ABOUT THE WEEK

UT Concludes Home Schedule Against No. 12 Florida, South Carolina

The University of Tennessee volleyball team (19-8, 12-4 Southeastern Conference) will close out the home portion of its schedule this weekend when it welcomes No. 12 Florida and South Carolina to Rocky Top. The Orange and White will take on the Gators at 7 p.m. on Fri., Nov. 7 before hosting the Gamecocks at 1:30 p.m. on Sun., Nov. 9 in Thompson-Boling Arena. Sunday's contest will be tape delayed and broadcast on FOX Sports Regional Networks at 3:30 p.m. that same day. In addition, the first 300 fans to the match against USC will receive a free set of Lady Vol volleyball trading cards.

The Big Orange picked up a pair of key road wins this past weekend to extend its league-best winning streak to nine matches. The streak marks the second longest during UT Head Coach Rob Patrick's tenure and the fifth-best run in program history. The Lady Vols, who have swept six consecutive contests, downed both Arkansas and Ole Miss in three frames each.

Leading the way offensively for the Orange and White was senior Milan Clarke who pounded out a team-high 25 kills over the weekend with match-high totals of 15 and 10 against the Razorbacks and Rebels, respectively. Defensively, junior libero Chloe Goldman tallied a total of 40 digs to pace the Lady Vols. The Monterey, Calif., native recorded a match-high 25 at Arkansas, marking the third highest three-set match total in UT history, before collecting 15 against Ole Miss just two days later. With her strong weekend, Goldman was named the Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week for the third time this season after regaining the conference lead with 5.10 digs per set in league play.

Following this weekend's contests, Tennessee will finish off the regular season with a pair of road matches. The Lady Vols will first face Auburn at 1:30 p.m. CT on Sun., Nov. 23, before making the trip to Lexington, Ky., for a showdown with No. 22 Kentucky in its season finale at 7 p.m. on Fri., Nov. 28.

SCOUTING NO. 12 FLORIDA

Tennessee will put its season-best, nine-match winning streak on the line on Friday evening when it faces SEC-leading and No. 12 Florida (20-2, 14-1 SEC) at 7 p.m. in Thompson-Boling Arena.

The hard-hitting Gator offense features a number of options, including five different players who have recorded over 100 kills this season. Leading the attack is freshman phenom Kelly Murphy who not only leads the team with 260 kills and 3.25 kills per set, but paces the squad with 459 assists and a .374 hitting percentage as well. To top things off, she also ranks second on the team with 134 digs (1.67/set) and fourth with 23 blocks (0.43/set). During conference play, Murphy is third in the league with a .389 attack average and sixth with 3.49 kills per set.

Fellow first-year player Kristy Jaeckel is the Gator's second-most effective weapon, having pounded out 248 kills this season, good for an average of 3.22 per set. Trailing that duo are another freshman in Colleen Ward with 166 kills, sophomores Lauren Bledsoe and Callie Rivers with 120 and 114 putaways, respectively. Yet another freshman, setter Cindy Bathelt, is also an integral part of the team's 6-2 offense, having recorded 444 assists when Murphy rotates to the right-side position. As a team, UF ranks as the most efficient offense in the SEC with a hitting percentage of .277 during league play.

Defensively, standout junior libero Elyse Cusack leads all Florida performers with 365 digs (4.56/set). She also tops the team and ranks fourth in the conference with 34 service aces. While senior Kelsey Bowers leads the Gators with 63 blocks, they get solid efforts from a number of other individuals, as seven other players have already crossed the 20-block threshold in 2008.

Florida holds a 38-9-1 advantage over Tennessee all-time after claiming a 3-0 victory in Gainesville earlier this season. Although the Gators have won the past five contests between the two squads, most of the Orange and White's success against UF has come in the last four seasons. Over the last eight matches against the Gators, UT has been able to come away with three of their nine victories in the all-time series.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

On Sunday, the Big Orange will welcome South Carolina to Rocky Top for a 1:30 p.m. contest in Thompson-Boling Arena. The match will be tape delayed and broadcast on FOX Sports Regional Networks at 3:30 p.m. that same day. In addition, the first 300 fans to the contest will receive a free set of Lady Vol volleyball trading cards. The Gamecocks enter the weekend with a 19-6 overall record and 10-5 mark in SEC action. No. 22 Kentucky on Friday evening in Lexington.

USC has won three-straight matches since dropping a pair of five-set tilts three weeks ago. The Gamecocks boast a balanced offensive attack with five players having reached the century mark in kills. Junior Ivana Kujundzic and senior Belita Salters, however, are the undisputed leaders of the offense, with totals of 332 and 280 kills, respectively. Kujundzic ranks fifth in league play with 3.55 kills per set and fourth with 20 aces (0.36/set), while Salters places eighth with 3.24 kills per set and is second in the conference with an impressive .393 hitting percentage. Only UT junior Farren Powe ranks higher with her .436 attack average.

A transfer from Connecticut, junior setter Bridget Denson-Dorman is tops the SEC with an average of 11.09 assists per set during league action. On the defensive side of the court, USC is led by the efforts of junior Sarah Cline, Kujundzic and sophomore Hannah Lawing who have 315, 264 and 215 digs, respectively. The Gamecock

blocking effort is paced by Salters who has 72 putbacks, including 14 of the solo variety, this season.

Tennessee currently holds a 26-25 advantage all-time over the Gamecocks after dropping a 3-0 decision to USC in Columbia earlier this year. UT has won eight of the last 11 matches between the two squads, dating back to the 2003 campaign, with all three of its losses during that stretch coming on the road

LIKE BUTTER, THEY'RE ON A ROLL

The Lady Vols are currently in the midst of a nine-match winning streak which ranks as the fourth-longest in school history and second-best run during Rob Patrick's 12-year tenure. The Big Orange record for consecutive victories is 22 set by the 1980 squad. UT also won 20 in 1973, 14 in 2004 and 11 in both 1986 and 1982.

In addition, UT has claimed six straight sweeps, tying the school record as the 1973 and 2004 teams also accomplished the feat. The

Orange and White has also won 19 straight sets which ranks as the second-most by a Patrick coached team. The record of consecutive set victories is 21, set in 2004. Finally, UT has won eight straight SEC matches which is one short of tying the record of nine set in 2005.

PICKING UP THE PACE

During their current nine-match winning streak, the Lady Vols have definitely picked up the pace offensively, hitting at a .333 clip as a team. In the 18 matches prior to their current streak, they posted just a .211 attack average.

The key has been the fact that UT has been able to significantly cut down on its hitting errors, going from 5.25 errors/set in the first 18 matches to just 3.54/set over the past nine.

Junior Farren Powe alone has raised her hitting percentage 63 points, moving from .263 to .326. During the winning streak, the Mobile, Ala., native has tallied a stellar .491 percentage with 62 kills and just nine errors in 108 swings. She also leads the Lady Vols with 28 blocks during that stretch.

THE CLEVELAND CONNECTION

The Lady Vol volleyball program continued its Cleveland connection by signing Chagrin Falls, Ohio, native Leslie Cikra to a national letter-of-intent for the 2009 season on Thursday. The 6-3 outside hitter/middle blocker is ranked as the nation's No. 11-ranked recruit by PrepVolleyball.

com and is the second player to come to Rocky Top out of the Buckeye State in the past two seasons, joining Kayla Jeter from Solon, Ohio.

Part of UT's success in recruiting out of the Cleveland area is the fact that both head coach Rob Patrick and assistant Katie Noble hail from the region. Patrick is originally from Garfield Heights, while Noble is a former Mentor standout.

LADY VOLS BACK IN THE POLLS

For the first time since the 2006 season, the University of Tennessee has found its way back into the Bison/AVCA Coaches Poll as it received six votes to unofficially rank them 34th in the country. The Lady Vols were last ranked on Oct. 16, 2006, when they were voted as the 25th-best team in the nation.

HAAVE RETURNS TO ROCKY TOP

Former Lady Vol two-sport star Tanya Haave will be back in Knoxville this weekend as she returns to Rocky Top as the head coach of the University of San Francisco women's basketball team. Her squad will take on the two-time defending national championship Tennessee team on Saturday afternoon. The Lady Vols will raise the 2008 NCAA National Championship banner prior to the game.

An All-American on the basketball court in 1983, "La Machine" was also named the CBS Co-MVP of the 1984 NCAA Final Four with Southern

Cal's Cheryl Miller. She still stands in the top-10 in the UT career record book for total points (1771), field goals made (746), field goals attempted (1456) and free-throw percentage (.816).

The 6-2 lefty was also a force on the volleyball court, playing for UT during the 1981 and 1984 seasons. She still ranks seventh all-time with a career hitting percentage of .300 and holds the single-season highs for kills (756) and attacks (1631) and stands third with 92 aces in 1980. She was named All-State, All-Region and All-SEC 1980 and earned Academic All-SEC in 1984.

LADY VOLS ON TV

The University of Tennessee volleyball team will make its second television appearance of the season on Sunday when South Carolina makes the trip to Rocky Top for a 1:30 p.m. contest. The match will be tape delayed and broadcast on FOX Sports Regional Networks at 3:30 p.m. that same day. Pete Pranic will provide play-by-play while Phil Push will serve as the color analyst.

UT's first appearance on television came on Sun., Oct. 12, when its contest against then-No. 9 Florida was featured on Sun Sports Television.

FOWLER NAMED TO COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT FIRST TEAM

Sophomore outside hitter Nikki Fowler has been named to the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District First Team, as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America. The Dallas, Texas, native will move on to the national ballot where she attempt to become the program's second All-American in three years.

A business major, Fowler currently holds a cumulative GPA of 3.86. She is the fourth Lady Vol in as many seasons to earned academic all-district honors, following Jena Berg who earned second-team laurels last year. In 2006, Kelsey Fautsch claimed a spot on the first team en route to third-team All-America honors, while Kristen Andre was named to the second team in 2005.

STATISTICALLY SPEAKING

The Lady Vols have been a fixture at the top of the SEC statistical rankings this season and currently rank among the top five teams in nearly every major statistical category in league play. The Lady Vols top the conference in digs (16.25/set), kills (14.12/set) and assists (13.33/set), rank second in hitting percentage (.270) and third in opponent hitting percentage (.164) and block (2.35/set).

Individually, UT is well represented on the SEC charts, led by junior Farren Powe's league-best .436 hitting percentage in conference action. Senior Mindy Flynn ranks just behind her in sixth with an attack average of .339.

Junior Chloe Goldman, meanwhile, tops the league in digs with 5.10/set, while sophomore Nikki Fowler ranks second with an average of 3.81 kills/set.

Freshman Kelsey Mahoney can be found on the assists chart where she ranks ninth with 6.65 assists/set. Fellow classmate Alyssa Hilby rounds out UT's presence on the leaderboards with an average of 1.10 blocks/set which ranks her fourth in the league.

LADY VOLS EARNING THEIR FAIR SHARE OF WEEKLY AWARDS

Four different members of the UT roster have earned a total of seven SEC weekly honors this season. Junior Chloe Goldman is the most recent Lady Vol to accomplish the feat, earning SEC Defensive Player of the Week accolades for the third time this season on Nov. 10.

Her award comes on the heels of junior Farren Powe being tabbed the league's offensive player of the week and Lady Vol Athlete of the Week on Nov. 3 after helping UT to sweeps over Georgia and LSU.

Sophomore Nikki Fowler was the first to be honored by the league, claiming SEC Offensive Player of the Week accolades on Sept. 2 after posting an MVP performance at the Marquette Kickoff Classic. She earned the same award on Oct. 20 and was named the Lady Vol Athlete of the Week on Sept. 15 as well.

Goldman's other two SEC Defensive Player of the Week awards came back-to-back as she took home the honors on Sept. 15 and 22. Freshman Kelsey Mahoney, meanwhile, rounds out the Lady Vol award-winning quartet, having been named SEC Freshman of the Week on Sept. 20 after leading UT to victories over ETSU, Ole Miss and Arkansas.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP FOR FOWLER

Nearly finished with her second season at Rocky Top, outside hitter Nikki Fowler has been

able to avoid the dreaded sophomore slump, leading UT in kills (340), kills/set (3.58), total attacks (903) and attacks/set (9.51).

The 2007 SEC Freshman of the Year, Fowler has led the Lady Vols in kills in 18 of their 27 matches this season, accumulating double-digit totals in 19 contests as well.

A native of Dallas, Texas, she also tops the team in double-doubles for the second straight campaign with six in 2008, accomplishing the feat against Illinois, Dayton, Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky and Alabama..

PATRICK SETS UT CAREER WINS RECORD

With a 3-0 victory over Auburn on Sun., Oct. 3, Lady Vol Head Coach Rob Patrick became the all-time winningest coach in UT history, earning the 230th victory of his career to surpass Bob Bertucci's mark of 229 set from 1979-86. During his 12 seasons at Rocky Top, Patrick has amassed a career record of 240-133 (.643).

Patrick became just the second coach in UT volleyball history to record 200 career wins with a 3-1 victory over Arkansas on Sept. 17, 2006.

The Cleveland, Ohio, native has led a resurgence of volleyball on the UT campus since his arrival in 1997. Six of the eight years prior to that season, UT had recorded losing campaigns, while Patrick has earned a winning record in nine of the last 10 years, en route to setting the school mark for consecutive seasons above .500 with nine straight from 1998-2006. He bested the previous mark of seven (1978-84) with his 17th win of the 2006 campaign.

"CHALK TALK" WITH ROB PATRICK

Prior to both remaining home matches, Lady Vol Head Coach Rob Patrick will lead a "Chalk Talk" session to give fans an inside look at that day's contest. UT volleyball fans are encouraged to attend the event which will be held at the Court-side Club in the Ray Mears Room at Thompson-Boling Arena. Gates to the arena open one hour before first serve and Patrick's session will begin 45 minutes prior to the start of each match.

LADY VOLS "DIG FOR THE CURE"

On Fri., Oct. 3, the Lady Vol volleyball team helped raise over \$1,000 by participating in the Susan G. Komen "Dig for the Cure", when it took on Auburn. Fans made either a flat donation or donated per dig as UT raised money in support of breast cancer research.

"Dig for the Cure" was established in 2003 in an effort to raise money and awareness for breast cancer research while partnering with volleyball programs across the country. Currently, 156 volleyball programs are involved in this organization and have helped raise over \$340,000 for breast cancer research.

FRESHMEN MAKING AN IMPACT

The much heralded UT rookie class is already beginning to make an impact on the court this season with three different freshman having already earned starting nods through the team's first 27 contests.

Setter Kelsey Mahoney has started the last 15 matches and 17 total this season at the setter position, while outside hitter Kayla Jeter has started two matches and middle blocker Alyssa Hilby leads all rookies with 21 starts.

Mahoney paces the team with 551 assists and 5.74 assists per set this season in addition to having collected a team-high 22 aces and a total of 156 digs. In 21 matches, Hilby has accumulated 74 kills and a squad-best 85 blocks, while Jeter has 26 kills, three aces, 27 digs and 14 blocks in 14 matches.

NOBLE INDUCTED INTO ROBERT MORRIS HALL OF FAME

On Sat., Sept. 27, Lady Vol Assistant Coach Katie Noble returned to her alma mater, Robert Morris University in Moon Township, Pa., where she was officially inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame.

A member of four straight NEC Tournament championship teams and subsequent appearances in the NCAA Tournament, Noble is the only two-time NEC Player of the Year (2001, 2002) in Robert Morris volleyball history. She held the Colonial career record for kills with 1,418 before it was eclipsed in 2005 and also ranks third in career attack percentage (.280) and block assists (203), fourth in games played (463) and fifth in solo blocks (133).

In 2001, Noble, a native of Mentor, Ohio, and a graduate of Mentor High School, helped lead RMU to a school record 30 victories.

Five of the six members of the 18th class of inductees, including Noble, were enshrined into the Robert Morris Athletic Hall of Fame at half-time of RMU's football game against Monmouth, Sat., Sept. 27, at Joe Walton Stadium.

BANNER DAY FOR CLARKE AT ETSU

Against East Tennessee State on Oct. 14, UT senior outside hitter Milan Clarke recorded one of the most impressive offensive performances by a Lady Vol in recent memory, tallying an amazing .812 hitting percentage with 13 kills and no errors on 16 swings. Clarke's attack average marked the best by a UT player since Trinia Cuseo hit at a stellar .833 clip (15-0-18) against Florida on Nov. 18, 2000.

With her .812 attack average, the Santa Monica, Calif., native, now holds the third-highest single-match hitting percentage by any player in the Southeastern Conference this season, surpassing the previous high of .786 (12-1-14) set by Florida's Kristy Jaekel versus Pacific on Aug. 30. Only Kentucky's Queen Nzenwa and South Carolina's Belita Salters have better marks, having hit .867 (13-0-15) and .857 (12-0-14) against Alabama and Arkansas, respectively.

Prior to her offensive display against the Bucs, Clarke's previous career high for hitting percentage (min. three kills) was .600 (3-0-5) against Gardner-Webb earlier this season at the Comcast Lady Vol Classic on Sept. 12.

UT HISTORY IN HOME OPENERS

Throughout the years, the University of Tennessee volleyball team has amassed a stellar 26-5 (.839) record in home openers, including a 3-0 triumph over Gardner-Webb this season. During the Rob Patrick era, the Lady Vols have been even better with an 11-1 (.917) mark in his 11 years at the helm. The lone loss during that span was to LSU on Sept. 21, 2001.

MOVIN' TO AN ARENA...DOWN BY THE RIVER

After spending 10 seasons in Stokely Athletics Center, the Lady Vol volleyball team has made the short move down to the Tennessee River to play in Thompson-Boling Arena for the 2008 campaign.

The Big Orange hopes that it can bring with it the tradition of home-court dominance that it displayed in Stokely, where it amassed an impressive 98-34 (.742) record following a multi-million dollar renovation that was completed prior to the 1998 season. So far so good for the Orange and White which has won 10 of its 12 contests in TBA this season.

Another tradition that UT hopes to continue at Thompson-Boling is that of record-breaking attendance. Tennessee had competed in TBA on two occasions prior to this season, setting the top two home attendance marks in the process, including a crowd of 3,311 that came to see the Orange and White take on Georgia on Oct 28, 2005. In 2008, the volleyball configuration at TBA provides seating for up to 7,000 Big Orange faithful.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

The 2008 Lady Vol roster boasts a pair of freshmen with strong athletic pedigrees as the fathers of both DeeDee Harrison and Kayla Jeter are former stars in the National Football League.

Harrison's father, former Vanderbilt star Dennis "Bigfoot" Harrison, spent 10 seasons as a defensive end with the Philadelphia Eagles, Los Angeles Rams, San Francisco 49ers and Atlanta Falcons in the NFL. In addition, her brother, David Harrison, is currently a center on the Indiana Pacers roster in the NBA. Her father earned a spot in the NFL Pro Bowl in 1981, while her brother was named to the All-Big XII First Team and earned Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American honors at Colorado in 2004. In all, Harrison has 11 siblings, including five brothers and six sisters.

Meanwhile, Jeter's father, Gary, was an All-American defensive tackle for Southern California, a top-five draft pick and played in the NFL for 13 seasons with the New York Giants, Los Angeles Rams and New England Patriots. During the 1985 season with the Rams, he was a teammate of and played on the same defensive line as DeeDee's father, Dennis.

LADY VOL OLYMPIC CONNECTION

While the 2008 Beijing Olympics took place halfway across the globe, there was at least one connection that linked Tennessee volleyball to Olympic gold, as UT Head Coach Rob Patrick is a former coach of two-time beach volleyball champion Kerri Walsh.

During the 1996 season, Walsh was a freshman on the NCAA National Champion Stanford team on which Patrick was an assistant coach. That year, Walsh was named National Freshman of the Year and first team All-American after she and Patrick helped lead the Cardinal to a Pac-10 title and a victory over Hawaii in the national championship match.

FOWLER NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

University of Tennessee sophomore outside hitter Nikki Fowler was named to the 2008

preseason All-Southeastern Conference team on Aug. 21. The poll was the first in the history of the conference and featured nine athletes.

Fowler was the only underclassman to make the squad, which also consists of seven seniors and one junior. Each SEC head volleyball coach voted for seven players and no ties were broken. The Eastern Division had five players recognized, while the West had four. LSU led all teams with three selections, and Florida had two.

A native of Dallas, Texas, Fowler became just the second player in UT history to garner a postseason player of the year award during her initial season at Rocky Top, being named 2007 SEC Freshman of the Year. She also earned a spot on the conference's all-freshman team.

The first SEC Freshman of the Year in Tennessee history, Fowler played a critical role in a number of areas for the Lady Vols during her rookie campaign, leading the Big Orange with 370 kills, 1,081 total attacks and 449.0 points and averaging a team high 3.27 kills per game and 3.97 points per game. She also stood second on the squad with 26 aces and 98 blocks, third on the team with 98 assists and 0.87 blocks per game and fourth with 281 digs and 2.49 digs per game.

The only other Lady Vol to claim a postseason player of the year award is Amy Morris, who was named SEC Defensive Player of the Year following the 2005 season.

UT PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN SEC EAST

For the second consecutive season, the University of Tennessee volleyball team was picked to finish third in the Southeastern Conference Eastern Division, as determined by a vote of the league's 11 head coaches. With a total of 33 points, the Lady Vols were selected to finish behind league-title favorites Florida and Kentucky.

Following Florida (11 points), Kentucky (18) and Tennessee (33) in the East were Georgia (38) and South Carolina (40). LSU, meanwhile, was the unanimous selection to win the Western Division, with Ole Miss (21), Alabama (27), Arkansas (41), Auburn (44) and Mississippi State (52) rounding out the group.

The Gators received the majority of the votes for SEC champion with seven, while LSU earned three and the Wildcats picked up a single nomination in the preseason survey.

UT CLAIMS TITLE AT MARQUETTE KICKOFF TOURNAMENT

The University of Tennessee volleyball team opened its season in style, claiming the Marquette Kickoff Tournament title with three wins in two days on Aug. 29-30.

UT christened the campaign with a three-set sweep over in-state rival Chattanooga, 25-13, 25-14, 25-18, on Aug. 29, before taking out Houston in five sets, 25-12, 25-19, 20-25, 19-25, 15-10, and Marquette in four frames, 25-14, 22-25, 25-22, 25-21, the following day.

Sophomore Nikki Fowler took home tournament Most Valuable Player honors as well as SEC Offensive Player of the Week accolades after knocking out a team-high 41 kills over the course of the weekend, while senior Milan Clarke and juniors Kylie Marshall and Chloe Goldman earned spots on the all-tournament team as well.

UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE HEAD COACH ROB PATRICK



Two-time National Coach of the Year Rob Patrick has developed a tradition of excellence since coming to Tennessee 11 years ago. Following his arrival at Rocky Top, Patrick has become one of the nation's top coaches and helped the Lady Vols attain levels of success never before reached in Knoxville, as evidenced by NCAA Tournament berths in three of the last four years, including a run to the Final Four in 2005. His nine-year stretch of winning seasons from 1998-2006 marks the longest-such run in program history, topping the previous high of seven, set from 1978-84. The Big Orange has now won 20 or more matches in four of the last six campaigns and has done so five times in an eight-year span. Prior to Patrick's arrival at UT in 1997, the Lady Vols last recorded a 20-win season in 1988.

Patrick joined the UT program in July of 1997 after spending the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with national powerhouse Stanford. From 1994 to 1996, he helped lead the Cardinal to a combined 92-6 record and two NCAA championships, including title-game victories over UCLA and Hawaii in 1994 and 1996, respectively. During that stint, Stanford never lost a home match en route to participating in the 1995 NCAA Final Four and winning three consecutive Pac-10 titles.

GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

LADY VOLS SCORE 3-0 VICTORY OVER CHATTANOOGA IN SEASON OPENER

Sophomore Nikki Fowler Posts Team-High 13 Kills

MILWAUKEE, Wis. – The University of Tennessee Lady Volunteer volleyball team got the 2008 season off to a quick start, downing in-state rival Chattanooga in three straight sets, 25-13, 25-14, 25-18, in the opening contest of the Marquette Kickoff Tournament at the Al McGuire Center in Milwaukee, Wis. The Orange and White held the Lady Mocs to a -.100 hitting percentage in the match, which lasted only one hour and 18 minutes.

"I am very happy with this performance to open up the season," UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. "I thought the team brought a tremendous focus, especially to the first two games. I feel that the areas where we were inconsistent were due to either the usual opening game jitters or the fact that we did not make a decision on a starting lineup until later in the preseason than usual."

Sophomore Nikki Fowler, the 2007 Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year, led all players with 13 kills in the contest, in addition to notching nine digs and four blocks. The only other Lady Vol to reach double-digits in kills was senior Milan Clarke who knocked out 10 putaways on 21 swings with a mere three errors for a UT-best .333 hitting percentage.

"This was a definitely a good way to start off the season and a positive step forward after last year," Fowler said. "As a whole, I thought our team played well, but we still have some things to work out. It was good to get out on the court and get a win under our belts though."

Defensively, junior Chloe Goldman tallied a team-high 10 digs, while UTC libero Lara Newberry, the national leader in digs in 2007, totaled 17 of her own. In her first match wearing the Orange and White, junior Michaela Hanakova finished third on the squad with seven digs, while pacing the UT offense with 20 assists. Junior Leah Hinkey, meanwhile, accumulated seven blocks in the contest to edge out totals of six by fellow classmate Farren Powe and senior Mindy Flynn for the match high.

"Nikki started this season right where she left off last year, providing us with an effective and consistent offensive weapon. I was especially pleased that we were able to have her attack from all areas of the net."

"Overall, our defense was more in sync than our offense," Patrick said. "Our middle blockers were all terrific at closing the block, while our right and left-side blockers set the blocks in the right areas all afternoon. Specifically, I thought that Mindy, Leah, Nikki, Farren and Milan all did a great job of slowing balls down and defending the attack."

Senior Milan Clarke Records Match High 11 Kills

DENVER, Colo. – Despite a valiant effort, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (3-2) was not quite able to finish off its attempt to come back from two sets down, eventually falling in five games to Virginia (4-1), 23-25, 19-25, 25-19, 25-22, 6-15, at the University of Denver Pioneer Classic at Hamilton Gymnasium in the Daniel L. Ritchie Center in Denver, Colo. Senior Milan Clarke shouldered the bulk of the offensive load for the Lady Vols, pounding out a career-high 19 kills and hitting at an impressive .417 clip with just four errors on a team-high 37 swings.

Junior Farren Powe also posted a solid performance in the loss, recording a season-high 11 kills in addition to seven blocks and a pair of digs, while fellow classmate Kylie Marshall paced the team defensively with 21 digs. The Puyallup, Wash., native spent the first two games at outside hitter, knocking out four kills, before switching to the libero position for the final three.

A pair of freshmen saw their playing time increased as well, with Kayla Jeter tallying a squad-high six blocks in addition to four kills. Alyssa Hilby, meanwhile, finished the match with three putaways to go along with five blocks in her collegiate debut.

DENVER, Colo. – The University of Tennessee Lady Volunteer volleyball team (3-3) finished out a rough stay at the Pioneer Classic with a 3-0 loss to tournament champion Denver (5-1), 25-22, 25-16, 25-18, at Hamilton Gymnasium in the Daniel L. Ritchie Center in Denver, Colo. Senior Milan Clarke continued her stellar play, leading all players with 11 kills in the contest.

“This was a tough weekend for us,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “Although we had some weaknesses exposed, we will be a better team down the road because of it. We were not very organized this weekend, partly due to the fact that we played a number of different lineups, but that is something that we need to get squared away.

“Despite the three losses, we will take some positives away from this tournament,” Patrick said. “We were able to see a lot of people play in a lot of different positions and we were able to get our freshmen some valuable on-court experience that will only help them to get better quicker. When we get back to Knoxville, we will get back in the gym and use what we learned this weekend to become a better team.”

For the tournament, Clarke finished with team highs in both kills and attacks with 38 and 94, respectively. Junior Farren Powe, meanwhile, paced the squad with 12 blocks over the course of the weekend and finished second on the team with 26 kills, including six in the loss to Denver.

“Farren made a huge jump this week after having a bit of a tough time last weekend in Milwaukee,” Patrick said. “I am excited to see her continue to improve and feel that she is someone that we will be able to count on to be a consistent force at the net for us the rest of the season.”

Starting at libero for the first time since her rookie season, junior Kylie Marshall reached double-digits in digs for the third time this season with 11 against Denver. She was one of the Lady Vols’ most effective all-around players this weekend, accumulating totals of 14 kills, four blocks and team highs of 41 digs and four aces.

“Kylie did a tremendous job switching back-and-forth between the outside hitter and libero positions,” Patrick said. “She displayed her versatility and was effective all over the court.”

TENNESSEE FINISHES OFF DAYTON IN FIVE TO CLOSE OUT COMCAST LADY VOL CLASSIC

Sophomore Nikki Fowler Named to All-Tournament Team

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – The University of Tennessee Lady Volunteer volleyball team (5-4) closed out its home tournament in style Sunday afternoon, scoring a come-from-behind, five-set victory over Dayton (6-3), 18-25, 25-23, 22-25, 25-21, 15-13, in the final match of the sixth annual Comcast Lady Vol Classic held in Thompson-Boling Arena. Sophomore Nikki Fowler was named to the all-tournament team after posting double-doubles in kills and digs in two of the three matches.

Despite the UT win, Dayton still came away with the tournament championship due to tiebreaker rules. Because Dayton, Illinois and Tennessee all finished with a 2-1 record, no team had a better head-to-head record (all 1-1) and all three teams played the same amount of games (13), the championship was determined by total points against. The Flyers had 236 total points scored against them, while Illinois had 241 and Tennessee had 246, to account for the final team standings.

Fowler was dominant over the weekend, recording a team-high 49 kills and 131 total attacks. The Dallas, Texas, native also finished second on the squad with 36 digs and third with nine blocks. She hit an impressive .275 clip with just 13 errors in three matches.

Another statistical standout for Tennessee over the weekend was junior libero Chloe Goldman who averaged a tournament-high 5.46 digs per set and led all players with 71 total digs. The Monterey, Calif., product was equally impressive in the serve receive game where she had just one reception error in 74 attempts.

In Sunday afternoon's match against Dayton, Fowler paced the Big Orange offense with her second double-double in as many contests, while Goldman tallied the fourth-highest single-match dig total in school history with 36, just six off the standard of 42 set by former Lady Vol Amy Morris at Notre Dame on Nov. 26, 2005.

After posting 18 kills and 19 digs against Illinois on Friday night, Fowler continued her terrific play with a season-high 22 kills and 13 digs in the triumph over Dayton. Senior Milan Clarke also reached double-digits in kills with 13 of her own, while freshman Alyssa Hilby paced the Orange and White with six blocks in the contest. Junior Michaela Hanakova also put together a solid effort with career highs in both assists and digs with 31 and 13, respectively.

Junior Kylie Marshall Smashes Out Career-High 14 Kills

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – With a four-set victory over Alabama, the University of Tennessee Lady Volunteer volleyball team (7-4) improved to 2-0 in Southeastern Conference play for the first time since the 2004 season. Sophomore Nikki Fowler Posted Match-High 19 Kills In Loss

BATON ROUGE, La. – The University of Tennessee volleyball team (7-5, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) dropped its first SEC match of the season Friday evening, falling in four sets, 25-22, 18-25, 20-25, 23-25, to LSU (6-4, 1-2 SEC) in front of 965 boisterous fans at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in Baton Rouge, La.

“We played hard tonight but were unable to string together long stretches of competitive play,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “I give LSU a lot of credit for taking our best punch early and being able to respond. They simply played at a level higher than us for most of the match.

Patrick Ties Bob Bertucci for Most Wins in UT History with 229

In the triumph over Georgia, the Big Orange offense was paced by sophomore Nikki Fowler and senior Milan Clarke who each tallied 13 kills in the contest. Junior libero Chloe Goldman, meanwhile, led the squad in digs for the 11th time this season with 20, her highest three-set output this year. Junior Kylie Marshall and Fowler also reached double digits in digs with 10 each. For Fowler, her 13 kills and 10 digs marked her team-high third double-double of the season and 14th of her career. As a team, Tennessee had success at the service line, recording a season-high nine aces in the match.

"Milan set the tone for our team today," Patrick said. "She provided us with many point-scoring swings without making very many errors. Nikki was also outstanding. Everyone sees the amount of kills that she gets, but I was more impressed with the rest of her game. She really filled up the stat sheet tonight with 10 digs, four aces and two blocks."

LADY VOLS DROP 3-1 DECISION TO KENTUCKY

Sophomore Nikki Fowler Tallies Fifth Double-Double of the Season

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – Despite sophomore Nikki Fowler's fifth double-double of the season, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (8-6, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) was unable to overcome a talented Kentucky squad (14-2, 5-0 SEC), falling in four sets, 25-19, 20-25, 25-17, 25-19, Wednesday night at Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville, Tenn. Fowler recorded a match-high 19 kills in addition to 17 digs in the loss.

"First of all, I want to say that Kentucky played extremely well tonight and I have to tip my hat to them," UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. "With that said, we simply made way too many hitting errors on balls that we should not have hit out. PATRICK SETS UT CAREER COACHING MARK AS TENNESSEE BLASTS AUBURN, 3-0

Farren Powe Sets Career Highs with 15 Kills, .625 Hitting Percentage

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – The 676 fans in attendance at Thompson-Boling Arena were witness to Lady Vol program history on Friday night as Rob Patrick became the winningest coach in Tennessee volleyball annals with a 25-15, 25-23, 28-26 triumph over Auburn (5-11, 0-5 SEC). With the victory in front of the largest home crowd of the season, the Big Orange improved its record to 9-6 overall and 4-2 in Southeastern Conference action.

“This record is a tribute to the support that the University of Tennessee administration and (Lady Vol Athletic Director) Joan Cronan provide to our program,” Patrick said. “I’ve also been very fortunate to have great assistant coaches and, most of all, I’ve been blessed with fantastic student-athletes during my time at Tennessee. I give all the credit for this record to the hard work, energy, sweat and time that all of these people have put into the Tennessee volleyball program over the past 12 years. I could not have accomplished this without each and every one of them.”

The win over the Tigers improved Patrick’s career record to 230-131 (.637), surpassing former Lady Vol Head Coach Bob Bertucci who recorded 229 wins during his eight-year stay at Rocky Top from 1979-1986.

Junior middle blocker Farren Powe powered the Tennessee offensive attack with a career-high 15 kills and a personal-best .625 hitting percentage. The Mobile, Ala., native was near-perfect in the match with zero errors in 24 swings. Sophomore outside hitter Nikki Fowler contributed nine kills and senior middle blocker Mindy Flynn added seven as UT hit .259 as a team while posting its best three-game team kill total of the campaign with 43.

“We have been trying to find another hitter to help us get kills and, as evidenced by her performance tonight, Farren is one of the people that can do that for us,” Patrick said. “We made a concerted effort to get her the ball and she really took care of business. Auburn had a block in her face on every swing and she did a terrific job of getting the ball past the block with authority. When the kill wasn’t there, she just did what she had to do to keep the ball in play, which is a sign of an experienced player being patient and taking what the defense gives her.”

Junior libero Chloe Goldman and freshman setter Kelsey Mahoney proved quite the weapons from behind the service line as the duo each recorded three of the squad’s eight total aces. Goldman also added 13 digs from her defensive specialist position.

FOWLER LEADS LADY VOLS TO 3-1 WIN OVER LOUISVILLE

Fowler Recorded a Match-High 21 Kills in the Victory

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – Behind the strength of 21 kills by sophomore Nikki Fowler, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (10-6) picked up a four-set victory, 25-17, 25-18, 23-25, 25-23, over BIG EAST foe Louisville (6-9), Wednesday night at Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville. Freshman Kelsey Mahoney also tallied her third career double-double in the win with 28 assists and a career-high 16 digs.

“This was a terrific out of conference win for our team,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “Louisville is one of the bigger teams that we will play against at the net this season and I thought our hitters did a very nice job of getting the ball past their block. I think that having success against such a big net team will give us confidence as we go on the road this weekend.”

In addition to her 21 kills, Fowler also recorded eight digs, three blocks, a pair of assists and an ace. The Dallas, Texas, native hit at a solid .250 clip with just seven errors in a match-high 56 total attacks as well.

“Once again, Nikki just continues to fill up the stat sheet for us,” Patrick said. “I could not be more proud of how she played, not only offensively, but defensively, passing and serving as well. She really came through in the clutch a number of times tonight and was able to get us out of some tight situations with a timely play, whether it was a kill, dig or block.”

Also standing out offensively was senior Milan Clarke who was the only other Lady Vol to reach double-digits in kills, collecting 12 in the match. Mahoney, meanwhile, finished just four assists off her personal-best with 28 and destroyed her previous career high of 11 digs with 16 in the victory.

“I was really happy to see Milan hit effectively against a very physical block tonight and Kelsey continues to improve daily, not only in her ability to run our offense but in her leadership skill as well,” Patrick said. “She has also made a commitment to defense, as evidenced by her play tonight, which really helps our team to play at a higher level.”

On the defensive side of the court, junior libero Chloe Goldman continued her dominance with 22 digs in the contest, while freshman Alyssa Hilby paced the UT blocking effort with a career-high seven putbacks, including three of the solo variety. Junior Kylie Marshall also reached double-digits in digs for the ninth time this season, collecting 10 in the win.

CLARKE BLASTS LADY VOLS PAST EAST TENNESSEE STATE

Senior Milan Clarke Sets Career High with .812 Hitting Percentage

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. – Playing its fourth match in just seven days, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (11-8) used a career-best performance by senior Milan Clarke to pick up a 3-0 sweep over in-state rival East Tennessee State University (7-11), 25-14, 25-16, 25-20, Tuesday night at Brooks Gymnasium in Johnson City, Tenn. The 6-1 senior recorded a personal-high .812 hitting percentage in the victory, pounding out 13 kills on 16 swings with no errors.

"My job is to get kills for our team so I made it my goal to come out really aggressive this match," Clarke said. "Mischa (Hanakova) and I spent a lot of time this week talking about what we needed to do to improve and I felt like we really connected tonight."

"I was very happy with how Milan was able to contact the ball and move it around offensively tonight," UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. "She was able to hit the ball down the line and cross court all night and was really consistent the entire match."

As a team, the Big Orange smashed its previous season-high with a .420 hitting percentage (43-9-81), as opposed to the .138 percentage that it held ETSU to in the contest. The Lady Vols also bested the Bucs in total kills (43 to 32), assists (36 to 29), digs (34 to 26), aces (4 to 0) and blocks (9 to 7).

"I thought the keys to this match were our hitting efficiency and the fact that we were able to keep our errors to a minimum," Patrick said. "We have been stressing the importance of both of those things in practice and I was very proud that we were able to translate that into our play today."

In addition to Clarke's offensive output, UT also got 10 kills from sophomore Nikki Fowler who hit at a solid .350 clip as well with just three errors in a team-high 20 attacks. Also joining in on the festivities were juniors Kylie Marshall and Faren Powe who recorded hitting percentages of .533 (8-0-15) and .571 (4-0-7), respectively.

On the defensive side of the court, junior Michaela Hanakova led all UT players with seven digs, while Marshall and Fowler tallied six each. Senior Mindy Flynn paced the Orange and White blocking effort with three putbacks in the match.

LADY VOLS RECORD SWEEP OF OLE MISS IN FRONT OF SEASON-BEST CROWD

Nikki Fowler Pounds Out Career-High .480 Hitting Percentage

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – Playing in front of its biggest home crowd of the season, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (12-8, 5-4 Southeastern Conference) put forth one of its best efforts of the year, sweeping Ole Miss (8-9, 4-4 SEC) in three sets, 25-21, 25-14, 25-15, Friday night at Thompson-Boling Arena. A career-high .480 hitting percentage by sophomore Nikki Fowler and freshman Kelsey Mahoney's fourth career double-double helped propel the Lady Vols to victory.

"The energy in the gym tonight was fantastic and really helped carry our team through some great runs during each set," UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. "It was great to see so many students. I know it meant a tremendous amount to our players to see that kind of support and made them proud to represent the University of Tennessee."

A native of Dallas, Texas, Fowler smashed out a match-high 14 kills and had just a pair of errors in 25 total attacks. She also collected four digs, three blocks and an ace in the contest. Senior Mindy Flynn, meanwhile, was not far behind, recording a sensational .476 hitting percentage of her own, with 10 kills on 21 swings without a single error. As a team, the Lady Vols outthit the Rebels, .374 to .080. That attack average stands as UT's highest mark during SEC play this season and second-best average all year behind only Tuesday night's .420 performance at East Tennessee State.

"I hope we don't start to take Nikki Fowler for granted," Patrick said. "I'm not only talking about her offensive numbers and hitting efficiency, but also the little things that don't show up in the stat sheet like her passing consistency and how well she sets up the block. She played tremendous again today despite the fact that our opponents continue to try and find new ways to stop her on every point."

Also standing out on the stat sheet for the Big Orange were freshman Alyssa Hilby, junior Chloe Goldman and Mahoney. A product of Lakewood, Wash., Hilby paced the UT blocking effort with five putbacks, in addition to hitting at a .500 clip with five kills and no errors on 10 swings, while Goldman led all performers with 14 digs from the libero position. Mahoney, meanwhile, reached double-digits in both assists and digs with 21 and 10, respectively, to tally the third double-double of her young career.

LADY VOL VOLLEYBALL TAKES OUT ARKANSAS IN FOUR SETS Senior Mindy Flynn Posts Season-High 16 Kills

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – The University of Tennessee volleyball team (13-8, 6-4 Southeastern Conference) closed out the first half of its league schedule in style Sunday afternoon, defeating Arkansas (5-14, 2-7 SEC) in four sets, 25-21, 25-18, 17-25, 25-21, at Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville, Tenn. Three different Lady Vols reached double-digits in kills and UT hit at a solid .282 clip in the victory.

“Overall, this was a good way for us to finish out the first half of our SEC schedule,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “We knew that Arkansas was a better team than their record indicated and we expected a hard-fought match, which is exactly what we got.

“Even though this was one of our more inconsistent matches all season from a passing perspective, I was very happy with the way our offense was still able to produce at a high level for most of the match,” Patrick said. “Our offense really carried us today and was the reason we were able to come away with a win. We need to continue working on our defensive consistency and we will make that a point of emphasis in practice this week.”

For the 16th time this season, sophomore Nikki Fowler led the Big Orange in kills, smashing out 20 in the win. The Dallas, Texas, native also reached double-digits with 11 digs to account for her team-high sixth double-double of the year and 17th of her young career. Finishing just behind Fowler in the kills category was senior Mindy Flynn who tallied a season-high with 16 putaways in the contest. She also topped the team with a stellar .483 hitting percentage with just a pair of attack errors in 29 total attacks, in addition to collecting five digs and a block.

UT setters freshman Kelsey Mahoney and junior Michaela Hanakova continued their run of strong play, notching 34 assists and eight digs and 17 assists and five digs, respectively, while pacing the Orange and White to a .282 attack average (59-19-142) as a team. Mahoney’s 34 assists marked both a career-high and the best total by a Lady Vol this season.

Defensively, junior libero Chloe Goldman led all performers with 18 digs, while Fowler and junior Kylie Marshall had 11 and 10 each. In the blocks category, junior Farren Powe was able to send back a squad-high three Razorback attacks and freshman Alyssa Hilby and Marshall both had a pair of putbacks.

LADY VOLS PICK UP HARD-FOUGHT SWEEP AT ALABAMA Win Marks UT's First in Tuscaloosa Since 2004 Campaign

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. – The University of Tennessee volleyball team (14-8, 7-4 Southeastern Conference) opened the second half of its SEC schedule with its fourth consecutive victory, downing Alabama (10-9, 3-7 SEC) on the road, 25-22, 25-22, 25-22, Friday evening at the Coleman Auxiliary Volleyball Extension. The win marked the Lady Vols’ first in Tuscaloosa since the 2004 campaign.

“This was a big win for our team,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “I was very proud of how we finished each set. Alabama was serving tough and not making any errors which forced us to play at a high level and earn each point. We had a number of people come up big tonight, whether it was a kill by Milan (Clarke) or Mindy (Flynn), a tough serve by Farren (Powe) or a great set by Kelsey (Mahoney) or Mischa (Hanakova).

“Chloe (Goldman), Kylie (Marshall) and Nikki (Fowler) also had their best passing match of the year against a very strong serving Alabama team. That allowed us to side out at a very high percentage, which really helped to carry our team, especially in the first set.”

Senior Mindy Flynn paced the Big Orange offensive attack with 12 kills in the contest, while hitting at a team-high .391 clip with just three errors in 23 attacks. Sophomore Nikki Fowler and senior Milan Clarke tied for second on the squad with eight putaways each. Junior libero Chloe Goldman topped UT with a match-high 17 digs, while fellow classmate Kylie Marshall finished just behind her with 11 of her own. Freshman Alyssa Hilby and junior Farren Powe, meanwhile, led the Lady Vol blocking effort with three putbacks each.

“This was a good win to start the second half of the SEC season on the road,” Flynn said. “Alabama was focusing a lot of their attention on Nikki and I made it my goal to go out and take the pressure off of her. I just went out and tried to take good, quality swings and I thought I was able to do that.”

With her 17 digs, Goldman moved her career total to 1,013, making her the ninth player in UT history to cross the 1,000-dig threshold. She also moved into eighth on UT’s all-time digs chart, edging past Sonja Thomas’ career mark of 1,012.

Junior Kylie Marshall Notches Season-High .556 Hitting Percentage

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Utilizing an efficient offensive output, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (15-8, 8-4 Southeastern Conference) moved its winning streak to a season-best five matches with a sweep over Mississippi State (6-16, 1-10 SEC), 25-16, 25-16, 25-17, Sunday afternoon at the Newell-Grissom Building in Starkville, Miss.

“To be successful in the SEC, you have to work very hard to get wins on the road,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “I am very proud of our entire team for their focus and energy this entire weekend. We were able to go on the road against two of the toughest serving teams, not only in our conference but in the nation, and run our offense at a very high level. If you would have told me that we would have had just two reception errors all weekend, I would have been very surprised.”

The Lady Vols posted their best team hitting percentage in an SEC match this season with a .384 attack average. They had a total of 38 kills in 86 attacks with a season-low five errors in the victory. Junior Kylie Marshall paced the attack with a team-high 11 kills in the contest while hitting at a season-best .556 average with just a single error in 18 total attacks. Finishing just behind her were sophomore Nikki Fowler, junior Farren Powe and senior Milan Clarke who tallied nine, eight and six kills, respectively.

“We played a very clean match today,” Patrick said. “We were able to take care of the ball on serve receive, with our serving and by controlling our digs. I thought that Kylie played a great match. If you just look at the stat sheet, you would think that it was her offense that carried us, but, in reality, it was her defensive play that really sparked us in the second and third sets. She made some tremendous digs from the middle-back position that allowed us to continue and win a number of long rallies.”

Defensively, junior libero Chloe Goldman continued her stellar play with a match-high 13 digs, while seven other players tallied at least two digs each. Powe led the blocking effort with five putbacks while seniors Mindy Flynn and Clarke posted three each.

LADY VOLS MAKE QUICK WORK OF UGA WITH 3-0 SWEEP

Senior Milan Clarke Pounds Out Match-High 12 Kills

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – With one of its best efforts of the season, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (16-8, 9-4 Southeastern Conference) was able to snap Georgia's conference-best, six-match winning streak in dominating fashion, taking out the Bulldogs (14-10, 7-6 SEC) in three sets, 25-15, 25-12, 25-16, Friday night at Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville, Tenn. With the win, the Lady Volunteers extended their winning streak to a season-high six matches as well, marking their longest run without a loss since claiming nine straight in 2005.

“We are playing really well offensively right now,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “We have been getting better and better as the season has gone on and I'm really excited about the direction we are heading. Our serve and pass game was as consistent as it has been all year which let us run an efficient offense, side-out at a high percentage and defend their offense a little easier.”

The Big Orange offensive attack was on full display, outhitting Georgia, .391 to .029, committing just eight errors while knocking out 44 kills on 92 swings. UT's hitting percentage marked its highest during conference play this year and is the seventh-best effort by an SEC team during league action in 2008.

Senior Milan Clarke paced the offense with a match-high 12 kills, while hitting .429 (12-3-21) in the contest. Finishing just behind her was junior Farren Powe, who hit at a career-best .692 clip with 10 kills on 13 attacks with just a single error. She also topped the squad's blocking effort with a match-best five putbacks, including one solo block and four block assists.

“I thought Milan played a very smart, experienced game,” Patrick said. “She took big swings at the appropriate times and was able to take some heat off her shot in order to take advantage of some weaknesses in Georgia's defense. When she is able to do that, she really expands our offensive arsenal.”

On the defensive side of the court, junior libero Chloe Goldman continued her assault on the UT record book, notching a team-best 18 digs, improving her season total to 366 which gives her the 10th-highest single-season mark in school history, surpassing April Chapple's total of 356 during the 1983 campaign. Freshman Alyssa Hilby, senior Mindy Flynn and sophomore Nikki Fowler, meanwhile, tied for second on the squad with three blocks each. Fowler and junior Kylie Marshall also had seven kills and nine digs each in the contest.

UT CLAIMS SEVENTH STRAIGHT WITH 3-0 SWEEP OVER LSU

Sophomore Nikki Fowler Posts Match-High 15 Kills in the Victory

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – The University of Tennessee volleyball team (17-8, 10-4 Southeastern Conference) continued its torrid pace through the second half of its SEC schedule, claiming its seventh straight victory with a clean sweep, 25-22, 25-11, 25-23, over LSU (12-9, 7-7 SEC), Sunday afternoon at Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville, Tenn. Sophomore Nikki Fowler paced the Lady Vol attack with a match-high 15 kills.

“Our team is playing with a lot of confidence right now,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “That confidence comes from the fact that our setters are finally getting comfortable with our offense, the tempo we are setting and their knowledge of our hitter’s tendencies.

“It has also really helped that we have had the same starting lineup on the court for the past six weeks,” Patrick said. “We have also been getting some huge contributions from our non-starters during practice. Jaye Loyd, Amanda Friday, Laurén LaFlamme, Kayla Jeter, Carol Cheade and DeeDee Harrison have all done an extremely good job of pushing our play in practice up a notch and forcing everyone else to perform at a high level at all times.

“LSU really served as tough as we’ve been served all year and I really liked how our passers hung in there and handled the initial onslaught in the first set,” Patrick said. “Our offense starts with Chloe, Kylie and Nikki’s passing. They were able to get a bead on their serves and become more and more comfortable as the match went on.

In addition to her 15 kills, Fowler hit at a stellar .382 clip with just a pair of errors in a team-high 34 attacks. She also posted nine digs, four blocks and an ace to round out a solid, all-around performance. Senior Mindy Flynn was second on the squad with nine kills, while also tying her career-high with six digs and recording two blocks.

Defensively, juniors Chloe Goldman and Farren Powe paced the team with 13 digs and six blocks, respectively. As a team, Tennessee collected a total of 10 blocks, with freshman Alyssa Hilby and junior Kylie Marshall each tallying three of their own as well. Marshall also had seven digs in the contest while freshman Kelsey Mahoney recorded eight.

UT SQUEEZES OUT TOUGH ROAD WIN AT ARKANSAS

Junior Chloe Goldman Records Third-Highest Three-Set Dig Total in School History

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. – The University of Tennessee volleyball team (18-8, 11-4 Southeastern Conference) was able to overcome a spirited effort from a hard-working Arkansas squad (6-18, 3-11 SEC) to win its eighth consecutive match with its fifth straight sweep, 29-27, 31-29, 25-18, Friday night at Barnhill Arena in Fayetteville, Ark. Junior libero Chloe Goldman tallied the third-highest, three-set dig total in school history with 25, while senior Milan Clarke posted a match-high 15 kills in the victory.

“Arkansas certainly did not make anything easy for us tonight, but it’s always great to win on the road in this tough conference,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “I thought we made quite a few unforced errors in the first two sets, which I attribute to us not being as focused as we needed to be.

In addition to her 15 kills, Clarke also hit at a solid .375 clip with just three errors in 32 swings. Sophomore Nikki Fowler, meanwhile, recorded 13 kills of her own, while senior Mindy Flynn and junior Farren Powe each collected 11 putaways in the match. Last week’s SEC Offensive Player of the Week, Powe continued her efficient offensive output, collecting a team-best .529 hitting percentage with just two errors in 17 total attacks.

“Milan continues to get big kills for us while also reducing her unforced errors,” Patrick said. “I’m really proud of how she has matured into such a good hitter. We are very comfortable putting the ball in her hands during key situations and she came through in a big way tonight.”

Freshman Kelsey Mahoney finished just one dig away from her fifth career double-double with a team-high 38 assists and nine digs, while junior Kylie Marshall and Fowler tallied seven and six digs, respectively. Fowler also paced the UT blocking effort with four putbacks, including one solo block, while Powe tallied three and Flynn and freshman Alyssa Hilby each posted two.

As a team, the Big Orange set three-set match season highs in four different categories, including kills (60), total attacks (139), assists (56) and digs (61).

LADY VOLS TAKE OUT OLE MISS TO EXTEND STREAK WITH SIXTH STRAIGHT SWEEP

Goldman Records Team-High 15 Digs in the Victory

OXFORD, Miss. – With its sixth straight sweep, the University of Tennessee volleyball team (19-8, 12-4 Southeastern Conference) extended its league-best winning streak to nine matches as it defeated Ole Miss (11-13, 7-8 SEC), 25-17, 25-17, 25-18, Sunday afternoon at the Gillom Sports Center in Oxford, Miss. The Lady Vols' current run stands as the second-best streak during UT Head Coach Rob Patrick's tenure and fifth-best in school history.

"It's great to be coming home from this weekend with two road wins over teams that have been playing very well lately," Patrick said. "Offensively, we have been able to control the ball well enough with our passing game and in transition to have at least two options at all times. Our setters are also doing a great job of finding either the hot hitter or the person in the best position to finish the play."

Three different Lady Vols tied for the team-high in kills on Sunday, as seniors Milan Clarke and Mindy Flynn and sophomore Nikki Fowler each had 10 putaways in the 3-0 triumph over the Rebels. Clarke hit at an outstanding .556 clip with no errors in 18 total attacks. Flynn was just behind her with a .450 attack average with just one error in 20 swings, while junior Farren Powe topped the squad with a .667 hitting percentage (6-0-9). As a team, UT out-hit Ole Miss, .365 to .085.

"It's really fun to see two of our seniors be so successful on a consistent basis during the latter part of their careers," Patrick said. "They have had a huge impact on our success. Milan had a huge weekend and is playing with a tremendous amount of confidence right now. She has been a go-to player for us the second half of the season and has really been consistent in that role.

"Mindy is really playing a great all-around game as well, giving us a nice block on both pins and a couple of digs a match," Patrick said. "She's also getting more kills than we expected while still keeping her errors low."

Junior libero Chloe Goldman paced the Big Orange defensive effort with 15 digs, while fellow classmate Kylie Marshall reached double-digits with 10 of her own to go along with four kills, two aces and the team's only solo block. Fowler and freshman Alyssa Hilby led the squad with two putbacks each.
