Brown** and **Vaughn Carraway** (Laureldale, Pa.) are expected to make an immediate impact. Brown is listed as a starter on the depth chart.

### SEE SPOT RUN

Temple's backfield is stacked with experience. Leading the running backs is redshirt senior **Lamar McPherson**. The Philadelphia native played in 11 games last fall at fullback.

Sophomore **Kee-ayre Griffin** made a name for himself as a true freshman in 2008. He led the Owls in rushing with 394 yards on 96 carries for five touchdowns, scoring a TD in each of his first five games on offense.

Redshirt sophomore **Joe Jones** (Davie, Fla.) is ready for his second season in the Cherry & White. In 12 games last fall, Jones was second in the Owls' rushing efforts with 100 carries for 275 yards and a touchdown.

## SPECIAL TEAMS

### McMANUS BECOMES FIRST SCHOLARSHIPPED KICKER

Freshman **Brandon McManus** (Hatfield, Pa.) is the first kicker to be recruited for a scholarship under head coach Al Golden. The 6-3 Big 33 All-Star is expected to handle Temple's kickoff duties. As a senior for North Penn HS in 2008, McManus went a perfect 78-for-78 in PATs, while 68 of 80 kickoffs were touchbacks.

### WATHNE HANDLES PUNT DUTIES

Junior **Jeff Wathne** returns to his role as team punter. In 2008 he had 2,623 yards on 65 punts for a 40.4 average with 19 of those punts landing inside the 20. Seven were longer than 50 yards. He will also assist on kickoffs.

### BROWNELL KICKS FOR POINTS

Senior **Jake Brownell** will tackle Temple's field goals and extra points this fall. In 2008, he finished second in Owls' scoring with 52 points. He has 8-of-14 field goals and 28-of-31 extra points. A member of the President's Academic Honor Roll and University Honors Program, Brownell earned a scholarship with the Owls after initially joining the program as a walk-on.

### NATIONS BEST RETURNERS

After finishing first in the nation in kickoff returns in 2008, Temple has its work cut out for it this fall. Leading the charge are two of the team's quickest players—sophomores **Kee-ayre Griffin** and **Joe Jones**.

Jones and junior **Delano Green** will handle punt return. Last fall Green had eight returns for 120 yards. His punt return average yards per game (10.95) ranked 27th nationally.

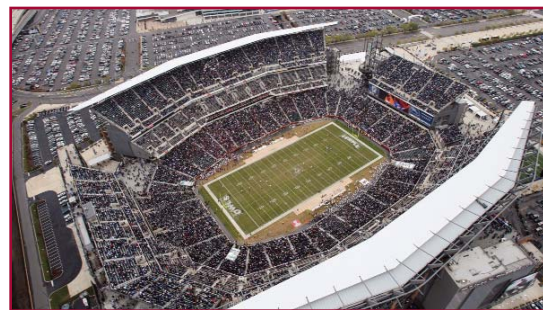

**ON THE SIDELINES**

**WELCOME TO OUR HOUSE**

Temple is one of seven Bowl Sub-division programs to share its home venue with an NFL franchise. Since it opened in the fall of 2003, the 68,532-seat Lincoln Financial Field has hosted the Temple Owls and the Philadelphia Eagles.



Temple celebrated the largest crowd in school history as 69,029 fans, marking the Owls' first sellout at The Linc, watched No. 25 Penn State and Temple on Nov. 10, 2007.

The previous largest crowd to attend a Temple home football game came on Oct. 1, 1988, when a sellout crowd of 66,592 fans went to Veterans Stadium for a clash with Penn State. Actually eight of Temple's top 10 attended home games came against the Nittany Lions.

In 2008, Temple hosted just five home games for a total of 77,909 fans (15,582 average). Mother Nature didn't help the Owls either. For each of the five home contests, the teams and fans endured heavy rains or frigid conditions.

#### **SMILE, YOU'RE ON CAMERA**

Six Temple University football games will be televised live this fall, including three contests carried nationally on ESPN and CBS College Sports Network. The most televised contests in program history were 10 games during the 2000 season.

#### **EARLY BIRDS**

For the second consecutive year under Al Golden, the Owl football team will conduct morning practice sessions. Temple practiced from 9:15 to 11:15 a.m. each weekday.

#### **IN THE COMMUNITY**

During the off-season, the Temple Owls continued their Owl Outreach program, giving back to the Philadelphia community with 100 percent student-athlete participation. During their free time, the players logged more than 1,000 hours of service last spring alone.

In April 2008, the Owls organized the largest bone marrow drive by a collegiate team, registering 630 potential donors. The team participated in the Partnership Field Day and the Diamond Street Cleanup while organizing a Thanksgiving food drive for two area homeless shelters.

Prior to the Ohio game last fall, the Temple players voted to donate their weekly per diem to the Philadelphia affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure. The coaches and staff contributed additional cash, while Temple Athletics also donated a minimum of 10 percent of its single-game ticket sales.

The team also assisted on the Komen three-day walk (during a game week). Players helped walkers unload their gear and set up their tents on Friday upon arrival at the camp site. On Sunday, beginning at 5 a.m., the players helped break down tents and load gear onto moving trucks.

A contingent of players visits children at St. Christopher's Hospital several times throughout the year. Teammates work the North Philly Aztecs Youth Football Camp each July. The Owls also volunteer with the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House, assisting with its volunteer barbecue and First Southwest Airlines Plane Pull. The Owls organize community service events each month.

For their efforts, the Owls received recognition for their service. At the Breakfast of Champions ceremony in April, the football team received the inaugural T.E.A.M. [Temple's Exceptional Acts for Mankind] Award for community service by the Temple Athletic Dept. In July, the team was awarded the 2009 Robert P. Levy Community Service Award from the Philadelphia Sports Congress.

Head Coach / Special Teams Coordinator  
Fourth Season at Temple

Al Golden, who has 12 postseason bowl games on his résumé, enters his fourth season as head football coach at Temple University in 2008. The Colts Neck, N.J. native was named the Owls' 24th head football coach on December 6, 2005, after spending the prior five seasons as defensive coordinator at the University of Virginia. The 40-year old Golden is the sixth-youngest head coach in college football's bowl subdivision.

In his third season, Golden guided the Owls to a 5-7 mark, the team's most wins most since 1990, and a second-place finish in the MAC East. Facing five opponents that went on to postseason play, the Owls persevered to new heights, despite losing three games on the very last play of the game.

In 2008, Golden saw five Owls earn All-MAC honors, including senior DT Terrance Knighton, Temple's first First-Team selection. Temple showed significant improvement on special teams, leading the nation in kickoff returns. The Owls out-scored their opponents for the season for the first time since 1990.

During his second season in 2007, Golden once again played the nation's most true freshmen (20) and started the nation's most true freshmen (12). He led the Owls to a 4-8 overall record and a 4-4 mark during their inaugural season in the Mid-American Conference.

Along the way, TU won three consecutive games. The fourth win tied Temple's mark for the most conference wins since 1967. Led by All-MAC players DT Andre Neblett and DB Dominique Harris, the Cherry & White defense led the MAC in total defense, red zone defense, and pass defense. The Owls' red zone defense ranked first nationally.

In his first campaign in

Owl Country, Golden played 22 true freshmen, the most in the nation, against the third most difficult schedule in the country. Only national champion Florida (10) and Stanford (9) played more bowl participants during the regular season than the Owls, who competed against eight teams that earned postseason berths. Thirty-eight players saw their first major college football action under Golden in 2006, including 27 freshmen.

Golden captured his first victory at the helm when the Owls defeated Bowling Green, 28-14, at Lincoln Financial Field on Oct. 28, 2006. The win was the largest accomplishment for the Owls on the field, but a multitude of goals were achieved off the field during Golden's initial campaign. Temple unveiled the most comprehensive academic support team in the Mid-American Conference and teamed with Adidas as the team's official outfitter. The program was also successful in assembling a regional, nonconference schedule for years to come.

Recruiting has also been a tremendous success under Golden's leadership. His initial signing class in 2006 was rated best in the MAC by CollegeFootballNews.com, while the 2007 and 2008 classes earned top honors in the league from Scout.com.

With a commitment to community service and academics at the core of Golden's program, a multitude of individual honors were bestowed upon the Owls in 2006.

Seven student-athletes were named to the 2006 Philadelphia Inquirer Academic All-Area Football team, providing

Temple the most honorees of the 10 Delaware Valley institutions that sponsor football. Three players were named to the 2006 Eastern College Athletic Conference Division I-A Football All Star Team, marking the most for the Owls on the ECAC squad since a trio also earned recognition in 1997.

In addition, three football student-athletes were named honorable mention freshman All-Americans by *The Sporting News*. It signaled the largest number of rookies to receive national recognition in program history.

Golden was named the youngest defensive coordinator in Division I-A by Virginia head coach Al Groh in January 2001 after spending the previous season at his alma mater, serving as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator under Joe Paterno. From 2001 to 2004, the Cavaliers' defense improved under his tutelage, ranking 108th in total defense in his first year to ranking 18th in total defense in 2004. In the same time period, Virginia's scoring defense went from 74th in the nation (27.6 ppg) to 17th (17.7 ppg) utilizing Golden's 3-4 scheme.

In addition to his responsibilities as defensive coordinator, Golden directed the inside linebackers from 2001-04 before shifting to the secondary in 2005. In 2004, he oversaw a

with the Buffalo Bills, and 2003 Hula Bowl participant Merrill Robertson. Following the 2001 season, Golden was an assistant coach for the Gray team in the 64th Annual Blue-Gray All-Star Football Classic.

Golden began his coaching career in 1993 as offensive coordinator at Red Bank (N.J.) Catholic High School. He then served as a graduate assistant under George Welsh at Virginia from 1994 to 1996, where he worked primarily with the linebackers and the kickoff and punting teams. He helped develop All-ACC linebackers James Farrow and Jamie

Ridge Riley Award, given annually to a player who displays excellence in scholarship, sportsmanship, friendship and leadership. As a junior in 1990, Golden played a key role in Penn State's nationally-televised 24-21 upset of No. 1-ranked Notre Dame at South Bend.

His touchdown reception late in the fourth quarter tied the score at 21 as Penn State rallied from a 21-7 deficit. Golden captained the Nittany Lions his senior year and helped lead them to a 42-17 win over Tennessee in the 1992 Fiesta Bowl. Following that victory, Penn State finished with an 11-2 record



defense that featured the nation's best group of linebackers, according to *Athlon*, *The Sporting News*, and *ESPN The Magazine*. Under his guidance, Ahmad Brooks blossomed into a finalist for the Butkus Award. In 2003, Brooks and Kai Parham earned Freshman All-America honors. Golden was responsible for recruiting Brooks, the *USA Today* National Defensive Player of the Year—the highest ranked recruit to ever attend UVa. Golden signed the Virginia High School Player of the Year in both 2002 (Brooks) and 2004 (Olu Hall).

During his first two seasons at Virginia, Golden helped develop two-time All-ACC linebacker Angelo Crowell, who currently plays

Sharper, both of whom were chosen in the 1997 NFL draft. Farrow was a first-round pick (#8) by the New York Jets, while Sharper was a second-round selection (#34) by the Baltimore Ravens. Golden then coached the linebackers at Boston College from 1997 to 1999 under Tom O'Brien. While at BC, Golden coached All-Big East and NFL linebackers Frank Chamberlin (Tennessee Titans) and Erik Storz (Jacksonville Jaguars). The Eagles finished the 1999 regular season with an 8-3 record and a top-25 national ranking, while making their first postseason bowl appearance since 1994.

Golden was a three-year (1989-91) letterwinner and two-year starter at tight end for Penn State, where he received the 1991

and ranked third in the nation in the final 1991 AP poll.

After his tenure as a player in State College, Golden spent one season in the NFL with the New England Patriots.

Golden, born July 4, 1969, earned his undergraduate degree in pre-law from Penn State in 1991 before receiving his master's in sports psychology from Virginia in December, 1996.

A 2004 inductee of the Jersey Shore Sports Hall of Fame, he is married to the former Kelly Elizabeth Hanna of Lock Haven, Pa. The couple has a four year-old son named AJ and a two-and-a-half year-old daughter named Addison.
