THE GAME

Auburn travels to Knoxville for the first time since 2004 to play Tennessee in the first road game of the season for the Tigers. The game will kick off at 6:45 p.m. CT and be televised nationally by ESPN.

AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ Auburn is looking to start a season 5-0 for the third time in the last six seasons and first time since 2006.
- ▶ Auburn has won 19 consecutive games overall and 11 consecutive games at Jordan-Hare Stadium with Gene Chizik on the coaching staff.
- ▶ Auburn has won four straight games against Tennessee, which ties the longest streak in series history for the Tigers.
- ▶ Auburn has come from behind to win in all four of its games this season.
- ▶ Auburn is third in the nation in scoring offense (45.3) and tied for third in total offense (526.3 yards per game).
- ▶ Auburn has scored 181 points this season, which is the most in the first four games of any season in school history, and just 27 points fewer than Auburn scored all of last year.
- ▶ Auburn has scored in every quarter this season, including touchdowns in 15 of 16 quarters, including 14 in a row.
- ▶ Auburn ranks sixth in the nation in rushing offense (261.3) and has two of the top four rushers in the SEC in Ben Tate (103.0 ypg) and Onterio McCalebb (91.2 ypg).
- ▶ Auburn has recorded four straight games of 400 or more yards of offense for the first time since the first four games of the 2000 season.
- ▶ Auburn is tied for eighth nationally in first downs (24.3) and has had at least 20 in all four games.
- ▶ Auburn is tied for fifth in the nation in turnover margin (+1.75), tied for fourth in interceptions (eight) and tied for fifth in turnovers forced (12).
- ▶ Chris Todd has nine touchdown passes in his last two games. Last year, Auburn had just seven touchdown passes as a team during the entire season.
- ▶ Todd ranks second in the nation in yards per completion (16.32), tied for third in TD passes (11) and sixth in passing efficiency (171.05).
- ▶ Senior Ben Tate ranks 17th nationally in rushing (103.0), and is ninth in school history with 2,371 career rushing yards.
- ▶ Senior defensive end Antonio Coleman has 17.0 career sacks, which ranks tied for sixth in Auburn history for career sacks.

AUBURN-TENNESSEE RIVALRY

Auburn and Tennessee played every year from 1956-91. The two teams didn't play from 1991 until the 1997 SEC Championship game because of the league expansion and the rotating opponents' setup. The two played in 1998 and 1999, and in 2003 and 2004 before rotating off each others schedule until 2008.

The two schools dominated the SEC in the mid-to-late '80's. In six of the eight seasons from 1983-90, either Auburn (1983-87-88-89) or Tennessee (1985-89-90) claimed an SEC Championship.

SERIES NOTES

Nine of the last 12 games in the series have been decided by 10 points or less ... Auburn's current four-game winning streak against Tennessee matches the Tigers' longest winning streak against the Vols in series history (1961-64) ... Auburn has averaged 28.5 points during its four-game winning streak against Tennessee ... Tennessee has only thrown three touchdown passes in the last six meetings ... Auburn has held Tennessee to fewer than 300 yards of total offense in each of the last three meetings ... This will be the first meeting since 1982 in which neither team is ranked, and prior to last year, the previous 13 meetings all included at least one top-10 team ... From 1956-1991, every meeting was on the last Saturday of September except in 1968.

MEMORABLE AU-UT GAMES

1956--The Modern Auburn-Tennessee series begins in Birmingham over the objections of Vol AD Gen. R.R. Neyland. Johnny Majors, who would finish second in the Heisman Trophy balloting, led Tennessee to a 35-7 win over Auburn before a crowd of 44,258.

1957--In its first trip to Knoxville since 1939, Auburn was expected to be little match for Tennessee, the defending SEC champions. Yet, the Tigers won 7-0 and started their march toward the National Championship.

1958--Defending National Champion Auburn 13, Tennessee 0 in Birmingham. Tennessee made no first downs and was held to minus 30 yards of total offense. Lindsey Nelson and Red Grange described it to the nation on NBC-TV.

1959--Tennessee ended Auburn's 24-game unbeaten streak with a 3-0 upset victory at Knoxville. Time and time again, the Tigers assaulted the Tennessee goal line. Time and time again, Tennessee's Volunteers pushed them back. Cotton Letner's field goal won it for the Vols.

1961-63--Auburn fell behind by two touchdowns or more three years in a row, 0-21 in 1961, 0-14 in 1962, and 0-12 in 1963, only to storm back and win all three games, 24-21 in 1961, 22-21 in 1962 and 23-19 in 1963. The modern Auburn-Tennessee series had been born.

1965--Auburn defensive tackle Jack Thornton intercepts not one, but two passes as

1968--In the first Auburn-Tennessee game to be played at night, Auburn upsets the unbeaten Vols 28-14 in Birmingham. Halfback Mike Currier from Oneonta scored on three of his first four plays in the game.

1969--Vols jump to a big lead in Knoxville, 24-3 at the half, but Auburn, behind first-year quarterback Pat Sullivan, came storming back to cut the Vol lead to 24-19 in the fourth quarter. The Vols pull away, however, and won 45-19.

1970--Auburn overcame a 10-0 Tennessee lead and defeated the Vols 36-23 in Birmingham. It was the only loss of the year for Tennessee and cost the Vols an SEC Championship.

1971--Tennessee dominated Auburn for 58 minutes, but in the final two minutes, Pat Sullivan drove Auburn 86 yards for a touchdown and a 10-9 victory. The next day, Jack Doane of *The Montgomery Advertiser* wrote: "Blindfolded, hands tied behind his back, Pat Sullivan would be a one-point favorite at his own execution."

1973-74--Tennessee defeated Auburn 21-0 in Knoxville in a driving rainstorm. Tennessee punted on first down throughout the fourth quarter, infuriating Auburn coaches. At the end of the game, Auburn coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan refused to shake hands with Vol coach Bill Battle saying Battle refused to shake hands with him before the game. In 1974, Tennessee, reluctantly, made its first trip to Auburn. Auburn won, ironically by the same 21-0 score. Throughout the first quarter, Auburn fans chanted "Punt...Punt...Punt" whenever Auburn had a first down.

1977--Leads are never safe in the Auburn-Tennessee game. Tennessee jumped to a 12-0 lead in Johnny Majors' first SEC game as head coach of his alma mater, but Auburn won 14-12 when a Vol field goal attempt was wide right on the final play of the game.

1980--Tennessee defeated Auburn 42-0 before the then largest crowd in Auburn history. It was, perhaps, the darkest day in Auburn's long and glorious football history.

1983--Auburn, 20-7 losers to Texas a week earlier, came to Knoxville labeled as the SEC's disappointment of the year after only two games. Auburn reestablished itself with a 27-14 win over the Vols, highlighted by an 81-yard Trey Gainous punt return.

1985--Auburn went to Knoxville undefeated and ranked No. 1 in the nation. That ranking lasted as long as Tennessee's first possession. The Vols led 24-0 at the half and Auburn has not been ranked No. 1 since that day, Sept. 28, 1985.

1990--Proving once again that leads, big or small, do not hold up in the AU-UT series, Auburn spotted Tennessee a 17-point fourth quarter lead, 26-9, only to storm back to tie the game, 26-26. Tennessee missed a potential game-winning field goal with 15 seconds to play.

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

1991--A series that had been contested 35 consecutive years came to an end thanks to the expansion of the SEC from 10 schools to 12 and the formation of two divisions. Vol receiver Carl Pickens caught four balls for 172 yards, including TD receptions of 87 and 67 yards in Tennessee's 30-21 win.

1997--In the SEC Championship game in Atlanta, Auburn scored 20 unanswered points to take a 20-7 lead. Tennessee scored two touchdowns late in the third quarter and early in the fourth to win 30-29. Tennessee's Peyton Manning threw for 373 yards and four TDs, while Auburn signal caller Dameyune Craig passed for 262 yards and a pair of scores.

2004--Auburn raced to a 31-3 halftime lead en route to a 34-10 win over No. 10 Tennessee for the Tigers' first win in Neyland Stadium since 1983. Auburn QB Jason Campbell was 12 of 15 for 240 yards and two TD strikes in the first half. Safety Junior Rosegreen set a school record and tied an SEC mark with four interceptions in the game. The teams met again in the SEC Championship, with Auburn prevailing 38-28 behind Campbell's 374 yards passing and three TDs.

TENNESSEE QUICK HITTEES

Tennessee improved to 2-2 overall with a 34-23 win over Ohio last Saturday ... Tennessee was picked to finish fourth in the East by the media in the SEC Media Days poll ... The win over Ohio was the Vols' 500th all-time win in Knoxville ... Senior Montario Hardesty leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally averaging 121.3 yards rushing per game ... Tennessee ranks eighth nationally in total defense, allowing just 233.0 yards per game ... The Vols are 11th nationally in pass defense (146.0 yards per game) and 15th in rushing defense (87.0) ... Chris Walker is tied for second in the SEC with four sacks this season ... Junior middle linebacker Nick Reveiz, who entered the Ohio game ranked third on the team in tackles, suffered an apparent season-ending injury ... Freshman Nu'Keese Richardson is second in the SEC averaging 11.4 yards per punt return.

TENNESSEE TIGERS

The 2009 Auburn roster includes three players who hail from the state of Tennessee. Freshman Daren Bates is from Memphis, junior OL Mike Berry is from Antioch and sophomore OL A.J. Greene is from Madison.

ALABAMA VOLS

The 2009 Tennessee roster includes two players who hail from the state of Alabama. Freshman OL Carson Anderson is from Florence, redshirt freshman DE Willie Bohannon is from Mobile and senior DT Wes Brown is from Athens.

AU-UT CONNECTIONS

- ▶ Auburn assistant head coach/wide receivers coach Trooper Taylor was at Tennessee from 2004-07, coaching running backs from 2004-05 and serving as assistant head coach/player development/wide receivers coach from 2005-07.
- ▶ Tennessee special teams coordinator/running backs coach Eddie Gran served as Auburn's running backs coach and special teams coordinator from 1999-2008.
- ▶ Tennessee linebackers coach Lance Thompson coached the defensive line at Georgia Tech in 1998 when Auburn defensive coordinator Ted Roof coached Tech's linebackers. Thompson returned to Georgia Tech in 2001 to coach the defensive line while Roof was the defensive coordinator.
- ▶ Auburn special teams coordinator/tight ends coach Jay Boulware and Tennessee defensive backs coach Willie Mack Garza were teammates at the University of Texas from 1991-92, and both started their coaching careers at Texas from 1994-96 - Garza as a graduate assistant and Boulware first as a student assistant, then a graduate assistant in 1996.
- ▶ Auburn video coordinator Brent Thomas was a deep snapper for Tennessee from 1996-2000, and was a video graduate assistant for the Volunteers from 2002-03.

TIGERS AND VOLS ON TV

Saturday's game will mark the 15th straight meeting between Auburn and Tennessee that football fans will be able to watch on television.

FIVE STRAIGHT AT NIGHT

Auburn's game at Tennessee will be the fifth straight night game for the Tigers, marking the first time Auburn has ever played five consecutive games at night. In 2007, the Tigers played four of their first five games at night and eight overall, marking the most night games in a single season in school history. Auburn played just four night games all of last season.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn has an all-time record of 10-3-1 on Oct. 3. The Tigers last played on this date in 1998, also against Tennessee, falling 17-9 to the third-ranked Vols. Auburn has a 3-1 record on Oct. 3 when the Tigers are ranked, and is 1-1 when playing a ranked opponent. Auburn's biggest upset on Oct. 3 was a 13-0 shutout of No. 15 Ole Miss in 1953 in Auburn.

IN OCTOBER

Auburn, which just concluded its sixth consecutive winning month of September, is 287-146-18 (.656) all-time in the month of October. The Tigers are 23-9 (.719) in their last 32 games in October.

SEC SUCCESS

Auburn has won 29 of its last 41 Southeastern Conference games and 30 of its last 42 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back beyond 2004, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers have the fourth best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games, just 4.5 games behind the leader. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-08.

THE DRIVE FOR FIVE

Auburn will be looking to start the season with a 5-0 record with a victory at Tennessee. If the Tigers win, it would mark Auburn's third 5-0 start in the last six seasons (2006, 2004), and the seventh in the last 17 seasons. In the previous 18-year period from 1975-92, the Tigers only started 5-0 one time (1986).

CHIZIK'S STREAK

With a 4-0 start to his head coaching tenure at Auburn, Gene Chizik has now been a part of 19 consecutive victories as a member of the Auburn coaching staff. His final season as Auburn's defensive coordinator was during the Tigers' 13-0 2004 season, and Auburn also won its final two games in 2003.

Chizik, who has seen 12 straight wins at Jordan-Hare Stadium, also became the fifth consecutive Auburn head coach to win his debut with the Tigers, and the 24-point margin of victory over Louisiana Tech was the largest in an Auburn head coaching debut since Carl Voyles won his first game as Auburn's head coach by a 32-0 score over Samford in 1944.

TODD TERRIFIC

Senior quarterback Chris Todd is off to a blazing start to this season. He has established a career high in passing yards three times in four games, first with 255 yards against Louisiana Tech, then with 284 yards against West Virginia, then with 287 yards against Ball State. He also threw for what was then a career-best four scores against the Mountaineers, before tying the school record with five the next week against Ball State. Daniel Cobb is the only other Auburn player to throw for five scores, doing it against Louisiana Tech in 2001.

Todd is the first Auburn quarterback in history to throw at least four touchdown passes in consecutive games, and his nine TD passes in the last two weeks are two more than Auburn had as a team during the entire 2008 season.

Todd ranks second in the nation in yards per completion (16.32) and sixth nationally in passing efficiency (171.05). His 11 touchdown passes are tied for third most in the NCAA behind Texas Tech's Taylor Potts (13) and NC State's Russell Wilson (12).

RECORD-SETTING SCORING RUN

Auburn ranks third nationally in scoring offense at 45.3 points per game, and has scored 181 points this season, which is the most through the first four games of a season in school history. The previous high was 176 points in 1996. Auburn would need 38 points against the Vols to surpass the 5-game mark of 218 set in 1995.

The Tigers have also scored 40+ points in three straight games, marking the first time the Tigers have ever scored 40 or more points in three consecutive contests.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

Through four games, Auburn has already accumulated 181 points. The 181 points are more than Auburn scored in its first nine games combined last season, when the Tigers had 158 points after nine contests. In fact, Auburn needs just 27 points to match its point total from the entire 2008 season.

The Tigers also have 2,105 yards of offense already this year, which is more than the Tigers had in their first seven games combined last year (2,048).

EVERY QUARTER SO FAR

Auburn's offense has not only been explosive, it has been consistent. The Tigers have scored at least once in all 16 quarters this season, and have scored between 41 and 53 points for the season in each of the four quarters. In fact, Auburn has scored a touchdown in 15 of the 16 quarters played this year, including each of the last 14. The only quarter this season in which Auburn didn't reach the end zone was the second quarter of the season opener, when the Tigers settled for a field goal against Louisiana Tech.

The current streak is the Tigers' longest since 2005, when Auburn scored in 16 straight quarters during games 2-5.

POINTS BEFORE THE HALF

Auburn has been proficient at scoring points just before halftime, with scores in the last two minutes of the second quarter in all four games this season. In the season opener, Wes Byrum capped a quick three-play drive with a 49-yard field goal on the last play of the first half. Against Mississippi State, Auburn marched 78 yards on eight plays in just 1:13 before Kodi Burns scored on a 1-yard run with 16 seconds left in the half.

Against West Virginia, Darvin Adams' 4-yard TD catch with 1:34 left before halftime finished a 11-play, 68-yard drive in 3:24. Byrum connected from 32 yards out with seven seconds left in the half against Ball State after a nine-play, 49-yard drive.

OFFENSE KEEPS ON ROLLING

Auburn ranks tied for third nationally in total offense, averaging 526.3 yards per game. The Tigers started the season with back-to-back games of more than 500 yards, totaling 556 yards in the season opener against Louisiana Tech and 589 yards in the SEC opener against Mississippi State. It marked the first time Auburn had back-to-back games with at least 500 yards of offense since 1970, when the Tigers had 566 yards against Florida and 664 against Mississippi State.

Auburn totaled 400 yards Sept. 19 against West Virginia and 560 yards last Saturday against Ball State. It marks the first time Auburn has had four straight games with at least 400 yards of offense since the first four games of the 2000 season.

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

GAINING GROUND

Auburn ranks fifth nationally in rushing offense, averaging 261.3 yards per game. The Tigers collected 301 yards rushing against Louisiana Tech in the season opener before running for 390 yards against Mississippi State the following week. The last time Auburn had back-to-back games with at least 300 yards rushing was in 1985, when Auburn had three straight games with more than 300 yards rushing (Ole Miss, 438; Florida State, 413; Georgia Tech, 377).

DYNAMIC DUO

Auburn has two of the nation's top 31 rushers, including two of the top four in the SEC. Senior Ben Tate, who ranks ninth in Auburn history with 2,371 career rushing yards, averages 103.0 yards rushing per game, which is third in the league and 17th nationally. He needs just 441 more yards rushing to crack Auburn's all-time top five. Freshman Onterio McCalebb is fourth in the SEC and 31st nationally, averaging 91.3 yards rushing per game. McCalebb also ranks third in the SEC in all-purpose yards, averaging 131.0.

ADAMS EMERGES

Sophomore wide receiver Darvin Adams has emerged as Auburn's top target downfield, leading the team in catches (20), receiving yards (334) and touchdown receptions (five). Adams caught three touchdown passes against West Virginia, becoming the first Tiger to haul in at least three scores in a game since Alexander Wright caught four TD passes against Pacific in 1989. Adams, who entered the season with three catches for 18 yards during his career, ranks tied for third in the SEC in receptions per game (5.0) and third in receiving yards per game (83.5). His five receiving TDs are tied for the SEC lead.

SECOND-HALF SURGES

Auburn has been able to wear down its opponents in the second half of its games, helping the Tigers post a large scoring differential in the second half. Auburn holds a 94-58 scoring edge in the first half of its games this year, but has outscored its opponents 87-39 in the second half, including a 42-20 margin in the fourth quarter.

FIRST DOWN FLURRY

Auburn is currently eighth nationally in first downs per game, averaging 24.3. The Tigers had 27 in the season opener against Louisiana Tech, 29 Sept. 12 against Mississippi State, 20 against West Virginia Sept. 19 and 21 against Ball State last Saturday. Last season, Auburn only reached 20 first downs in a game twice all year, with a high of 26 against UT Martin. Auburn had not had as many as 27 first downs in a game since collecting 28 at Arkansas in 2005, and the last time Auburn had at least 29 first downs was in the 2004 SEC Championship game against Tennessee.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

Auburn's offense has excelled at both striking quickly and putting together sustained drives. The Tigers have had 14 scoring drives that used less than two minutes on the clock, including 12 that resulted in touchdowns. In 12 games last year, Auburn had just 10 scoring drives that took less than two minutes, and only six of those ended with touchdowns.

The Tigers also already have six scoring drives of at least 10 plays this season, including three that took 13 plays. Last year, Auburn only had two scoring drives all season that used at least 13 plays. In addition, all six of the Tigers' scoring drives against Mississippi State Sept. 12 covered at least 72 yards.

O-LINE PAVES THE WAY

Much of Auburn's offensive success can be attributed to the Tigers' offensive linemen. Tackles Andrew McCain and Lee Ziemba, guards Mike Berry and Byron Isom and center Ryan Pugh have a combined 78 starts under their belt. They have not only helped Auburn rank among the national leaders in scoring offense, total offense and rushing, but have allowed just two quarterback sacks this season, which ties for the national lead. Virtually the same group last year surrendered 21 sacks.

GOING FOR SIX IN THE RED ZONE

Auburn's offense has been efficient in the red zone, as the Tigers have not only scored on 14 of 15 possessions in the red zone (93.3), but 12 of the 14 scores have been touchdowns. Auburn's TD percentage of 80.0 ranks second in the SEC behind only Ole Miss, and six of the scores have come on the ground and six through the air.

BUSINESS AS UNUSUAL FOR MALZAHN

Auburn's gaudy offensive numbers are nothing new to first-year offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn. His Tulsa teams led the nation in total offense in both 2007 (543.9 yards) and 2008 (569.9). Last year's Tulsa team also led the country in third-down conversions (57.0 pct.) and yards per play (7.27). Two of the three previous college squads that he coached finished in the top 10 in the nation in rushing, as the 2008 Tulsa team ranked fifth (268.0 yards) and his 2006 Arkansas squad was fourth (228.5).

DEFENSE HOLDING TOUGH

It's easy to overlook the job Auburn's defense has done because of the offensive output, but the unit has excelled despite a rash of injuries. In addition to the 12 turnovers and eight interceptions forced by Auburn, the Tigers rank 28th in pass efficiency defense (101.26) and tied for 31st in sacks (2.5).

The Tigers have managed despite missing projected starters or second-stringers S Mike McNeil, CB Aairon Savage, LB Spencer Pybus and DE Nosa Egaue for all four games, DE Antonio Carter and DB D'Antoine Hood for three games each, and LB Eltoro Freeman and DL Zach Clayton for one game each.

TURNOVERS TELL THE TALE

Auburn currently is tied for fifth in the nation in turnover margin, with a margin of +1.75 per game. The Tigers have forced 12 turnovers in their first four games and committed just four. As a result of that differential, Auburn has scored 45 points off of opponent turnovers, and allowed just 10 points.

TOTALING THE TAKEAWAYS

Auburn ranks tied for fourth in the nation with eight interceptions, and tied for fifth with 12 total turnovers forced. Last year, Auburn had just 11 interceptions during the entire season and forced 18 turnovers in 12 games. The Tigers have spread the wealth, with eight different players grabbing one interception each. Auburn picked off five passes against West Virginia, marking the first time since 2004 (at Tennessee) that Auburn intercepted five passes in a game. Antonio Coleman and Josh Bynes both have an interception and a fumble recovery this season.

COLEMAN MAKES AN IMPACT

Antonio Coleman, a first-team preseason All-SEC selection, is off to a strong start to the season. He has 19 tackles including 4.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, an interception which he returned for a touchdown against Mississippi State and a fumble recovery. Coleman ranks tied for sixth in school history with 17.0 career sacks, and this season, he is tied for eighth in the league in tackles for loss and tied for 10th with 2.5 sacks.

JUNIORS LEAD THE WAY

Although Auburn is without several expected contributors on defense due to injury, several veterans are still leading the charge, including a trio of juniors. Junior linebackers Josh Bynes and Craig Stevens have 34 and 32 tackles, respectively, to lead the team, while junior safety Zac Etheridge is fourth with 22. Bynes and Stevens both have interceptions, while Stevens is second on the team with 4.0 tackles for loss, Etheridge has 1.5 and Bynes recorded a safety against Ball State.

BYRUM ON TARGET

Junior Wes Byrum has been perfect so far during the 2009 season, connecting on all six of his field goal attempts and 23-of-23 extra points. Byrum, who ranks second in the SEC in scoring (10.3) and tied for 21st in the nation with six field goals made, now is tied for sixth in school history with 34 career made field goals.

COMEBACK KIDS

Auburn has had to come from behind in each of its four victories, including a fourth-quarter comeback to defeat West Virginia Sept. 19. The Tigers trailed Louisiana Tech, 7-3, late in the first quarter before pulling away for a 37-13 vic-

tory. Auburn fell behind Mississippi State, 17-14, late in the second quarter before storming back for a 49-24 victory. Against the Mountaineers, Auburn trailed by 14-0 less than five minutes in, and 21-10 at the end of the first quarter. West Virginia still led 30-27 entering the fourth quarter before Auburn ended the game on a 14-0 run. The Tigers trailed Ball State 7-0 in the first quarter before scoring the game's next 30 points.

YOUNG GUNS GET FIRST ACTION

A whopping 31 Auburn players have played in their first career games as Tigers so far this season. The list of first-timers included: DB Gabe Barrett, DB Daren Bates, DB T'Sharvan Bell, WR DeAngelo Benton, WR Emory Blake, OL Jorell Bostrom, LB Watson Downs, LB Jonathan Evans, DL Nick Fairley, LB Eltoro Freeman, DE Dee Ford, LB Harris Gaston, WR Anthony Gully, OL Andre Harris, DS Josh Harris, DE Robert Hill, RB Davis Hooper, DL Chris Humphries, TE Philip Lutzenkirchen, DL Derrick Lykes, RB Onerio McCalebb, DB Ikeem Means, DB Blake Poole, LB Ashton Richardson, OL Darrell Roseman, WR Travante Stallworth, OL John Sullen, DL Jamar Travis, DB Demond Washington, WR Jay Wisner and TE Bailey Woods.

In addition, 11 players have made their first career starts: WR Darvin Adams, DB Daren Bates, DL Nick Fairley, LB Eltoro Freeman, LB Adam Herring, OT Andrew McCain, RB Onerio McCalebb, DL Jake Ricks, RB Eric Smith, OL John Sullen and WR Terrell Zachery.

FRESH FACES

Freshmen are playing a key role in determining Auburn's level of success this year, as 10 true freshmen are listed on the depth chart.

The depth chart includes DB Daren Bates, WR DeAngelo Benton, WR Emory Blake, LB Jonathan Evans, DE Dee Ford, WR Anthony Gully, TE Philip Lutzenkirchen, RB Onerio McCalebb, QB Tyrik Rollison and OL John Sullen.

Two redshirt freshmen are also on the depth chart: DB T'Sharvan Bell and DT Derrick Lykes.

30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Auburn has won 53 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.

In the last 23 years, Auburn is 122-2 when scoring 30 points.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

In the last 10 seasons, Auburn is 75-8 (.904) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 118-15-1 (.884) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Auburn has had a knack for winning close games in recent seasons. Since the 2003 Capitol One Bowl, Auburn is 18-9 in games decided by seven points or less, even after posting just a 2-4 record in such games during the 2008 season. Nine of the 18 wins were by three points or less, with just four losses coming by that margin.

DYNAMITE DEBUT

Freshman running back Onterio McCalebb became the first Auburn freshman to rush for at least 100 yards in each of the first two games in a season, totaling 148 in the opener against Louisiana Tech and 114 Sept. 12 against Mississippi State. His 148 yards in the opener was the seventh highest single-game total by a freshman in school history.

A NIGHT OF FIRSTS

Auburn established several firsts during its game against Mississippi State Sept. 12. To begin, Ben Tate and Onterio McCalebb both went over 100 yards rushing for the second straight game, marking the first time in school history that the Tigers have had two 100-yard rushers in back-to-back games.

McCalebb established another first by becoming the first Tiger freshman ever to rush for 100 or more yards in each of the first two games of the season.

Finally, Darvin Adams had 116 yards receiving, marking the first time in school history that Auburn had two 100-yard rushers and a 100-yard receiver in the same game. It nearly marked the second straight game that Auburn accomplished that feat, as Terrell Zachery had 104 yards receiving at one point during the season opener, but lost 6 yards on his final reception and finished with 98 yards receiving for the game.

TOP SEC OPENER TOTAL

Auburn's total of 589 yards of offense against Mississippi State was a school record for the most yards ever in an SEC opener. The previous record was 527 yards in the 1995 season opener against Ole Miss. Auburn's 589 yards were tied for 11th most in any game in school history and tied for fourth most in an SEC game, and the most since the Tigers also had 589 yards at Kentucky in 2005.

RECORD-BREAKING PLAY

Chris Todd and Terrell Zachery teamed up to make school history during Auburn's season-opening win against Louisiana Tech, connecting on a 93-yard touchdown pass. The play was the longest play from scrimmage in school history, surpassing a 92-yard rush by Ralph O'Gwynne vs. Loyola on Nov. 21, 1936. The longest pass play in school history had been an 87-yard pass from Jason Campbell to Silas Daniels on Oct. 9, 2004, also against Louisiana Tech.

GENE CHIZIK ERA BEGINS ON THE PLAINS

A new era of Auburn football is underway as Gene Chizik is in his first season as Auburn's head coach. It marks Chizik's second stint on the Plains, as he previously served as defensive coordinator from 2002-04, helping lead the Tigers to a perfect 13-0 record in 2004 while earning the Frank Broyles Awards as the nation's top assistant coach. His defense led the nation in scoring that season (11.3 ppg) and the Tigers were 30-9 overall during his previous three-year stint.

Chizik went on to help guide Texas to the 2005 national championship while serving as assistant head coach and co-defensive coordinator for the Longhorns. After two seasons in Austin, he was named head coach at Iowa State, where he spent two more years prior to returning to Auburn.

Chizik's reputation as an outstanding teacher is evident by the fact that he coached three consecutive Thorpe Award Winners, starting with Auburn's Carlos Rogers in 2004, followed by Texas' Michael Huff and Aaron Ross in 2005 and 2006, respectively.

AUBURN BY THE NUMBERS

The Tigers return 46 lettermen from last season, including 24 on offense, 18 on defense and four specialists. Auburn returns seven starters on offense and seven on defense.

Auburn's current roster of 113 players includes 13 seniors, 31 juniors, 27 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 31 freshmen. The underclassmen (69) represent 61.1 percent of the Tigers' roster.

A number of walk-ons joined the program after the first day of classes on August 17.

THE SENIOR CLASS

Head coach Gene Chizik has a senior class that includes 12 players at Auburn in 2009. It marks the smallest senior class at Auburn since the 2001 squad had 10 seniors.

The 2009 seniors include: DE Antonio Coleman, H Clayton Crofoot, P Clinton Durst, OT Andrew McCain, CB Walter McFadden, TE Gabe McKenzie, DB Woody Parramore, DL Jake Ricks, DB Aairon Savage, RB Ben Tate, QB Chris Todd and TE Tommy Trott.

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 12 seniors, eight have seen time in at least 30 games during their careers, including four with at least 40 games under their belt. Tommy Trott leads the group, having played in 43 career games, including 41 of a possible 42 over the past four seasons. Gabe McKenzie is the only player who has played in all 42 games over the past three seasons. Antonio Coleman is next with 41 games played, followed by Walter McFadden (40 games), Ben Tate (38), Jake Ricks (35) and Andrew McCain (31).

STARTS STREAK

Junior Lee Ziemba has the longest starting streak on the Auburn squad, having started all 28 games over the past three seasons. Only three other players have starting streaks that date back to the 2007 season. Juniors Zac Etheridge and Ryan Pugh both have started 18 straight contests, while junior Craig Stevens has 16 straight starts under his belt.

Two other players have started every game since the start of the 2008 season: senior Walter McFadden and juniors Michael Goggans.

TIGER GRADS

Auburn began the season with eight graduates on its roster, which is tied for fifth most among all FBS schools.

The Tiger graduates include: WR Montez Billings (Public Administration), DE Antonio Coleman (Criminology), CB Walter McFadden (Public Administration), TE Gabe McKenzie (Criminology), DB Aairon Savage (Exercise Science), RB Ben Tate (Criminology), QB Chris Todd (Business Finance) and TE Tommy Trott (Public Administration).

WATCH LISTS

Three members of the Auburn team have been named to preseason watch lists for national awards.

Antonio Coleman leads the way, landing on four watch lists, including those for the Lombardi Award (best lineman or linebacker), Bronko Nagurski Award (best defensive player), Chuck Bednarik Award (best defensive player) and Ted Hendricks Award (best defensive end).

Ben Tate has been named to the Maxwell Award watch list, for the nation's outstanding player, and Tommy Trott is on watch list for the John Mackey Award, which goes to the nation's top tight end.

TIGER PROS

Auburn has demonstrated a proficiency for placing players in the National Football League. As of Aug. 24, 37 former Auburn Tigers were listed on NFL rosters. The Seattle Seahawks have the most former Tigers, with four former Auburn players on the roster, while the San Diego Chargers have three. Twenty-seven of the 32 teams have at least one former Auburn player on the roster.

2009 Auburn Football Game Notes

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Now celebrating its 70th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers, who set a school record by averaging 86,915 fans last season, are 269-67-7 (.794) all-time at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn has had nine straight winning seasons at Jordan-Hare Stadium, posting a mark of 55-13 (.809) at home since the 2000 season. The Tigers were undefeated at home during two of those seasons, going 7-0 in both 2000 and 2004.

UNDER THE LIGHTS AT JORDAN-HARE

Auburn has been tough to beat in night games at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including victories this season over each of its first four opponents. The Tigers have accumulated a record of 19-3 since the 2000 season in home games starting at 6 p.m. or later. That stretch includes a 4-1 record against ranked opponents, with wins over No. 1 Florida in 2001, No. 2 Florida in 2006, No. 7 Tennessee in 2003 and No. 14 Georgia in 2000.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Auburn is one of just two teams in the Southeastern Conference that is playing three non-conference games this season against teams that went to bowl games last season. South Carolina is the other.

Auburn opened the season with Louisiana Tech, which won the Independence Bowl last season. The Tigers' second non-conference game was against West Virginia, which defeated North Carolina in the Meineke Car Care Bowl. The following week the Tigers hosted Ball State, which fell to Gus Malzahn's Tulsa team in the GMAC Bowl, 45-13.

AUBURN FOOTBALL: EVERY DAY ...

This season Auburn is debuting a new weekly 30-minute show offering fans a reality-based, behind the scenes style production that will chronicle the inner-workings of the Tigers' football program through the entire 2009 season. The program follows the high and lows of competing as an SEC football player, with wired up coaches and players and exclusive interviews.

The show may be viewed across the state of Alabama and the Southeast on television stations as well as the Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS) regional cable network. The show will also be streamed via the internet at www.auburntigers.com. The show will air either Friday nights or Saturday mornings in all markets.

TIGERS ON CSS

Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS) will broadcast encore presentations of Auburn football every Sunday at 6 p.m. ET/5 p.m. CT with Andy Burcham handling play-by-play duties and Cole Cubelic doing color commentary. CSS will also air the Auburn Football Review every Tuesday at 5 p.m. ET/4 p.m. CT.

CSS is a 24-hour regional sports network serving approximately 5.8 million households across 12 Southeastern states.

No. 15 Auburn scored on both the offensive and defensive sides of the ball as the Tigers defeated SEC foe Tennessee 14-12 in front of a capacity crowd at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Tigers improved to 4-1 and 2-1 in league action.

It was the first meeting between Auburn and Tennessee since the 2004 season. Auburn's win gave the Tigers a 26-21-3 all-time series lead and for the first time since 1961-64, Auburn won four straight against the Volunteers.

Auburn got on the board on its second drive of the first quarter with Chris Todd connecting with Robert Dunn in the end zone from 18 yards out. The 11-play, 69-yard drive saw Ben Tate rush for 25 yards on three carries and Todd find Tommy Trott and Dunn for receptions of six and 14 yards, respectively.

Tennessee closed the gap on the Tigers with a pair of Daniel Lincoln field goals in the second quarter to bring the game within a point at 7-6. Lincoln knocked in field goals from 47 and 35 yards.

Jake Ricks would put the Tigers up 14-6 before heading in for halftime on a fumble by Volunteer quarterback Jonathan Crompton on his own goal line. Ricks jumped on the ball in the end zone for his first career touchdown.

Auburn looked to tack on another score before the half closed out as Tiger quarterback Kodi Burns conducted a 10-play drive that covered 46 yards, but a Wes Byrum field goal attempt from 35 yards was wide left.

The third quarter was a back-and-forth grind between both teams. Auburn started its third drive of the quarter from its own 2-yard line and was able to put together three-straight first downs. A Tennessee personal foul

pushed the Tigers into Volunteer territory, but a pass by Todd was picked off and returned for 38 yards.

Tennessee converted the interception into points at the start of the fourth quarter with a Montario Hardesty 2-yard touchdown run, the first rushing touchdown surrendered this season by the Auburn defense. Down by two, 14-12, the Volunteers attempted a two-point conversion with a Crompton pass, but failed.

The Tiger defense was key during the entire fourth quarter, limiting Tennessee to 14 yards of total offense and four possessions that resulted in three-and-outs.

Dunn finished the game leading the receiving unit with 54 yards on six catches to set a new career high.

Josh Bynes made his first career start at linebacker and tallied a career-high 11 tackles. He became the first Auburn player of the season to have double-digit tackles in a game.

Antonio Coleman registered his fourth sack of the season by taking down Crompton for a loss of four yards. Auburn's defense had six tackles for 19 yards lost against Tennessee.

Carrying a three-point lead into the locker room at halftime, the Auburn offense erupted for 24 second-half points en route to a 37-13 season-opening win over Louisiana Tech under the lights at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The win was also the first for Gene Chizik as Auburn's head coach.

The Tigers put up a balanced 556 yards of total offense in the victory with 301 rushing yards and 255 passing yards. Starting quarterback Chris Todd hit his target on 17-of-26 attempts for two touchdowns and no interceptions.

The highlight of the night for Todd came early in the second half following an interception by freshman Daren Bates. Auburn took over possession at its own 2-yard-line and on third down, Todd found Terrell Zachery down the right sideline for a 93-yard touchdown pass. The play is the longest from scrimmage in Auburn history.

Junior kicker Wes Byrum got the scoring started for Auburn in the first quarter, hitting a 25-yard field goal on the Tigers' first possession.

Louisiana Tech took its only lead of the game at the 5:00 mark of the first quarter as Dennis Morris caught a 19-yard pass from Ross Jenkins. Auburn retaliated on its next possession as Kodi Burns scored the team's first touchdown of the season on a 1-yard run.

With 23 seconds remaining in the first half, Louisiana Tech looked poised to take a 10-10 tie into the locker room following a 20-yard field goal by Matt Nelson, but Auburn marched back down the field, gaining 29 yards on three plays, to set up the 49-yard field goal by Byrum with no time left on the clock for the 13-10 lead.

The Tigers' momentum continued to roll as the third quarter started, beginning with the record-setting touchdown from Todd to Zachery at the 10:59 mark. Byrum connected on his final field goal of the game at the 4:28 mark of the period to give Auburn a 23-10 lead. Tech would follow up on its next possession with a field goal of its own by Nelson, cutting the lead to 23-13.

The Auburn defense kept the Bulldogs scoreless in the fourth quarter, capping off a half in which it gave up only 102 yards of total offense.

With 12:45 left in the game, Todd connected with sophomore Darvin Adams for his first career touchdown on a 17-yard pass. True freshman Onterio McCalebb followed with 5:27 remaining in the game with his first career touchdown as well, scoring on a 3-yard run.

McCalebb finished the game with a game-high 148 yards of rushing, becoming the first Auburn true freshman to run for more than 100 yards in a season opener since Bo Jackson accomplished the feat with 123 yards against Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was not the only 100-yard rusher on the team as senior Ben Tate racked up 118 of his own, marking the first time since 2007 against New Mexico State for Auburn to have two 100-yard rushers. Tate also hit another milestone in the game as he became the 13th Auburn player ever to amass 2,000 career rushing yards. He finished the game with a total of 2,076, ranking him 12th all-time at Auburn.

Zachery led the Auburn receiving corps with 98 yards, followed by Mario Fannin with 82 and Adams with 65.

On the defensive end, Zac Etheridge, Craig Stevens and Josh Bynes finished with eight tackles each to lead the Tigers. Senior Antonio Coleman finished with seven tackles and a sack, giving him 15.5 on his career and a tie for 10th all-time at Auburn in the category.

With the win, Auburn holds an 11-0-1 record all-time against Louisiana Tech and is 90-25-2 in season-opening games.

Kodi Burns accounted for four of Auburn's touchdowns, throwing one and running in three, and Onterio McCalebb and Ben Tate each topped the 100-yard rushing mark for the second straight game as Auburn pulled away from Mississippi State with 28 unanswered points to win 49-24 on Saturday night. Tate carried it 20 times for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown while McCalebb rushed for 114 yards on 16 carries with a touchdown, becoming the first pair of Auburn running backs to top the 100-yard rushing mark in back-to-back games.

Burns had nine rushes for 32 yards, scoring on three 1-yard runs, and also was 1-for-1 passing for 13 yards and a touchdown. Ahead 28-17 at the half, Auburn scored twice in the third quarter as Burns threw his fifth career touchdown pass, a strike to Philip Lutzenkirchen to go up 35-17, and then Tate ran it in from 35 yards out for his first touchdown of the season to put Auburn up 42-17.

Mississippi State had scored 17 consecutive points to take a 17-14 lead with 4:44 left in the second quarter before Auburn answered with two late second-quarter touchdowns. A 1-yard run by Anthony Dixon and a Sean Brauchle 29-yard field goal brought Mississippi State to within four, 14-10, before Robert Elliott returned a blocked Clinton Durst punt for the 17-10 lead.

McCalebb's touchdown, a 48-yard run around the left end, regained the lead for Auburn, 21-17, before Burns scored from 1 yard out with 16 seconds left in the half.

Auburn went up 7-0 on its first possession of the game as Burns capped an eight-play, 73-yard scoring drive with a one-yard rush up the middle for his first touchdown of the game.

An Antonio Coleman 20-yard interception return of a Chris Relf pass put Auburn ahead, 14-0, with 2:21 remaining in the first quarter. The interception was the first of Coleman's career and the touchdown was the second of his career, following a fumble return in the 2007 season-opener against Kansas State.

Burns closed out Auburn's scoring with his third touchdown run of the game with 5:56 remaining as Auburn moved to 2-0 on the season.

Chris Todd was 10-of-23 for 186 yards. Most of those passes went to Darvin Adams as he finished the night with five catches for 116 yards. Along with Tate and McCalebb, Adams combined to mark the first time ever for Auburn to have two 100-yard rushers and a 100-yard receiver in the same game.

McCalebb became the first player in Auburn history to top 100-yards rushing in his first two career games.

Auburn's 49 points were the most it has scored in a SEC game since scoring 49 at Kentucky in 2005. With 589 yards of total offense, it also marked the first time that Auburn had 500 or more yards of total offense in back-to-back games since 1970, when the Tigers had 566 yards against Florida and 664 against Mississippi State.

Defensively for Auburn, Zac Etheridge and Josh Bynes led the way with eight tackles each. Neiko Thorpe and Craig Stevens chipped in seven tackles with two of Stevens' coming for loss. Making his first career appearance as a Tiger, sophomore Eltoro Freeman followed with six tackles.

With the win, Auburn now holds a 58-23-2 all-time record over Mississippi State and is 43-28-5 in SEC openers.

A year earlier in Morgantown, W.Va., it was Auburn that took a 17-10 lead into the locker room at halftime, only to have the West Virginia Mountaineers out-score the Tigers 24-0 in the second half for the come-from-behind win. Auburn returned the favor Saturday, out-scoring West Virginia 31-9 after spotting the Mountaineers a 21-10 lead to pick up the 41-30 victory and improve to 4-0.

With Auburn's running game, that had averaged more than 300 yards per game in the first two games of the season, limited to just 100 yards against the Mountaineers, the Tigers had to go in another direction to get points on the board. The direction ended up being senior quarterback Chris Todd as he threw for career highs of 284 yards and four touchdown passes. Todd was 16-of-31 on the night, including an 82-yard pass to Mario Fanin that tied the game in the third quarter.

West Virginia took the early lead in the game as Noel Devine ran in for two touchdowns in the first five minutes, including a 71-yard run to put WVU up 14-0. Auburn countered with a 46-yard Wes Byrum field goal to put the Tigers on the board. Senior defensive end Antonio Coleman recovered a fumble at the West Virginia 45-yard line on the Mountaineers next possession, helping to set up a 16-yard pass from Todd to Darvin Adams to cut the WVU lead to four at 14-10. The reception was the first of three Touchdown catches on the night for Adams, making him the first Auburn player to tally three touchdown passes in a game in more than 20 years.

The Mountaineers closed out the first quarter with its third touchdown of the period as quarterback Jarrett Brown found Jock Sanders in the end zone for a 6-yard touchdown pass.

Auburn cut away the West Virginia lead in the second quarter, beginning with a 42-yard Byrum field goal. The field goal was the result of a Neiko Thorpe interception. The Tigers marched back up the field in its next possession, capping it off with a 4-yard touchdown pass from Todd to Adams to cut the WVU lead to one at 21-20.

West Virginia scored its final touchdown of the night halfway through the third quarter as Devine took off for 12 yards to extend the Mountaineer lead to 27-20. Tyler Bitancourt missed the ensuing extra-point attempt, setting up the opportunity for Auburn to tie the game on its next possession.

Less than a minute after the West Virginia touchdown, Todd rolled out of the pocket and found Fanin open on the right side. Fanin cut through the Mountaineer defense to streak down the field 82 yards for the touchdown. Byrum's extra-point tied the game at 27-27.

West Virginia took its final lead late in the third quarter on a Bitancourt field goal, 30-27. Auburn shut the Mountaineers out in the fourth quarter, taking the lead on a 17-yard touchdown pass from Todd to Adams early in the period and sealing the victory with a 15-yard Craig Stevens interception return for a touchdown to give Auburn a 41-30 lead.

Fanin's 82-yard reception led the team in receiving yards, followed by Adams with three touchdowns and 80 yards on six receptions. Eric Smith followed with 67 yards on three receptions.

Ben Tate led the Auburn rushing attack with 81 yards on 19 attempts. Onterio McCalebb followed with 25 total yards.

Defensively for Auburn, Josh Bynes led the team with 12 tackles and an interception while Stevens tallied 11 tackles and an interception. Also picking off passes in the game were Walter McFadden, Thorpe and lineman Jake Ricks.

With the win, Auburn and West Virginia are now tied in the all-time series, 1-1. The game was also delayed by 1:03 due to lightning.

Chris Todd tied an Auburn record with five touchdown passes as the Tigers tallied 560 yards of total offense in a 54-30 win over Ball State. The game marked the second in a row to have a delayed start as thunderstorms in the area forced the game to move from its 6 p.m. scheduled kickoff time to 6:30 p.m.

Ball State struck first against the Tigers, recovering a muffed punt on Auburn's 18-yard line. Four plays later, MiQuale Lewis took the ball around the right side to get Ball State in the end zone at the 12:26 mark in the opening period for its only lead of the game.

Following a Ball State fumble, the Tigers moved the ball to the BSU 6-yard-line, setting up a pass from Todd to Tommy Trott, giving the senior his first touchdown reception of the year with 2:53 remaining in the first quarter.

Heading into the second quarter with the game tied, 7-7, Auburn managed to put up a near record-setting performance while limiting the Cardinals to just a field goal. The Tigers tallied 26 points in the period with three touchdowns and a safety, giving Auburn its highest scoring quarter since racking up 28 against Tennessee-Chattanooga on Sept. 9, 1995.

Terrell Zachery accounted for two of the touchdowns, picking up a 46-yarder at the 13:47 mark and a 65-yarder with 8:22 left in the half. Onterio McCalebb also picked up a touchdown, running in for a yard at the 12:20 mark, immediately after a 62-yard rush put the Tigers in scoring position.

Byrum picked up his first and only field goal of the night with seven second left in the half, connecting on a 32-yard attempt.

The defense also got on the board at the 12:53 mark of the quarter as Josh Bynes tackled Ball State's Lewis in the end zone.

Ball State kicker Ian McGarvey gave the Cardinals their lone points of the quarter, connecting on a 33-yard field goal with 2:35 left in the first half to cut the lead to 30-10.

Auburn made good on its first possession of the second half, taking the opening kickoff and marching down the field to set up a 26-yard pass from Todd to Darvin Adams at the 11:39 mark of the third quarter.

Ball State answered on its next possession as quarterback Page kept the ball on a fake and ran 21 yards for the touchdown.

Auburn did not back down as Todd caught Mario Fanin with a pass in the flat that turned into a 36-yard touchdown reception.

The Cardinals put up 13 fourth-quarter points. Page found Fakes for a 1-yard touchdown pass while McGarvey connected on a pair of field goals.

Neil Caudle gave the Tigers their lone points of the quarter, breaking away for a 52-yard run for a touchdown.

Todd finished the night with 19 completions on 26 attempts for a career-high 287 yards and five touchdowns. Two of those touchdowns went to Zachery, who finished the night with 122 receiving yards on five catches. Adams followed with 73 on five receptions while Fannin was third on the team with 55 yards on three catches.

McCalebb led the Auburn rushing attack with 83 yards and a touchdown. Ben Tate finished second with 63 yards, but led the team in all-purpose yards with 139 after racking up 58 yards from kick returns.

Defensively for Auburn, the Tigers were led by Daren Bates' seven tackles. Josh Bynes, Neiko Thorpe, Craig Stevens and Harris Gaston each finished with six tackles on the night while Bates, Stevens, Dee Ford, Antonio Coleman and Mike Blanc combined for Auburn's five quarterback sacks.

With the win, Auburn improves to 3-0 all-time against Ball State and 7-0 all-time against teams from the Mid-American Conference.
