## TONIGHT'S GAME

Tennessee coach Pat Summitt and her #13/15-ranked Lady Vols (16-4, 5-2 SEC) will try to make basketball history as they travel to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, for a "Big Monday" meeting on ESPN2 taking on the #2-ranked Oklahoma Sooners (18-2, 7-0 Big 12) in the Ford Center. Summitt will be seeking her 1000th coaching victory.

## LADY VOLS AT A GLANCE

This is the Lady Vols' 35th season under Head Coach Pat Summitt...She has compiled a staggering 999-186 overall record... Is just **ONE** win away from a remarkable 1,000 career victories... Collected her 900th coaching win with a 80-68 decision over #19-ranked Vanderbilt on Jan. 19, 2006... She passed Dean Smith (879 wins) for most NCAA collegiate basketball wins of all-time with a 75-54 victory over Purdue on Mar. 22, 2005 ...Her 2006-07 and 2007-08 squads were crowned as the NCAA Champions producing the program's seventh and eighth titles...Last season, UT finished with a 36-2 overall record and were also the SEC Tournament Champions...

This season, UT returned five letterwinners, a redshirt freshman and welcomed a talented six-pack rookie class...The 2008-09 season marked the Lady Vol debut for freshmen: #1 Briana Bass, a 5-2 guard from Indianapolis, Ind., #10 Amber Gray, a 6-1 forward/center from West Chester, Ohio, #15 Alicia Manning, a 6-1 guard/forward from Woodstock, Ga., #25 Glory Johnson, a 6-3 forward from Knoxville, Tenn., #33 Alyssia Brewer, a 6-3 forward from Sapulpa, Okla. and #40 Shekinna Stricklen, a 6-2 guard/forward from Morrilton, Ark. A redshirt freshman, #52 Kelley Cain, a 6-6 center from Atlanta, Ga., restarted her rookie season after undergoing surgery in December 2007.

## ON THIS DAY IN LADY VOL BASKETBALL HISTORY

UT is 13-2-1 all-time on February 2 featuring a 8-1 record at home, a 5-1-1 slate on the road and a 0-0 mark on neutral courts. The last time the Lady Vols were in action on this date, Tennessee defeated Mississippi, 78-63, in Oxford, Miss., in 2006.

## LOOKING BACK

Last year at this time, the #2-ranked Lady Vols were 19-1 (6-0 SEC) on the campaign after defeating Ole Miss, 68-44, in Oxford, Miss.

## LADY VOLS ON TV

Currently, 21 Lady Vol regular season games are slated for television this season. Upcoming TV games include: Oklahoma (ESPN2) and Georgia (FS-South). Last season, UT had a school record 36 national television appearances. UT is 10-4 in TV games this year.

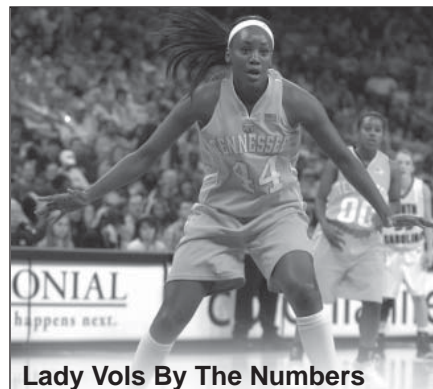
## COUNTDOWN TO 1,000

The much anticipated countdown to Coach Pat Summitt's 1,000th career victory continues tonight with a game against Oklahoma. Summitt (with 999 wins) now needs just one victory to hit the magic mark. Summitt started the year needing 17 victories to reach 1,000. Last season, UT grabbed win number 17 on Jan. 24 vs. Arkansas (98-55) and in 2006-07, win number 17 occurred on Jan. 18 with a victory over Miss. State. Traditionally, Tennessee has reached 17 wins in 20.5 games each season (on average).

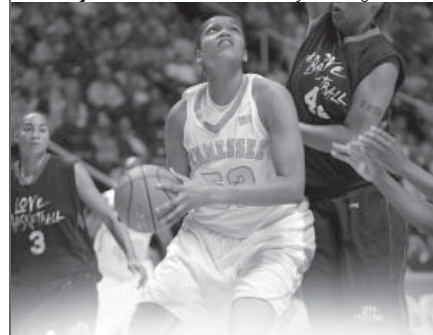

Pat Summitt stands with dear friend and active coach Don Meyer (906-304, .748; Northern State, NCAA Div. II, record as of Jan. 31), retired Bob Knight (902-317, .706) of Texas Tech, and Jody Conradt (900-307, .746) of Texas, on the 900-victory plateau among all NCAA coaches\*. In reaching such an elite level, she passed a handful of legendary coaches -- Dean Smith (879-254, .776), Adolph Rupp (876-190, .822), Herb Magee (871-342, .716; still active at Philadelphia Univ., NCAA Div. II, record as of Jan. 31), Jim Phelan (830-524, .613), Clarence Gaines (828-447, .649) and Jerry Johnson (821-447, .647). \*As of Jan. 31, 2009 (Gene Bess of NJCAA's Three Rivers Community College, Poplar Bluff, Mo., is still active with a 1075-282 record; Harry Statham of NIAA's McKendree College, Lebanon, Ill., is still active with a 984-379 record).

# SOON TO BE THE GRAND DAME 999 WINS -- SUMMITT'S MILESTONE VICTORIES

## # 1

January 10, 1975 – In Knoxville, Tenn., Pat Head, the 22-year old University of Tennessee Lady Vol head coach, records her first collegiate win over Middle Tennessee State, 69-32, in UT's Alumni Gym. Fifty-three spectators were on hand.

## # 100

January 13, 1979 – Coach Head hits the century mark in the Lady Vols' third-ever win over the North Carolina St. Wolfpack, 79-66, at Reynolds Coliseum. To record her first 100 wins, it took Head's Lady Vols three years and 362 days to hit the century mark.

## # 200

December 3, 1982 – The Lady Vols deliver win number 200 to Coach Head at Detroit's Coca-Cola Classic. UT turns away a stubborn St. John's squad, 69-56, for the victory. Wins 100-200 took three years and 324 days to accomplish.

## # 300

January 4, 1987 – It was hard to believe that five years (and 32 days) would elapse before Coach Pat Summitt would claim 100 more wins. Victory 300 came over North Carolina, 87-68, in front of the home folks. Nineteen wins after number 300 over UNC, Summitt's Lady Vols claimed UT's first NCAA title.

## # 400

January 25, 1990 – Tennessee barely squeaked out win number 400 in Columbia, S.C., defeating the Lady Gamecocks, 70-69. Wins 300-400 came quickly (three years and 21 days) and were wrapped around NCAA Championships in 1987 and 1989.

## # 500

November 21, 1993 – Pat Summitt's 500th victory came against a former assistant coach who had helped UT's mentor to 180 wins from 1978-85-- Nancy Darsch. Ohio State was no match for UT in the Inaugural State Farm Hall of Fame game, 80-45, in Jackson, Tenn. Victories 400-500 were accomplished in three years and 300 days

## # 600

November 23, 1996 – Four victories into the 1996-97 season, Summitt's defending NCAA Champs defeated Marquette, 83-68, in the Howard Bank Classic in Burlington, Vermont. The governor of the state of Vermont, Howard Dean, was on hand to surprise the coach with a cake commemorating her 600th win. Summitt's teams from 1993-96 fast-tracked the coach with the quickest 100 wins in her career, three years and two days. She was the fastest women's coach to reach 600 wins – just 734 games.

## # 700

December 5, 1999 – Pat Summitt reached the magical 700-win plateau at the University of Wisconsin with an 85-62 conquest of the Badgers. She joined Texas' Jody Conradt as the only women to notch the milestone. Her ascent to 700 wins was also the fastest in women's collegiate basketball. This set of 100 wins was knocked out in three years and 12 days along with three more NCAA titles.

## # 800

January 14, 2003 – An anxious throng at Thompson-Boling Arena anticipated win #800 as the Lady Vols jump out quickly against #25/24 ranked DePaul en route to a 76-57 victory. As the last seconds ticked down, the crowd chanted, "800, 800, 800!" The post game activities featured a giant "8-0-0" cake, balloons, flowers, fireworks and the presentation of the game ball. The latest set of 100 wins took three years and 38 days.

## # 880

March 22, 2005 – An electric atmosphere welcomed Tennessee and Purdue to the court for the NCAA Second Round game in Knoxville, Tenn. At stake was a win to advance in the tournament and a victory that would put coach Pat Summitt number one on the list of NCAA all-time winningest basketball coaches. With a 75-54 triumph over the Boilermakers, Summitt etched her name in the history books with her 880th victory. To commemorate her achievement, the University of Tennessee named its basketball court, "The Summitt," in a surprise ceremony.

## # 900

January 19, 2006 – If you had to be away from your home arena for such a monumental milestone win, it was fortunate for Coach Pat Summitt and the Tennessee Lady Vols that the majority of the 13,127 fans in attendance at Memorial Gym in Nashville, Tenn., were bedecked in Orange and White for #900. Number one-ranked Tennessee remained perfect on the year at 18-0 as they knocked off #19-ranked Vanderbilt, 80-68, in a dramatic come-from-behind victory on Jan. 19, 2006. It was "W" number 900 for Summitt – a magical and uncharted victory plateau. It was the second quickest 100 wins in her career, just three years and four days. For this win, Hazel Head, Summitt's mother, sat on the Tennessee bench during the game.

## # 1000

???????????????????? Lady Vol coach Pat Summitt currently has 999 wins heading into the game with Big 12 foe Oklahoma on Feb. 2 in her first attempt to reach 999. Tennessee was defeated by #6/5-ranked Auburn, 82-68, on Jan. 25 in the first attempt to hang three nines. Four days later, she got #999 with a dramatic come-from-behind win over Ole Miss, 60-59.

## SOON TO BE THE GRAND DAME *SUMMING IT UP...* THE ROAD TO 1,000 WINS

• After setting up the chairs, getting out the clock and sweeping the floors at the 3,000 seat Alumni Memorial Gym with UT custodian Doug Pease, Pat Head (Summitt) lost the very first game of her career to Mercer, 84-83 on Dec. 7, 1974.

• Her first win came almost a month after her first loss. The team went home for the Christmas holidays and in the first game of the new year, the Lady Vols defeated Middle Tennessee State, 69-32, to notch her first win on Jan. 10, 1975.

• In 1976, the women were invited to play in Stokely Athletics Center (12,000 capacity) for the first time on Nov. 13. In the first game on the tartan court, her team defeated Kentucky, 107-53, as first Lady Vol All-American Patricia Roberts broke the Fieldhouse record with 51 points. Current Lady Vol associate head coach Holly Warlick was the starting rookie point guard on that team.

• When the University of Tennessee's mammoth Thompson-Boling Arena was finished, there was some debate if the women would rather stay in Stokely Athletics Center or make the move to the new 25,000 seat arena. Urged on by then men's athletics director Doug Dickey, the women also made the move to the Arena. The playing floor in the facility now bears Summitt's name.

• Over 35 years, Summitt has brought 153 women into the program (including this year's team). Of that total group, 111 have graduated (including current starting post Alex Fuller), two discontinued playing due to medical reasons (knees), 23 transferred, and six quit.

• Summitt has always said, "You win with players." Summitt's all-time Lady Vols represent 30 states led by 64 players from the state of **Tennessee**... 20 from **Georgia**... six each from **Indiana** and **Ohio**... five from Michigan... four each from **California**, Florida, Kentucky, Texas and Virginia... three from Alabama, New York, South Carolina and West Virginia... two from Illinois, North Carolina and Pennsylvania and one each from the states of **Arkansas**, Arizona, Colorado, Iowa, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Mississippi, New Jersey, **Oklahoma**, Oregon, **Washington** and Wisconsin. (bold states indicate players on the 2008-09 team)

• Summitt has also been fond of saying, "Surround yourself with great people." During her 35-year coaching tenure at the University of Tennessee she has worked with 153 Lady Vol basketball student-athletes and been assisted throughout the years by a total of 39 coaching staffers (assistant coaches, graduate assistants and operations directors), 53 student managers, 3 head athletic trainers, 2 women's athletics directors, 1 media relations director and 1 secretary.

• Over 46 percent of ALL games coached by Summitt have come against Associated Press ranked opponents with the Lady Vols producing a 400-154 record and a 72 percent winning percentage. Imagine facing a ranked opponent in practically every other game in your career. Summitt has faced this challenge for 35 years, night-in and night-out. Additionally, 95 percent of the time she has faced an unranked opponent, Summitt's teams have won 599 games and lost just 32 contests.

• Never had a losing season

• 32 consecutive seasons with at least 20 wins

• 18 seasons with more than 30 wins

• For the last 10 years, Coach Summitt has averaged 31.7 wins and only 4.4 losses per season

**AUBURN GRABS BIG WIN OVER UT**

Auburn, playing in front of the largest crowd in history (12,067), put an end to Tennessee's dominance with a 82-68 win on Jan. 25. The Tigers had lost 24 of the last 25 and 16 in a row to the Lady Vols.

**VANDY STOPPED THE BLEEDING, TOO**

The Vanderbilt Commodores halted the Lady Vols 16-game winning streak against them dating back to the 2002 season with a 74-58 dusting of Tennessee in Nashville on Jan. 11, 2009, in the first SEC road game of the year. It also marked VU coach Melanie Balcomb's first victory over Tennessee since becoming the Commodore coach.

**RARE SEC ROAD LOSS FOR SUMMITT**

Lady Vol coach Pat Summitt's teams rarely lose on the road in the SEC. The loss to Vanderbilt on Jan. 11, 2009 was the 30th SEC road loss suffered by a Summitt-coached Lady Vol team and halted a 17-game SEC road winning streak. Two weeks later, UT also lost, this time at #6/5 Auburn.

**AMAZING AT HOME VS. THE SEC**

Since Tennessee began contesting games with SEC opponents, the Lady Vols have produced a 167-12 record in home games. Only six SEC teams have ever managed a victory over the Lady Vols in Knoxville - Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Ole Miss. Georgia has won three games on UT's turf while Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss and LSU have registered two wins each and Florida one win. Georgia was the only team to defeat UT at home in the 1990s (1991 & 1996). LSU and Florida are the only SEC teams to defeat UT at home in the 21st century.

**SEC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

Tennessee freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morril-

ton, Ark.) was named Southeastern Conference (SEC) Freshman of the Week (Dec. 29-Jan. 3) for the second time this season, after helping the Lady Vols to a pair of wins over Gonzaga, 77-58, and the come-from-behind win at Rutgers, 55-51. The explosive rookie scored 12 points and grabbed six boards, while dishing out a career-high five assists and making four steals in the win over the Bulldogs on Dec. 30. On Jan. 3 against Rutgers, Stricklen notched her first career double-double with team-highs of 16 points and 11 rebounds and was named the CBS Chevrolet Player of the Game. She was 4-of-8 for 13 points and grabbed six rebounds in leading the Lady Vols to a 20-point comeback win, the largest in school history.

**STRICK -- SEC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

Tennessee freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) was named Southeastern Conference (SEC) Freshman of the Week (Dec. 15-22) for the first time this season, after leading the Lady Vols to a 79-69 upset overtime win over #3/4-ranked Stanford on Dec. 21. After missing the game at Old Dominion on Dec. 18 due to illness, the rookie came back strong to lead the Lady Vols over the Cardinal. She scored a career high 25 points including the first eight of the Lady Vols 11 points in overtime. For good measure, she grabbed seven rebounds, snagged three steals and registered a career high four assists. Stricklen joins teammate Glory Johnson who has been named SEC Freshman of the Week twice this season.

**GLORY BE -- SEC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK**

Lady Vol rookie Glory Johnson has picked up SEC Rookie of the Week honors twice this season. She received the award for the week of Nov. 23-30 after leading the Lady Vols to wins over Western Carolina (83-56) and DePaul (88-67). In each game, she scored a season-high 19 points. Johnson was also named SEC Freshman of the Week for the opening week of the new campaign after leading UT to a 68-39 win over San Francisco with 17 points and 12 rebounds.

**SEC COACHES SELECT LADY VOLS AS #2**

Vanderbilt was predicted to win the SEC women's basketball regular season championship. The Commodores were 25-9, 11-3 in the SEC last season. VU tops the order of finish with Tennessee, Auburn, Georgia, LSU and Florida rounding out the top half of the league. Kentucky comes in at seven while Mississippi St., Ole Miss, South Carolina, Arkansas and Alabama round out the bottom half of the conference. Auburn senior guard DeWanna Bonner was named SEC Preseason Player of the Year while three Lady Vols were selected to either the first or second teams. Joining Bonner, on the All-SEC First Team were UF's Marshae Dotson and Sha Brooks, UGA's Ashley Houts, LSU's Allison Hightower, Ole Miss' Shawn Goff, UT's Angie Bjorklund, and VU's Christina Wirth. Second team: AU's Whitney Boddie and Sherell Hobbs, UGA's Angel Robinson, UK's Victoria Dunlap, MSU's Marneshia Richard, USC's Demetress Adams, Tennessee's Vicki Baugh and Shekinna Stricklen, and VU's Jennifer Risper.

**UT PICKED NUMBER TWO AT SEC MEDIA DAYS**

Tennessee was picked to finish second in the SEC race with 261 points by a vote of conference and national media members. UT sophomore Angie Bjorklund and freshman Shekinna Stricklen were each selected to the All-SEC Second Team. Vanderbilt was picked to finish first with 273 points, followed by UT, Auburn, Georgia, and LSU. Auburn's DeWanna Bonner was tabbed as Player of the Year. Joining her on the All-SEC First Team was Vanderbilt's Christina Wirth, Florida's Marshae Dotson, Georgia's Ashley Houts and Ole Miss' Shawn Goff. Bjorklund, the 2007-08 SEC Freshman of the Year and Stricklen, were joined on the second team by Whitney Boddie of Auburn, Sha Brooks of Florida, Angel Robinson of Georgia and Allison Hightower of LSU.

THE 4-1-1 ON OKLAHOMA

In the last outing before facing Tennessee, #2-ranked Oklahoma, behind Nyeshia Stevenson and Ashley Paris each scoring 14 points, extended its winning streak to 14 games and remained atop the Big 12 Conference by routing Missouri 78-56 on Jan. 31 in Norman, Oklahoma. Oklahoma avenged its last loss to a Big 12 foe while giving Missouri its fourth straight loss. The Tigers stunned Oklahoma in overtime in the first round of last season's conference tournament. Sooner center Courtney Paris had 10 points and 11 rebounds in 21 minutes of playing time to extend her NCAA-record streak of consecutive double-doubles to 112 games. Oklahoma led all the way, although the Tigers kept it close in the early minutes and were within 10 with 6:25 left in the first half. Oklahoma had a 45-20 halftime lead. Courtney Paris registered her double-double on a bucket with 6:53 left -- which gave Oklahoma its biggest lead at 71-38. Ashley Paris narrowly missed her own double-double, finishing with nine rebounds.

OUR 2007-08 MEETING

The battle of the "CP3s" (Courtney Paris and Candace Parker) was finally played out with Tennessee's CP3 coming out on top on Nov. 15, 2007, at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa, Fla., as the #1-ranked Lady Vols defeated #8/9-ranked Oklahoma, 70-67. Against the Sooners, Tennessee coach Pat Summitt turned to her experienced players and it paid off. Junior Candace Parker had 28 points and senior Shannon Bobbitt scored 22 of her career-high 27 points in the second half as Tennessee improved to 2-0 on the season. Bobbitt secured the win with two free throws to put Tennessee up 70-67 with 1.6 seconds to play, after the Lady Vols incredible defensive stop forced a jump ball on Oklahoma's previous possession. Bobbitt hit nine-of-15 shots, including six-of-nine from three-point range, which tied for the second most in a single game in UT history. The Lady Vols trailed most of the game, but rallied to take an eight point lead with just over five minutes remaining. That lead dwindled until Oklahoma went ahead 67-66 on Courtney Paris' basket with a half-minute left. Tennessee took the lead for good on two free throws by Alexis Hornbuckle with 26.7 seconds to go. Hornbuckle finished with six rebounds and went three-of-four from the line on the night. Tennessee scored five of the last seven points in the first half to take a 32-29 lead at halftime. Bobbitt hit a three and

Parker drew a shooting foul with one second remaining for the three-point cushion at the break. Parker finished the first half with 18 points. She hit 7-of-10 shots, but struggled from the line, going four-of-eight. On the night, she hit eight-of-14 from the charity stripe to go along with 15 rebounds, four assists and four blocks. Parker and Bobbitt both played the entire 40 minutes. The Sooners held a 44-33 rebounding advantage, but coughed up 22 turnovers and went just 13-of-25 from the line in their second straight loss. Paris missed a free throw attempt which was accidentally knocked in by competing Tennessee rebounders (Parker and Vicki Baugh).

LAST MEETING WITH THE SOONERS IN OK

ENJOYED THE FORD CENTER RECEPTION

In the 2007-08 NCAA Championship season, the Lady Vols were placed in the Oklahoma Regional. In two games at the Ford Center last Mar. 30 and April 1, #3-ranked Tennessee defeated #15-ranked Notre Dame, 74-64, and then dealt #8-ranked Texas A&M a 53-45 defeat to advance to the NCAA Final Four in Tampa, Fla. One week later, the Lady Vols brought home NCAA title number eight.

UNDEFEATED IN THE SOONER STATE

Tennessee has fashioned a 5-0 record in games played in The Sooner State. The Lady Vols played OU in Norman on Dec. 21, 2003 and grabbed a 71-55 win. Three months later, Tennessee found itself back in Norman at the 2004 NCAA Midwest Regionals where the Lady Vols claimed a 71-69 win over #15-ranked Baylor and advanced to the 2004 Final Four in New Orleans with a 62-60 win over #10-ranked Stanford. Last season, UT picked up wins four and five in OKC in the regionals.

IRONY OF THE MOMENT

Pat Summitt is going for a historic 1,000 wins against Oklahoma, a program that might not exist if she hadn't been one of the folks to turn the national spotlight on Norman in 1990. OU had decided to drop women's hoops while the Final Four was in Knoxville, Tenn., without Tennessee playing in it. The WBCA board of directors, led by President Rene Portland and Pres.-Elect Kay Yow, came up with the idea to pass out red ribbons to all of the fans in the packed stands at Thompson-Boling Arena in support of women's hoops at OU. Since Summitt wasn't coaching, she became a hot interview talking about keeping Oklahoma's program. Longtime Sooner media relations staffer Debbie Copp sent Summitt a note when she became the all-time winningest coach, "with all her victories at Tennessee, the most important one may have been for a school she never coached -- the University of Oklahoma."

THE SERIES

This marks the third meeting between the two schools dating back to the 2002 season. There have been two "almost" meetings. At the 2002 NCAA Final Four in San Antonio, Texas, Tennessee was joined at the Final Four by Connecticut, Duke and a first-time trip for Oklahoma. The Lady Vols were embarrassed by UConn in one semifinal, 79-56, while upstart Oklahoma defeated Duke, 86-71, in the other semifinal. It was too much of the Husky women in the title game, as Connecticut defeated Oklahoma, 82-70. In 2007, UT and Oklahoma appeared to be on a collision course in the 2007 Dayton Regional. Tennessee defeated Marist, 65-46, and fellow SEC school Ole Miss then ended #11 Oklahoma's season, 90-82. UT knocked out the Lady Vols, 98-62, to advance to the 2007 NCAA Final Four where the team picked up title number 7.

PERHAPS ANOTHER SELLOUT???

On Dec. 21, 2003, the #2-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols took a 71-55 decision over #13/15 Oklahoma in a sold-out Lloyd Noble Arena (12,080) in Norman, Okla. Tonight could see the same situation as UT coach Pat Summitt goes for her record 1,000th win. This season, the Lady Vols have played in advance sold out situations at Gonzaga, Rutgers and Auburn. Mississippi State registered the fifth largest crowd in history.

UT VS. BIG 12

Tennessee currently holds a 43-13 record all-time against 11 teams from the Big 12, including a perfect 7-0 mark in NCAA Tournament play. Twelve of those losses, however, have come at the hands of Texas, with the only other defeat credited to Colorado in 1981.

UT-OKLAHOMA FACING THE RANKED

Tennessee faced their sixth ranked opponent of the 2008-09 season in the loss to #6/5-ranked Auburn on Jan. 25. UT is 2-4 in games versus ranked teams out of 20 total contests. Meanwhile Oklahoma will be taking on their ninth ranked opponent in 21 games when they face #13/15 Tennessee. OU is 6-2 vs. ranked teams having lost to #4/3 North Carolina and top-ranked Connecticut.

TENNESSEE'S FIRST OKIE

When 6-3 forward Alyssia Brewer (Sapulpa, OK/Sapulpa H.S.) signed with the Lady Vols last year, it marked Tennessee's first player from the state of Oklahoma.

**ANGIE B TO THE RESCUE**

Sophomore Angie Bjorklund went scoreless in the

first half of the second game in a row. In the second stanza, she was 2-7 from three point land before launching a perfect game winning, nothing but net, trey with 6.8 ticks left against Ole Miss to give UT the 60-59 win.

**HOT POTATO HOOPS TIMES TWO**

In dropping the fourth game of the year and the second in the SEC, the young Lady Vols really looked the part of "young" on Jan. 25 in front of 12,067 record-setting fans at #6/5-ranked Auburn. Four Tennessee players had four turnovers each and a total of 23 for the team, leading to 29 points for the Tigers. In the next game versus Ole Miss, UT tallied 24 give-aways. Senior Alex Fuller had an uncharacteristic 7 miscues but balanced it with her first career double-double of 11 points and 11 rebounds. UM managed 17 points off of TO's.

**STRICKLY SPEAKING**

A bright spot in the loss at Auburn was a career afternoon from rookie Shekinna Stricklen who tossed in 26 points. Fellow rookie Glory Johnson recorded her fourth career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

**CAIN BACK VERSUS AUBURN & OLE MISS**

Redshirt rookie Kelley Cain, a 6-6 post was back in the line-up at Auburn after sitting out the South Carolina and Arkansas games to rest her knees. Cain came down hard in the game at Mississippi State and irritate her surgically repaired knee. Against Auburn, she gutted out 16 minutes and had six points, five rebounds and three blocked shots. She battled the bigs from Ole Miss and tallied eight points and four boards in 13 minutes.

**BAUGH -- GAME TIME DECISION**

It will be a game time decision if Vicky Baugh plays tonight versus Oklahoma. The Lady Vol sophomore starting center is hoping she doesn't have any pain on lateral cuts. She was injured in the Lady Vols practice at Rutgers Prep on Jan. 1, 2009. Baugh went down and grabbed her left knee -- the same knee she injured (torn ACL) in the 2008 NCAA title game against Stanford last April. Baugh was taken to the hospital for x-rays which were negative. She returned to the practice floor on Friday, Jan. 16.

**BAUGH'S NUMBERS MISLEADING**

On Tennessee's cumulative stat sheet, it says that sophomore post Vicki Baugh has played in 13 games, started 10 and is averaging 6.2 ppg and 7.5 rpg. Well sort of... Baugh missed the first two games of the year as her surgically repaired knee continued a course of rehab. She then started the next 10 games before suffering an injury on New Year's Day prior to the game at Rutgers. She missed four games and returned to the court against South Carolina. She logged 2:52 and scored a bucket before the knee started to bother her. She attempted to play at Arkansas but managed just 1:24 on the court before her knee took a shot under the basket. After a good

practice before Auburn, Baugh appeared ready for some solid minutes. This time the knee lasted just 20 seconds. Prior to the Rutgers game, Baugh was averaging 7.8 ppg and 9.7 rpg and had just come off of a 12 point, 15 rebound performance at Gonzaga for her third double-double of the season. The current stat sheet shows her averaging 6.2 ppg and 7.5 rpg.

**NO WHAMMIES**

The Lady Vols have lost back-to-back games just 24 times in Coach Pat Summitt's 35-year career. The last time it happened, UT lost at #2 Duke, 75-53, and at Kentucky, 66-63, on Jan. 23 & 26, 2006. Before that, you have to go all the way back to the 1996-97 season for back-to-back losses.

**LADY VOLLS MOURN THE LOSS OF KAY YOW**

The Lady Vols will not practice on Friday and just have a lifting session scheduled as the Tennessee coaching staff will be in Cary, N.C. attending the funeral of N.C. State coach Kay Yow who succumbed to cancer on Jan. 24.

**Comments by Coach Pat Summitt regarding the passing of Kay Yow --** "My heart goes out to the Yow family and the N.C. State Wolfpack nation on the passing of a truly remarkable lady and a dear friend in Kay Yow. In the two decades she fought the disease, Kay never allowed herself to be victimized by cancer. Kay never pitied herself. Instead, she tried to bring awareness to the horrible disease that was robbing her of her life. Through her foundation in conjunction with the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) - The Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund, in partnership with The V Foundation for Cancer Research, she did all that she could do to help others. That was just Kay. Helping to get the cancer fund off the ground put Kay on a mission. She fought for cancer funding the same way she fought the disease... positive and determined every step of the way. Kay was passionate about life and coaching. She was a giver and she gave so much to every life she touched. She made a difference in the lives of so many people, not just the life lessons she shared with her student-athletes at Elon and North Carolina State."

**ROOKIES SHOWED A LITTLE GRIT**

After falling behind to Arkansas by six points, 44-38, with 16:02 to go on Thurs., Jan. 22, a couple of Lady Vol rookies showed some fire and a little grit in a three minute spurt to reclaim the lead. Glory Johnson started things off with a traditional three point play... Lyssi Brewer made a defensive stop with a blocked shot and then made a lay-up off a beautiful feed from Johnson... Johnson then fed Shekinna Stricklen for a lay-up to tie the game at 45-all... A steal by Johnson led to another lay-up opportunity for Alicia Manning to put the Lady Vols up by two, 47-45.

**ALEX FULLER -- EVER THE LEADER**

Tennessee Lady Vol basketball graduate forward Alex Fuller has decided to exchange her number 44 jersey for that of teammate Cait McMahan starting with the game versus South Carolina. Prior to the Vanderbilt game on Jan. 11, McMahan, a redshirt sophomore point guard, decided to step into the role of a student assistant after chronic knee soreness finally sidelined her. Fuller will now wear McMahan's number 2 jersey for the remainder of the season. "Cait is such a competitor and a leader for our team," said Fuller. "We are both Tennessee girls and grew up wanting to wear the orange jersey. I am doing this as a tribute to Cait. I know how much she wants to be on the floor helping to lead this team. There is a lot of heart in the number 2 jersey." A few years back, Fuller was forced to the sidelines during her rookie season to give her surgically repaired knees a chance to rehab. She remembers when Shanna Zolman had a surprise for teammate Sidney Spencer on Feb. 24, 2005 after Spencer tore her ACL. Zolman wore Spencer's #1 jersey for the rest of the season.

**BLINK AND WE WERE GONE IN JANUARY**

The Ole Miss game was just the third home date in the month of January for UT. The Lady Vols opened the SEC slate with a home win over Kentucky (69-64) on Jan. 8 and took a tough 68-56 win over Carolina on Jan. 18. The Lady Vols finished the month with a home win over Mississippi on Jan. 29, 60-59.

**SEND OUT A SEARCH PARTY**

UT coach Pat Summitt needs to send out a search party to look for accurate shooters. The 2008-09 Lady Vols are shooting a program worst 40.8 percent from the field eclipsing the 2004-05 team which only connected on 41.6 percent of its shots for the season. UT's 33.9 shooting percentage vs. Mississippi State was the worst of the season in a win.

**CRASH CART AT MISS STATE**

Tennessee was already without the temporary services of sophomore post Vicki Baugh (injured knee on Jan. 1) and the premature ending to point guard Cait McMahan's career (announced Jan. 10) when the team rolled into Mississippi State on Jan. 15. For the second year in a row at State, three UT players were injured. Last year, it was a broken nose for Angie Bjorklund, a hyper-extended knee for Candace Parker and a biceps strain for Alberta Auguste. This year, Kelley Cain came down hard on her surgically repaired right knee in the first half and did not return... Alex Fuller's eye was scratched and Shekinna Stricklen received a rib contusion.

**STRICK FOUND A WAY**

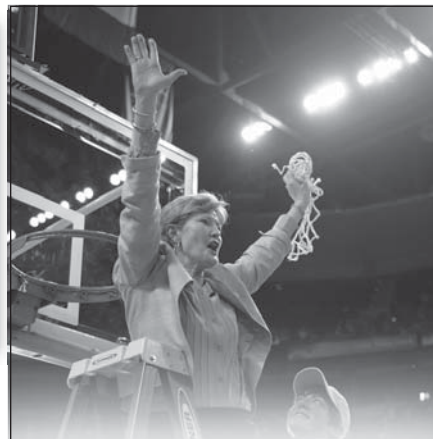
Rookie Shekinna Stricklen was having a challenging night from the field (1-10) against Mississippi State on Jan. 15 when she connected on a three-pointer with 1:45 to go to put the Lady Vols ahead for good, 59-56. Strick also cashed in on 10-10 free throws to finish with a team high 15 points on the night.

**CHARITY BEGINS AT HOME**

In seven SEC games, freshman Shekinna Stricklen has hit 26 of 28 of her free throws.

**GRABBED 400TH SEC WIN**

The University of Tennessee Lady Vols' win over Mississippi State on Jan. 15 was the program's 400th all-time victory over an SEC foe. UT is now 403-61 vs. SEC schools. Lady Vol coach Pat Summitt has been on board for 400 wins and 60 losses. A 2-1 record versus South Carolina and a 1-0 mark against Georgia pre-dates Summitt's coaching tenure with the Lady Vols.



**REVIEWING THE GOOD...**

The Lady Vols have been hitting the boards... Tennessee is grabbing 44.0 rpg and outrebounding the opposition by +6.8 (37.2)...At Texas, the Longhorns schooled the Lady Vols on the boards, 52-41... Leading the charge on the boards is sophomore Vicki Baugh who is grabbing 7.5 rpg -- dipping below the +10 rpg she had been pulling down when she was healthy... Should Baugh be able to return to a double-digit rebounding slate, she'd be the first Lady Vol since Patricia "Trish" Roberts to record extra digit rebounds in a season... Roberts averaged 14.2 rpg (1976-77)... Quick hands and feet for Shekinna Stricklen and Glory Johnson have resulted in the rookies leading the team in thefts this season as "Kinna" has 41 steals and Johnson 25... Stricklen has the individual team lead with five steals against GWU... Speaking of team leaders, Briana Bass dished out eight helpers in the game versus Louisiana Tech... she was one assist off the Lady Vol rookie record of nine set by Jody Adams twice during her freshman campaign in 1989-90.

**THEN THERE'S THE BAD AND/OR UGLY...**

Perhaps one of the reasons UT has been so tough on the boards is that there are a lot of misses on the offensive end this year resulting in a 41.1 percent field goal shooting accuracy... The team took a big step in the right direction notching their second 50% game of the season reaching 50 percent (exactly) against Gonzaga. Previously, UT connected on 51.7 percent from the field vs. MTSU and fell off the apple cart one game later posting the worst FG percentage of the season registering 33% at Texas... With the exception of Angie Bjorklund, the Lady Vol three-point bombardiers have only reached 33.9 percent of their tries... As young players learn the UT system, they need to embrace the "Love thy neighbor" credo... The Lady Vols have only registered 243 assists on 489 made field goals... Free throws improved to 68.6 percent after a shaky start but dipped to 45.8% in the Texas game -- missing charity tosses could cost a bigger win down the line... In the second effort department, the Lady Vols are looking to improve on 16.8 ppg second chance points.

**MANNING BECAME THE 56TH**

Rookie Alicia Manning, a 6'1" freshman from Etowah, Ga., became the 56th all-time Lady Vol to earn a starting assignment as a Tennessee rookie when she started at point guard versus Vanderbilt on Jan. 11, 2009.

**WENT OVER 100,000 AT HOME**

The Lady Vols have eclipsed 100,000 fans at home games for the last 15 consecutive years. A total of 120,758 folks have attended nine games at home this season for an average of 13,418. A season high 16,413 showed up at the South Carolina game on Jan. 18.

**LOSING CAITY-MAC**

The Lady Vol roster dipped to 11 players when redshirt sophomore basketball player Cait McMahan decided to change her role with the team. The 5'4" guard had been experiencing continued pain, swelling

and dysfunction in her right knee following a number of surgeries and procedures, the most recent on Sept. 3, 2008. After consulting with her orthopaedic physicians, Dr. Greg Mathien and Dr. Russ Betcher, Lady Vol Head Coach Pat Summitt, and Jenny Moshak, University of Tennessee Associate Athletics Director for Sports Medicine, McMahan arrived at the joint decision (on Jan. 10, 2009) that it was time for her to step away from a playing role and move into that of a student assistant coach on the Lady Vol sideline for the remainder of the season. As a Lady Vol rookie in the 2006-07 NCAA Championship season, she played in 35 games and earned one starting assignment. She averaged 2.4 ppg, 1.2 rpg, 1.4 apg while logging almost 14 minutes per contest. This season, McMahan earned a spot in the starting line-up at point guard before her knee became chronically sore. She played in nine games and started six while averaging 4.4 ppg, 1.3 rpg and 1.5 apg in 14.4 minutes of play. "I know how disappointed Cait is," said Summitt. "The last thing she wanted to do was step away from her position on the floor because she is such a great competitor. I welcome Cait's addition in her new role as a student assistant coach bringing that same leadership and determination to the bench."

**YOUNGSTERS NOT TOUGH ON "D"**

Tennessee's young team evolves each game but took a step backwards defensively against both Vanderbilt and Kentucky. The Commodores tossed in 46.2% of its field goal tries -- the second-best by an opponent vs. UT this season. One game earlier vs. Kentucky, the defense was spotty there as well with the Cats tossing in 45% from the field. Virginia is the only team to hit 50% vs. UT this season. To their credit, the Lady Vols have held nine of 15 opponents below 40% from the field.

**ROOKIES CARRYING THE LOAD**

UT's seven rookies are handling 68% (50.9 points per game) of the team's total of 72.3 ppg scoring load and 60.4% (27.7 rebounds per game) of the total of 44.2 rpg.

**LEADING AT THE BREAK**

The Lady Vols have led at halftime in 15 of 20 games this season. Tennessee and Texas (31-all) and Arkansas (32-all) were knotted at halftime... the Lady Vols trailed 33-13 after 20 minutes at Rutgers... Vandy jumped out to a 31-23 halftime lead and Auburn had a 31-26 lead. On average, UT holds a 34.4 to 30.1 halftime lead. The Lady Vols have outscored the opposition 37.3 to 32.9 in the second stanza.

**2008-09 RANKED TIDBITS**

The Lady Vols dropped a game to a ranked team on Jan. 25, 2009, falling to #6/5-ranked Auburn, 82-68. Two weeks earlier, #24-ranked Vanderbilt sent UT home, 74-58. UT claimed its second win over a ranked team this season with a 55-51 road win at #15/14 Rutgers. Number 3/4-ranked Stanford is the highest ranked opponent the Lady Vols have faced this season (a 79-69 OT win)... The Lady Vols lost at #6/5-ranked Texas, 73-59... Virginia was Tennessee's first ranked opponent of the 2008-09 season... The Cavs were ranked #16/15 when they defeated the #5/6 Lady Vols, 83-82... Tennessee's 2008-09 slate originally included 11 contests against currently ranked opposition... Last season, Tennessee faced a total of 20 ranked opponents in 38 games and produced a 18-2 record...

**LADY VOL STREAKS**

The Lady Vols last lost at home was against Virginia, 83-82, on Nov. 17, 2008, since then UT has won eight home games. The last time UT lost on the road was on Jan. 25, 2009 at Auburn, since then, UT has not played a road game. The last time the Lady Vols lost on a neutral court was against LSU, 63-54, in the SEC semis game on Mar. 3, 2007. Since that time, UT is 16-0 on a neutral court.

**LAST LOSS TO AN UNRANKED TEAM?**

It was in the 2005-06 season. Florida became the second unranked team in the 2005-06 season to knock off the Lady Vols, when they won 95-93 OT on Feb. 26,

2006. Exactly one month earlier, unranked Kentucky turned the trick with a 66-63 win over #1/3-ranked Tennessee on Jan. 26, 2006 at Rupp Arena. Previously, it had been four years since an unranked team upset the Lady Vols. So before Florida and Kentucky had their way with UT, when was the last time Tennessee lost to an unranked team? That would have been to LSU on Mar. 2, 2002 at the SEC Tournament in Nashville, Tenn. LSU had been in and out of the Top 25 polls in late January and February. Prior to that, UT's last loss to an unranked team was five years previous (to the day) losing to Auburn on Mar. 2, 1997 at the SEC Tournament.

**THE COMEBACK KIDS**

In all of UT coach Pat Summitt's career collegiate games, none of her Lady Vol teams had mounted the kind of comeback they fashioned against Rutgers on Jan. 3, 2009. Tennessee trailed 33-13 at the half. The 13 points were the fewest ever the Lady Vols have scored in the first half. The deficit also marked the first time in the 2008-09 season, UT has trailed at the half. Additionally, the 20-point halftime deficit was the largest in school history. The previous first-half low was 14 at Virginia on March 25, 1996. The previous largest halftime deficit was 19. Once on Feb. 4, 1996, at Ole Miss and on March 28, 1986, against Southern California in the Final Four in Lexington, Ky. Rutgers led by as many as 23-points before UT rallied for the win. Previously, the Lady Vols had to come back from a 22-point deficit to defeat Illinois in the 1997-98 season.

**COAST-TO-COAST**

Over the Christmas holidays, the Lady Vols gave new meaning to coast-to-coast. UT traveled to Spokane, Washington on Dec. 27 for Angie Bjorklund's homecoming game and made Gonzaga their temporary home-away-from-home. The hospitality of Angie Bjorklund's mom and dad, Kris and Jim, made the junket even more enjoyable in the 56 inches of snow that blanketed the city. After defeating the Zags, 77-58, on Dec. 30, the Tennessee traveling party headed to the East Coast on New Year's Eve. Following the Jan. 3 come-from-behind game against Rutgers, 55-51, the Lady Vols finally returned to Knoxville.

**HOME COURT STREAKS BROKEN BY UT**

Throughout the years, UT has been responsible for breaking a number of lengthy home court winning streaks, 21 to be exact. This season, UT has taken down three streaks -- the Lady Vols broke Rutgers' 20-game home winning streak at the RAC. *Also this season, UT snapped ODU's nation-leading 29 game home court winning streak at the "Ted" on Dec. 18. Earlier in the month, the Lady Vols snapped GWU's 17-game streak at the Smith Center on Dec. 2.* Last season, UT snapped Duke's 24-game winning streak which was the longest in the nation at the time.

The Lady Vols know something about home court winning streaks -- Tennessee shares the NCAA record at 69 consecutive wins at home.

**COMING OF AGE WIN**

Tennessee's overtime upset victory against #3/4-ranked Stanford, 79-69, was a great way to go into the Christmas break. The Lady Vols had a great OT defensive effort in the win over the Cardinal holding SU to just one point in the extra stanza. The team, minus West Coasters Angie Bjorklund and Vicki Baugh, reassembled in Knoxville on Dec. 26 for practice prior to traveling to Spokane. The first full team practice back after the break was on Dec. 27 following a full day of flying.

**HEY! THE GANG WAS ALL HERE -- FINALLY**

It's a little known fact that Lady Vol Coach Pat Summitt is a master juggler. After all, she's only had a full roster of 12 players available in just four games this season -- DePaul, George Washington, Texas and Gonzaga. Against DePaul on Nov. 30, Lady Vol Coach Pat Summitt enjoyed a full roster available to play for the first time in the 2008-09 season. Sophomore Angie Bjorklund, the only returning player with solid experience as a starter (30 starts) was available for the first time this season af-

ter missing five games. Back from concussions were Alicia Manning and Kelley Cain who missed one and four games, respectively.

**BAUGH WAS BACK IN A BIG WAY**

Lady Vol sophomore Vicki Baugh missed a lot of the preseason rehabbing her ACL repaired knee. It didn't seem to matter that she was having to play catch up. Since she was cleared to play and before she was hurt before the Rutgers game, Baugh played and started in 10 games and averaged 7.8 ppg, 9.7 rpg and 2.0 bpg in 23.6 minutes of action. She recorded back-to-back double-doubles of 13 pts. and 12 rbs. (La Tech) and 11 pts. and 15 rbs. (Western Carolina). She suffered a setback when she injured her knee prior to the game at Rutgers.

**ALL THINGS ACADEMIC**

Seven Lady Vol hoopsters earned Dean's List honors for the Fall semester. Rookies Briana Bass, Kelley Cain, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and sophomores Vicki Baugh, Angie Bjorklund and Sydney Smallbone all earned over a 3.0 GPA.

**GOT THE PATCH**

Tennessee athletes who have achieved honor roll status in the classroom display a "Vol Scholar" patch on their uniform. The "VS" letters are wrapped around a replica of the torch carried by the UT Torchbearer. Currently, sophomores Angie Bjorklund, Cait McMahan and Sydney Smallbone display the academic patch on their uniforms. Following Fall semester grades, new additions to wear the patch will be Briana Bass, Kelley Cain, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and Vicki Baugh.

**GLORY BROKE OUT OF MINI SLUMP**

Rookie Glory Johnson broke out of a mini scoring slump vs. Kentucky with 14 points. In the three games previous, she managed single digits and was held to a season low four points against Gonzaga. Against Stanford, Johnson was held to just single digit scoring for the first time in her Lady Vol career with seven points. One game previously (against Old Dominion), she became only the second Lady Vol to open her career with double-digit scoring in her first 10 games... Four-time All-American Chamique Holdsclaw holds the UT record for most consecutive double-digit scoring outputs to begin her Tennessee career with 14... Against ODU, Johnson passed Candace Parker for second on the list... Parker had nine straight games of double-digit scoring to open her freshman year...

**IN THE GROOVE**

Coming off a career-high night against Old Dominion with 29 points, sophomore Angie Bjorklund continued her hot streak against Stanford. She tallied 16 points and four assists in 41 minutes. As a rookie, she did not score a single point against the Cardinal last season in two games. Senior Alex Fuller maintained her groove after a career-high five assists and tying a career high with 12 rebounds after being inserted back into the starting lineup replacing an ailing Shekinna Stricklen.... Fuller was 4-4 in free throws in a critical stretch versus Stanford and played some tough "D."

**AP STREAK WAS BROKEN**

Tennessee's record run in the top 10 was finally stopped. The Lady Vols' streak of 211 straight weeks in the top 10 ended on Dec. 15, 2008, when they were ranked 11th in The Associated Press Top 25 poll. Tennessee, which lost at then-No. 6/5 Texas 73-59 on Dec. 14, was last out of the first 10 on March 3, 1997. The run went 56 weeks longer than the men's record of 155 set by UCLA. North Carolina, which stayed No. 2 this week, now has the longest active streak in the Top 10 with 70 consecutive weeks. It would take them nearly eight years to match the Lady Vols' run.

**GOT BACK ON TRACK**

Before UT lost at Texas on Dec. 14, 2008, the Lady Vols had won 13 consecutive road games dating back to a 73-68 OT loss at #5-ranked Stanford on Dec.

22, 2007. Tennessee got back on the winning road track with a tough 81-76 win at Old Dominion on Dec. 18.

**YOUNGEST LINE-UP IN LADY VOL HISTORY**

When rookies Shekinna Stricklen, Glory Johnson and Briana Bass started the game versus Middle Tennessee with sophomores Vicki Baugh and Angie Bjorklund, it marked the youngest starting lineup in Lady Vol history. Three rookies have started in three other lineups in the past but never with a couple of sophomores as their wing men. Previous three freshmen lineups: 1980-81 - Tanya Haave (Fr.), Mary Ostrowski (Fr.), Pat Hatmaker (Fr.), with Lea Henry (So.) and Cindy Noble (Sr.); 1984-85 - Karla Horton (Fr.), Kathy Spinks (Fr.), Dawn Marsh (Fr.), with Shelley Sexton (So.) and Shelia Collins (Sr.); 1997-98 - Tamika Catchings (Fr.), Semeka Randall (Fr.), Teresa Geter (Fr.), with Chamique Holdsclaw (Jr.) and Kellie Jolly (Jr.).

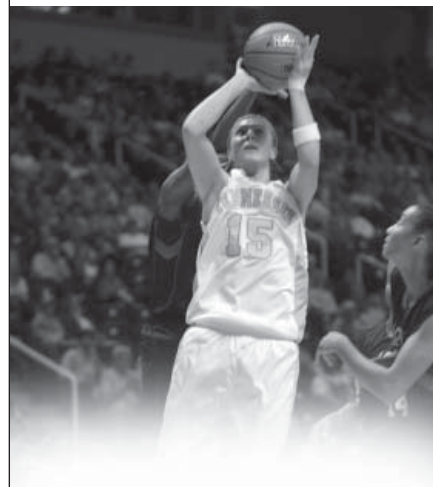
**"BIRD" AND ALEX = GRADUATION RATE PERFECT**

boarded the plane with her Lady Vol teammates to travel to Texas. Fuller received her degree in exercise science and will begin grad school in January 2009 majoring in both Sport Management and Sport Psychology. Also graduating on Saturday with Fuller was former Lady Vol hoopster Alberta "Bird" Auguste who completed her eligibility last May and was a member of the 2007 and 2008 NCAA title teams.

**THINGS CEREBRAL**

This season, four Lady Vols dealt with concussions just eight games into the season -- a scary stat. Three of the head blows were suffered in practice as Shekinna Stricklen, Kelley Cain and Amber Gray all went to the mat. Rookie Alicia Manning was knocked in the head in the game with Louisiana Tech. Gray was cleared to play against MTSU.

**AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL**

Rookie Shekinna Stricklen had a break-out game against MTSU. The Morrilton, Ark., native tossed in a career high 20 points while pulling down six rebounds. Her ATC moment came just before halftime when she nailed a 33-footer before the buzzer.

**BOMBS AWAY ANGIE B**

The old Angie Bjorklund showed up for the game at Old Dominion. The long-range gunner hit 6-10 treys en route to tying her career high of 29 points. The sophomore was back as a starter in the game versus MTSU. As a rookie, Bjorklund started 30 games and then hit a wall in February and suffered a case of the "February Freshman Fade." To open this season, she had to deal with a bulging disc in her back and has only played in the last several games. Against Middle, she tossed in 16 points including a couple of her signature treys.

**FIRST LOSS IN SECOND GAME OF THE SEASON**

The last time Tennessee opened the season with a 1-1 record was during the 2002-03 campaign. The Lady Vols started the year with a win over #22-ranked Oklahoma, 94-68, and then fell to #1-ranked Duke, 76-55, in the Jimmy V Classic at the RBC Center in Raleigh, N.C. UT met Duke again later that season and handed the Blue Devils a 66-56 loss in the NCAA Final Four semifinals.

**ANOTHER SUMMITT ACCOLADE**

Coach Pat Summitt was selected as an inaugural recipient of the Joe Lapchick Character Award. Also honored at the Nov. 20 ceremony at Madison Square Garden in New York City was Hall of Fame coaches Lou Carnesecca of St. John's and Dean Smith of North Carolina. "It is an honor to have been selected as the first recipient of the Joe Lapchick Character Award. He was a legendary figure on both the collegiate and professional level of our game," said Summitt. "I am humbled to accept an award which bears his name."

**JOINING THE LADY VOL FOLD**

University of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball head coach Pat Summitt announced the early signing of three student-athletes to National Letters of Intent for the 2009-10 academic school year. Joining the eight-time NCAA Champions are signees Taber Spani, a 6'1" home-

schooled shooting guard from Lee's Summit, Mo., playing for the Metro Academy Mavericks; Kamiko Williams, a 5'11" combination guard from Northeast High School in Clarksville, Tenn., and Faith Dupree, a 6'3" post from The Webb School in Knoxville, Tenn. Spani, ranked by ESPN.com as the nation's 13th ranked overall player in the class of 2009, is also regarded as one of the top back-court players. She is a heady guard with incredible three point range. Last season, she averaged 29.6 points, 11.1 rebounds, 3.4 assists, three blocks and 2.4 steals a game and capped her junior campaign by winning the DiRenna Award, which honors the top boys and girls basketball players in metropolitan Kansas City. In signing Dupree and Williams, it marks the first time Summitt has picked up two scholarship players from the state of Tennessee in the same recruiting class since Misty Greene (Decatur), Kellie Jolly (Sparta) and Brynae Laxton (Oneida) signed with the Lady Vols in 1995. That trio went on to win three consecutive NCAA titles in 1996, 1997 and 1998. Dupree plays at The Webb School and is coached by former Lady Vol Shelley Sexton Collier. As a junior, she averaged 14.5 points, 6.3 rebounds, 2.1 assists, 1.7 blocks and 1.2 steals per game as the Spartans were the Division II-AA state runner-up and she was named to the Division II-AA all-tournament and all-region teams. Dupree will join former teammate and current Lady Vol starting rookie forward Glory Johnson at UT. Williams was the first player to commit to this recruiting class when she notified Summitt of her intentions in the Fall of 2007. She is a left-handed combination guard who is comfortable at the point or on the wing. In 22 games last season, she averaged 19.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game and also recorded 87 assists and 84 steals. These Signees will join 11 returning players on the Lady Vols 2009-10 roster. Tennessee's lone graduate will be fifth year senior forward Alex Fuller. Next year, UT's roster will have no seniors, four juniors, seven sophomores and the freshmen class of Dupree, Spani and Williams.

**ABOUT THE ROOKIES**

Six Lady Vols made their rookie debut on Sat., Nov. 15 against San Francisco. About the newbies... Shekinna Stricklen and Alyssia Brewer are first-time Lady Vols from their home states, Arkansas and Oklahoma, respectively. Briana Bass, from Indianapolis, Ind., grew up watching Tamika Catchings play for the WNBA's Indiana Fever from a bird-eye view. Bass was a ball girl for the Fever. Glory Johnson is the sixth player from Knoxville to don a Lady Vol jersey. She joins Liza Graves (1975-78), Holly Warlick (1976-80), Pat Hatmaker (1980-84), walk-on Kristie Snyder (1983-84) and Tanika Smith (1993-95) as local products who wore the orange and white. Alicia Manning, from Woodstock, Ga., is sure happy that video streaming and Lady Vol radio broadcasts are available on the internet. Her parents (Virginia and Jeff) currently live in Hawaii where her dad has a job. Amber Gray lives in a long shadow. Her father, Carlton had a seven-year playing career as an NFL defensive back. Her great grandfather, Benjamin Hooks, was a colleague of Martin Luther King and once headed the NAACP. He was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

**KEEP AN EYE ON REBOUNDING**

For two of the past three seasons, the Lady Vols have reset all-time low rebounding marks. The 2007 NCAA Champs hold the distinction as the worst UT rebounding team of all-time with just 38.4 rpg. The 2008 NCAA Champs collected 40.9 rpg and finished as the sixth worst in Lady Vol history last year.

basketball. It's a little known fact that there has only been one double-figure rebounder in the history of the program -- Olympian and Kodak All-American Patricia Roberts. Roberts hauled in 14.2 rpg (467 total) in her only season as a Lady Vol in 1976-77. She also claimed scoring honors with 29.9 ppg (987 points). In 2006-07, Candace Parker came the closest to a double-figure rebounding average but had to settle for 9.8 rpg.

**300 WINS IN TBA**

Tennessee recorded its 300th win in Thompson-Boling Arena when the Lady Vols defeated the Stanford Cardinal, 79-69 OT on Dec. 21, 2008. Seven years earlier, UT grabbed its 200th TBA win over the University of Southern California on Nov. 18, 2001, 106-66. UT has now amassed a 303-19 (.942) record since the Orange and White moved into the Thompson-Boling Arena to start the 1987-88 season 20-years ago. Along the way, the Lady Vols have produced nine flawless home records in 1988-89 (15-0), 1991-92 (14-0), 1992-93 (13-0), 1993-94 (15-0), 1994-95 (15-0), 1997-98 (16-0), 1998-99 (14-0), 2000-01 (15-0) and 2002-03 (16-0). UT also registered an NCAA record 69-game home court-winning streak from Feb. 1, 1991 thru Jan. 2, 1996.

**JUST 19 LOSSES**

The Tennessee Lady Vols rarely lose at home. In fact, since moving to the Thompson-Boling Arena for the 1987-88 campaign, UT has lost two games in one season just six times. UT lost two games in TBA during the inaugural 1987-88 campaign, 1996-97, 1999-00, 2001-02, 2003-04 and the 2005-06 seasons. The 19 all-time losses at TBA have come at the hands of just 10 teams: Virginia (2008), Florida (2006), LSU (2006, 2008), Duke (2004, 2007), Connecticut (2004, 2002, 2000, 1996), Louisiana Tech (1999, 1989), Georgia (1996, 1991), Texas (2003, 2002, 1987), Stanford (1996) and Auburn (1988).

**HOME SWEET HOME -- OVER 400 HOME WINS**

The victory over Georgia on Jan. 31, 2005, was the Lady Vols 400th home win since Pat Summitt took over as head coach in 1974. Summitt has won 91.4 percent of all home games in 35 years producing a 452-44 overall record. Home losses (in the Summitt era) include: six in Alumni Gym from 1974-76; 18 in Stokely Athletics Center from 1976-87; and 19 in Thompson-Boling Arena since 1987.

**A LOOK AT ATTENDANCE**

The Tennessee Lady Vols staying power with the home fans is evidenced by the huge numbers who have turned out for games in Knoxville since 1990. Tennessee has won the attendance challenge 13 out of the last 19 years. From 2000-08, the Lady Vols attracted 1,719,694 spectators per game for an average of 14,451 at 119. Texas Tech is second with 1,317,848 attending 108 games in Lubbock for an average of 12,202. Connecticut ranks third with 1,534,673 folks at 128 games for an average of 11,989.

**100 POINT GAMES**

Since 1974, the Lady Vols have gone over the century mark 69 times. Last season, DePaul allowed 102 Tennessee points on Jan. 2, 2008. The 1987-88 team hit triple digits in seven games to lead the NCAA.

**IN OVERTIME**

The Lady Vols are 26-14 all-time in overtime games. The most OT games in a year was tied in 2003-04 with four as the Lady Vols went 3-1 in overtime losing to Georgia, 68-66, and defeating Auburn, 68-61, DePaul, 96-89, and Stanford, 70-66. It tied the mark set in 1996-97, when the Lady Vols were 3-1 in overtime contests losing to Georgia, 94-93, and defeating Texas, 68-65, Vanderbilt, 92-79 and LSU, 100-99. UT's 22 points in the OT against Florida (2-3-05), was the most ever scored by the Lady Vols in a single overtime. UT's most recent OT affair was a 79-69 win over Stanford on Dec. 21, 2008, at home.

**OVER 500 GAMES VS. RANKED**

Tennessee's game versus #12 Georgia on Feb. 16,

2006 was the Lady Vols' 500th all-time versus a ranked team since the inception of the polls in 1976. UT is an amazing 400-154 (.725) versus ranked teams. The 2007-08 NCAA Champs were 18-2 versus ranked teams.

**POLLSTERS**

The Tennessee Lady Vols started the season in somewhat unfamiliar territory in the Top 25 Preseason polls. The Associated Press had UT in the seventh position to start the season, while the ESPN/USA TODAY Coaches Poll had UT in the sixth spot receiving one first place vote. Tennessee's start in the AP poll is the lowest since the 1985-86 season when UT started in the number nine spot.

**HEY! WE LOVE A HAPPY MEAL**

The Tennessee Lady Vols lead the nation with the number of McDonald's High School All-Americans on their roster in 2008-09 with nine players. Rutgers follows with eight "Mickey D" selections and Duke has seven. Four schools have six McDonald's honorees on their rosters -- North Carolina, Maryland, Stanford and Connecticut. Tennessee's McDonald's All-Americans: Vicki Baugh, Angie Bjorklund, Alyssia Brewer, Kelley Cain, Alex Fuller, Amber Gray, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and Shekinna Stricklen.

**BANNER RAISING**

For the second season in a row, the Lady Vols hoisted a banner to the Thompson-Boling Arena rafters to commemorate another NCAA title. Championship number eight was celebrated on Nov. 15 in pregame ceremonies before the Lady Vols' game with San Francisco. NCAA MVP Candace Parker and Alberta Auguste were on hand representing two of the starting five who completed their eligibility after season's end last year. Quan and Jerome Hornbuckle stood in for their daughter Alexis who is currently playing in Turkey. Also playing professionally overseas and unable to attend were Shannon Bobbitt (playing in Turkey) and Nicky Anosike (playing in Israel). Prior to raising the 2007 Championship last Nov. 18 on the day the Lady Vols defeated #21/22 Texas, 92-67, nine years and five days had passed since the Tennessee Lady Vols last hung a NCAA Championship banner in Thompson-Boling Arena. On Nov. 13, 1998, UT celebrated the 1998 title with a banner raising against another WCC school, the Portland Pilots with a 94-57 win.

**STAFFERS HAVE -- NEVER A FORMER PLAYER**

Coaches Kellie Jolly Harper and Tanya Haave gave it a shot but couldn't knock off their former college coach. UT coach Pat Summitt has faced many former players and assistant coaches in a variety of games thru the years but no former Lady Vol player has ever defeated her mentor. Former assistant Carolyn Peck was the first to record a victory over her former boss. While at Purdue, Peck handed Summitt a 78-68 loss on Nov. 15, 1998 in the State Farm Tip-Off Classic in West Lafayette, Ind. The defeat snapped UT's 46-game consecutive winning streak (that was second only to Louisiana Tech's NCAA all-time 54-game winning streak). Former assistants Mickie DeMoss turned the trick as a head coach at Kentucky, 66-63, on Jan. 26, 2006, and Sylvia Hatchell managed to pull off the feat twice at North Carolina (75-63 on Mar. 28, 2006 and 70-57, Dec. 3, 2006).

Former Lady Vol players turned head coaches have been less successful. Former Lady Vol All-America Patricia Roberts tried while head coach at Maine (0-2, lost 77-64 on Dec. 13, 1990 and 86-71 on Nov. 24, 1991). Former Lady Vol Olympian and point guard Lea Henry faced Summitt in the NCAA Tournament with her Georgia State team and lost 98-68 on Mar. 15, 2002. Next to try to knock off Summitt was Kellie Jolly Harper with her Western Carolina team on Mar. 20, 2005. The Lady Catamounts lost 94-43. The most recent former Lady Vol hoopsters to take on their former coach was UT All-American and San Francisco head coach Tanya Haave. "LaMachine's" Dons fell to UT on Nov. 15, 2008, 68-39. Ten days later in Knoxville, Harper's Catamounts fell to the Lady Vols, 83-56.

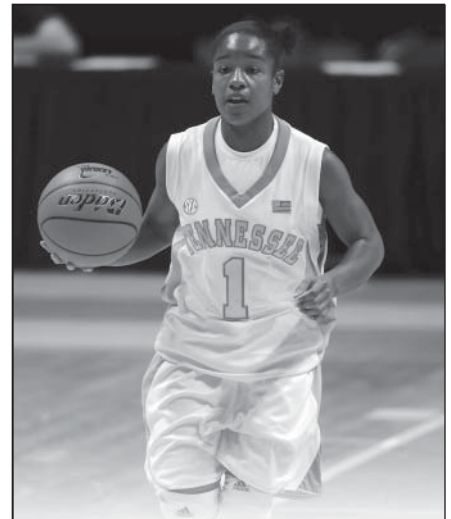

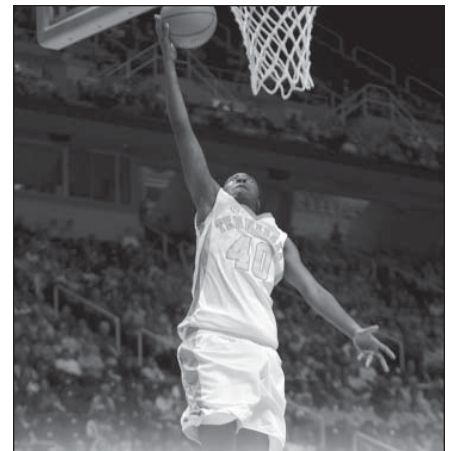

The list of opening day rookie starters: Angie Bjorklund, 2007, Candace Parker, 2005, Shyra Ely 2001, Ashley Robinson 2000, Gwen Jackson 1999, Kyra Elzy 1996, Chamique Holdsclaw 1995, Tiffani Johnson 1994, Bridgette Gordon and Sheila Frost 1985.

**THE NOD**

Stricklen and Johnson become the 53rd and 54th Lady Vols all-time to start during their freshman season -- both have started each game so far this year. Last season, Angie Bjorklund started in 30 of 38 games. Previously, Cait McMahan earned a start at point guard versus Louisiana Tech during her freshman season. Prior to Cait's starting nod, then-redshirt freshman Candace Parker played and started in all 36 games her rookie season in 2005-06. A season earlier, Tennessee coach Pat Summitt liked what she saw out of the 2004-05 rookie class as two players earned starting nods during the season. Nicky Anosike played in all 35 games with 25 starting assignments and Alexis Hornbuckle played in all 35 games with 21 starts. This duo became the 48th and 49th rookies all-time to earn starting assignments at UT as rookies. The 2001-02 rookie class found three players earn a starting nod as Loree Moore, Shyra Ely and Brittany Jackson all started at some point as rookies.

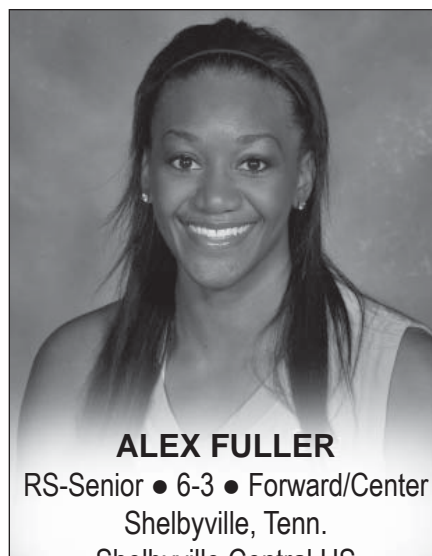

- Continues to be the steady veteran for the Lady Vols. Against Ole Miss, she recorded her first career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Eight of her boards came in the second half, which she played all 20 minutes of.

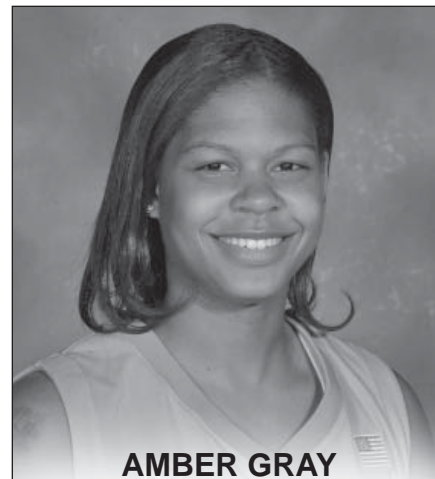

## Game Notes • Tennessee vs. Oklahoma • Feb. 2, 2009

• University of Tennessee Lady Vol redshirt sophomore basketball player Cait McMahan has decided to change her role with the team. The 5'4" guard has experienced continuing pain, swelling and dysfunction in her right knee following a number of surgeries and procedures, the most recent on Sept. 3, 2008. After consulting with her orthopaedic physicians, Dr. Greg Mathien and Dr. Russ Betcher, Lady Vol Head Coach Pat Summitt, and Jenny Moshak, University of Tennessee Associate Athletics Director for Sports Medicine, McMahan arrived at the joint decision this afternoon that it was time for her to step away from a playing role and move into that of a student assistant coach on the Lady Vol sideline for the remainder of the season.

"Cait had been experiencing discomfort in the knee and conservative treatments did not address the problems. Her last scope eliminated some loose bodies, smoothed out joint surface irregularities and addressed a small lateral meniscus tear. Her knee is not able to withstand the rigors of Division I basketball on a day-to-day basis," said Moshak. Her last surgery came after McMahan sat out the 2007-08 season following an extensive surgery on June 6, 2007, to repair a lesion on the articular cartilage in her right knee. The guard from Maryville, Tenn., originally tore the anterior cruciate ligament in the same knee on Nov. 29, 2005, while playing at Heritage H.S.

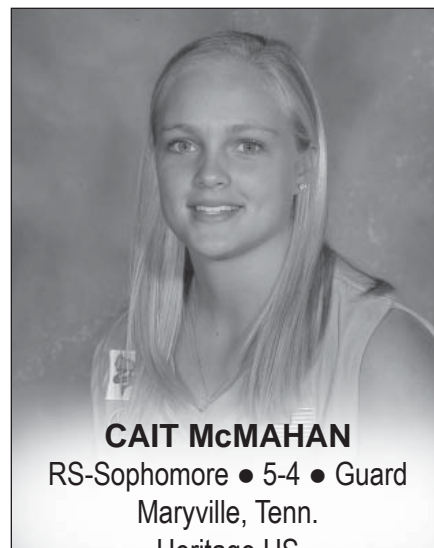
"I have to face reality and accept the fact that my knee can't take the day-to-day pounding to play for this team," said McMahan. "I'll try to continue to be a leader for my team from the sidelines." As a Lady Vol rookie in the 2006-07 NCAA Championship season, she played in 35 games and earned one starting assignment. She averaged 2.4 ppg, 1.2 rpg, 1.4 apg while logging almost 14 minutes per contest. This season, McMahan earned a spot in the starting line-up at point guard before her knee became chronically sore. She played in nine games and started six while averaging 4.4 ppg, 1.3 rpg and 1.5 apg in 14.4 minutes of play.

"I know how disappointed Cait is," said Summitt. "The last thing she wanted to do was step away from her position on the floor because she is such a great competitor. I welcome Cait's addition in her new role as a student assistant coach bringing that same leadership and determination to the bench."

- Did not play at Rutgers or against Kentucky to rest her sore knees.
- Played two minutes at Gonzaga for her first action since the Texas game.
- Did not play at Old Dominion or against Stanford due to sore knees.
- Played only five minutes at Texas, recording one assist.
- Did not play against Middle Tennessee while resting her knees.
- Grabbed three rebounds in 18 minutes at George Washington.
- In 11 minutes against DePaul, she scored five points, dished two assists, grabbed one rebound and a steal.
- In 18 minutes against Western Carolina, scored nine points on 4-of-6 shooting. Also dished two assists, grabbed two rebounds and a steal. Earned Lady Vol Player of the Game.
- Finished with only four points in 16 minutes against Louisiana Tech after picking up three fouls.
- Came off the bench to play a career-high 30 minutes at Chattanooga, finishing with seven points, four assists and three rebounds.
- Her free throw with 2.6 seconds to play gave UT a 65-63 lead over the Lady Mocs.
- In 16 minutes against Virginia, she tallied a career-high 11 points on 3-of-5 shooting, including a perfect 4-of-4 from the free-throw line.
- Made the first basket against Virginia - a three off a tip assist from Glory Johnson 1:13 into the game.

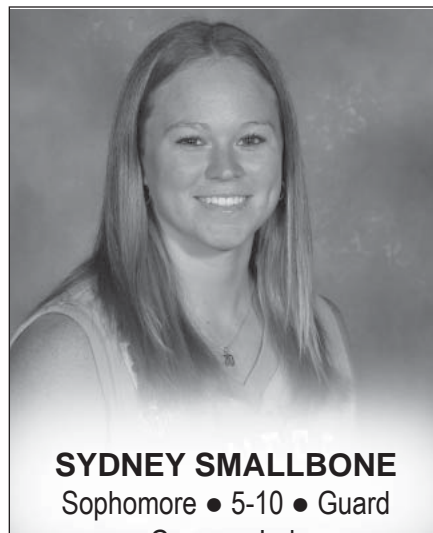

**EXHIBITION 1: CARSON-NEWMAN**

On Nov. 6, 2008, at Thompson-Boling Arena, the University of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball team opened its 2008-09 season with a 135-55 exhibition win over the Carson-Newman Lady Eagles.

Freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) made an impressive debut, finishing with 33 points and 14 rebounds to lead the Lady Vols. She was one of six Big Orange players to finish in double figures. Freshman Alyssia Brewer (Sapulpa, Okla.) also posted a double-double with 14 points, 13 rebounds to go with seven steals.

The Lady Vols opened the game with a 17-4 run, spurred by redshirt freshman Kelley Cain's (Atlanta, Ga.) nine points. Cain would finish with 18 first half tallies on 8-of-10 shooting.

Cain was not the only Lady Vol working hard in the paint, as UT outscored the Lady Eagles 44-6 in the paint in the first half and 80-14 for the game.

After finishing off her second national title in as many years in 2008 with a limited bench, Head Coach Pat Summitt played all 10 Lady Vols available, which led to 86 points contributed by substitutes.

Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) earned a starting spot in the lineup and made her first shot, a two-point field goal, 1:48 into the game. Stricklen wasn't the only rookie to make her first shot in the Orange and White as Brewer and Amber Gray (West Chester, Ohio) both made their initial three shots.

An Alicia Manning (Woodstock, Ga.) free throw at the 8:07 mark - her first charity toss of the evening - put UT over the century mark for the fourth time in the last five exhibitions against Carson-Newman. The 135 points mark the second-highest exhibition output by a Pat Summitt-coached team, only ranking behind a 144-point outburst against Dynamo Kiev on Nov. 5, 2000.

Leading the Lady Eagles was Mandy Mendenhall with 13 points and eight rebounds.

**EXHIBITION 2: LOVE & BASKETBALL**

The University of Tennessee women's basketball team closed its exhibition slate with a commanding 85-50 victory over Love & Basketball on Nov. 9 at Thompson-Boling Arena. Redshirt freshman Kelley Cain (Atlanta, Ga.) and freshman Alyssia Brewer (Sapulpa, Okla.) each recorded double-doubles to lead a balanced attack that saw seven Lady Vols score at least nine points.

Cain finished with 12 points and 10 rebounds, while Brewer added 11 points and 11 boards. Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) scored a team-high 16 points. Sophomore Sydney Smallbone (Granger, Ind.) added 12, freshman Amber Gray (West Chester, Ohio) had 11 and freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) scored nine. Freshman Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) scored nine points, all on three-pointers and dished out a game-high six assists.

Trailing 9-8 early, the Lady Vols broke the game open by ending the first half on a 34-4 run to take a commanding 42-13 lead into halftime.

Love & Basketball went up 11-10 before Stricklen sparked a 10-0 spurt to put UT up 20-11 by whipping a no-look dish to Amber Gray for an easy lay-in on a fastbreak.

The Orange and White went up 28-13 on back-to-back threes by freshman Alicia Manning (Woodstock, Ga.) and Bass with six minutes remaining in the half, and extended the lead to 30-13 on a short jumper by Smallbone on the next possession. UT ended the half with lay-ups by Johnson, Brewer, Stricklen and Cain. Stricklen's lay-up came off a nifty behind-the-back dish from Gray on a fastbreak.

The Lady Vols weren't as dominant during the second half which was tempered by UT's loss of senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.), who left the game with 16:53 remaining with an injury and did not return.

Love & Basketball contained UT's offensive outbursts much better in the second half, but did give up a 12-0 run midway through and a 10-0 with the game winding down.

A pair of layups by Cain and two jumpers, including a three, by Smallbone sparked the 12-0 run that put UT up 67-27.

**GAME 1: SAN FRANCISCO**

The University of Tennessee women's basketball team officially opened the 2008-09 season by closing the 2007-08 campaign with the raising of UT's eighth national championship banner to the rafters of Thompson-Boling Arena. With a 68-39 victory over the San Francisco Dons and former Lady Vol Tanya Haave, UT Head Coach Pat Summitt improves to 984-182 for her career.

Freshmen Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen became just the 11th and 12th players to start in their first game at Rocky Top. Johnson, a Knoxville native, led the Big Orange attack with 17 points on 7-of-11 shooting, and grabbed 12 rebounds for a double-double. Stricklen added 12 points and just missed a double-double with nine rebounds. The Morrilton, Ark., native also dished out four assists in 35 minutes of play.

Senior Alex Fuller, making her third career start, managed only four points, but pulled down 12 boards. Sophomore Sydney Smallbone made her first career start and scored seven points to go with two boards and two assists.

Tennessee jumped out to a 9-3 lead, but San Francisco tied the game up at the 7:18 mark with 17 apiece and again at 24 points per with 1:59 to play in the first half. Coach Summitt and her staff, along with Fuller, settled the youngsters down as the Dons only managed to get within nine points, 39-30, with 15:57 remaining in the contest.

The Lady Vols crashed the boards, pulling down 64 for the game compared to just 41 for San Francisco. UT's athleticism and depth showed with 16 fast break points, and a 24-5 advantage off the bench.

"In the second half, they settled down and played much better together. That's what a young team will do. It was good to get a game like this under our belts. We'll learn from it," said Summitt.

Tennessee improved to 32-3 all-time in season-openers under Summitt and 8-0 in its first game following a national championship.

**GAME 2: #16/15 VIRGINIA**

The Tennessee Lady Vols suffered their first defeat of the young season on Nov. 17 at Thompson-Boling Arena when the No. 15 Virginia Cavaliers upset the No. 7 Lady Vols, 83-82. This was only the 19th home loss Tennessee has suffered at Thompson-Boling since it opened in 1987, and was the first time since the 2002-03 season that UT was downed in the second game of the season.

Six Lady Vols finished in double-figures, paced by freshmen Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) and Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) who each finished with 13 points. Redshirt sophomore Cait McMahan (Maryville, Tenn.) finished with a career-high 11 points and sophomore Sydney Smallbone (Granger, Ind.) tied her career-best with 12 points. Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) added 12 and redshirt freshman Kelley Cain (Allanta, Ga.) pitched in 10 points in her first game of the season.

However, Virginia junior Wade Trophy candidate Monica Wright had a career-high 35 points, to go with eight rebounds and five steals. Senior Aisha Mohammed and freshman Whitney Edwards finished with 19 and 13 points, respectively.

This was only the second time the Cavaliers have beaten the Lady Vols in 13 tries. The first was a 79-75 overtime game in the 1990 NCAA East Regional Championship game. That UT loss prevented the Lady Vols from playing in the Final Four in Knoxville. The next season, UT downed UVa to win its third NCAA title.

Smallbone gave UT a quick 7-0 lead, when she converted a four-point play barely 1:40 into the game. After falling behind 17-11, the Lady Vols went on a 12-0 run to take a 23-17 lead midway through the first half.

However, the Cavaliers trimmed their halftime deficit to eight and closed to within three at 45-42 on the strength of a 12-3 run and outscored UT 48-39 in the second half. Tennessee regained a six point lead at 69-63, but was outscored 20-13 down the stretch.

**GAME 3: CHATTANOOGA**

The Tennessee Lady Vols hit the road for the first time this season with a short journey down I-75 to take on the Chattanooga Lady Mocs at the Roundhouse. A crowd of 7,008 -- the fourth largest crowd to see a Lady Moc home game -- was treated to a thriller as the Lady Vols earned a 66-63 win on Nov. 21.

Tennessee built a 10 point lead at 49-39, but Chattanooga got hot and went on a 19-1 run and took a 58-50 lead with 7:43 to play.

With their backs against the walls, the Lady Vols put together a 7-0 run to cut the deficit to one at 61-60 and tied the game at 63 with 1:21 to play on a three-pointer by freshman Alicia Manning (Woodstock, Ga.).

Tennessee was able to grab the slimmest of leads at 64-63 on a Vicki Baugh (Sacramento, Calif.) free throw with just under a minute to go. Holding on to that lead, the Lady Vols stretched the lead to three from the charity stripe -- where they struggled most of the game, shooting only 53.5 percent (23-of-43). Redshirt sophomore Cait McMahan (Maryville, Tenn.) made it a 65-63 game with her free throw with 2.6 seconds on the clock and freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) ensured that a full court heave would not beat UT with her free throw with two seconds left.

The Lady Mocs would not even get a full court shot off after Stricklen missed her second free throw, but grabbed the loose rebound as the clock hit triple zeros.

Freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) led the Lady Vols with her second double-double in her young career with 19 points and 13 rebounds. She added four steals and a pair of assists in 31 minutes. Classmate Alyssia Brewer (Sapulpa, Okla.) was the only other Lady Vol to finish in double digits with a season-high 10 points.

UT finished the game making more free throws (23) than field goals (21) and a 45-39 rebound margin. While the Lady Vols had committed 39 turnovers in the first two games, UT managed to only give the ball away eight times against the Lady Mocs.

**GAME 4: LOUISIANA TECH**

The Tennessee Lady Vols claimed a 94-59 victory over Louisiana Tech on Nov. 23, at Thompson-Boling Arena. This was the final scheduled regular-season matchup between the two winningest programs in women's college basketball history and the 35-point margin of victory was the largest by either school in the series. The win also gives the Lady Vols a nine-game winning streak over the Lady Techsters, matching the longest by either squad in the 30-year history of the rivalry.

Sophomore Vicki Baugh (Sacramento, Calif.), who had a strong outing last year against La. Tech, showed up strong again today, scoring seven of the Lady Vols' first nine points. She would finish with 13 points, 12 rebounds, four blocks, an assist and a steal in only 17 minutes of action.

When Amber Gray (West Chester, Ohio) made her first career three-pointer in the first half, it marked the 344th consecutive game in which UT has made at least one three.

Tennessee held the Lady Techsters scoreless for 3:35 late in the first half and went on a 13-0 run to stretch the Lady Vol lead to 34-19. However, the resilient Lady Techsters trimmed the lead with a 9-0 run of their own before Alyssia Brewer (Sapulpa, Okla.) made a pair of free throws to make the halftime score 40-33.

UT opened the second half on a 9-1 run and outscored La. Tech 54-26 in the second half. Freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) finished in double-figures with 12 points for the fourth straight game.

All 10 Lady Vols who were available for today's game played at least 16 minutes and scored four points, with only freshmen Alicia Manning (Woodstock, Ga.) and Johnson playing more than 20 minutes.

Four Lady Vols finished the day with double-figure scoring, led by Baugh and Brewer's double-doubles. Brewer finished with 16 points and 12 rebounds in 20 minutes. Gray added 16 points to tie Brewer for the team-high. Manning, who came up clutch against Chattanooga, added seven points, seven boards and five assists off the bench for Tennessee.

**GAME 5: WESTERN CAROLINA**

The Tennessee Lady Vols earned win number 297 at Thompson-Boling Arena on Nov. 25 with an 83-56 win over the Western Carolina Lady Catamounts and former Lady Vol Kellie (Jolly) Harper. Sophomore Vicki Baugh (Sacramento, Calif.) recorded her second career double-double in as many games with 11 points and 15 rebounds, 10 of which came on the defensive end.

The first 10 minutes saw each team go on a run of at least six points. The Lady Vols jumped out to a quick 7-1 lead before the Lady Catamounts answered with a 6-0 spurt to tie the game at seven. UT put together another 7-0 run, which was answered 8-0 Western Carolina, to give WCU its first lead of the game at 17-16. After four straight possessions saw the lead change hands four times, the Lady Vols would outscore the Lady Catamounts 21-7 to end the half with a 49-26 lead.

The 49 first half points were the most by Tennessee since scoring 49 in the first half of a Feb. 21, 2008, game at Alabama. The Lady Vols held WCU scoreless for the final 3:15 of the first half and didn't allow a Lady Catamount field goal until the 16:27 mark of the second half, a span of 7:48 in which UT went on a 16-0 run to take a 53-26 lead.

An area of concern for the UT coaching staff was free throw shooting, but not on this night, when the Lady Vols made their first 10 and 23 of 27 for the game.

A trio of Lady Vol freshmen, in addition to Baugh, finished in double-figures. Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) had 19, Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) tallied 13 and Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) added 10. The scoring onslaught was pushed by a season-high shooting percentage of 47.5.

**GAME 6: DE PAUL**

The Lady Vols improved to 5-1 on the season with an 88-67 win over the DePaul Blue Demons on Nov. 30 at Thompson-Boling Arena. Freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) finished with a game-high 19 points to lead Tennessee -- the third time this season Johnson has scored 19 points.

For the first time this year, all 12 student-athletes on the roster were able to play and all 12 saw at least 10 minutes of action.

Tennessee jumped out to a quick 13-0 lead and didn't look back as UT never trailed against the Blue Demons.

After the Lady Vols built a 19-point lead at 36-17 with 5:37 to play in the first half, DePaul rallied with a 10-0 run in just over a minute and a half to cut the UT lead to nine, and had pulled within six with 1:30 to play until the break.

Freshman Kelley Cain, playing for the first time since Nov. 17, scored five of the Lady Vols' final eight points in the first half, as coach Summitt's squad held a 44-34 halftime advantage. Cain finished with a season-high 12 points. Fellow freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.), who has scored in double-figures in four of the first six games, tallied a season-high 16 points.

Tennessee used a 15-0 run midway through the second half to break the game open. Sophomore Angie Bjorklund (Spokane Valley, Wash.), seeing her first action of the season, hit her first three on a Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) assist to put UT up 60-43. Johnson followed up Bjorklund's three with eight straight points on a jumper, fastbreak layup from Bass, a pair of free-throws and a second jumper, again coming off an assist from Bass.

Bass dished out a game-high eight assists, which is tied for fourth most in a single game by a freshman. Freshman Alicia Manning (Woodstock, Ga.), who was back from a concussion, also distributed the ball well, finishing with five assists, the second time this season she has recorded five helpers.

**GAME 7: GEORGE WASHINGTON**

The Lady Vols earned on a hard-fought, 71-59, win over the George Washington Colonials in our nation's capital on Dec. 2. Freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) again led the way for Tennessee with her third double-double of the season. She recorded game-highs of 16 points and 10 rebounds, including a season-high 10 free throws on 12 attempts. Johnson added four steals on the defensive end.

Senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.) played arguably her best game of the season thus far, as she finished with 13 points on 4-of-6 shooting, and grabbed six rebounds. Fuller played 28 minutes, including all 20 of the second half. She also knocked down her first two three-pointers of the season.

The Lady Vols opened the game on a 6-0 run and never trailed in the first half for the fourth time this season. UT never relinquished the lead in the final 20 minutes, either, for the fifth time this season.

George Washington trimmed the Tennessee lead to 54-52 with just over six minutes to play, but the Lady Vols held onto the lead and a pair of Johnson free throws with just under four minutes left put UT back up 59-54. Fuller stepped to the line twice and made three of four free throws to put the Lady Vols up six, 62-56, with 2:41 remaining.

Sophomore Angie Bjorklund (Spokane Valley, Wash.) made her first three-pointer of the game and only her second all season with 1:12 to play that gave Tennessee an eight point lead.

Four times throughout the game Tennessee built a 13-point lead, but each time George Washington responded with five consecutive points to cut the lead back to

**GAME 8: MIDDLE TENNESSEE**

The Tennessee Lady Vols earned win number 299 at Thompson-Boling Arena and Head Coach Pat Summitt's 990th career victory with an 81-52 decision over the Middle Tennessee State Blue Raiders on Dec. 11.

Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) posted team-highs of 20 points and six rebounds to lead the Lady Vols, who were energetic coming off a nine-day layoff for final exams.

The Lady Vols came ready to play from the opening tip and never trailed against the Blue Raiders. UT missed its first four shots, but crashed the offensive glass, earning another possession each time. Sophomore Vicki Baugh (Sacramento, Calif.) finally scored the game's first points at the 18:59 mark of the first half.

After a Blue Raider bucket, the Lady Vols opened the game up with a 14-2 run. MTSU was able to get back within three with three straight three-pointers, but Tennessee answered with a run of their own, keyed by pair of Alyssia Brewer (Sapulpa, Okla.) steals, which converted into fastbreak layins. Stricklen finished off the half with a 33-foot buzzer-beater to give UT a 41-23 halftime lead.

Freshman Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) earned her first career start as redshirt-sophomore Cait McMahan (Maryville, Tenn.) did not play to give her knees some rest. Head Coach Pat Summitt trotted out the youngest starting lineup in Lady Vol history with Bass, Stricklen, freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.), Baugh and sophomore Angie Bjorklund (Spokane Valley, Wash.). Three previous times, Coach Summitt has had three rookies starting together, but each time there was at least one upperclassmen in the lineup.

Bass keyed the UT defensive effort that limited MTSU to its second-lowest offensive output of the year with four steals.

Bjorklund, making her first start of the season after earning 30 as a freshman, tallied a season-high 16 points on 6-of-11 shooting, and added three assists. The third Lady Vol to score double figures was Johnson, with 11, and making her the only student-athlete to post double digits in all eight games this season.

Senior Alex Fuller, playing against her high school coach Rick Insell, came off the bench for 21 productive minutes, including a pair of assists and a steal.

**GAME 9: #6/5 TEXAS**

The Tennessee Lady Vols suffered their second loss of the season, 73-59, on Dec. 14 in Austin to the Texas Longhorns. Freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) led the Lady Vols with 13 points and nine rebounds after playing only three minutes in the first half and picking up three fouls. The double-digit output was the ninth in nine games this season for Johnson.

Texas jumped out to a quick 9-2 lead, with the Lady Vols' only bucket coming on a Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) jumper in the lane at the 18:56 mark. Tennessee responded by pulling within one at 9-8 on a Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) three-pointer at the 16:07 mark.

The Lady Vols trailed the Longhorns the entire first half, until freshman Alyssia Brewer (Sapulpa, Okla.) hit a free-throw with 26.9 seconds to play before the break. Tennessee had pulled within one three times, including the Bass three-pointer. Bass hit a free-throw at the 1:55 mark to make it 29-28 in favor of Texas and senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.) made a jumper in the lane with just under a minute to play to make the score 31-30.

Tennessee, which shot only 35.3 percent from the field in the first half, continued to struggle from the field after the break, and, at one point, went 6:04 without a field goal. During that span, the game went from a 39-39 tie to a 53-44 Texas lead.

For the game, Tennessee shot season-lows of 33.3 percent from the field and 33.3 percent from the free throw line. Only five Lady Vols even attempted a free throw and none made more than half. Redshirt-freshman Kelley Cain (Atlanta, Ga.), who was 2-of-4, and Johnson, who was 7-of-14, were the only two to make at least two from the charity stripe.

Stricklen was the only other Tennessee player to finish with double-digit points, as she had 11 on 4-of-7 shooting. Four Longhorns posted double-figures, led by Brittaine Raven's game-high 21.

**GAME 11: #3/4 STANFORD**

The Tennessee Lady Vols needed an extra five minutes to claim a 79-69 win on Dec. 21 over No. 3/4-ranked Stanford and improve to 9-2 before heading into the holiday break. Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) recorded a career-high 25 points, including eight of Tennessee's 11 points in overtime.

The Lady Vols held the Cardinal to only one point in the extra session.

With 7:29 remaining in the first half, Tennessee held a slim 22-21 lead, but limited Stanford to only two field goals before the break, extending its lead to 41-32 at the half.

Stanford, whose bench was opposite the 2008 National Championship banner, came out strong to begin the second period. It quickly trimmed the lead to three and held a 49-48 lead with 12:49 to play in regulation.

With the score tied at 52 apiece and 11:16 remaining, Tennessee held Stanford to just three field goals over the next 3:09 to build a 65-60 lead.

Down the stretch, Stanford trimmed the lead and evened the score at 68 all on a Jeanette Pohlen three-pointer with 52.6 seconds to go. Lady Vol freshman Alicia Manning (Woodstock, Ga.) stepped up and locked down on Stanford redshirt-sophomore Melanie Murphy, blocking the last second shot to send the game into OT.

With the extra five minutes, Stricklen decided to take over. She had eight points on 3-of-3 shooting in the deciding five minutes. Senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.) stepped to the line with 23.2 seconds and knocked down a pair free throws to put Tennessee up 78-69. The only Cardinal point of the extra period came on a Jayne Appel free throw with 3:10 to play in the extra session.

Tennessee dodged a major bullet as freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) went down with a right thigh contusion in overtime.

The win was not only significant in that it was a rematch of last year's national title game, and that it was the first overtime game since UT lost at Stanford last season right before the holidays, but it was the 300th Lady Vol victory in Thompson-Boling Arena.

The Tennessee Lady Vols headed to the Great Northwest and a hometown match-up for sophomore Angie Bjorklund (Spokane Valley, Wash.) against the Gonzaga Bulldogs and her sister Jami (Bjorklund) Schaefer on Dec. 30. After starting a little sluggish, the Lady Vols pulled away in the second half and grabbed a 77-58 win to improve to 10-2 on the season.

Although the Inland Empire had seen a record amount of snowfall, the ticket to the McCarthy Center was red-hot as a crowd of 6,000 fans packed in to see the Lady Vols and Bulldogs duke it out. It was the first sellout that Gonzaga women's basketball has hosted.

**GAME 14: KENTUCKY**

The No. 7/11-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols opened Southeastern Conference play with a 69-64 win over Kentucky on Jan.8 at Thompson-Boling Arena to improve to 12-2 overall, 1-0 in SEC play this season. UT won its SEC opener for the 25th time in 30 games and owns a 13-2 mark in league lid-lifters at home.

The first 12 minutes of the game proved indicative of the rest of the evening as the teams saw four ties and six lead changes, with neither team leading by more than three.

As the half wound down, the Lady Vols wound up, posting a 35-27 halftime lead. It was the 12th time this season Tennessee has held an advantage at the break. UT used a 12-2 run over three minutes 17 seconds late in the first half to take a 20-20 tie to a 32-22 lead.

The Wildcats responded to UT's run with a 12-2 spurt of their own to open the second half, taking a 39-37 lead with 16:43 to play.

The two squads would go back and forth until UT senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.) made a layup off an offensive rebound with 3:19 left, giving Tennessee a 59-58 lead, which the Lady Vols would not surrender.

Four Lady Vols finished in double figures, led by freshman Shekinna Stricklen's (Morrilton, Ark.) 18 and rookie Glory Johnson's (Knoxville, Tenn.) 14. Stricklen was on mark from the charity stripe, hitting all eight of her free throws. Johnson made her first six, finishing 6-of-7 from the line.

It was the 11th time this season each of the underclassmen posted double-digit scoring outputs. For Stricklen, it was the fourth straight game with at least 10 points, but it was the first time Johnson had tallied double-digits since scoring 11 at Old Dominion on Dec. 18.

Classmate Alicia Manning (Woodstock, Ga.) finished with a career-high 13 points on 4-of-6 shooting, including a perfect 3-of-3 from beyond the arc. Fuller was the fourth UT student-athlete in double digits with 10 points.

**GAME 15: #24/24 VANDERBILT**

The No. 7/11-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols suffered their first Southeastern Conference loss of the season, 74-58, at No. 24/24-ranked Vanderbilt on Jan. 11. The loss ended a 16-game UT winning streak in the series. The last time Tennessee lost to Vanderbilt was on Feb. 2, 2002, when the Commodores claimed a 76-59 win in Nashville.

Senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.) was the only Lady Vol to finish in double figures with 12 points on 6-of-10 shooting. Fuller also pulled down a game-high seven rebounds, of which five came on the offensive end.

The Lady Vols and Commodores played a close first half, trading the lead four times and being tied on six occasions.

**GAME 16: MISSISSIPPI STATE**

The No. 13/15-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols escaped from Starkville, Miss., with a 63-56 win over the Mississippi State Lady Bulldogs on Jan. 15. Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) led the Lady Vols in scoring for the fifth time this season and the third time in the last four games with a game-high 15 points.

She earned praise from Head Coach Pat Summitt on not letting her offensive woes effect her defensive tenacity, as Stricklen grabbed seven boards, three of which were defensive, and three steals.

Tennessee began the game 0-of-8 from the field before freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) made a layup at the 16:34 mark of the first half. The Lady Bulldogs quickly responded with 10-0 run to the 10:41 point, grabbing a 10-3 lead.

The young Lady Vols continued to fight and put together a 10-2 run of their own over 4:04 midway through the first stanza, taking a 23-19 lead.

The UT defense continued to pressure the Lady Bulldogs in the second half. After State converted 4-of-8 three-point attempts in the first 20 minutes, it managed only to make only 1-of-6 from behind the arc in the second half.

Senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.) continues to provide a key leadership role as the lone upperclassman on the squad. In her 28 minutes of action, she grabbed nine rebounds, to go with six points and two steals, while not committing a turnover. Her nine boards are the most she has pulled down in a Southeastern Conference game in her career.

The win marked the 400th time Tennessee has downed a league foe and improves the Lady Vols to a remarkable 267-35 in conference games.

**GAME 17: SOUTH CAROLINA**

The No. 13/15-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols returned to the friendly confines of Thompson-Boling Arena for the first time in 10 days and claimed a 68-56 win over the South Carolina Gamecocks on Jan. 18 in front of a season-best crowd of 16,413.

Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) posted her second career double-double with 13 points on 6-of-13 shooting and 10 rebounds, including eight offensive boards. The rookie also added three assists and a steal. Stricklen converted her only free-throw attempt to improve to a perfect 19-of-19 from the charity stripe in Southeastern Conference play.

Senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.), who decided to wear No. 2 for the remainder of the season in honor of teammate Cait McMahan (Maryville, Tenn.), scored a team-high 14 points and grabbed eight boards. Fuller came out firing on all cylinders as she scored eight of the Lady Vols' first nine points and 10 of UT's first 13.

The first half was a back-and-forth contest with seven lead changes before Tennessee grabbed a 33-30 halftime lead, marking the 14th time in 17 games this season that the Lady Vols have enjoyed a lead after the opening 20 minutes.

UT stepped up its defense in the second half, holding South Carolina to only 34.5 percent shooting in the second stanza and only two three-pointers.

The Lady Vols' size and depth proved too much for the Gamecocks as Tennessee outscored SC 44-28 in the paint, 12-0 on fastbreak points and a 22-15 advantage with bench scoring.

While only scoring seven points, sophomore Angie Bjorklund (Spokane Valley, Wash.) continued to move towards the top of the Lady Vol all-time three-pointers made record. She made one of two attempts against the Gamecocks to give her 92 for her career, just 11 out of the top 10. Bjorklund grabbed five boards, dished a season-high five assists, and added one steal and one block.

The No. 10/12-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols again found a way to win, 76-67, over the Arkansas Razorbacks at Bud Walton Arena on Jan. 22.

UT got off to a quick start with a Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) three-pointer just 12 seconds into the game and Tennessee would get out to a 9-2 lead over the Razorbacks. Tennessee held Arkansas without a field goal for 6:09 late in the first half, building a 26-19 lead. However, Arkansas kept fighting and forced a 32-32 halftime tie on a Shanita Arnold three-pointer with seven seconds left before the break.

The second half was a back-and-forth battle for the first 12 minutes of the second stanza. With 8:33 remaining in the game, Ayana Brereton hit a three-pointer to give the Razorbacks a 59-57 lead.

The Lady Vols felt their backs getting pushed against the proverbial wall and the Razorbacks could sense a win was within their grasp. From that point, UT went on an 11-0 run and held Arkansas without a field goal until the 1:42 mark of the second half. Over that span of 6:51, Tennessee went from a two-point deficit at 59-57 to holding a nine point lead at 68-59.

Down the stretch, freshman Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) hit 3-of-4 free throws and sophomore Angie Bjorklund (Spokane Valley, Wash.) converted a pair of free throws with just seven seconds left to ice a victory for Tennessee.

Bjorklund led the Lady Vol offense on the night with 18 points on 6-of-12 shooting and a perfect 4-of-4 mark from the free throw line. She also dished out a season-high-tying five assists and grabbed a career-high-tying four steals, while only committing one turnover in 38 minutes of action. Freshman Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) got back on track with 15 points, seven boards and three assists. **GAME 19: #6/5 AUBURN**

The No. 10/12-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols came into the showdown with the No. 6/5-ranked Auburn Tigers as the lower-ranked team for the first time since the Tigers held the nation's top spot and the Lady Vols were No. 2 in the SEC Championship game on March 6, 1989. The Lady Tigers came into that game sporting a 28-0 record and already owning a 67-59 win over UT that season.

The game also brought a crowd of 12,067 to Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum, which set an arena record for the largest crowd to see a basketball game, men's or women's, there. The previous largest crowd of 7,150 saw the 67-59 win over UT on Jan. 6, 1989.

Auburn struck first with a Whitney Boddie jumper, but the Lady Vols responded with a Glory Johnson (Knoxville, Tenn.) jumper to tie the game at two apiece. However, the Tigers would run off five straight points to grab a 7-2 lead, and UT would not grab its first lead, 23-22, until redshirt-freshman Kelley Cain (Atlanta, Ga.) made a layup with 2:48 left before the break. Auburn responded with a 9-0 run before Briana Bass (Indianapolis, Ind.) banked in a running 40-foot 3-pointer to make the halftime score 31-26.

Tennessee got the first bucket of the second half to pull within three, but that would be as close as UT would get in the second half. Auburn went on to a 17-5 run on UT to the 14:11 point of the second stanza, opening up a 48-33 lead. The Tigers built a 24-point lead, 73-49, on a DeWanna Bonner layup with just 4:22 remaining. The Lady Vols responded with a 14-0 run of their own to make the score 77-67 with 43 seconds to play, but Auburn would convert 5-of-6 free throws down the stretch and also got a steal by Bonner to ice the game.

Freshman Shekinna Stricklen (Morrilton, Ark.) scored a career-high 26 points on 9-of-20 shooting, including four three-pointers. She added four rebounds, three assists and two steals in 37 minutes of action. Johnson was the only other Lady Vol to score in double-figures against the Tigers. She finished with 13 points on 5-of-7 shooting in 32 minutes. Johnson also recorded her fourth career double-double by pulling down 10 rebounds - seven of which came on the defensive end. However, Bonner's 35 points and nine rebounds were too much for the young Lady Vols to overcome.

**GAME 20: OLE MISS**

Sophomore Angie Bjorklund (Spokane Valley, Wash.) hit a three-pointer from the corner with eight seconds remaining to give the No. 13/15-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols a dramatic 60-59 win over the Ole Miss Rebels on Jan. 29. The sophomore finished with 13 points, five boards - four of which were offensive - and four assists in 35 minutes to lead UT.

The Lady Vols came out focused and fired up, holding the Rebels without a point for the first four minutes, 20 seconds of the game, and beginning the contest with a 12-3 run.

After the early struggles, the Rebels rebounded and posted an 11-0 run of their own over nearly six minutes midway through the first half to grab a 14-12 lead.

The Lady Vols grabbed the lead back at 17-16 and would hold on until senior Alex Fuller (Shelbyville, Tenn.) added a layup with 20 seconds before the first half horn to give UT a 25-22 halftime advantage. Fuller would finish with her first career double-double as she tallied 11 points and 11 boards.

It was the 15th time this season that Tennessee had held an edge after the first 20 minutes. The 22 Ole Miss points were the fewest Tennessee had allowed in the first half all season.

UT maintained its advantage to begin the second half and stretched its lead to as many as eight points with 14:33 to play. The Rebels would not surrender and fought back to take the lead, 40-38, at the 9:56 mark of the second stanza and extended the lead to nine with just 4:10 on the clock.

Tennessee continued to battle and pulled within two at 59-57 with just over a minute to play after Bjorklund hit a 15-foot jumper. After UT recorded a defensive stop, the Lady Vols came racing down the floor, looking for a transition bucket to tie the game. Shekinna Stricklen's (Morrilton, Ark.) pass to Fuller fell into the hands of Ole Miss' Kayla Holloway and UT fouled Shantell Black, who missed the free throw. Bjorklund, facing heavy defensive pressure, managed to find enough space on the right baseline, got her shoulders square and buried a three-pointer with eight seconds on the clock to give UT the lead.
