ABOUT THE WEEK

UT Welcomes Kentucky, Auburn to Rocky Top This Week

University of Tennessee Head Coach Rob Patrick will attempt to become the winningest coach in program history this week, as the Lady Vols (8-5, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) are set to host a pair of contests. UT will welcome Kentucky to Rocky Top for a 7 p.m. showdown on Wed., Oct. 1 in Thompson-Boling Arena before taking on Auburn at the same time two days later.

With a sweep at Georgia last Sunday, Patrick tied Bob Bertucci for the most wins by a Lady Vol head coach, moving his career record to 229-130 (.638). Just two days before that victory, the Big Orange dropped a four-set decision at LSU, giving it a split in its first weekend on the road in SEC play.

Sophomore Nikki Fowler paced UT offensively in both contests with 19 kills against the Tigers and 13 versus the Bulldogs. She also recorded her team-high fourth double-double of the season and 15th of her career with 10 digs against UGA. Defensively, junior Chloe Goldman, continued her torrid pace, amassing 37 total digs in two matches, good for an average of 5.29 per set. The Monterey, Calif., native recorded 17 digs against LSU and 20 in just three sets at Georgia.

Tennessee will offer free live video of its showdown with Kentucky on Wednesday night at www.UTLadyVols.com. Roger Hoover will provide play-by-play of the action and, as always, fans can follow along with live stats via GameTracker as well. UT will also live stream video for matches against Louisville (Oct. 8), Arkansas (Oct. 19), Georgia (Oct. 31), LSU (Nov. 2) and Florida (Nov. 14).

On Sunday, the Lady Vols will participate in the Susan G. Komen "Dig for the Cure." Fans can make either a flat donation or donate per dig as UT raises money in support of breast cancer research. Last season, UT averaged just over 17 digs per set in two contests against Auburn. For more information about making a pledge or donation, please visit www.UTLadyVols.com or call (865) 974-1734. Following this week's action, UT will step out of conference play to host Louisville on Wed., Oct. 8 at 7 p.m., before hitting the road to face South Carolina and No. 10 Florida at 7 p.m. on Fri., Oct. 10 and 1:30 p.m. on Sun., Oct. 12, respectively.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

Tennessee will take on one of the hottest teams in the nation this Wednesday when it hosts the Kentucky Wildcats. UK has won 10 straight matches, including a 4-0 start in conference play. Kentucky (13-2, 4-0) bested Georgia 3-1 on Friday before sweeping LSU on Sunday.

The Wildcats lead the SEC in hitting percentage (.276), kills per game (13.83), and blocks per game (2.73).

UK Head Coach Craig Skinner's team is led by sophomores Sarah Mendoza and Lauren Rapp, who lead the team with 3.25 and 3.04 kills per set, respectively. Junior setter Sarah Rumely, meanwhile, ranks first in the SEC with 10.71 assists per set, including an average of 10.38 in league play.

Queen Nzenwa, a 6-2 senior middle blocker from Baltimore, Md., is attacking at an SEC best .520 clip in league play. Nzenwa also leads the league with an average of 1.54 blocks per game in conference matches.

Kentucky hasn't lost to Tennessee since Nov. 6, 2005, winning the last four matches in the series. The Wildcats have an all-time record of 38-23 against UT including a pair of 3-1 victories a year ago.

SCOUTING AUBURN

Auburn (5-10, 0-4 SEC) has lost its last five matches under first-year head coach Wade Benson. The Tigers dropped a 3-1 decision at in-state rival Alabama last Friday and fell, 3-2, at Mississippi State on Sunday.

Offensively, the Tigers are paced by senior OH Jessica Glover's 3.11 kills per game. Glover, who also ranks second on the squad with an average of 0.46 blocks per set, was solid in last weekend's matches, recording 27 kills and attacking at a clip of .322. As a team, Auburn is only attacking at a percentage of .176, ranking it ninth in the SEC.

Sophomore setter Sarah Shanks leads the team with 8.16 assists per set, while fellow sophomore Liz Crouch averages a team-best 3.24 digs per set.

Lady Vol Head Coach Rob Patrick is 13-3 all-time against the Tigers and Tennessee leads the all-time series between the two squads, 21-12-1. The Big Orange had won 13 straight decision against Auburn before losing in four sets on the road last season.

Gates to the arena will open one hour before first serve and Patrick's session will begin 45 minutes prior to the start of each match.

LADY VOLS SET TO "DIG FOR THE CURE"

The Lady Vol volleyball team will participate in the Susan G. Komen "Dig for the Cure" on Fri., Oct. 3, when it takes on Auburn at 7 p.m. Fans can make either a flat donation or donate per dig as UT raises money in support of breast cancer research. PATRICK CLOSING IN ON RECORD

With his next victory, Lady Vol Head Coach Rob Patrick will become the all-time winningest volleyball coach in Tennessee history. With a 3-0 triumph over Georgia on Sept. 28, he tied Bob Bertucci (1979-86) for the most career wins in UT history with 229.

He became just the second coach in UT volleyball history to record 200 career wins with a 3-1 victory over Arkansas on Sept. 17, 2006.

The Cleveland, Ohio, native has led a resurgence of volleyball on the UT campus since his arrival in 1997. Six of the eight years prior to that season, UT had recorded losing campaigns, while Patrick has earned a winning record in nine of the last 10 years, en route to setting the school mark for consecutive seasons above .500 with nine straight from 1998-2006. He bested the previous mark of seven (1978-84) with his 17th win of the 2006 campaign.

NOBLE INDUCTED INTO ROBERT MORRIS HALL OF FAME

This past Saturday, Lady Vol Assistant Coach Katie Noble returned to her alma mater, Robert

Morris University in Moon Township, Pa., where she was officially inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame.

A member of four straight NEC Tournament championship teams and subsequent appearances in the NCAA Tournament, Noble is the only two-time NEC Player of the Year (2001, 2002) in Robert Morris volleyball history. She held the Colonial career record for kills with 1,418 before it was eclipsed in 2005 and also ranks third in career attack percentage (.280) and block assists (203), fourth in games played (463) and fifth in solo blocks (133).

In 2001, Noble, a native of Mentor, Ohio, and a graduate of Mentor High School, helped lead RMU to a school record 30 victories.

Five of the six members of the 18th class of inductees, including Noble, were enshrined into the Robert Morris Athletic Hall of Fame at half-time of RMU's football game against Monmouth, Saturday, Sept. 27, at Joe Walton Stadium.

already earned starting nods through the team's first 13 contests.

Setter Kelsey Mahoney and outside hitter Kayla Jeter have started three and two matches, respectively, while freshman middle blocker Alyssa Hilby leads all rookies with nine starts.

Mahoney is second on the squad with 238 assists and 4.67 assists per set this season in addition to having collected a team-high 13 aces and 65 digs. In just seven matches, Hilby has accumulated 34 kills and a squad-best 44 blocks, while Jeter has 14 kills, three aces, 22 digs and 11 blocks in 10 contests.

UT HISTORY IN HOME OPENERS

Throughout the years, the University of Tennessee volleyball team has amassed a stellar 26-5 (.839) record in home openers, including a 3-0 triumph over Gardner-Webb this season. During the Rob Patrick era, the Lady Vols have been even better with an 11-1 (.917) mark in his 11 years at the helm. The lone loss during that span was to LSU on Sept. 21, 2001.

UT CLAIMS TITLE AT MARQUETTE KICKOFF TOURNAMENT

The University of Tennessee volleyball team opened its season in style, claiming the Marquette Kickoff Tournament title with three wins in two days on Aug. 29-30.

UT christened the campaign with a three-set sweep over in-state rival Chattanooga, 25-13, 25-14, 25-18, on Aug. 29, before taking out Houston in five sets, 25-12, 25-19, 20-25, 19-25, 15-10, and Marquette in four frames, 25-14, 22-25, 25-22, 25-21, the following day.

Sophomore Nikki Fowler took home tournament Most Valuable Player honors as well as SEC Offensive Player of the Week accolades after knocking out a team-high 41 kills over the course of the weekend, while senior Milan Clarke and juniors Kylie Marshall and Chloe Goldman earned spots on the all-tournament team as well.

FOWLER NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

University of Tennessee sophomore outside hitter Nikki Fowler was named to the 2008 preseason All-Southeastern Conference team on Aug. 21. The poll was the first in the history of the conference and featured nine athletes.

Fowler was the only underclassman to make

the squad, which also consists of seven seniors and one junior. Each SEC head volleyball coach voted for seven players and no ties were broken. The Eastern Division had five players recognized, while the West had four. LSU led all teams with three selections, and Florida had two.

A native of Dallas, Texas, Fowler became just the second player in UT history to garner a postseason player of the year award during her initial season at Rocky Top, being named 2007 SEC Freshman of the Year. She also earned a spot on the conference's all-freshman team.

The first SEC Freshman of the Year in Tennessee history, Fowler played a critical role in a number of areas for the Lady Vols during her rookie campaign, leading the Big Orange with 370 kills, 1,081 total attacks and 449.0 points and averaging a team high 3.27 kills per game and 3.97 points per game. She also stood second on the squad with 26 aces and 98 blocks, third on the team with 98 assists and 0.87 blocks per game and fourth with 281 digs and 2.49 digs per game.

The only other Lady Vol to claim a postseason player of the year award is Amy Morris, who was named SEC Defensive Player of the Year following the 2005 season.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

The 2008 Lady Vol roster boasts a pair of freshmen with strong athletic pedigrees as the fathers of both DeeDee Harrison and Kayla Jeter are former stars in the National Football League.

Harrison's father, former Vanderbilt star Dennis "Bigfoot" Harrison, spent 10 seasons as a defensive end with the Philadelphia Eagles, Los Angeles Rams, San Francisco 49ers and Atlanta Falcons in the NFL. In addition, her brother, David Harrison, is currently a center on the Indiana Pacers roster in the NBA. Her father earned a spot in the NFL Pro Bowl in 1981, while her brother was named to the All-Big XII First Team and earned Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American honors at Colorado in 2004. In all, Harrison has 11 siblings, including five brothers and six sisters.

Meanwhile, Jeter's father, Gary, was an All-American defensive tackle for Southern California, a top-five draft pick and played in the NFL for 13 seasons with the New York Giants, Los Angeles Rams and New England Patriots. During the 1985 season with the Rams, he was a teammate of and played on the same defensive line as DeeDee's father, Dennis.

MOVIN' TO AN ARENA...DOWN BY THE RIVER

After spending 10 seasons in Stokely Athletics Center, the Lady Vol volleyball team has made the short move down to the Tennessee River to play in Thompson-Boling Arena for the 2008 campaign.

The Big Orange hopes that it can bring with it the tradition of home-court dominance that it displayed in Stokely, where it amassed an impressive 98-34 (.742) record following a multi-million dollar renovation that was completed prior to the 1998 season. So far so good for the Orange and White which has won four of its first five contests in TBA this season.

Another tradition that UT hopes to continue at Thompson-Boling is that of record-breaking attendance. Tennessee had competed in TBA on two occasions prior to this season, setting the

top two home attendance marks in the process, including a crowd of 3,311 that came to see the Orange and White take on Georgia on Oct 28, 2005. In 2008, the volleyball configuration at TBA will provide seating for up to 7,000 Big Orange faithful.

LADY VOL OLYMPIC CONNECTION

While the 2008 Beijing Olympics took place halfway across the globe, there was at least one connection that linked Tennessee volleyball to Olympic gold, as UT Head Coach Rob Patrick is a former coach of two-time beach volleyball champion Kerri Walsh.

During the 1996 season, Walsh was a freshman on the NCAA National Champion Stanford team on which Patrick was an assistant coach. That year, Walsh was named National Freshman of the Year and first team All-American after she and Patrick helped lead the Cardinal to a Pac-10 title and a victory over Hawaii in the national championship match.

LADY VOLS ON TV

The University of Tennessee volleyball team will make at least two appearances on television this season. The Lady Vols will first hit the airwaves on Sun., Oct. 12, when they travel to Gainesville, Fla., to take on the University of Florida at 1:30 p.m. The match will be shown live on Sun Sports.

UT will also be on television on Sun., Nov. 16 when South Carolina makes the trip to Rocky Top for a 1:30 p.m. contest. That match will be tape delayed and broadcast on FOX Sports Regional Networks at 3:30 p.m. that same day.

UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE HEAD COACH ROB PATRICK



Two-time National Coach of the Year Rob Patrick has developed a tradition of excellence since coming to Tennessee 11 years ago. Following his arrival at Rocky Top, Patrick has become one of the nation's top coaches and helped the Lady Vols attain levels of success never before reached in Knoxville, as evidenced by NCAA Tournament berths in three of the last four years, including a run to the Final Four in 2005. His nine-year stretch of winning seasons from 1998-2006 marks the longest-such run in program history, topping the previous high of seven, set from 1978-84. The Big Orange has now won 20 or more matches in four of the last six campaigns and has done so five times in an eight-year span. Prior to Patrick's arrival at UT in 1997, the Lady Vols last recorded a 20-win season in 1988.

Patrick joined the UT program in July of 1997 after spending the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with national powerhouse Stanford. From 1994 to 1996, he helped lead the Cardinal to a combined 92-6 record and two NCAA championships, including title-game victories over UCLA and Hawaii in 1994 and 1996, respectively. During that stint, Stanford never lost a home match en route to participating in the 1995 NCAA Final Four and winning three consecutive Pac-10 titles.

GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

LADY VOLS SCORE 3-0 VICTORY OVER CHATTANOOGA IN SEASON OPENER

Sophomore Nikki Fowler Posts Team-High 13 Kills

MILWAUKEE, Wis. – The University of Tennessee Lady Volunteer volleyball team got the 2008 season off to a quick start, downing in-state rival Chattanooga in three straight sets, 25-13, 25-14, 25-18, in the opening contest of the Marquette Kickoff Tournament at the Al McGuire Center in Milwaukee, Wis. The Orange and White held the Lady Mocs to a -.100 hitting percentage in the match, which lasted only one hour and 18 minutes.

"I am very happy with this performance to open up the season," UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. "I thought the team brought a tremendous focus, especially to the first two games. I feel that the areas where we were inconsistent were due to either the usual opening game jitters or the fact that we did not make a decision on a starting lineup until later in the preseason than usual."

Sophomore Nikki Fowler, the 2007 Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year, led all players with 13 kills in the contest, in addition to notching nine digs and four blocks. The only other Lady Vol to reach double-digits in kills was senior Milan Clarke who knocked out 10 putaways on 21 swings with a mere three errors for a UT-best .333 hitting percentage.

"This was a definitely a good way to start off the season and a positive step forward after last year," Fowler said. "As a whole, I thought our team played well, but we still have some things to work out. It was good to get out on the court and get a win under our belts though."

Defensively, junior Chloe Goldman tallied a team-high 10 digs, while UTC libero Lara Newberry, the national leader in digs in 2007, totaled 17 of her own. In her first match wearing the Orange and White, junior Michaela Hanakova finished third on the squad with seven digs, while pacing the UT offense with 20 assists. Junior Leah Hinkey, meanwhile, accumulated seven blocks in the contest to edge out totals of six by fellow classmate Farren Powe and senior Mindy Flynn for the match high.

"Nikki started this season right where she left off last year, providing us with an effective and consistent offensive weapon. I was especially pleased that we were able to have her attack from all areas of the net."

"Overall, our defense was more in sync than our offense," Patrick said. "Our middle blockers were all terrific at closing the block, while our right and left-side blockers set the blocks in the right areas all afternoon. Lady Vols Will Close Out Tournament Schedule Against Dayton at 1 p.m. on Sunday

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – In front of 468 fans on Friday night at Thompson-Boling Arena, the Tennessee Lady Vol volleyball team (4-4) dropped a tough five-setter to No. 17 Illinois (6-2) by a 25-22, 21-25, 22-25, 25-21, 11-15 count. The two-hour and thirty-two minute match brought an end to the day's action at the sixth annual Comcast Lady Vol Classic.

"This was just a terrific collegiate volleyball match," UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. "Although we played very hard, it just came down to a few big points at the end and Illinois just played a little better than us on those points."

Sophomore outside hitter Nikki Fowler led the way offensively for the Big Orange, tallying her first double-double of the season by posting a team-high 18 kills and 19 digs. Junior libero Chloe Goldman contributed 23 of Tennessee's season-high 93 total digs (previous high was just 51), while freshman setter Kelsey Mahoney hit the double-digit mark in digs for the first time in her brief career. Senior outside hitter Milan Clarke and junior middle blocker Farren Powe rounded out the Tennessee players with double-figure kill totals by tallying 11 and 10, respectively.

TENNESSEE FINISHES OFF DAYTON IN FIVE TO CLOSE OUT COMCAST LADY VOL CLASSIC

Sophomore Nikki Fowler Named to All-Tournament Team

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – The University of Tennessee Lady Volunteer volleyball team (5-4) closed out its home tournament in style Sunday afternoon, scoring a come-from-behind, five-set victory over Dayton (6-3), 18-25, 25-23, 22-25, 25-21, 15-13, in the final match of the sixth annual Comcast Lady Vol Classic held in Thompson-Boling Arena. Sophomore Nikki Fowler was named to the all-tournament team after posting double-doubles in kills and digs in two of the three matches.

Despite the UT win, Dayton still came away with the tournament championship due to tiebreaker rules. Because Dayton, Illinois and Tennessee all finished with a 2-1 record, no team had a better head-to-head record (all 1-1) and all three teams played the same amount of games (13), the championship was determined by total points against. The Flyers had 236 total points scored against them, while Illinois had 241 and Tennessee had 246, to account for the final team standings.

Fowler was dominant over the weekend, recording a team-high 49 kills and 131 total attacks. The Dallas, Texas, native also finished second on the squad with 36 digs and third with nine blocks. She hit an impressive .275 clip with just 13 errors in three matches.

Another statistical standout for Tennessee over the weekend was junior libero Chloe Goldman who averaged a tournament-high 5.46 digs per set and led all players with 71 total digs. The Monterey, Calif., product was equally impressive in the serve receive game where she had just one reception error in 74 attempts.

In Sunday afternoon's match against Dayton, Fowler paced the Big Orange offense with her second double-double in as many contests, while Goldman tallied the fourth-highest single-match dig total in school history with 36, just six off the standard of 42 set by former Lady Vol Amy Morris at Notre Dame on Nov. 26, 2005.

After posting 18 kills and 19 digs against Illinois on Friday night, Fowler continued her terrific play with a season-high 22 kills and 13 digs in the triumph over Dayton. Senior Milan Clarke also reached double-digits in kills with 13 of her own, while freshman Alyssa Hilby paced the Orange and White with six blocks in the contest. Junior Michaela Hanakova also put together a solid effort with career highs in both assists and digs with 31 and 13, respectively.

Freshman Kelsey Mahoney Records Second Career Double-Double

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – In its opening Southeastern Conference action of the 2008 campaign, the Tennessee Lady Vol volleyball team (6-4, 1-0 SEC) registered a dominating 25-20, 25-13, 25-14 decision over the Mississippi State Bulldogs (5-7, 0-1 SEC) on Friday night in front of 422 Orange-clad fans at Thompson-Boling Arena.

"Anytime that you can open SEC play with a win, you are happy," Lady Vol Head Coach Rob Patrick said. "Mississippi State is a great serving team, but Nikki (Fowler), Chloe (Goldman) and Kylie (Marshall) did a terrific job in the passing game which really helped us to get our offense going."

Sophomore outside hitter Nikki Fowler led the Tennessee offense with 10 kills as the Big Orange hit .255 overall and controlled play at the net with 11.5 blocks. Junior Kylie Marshall Smashes Out Career-High 14 Kills

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – With a four-set victory over Alabama, the University of Tennessee Lady Volunteer volleyball team (7-4) improved to 2-0 in Southeastern Conference play for the first time since the 2004 season. Senior Milan Clarke led the team with 15 kills as UT took out the Crimson Tide (7-4, 0-2 SEC) in four sets, 25-17, 25-18, 24-26, 25-18, Sunday afternoon at Thompson-Boling Arena.

“Winning our first two SEC matches is huge for our team,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “It is a testament to how our players have really bounced back from our play in Denver a couple of weeks ago. I was very proud of the way that we stuck to our game plan in games one, two and four and how we defended Alabama in the transition game.

“We went away from our game plan in the third game and made way too many unforced hitting errors, which allowed Alabama to stay in that game longer than we would have wanted,” Patrick said. “However, our team did a good job of refocusing in the fourth game and getting the job done.”

Junior Kylie Marshall had 12 kills in the contest, finishing just one off her career high set at Marquette earlier this season. She also collected 12 digs in the contest to account for her second double-double of the season.

“Kylie has been filling up the stat sheet a little bit more than we thought she would offensively,” Patrick said. “She has been working diligently on a couple of new shots to diversify her attack a bit more. She has also been a stabilizing force for our defense and passing with her consistent ball-handling skills.”

Besides Marshall and Clarke, the only other Lady Vol to reach double digits in kills was sophomore Nikki Fowler who had 11 putaways. The Dallas, Texas, native was a force defensively as well, tallying a career-high 20 digs. She was bested, however, by junior libero Chloe Goldman who led all players with 25 digs in the match. Freshman Alyssa Hilby, meanwhile, continued her dominance at the net, recording a match-best and career-high tying six blocks in the UT victory.

TENNESSEE FALTERS IN SEC ROAD DEBUT, FALLS IN FOUR TO LSU

Sophomore Nikki Fowler Posted Match-High 19 Kills In Loss

BATON ROUGE, La. – The University of Tennessee volleyball team (7-5, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) dropped its first SEC match of the season Friday evening, falling in four sets, 25-22, 18-25, 20-25, 23-25, to LSU (6-4, 1-2 SEC) in front of 965 boisterous fans at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center in Baton Rouge, La.

“We played hard tonight but were unable to string together long stretches of competitive play,” UT Head Coach Rob Patrick said. “I give LSU a lot of credit for taking our best punch early and being able to respond. They simply played at a level higher than us for most of the match.

“Another reason LSU had more success as the match went on was because of the fact that we moved away from our game plan. Part of the reason that happened is because of our lack of experience, but that is something that we will continue to work on and get better at as the season goes on. All in all, I am excited about how hard we played tonight. If we bring this much energy to the rest of our practices and matches, the rest will take care of itself.”

For the ninth time in the first 12 contests this season, sophomore Nikki Fowler led all UT performers with 19 kills in the loss. The Dallas, Texas, native also hit a solid .333 clip in the match with just four errors on a squad-best 45 swings.

Junior libero Chloe Goldman continued her terrific play on the defensive end, tallying a team-high 17 digs, while fellow classmate Kylie Marshall reached double-digits as well with 10 of her own. Meanwhile, freshman Alyssa Hilby led the blocking effort for the seventh consecutive contest, notching four putbacks in the defeat.

PATRICK TIES RECORD WITH THREE-SET TRIUMPH AT GEORGIA

Patrick Ties Bob Bertucci for Most Wins in UT History with 229

ATHENS, Ga. – The University of Tennessee volleyball team (8-5, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) got back to its winning ways, scoring its first Sunday conference road win in over two years with a three-set sweep, 25-19, 25-19, 25-19, over Georgia (7-8, 0-4 SEC) at the Ramsey Student Center in Athens, Ga. With the win, Lady Vol Head Coach Rob Patrick recorded his 229th career victory, tying Bob Bertucci as the winningest coach in UT history.

Tennessee's last road victory on a Sunday during conference play came against Mississippi State on Sept. 24, 2006. UT had dropped its last seven such decisions.

"The team did a very good job of following the game plan today," Patrick said. "One thing that our team has done very well defensively is defending the outside hitters. We were able to do that again today. The other thing that I was very pleased with was our serve-and-pass game. We did a great job of putting pressure on Georgia with our tough serving and our pass-reception efficiency was outstanding. We challenged our players after a sub-par serving effort at LSU by asking them to be more aggressive and they did a terrific job of responding to that challenge."

In the triumph over Georgia, the Big Orange offense was paced by sophomore Nikki Fowler and senior Milan Clarke who each tallied 13 kills in the contest. Junior libero Chloe Goldman, meanwhile, led the squad in digs for the 11th time this season with 20, her highest three-set output this year. Junior Kylie Marshall and Fowler also reached double digits in digs with 10 each. For Fowler, her 13 kills and 10 digs marked her team-high third double-double of the season and 14th of her career. As a team, Tennessee had success at the service line, recording a season-high nine aces in the match.

"Milan set the tone for our team today," Patrick said. "She provided us with many point-scoring swings without making very many errors. Nikki was also outstanding. Everyone sees the amount of kills that she gets, but I was more impressed with the rest of her game. She really filled up the stat sheet tonight with 10 digs, four aces and two blocks."
