LAST TIME VS. NORTH CAROLINA

Tennessee suffered its first loss of the season Dec. 3 at the hands of second-ranked North Carolina, 70-57. Candace Parker recorded her 12th career double-double, pouring in 27 points and grabbing 10 boards to go along with four blocks and three steals. The Lady Vols fell to 6-1 with the loss, while North Carolina improved to 8-0 on the season. Erlana Larkins had 17 points and 12 rebounds to lead the Tar Heels. Prior to the game, the Lady Vols were 3-0 in games against ranked teams in 2006-07. North Carolina out-rebounded the Lady Vols, 43-33. Tennessee, which entered shooting 48 percent from three-point range, was just 3-of-11 from beyond the arc but offered incredible defensive pressure, forcing 24 UNC turnovers. The Lady Vols trailed at the half for the first time all season but a quick run to start the second period tied the game at 30. North Carolina answered with nine straight points and the Lady Vols never got closer than three. Nicky Anosike made it a three-point game midway through the second half. She finished with six rebounds, nine points, four assists and three blocks. UNC's Ivory Latta was held in check by strong defensive performances from UT point guards Shannon Bobbitt and Cait McMahan. Alexis Hornbuckle grabbed six rebounds, added four assists and four steals, extending her streak of games with a theft to 43. Several good looks at the basket rimmed out of Tennessee's favor, as the squad finished 21-of-58 from the field.

THE SERIES

The Final Four match-up between the Lady Vols and Tar Heels will mark the 16th meeting between the two teams in a series that dates back to 1978. Tennessee holds a commanding 12-3 record against North Carolina, although UNC picked up a 70-57 win on Dec. 3, earlier this season. In NCAA Tournament showdowns, UT has claimed victories in two of the three contests in which the squads have taken to battle.

POSTSEASON VS. THE ACC

The Lady Vols are 17-3 all-time against the Atlantic Coast Conference in the NCAA Tournament. Two of the losses against the league came in the regional finals, while the third was in the national semifinals. Virginia took a 79-75 overtime win in 1990, while Duke ended UT's dreams of a four-peat with a 69-63 win in Greensboro, N.C., in 2003. North Carolina knocked UT out of the tourney last season with a 75-63 victory in the Elite Eight.

BEEN THERE, WON THAT: If Sunday's contest comes down to a last-second shot, the Tar Heels can turn to current assistant coach Charlotte Smith for guidance, as she has plenty of experience in hitting big shots in the NCAA Tournament. In fact, she can lay claim to arguably the most important shot in Tar Heel history, having nailed a buzzer-beating three-pointer to give her squad a 60-59 victory over Louisiana Tech in the 1994 NCAA National Championship game in Richmond, Va.

HEIGHT MATTERS: The Tar Heels are one of the few teams in the country that can match up with the Lady Vols' height on the court, as both teams boast starting lineups that stand at an average of six-feet tall. Throughout the season, each squad has been able to put that length to good use on the defensive end of the court, as UT swats away 5.6 attempts a game, while UNC sends back 6.6 shots per contest. Sophomore Candace Parker leads the Big Orange with 2.9 blocks per game and LaToya Pringle tops North Carolina with an average of 3.2. Entering the tournament, Pringle ranked fifth in the country in the blocked shots category while Parker was close behind at 18th. As a team, UNC was just second in the country behind Baylor, while UT rated in at 19th.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST: UNC head coach Sylvia Hatchell's squad has been one of the best in the nation throughout the season and that fact is most evident in the team's placement at the top of a number of national statistical categories. Not only do the Tar Heels score more points per contest (84.6) than any other team, they also outscore their opponents by the widest margin (+29.6). In addition, they also hold the best mark in the country for steals per game with an average of 14.4. It doesn't end there, however, as North Carolina ranks second in win-loss percentage (.919) and blocked shots (6.6), as well as third in both assists per game (18.1) and rebound margin (+11.1).

LATTA LEADS THE WAY: First-team All-ACC guard Ivory Latta leads the Tar Heels into battle. She is the top scorer on the squad (16.3 ppg) and serves as the main three-point weapon (105 treys) for North Carolina. She is also at ease at the free-throw line, topping the team's efforts with an 85.2 percentage (109 of 128). The McConnells, S.C., native also leads the squad in assists (4.3 apg) and is fifth in steals (1.6 spg). Just like Tennessee's Candace Parker, Latta is up for a number of national awards, including the State Farm Wade Trophy, John R. Wooden Award, the Naismith Trophy and Kodak All-America. In addition, Latta has also been named a finalist for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award and the Nancy Lieberman Award (nation's top point guard).

HATCHELL SETTING NEW RECORDS AT EVERY TURN IN NCAA TOURNAMENT: It's been a record-breaking postseason for UNC head coach Sylvia Hatchell, as she has consistently moved up in a number of rankings involving the NCAA Tournament this season. With her 15th appearance in the competition this year, Hatchell is now tied with former Western Kentucky and Nebraska coach Paul Sanders for the 17th-most entries into the tournament. She has also climbed into 13th on the all-time list for most games coached in the tourney with 46, and will tie Marsha Sharp and Rene Portland, formerly of Texas Tech and Penn State, respectively, for 12th with Sunday's contest against Tennessee. Her four wins in the tourney this year have also allowed her to become the eighth-winningest coach in the history of the NCAA Tournament with a record of 33-13. Despite Hatchell's steady progress, she has yet to make up any ground on the leader in any of these categories, as Lady Vol head coach Pat Summitt holds the standard for each one, having notched 26 consecutive appearances, 115 games coached and an overall NCAA Tournament record of 96-19.

BIG BODIES DOWN LOW: The Tar Heels are one of the most difficult teams in the country to steal a rebound from, as they have a trio of players who average at least 6.0 caroms a game in juniors Erlana Larkins (9.0 rpg) and LaToya Pringle (7.5), as well as senior Camille Little (6.0). As a team, North Carolina pulls down 45.4 boards per contest while allowing its opponents an average of just 34.2. The resulting rebounding margin of +11.1 is good enough for third in the nation. On the other side of the court, Tennessee has just one player over the 6.0 rebounds per game threshold. That player, however, is Candace Parker, who has recorded an average of 9.8 per contest thus far this season.

WATCH YOUR POCKETS, THEY MAY GET PICKED: You can expect both teams to force a few turnovers on Sunday, as each squad entered the tournament ranked among the top 10 in the country in steals per game. Tennessee comes in at ninth with an average of 11.7, while North Carolina leads the nation at 14.4 per contest. Despite the fact that the Tar Heels have 533 thefts this year, no one person on the team has more than 98 of them. The Lady Vols, on the other hand, rely heavily on Alexis Hornbuckle who has accounted for nearly 26 percent of the team's steals with 106 of its 409. Her 3.0 takeaways per game ranks ninth among all NCAA performers.

ROCKY TOP ROOTS FOR HATCHELL: UNC head coach Sylvia Rhyne Hatchell cut her coaching teeth in Knoxville as a graduate assistant with the Lady Vols in the mid-70s under coach Pat Head Summitt. Both were graduate assistants at the time – Head Summitt had just been named the head coach and Rhyne Hatchell was in charge of the junior varsity squad. Prior to arriving at Rocky Top, Hatchell was a 1974 cum laude graduate of Carson-Newman College in nearby Jefferson City, Tenn. After she earned a master's degree in physical education from UT in 1975, she became the head coach at Francis

Marion, where she led the Lady Patriots to a 272-80 mark over 11 seasons. In her time at the Florence, S.C., school, she led FMU to the 1982 AIAW small college division national championship and the 1986 squad to the NAIA national title. Combined with her 1994 title with the Tar Heels, she is the only women's basketball coach to lead teams to national titles on the AIAW, NAIA and NCAA Division I levels.

HOME GROWN TALENT: Of the 13 players to don the Blue and White, seven hail from within the borders of North Carolina, while an additional four come from the adjoining states of South Carolina and Virginia. By contrast, the Lady Vols have just two native Tennesseans on their roster in Cait McMahan (Maryville) and Alex Fuller (Shelbyville).
